*5 wins AWAY from home arena, including Feb. 2 win at LSU (when team's second-leading scorer was out due to a concussion)

*The Gators have won five of their last eight games, as well as five of their last 10. Florida lost those four of the five games by a <u>combined total of 15 points</u> and all five of those setbacks were on the road, with four against nationally ranked opponents (at Tennessee, at Kentucky, at South Carolina and at Vanderbilt in OT) and the fifth in double-overtime versus recently-ranked Arkansas.

*the team's leading scorer and rebounder (Jennifer George) had a severe ankle sprain and did not practice in the days leading up to the Jan. 29 road game at Arkansas, which was a 2-OT loss

*Played **9 games vs. nationally-ranked teams** (at game time) and held them to an average of 61.5 points per game; also outrebounded ranked teams by an average of 39.1-38.2; team's scoring margin in those 8 games vs. ranked teams was a mere -2.5 ppg

*5 seniors, all of whom have started this season, make up a veteran lineup

*Able to suit-up only 9 players in season-opening loss to Michigan (69-66) because one player's mother had passed away, another had a concussion and one other tore her ACL two days prior

*Have already defeated 8 teams that they lost to last year (one additional game remaining vs. team that defeated them last season)

*holding opponents to 59.8 points per game - the second-fewest in the 38-year history of the program

Cassie Macias is UF's SEC Great

Gator basketball letterwinner **Cassie Macias** (muh-C-us) is the University of Florida's 2012 honoree and will be honored at the 2012 SEC Tournament.

Cassie Macias, who played for the inaugural varsity Gator basketball team during the 1974-75 season, is Florida's 2012 SEC Great. In this 40th anniversary of Title IX, Macias is the perfect representative for the Florida women's basketball program. When Cassie arrived at UF her freshman year, there wasn't even a women's basketball club team. She approached the director of UF's sports and recreation department and was instrumental in having it added to the list of activities for UF female students. As a club team, the group schedule games against other school's varsity teams, driving themselves to games and playing school's that had scholarship-level members. The next step was having the program elevated to varsity status, which it achieved for the 1974-75 season - Cassie's senior year - when she was named the first-ever team captain. Dr. Paula Welch, the first-ever coach of the Gators, called Cassie, "the sparkplug" of the team, sharing that she had "enthusiasm, energy and brought the feeling to everyone that we could win every game."

The entire 2012 SEC Greats class includes: Kelly Kretschman, Alabama (Softball); Sytia Messer, Arkansas (Basketball); Laticia Morris, Auburn (Basketball); Cassie Macias, Florida (Basketball); Camille Lowe, Georgia (Basketball); Valerie McGovern Young, Kentucky (Track); Yvette Girouard, LSU (Softball); Yolanda Moore, Ole Miss (Basketball); lyhia McMichael, Mississippi State (Softball); Jocelyn Penn, South Carolina (Basketball); Chamique Holdsclaw, Tennessee (Basketball); Carolyn Peck, Vanderbilt (Basketball).

Each honoree will be honored during half-time of their teams first game of the tournament, all 12 individuals will also be honored as a group between games of the second session on Friday, March 2. The Greats will then participate in an autograph session on the concourse before game eight. Complimentary posters of the Greats will be available at the session.

Game 24: Auburn at Florida

Feb. 9, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Senior Lanita Bartley led the Gators in scoring for the second straight game with 17 points

and Florida earned a 70-56 victory over Auburn Thursday evening at the O'Connell Center.

The victory was the third consecutive for the Gators (16-8, 6-5 SEC), who used strong defense throughout and forced 22 Auburn turnovers that led to 26 points. Florida was also able to get out in transition and score 13 fast-break points, compared to just two for the Tigers

The Gators and Tigers exchange buckets for the majority of the first half, when there were five lead changes and six tied scores, with the lead getting no larger than five for either team.

With Auburn holding a 29-27 lead with 2:26 remaining in the opening period, Florida went on a 7-2 run to end the half and headed into the locker room with a 36-31 lead.

The backcourt of Deana Allen, Bartley and Jaterra Bonds led the way for the Gators during the first 20 minutes, when the trio combined for 27 first-half points. Allen finished with 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the floor in addition to three assists and three steals in 23 minutes of action. Bonds tallied 12 points, converting 4-of-5 shots, with a team-high four assists, as the Gators dished 18 in the game.

Bonds started that final spurt with an acrobatic layup and drew contact and Allen followed with a steal on the other end of the floor and dished to Jordan Jones for the layin and forced an Auburn timeout. Jennifer George then stole the ball from Parrisha Simmons and Florida took advantage as Bonds nailed a three-pointer on another assist from Allen and the Gators held a 43-29 lead with 1:04 remaining.

Blanche Alverson, who finished with a game-high 19 points, converted a jumper to halt Florida's run, but Ndidi Madu found George under the basket and completed the high-low game that ended the first half's scoring.

The Gators continued their momentum at the start of the second half by scoring the first seven points and pushing their lead to 15 points, 43-31, with 18:04 remaining in the game.

Florida's defensive pressure kept the Tigers from converting a field goal for more than three and a half minutes, a span that covered the end of the first half and into the second. The Gators continued to get offensive contributions from every position, as nine out of the 10 Gators who suited up scored and helped maintain a double-digit lead for the remainder of the contest.

Auburn cut Florida's lead to 11 points with 12:06 remaining, but freshman Andrea Vilaró Aragonés answered with a three-pointer, before Tiger rookie Hasina Muhammad sank a layup and kept the Gator lead at 12 points, 53-41, with 11:11 to play

That's when Florida mounted a 10-4 spurt for a 63-45 advantage and took an 18-point lead, its largest of the game, with 5:25 remaining and Auburn never recovered.

Jones capped that final run with a free throw, marking her 900th career point at UF, as her overall career total swelled to 1,319.

A three-point basket from the wing by Allen with 1:25 remaining in the game extended the lead to 68-51 and ended any hopes for an Auburn comeback. With Bonds converting two free throws from the line with 45 seconds remaining in the game, the Gators reached the 70-point mark for the fourth straight game.

George collected a team-high eight rebounds, helping Florida to a 36-35 rebounding edge. The Gators also shot a steady 44.8 percent (26-58) for the game, including an 8-of-17 effort from the three-point arc

Auburn shot 48 percent (12-25) in the first half and finished with a 39.2 percent clip.

Game 16: Auburn 73, Florida 56

January 6, 2011 * Auburn, Ala. * Auburn Arena

Auburn used a 22-9 run in the final 6:43 of the game and blew open a close game to post a 73-56 decision against Florida Thursday evening at the new Auburn Arena.

The Gators held a 33-28 halftime lead, but the Tigers roared out of the locker room and started the second half scoring the first four points and whittled the deficit to one. Azania Stewart and Jordan Jones followed with buckets and retuned the Gator advantage to five, 37-32. Auburn, however, tallied six consecutive points and sparked a 13-2 run and assumed a six-point lead with 11:15 to go in the game

Jennifer George, who finished with a team-high 10 points, scored the lone field goal during the stretch, as Stewart hit an inside jumper to stop the spree. The teams then traded scores for the next seven opportunities, as the Gators could get no close than four points, including 51-47 with 7:19 remaining. That's when the Tigers (9-6, 2-0 SEC) went on their game-ending run to earn their fifth consecutive victory and deny Florida (11-5, 1-1 SEC) its first true road win in five tries.

Auburn also won the rebounding battle, 34-25, handing the Gators their worse deficit margin this year, including a seven rebound differential in the deciding second half, when the Tigers shot 57.7 percent and made 16 of their 24 trips to the free throw line. AU shot 50 percent overall during the game, the best by a UF opponent this season.

Florida shot 41.5 percent overall (22-53), including 5-of-11 from the three-point arc, but found their way to the free throw line only 10 times, all in the first 20 minutes of play.

"They won the paint, there's not any question," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "They dominated us on the boards, did a great job of getting to the rim and posting us up and scoring. It's really disappointing because that was our emphasis. We didn't come in with the determination and fight that it's going to take to win on the road in this league. I thought we played a real soft game When we're at our best, we're playing with toughness and we didn't bring that toughness tonight.

Stewart, who was plagued with foul trouble and whistled for her fourth with 10 minutes remaining, pulled down a team-high five rebounds along with seven points in 19 minutes of action Nine of the 10 Gators who played scored during the game.

Chantel Hilliard scored a career and game-high 17 points for Auburn, leading four Tigers in double-figure scoring.

Ndidi Madu opened the game's scoring 12 seconds after the initial ball went into the air, but Auburn sharp-shooter Blanche Alverson came back with a three-pointer and Parrisha Simmons followed with a pair of free throws and gave the Tigers the early 5-2 lead. Jones nailed a trey for the Gators to even things up, but Alli Smalley hit a bucket and Alverson went deep again to give Auburn a 10-5 advantage with 16:38 remaining in the opening half.

Florida settled after a pair of turnovers and marched off a 12-4 run, with scoring from Deana Allen, Madu, Deaundra Young, Lanita Bartley and Jaterra Bonds and took a 17-14 lead with 9:21 remaining, as Bonds capped the spree with a three-pointer en route to a team-best seven first-half points. The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes before Auburn came right back with two consecutive scores and held a 20-19 edge with 5:17 on the clock. That started a trend of six lead changes and one tied score over the next three minutes. With Auburn holding a 28-27 advantage and 2:39 on the clock, Bonds hit two free throws, Azania Stewart converted a three-point play and Bartley capped the first-half scoring with one from the charity stripe and gave Florida a 33-28 halftime lead

Looking Ahead: Winner Plays SEC Champ Kentucky

The winner of the Florida-Auburn first round game meets top-seeded and 10th-ranked Kentucky in the quarterfinals on Friday at 1 p.m. ET/ Noon CT.

UF vs. UK: The Series

Kentucky holds a 23-22 lead in the 45-game series against Florida, thanks in part to sweeping both regular-season meetings this year.

The Wildcats began the new calendar year with a 59-56 win in Gainesville, before taking the 57-52 decision over the Gators in Lexington on Jan. 22.

Kentucky has won the last four meetings against Florida with each of the last three being decided by five points or less - including last year's 59-58 thriller in Gainesville.

UK has claimed five of last six decisions against the Gators, as well as seven of the last nine outings.

The teams have split the four meetings in SEC Tournament action, with the Wildcats claiming the most recent - an 88-70 decision in the 2006 quarterfinal round played in Little Rock, Ark.

Kentucky Team Ties

Kentucky head coach **Matthew Mitchell** was an assistant coach at Florida for three years (2000-03), serving under former head coaches **Carol Ross** and **Carolyn Peck**. The Gators were 51-36 during his three-year stay in Gainesville.

Florida whittled a 15-point deficit down to two but was unable to complete what would have been a stirring upset against the sixth-ranked Kentucky Wildcats, who captured the 57-52 decision on Sunday in front of a sold-out crowd of 7,888 in Memorial Coliseum.

Jennifer George posted her Southeastern Conference-leading fifth double-double in seven league games, as well as her 12th this season, contributing 10 points and 11 rebounds with three steals and three blocks for the Gators, who were led in scoring by Jordan Jones, who scored a game-high 13 points. Jaterra Bonds also scored 10 points for Florida, which has lost its last three games in the series against the Wildcats by a total of nine points.

With Florida holding a 21-16 lead with 3:18 remaining in the first half, Kentucky went on a 22-2 run that spanned the final three minutes of the first half and the first six and half minutes of the second and took a 38-23 lead with 13:27 remaining. The Gators answered with the next six points and seemingly traded scores with the Wildcats for the next eight minutes before ripping off an 8-0 run and were within two points with 27 seconds remaining. Kentucky stepped up at the free throw line where it scored its final seven points to fend off Florida's rally and hopes of an upset.

The Gators collected themselves after the devastating 22-2 Wildcat march and scored six consecutive points and dropped their deficit to single digits after Azania Stewart, Jaterra Bonds and Ndidi Madu each contributed. Florida had a couple of chances to get even but turned the ball over three times and the Wildcats were able to get themselves to the free throw line where they knocked down 3-of-4 and took a 41-29 lead.

Bonds then banked in a three-pointer and had Florida within nine points, 41-32, with 9:40 remaining. Brittany Shine added two free throws at the 8:02 mark and the Gators clawed to within seven points, 41-34. Kentucky halted its six-minute field goal drought when Brittany Henderson hit one from under the basket, before the Gators committed their 22nd turnover the contest and gave the ball back to the Wildcats. Florida forced a long shot from the Wildcats, who missed, but corralled the offensive board. The Gators then sent Kastine Evans to the free throw line for three attempts, as she made two and gave UK a 45-34 lead with 6:41 remaining. The teams then traded scores for the next minute, with the Gator getting makes from George, Bonds and Jones and helping UF remain within nine points, 49-40, with 5:04 remaining. After the scoring frenzy, neither team scored for the next minute before UK hit one free throw, followed by four straight points from George, who brought the Gators within six points, 50-44, with 2:58 remaining. George, however, then missed the front end of a one-and-one, the third by a Gator in the game. Madu corralled a UK miss on the other end and streaked down the lane for a layup and had UF within four, 50-46, with

1:49 remaining.

On the Wildcats next possession, they missed three wild shots but got the rebound each time, before A'dia Mathies found her way to the free throw line with 1:01 remaining. She missed both, but UK again secured the loose rebound and held the four-point advantage. Another miss from UK and UF finally had its chance offensively , where Bartley dribbled the court and scooped in a layup and the Gators were now within tow points, 50-48, with 25.2 seconds on the clock. UF thought it had a quick steal, but was whistled for a foul and Bria Goss stepped to the line, hit two free throws with 22.8 seconds remaining and gave UK a 52-48 cushion. The Gators then had the ball and Jones' soft 6-foot floater found the bottom of the next and Florida was within two, 52-50. Florida immediately fouled Snowden, who sank two free throws with 13 ticks on the clock, before Bartley again sank a layup with just over six seconds remaining and again had Florida within two, 54-52. Snowden was again fouled and missed the first attempt from the line and made the second as UK held a 55-52 lead with six seconds to go. Florida threw the ball the to midcourt, but it was tied up and the possession arrow was in favor of the Wildcats, who were able to inbound the ball to Snowden, who made both with 4.5 seconds remaining and ended the game's scoring.

Jennifer George had her sixth straight double-double and senior guard Deana Allen led the Gators in scoring for the second straight contest, but it wasn't enough as Florida fell to No. 6 Kentucky, 59-56, in both team's respective SEC openers on Sunday afternoon.

George put up another solid overall performance with 10 points and 11 rebounds against the 'Cats, including seven offensive boards. George also had two blocks, becoming the eighth Gator to swat 100 or more in her career. Allen had 12 points on the afternoon, including going 2-for-4 from beyond three-point arc. In all, Florida had four players in double-figure points, the second consecutive contest with at least four Gators in double-digit scoring. Redshirt senior Ndidi Madu tallied 11 points against the 'Cats, while sophomore guard Jaterra Bonds registered 10 points

The Gators (10-4, 0-1 SEC) outrebounded their opponent for the 11th consecutive game, on Sunday registering a 44-42 advantage against the Wildcats thanks in part to the 11 boards from George and the 10 from senior center Azania Stewart, who also collected a career-high five steals to go along with a pair of blocked shots, as increased her career swat total to 170.

Florida turned the ball over a season-high 23 times, resulting in 20 UK points. The Gators

also shot just 32.8 percent from the floor (20-61) and hit 11-of-19 free throws

Bonds opened the scoring in the second half, hitting a jumper just 2:15 into the second. Allen hit a jumper to tie the game at 33-33. Kentucky answered with a layup by Kastine Evans but Madu put UF right back in it with a deep jumper at the 15:23 mark courtesy of a dish by Bartley.

UF had a couple opportunities to take lead in second half when the scored was tied at 35,

but couldn't, as UK eventually found its stroke and scored five straight to take a 40-35 lead midway through the second half. Deana Allen helped the Gators close the gap, as she nailed a pair of three-pointers on consecutive possessions and had Florida within two, 42-40, with 10:44 to play Neither team could scored for the next four minutes until Stewart knocked down one free throw with 8:19 remaining and drew the Gators within 42-41.

Kentucky, however, came right down and Samarie Walked scored inside on back-to-back

possessions, building the Wildcat's lead back to five points with 7:37 to play. Allen struck again with her third three-pointer of the game and the Gators were within two, 46-44, with 6:36 on the clock.

A'dia Mathies, who finished with a team-high 14 points, converted a layup and put Kentucky

ahead by four, 48-44, before Evans stole the ball and sparked a 4-0 run that put Kentucky ahead 50-45. Out of the final media timeout, a Brittany Henderson layup gave Kentucky (12-2, 1-0 SEC) one of its largest leads of the contest, 52-45. Two made free throws by senior guard Lanita Bartley, her first points of the afternoon, put Florida back within five with just 2:26 to go in the game.

Kentucky's Amber Smith hit a trey as the shot clock ticked down to put the 'Cats ahead by its largest lead of the afternoon, 55-47, but redshirt senior Jordan Jones knocked down her first trey of the game, as the Gators remained within five with less than a minute remaining.

A Kentucky shot-clock violation gave Florida possession but a costly turnover put the ball back in the hands of the 'Cats. After a make and a miss from the charity stripe for Kentucky's Smith, Bonds drove hard in the paint to put Florida back within four, 56-52, with just 19 ticks remaining in the game. Smith returned to the line and hit both free throws but Bartley raced to the other end to put up a layup with 8.7 seconds to play. The next possession seemed to be much of the same, as Smith hit both shots from the charity stripe and Allen sped to lay it in to pull Florida within three, 59-56, with just one second remaining as Kentucky claimed the victory.

In the final 37 seconds of the first half, Mathies, who had been scoreless to that point in the

game, got loose and nailed back-to-back three-pointers, forcing a Gator turnover in between, that gave the Wildcats a 33-29 halftime lead and the momentum heading into the locker room.

Lily Svete (Granger, Ind.) scored a career-high and led Florida with 12 points but the Gators went cold from the floor in the final minutes and lost at No. 10/9 Tennessee, 75-59, at Thompson-

Boling Arena Sunday afternoon in the regular-season finale for both teams. Florida (18-11, 8-8 SEC) committed 20 turnovers that the Lady Vols (21-8, 12-4 SEC) converted into 10 points, as UT also benefitted from holding a 16-7 advantage in fast break points

Florida scored six straight points on scores from Ndidi Madu and Lanita Bartley and had the Gators within seven points, 51-44, with 9:45 remaining, and had two possessions to cut the into their deficit even further, but turned the ball over both times. UT took advantage with four points and regained a double-digit lead, with six minutes on the clock.

Florida refused to fold, as Svete nailed a three-pointer and Jennifer George hit one free throw and the Gators were back within seven points with 7:18 remaining

Again the Vols countered with four straight points, before Jordan Jones nailed her third trey of the game and Florida was down eight, 59-51, with 5:41 on the clock.

Shekinna Stricklen, who finished with 15 points and was one of five Lady Vols seniors who were honored in a pregame ceremony, quickly responded with a three-pointer and Ariel Massengale added two free throws and UT was back up by 13 points.

Florida made one last push, as George and Bartley scored and had the lead back within single digits with under three minutes to play. After UT answered and George added her 11th points of the game with 2:36 remaining, the Gators went cold. That was their final field goal, as the Lady Vols finished with nine consecutive points and their lead swelled to 18. Bartley tacked on two free throws for the final scores.

George finished with her SEC-leading 14th double-double of the season as she contributed 11 points and 11 rebounds, while Bartley added 11 points and four assists. Jones finished with nine points and two steals for Florida, which shot 37.9 percent overall from the floor, including a 5-of-24

Jones struck first for the Gators, nailing an uncontested 25-footer that began the game's scoring. UT responded with a 15-0 run, during when Florida committed four turnovers that led to nine points, while being out-rebounded 7-3 and missing seven shots, while calling two timeouts

Ndidi Madu finally ended the Gator's offensive draught with an inside bucket at the 13:32 mark. Sophomore Lily Svete followed with a three-pointer shortly after entering the game and cut Florida's deficit to seven points, 15-8, with 12:12 remaining in the half.

The Lady Vols came right back with a jumper in transition from Alicia Manning, but Jennifer George took a great pass from Andrea Vilaró Aragonés, before Jordan Jones canned her second trey of the game and Florida was within four points, 17-13, with 9:59 to go in the period.

The teams then traded scores for the next three minutes before UT converted back-to-back buckets and held an eight-point advantage.

Deana Allen swished in a deep jumper with her toe on the three-point arc, but the Lady Vols again responded with an 18-footer from Cierra Burdick and kept the difference at eight points. Madu then added an inside basket and George tacked on one free throw and Florida was

back within five points, 27-22, with 3:27 remaining.

From there, Florida went cold from the floor for the rest of the half, converting just 1-of-5, with Svete's inside bucket the Gator's only field goal. The Gators also had the ball with a chance for the last shot, but came down with 21 seconds to go and put up a quick attempt, which was off the mark and Glory Johnson sank a fastbreak layup for her 12th point of the game with four seconds remaining and the Lady Vols headed into the locker room with the 35-24 lead.

Opening Tip-Off

Florida plays Auburn in the first round of the 2012 Southeastern Conference Tournament held at the Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tenn.

The eighth-seeded Gators (18-11, 8-8 SEC) and ninth-seeded Tigers (13-16, 5-11 SEC) will play the initial game of the 12-team event on Thursday, March 1, with tip-off scheduled for 1 p.m. ET/Noon CT. The winner meets top-seeded Kentucky on Friday, March 2 at 1 p.m. ET/Noon CT.

Thursday's opening round game will be televised live by FSN, with coverage throughout the state of Florida airing on SunSports.

Florida defeated Auburn, 70-56, in Gainesville on February 9 in the only regular-season meeting between the two teams this year.

Odd Run of Emotion

Including Thursday's SEC Tournament opening round game againt Auburn, Florida will have faced an out-going coach in two of its last three games.

Florida was MSU's first opponent following coach Sharon Fanning-Otis' announcement, earning a win against the Bulldogs on Feb. 23.

The Gators then faced Tennessee (and Coach Pat Summitt) in Knoxville to end the regular season and now have to battle emotion-charged Auburn led by coach Nell Fortner, who announced she too would be stepping down from her post at the end of the season.

Florida at the SEC Tournament

Florida holds a 16-31 all-time record in the SEC Tournament, reaching the championship game in 1997, the team's lone appearance in the final. Current UF head coach Amanda Butler was an assistant coach on the Gator staff that year.

The Gators sport an 11-13 all-time record in the first round of the SEC Tournament. Last year, Florida downed Arkansas and advanced to the guarterfinals, falling to top-seeded Tennessee.

Butler at the SEC Tournament

During her two seasons as an assistant coach at Florida. Amanda Butler helped the Gators reach the SEC Tournament semifinal round in 1996 and the championship game in 1997.

During her four-year career as a starting point guard for the Gators (1990-94), Butler played in and started five SEC Tournament games, averaging 29.4 minutes, while contributing 4.2 points, 3.0 assists and 2.6 steals.

Page at the SEC Tournament

Current assistant coach Murriel Page was named to the 1996 and 1997 SEC All-Tournament Teams. She appeared in 10 SEC Tournament games from 1995-98, totaling 145 points (14.5 ppg) and 109 rebounds (10.9 rpg), while helping the Gators reach semifinals in 1996 and the championship game in 1997 - in what remains UF's lone appearance in the title game.

Local Flavor

Redshirt senior Ndidi Madu and head coach Amanda Butler are natives of the Volunteer State. Butler hails from Mt. Juliet, located just 15 miles from Nashville. Madu is from Antioch, 10 miles from Nashville.

The UF-Auburn Series

The Tigers hold a 32-16 lead in the all-time series, including a 7-1 record in neutral site games - all at the SEC Tournament. Florida's lone neutral site victory against Auburn was the 72-67 win in the first round of the 1994 event, when the Gators were the No. 3 seed and the Tigers the No. 10 seed.

The Tigers have won six of the last nine games in the series, however the Gators won the regular-season meeting in Gainesville this year..

Team Ties

Amanda Butler's fellow classmate during her fouryear career as a Gator letterwinner was Kerry Cremeans, who is the associate head coach at Auburn. The two were backcourt mates from 1990-94, helping UF earn its first-ever NCAA Tournament bid their junior year and repeated the trip their final season.

Cremeans also was an assistant coach at Florida during the 2003-04 season, when the Gators posted a 19-11 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Fans Get their Money's Worth!

Florida has played 52 games over the last three seasons with outcomes decided by 10 points or less, posting a 27-25 record in those tight ballgames.

14 games fit into that category this year, when UF has posted a 5-9 record.

10 of UF's 16 SEC games this season were decided by six points or less, with 11 of 16 by decided by single digits.

Twenty-three of UF's program-record 35 games during the 2010-11 season were decided by 10 points or fewer, with 16 being six-point differences - including the final two of the season. The Gators were 14-9 in games decided by 10 points or less in 2010-11.

During the 2009-10 season, the Gators played 15 games decided by fewer than 10 points and posted an 8-7 in those outings.

D-FENCE

As a team, Florida is holding opponents to 59.8 points per game - the second-fewest in a season in the 38-year history of the program. The 1983-84 squad held its foes to 59.1 points per game.

Opponents are shooting 38.4 percent from the floor, the lowest since the 2000-01 Gators limited foes to a 36.9 percent clip.

From beyond the arc, opponents are connecting on just 28.4 percent, the third-lowest accuracy mark from the three-point arc in program history and the lowest since the program-standard 25.8 percent set by the 1997-98 team. The 1987-88 club limited foes to a 27.7

percent mark in the inaugural year of the three-

Florida sports a +5.3 rebound margin, its best since the 2000-01 team held a +7.9 margin.

With her one blocked shot at Tennessee on Feb. 26. Azania Stewart tallied her 62nd rejection of the season. It took her 29 games to equal her 35-game block total of last year.

Gator Watch

Junior forward Jennifer George continues to lead UF in scoring (12.8 ppg) and rebounding (9.0 rpg), an effort that also is second in the SEC (in SEC games and all games).

She has posted 14 double-doubles

this year - and 18 in her career. George recently compiled a streak of eight consecutive doubledoubles, a run that ranked tied as the fourth-longest in UF history. The run ended at Georgia on Jan. 12, when she posted 15 points with eight rebounds.

Not bad considering she was held scoreless on 0-for-1 shooting with three rebounds in the season opener versus Michigan!!

George also has a team-high 21 doublefigure scoring games.

Jones Right Behind George

Senior Jordan Jones has been doing a bit of everything for the Gators this year, contributing 11.4 points, in addition to 3.8 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.1 steals, while hitting 62-of-176 treys (35.2%).

Jones had started 43 consecutive games prior to missing the Feb. 2 game at LSU because of a concussion she sustained during the Jan. 29 game at Arkansas.

Jones had converted at least one threepoint attempt in 11 consecutive games before going 0-3 from beyond the arc against South Carolina on Jan. 8. That was her career third double-digit streak of converting three-pointers

During her three-year tenure at UF, Jones has drained 189 three-pointers, the fourth most in a career (third is 212 by Sha Brooks, 2005-09), as well as 286 overall.

Last year, Jones was 72-of-186 from long range for 38.7%, the second-highest accuracy mark in a season in UF history. Her 72 treys tied for the seventh-most in a season.

Bartley's Bringin' it!

Senior point guard **Lanita Bartley** has stepped up her game during her second and final season wearing the Gator orange & blue.

She's Florida's third-leading scorer (9.1 ppg) and leads the club in assists (3.2 apg) and steals (1.93 pg).

The 5-foot-6 Bartley also tied for UF's second-leading rebounder (5.1 rpg) in SEC games!

During a four-game span from Jan. 29-Feb. 9, Bartley helped the Gators post a 3-1 record (the loss a double-overtime heartbreaker at Arkansas), while lead the team with 16.3 points and converting a sizzling 10-of-15 three-pointers (66.7%) ... she has a total of 16 treys this year - including the 10 she dropped in those four games.

Rookie Review

Andrea Vilaró Aragonés, Florida's only freshman competing during the 2011-12 season, posted back-to-back career scoring efforts against nationally-ranked opponents during the week of Feb. 13 She scored eight on the road at #24 Vanderbilt, before tallying 10 in the win against #18/15 Georgia, when she hit a pair of big three-pointers that sparked Gator runs. She also collected a career-high-tying four rebounds against the Lady Bulldogs.

She totaled four three-pointers in the two games last week, more than any other Gator, hitting a respectable 35.4 percent from beyond the arc and helping Florida earn its seventh SEC win of the year.

Vilaró Aragonés, who missed the first four games of the year due to the passing of her mother, has shown improvement in her game each week, capped by last week when she averaged 9.0 points and was UF's third-leading scorer in the pair of games.

It's Senior Time!

During Florida's recent three-game win streak, the top four leading scorers were seniors. Point guard **Lanita Bartley** averaged 15.3 points and a team-best 7.3 rebounds during that span, while connecting on 61.5 percent of her shots overall, including 7-of-12 three-pointers.

Deana Allen averaged 9.7 points during those three games, followed by **Azania Stewart**'s 9.3 ppg and **Ndidi Madu**'s 9.0 ppg contributions.

This One Really Was a Heartbreaker

While Florida has more than had its fair share of games decided by six points or less this year, its 75-69 overtime loss at Vanderbilt on Feb. 16th may have been the most heartbreaking.

The Commodores' Christina Foggie launched a 'Hail Mary' at the buzzer that hit the backboard, all sides of the rim and somehow dropped in and tied the game and sent the game to overtime. It was discovered too late, however, that the game clock did not run during the final 75 seconds for almost 14 seconds.

Deana Allen Stars off the Bench

Senior **Deana Allen** has provided Florida with a definite spark off the bench in every game she's played this year, averaging 7.8 points (fifth on team) and 4.9 rebounds (third on team), with 1.5 steals (second on the team). She hits 31.3 percent from the three-point arc (the third-highest on the team) and 71.9 percent from the free throw line (highest percentage).

The only game Allen has missed this year was the season-opener against Michigan when she sat out to recover from a concussion.

Allen did make her first start of the year on Jan. 8 against South Carolina, responding with nine points, a season-high 10 rebounds and a team-best three assists with a pair of steals. She followed that with another start and a 14-point, six-rebound, four-steal performance at Georgia. Allen started seven consecutive SEC games this year, but has come off the bench in the last seven (thru Tennessee).

Everyone Scores!

Six times this year every Gator who has suited up for a game has scored: at San Francisco (Dec. 7), vs. Samford (Dec. 28) vs. LSU twice (Jan. 15 & Feb. 2), vs. Ole Miss (Feb. 5) and vs. Mississippi State (Feb. 23).

Two Big Wins in One Week

Florida earned two significant wins during the week of Jan. 30, when the team get to an even 5-5 in the league standings. The Gator's 73-64 win at LSU on Feb. 2 marked their first against LSU in Baton Rouge since January of 1996. The 84-55 victory against Ole Miss on Feb. 5 was the team's largest margin of victory in an SEC game since a 38-point win versus South Carolina on Jan. 28, 2001.

UF vs. Ranked Teams

Florida is 2-7 this year against Associated Press nationally-ranked opponents, and 2-8 versus teams ranked in the ESPN-USA Today Coaches Poll at tip-time (Vanderbilt was receiving votes in the AP poll, but No. 24 in Coaches Poll).

The Gators posted a 61-57 win against #18/15 Georgia on Feb. 19 and a 72-58 victory on Nov. 17 against Florida State, which checked in at No. 21 in the AP and No. 19 in the ESPN-Coaches poll, but lost to No. 11/12 Rutgers (63-49) on Dec. 2 at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach, to No. 6 Kentucky (59-56) on Jan. 1 in Gainesville and 57-52 on Jan. 22 in Lexington, at No. 19/16 Georgia (61-55), at No. 24 South Carolina on Feb. 12 (62-58) and at No. 10/9 Tennessee on Feb. 26 (75-59).

The Gators earned two wins last year against ranked foes, with the last coming on Feb. 27, 2011 when unranked UF knocked off then-No. 22-ranked Georgia, 74-71, in the O'Connell Center.

Including this year's win against the Lady Bulldogs and Seminoles, Florida has collected 47 upset wins against a higher-ranked opponent, with 27 of those coming when the Gators were unranked.

Hello, Again!

The 2011-12 season marked the beginning of new rotation for the SEC's 16-game schedule, with each team still playing the other 11 schools once, while keeping a home-and-home series with its 'natural geographic rival' (UF's is **Georgia**). Florida's four other games were home-and-home series' against **Kentucky**, **South Carolina**, **LSU** and **Ole Miss**.

Jones Voted to Academic All-District Team Jordan Jones was voted to the Capital

One Academic All-District 4 women's basketball team that was released on Feb. 2.

In the classroom, Jones earned a spot on the 2010 & 2011 SEC Academic Honor Roll and the 2008 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Jones, who received her bachelor's degree in business in May of 2010 and is taking coursework toward a master's degree in sports management, moves onto the national ballot for the CoSIDA Academic All-America Team, joining members of the other seven districts.

Unfriendly Road Ends with a Historic Win

The Gators are coming off a three-game SEC road swing. Florida lost a tough 57-52 decision at No. 6 Kentucky on Sunday, January 22nd and a 73-72 double-overtime setback at Arkansas on Jan. 29, but capped the trip with a 73-64 victory at LSU where the Gators earned their first win since January 21, 1996.

First Half in the Books

Florida capped the first half of the team's 16-game SEC schedule on Sunday, Jan. 29 with a 73-72 double-overtime loss at Arkansas.

The Gators compiled a 3-5 record during the first half of the slate, a mark that placed them tied with Mississippi State for eighth in the standings.

The Perfect 10

Because of injuries, the Gators have been limited to 10 healthy players for every game this year except the season opener versus Michigan when only nine Gators suited up.

Florida began the season with **Kayla Lewis** in the starting lineup and senior **Deana Allen** out with a concussion, while freshman **Andrea Vilaro Aragones** was in Spain for the first four games due to the passing of her mother and freshmen **Viktorija Dimaite** (ankle) and **Carlie Needles (knee)** redshirting the season due to injuries.

Lewis suffered a stress fracture during the Nov. 17 Florida State game and has not dressed since the third game of the year. She will redshirt the 2011-12 season.

Strongest Gator

Jennifer George is unquestionably the strongest member of the team. With her legs, she moves 225 pounds for a dead lift (2 sets, 9 reps) and 185 pounds for a front squad (2 sets, 10 reps), while using 65 pound dumb bells for a bench press (2 sets, 6 reps).

Back-to-Back 20-Point Games Not Common

Three different Gators have charted a 20-point game this season: Lanita Bartley (28 vs. Charlotte), Jennifer George (24 at San Francisco, 21 vs. Stetson) and Jordan Jones (21 vs. Michigan, 28 vs. Hampton, 20 vs. Rutgers, 20 vs. Charleston Southern).

The last time a Gator was able to string back-to-back 20-point performances was during the 2008-09 season, when **Sha (SHAY) Brooks** tagged Arkansas for 27 (Feb. 19) and South Carolina for 24 (Feb. 22).

George Joins Elite Swat Team

Jennifer George's first blocked shot of the game against Kentucky on Jan. 1 was the 100th of her career (Keyla Snowden, 14:13 mark of first half). She became the eighth Gator to block 100 in career.

George Honored as SEC Player of Week

Jennifer George was named the SEC Player of the Week for the games played Dec. 19-25.

George was the catalyst in Florida winning its own Gator Holiday Classic, as she totaled 34 points and 23 rebounds en route to earning MVP honors, the first such honor of her career.

Gators Assemble Nationally-Ranked Signing Class for 2012-13

Officially signing a National Letter of Intent to join the Gators for the 2012-13 season are:

Chandler Cooper (5-11, Guard, Clarksville, Tenn./Clarksville HS),

Christin Mercer (6-0, Post, Douglasville, Ga./Douglas County HS),

January Miller (5-8, Guard, Orlando, Fla./University HS) and

Sydney Moss (5-11, Guard/Forward, Union, Ky./Boone County HS).

"I'm really excited about this class in every way," **Coach Amanda Butler** said of the quartet. "They have a chance to be one of the most talented classes that has ever played here. I like their personalities, they all have championship mentalities and they are all excited to be Gators and that goes a long, long way with me. All of them will be the type of players that others are definitely going to want to play with and not just because they are talented, but because of the type of people they are."

Chandler Cooper, who ranked as high as the No. 30 overall prospect in the 2012 HoopGurlz Recruiting Rankings, is one of five players from Clarksville High School to sign a NLI to an NCAA Division I basketball program, with three to a Southeastern Conference school during November's early signing period. Cooper already owns the program's all-time record with 177 career three-pointers. In her regimented practice routine, Cooper is said to attempt 200 three-pointers per day. She averaged 9.1 points, 4.2 rebounds and 3.8 assists during her junior season.

Christin Mercer was honored as a 2011 Class AAAA First Team All-State performer, as she helped Douglas County High School to a 31-1 record and advance to the state semifinals for the first time in school history. The 2011 Region 5-AAAA Player of the Year averaged 14.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game while hitting 51.8 percent of her shots during her junior season with coach Chet Forsh's Lady Tigers.

January Miller verbally committed to the Gators following her sophomore season, when she averaged 21 points, 6.2 rebounds, 3.9 steals and 2.6 assists and eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau. Through her three years running the floor at University High School, Miller has amassed 1,507 points in addition to averaging 18.8 points, along with 6.0 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 3.7 steals. The three-time All-Central Florida honoree is already UHS's all-time leader scorer in girl's history and has a chance to become the school's all-time leader, needing 77 points her senior season to reach the boy's mark.

Sydney Moss has been a two-time First Team All-State selection as named by the Louisville Courier-Journal and Lexington Herald, collecting honors in 2010 and 2011. She led Boone County High School to the 33rd District championship when she was named MVP in 2010 and 2011, as well as the 9th region title when she was the 2010 MVP and an appearance in the 2010 KHSAA State Tournament final, being named to the 2010 KHSAA All-State Tournament Team. Moss has amassed 2,140 points and 1,156 rebounds in her prep career, averaging a double-double in her career with 18.2 points and 10.5 rebounds. During her junior campaign, Moss averaged 22.9 points, 11.8 rebounds, 3.4 assists, 2.8 steals and 1.3 blocks, while hitting 51.4 percent from the floor, including 35.3 percent from the three-point arc.

George posted a double-double in both tournament wins, extending her double-double streak to four games, the first time a Gator has strung together as many since Vanessa Hayden did so midway thru the 2003-04 season.

George shot an incredible 72.2 percent from the floor during UF's two games during the week, hitting 13-of-18, and blocked five shots.

Gators in the Golden State

When Florida played at San Francisco on Dec. 7, it was the first time the Gators have played a game in the state of California since Nov. 18, 2006.

Florida in the Big Apple

The Nov. 25 game against La Salle was just the second time in program history Florida played a game in the state of New York. The only other trip to the Big Apple was on Nov. 17, 2000, when the Gators won at Fordham, 76-36.

I Love NY

Lanita Bartley made the most of her firstever visit to New York, averaging 22.0 points and 8.0 rebounds, while hitting 16-of-17 free throws and leading the Gators to two wins. While it was their first trip to the Big Apple, **Jordan Jones** and **Jennifer George** put up big numbers in two tournament wins, with Jones contributing 18;0 points and 6.0 rebounds, while hitting 7-of-18 three-pointers, and George tallying 13.5 points and 12.0 rebounds, converting 68.8 percent from the field (11-16).

Bartley and George earn a spot on the Courtyard LaGuardia Turkey Classic All-Tournament Team for their performances.

Gators in the Big Apple

Only four Gators on the current 13-player roster had ever stepped foot in the state of New York prior to the Courtyard LaGuardia Turkey Classic hosted by Long Island University, Nov. 25-26.

Only **Jennifer George**, **Jordan Jones**, **Ndidi Madu** and **Azania Stewart** had visited New York.

Opening with a Small Bench

Florida suited up just nine players for the Nov. 11 season-opener against Michigan, with Deana Allen listed as day-to-day, Andrea Vilaro Aragones in Spain with the passing of her mother and freshmen Viktorija Dimaite and Carlie Needles redshirting the season due to injury.

All nine played at least 10 minutes in the game against the Wolverines and eight scored.

The Gators did Allen back for its next game versus Stetson and she responded with 11 points and eight rebounds in 19 minutes of work.

Mini Preseason Outlook

For the third time since the 1990-91 season – and the first time since the 2003-04 campaign - the Gators return all five starters from the previous year. Florida's 2011-12 roster features five seniors, each of whom boasts starting experience, as 10 returning letterwinners welcome three talented newcomers aiming to build upon last year's 20-win season and earn a fifth consecutive postseason berth under fifthyear head coach **Amanda Butler**.

A Safer, Cosier O'Connell Center

The O'Connell Center underwent renovations during the 2011 summer. New handrails were installed throughout the lower level section, all of the 13-year-old lower level bleachers were replaced with contoured blue seats and the original, 31-year-old support structure and undercarriage were replaced. These upgrades slightly reduced the maximum capacity for basketball games from 12,000 to 11,373.

All Starters from 2010-11 Return

For the third time since the 1990-91 season, the Gators return all five starters from the previous year (1996-97 and 2003-04 were the other previous years and both ended in trips to the NCAA Tournament – 1997 team went to Elite Eight; 2004 team to second round).

Leading the Way - and Returning

Jordan Jones led the 2010-11 balanced Gator scoring effort, recording 10.2 points per game, hitting a team-leading 72 three-pointers at a 38.7 percent clip and playing 32.6 minutes per outing.

Azania Stewart was Florida's leading rebounder last season with 6.1 per game and hit 52.7 percent of her shots from the floor. Her 62 blocked shots also was tops for the Gators and ranked second in the SEC.

Lanita Bartley dished a team-leading 3.4 assists in 2010-11 and collected a team-high 1.77 steals, while finding her way to the free throw a team-best 132 times.

Tough 24 Hours

The Gators suffered tough news on Nov. 6 and 7 to two of their freshmen. Carlie Needles tore the ACL in her right knee during a scrimmage (non-contact, defensive play) on Nov. 6. Less than 24 hours later, Andrea Vilaró Aragonés' mother Maria Angels Aragones Barbera passed away from cancer. Andrea flew back to Barcelona, Spain on Nov. 3 to be with her mother and family.

Rookie to Redshirt

Upon signing with UF, Viktorija Dimaite's plan with the Gator coaching staff had always been to redshirt the 2011-12 season to develop her strength and get physically stronger. The day before the 2011 Under-20 European Championships were to begin, Dimaite dislocated her right ankle and was unable to play with her native Lithuanian U20 team that was set to compete. Since stepping foot on campus for the

2011 fall semester, Dimaite has been rehabilitating her injury.

Lewis on the Mend

Sophomore **Kayla Lewis**, who missed 19 games last year due to injury, was hampered during the summer because of a bone bruise on her left tibia; similar injury she dealt with last year on her right tibia, but not as severe. Her preseason workouts were limited as a result. The last game she played prior to the 2011-12 season was on Jan. 23 at LSU, seeing just eight minutes of action.

Going Global

For the first time in program history, there is more than one foreign player on the roster: senior **Azania Stewart** is first-ever Gator from Europe & Great Britain; freshman **Viktorija Dimaite** is first-ever from Lithuania; and freshman **Andrea Vilaró Aragonés** is first-ever from Spain.

Trio of First-Timers

The three freshmen on the 2011-12 women's basketball roster are the first ever in program history from a specific state or country: Carlie Needles is the first Gator hoopster from the state of Colorado; Viktorija Dimaite is the first ever from Lithuania; and Andrea Vilaró Aragonés is the first-ever Gator from Spain to join the team.

Second Degree

SEC Expansion

The SEC has welcomed Texas A&M and Missouri to the join the league, beginning with competition in all sports for the 2012-13 academic year.

The addition of Missouri on Nov. 6, 2011, will increase SEC membership to 14 institutions. The additions of Texas A&M, announced on September 25, 2011, and Missouri, are the first expansions for the SEC since September of 1991 when the University of South Carolina joined the league.

The University of Arkansas joined the SEC in August of 1991. With the addition of Arkansas and South Carolina, the SEC was the first conference to split into divisions and add a conference championship game in 1992.

2011-12 & 2012-13 Women's Basketball More Significant Rule Changes:

*the three-point line has moved from a distance of 19'9" to 20'9" (the current distance in men's basketball)

*Restricted area arc: addition of a restricted area three (3) feet from the center of the basket (rationale is that the arc will mark the area under the basket where a secondary defender is not permitted to establish a legal guarding position.)

NCAA Rule Change: Preseason Practice

Women: shall not commence on-court preseason basketball practice sessions prior to 5 p.m. on the date that is 40 days prior to the date of the institution's first regular-season contest. An institution shall not engage in more than 30 days of countable athletically related activities prior to its first regular-season contest.

Expanded Expansion

With the addition of Missouri and Texas A&M, the SEC's television package will go from a viewership of 19 million homes to 30 million.

Head Coach Amanda Butler

Combine passion, pride, toughness, intensity, humor, wittiness, competitiveness, leadership and mix in a healthy dose of a swagger and you have Amanda Butler, who in 2011-12 is in her fifth year as head coach of the University of Florida women's basketball

Each of her first four Gator teams have earned a postseason berth - the first time any of the previous eight coaches in program history has been able to

Butler's four-year win total (78) with the Orange & Blue is already the most of any coach in program history through their respective first four seasons.

Butler also has made the O'Connell Center a tough venue for opponents, as her Gators have won 89.2 percent of their games against non-conference foes, posting a 33-4 home record during her four-year tenure.

In the 37-year history of the Florida women's basketball program, the team has posted 20 wins 10 times, with Butler accounting for two of those, including the 20-victory campaign in 2010-11.

That final 20-win season coming in 2010-11 was compiled by an extremely young and inexperienced team that returned only two starters and listed one scarcely-used senior on its roster

The 2008-09 season will go down as one of the most successful campaigns in program history. In addition to tying the school record with 24 victories during the year, Florida marched into the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in history. In the team's first trip to the round of 32 since 2004, the 2008-09 squad had its season close on the road at top-ranked and eventual NCAA champion Connecticut. Florida ended the year rated among the top-25 in both national polls for the first time since 2002.

When Florida earned the No. 23 spot in the Dec. 8, 2008 Associated Press national poll, Butler joined an elite list of women. She became one of only 24 women in the history of NCAA Division I women's basketball who had played for a team that was ranked in the AP Top-25 and later coached a team that earned a top-25 ranking. Even more rare was the fact the Butler played for and coached the SAME team that earned a top-25 ranking, becoming only the sixth woman ever to accomplish that

During Butler's four-year tutelage in Gainesville, a Gator has been named First-Team All-SEC three times and awarded a spot on the All-SEC Freshman Team three times, as well

During her two years as head coach at Charlotte, Butler compiled a 40-22 record that included two WNIT berths and a share of the 49ers first-ever Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season championship. Her debut season resulted in an overall record of 21-9, the most wins ever by a Charlotte coach in their first year, as Butler was recognized as the league's Coach of the Year.

Given her talents as a collegiate coach, it comes as no surprise that Butler has played a role in some of the most successful seasons in Florida history. Upon graduation, then-Florida coach Carol Ross hired Butler as the Gators' assistant coach. That 1995-96 squad compiled a 21-9 record and earned a berth into the NCAAs. The following season, the Gators won a program-record 24 games and advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament, falling to Old Dominion, 53-51.

Game 1: Michigan 69 d. Florida 66 Nov. 11, 2011 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Senior Jordan Jones knocked down a UF career-tying five three-pointers and rallied for 21 points – just shy of a her UF career-high 25 – but a physical back and forth battle with Michigan that consisted of 29 lead changes and 13 ties fell short for the Gators, 69-66, in the team's seasonopener Friday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

"You have to give Michigan a lot of credit for the way they played and the way they executed. They really looked like a solid and experienced veteran team," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "I thought they did an exceptional job of executing their game plan and what would be effective against us - I thought that we didn't, plain and simple. I felt we didn't do a good job of winning the paint. We shot way too many threes and a lot of them didn't make sense. My biggest disappointment in how we played was that we didn't pay enough attention to our defensive game. Luckily, this is our first game and not our last and we have, obviously, a lot of areas to improve and a great opportunity to do that when we play again on Monday."

A crowd of 3,028 gathered to watch Florida (0-1) open the 2011-12 season against Michigan

(1-0), and what a show they got. The Gators rallied for 10 treys, with five different student-athletes connecting from behind the arc, led by Jones' five, while sophomore Lily Syete knocked down two and senior Lanita Bartley and sophomores Jaterra Bonds and Kayla Lewis tallied one apiece.

Bartley (11) and Jones (21) each scored in double-digits as Jones achieved her 50th career double-figure scoring. For Bartley, it was the 11th of her Florida career. The Gators' starting lineup collaborated for 48 points and 20 of UF's 36 rebounds on the evening, while the bench chipped in 18 points and nine boards. Eight of UF's nine players put up points, while all nine grabbed at least one rebound, led by senior Azania Stewart's (Wood Green, England) six. Stewart was 3-for-5 from the floor and 2-for-3 from the charity stripe, finishing with eight points, but was strapped with foul trouble most of the evening.

Friday's contest was a fight until the end in the first meeting between Michigan and Florida neither team led by more than six points throughout the duration of the full 40 minutes - leading to a climatic finale that ended in a heartbreaker for the Gators.

With just under three minutes left in regulation, Bartley had success on a breakaway layup to

take Florida up, 60-59, after the Gators forced one of the Wolverines' 18 turnovers in the game, but Michigan responded with a Rachel Sheffer jumper to take UM up, 61-60. The final charge started when senior Ndidi Madu laid in a shot that put UF up, 62-61, with 2:03 on the clock, but Michigan's Carmen Reynolds countered with a three that gave the Wolverines momentum and a 64-62 advantage. Following a Jones foul, Courtney Boylan capitalized with an and-one layup that extended the UM lead, 67-62, following the free throw with 27 seconds remaining.

Florida was persistent, though, showing drive until the end as Stewart battled underneath, drawing a foul and knocking down one of two free throws to narrow the margin, 67-63, with 17.1 seconds on the clock. Reynolds' effort was relentless as the senior rallied for her final points on a layup with six seconds left that gave Michigan its largest lead of the game - six points the deal for the Wolverines with 69 points.

The Gators were able to tack on three more points on a Bonds three at the buzzer, but the Gators moved to 21-17 all-time on opening day as Michigan earned its first victory of the season in the first-ever meeting between the two programs.

Florida shot just 33.3 percent (23-69) overall from the floor, with a 10-of-27 effort from beyond the arc, while Michigan shot a steady 49.1 percent (27-55), with 5-of-12 from long range, while winning the rebounding battle 42-36 and outscoring the Gators 32-18 in the paint.

Florida women's basketball team used a strong defensive effort, holding Stetson to 28.3 percent (17-60) shooting from the field and forcing 17 turnovers, to pick up its first win of the 2011-12 campaign, 71-57, on Monday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The Gators were led by junior Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.), who tied a career-high with 21 points, on 9-of-16 shooting, and added nine rebounds.

"I was really proud with the way that we played down the stretch," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "I think that a lot of credit goes to our strength coach when you see the way we closed out the ball game in the last three minutes. I haven't looked at that segment statistically, but there is no question that our team had the energy to create our own momentum and make big plays. A lot of that was instigated by our defense and really just locking up and trying to take away some of the things that they had been successful with earlier in the ball game.

In addition to the 21 points from George, eight additional Gators scored, paced by Deana Allen (Houma, La.) and Jordan Jones (Suwanee, Ga.), who added 11 and nine points respectively to help balance out the UF offensive attack. For the game, the Orange and Blue shot 46.7 percent (28-60) and outscored Stetson by 26 points in the paint (46-20) to help secure its 13th consecutive victory over the Hatters (1-1).

The Hatters got out to quick start to begin the game, jumping out to an early 12-7 advantage before the Gators responded rallying off the next nine points behind a balanced effort which saw five different UF players contribute in the run. After the teams exchanged baskets for the next few minutes, Stetson closed the half on a 12-5 run to take a 30-29 lead into the half. George and Jones led the Gator charge in the first half with seven points apiece, while Allen added five and corralled seven boards. There were 10 lead changes and four tied scores during the first 20 minutes of action.

The Gators (1-1) set the tone for the rest of the game early in the second half, when they opened the frame with an 8-0 run, using three made jumpers and lockdown defense to force the Hatters into a timeout less than two minutes into the half. From there, UF kept up the pressure not allowing Stetson to get within four points the rest of the way as it cruised to the double-digit victory.

In the second half, the Gators outscored Stetson 42-27 behind an impressive 58.1 percent (18-31) shooting output and 14 points and five rebounds from George.

8-2 run after getting on the board first thanks to a Lanita Bartley layup and answered every Semi-nole run en route to a physical 72-58 upset victory over No. 21/19 (AP/ESPN Coaches) Florida State Thursday in the O'Connell Center.

Four Gators scored in double-digits, led by junior Jennifer George's 18 points - 14 of which George put up in the second half.

Sophomore Jaterra Bonds and senior Azania Stewart each grabbed a team-high six rebounds as Bonds chipped in 14 points and Stewart contributed 10 for the Gators (2-1) as the Orange and Blue served FSU (2-2) its second loss of the season. Senior Jordan Jones scored 14 points and grabbed two steals and a rebound as Florida halted FSU's two-game win streak in the series. Bartley dished out six assists, just one shy of her career-best seven, while Stewart also rallied for four blocks and two steals in the win

On sophomore Kayla Lewis' (Decatur, Ga.) 20th birthday, the Gators tallied their 46th all-time pset victory - the 24th in front of a home crowd - behind an aggressive offensive attack that saw UF shoot 46.8 percent from the floor, while holding the 'Noles to 35.5 percent. Lewis contributed four points and three rebounds in the win. Florida now has 26 upset wins when unranked, last defeating then-No. 22 Georgia at home, 74-71, Feb. 27 last season. UF was 12-for-14 (85.7 percent) from the charity stripe, worked the ball down low for 44 points in the paint, compared to FSU's 30, and capitalized on 15 fast break points to FSU's four.

The game was knotted just once, 2-2, at the 18:16 mark in the first half, but after a Jones jumper to go up, 4-2, UF never relinquished its lead, extending the largest margin to 14 points with a 41-27 halftime score. Florida State senior Cierra Bravard put up a team-high 22 points to lead the Seminoles' efforts, but Bravard fouled out with nearly five minutes remaining in the intra-state rivalry, Natasha Howard was FSU's only other double-digit scorer, with 16 points and a team-leading

After jumping out of the gate and surging to a 14-point halftime lead, an even battle ensued in the second half, but Florida never let the Seminoles closer than seven points within striking distance after FSU narrowed the UF margin, 53-46, with 12:33 on the clock.

Two defensive stands provided an entertaining finish down the stretch as both teams battled through a physical second-period contest. The Gators and Noles held each other scoreless for nearly a three-minute stretch from the 8:05 to the 5:11 mark in the final period, when senior Deana Allen (Houma, La.) knocked in two free throws after an Alexa Deluzio foul, resulting in a 68-54 score in favor of the Orange and Blue.

A Howard jumper for FSU and a Stewart layup for the Gators proved to be the only scoring for both teams from the 4:47 mark until one minute, 15 seconds remaining in the rivalry's regulation. Deluzio tacked on two more points in the form of two free throws and George sealed the deal with a layup just under a minute left, resulting in UF's 41st all-time victory over Florida State, a 72-58 success

It was Jones who led Florida on its first-half splurge, nailing a three with 29 seconds on the clock and following up with a fast break layup to take the Gators into the locker room ahead by 14 points at the half, 41-27. Jones rallied for 14 points alone in the first period of play, going 4-for-5 from the floor, including 1-for-2 from behind the arc and a perfect 5-for-5 from the charity stripe.

Florida shot 47.1 percent from the floor in the first period of play, holding FSU to just 37.5. As a team, UF's 7-for-7 mark from the free throw line led them to capitalize, along with 13 fast break points, compared to FSU's two and 14 points off turnovers to FSU's eight.

Game 4: Florida 63, Hampton 46 Nov. 22, 2011 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Fueled by the impressive play of its inside game, the University of Florida women's basketball team outrebounded Hampton by 14 and used a 43-point second half en route to a 63-46 victory Tuesday night at the O'Connell Center.

"I'm really proud in the way we played and in particular in the way we rebounded," Gator head coach Amanda Butler said. "Hampton is a very good ball club. We knew as evidence by their performance in the first half that we were going to have our hands full. We knew we were going to have to play significantly better than we played them last year and we also knew that winning the battle in the paint was going to be really huge for us. I am really proud of the way our players played and I'm proud of the way that our team prepared. The thing that is sustaining us right now is the way we are playing defense.

For the game, Florida (3-1) was led by junior forward Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.) who poured in 13 points and grabbed a game-high and career-tying 14 boards, to notch the first double-double by a Gator this year and the fifth of her career.

Senior forward Ndidi Madu (Antioch, Tenn.) collected a career-high 11 rebounds, with eight on the offensive end, while adding six points. Senior center Azania Stewart (Wood Green, England) anchored the paint with eight points, five rebounds and her second consecutive game with four blocked shots, as she and George combined to hit 10-of-13 from the floor.

Florida also received significant contributions from sophomore guard Jaterra Bonds (Gainesville, Fla.), who added 15 points by converting 9-of-10 free throws, and senior guard Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.), who tallied seven points, seven rebounds and a game-high four

Despite falling behind early and trailing for the majority of the first half, the Gators kept fighting and were able to rally from a 10-point deficit with 6:47 remaining in the opening frame to tie the score at 20 entering the locker room.

The Gators continued that momentum into the second half, coming out strong and scoring six of the first eight points, forcing the Lady Pirates (2-1) into an early timeout. The early run proved a sign of things to come, as Florida went on to outscore Hampton 43-26 in the second

The Gator offense seemed to wake up in the second half, shooting 43.8 percent (14-of-32) and converting on 14 free throws. As the offense picked up, the defense stayed strong again, holding Hampton to 30.8 percent (8-of-26) shooting and forcing 11 turnovers, which led to 12 Ga

In the first, the Gators used a balanced attack on offense with six players scoring paced by Bonds, who had seven points in 12 minutes of action. UF also used hardnosed defense to overcome the early deficit, which was as much as 10 points, holding Hampton to 27.6 percent (8-of-29) shooting in the first and forcing eight turnovers in the opening frame.

For the game, Florida shot 34.4 percent from the floor after a woeful start, and held Hampton to a 29.1 percent effort while forcing 19 Pirate turnovers that the Gators converted into 19 points. UF also won the rebounding battle 53-39 and charted 10 steals, the second time the team has reached a double-figure theft mark through four games this year.

Senior guard Deana Allen (Houma, La.) finished with a career-high four steals, while collecting seven rebounds.

Jordan Jones launched a Gator career-high 28 points, junior Jennifer George powered in her second consecutive double-double and Florida pulled away from La Salle for an 85-74 victory on the opening day of play at the Courtyard LaGuardia Turkey Classic held at the Wellness, Recreation and Athletic Center on the campus of LIU in Brooklyn, N.Y.

The win was the fourth straight for the Gators (4-1), who also received 16 points and nine rebounds from senior guard Lanita Bartley and 12 points and four assists from sophomore guard latera Bords

"I think today we had some really good individual performances," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "Obviously, Jordan (Jones') 28 points is very impressive and she shot the ball great. In the first half, (Jennifer) George really sustained us with her play in the paint. But there were some areas we need to quickly turn around and get better at tomorrow."

Jones nailed her fourth three-pointer of the game to begin the second half and give Florida a 44-38 lead, but La Salle charged back with a 6-1 run and got within one, 45-44, with 16:49 remaining

Jones answered with a runner in the paint and Bonds dropped in a floater, before the Explorers rallied with a 7-2 run and tied the game at 51 with 13:37 remaining.

Florida quickly regrouped, as Jones nailed another trey and Bartley connected on both ends of a 1-and-1 trip to the free throw line and stretched the lead back to five to begin a game-changing 16-4 spurt that gave the Gators a 71-57 advantage with 8:56 on the clock and Florida remained in charge for the duration of the game.

Four different Gators scored during the decisive run, with Jones and Bartley scoring six points each, George netting four points and Deana Allen, who finished with seven points and three steals, adding five points, including a three-pointer in front of the Gator bench that capped the run. Florida held the 43-35 rebounding advantage, snaring 22 offensive boards, while shooting

While Florida scored a season-high 85 points, the 74 points it surrendered is the most by an apponent this year.

George finished the game with 18 points and topped her career-high rebounding mark for the second consecutive game, collecting 15 against La Salle after her 14-rebound effort versus Hampton on Tuesday.

Jones connected on 9-of-18 shots overall, including 6-of-12 three-pointers and 4-of-4 from the free throw line. Her 28 points was three shy of the career mark she set during her freshman year at South Carolina.

Bartley helped set Florida's tone on both ends of the floor, but offensively she converted a game-high 7-of-8 from the free throw line, where the Gators shot 14-of-20.

The Gators came out sizzling behind the hot hand of Jones, who tallied of all her 11 points in the first 5:37 of the opening half. Bartley also found her shot early, contributing all of her eight points in the first 5:14.

Florida slowly added to its lead, as George, Bonds, Allen and Azania Stewart joined Jones and Bartley on the scoreboard and built a 29-15 lead with 7:40 remaining in the first half.

La Salle then ripped off an 11-2 run over the next 3:23 and cut Florida's lead to five, 31-36.

Senior Lanita Bartley scored a career-high 28 points and Florida hit 8-of-8 free throws in the final minute to seal an 82-73 victory against Charlotte Friday afternoon during the final day of play at the Courtyard LaGuardia Turkey Classic held at the Wellness, Recreation and Athletic Center on the campus of LIU in Brooklyn, N.Y.

The Gators (5-1), who won their fifth consecutive game, also got a double-figure scoring effort from Deana Allen and Jaterra Bonds, who both tallied 12 points and helped Florida avenge last year's season-ending loss in the third round of the WNIT to the 49ers (5-2). Jennifer George just missed her third straight double-double, finishing the game with nine points and nine rebounds, helping the Gators win the rebounding battle, 45-39, and take a 40-36 edge in points in the paint.

Florida overcame a seven-point deficit with 13:46 remaining and tied the score at 56 with 10:28 on the clock, as Bartley scored nine points, George four and Allen and Ndidi Madu a pair each during the stretch.

Bonds snapped the tie with a 15-foot jumper and then pushed the ball up the floor where she feed George who converted for a 60-56 lead and the Gators would never trail again.

Charlotte closed within three points twice on its next two offensive possessions, but Jordan Jones answered the first time with a floater in the lane and Bartley knocked down two free throws the second time.

Florida used a balanced offensive attack, which saw nine different players score, and a lockdown defensive performance to cruise to a 72-45 victory against Belmont Tuesday evening at the O'Connell Center.

"It was a great win for us, a great opportunity to try and spread our minutes around a little bit. It gave us an opportunity to work on things we don't always get to do during games," Gator head coach Amanda Butler said. "To have the type of balance and give everyone the opportunity at such quality minutes in a game situation is really valuable for our team going forward."

Florida (6-1) took advantage of 29 Belmont (1-6) turnovers by turning them into 44 points. The Gators also used their size to their advantage as they outscored the Bruins 34-16 in the paint to help them to the 27 point victory.

For the contest, the Gators (6-1) were led offensively by a trio of players who topped the 10-point mark led by Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.), who scored 15 points and shared team-high honors with six rebounds. Jordan Jones and Deana Allen combined for 31 points for Florida, but a season-high 22 turnovers proved to be costly for the Gators, who had their six-game win streak snapped to No. 11/12 Rutgers, which defeated Florida, 63-49, at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach

Rutgers (8-0) got double-doubles from Monique Oliver and Betnijah Laney, who collaborated for 23 points and 20 rebounds in the victory.

Jones and Allen led Florida (6-2) in scoring with 20 and 11 points, respectively, Jones' fourth double-digit outing of the season. Jennifer George led the Gators in rebounding with eight boards, including seven defensive. Azania Stewart eclipsed 150 career blocks with two against Rutgers, now owning 151 wearing a Gator uniform. Allen was 7-for-8 from the free-throw line, while Jones was a perfect 5-for-5. Rutgers shot 40.7 percent from the floor, while Florida was 31.9 percent from the floor. The Gators were 75 percent from thel ine behind a 15-for-20 effort.

Florida took an 18-16 lead with 8:18 remaining in the first half but went cold from the floor, as Rutgers closed the period on a 8-2 run and took a 24-20 lead at the break. The Scarlet Knights continued that run into the second half, as they mounted a 20-5 run that spanned 13:06 from the last two minutes of the first half until the 14:42 mark in the second half, resulting in a 36-23, margin. The Gators were held scoreless after a Ndidi Madu jumper with 2:50 left in the first half until Allen hit a free throw at the 16:46 mark in the second period. Despite a 15-point Rutgers advantage with 11:17 remaining in the match-up following two Florida turnovers in less than a minute that allowed the Knights to score four on layups, the Gators showed fight amid a 40-27 point differential, slowly closing the gap over the next five minutes. Jones took the game into her control, scoring Florida's next eight points off two jumpers, including an and-one free throw shot, and a three-pointer, Allen nailed two free throws before Jones swooshed her third and final 3-pointer with 5:37 on the clock to bring the Gators within nine, 40-49.

The Gators continued the surge with a layup from Jaterra Bonds that narrowed the margin 42-49, but Rutgers scored the next six points to go up, 55-42 with 1:35 on the clock and never looked back as the teams kept it fairly even to the end, with UF tallying seven points in the final minute thanks to a George layup and five free throws, while Rutgers tallied eight more points for its eighth victory of the 2011-12 season.

After the Gators won the opening tip-off, Rutgers' April Sykes drained a three to put the Scar-let Knights on the board first, but Jones quickly countered with a floater, an indication of the physical back and forth battle that would ensue in the first half. Despite 12 first-half Florida turnovers, the Gators were within four at halftime, 24-20, in favor of Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights relied on four three-pointers for 12 of their first-half points, as the squad shot 44.4 percent from behind the arc.

Both teams shot just 32 percent from the field in the first period, led by Jones seven points, while Allen and Madu each chipped in four. Rutgers' Betnijah Laney led the Scarlet Knights with seven points, while Monique Oliver grabbed seven boards. RU capitalized on four fast-break points to UF's zero, 10 second-chance points compared to Florida's four, scored 10 points in the paint and nine points off UF's 12 turnovers. Junior Jennifer George scored a career-high 24 points and notched her third double-double of the year to lead a balanced offensive showing that featured all 10 Gators in uniform scoring in Florida's 91-68 victory against San Francisco Wednesday night at War Memorial Gym.

Florida (7-2) earned its first true road win in its first attempt of the season, as the Gators bounced back from their tough loss to No. 11 Rutgers in their last game. The Dons (1-9) lost their eighth straight.

The Gators used a 17-0 run early in the first half to take a 13-point lead and added to that margin with a 9-2 spurt later in the period en route to a 46-28 halftime lead. Florida continued its intensity in the second half and slowly extended its lead with a 16-9 run to begin the final frame, as the Gator assumed a 25-point advantage and never looked back.

In addition to her career-high scoring performance that came on 11-of-16 shooting, George collected 11 rebounds for her seventh career double-double and helped the Gators overwhelm the Dons on the boards, 56-30, while holding the hosts without an offensive rebound for the entire first half. USF finished with six in game, while Florida snared 25 of the offensive side, with George responsible for seven of those.

Senior Azania Stewart also collected a season-high 11 rebounds while adding nine points and a pair of blocked shots. Seniors Lanita Bartley and Deana Allen both scored 11 points, with Allen snaring seven rebounds.

A couple of Gators tallied a season-high scoring performances, with freshman Andrea Vilaró Aragonés scoring seven points in 13 minutes and sophomore Lily Svete accounting for five. Sacramento-native Brittany Shine also scored seven points, giving the few dozen hometown fans in attendance a lot to cheer about during the Gator win that saw them score a season-high 91 points. Sophomore Jaterra Bonds recorded seven points with a team-high three assists and three steals, helping the Gators collect 11 thefts.

Rheina Ale led San Francisco with 19 points, while Kate Keating had 14 and Aundrea Gordon 12 for the Dons, who committed 18 turnovers that the Gator converted into 26 points.

Rheina Ale, who was honored during a pregame ceremony for scoring her 1,000th-career point, ended Florida's run with an eight-footer from the left side that started a 7-2 run and closed the Gator lead to eight points, 27-19, with 7:32 to play.

The teams traded scores for the next two minutes, with Allen hitting a pull-up, 17-footer in a transition bucket with a feed from Bonds, and George connecting on the other basket inside.

Jennifer George powered up her second consecutive double-double and fourth of the year but it wasn't enough as the Gators lost at the University of the Pacific, 78-73, Friday evening. Florida actually made one more field goal than the hosts, but the Tigers connected on 11-of-16 three-pointers and corralled 20 offensive rebounds that they turned into 22 second-chance points to win their fourth consecutive game.

George finished the game with 14 points and 14 rebounds, while Azania Stewart pulled down 10 rebounds to help Florida out-rebound Pacific, 52-35. Stewart also blocked a career-high six shots for the Gators, who turned the ball over 22 times and resulted in 25 Tiger points.

Jaterra Bonds finished with 13 points and four assists, while Lanita Bartley added 11 points with four assists and four steals and Jordan Jones tallied 10 points with three steals.

The Gators (7-3) began the second half on a 7-3 run and cut their eight-point halftime deficit to four points, 43-39. After the teams traded scores Pacific knocked down its seventh three-pointer of the game and another within the next two minutes as part of a 9-2 spurt and reclaimed a double-digit lead, 54-43, with 12:08 remaining.

Jordan Jones ended the run with a three-pointer for the Gators, who traded buckets for the next minute, with Jaterra Bonds hitting an eight-foot pull-up jumper in the paint. Pacific, however, answered with a score and kept its 10-point lead, 58-48, with 11:03 to go in the game.

Ndidi Madu then knocked down a 16-footer and started a 9-0 run that began a 13-3 overall spurt that tied the game at 61 with 4:58 remaining. Both teams scored on their next offensive trips and Pacific then nailed its 10th 3-pointer and took a three-point lead with 4:15 on the clock.

Azania Stewart skied for an offensive rebound and put back a miss and had Florida within one, 66-65, with 3:34 to go, but Pacific regrouped with the next five points, including four dropping as the shot clock expired. Florida tried one last rally, scoring the next three points, with Bonds hitting one free throw and Madu collecting the miss on her second attempt and putting it back in with 23.6 seconds remaining and brought the Gators within three points, 71-68.

Kendall Rodriguez then iced the game by hitting four consecutive free throws and finishing the game with 19 points and six of Pacific's 15 steals. Erica McKenzie was the star of the game, as she converted 7-of-8 three-pointers and ended with a game-high 23 points. Ashley Wakefield tallied a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds for the Tigers, who shot 40.6 percent overall from the floor and 15-of-17 from the free throw line.

Florida trailed at halftime for the fourth time this season, taking a 40-32 deficit into the locker room. After Pacific scored the first two buckets of the game, Florida staged an 8-3 run with scoring from Lanita Bartley, Jennifer George, Jordan Jones and Deana Allen and took an 8-7 lead with 15-40 to go in the half

Florida's lead was short-lived, as the Tigers countered with a 12-0 march over the next 3:20 and assumed a 19-8 lead that caused the Gators to call a timeout. George responded with an inside bucket out of the timeout, but Erica McKenzie fired up one of her four first-half three-pointers and gave Pacific a 22-10 lead with 10:56 on the clock. Allen then scored the next four points, the second set coming after Stewart blocked a shot, Jones corralled the defensive rebound and dished to Allen to complete the transition bucket. Jones was then the recipient of a long outlet from George, who collected a Tiger miss and capped a 6-0 stretch that initiated a 22-9 Gator run and put Florida ahead, 32-31. Jones capped the stint with a three-pointer from the top of the key with 3:25 to go in the half, marking the sixth consecutive game she has hit one from deep. Once again, UF's lead was short-lived, as the Gators went cold from the floor and wouldn't score again during the period and Pacific rattled off the final nine points of the frame for the eight-point halftime advantage.

Florida used a balanced offensive attack, which saw three players score in double figures, and stifling defense to down Charleston Southern, 83-59, Tuesday evening on the opening day of the 2011 Gator Holiday Classic.

For the contest, UF was led by a trio of players who scored in double figures, as senior guard Jordan Jones (Suwanee, Ga.) scored 20 points on 7-of-13 shooting and added three assists along with three steals. Junior forward Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.) scored all 19 of her points in the first half on 9-of-9 shooting, before collecting six more rebounds in the second to post her third consecutive double-double with 10 boards to headline Florida's 43-33 rebounding advantage.

Sophomore guard Brittany Shine (Sacramento, Calif.) scored a season-high 14 points to lead Florida's bench brigade.

"Obviously (Jennifer) George got us out of the gates quickly," Butler said. "One of the most impressive stats looking at the stat sheet was our bench out-scoring their bench, 30-4. We expect to go deep into our bench and get production. It was a good win against a good team."

The Gators jumped out to an early 17-6 advantage less than seven minutes into the game behind a quick 13 points on 6-of-6 shooting from George. Florida was able to push its lead to 12 as Jones poured in a trio of threes. The Buccaneers fought back and were able to cut the UF lead to eight entering the halftime break. In the first half, George was a perfect nine-for-nine from the field and one-of-one from the line for 19 points. Jones added 14 of her own in the first to give the Gators a 42-34 advantage heading into the locker room.

Florida dished a season-high 22 assists on its 31 field goals, paced by sophomore Jaterra Bond (Gainesville, Fla.), who provided a career-best nine.

Game 10: Florida 62, Duquesne 49 (Gator Holiday Classic Championship) Dec. 21, 2011 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Junior Jennifer George posted her fourth consecutive double-double and guided Florida to a hard-fought 62-49 victory against Duquesne Wednesday evening in the championship game of the 21st annual Gator Holiday Classic held at the O'Connell Center.

George was named the tournament's Most Valuable Performer after scoring 15 points with 13 rebounds and becoming the first Gator to tally four straight double-doubles since Vanessa Hayden strung together five such performances midway through the 2003-04 season.

Joining George on the All-Tournament Team were teammates Jordan Jones, who scored a team-best 18 points in the title game, and sophomore guard Jaterra Bonds, who scored a season-high 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting against Duquesne (10-2), which had its program-record eight-game win streak come to an end.

UF also used lockdown defense to secure the victory, limiting the Dukes, who entered the contest ranked 16th in the nation scoring an average of 77.3 points per game, to a mere 49 points on 32.8 percent from the field. Additionally, the Gators were able to shutout the Dukes from distance, as Duquesne went 0-for-19 from three-point arc.

For the second straight evening the Gators (9-3) ripped out of the halftime locker room with great energy and scored the first 11 points to extend their one-point lead to a 33-21 advantage with 16:23 remaining in the game.

Jones nailed a three-pointer 15 seconds into the second half and Florida rode that momentum to start an 11-0 run and extend its one-point lead to a 33-21 advantage with 16:23 remaining in the game.

Duquesne scored its first points of the second half at the 15:56 mark after missing its first six shots. The Dukes refused to go away and were able to cut UF's advantage to three, 39-36 with 9:58 remaining. Bonds then nailed a three-pointer and sparked a 7-0 spurt, pushing the Gator lead to back 10 points, 46-36, with 8:16 to play.

Duquesne made one last puch, cutting UF's cushion to five, 50-45, with 4:11 left but the Gators again responded, scoring the next six points as Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.) converted one free throw, George hit a tough inside jumper and Jones nailed her third triple of the game and Florida held a 56-45 cushion with 2:11 on the clock.

From that point forward, Bonds nailed a jumper and Jones went 4-for-4 from the free throw line to seal the victory.

Orsi Szecsi led Duquesne with 15 points and earned a spot on the all-tournament team, while Wumi Agunbiade added 13 points and a team-high eight rebounds for the Dukes.

Bonds continued her march and scored again with 4:19 remaining in the half to give Florida a 17-15 lead, its first of the game. Jones followed with a free throw and before she nailed the 250th three-pointer of her career that gave Florida a 22-19 lead with 48 seconds left in the opening frame and it would never trail again.

Florida utilized steady shooting and strong play on the glass to take down the Samford Bulldogs, 81-56, Wednesday evening in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Gator's 81 points were their second-highest scoring total at home this season (83, Charleston Southern, Dec. 20), as Florida closed its non-Southeastern Conference slate with its 10th victory of the year.

Five Gators scored in double-digits on Wednesday night, led by junior forward Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.). The reigning SEC Player of the Week notched her fifth consecutive doubledouble, scoring 10 points and nabbing 13 boards, as Florida dominated the rebounding battle, 43-20. The 20 total rebounds were Samford's fewest this season

The Gators' persistence on the glass paid off, as Florida (10-3) tallied 19 second-chance points thanks to 21 offensive rebounds.

Senior guard Deana Allen (Houma, La.) led all players with a season-high 17 points on the evening, just one shy of her career high. Senior guard Jordan Jones (Suwanee, Ga.) had her eighth double-digit scoring performance of the season with 13 points, including her fifth outing with three or more three-pointers. Sophomore guard Jaterra Bonds (Gainesville, Fla.) and senior guard Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.) scored 15 and 10 points against the Bulldogs, respectively

Florida shot 49.2 percent from the floor, its second-high mark this year, while Samford (6-6) connected on 43.6 percent from the field.

The second half played out similarly to the first, as Jones hit her third three-pointer of the game just 39 ticks into the second stanza. Florida continued its momentum from the first half, going on a 7-0 run to open the half.

Allen's jumper with 15 minutes remaining in the game gave Florida its largest lead of the night, as the Gators led 59-31.

Senior forward Azania Stewart (Wood Green, England) scored three straight buckets late in the second half, putting Florida ahead at 75-52. The Gators continued to push, holding the Bulldogs to just three points in the closing minutes of the half.

Jones got the scoring started for the Gators, knocking down the Orange and Blue's first trey

of the night at the 19:43 mark of the first half. Bonds wasn't too far behind with a trey of her own less than two minutes later, sparking a 15-0 Gator run over the next 4:24.

Florida led by as many as 22 in the first stanza, as Bonds hit a three-pointer with 9:55

remaining in the half. The Bulldogs began to chip away at the Gator lead, pulling within 11 courtesy of back-to-back free throws by Samford's Taylor Reece. Jones answered, nailing a trey to put the Gators up by 14 with less than four minutes remaining in the first.

Samford continued to surge, cutting the Florida lead to 10 with 2:09 to go in the half. The Orange and Blue recaptured the momentum, finishing the half on a 7-0 run. A George free throw began the scoring run and a Bartley offensive board and ensuing layup put the Gators up by 13

Stewart put on a defensive showcase, blocking two shots and pulling down two defensive boards in less than a minute to hold the Bulldogs scoreless down the stretch. Bonds hit a jumper with 12 seconds remaining in the half to give the Gators a 43-26 advantage heading into halftime.

Jennifer George had her sixth straight double-double and senior guard Deana Allen led the Gators in scoring for the second straight contest, but it wasn't enough as Florida fell to No. 6 Kentucky, 59-56, in both team's respective SEC openers on Sunday afternoon.

George put up another solid overall performance with 10 points and 11 rebounds against the 'Cats, including seven offensive boards. George also had two blocks, becoming the eighth Gator to swat 100 or more in her career. Allen had 12 points on the afternoon, including going 2-for-4 from beyond three-point arc. In all, Florida had four players in double-figure points, the second consecutive contest with at least four Gators in double-digit scoring. Redshirt senior Ndidi Madu tallied 11 points against the 'Cats, while sophomore guard Jaterra Bonds registered 10 points.

The Gators (10-4, 0-1 SEC) outrebounded their opponent for the 11th consecutive game, on Sunday registering a 44-42 advantage against the Wildcats thanks in part to the 11 boards from George and the 10 from senior center Azania Stewart, who also collected a career-high five steals to go along with a pair of blocked shots, as increased her career swat total to 170.

Florida turned the ball over a season-high 23 times, resulting in 20 UK points. The Gators also shot just 32.8 percent from the floor (20-61) and hit 11-of-19 free throws.

Bonds opened the scoring in the second half, hitting a jumper just 2:15 into the second. Allen hit a jumper to tie the game at 33-33. Kentucky answered with a layup by Kastine Evans but Madu put UF right back in it with a deep jumper at the 15:23 mark courtesy of a dish by Bartley.

UF had a couple opportunities to take lead in second half when the scored was tied at 35,

but couldn't, as UK eventually found its stroke and scored five straight to take a 40-35 lead midway through the second half. Deana Allen helped the Gators close the gap, as she nailed a pair of three-pointers on consecutive possessions and had Florida within two, 42-40, with 10:44 to play Neither team could scored for the next four minutes until Stewart knocked down one free throw with 8:19 remaining and drew the Gators within 42-41.

Kentucky, however, came right down and Samarie Walked scored inside on back-to-back possessions, building the Wildcat's lead back to five points with 7:37 to play. Allen struck again with her third three-pointer of the game and the Gators were within two, 46-44, with 6:36 on the clock.

A'dia Mathies, who finished with a team-high 14 points, converted a layup and put Kentucky ahead by four, 48-44, before Evans stole the ball and sparked a 4-0 run that put Kentucky ahead, 50-45. Out of the final media timeout, a Brittany Henderson layup gave Kentucky (12-2, 1-0 SEC) one of its largest leads of the contest, 52-45. Two made free throws by senior guard Lanita Bartley, her first points of the afternoon, put Florida back within five with just 2:26 to go in the game.

Kentucky's Amber Smith hit a trey as the shot clock ticked down to put the 'Cats ahead by its

largest lead of the afternoon, 55-47, but redshirt senior Jordan Jones knocked down her first trey of the game, as the Gators remained within five with less than a minute remaining.

A Kentucky shot-clock violation gave Florida possession but a costly turnover put the ball back in the hands of the 'Cats. After a make and a miss from the charity stripe for Kentucky's Smith, Bonds drove hard in the paint to put Florida back within four, 56-52, with just 19 ticks remaining in the game. Smith returned to the line and hit both free throws but Bartley raced to the other end to put up a layup with 8.7 seconds to play. The next possession seemed to be much of the same, as Smith hit both shots from the charity stripe and Allen sped to lay it in to pull Florida within three, 59-56, with just one second remaining as Kentucky claimed the victory.

In the final 37 seconds of the first half, Mathies, who had been scoreless to that point in the game, got loose and nailed back-to-back three-pointers, forcing a Gator turnover in between, that ave the Wildcats a 33-29 halftime lead and the momentum heading into the locker room

Jordan Jones nailed a three-pointer late, Jennifer George posted her seventh consecutive double-double and Florida defeated Ole Miss, 58-53, at Tad Smith Coliseum on Thursday evening. After Ole Miss cut Florida's lead to four points late, Jones stepped up and nailed her fourth

three-pointer of the game and gave the Gators a 58-51 lead with 3:13 remaining, as Florida held on to collect its first Southeastern Conference road win of the season. George finished with 18 points and 11 rebounds while dishing three assists, as her double-

double streak of seven is tied for the sixth longest streak in program history. Jones also scored 18 points, converting 6-of-9 overall from the floor, including 4-of-7 from beyond the arc.

The Gators shot 35.6 percent overall from the floor, while Ole Miss (10-5, 0-2 SEC) hit 38.1 percent overall and just 2-of-17 from the three-point arc.

UM's Nikki Byrd led the Rebels with 13 points and 11 rebounds, while Valencia McFarland added 13 points and Kenyotta Jenkins at 10 points and 10 rebounds, helping Ole Miss out-rebound Florida, 43-37, and snap the Gator's 11 game run of winning the battle of the boards.

After Ole Miss cut Florida's halftime lead to five points, 37-32, the Gators used a 9-2 run to take a 46-34 advantage with 16:24 remaining, as Jordan Jones scored five during the span and Azania Stewart and Jennifer George both dropped in two. The Rebels responded by scoring the next eight points of the game over a 4:20 span and closed within four points, 46-42, with 11:42 on the clock. George halted the run with one free throw, but Ole Miss continued its march with an inside bucket from LaTosha Laws, as the Rebels crept within three points with 11:17 to go

Florida had a couple chances to build on its lead, but missed chip shots inside and turned the ball over. Ole Miss couldn't take advantage and George ended both team's respective dry spells with an offensive rebound put-back with 9:07 remaining. George then converted one of two free throws and had the Gators ahead 50-44, before Florida turned up its defensive pressure and forced a shot clock violation with just under eight minutes remaining. Jones came out hot from the media timeout and nailed her second three-pointer of the game and gave Florida a 53-44 lead with

7:37 remaining. Ole Miss answered with a 5-0 run, capped by a three-point play from Nikki Byrd.

Azania Stewart stepped out and hit a 12-foot jumper, before Byrd hit two more free throws and kept the Gator lead at four points, 55-51, with 4:19 to go.

Neither team could convert offensively for the next two minutes, before Jones canned a three-pointer in front of the Gator bench and lifted UF to a 58-51 advantage with 3:13 on the clock Maggie McFerrin scored a deep bucket with 1:46 to go and cut the lead to five with 1:46.

Lanita Bartley, who was hampered in the second half with an ankle sprain, hit one free throw with 38.8 seconds remaining and gave the Gators a 59-53 lead, but Ole Miss continued to press and Kenyotta Jenkins put back an offensive rebound and had the Rebels within four points with 17 seconds remaining. Jones had a chance to seal the game at the line, but missed the front end of a one-and-one, giving life to the Rebels, who were unable to close the gap and the Gators walked off with their first SEC road win of the year.

Florida got off to a slow start, turning the ball over three times in its first four offensive possessions, while Ole Miss jumped out to a quick 9-2 lead. The Gators managed to attempt just three shots over the opening four-plus minutes of the game, while the Rebels connected on 4-of-10 during the early span. The Rebels continued their game-opening spurt with another bucket and extended their lead to nine points. Deana Allen ended the run with a three-pointer from the left side at the 14:32 mark and the teams traded buckets, with Florida's coming from Stewart, who knocked down a 16-footer from straight away and ignited a 13-0 run over the next 5:06, as Allen, Jones and Andrea Vilaró Aragonés also scored during the stretch and gave the Gators an 18-13 lead

For the second consecutive game Florida couldn't overcome a woeful first half and dropped a tough 61-55 decision at No. 19/16 Georgia Thursday at Stegeman Coliseum in front of 2,832 Bulldog fans. The Gators (11-6, 1-3 SEC) trailed 29-16 at halftime, but outscored the Bulldogs 39-32 in the second half, as all four of UF's SEC games have been decided by six points or less.

After Georgia scored the first points of the second to take a 15-point lead, UF began trading scores and eventually chipping away at the deficit. The first such spark was after back-to-back buckets from Azania Stewart and Deana Allen got Florida within 10 points, 48-38, with 12:42 remaining. The Gators had a two opportunities to get even closer, but turned the ball over both times.

Following a score from Anne Marie Armstrong, who finished with 19 points, that helped Georgia to a 40-28 advantage, the Gators ripped off a 9-0 run, with three-pointers from Allen and Jordan Jones and a three-point play from Jennifer George and Florida was within three points, 40-37 with 9:26 remaining.

Georgia came right back with a three-pointer from Khaalidah Miller and Krista Donald followed with a jumper that took the Bulldogs back to an eight-point lead with 7:23 on the clock. Allen hit a tough jumper, before Georgia scored for straight points and took a 10-point lead.

George scored for Florida, but Georgia answered, before Jones knocked down a 25-footer with just under four minutes remaining and started a 8-2 run that had Florida within four points, 53-49, with 2:31 remaining. The turnover bug bit again and Georgia took advantage by countering with the next three points.

Allen came away with one of her four steals and dribbled the length of the court for the layup and UF was within five, 56-51, with 65 seconds left. UF missed a pair of point-blank layups in the final 90 seconds of the game and UG came down the court and capitalized both times, tacking on three points when the Gators could have had four points with makes and would never recover.

George led Florida with 15 points and eight rebounds, but had her double-double streak

halted at eight. Allen finished with 14 points, six rebounds and four steals, while Jones added 13 points. Lanita Bartley tallied eight rebounds, helping Florida win the rebounding battle, 38-30. Florida committed a season-high 23 turnovers that resulted in 22 Georgia points, The

Bulldogs, however, committed 24 miscues that the Gators converted into 25 points. The Gators shot 33.3 percent overall for the game, hitting 22-of-66 of their shots. They attempted 24 more shots than their hosts, who converted 47.6 percent on 20-of-42 shooting. The Bulldogs also helped themselves at the charity stripe, where they sank 18-of-22, while Florida managed just 6-of-11

UF has played 45 games over the last two-plus seasons decided by 10 points or less, including seven this year. The last six games in the UF-UG series have been decided by single digits.

UF struggled to find its shot in the first half, yet trailed just one, 7-6, seven and a half minutes into the contest as the team hit 2-of-14 to begin the game. While Georgia didn't struggle as much as the Gators, they didn't attempt nearly as many shots. The teams exchanged scores until the 11-minute mark of the half, when Khaalidah Miller scored five straight points and sparked a 10-2 run and Georgia led 19-10 with 6:32 remaining in the first half. Stewart and George worked the high-low game to perfection in providing UF's lone score during the spree, as George dropped in two of her eight points during the opening 20 minutes of action. The teams played even ball for the next five minutes before the Bulldogs closed the half netting the final six points to take a 29-16 halftime advantage. UF had the ball for the last possession of the period with the ability to cut its deficit to single digits. Instead, the Gators committed their 12th turnover of the half with an errant pass at the top of the key and Armstrong picked off the pass and dribbled the length of the court and dropped in a layup with one second remaining

The University of Florida women's basketball team used a balanced offensive attack, which saw all 10 players record at least two points, and a lockdown defense to hand LSU its first Southeastern Conference loss, 62-58, Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Redshirt senior Jordan Jones led the offensive charge for the Orange and Blue scoring 11 of her 16 points in the second half to help UF to the victory. Ndidi Madu and Jaterra Bonds each added nine points for the Gators who improved to 12-6 overall and 2-3 in SEC play with the victory The balanced attack helped UF earn a key 18-12 advantage in bench scoring.

The win for UF was the first for UF coach Amanda Butler against LSU and has now earned at least one win against each of the other SEC schools. Sunday's victory marked Florida's first against the Tigers since a 79-78 overtime victory on Feb. 16, 2006.

After the first six minutes of the game saw the two teams go back-and-forth, the Gators went on an 18-4 run to push their advantage to 30-16. The run was sparked by a stout defense effort, which held the Tigers without a field goal for 10 minutes and 14 seconds of game action. LSU refused to back down and cut the Gator lead to 32-25 at the half.

UF used a balanced attack in the first half as nine different Gators etched their names in the score book. The balanced attack started early as each of UF's first seven field goals came from a different player before Jones added her second field goal at the 11:02 mark. Lilly Svete led the UF charge in the first with six points on a pair of threes, while Madu and Jones added five each. On the glass in the first, UF was paced by Allen who had six rebounds.

The second half saw Jennifer George, who was hampered with three early fouls and was the only Gator who played in the first half that didn't score, set the tone for UF as she scored two early baskets, which were followed by a Jones three that pushed the Florida advantage to 14 points,

LSU (13-4, 4-1 SEC) responded by going on a 7-0 run of its own and closed within seven, 43-36, with 10:58 remaining, before Bonds converted on a layup off of a two-on-one fast break taking a beautiful pass from Lanita Bartley, who dished a game-high six assists, a marked tied for her season-high.

The Bonds layup seemed to spark the Gators as they scored eight of the next 10 points behind a pair of deep threes from Jones and a foul line jumper from Madu that pushed UF's advantage back to 15 points, 53-38, with 7:39 on the clock.

As was the case earlier in the game, the Tigers refused to go away and cut the UF lead to two, 55-53, on a basket and the foul from Courtney Jones with 2:35 left in the game. George quickly answered with a fastbreak layup to push the lead back to two possessions. From there, Florida was able to play tough defense and hit 5-of-9 free throws down the stretch, including two from Bonds after the LSU was within four, 57-53, with 1:23 remaining, and two from Madu, who sank both with 15 seconds on the clock that pushed UF's lead back to eight, 62-54, to hang on for the four-point victory. Each of the Gator's five SEC games has been decided by six or less points this year.

LaSondra Barrett led all scorers and rebounders with 17 and 11, respectively, for LSU, which had its 10-game win streak snapped and surrendered the third most points it had allowed all season. The Gators also halted their five-game slide against the Tigers. Courtney Jones added 15 points and eight rebounds, as the Tigers held the 43-41 rebounding edge, as well as outscore the Gators 30-24 in the paint and tally 18 second-chance points, compared to UF's 11.

The Gators used stifling defense, which held Alabama to 24.6 percent shooting from the field, and a monster performance from junior Jennifer George to down the Crimson Tide, 61-37, Thursday at the O'Connell Center. The Orange and Blue defense was the difference maker in the game as UF held Alabama to 25 percent shooting in the first half and 24.2 percent shooting in the second half. Additionally, the Gators forced 18 turnovers which led to 22 points. The offense was also efficient on the evening as the Gators recorded 19 assists on their 25 made field goals.

George led the way for the Gators with an impressive 15-point, 12-rebound, five-block performance, tallying her 11th double-double of the year and 15th of her career. George, who hit 5-of-6 shots in the second half and 7-of-16 for the game, wasn't alone in her strong individual performance, as five additional Gators scored seven or more points led by senior Azania Stewart, who chipped in eight points, 10 boards and four blocked shots, and senior Jordan Jones, who had seven points, a career-high-tying seven rebounds and five assists. Senior Lanita Bartley dished a season-high seven assists while collecting a game-high five steals.

The Gators missed their first nine shots and began the game hitting just 12.5% (2-16) from the floor during the opening 7:39 minutes, yet trailed only 7-6 with 12:33 on the clock, as the Tide didn't connect any easier, converting 20 percent on 3-of-15

Stewart sank her second shot in as many tries as one of the few Gators who were sharp from the get-go, connecting on a jumper inside that gave Florida a 8-7 lead with 12:21 on the clock

Krya Crosby, who was equally as sharp for her team and finished with a Tide-best 14 points, tallied her third field goal in as many attempts and put Alabama back on top, before Jasmine Rob-inson followed with a jumper that had the Tide up three, 11-8, with 11:13 on the clock. On Florida's next offensive possession, Jordan Jones nailed a 25-foot three-pointer as the shot clock expired and tied the game at 11 with 10:39 remaining. The Gators forced a stop and Deana Allen added a 12-footer before Bartley collected a steal off the Tide in-bounds play. Bartley passed to Allen, who found Jaterra Bonds on the wing where she knocked down her 15th three-pointer of the season that gave UF a 16-11 lead with 9:18 to go.
Florida continued its defensive pressure and Barley came up with another steal, which she

took the length of the court for a layup and an 18-11 Gator advantage. Bartley again came away with another steal, but the Gators couldn't capitalize. Alabama missed an inside jumper and George collected the miss, but again Florida came away empty, committing its third turnover of the contest.

Florida held firm defensively and limited the Tide to one shot attempt on their next possession. The Gators also missed their try and Alabama game away with a layup from Meghan Perkins, who ended Florida's 10-0 run. Florida continued its scoring spurt with one free throw from George and an long jumper from Jones, who tacked on another running jumper and extended the march to 15-2 over a 4:24 span, as Florida took a 23-13 lead with 6:15 remaining. After Florida forced a shot clock violation, Jones collected an offensive rebound and Bonds sank a driving layup as the Gator's shot clock expired and continued the run, 25-13. Lily Svete came off the bench and added a three-pointer from the top of the arc and Florida kept the momentum. Deana Allen added to the long-range barrage by connecting from beyond the arc with 3:50 remaining that gave Florida a 31-13 lead and forced Alabama to call a timeout, as the Tide tried to find a way to stop the Gator's 23-2 run that spread over a 6:49 span. Celiscia Farmer ended the long march after Jessica Merritt collected a long defensive rebound and dished off to Farmer, who converted the layup at the 2:37 mark, as Florida held a 31-15 lead. George, who finished the first half with five points, nine rebounds and three blocked shots, came back with her second field goal of the contest for her fifth point, before Alabama came right back with a bucket inside with 47 seconds remaining to end the first half scoring with the Gators taking a 33-17 lead.

Florida whittled a 15-point deficit down to two but was unable to complete what would have been a stirring upset against the sixth-ranked Kentucky Wildcats, who captured the 57-52 decision on Sunday in front of a sold-out crowd of 7,888 in Memorial Coliseum.

Jennifer George posted her Southeastern Conference-leading fifth double-double in seven league games, as well as her 12th this season, contributing 10 points and 11 rebounds with three steals and three blocks for the Gators, who were led in scoring by Jordan Jones, who scored a game-high 13 points. Jaterra Bonds also scored 10 points for Florida, which has lost its last three games in the series against the Wildcats by a total of nine points.

With Florida holding a 21-16 lead with 3:18 remaining in the first half, Kentucky went on a 22-2 run that spanned the final three minutes of the first half and the first six and half minutes of the second and took a 38-23 lead with 13:27 remaining. The Gators answered with the next six points and seemingly traded scores with the Wildcats for the next eight minutes before ripping off an 8-0 run and were within two points with 27 seconds remaining. Kentucky stepped up at the free throw line where it scored its final seven points to fend off Florida's rally and hopes of an upset.

The Gators collected themselves after the devastating 22-2 Wildcat march and scored six

consecutive points and dropped their deficit to single digits after Azania Stewart, Jaterra Bonds and Ndidi Madu each contributed. Florida had a couple of chances to get even but turned the ball over three times and the Wildcats were able to get themselves to the free throw line where they knocked down 3-of-4 and took a 41-29 lead.

Bonds then banked in a three-pointer and had Florida within nine points, 41-32, with 9:40 remaining. Brittany Shine added two free throws at the 8:02 mark and the Gators clawed to within seven points, 41-34. Kentucky halted its six-minute field goal drought when Brittany Henderson hit one from under the basket, before the Gators committed their 22nd turnover the contest and gave the ball back to the Wildcats. Florida forced a long shot from the Wildcats, who missed, but corralled the offensive board. The Gators then sent Kastine Evans to the free throw line for three attempts, as she made two and gave UK a 45-34 lead with 6:41 remaining. The teams then traded scores for the next minute, with the Gator getting makes from George, Bonds and Jones and helping UF remain within nine points, 49-40, with 5:04 remaining. After the scoring frenzy, neither team scored for the next minute before UK hit one free throw, followed by four straight points from George, who brought the Gators within six points, 50-44, with 2:58 remaining. George, however, then missed the front end of a one-and-one, the third by a Gator in the game. Madu corralled a UK miss on the other end and streaked down the lane for a layup and had UF within four, 50-46, with 1:49 remaining.

On the Wildcats next possession, they missed three wild shots but got the rebound each time, before A'dia Mathies found her way to the free throw line with 1:01 remaining. She missed both, but UK again secured the loose rebound and held the four-point advantage. Another miss from UK and UF finally had its chance offensively, where Bartley dribbled the court and scooped in a layup and the Gators were now within tow points, 50-48, with 25.2 seconds on the clock. UF thought it had a quick steal, but was whistled for a foul and Bria Goss stepped to the line, hit two free throws with 22.8 seconds remaining and gave UK a 52-48 cushion. The Gators then had the ball and Jones' soft 6-foot floater found the bottom of the next and Florida was within two, 52-50. Florida missed 14 free throws and Arkansas staged an improbable comeback as the Gators dropped a tough 73-72 double-overtime decision at Bud Walton Arena on Sunday afternoon. Arkansas rallied from an 11-point deficit with 4:25 remaining, as well as eight points down in the final 2:02 of regulation to force overtime, where the Gators missed 3-0f-6 free throws in both extra frames, after converting only 5-of-13 during regulation. The Gators missed two free throws in the final 2:02 of regulation, as well as six more in overtime period and wasn't able to connect on a field goal attempt in the last 8:05 of the overtime periods, hitting just 2-of-9 attempts.

C'eira Ricketts came down and nailed a three-pointer with 48 seconds remaining and had the Razorbacks with three points, 61-58, as Arkansas again called another timeout to set up its defense, which worked as Ashley Daniels stole the ball from Azania Stewart shortly after the Gators in-bounded the ball and found Rickets under the basket where she hit the laupy with 39 seconds left and brought Arkansas within one point, 61-60. Azania stewart notcned ner rist oouble-double of the season, woll always scored a season-ingin 12 points and Florida defeated LSU, 73-64, at the Pete Maravich Center on Thursday evening for its first win in Baton Rouge since Jan. 21, 1996. The Cators (14-8, 4-5 SEC), who led wire to wire against the Lady Tigers, earned just their fourth-ever victory in Baton Rouge, halting an eight-game slide in the Maravich Center. Thursday's win capped a tough three-game SEC road trip for Florida, which was coming off a heartbreaking 73-72 double-OT loss at Arkansas.

Against the Tigers, the Gators stepped up and answered each time LSU cut their lead to six points, the last time coming with 4:15 remaining in the game as the Tigers were in the midst of a 6-2 run. Florida responded with a 6-0 spurt, with field goals from Jennifer George, Jaterra Bonds and Stewart, who also was big on LSU's next offensive possession, as she blocked two shots, marking the 21st consecutive game she has swatted at least one.

LSU scored the next two points of the game and cut Florida's lead to seven points, 64-57, with 2:41 remaining,

LSU scored the next two points of the game and cut Florida's lead to seven points, 64-57, with 2:41 remaining, but Lanita Bartley came through with a tough driving layup. LSU star LaSondra Barrett netted her first field goal of the game, but Bartley answered again with two free throws, before Stewart snatched an airball from a teammate and put it in as the shot clock was winding down, as she collected her season-high 10th rebound to accompany her 12 points that resulted in the sixth double-double of her career. The points also gave Florida a 70-59 lead with 64 seconds remaining and the Gators hit 3-of-4 free throws to seal the victory.

Jordan Jones missed Thursday's game because of a concussion incurred during UF's loss on Sunday.

Florida came out a bit cold in the second half, hitting just 1-of-7 to start after converting 48.3 percent in the opening 20 minutes, but still held a 40-30 lead six minutes into the period. The Gator's cold spell continued with 2-for-11 from floor at the 11:57 mark of the game, but they began to slowly heat up, converting 11 of their final 14 shots of the game to hit 50 percent (27-54) overall, as well as 52 percent (13-25) in the second half.

Stewart scored 10 of her team-high tying 12 points in the second half, while Madu was the star of the first, when she scored all 12 of her season-high effort, nailing 5-of-7 from the floor during those opening 20 minutes when Florida found itself in foul trouble.

Lanita Bartley added 10 of her 12 points in the second half, while Bonds dished a game-high five assists with nine points and Andrea Vilaró Aragonés collected a career-best and game-high four of UF's 11 steals.

Less than eight minutes into the game, three Gators had been whistled for two personal fouls each, but that didn't stop Florida from staying focused and maintaining a lead throughout the entire first half, taking a 33-24 advantage into the locker room. Deana Allen, a native of Houma, La, located 58 miles outside of Baton Rouge, picked up two fouls in the first 1:58 of the game and an already shorten Gator bench got leaner as Allen had to come out of the game to prevent even more foul trouble. Florida missed its first four shots from the floor before Madu knocked down a 15-footer. Stewart followed with a bucket inside, taking a great pass from Vilaro Aragonés with the shot clock winding down and Florida held the early lead. Bianca Lutley knocked down a three-pointer for LSU, shortly before Bartley was whistled for her second personal at the 15-22 mark, when two Gator seniors starters were forced the bench with foul trouble. George powered up a short shot, but LSU countered with one from Taylor Turnbow and the Gator's lead remained at one. After Bonds converted a driving layup, George, who is UF's leading scorer and rebounder, collected her second foul at the 12:08 mark and went to the pine.

LSU took advantage of George's foul by knocking down two free throws and were back within one point. LSU scored again, before Bonds completed a three-point play and gave the Gators a seven-point lead with 9:11 on the clock. The teams traded scores for the next minute, with Madu knocking down a 15-footer for the Gators. With Florida holding a four-point advantage, the Gators used a 7-0 spurt over a 1:14 span thanks to jumpers from Bonds, who nailed one with her toe on the three-point arc, Madu with her second trey of the game and Vilaro Aragonés, and Florida held a 25-14 lead with 6:35 remaining in the first half. LSU countered by scoring the next six points of the game, as Florida was carless with the ball and that led to a pair of uncontested Tiger layups. Lily Sveet halt the run with a three-pointer. Senior point guard Lanita Bartley scored a game-high 17 points and grabbed a career-high-tying 10 rebounds to record her first-ever double-double en route to an 84-55 victory over the Ole Miss Rebels. The win lifts Florida to 15-8 (5-5 SEC) while the Rebels fall to 12-12 (2-9 SEC).

The Gators surpassed their season-high for points scored at home or against an SEC opponent, with 84. The 29-point scoring margin was Florida's highest over an SEC opponent since Jan. 28, 2001, when the then-No. 10 Gators defeated South Carolina 91-53.

Bartley inked a career-high eight offensive rebounds, greatly contributing to the Gators' 18 second-chance points, while adding four assists. Azania Stewart and Brittany Shine each notched a season-high 14 points, and Stewart added seven rebounds and four blocks, marking the 22nd straight game in which she had at least one block.

Nididi Madu came away with eight points, eight rebounds and a career-high-tying four assists. Jordan Jones' steal in the first half marked the 100th of her career, the highest among active Gators. Jones also contributed seven points, four rebounds and three assists.

As a team, the Gators shot 48.5% from the field, while holding Ole Miss to just 34.4%, including 29.7% in the first half. UF out-rebounded Ole Miss, 46-38, and put up 22 assists as compared to seven by the Rebels. For the second straight game and the fifth time this season, every Gator that dressed scored.

The Rebels came out of the locker room trailing 41-26, ready to play, opening the second half with six straight points to close the gap to 44-34, but a big three-pointer by Bartley at 17:29 gave the momentum back to the Gators.

Danielle McCray, caught her own rebound and got the tip-in to try to keep the Gators from pulling away, but the Rebels were unable to get within 10 for the remained of the game. A pair of made free throws by Monique Jackson brought the Rebels back within 11, down 52-41 with 15:8 to play, but the Gators continued to push forward, steadily growing harder to catch.

Deana Allen hit back-to-back free throws at 4:22, to give Florida its first 20-point lead of the game, and eight straight points by Shine in the final two minutes, including two three-pointers, sealed the deal for the Gators with a final score of 84-55.

The game started tight, as the teams traded the lead back and forth as the score ran to a 9-9 tie at 16:04. A pair of layups by Jennifer George gave the Gators a 13-9 lead, but the Rebels came back to tie the score at 13 with two made free throws by Tia Faleru at 11:42.

With the game tied at 13, with 11:42 remaining, the Gators mounted a 18-2 run that lasted almost five minutes and took a 31-15 lead with 6:43 left in the first half.

Florida got scoring from Madu, Bartley, Jones and Stewart during the stretch, when the

Florida got scoring from Madu, Bartley, Jones and Stewart during the stretch, when the Gators hit 8-of-10 shots from the floor and out-rebounded the Rebels, 8-0, while Ole Miss hit 1-of-6 from the field and turned the ball over twice.

But the Gators then went cold from the floor after Jones' jumper at the 6:43 mark, as the Rebels chipped away at their deficit and scored the next nine points, closing Florida's advantage to seven points, 31-24, with 2:18 to go.

Two free throws from Jaterra Bonds at the 1:34 mark halted Ole Miss' run and sparked a 10-0 Gator swing, as Allen converted a layup and Bartley nailed back-to-back treys that extended UF's lead to 17 points, 41-24, with 25 seconds remaining.

Monique Jackson ended the two-minute Rebel scoring drought with a layup underneath and Florida took a 41-26 lead into the halftime locker room.

Game 24: Auburn at Florida

Feb. 9, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Senior Lanita Bartley led the Gators in scoring for the second straight game with 17 points and Florida earned a 70-56 victory over Auburn Thursday evening at the O'Connell Center.

The victory was the third consecutive for the Gators (16-8, 6-5 SEC), who used strong defense throughout and forced 22 Auburn turnovers that led to 26 points. Florida was also able to get out in transition and score 13 fast-break points, compared to just two for the Tigers.

The Gators and Tigers exchange buckets for the majority of the first half, when there were five lead changes and six tied scores, with the lead getting no larger than five for either team.

With Auburn holding a 29-27 lead with 2:26 remaining in the opening period, Florida went on a 7-2 run to end the half and headed into the locker room with a 36-31 lead.

The backcourt of Deana Allen, Bartley and Jaterra Bonds led the way for the Gators during the first 20 minutes, when the trio combined for 27 first-half points. Allen finished with 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the floor in addition to three assists and three steals in 23 minutes of action. Bonds tallied 12 points, converting 4-of-5 shots, with a team-high four assists, as the Gators dished 18 in the game.

Bonds started that final spurt with an acrobatic layup and drew contact and Allen followed with a steal on the other end of the floor and dished to Jordan Jones for the layin and forced an Alburn timeout. Jennifer George then stole the ball from Parrisha Simmons and Florida took advantage as Bonds nailed a three-pointer on another assist from Allen and the Gators held a 43-29 lead with 1:04 remaining.

Blanche Alverson, who finished with a game-high 19 points, converted a jumper to halt Florida's run, but Ndidi Madu found George under the basket and completed the high-low game that ended the first half's scoring.

The Gators continued their momentum at the start of the second half by scoring the first seven points and pushing their lead to 15 points, 43-31, with 18:04 remaining in the game.

Florida's defensive pressure kept the Tigers from converting a field goal for more than three and a half minutes, a span that covered the end of the first half and into the second. The Gators continued to get offensive contributions from every position, as nine out of the 10 Gators who suited up scored and helped maintain a double-digit lead for the remainder of the contest.

Auburn cut Florida's lead to 11 points with 12:06 remaining, but freshman Andrea Vilaró Aragonés answered with a three-pointer, before Tiger rookie Hasina Muhammad sank a layup and kept the Gator lead at 12 points, 53-41, with 11:11 to play.

That's when Florida mounted a 10-4 spurt for a 63-45 advantage and took an 18-point lead, its largest of the game, with 5:25 remaining and Auburn never recovered.

Jones capped that final run with a free throw, marking her 900th career point at UF, as her overall career total swelled to 1,319.

A three-point basket from the wing by Allen with 1:25 remaining in the game extended the lead to 68-51 and ended any hopes for an Auburn comeback. With Bonds converting two free throws from the line with 45 seconds remaining in the game, the Gators reached the 70-point mark for the fourth straight game.

George collected a team-high eight rebounds, helping Florida to a 36-35 rebounding edge. The Gators also shot a steady 44.8 percent (26-58) for the game, including an 8-of-17 effort from the three-point arc.

Auburn shot 48 percent (12-25) in the first half and finished with a 39.2 percent clip.

Jennifer George posted her 13th double-double of the season, but the Gator's poor first half led to a 62-58 setback at No. 24 South Carolina at Colonial Life Arena in front of a crowd of 6,517 on Sunday evening. The loss snapped the Gator's three-game win streak, as the Gamecocks (19-6, 8-4 SEC) swept the two-game season series by a total of nine points.

South Carolina sizzled with its shot during the first half, hitting 51.5 percent (17-33) overall that included a 7-of-10 effort from the three-point arc. It was the highest first-half efficiency by a Gator opponent this year and only the second time Florida has allowed a 50-percent shooting mark in the opening half. The seven treys were already the second-most the Cators had allowed in an entire game, as Pacific converted 11-of-16 from long range on Dec. 9. Markeshia Grant, who finished with a game-high 20 points, did the most damage from beyond the arc, connecting on all four of her attempts to tallied 16 points, while Tina Roy, who hit 3-of-5 attempts from long range and scored all of her 11 points during those first 20 minutes. The Gamecocks also had the edge on the boards, outrebounding the Gators by five, Florida's second-largest margin deficit after the first 20 minutes of action this year. All of that estuded in a 43-33 halftime hole for Florida, which was able to rally in the second half and outscore the Gamecocks, 25-19. The Gators even managed to the the game at 54 with 6:33 remaining, but couldn't find a way to take the lead.

Deana Allen stepped up and nailed UF's third 3-pointer of the game and followed on the other end of the floor with a steal and went the length of the court for the layup, but missed as she was fouled. She did hit one free throw and cut the Gator's deficit to six points, with 13:58 remaining.

The teams traded baskets for the next minute and a half and with South Carolina holding an eight-point cushion, George converted back-to-back inside jumpers and had Florida within four points, 49-45, with 11:11 to go.

South Carolina came right back with the next three points and regained a seven-point advantage, before Jordan Jones knocked down a three from the right side and the Gators closed the gap to four points, 52-48, with 10:18 on the clock. The teams again traded buckets. before both went cold for the next two minutes.

South Carolina wasn't able to take advantage and eventually, Lanita Bartley came up with a steal and kept it the length of the court, where she powered up a layup and had Florida within one point, 59-58, with 2:04 remaining. SC called a timeout with one second on the shot clock and couldn't get off a good shot and the Gators took possession with 1:29 to go. Florida had two chances but neither shot fell and SC came up with the defensive board with one minute remaining. Sutton came down and scored for the Gamecocks and Bartley was called for traveling with 29 seconds remaining, giving the ball back to the hosts, who led 61-58 with 32.3 seconds left. Vanderbilt's Christina Foggie nailed a wild three-pointer as the clock expired at the end of regulation and sent the game into overtime, where she scored five more points and helped the Commodores slip past Florida, 75-69, at Memorial Gym late Thursday evening.

The Gators (16-10, 6-7 SEC) held the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer in check for the majority of the night, as she scored just seven points prior to her game-tying trey and finished with 15 points, three below her average.

Lanita Bartley sank two free throws with 10.8 seconds remaining in regulation and gave Florida a 65-62 lead and the Gators played tight defense, but Foggie tossed up a prayer and it somehow found the bottom of the net.

"Vanderbilt is a great team with a lot players," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "One of the things that came to light at the end of the game was that the clock didn't run for 14 seconds and when you look at the way the game ended that's unfortunate. It's unfortunate for our kids. However, you've got to give Vanderbilt credit for heaving that ball up to the rim, as crazy as a shot as that was, she still got it off. They are a great team. They're really hard to beat here. We just had some detail work that wasn't as solid as it needed to be."

SEC Officials later determined there was a communication breakdown by the Official Table Crew working the game and they never notified the game officials that the game clock stopped with 1:15 remaining in regulation and didn't restart for 14 seconds.

Jennifer George scored 17 points with nine rebounds off the bench to lead the Gators, who shot just 1-of-9 during the overtime frame. Deana Allen contributed 10 points for Florida, which made just 13-of-23 free throws, including 8-of-14 in the second half and 2-of-4 in overtime.

Tiffany Clarke led all scorers with 18 points along with 17 rebounds, while Stephanie Holzer added 14 points and 12 rebounds, helping Vanderbilt (20-6, 8-5 SEC) outrebound the Gators 47-39 and outscore UF 44-30 in the paint.

Florida led by as many as six points, 53-47, as late as 6:33 remaining in regulation, before Jasmine Lister nailed a three-pointer and converted a three-point play to tie the game with 5:30 to go. The Gators never trailed during the final 12 minutes of regulation and scored the first two points of overtime with 3:47 on the clock.

After Azania Stewart knocked down two free throws for the Gators, Kady Schrann scored the first field goal of the extra frame for her only points of the contest and tied the game at 67 with 3:02 remaining.

The Gators then missed two free throws, before Foggie scored the game's next three points, including just her fifth made field goal of the contest coming with 34 seconds to play. Lister converted one free throw with 20.2 seconds on the clock, before Allen's driving layup brought Florida back within two points, 71-69 with 9;8 seconds left. Vanderbilt, however, closed out the game from the free throw line, where Foggie hit two and Clarke added the last two that gave the Commodores their largest lead of the game and ended the game's scoring, as Vanderbilt improved to 16-1 at home.

Nine of Florida's 13 SEC games have been decided by six points or less, with 10 of the 13 single digit outcomes.

This was the second time in the last three meetings between Florida and Vanderbilt where overtime was needed, as the Commodores have taken both of those after the Gators won last year's 74-69 game in Nashville.

Florida regrouped from Sunday's heartbreaking setback at Vanderbilt and earned a 61-57 victory against No. 18/15 Georgia in front of a season-best crowd of 3,049 at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Sunday afternoon when it was Senior Day.

Junior forward Jennifer George led the Gators in scoring for the second consecutive game, netting nine of her 15 points and pulling down five her of six rebounds in the second half when the Gators (17-10, 7-7 SEC) shot 44 percent (11-25) from the floor and outrebounded the Lady Bulldogs (20-7, 9-5 SEC) by seven. Lanita Bartley added 11 points and four rebounds to the mix, as she converted 9-of-10 free throws, including all four attempts from the line in the final eight seconds to seal the victory. Freshman Andrea Vilaró Aragonés chipped in a career-best 10 points off the bench, while pulling down a career-high-tying four rebounds.

The Gators were coming off a tough six-point loss at No. 24 Vanderbilt, when the Commodores tossed in a wild three-point shot at the buzzer that sent the game into overtime, while it was discovered too late that 14 seconds had not run off the clock during the final 75 seconds of

Each of the last seven meetings between the two teams has been decided by single digits and Sunday's contest was every bit as intense, featuring 15 lead changes and nine tied scores.

After Khaalidah Miller's jumper game Georgia a six-point lead – it's largest of the game – with 3:33 remaining in the first half, Florida answered with the final eight points of the half and took a 27-25 lead entering the locker room.

Jordan Jones, one of five Gator seniors who were honored in a postgame ceremony, began the second half with a three-pointer and gave Florida what would be its biggest lead of the game, 30-25, with 19:32 remaining. From there, it was a possession-by-possession game and the lead changed hands eight times and score was tied on six occasions. In what was her best offensive game of her young career, Vilaró Aragonés drained a three-pointer with 9:39 remaining and extended Florida's lead to four, 46-42.

Georgia, which had entered the game on a four-game win streak, scored the next four points and tied the game for the ninth game. Jones nailed her second trey and kept the Gators in the lead, but the Bulldogs came right back and eventually tied the score at 51 with 6:29 remaining.

Bartley added a layup and swung the lead back in Florida's favor, but Jamine Hassell followed with a jumper and another lead change, 54-53, with 2:47 on the clock.

George countered with a jumper in the paint and gave the Gators a 55-54 lead and added another 1:20 later that put Florida ahead by three with 1:09 remaining.

Georgia missed on its ensuing offensive possession and George hauled in the miss for her

team-leading sixth rebound of the game, helping Florida outrebound the Bulldogs, 42-32.

Georgia wasn't able to connect on another shot and was forced to foul Bartley with eight seconds remaining the Gators holding a three-point lead.

The Gator senior calmly nailed both, before Meredith Mitchell sank a three-pointer for the Dawgs, who were back within two with four ticks left. Bartley again was fouled and made both ends of the one-and-one to give Florida a four-point lead and seal the victory.

The Bulldogs were led by Jasmine James' 15 points, while Anne Marie Armstrong added 12 points and a game-high seven rebounds.

All 10 Gators who dressed out for the game scored en route to earning their largest margin of victory this year and posting their sixth consecutive home win. It was the sixth time this year every eligible Gator contributed offensively.

With the victory, Florida (18-10) ensured no worse than a .500 record in Southeastern Conference action, as the team takes its 8-7 league mark to Knoxville on Sunday and plays No. 10/9 Tennessee in the final regular-season game for both teams. Tip-off from Thompson-Boling Arena is set for 3:30 p.m. and will be televised live on ESPNU. The Lady Vols (20-8, 11-4 SEC) were upset on Thursday by Arkansas, 72-71 in overtime.

"It was a really big win for us. It was really important for a lot of reasons," Head Coach Amanda Butler said. "Most importantly for our team tonight was to finish in great fashion on our home court for our group of seniors. With our win over Georgia on Sunday, we needed to come in, show a lot of maturity and poise going forward with this game, the next and the SEC Tournament

Senior Jordan Jones (Suwanee, Ga.) led Florida in scoring with 18 points, as she tied her Gator career-high with six three-pointers on 12 attempts. Senior Azania Stewart (Wood Green, England) and junior Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.) added to Florida's compelling victory, scoring 13 and 12 points respectively. Stewart also pulled down 11 rebounds to record her second doubledouble of the season, while George corralled eight and helped the Gators win the rebounding battle, 51-29. Senior Ndidi Madu (Antioch, Tenn.) pulled down eight boards to accompany six

As a team, the Gators shot 43.3 percent from the field while holding Mississippi State to 30.9 percent, including 27.6 percent in the first half when the Bulldogs managed just 18 points, the second-fewest by a Gator opponent in the first half this season.

With 2:08 remaining in the second half, all five seniors checked into the game one final time, as they played out their last home appearance together. The Gator quintet contributed greatly in the win, combining for 47 points and 29 rebounds.

Joining Jones, Stewart and Madu were seniors Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.) and Deana Allen (Houma, La.), as Bartley led the Gators with five assists and Allen chipped in seven points with three assists and a pair of rebounds.

Florida began the game with an 11-0 run and never looked back, as the Bulldogs couldn't find the bottom of the net until Kendra Grant hit a three at the 14:54 mark.

The Gators scored three consecutive three-pointers in their 11-0 run to start the game. Two of those baskets came from Jones and the other triple was from sophomore Jaterra Bonds (Gainesville, Fla.), who finished with nine points and three assists.

The Gators saw their largest lead of the first half at the 6:15 mark when Stewart's layup put them ahead, 25-9, en route to a 33-18 halftime advantage.

Florida continued to build on its lead in the opening minutes of the second half, when

George sank a layup and Jones tacked on a trey. From there, the Gators ran away with the game seeing their largest lead at 36 with 16 seconds left to play in the game.

Porsha Porter was the only Bulldog in double-figure scoring, as she led MSU (14-14, 4-11
