- Sunday's game will be the 82nd meeting between Alabama and Auburn and will be the second of two games in the series this season. The Crimson Tide has won 36 of the previous games, while the Tigers have claimed 45 wins in the series. Alabama snapped a three-game losing skid to Auburn earlier in the season with a 51-50 victory on Jan. 22, in Tuscaloosa. The Tide's last win in Auburn came on Feb. 17, 2011 by a score of 59-51.
- Alabama has lost its last two games by a combined six points, falling 57-55 to No. 14/16 Mississippi State and 53-49 to Florida., both of which came at home. A win in Sunday's game would give the Crimson Tide the No. 13 seed in the Southeastern Conference Tournament next week, while a loss would put Auburn and No. 13 and Alabama at No. 14. Sophomore Ashley Williams continues to lead the team in scoring (13.4 ppg) and rebounding (6.2 rpg), while redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook is the Tide's leader in assists (3.2 apg). Alabama lost senior guard Sharin Rivers in Thursday's game to an ACL tear.
- After going winless in conference play through 13 games, Auburn has picked up wins in its last two, beating Georgia, 44-26, and Vanderbilt, 70-58, both of which came on the road. The Tigers are led offensively by junior Tra'cee Tanner and sophomore Brandy Montgomery, who combine for 23 points per game. Tanner also leads the squad in rebounds (5.9 rpg), while freshman Neydja Petithomme collects a team-best 3.1 assists.

NEWS AND NOTES

THE COACHES

Alabama head coach Kristy Curry has a Alabama has several players ranked in the history of success in her 16 year career. league standings. Below is a complete list: Nine of her teams have made the NCAA tournament, including a trip to the 2001 championship game while coaching at Ashley Williams - 12th (all games), 16th Purdue. With the Boilermakers, she won (SEC games) two Big Ten regular season titles. She holds an overall coaching record of 336-182 and Rebounding has led nine teams to 20-win seasons. The Ashley Williams – 18th (all games), 17th Tigers are under the direction of thirdyear head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, who in her first season at Auburn, reached the quarterfinals of the Women's National Invitation Tournament and the third round in 2014. In her 10 complete seasons as a head coach, Williams-Flournoy has guided her teams to the postseason six times, advancing to the NCAA Tournament in three of those years. Prior to taking over at Auburn, she was head coach at Georgetown from 2004-12. Assistant coaching stops for Williams-Flournoy include Southwest Missouri State (2002-04), Georgia (1996-2002) and Georgetown (1992-96).

LAST MEETING

A last-second block from junior Khadijah Carter helped secure the 51-50 victory for Alabama in the Jan. 22 meeting between the Tide and Tigers. Stifling defense and aggressive play helped Alabama claim the victory, especially late in the game as UA forced four Auburn turnovers in the final 2:41. Alabama had three players in Through 30 games, Alabama has been double-figures, led by redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook with 12 points and a Tide freshmen and sophomores have team-high five assists. Sophomore Ashley Williams added 11, while junior Nikki Heastetter led the Tide in rebounds with six and added 10 points. The Tide also received big minutes from Carter, who contributed a season-high eight points in the win. The two teams traded baskets in the opening minutes, but 13 unanswered points over a near six minute span game Alabama a 17-6 advantage with 9:30 to play in the half. The Tide led by as many as 15 in the period, however the Tigers would cut that to six at halftime after scoring nine unanswered. Alabama remained on top throughout the second half until a three from junior Katie Frerking gave the Tigers the 47-45 edge with 3:48 to go. Middlebrook then came up big for the Tide with six straight points giving Alabama a 51-47 lead. Tiger sophomore Brandy Montgomery hit one final shot for Auburn with 48 seconds to go before Carter's rejection at the last second.

YOUTH LEADS TIDE IN NUMBERS

led statistically by its youth. The Crimson accounted for 75.4 percent (1,343 of 1,780) of its scoring and 56.3 percent (646 of 1,147) of its rebounding. In UA's season opener, 76.7 percent of its points (46 of 60) was scored by underclassmen. Sophomore Ashley Williams led the way with 21 points, while freshmen Hannah Cook and Meoshonti Knight added 10 apiece and redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook the other five. Cook, alone, had 19 of the Tide's 40 points against No. 7 Duke, and she and Williams combined for 44 of Alabama's 62 points vs. Jacksonville State. The Tide's underclassmen accounted for 45 of its 54 points at South Carolina and 32 of its 42 points against Arkansas. Most recently, the freshmen and sophomores scored 44 of Alabama's 49 points at Texas A&M, 50 of 56 points at Tennessee and 44 of its 55 points against Mississippi State. Last time out, the underclassmen had 41 of 49 points and 23 of 29 rebounds.

EARLY SIGNEES

TAYLOR DOAN 6-4 • Post • Kearney, Mo. • Kearney Hs

Doan, a 6-4 post from Kearney, Mo., is, "among the most nimble low-post prospects in the class with a power frame," according to Dan Olson of Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. He also added that Doan, "combines soft touch and finishing skills in the paint with an emerging face up game." She is currently ranked the No. 57 overall prospect and the No. 10 post in the nation according to ESPNW HoopGurlz. Doan is a three-time first team allconference and all-district selection and was named conference MVP her freshman year after averaging 11.4 points and 9.5 rebounds. She helped lead Kearney High School to a trio of conference championships as well as two district championships. Doan also made the Kearney Classic All-Star Team all three years and was voted second team all-state by the media as a sophomore.

C'CORIEA FOY 5-11 • WING • FAYETTEVILLE, N.C. • JACK BRITT HS

Foy, a 5-11 wing from Fayetteville, N.C., provides Alabama with a versatile option both midrange and outside. Olson described her as an, "ultra-athletic guard and a prototype SEC prospect with a high ceiling." ESPNW HoopGurlz has Foy ranked the No. 22 guard in the nation. Foy made a huge impact at Jack Britt High School from the beginning as she was named team MVP as a freshman and has held the title every year since. She's led her team in scoring for the past three seasons including a 15.8 point average as a junior in addition to 6.8 rebounds per contest. Foy set a career-high in points last season, collecting 32 to help her reach the 1,000 point milestone in 2014.

TRISTA MAGEE 6-0 • Wing • Ellisville, Miss. • Presbyterian Christian

Magee, a 6-0 wing from Ellisville, Miss., is one of the top players in the state of Mississippi. Olson described her as an, "athletic and long perimeter threat with a big future for the college game." Magee, two-time member of the Clarion-Ledger Dandy Dozen Team, averaged a double-double of 22.3 points and 10.0 rebounds as a junior for coach Missy Bilderback at Presbyterian Christian. Following last season, she was named player of the year by Pine Belt Sports, the Hattiesburg American and the Mississippi Association of Independent Schools.

SHAQUERA WADE 6-0 • Wing • Huntsville, Ala. • Huntsville HS

Wade, a 6-0 wing from Huntsville, Ala. is "among the elite ultra-athletes in the 2015 class," said Olson. He also added she was, "a scoring machine off the dribble with range beyond the arc." Wade is ranked No. 48 overall and the No. 12 guard in her class by ESPNW HoopGurlz. Wade comes in with a long list of accolades including being named an Adidas Three Stripe All-American. Following her junior season, where she averaged 14.4 points, 6.7 rebounds and 3.7 steals, Wade earned Tennessee Valley Second Team honors and was recognized as the 2014 North All-Star MVP. She has made the all-city first team for two consecutive seasons and was an Alabama Sports Writers Second Team All-State selection in 2013 and 2014.

NEWS AND NOTES

TIDE REACHES DOUBLE-DIGITS WINS IN NON-Conference Play

Alabama's 11 wins heading into January is four more than last season and the most non-conference victories since 2010, when the Crimson Tide also had 11.

KNIGHT NAMED MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER AT HALL OF FAME WOMEN'S CHALLENGE

Freshman Meoshonti Knight scored a season-high 16 points, including 7-7 from the free throw line, in addition to five rebounds and three assists off the bench against Quinnipiac. For her efforts, she was named Alabama's Most Outstanding Player at the Hall of Fame Women's Challenge, which was played at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn.

HOME SWEET HOME

In stark contrast to last season, Alabama was home for the majority of its non-conference schedule including all seven games in December. The Crimson Tide has not played all of its games in the month of December at home since having on one during the 1975-76 season in Tuscaloosa against Stillman on Dec. 3.

LOST OF OPPORTUNITIES EARLY

Alabama played 11 games throughout the first three weeks of the season, marking the most games played by an NCAA Division I school in that span. The Crimson Tide has never had that many games to start a season.

DEFENSE DOMINATES IN WIN VS. UAPB

Alabama played one of its most dominant games in the Kristy Curry era on Dec. 16, where the Crimson Tide cruised past Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Tuesday. UA limited Arkansas-Pine Bluff to only 27 points, the lowest total by a Tide opponent this season and the second-lowest in program history. The lowest opponent point total was 21 by Georgia State on Dec. 21, 1990. The 47-point win was also the UA's largest margin of victory since Dec. 1, 2010, when it earned a 49-point victory over Alabama State, 80-31. Alabama recorded a seasonhigh 16 steals and scored 40 of its 71 points off turnovers.

PRACTICE MADE PERFECT AT THE FT LINE

Three Alabama players shot 100 percent from the free throw line in the Tide's game vs. Quinnipiac, helping the team finish 90 percent (18-20) for the game. Freshman Meoshonti Knight was 7-7, while redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook went 6-6 and senior Sharin Rivers 4-4 from the charity stripe.

WILLIAMS HONORED AS SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore Ashley Williams was named the Southeastern Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Nov. 24. The forward from Covington, Ga., averaged 21.3 points and 8.3 rebounds per game for the Crimson Tide last week and was instrumental in Alabama going undefeated at the Hall of Fame Women's Challenge in Lawrence, Kan., picking up wins against Kansas, Georgetown and Temple. Williams scored 20 or more points in three of the four contests, including a career-high 26 against Jacksonville State earlier in the week and added her second double-double of the season and seventh of her career with 20 points and 11 rebounds versus the Owls. She was 72.1 percent from the floor, hitting 31 of 43 shots and averaged a team-best 31.8 minutes of action per game.

WILLIAMS NAMED TO NCAA.COM'S STARTING FIVE

Sophomore forward Ashley Williams' notched a spot on NCAA.com's Starting Five for her performances during the week of Nov. 17-23. Joining her on the team was Western Kentucky forward Chastity Gooch, St. John's guard Danaejah Grant, Washington guard Kelsey Plum and Stanford guard Lili Thompson. Williams averaged 21.3 points and 8.3 rebounds per game for the week, shooting 72.1 percent from the floor.

Alabama head coach Kristy Curry coached her 500th game as a head coach on Sunday, Dec. 14. Through those 500 game she accumulated a 331-169 (.662) overall record as a head coach and is in her 16th season leading a program.

MORE THAN JUST BASKETBALL

The Alabama women's basketball team started its inaugural Community Caravan during the fall of 2014. In an effort to give back to the local community, the team has been volunteering at local schools, hospitals and non-profit organizations as well as attending events on campus. Some of the activities thus far have included Habitat for Humanity, The Miracle League of Tuscaloosa, assisting at The Rise School in Tuscaloosa and honoring veterans in town upon their return from an honor flight to Washington, D.C.

FANS EXCITED ABOUT WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season ticket sales increased 52.9 percent since Kristy Curry took over at the Capstone. Foster Auditorium drew a crowd of 2,678 for its win over Georgia on Jan. 26, 2014, setting a new record attendance for women's basketball in the historic building. Fans then answered the call to top that number the next week against Tennessee, and would set another record as 3,002 packed into Foster to watch the Tide and Lady Vols. The record was broken, yet again, this season when 3,133 were on hand for the Mississippi State game. Alabama's average attendance has continued to grow and is up an average of 1,405 per game since Curry's arrival (1,145 in 2012-13; 1,992 in 2013-14; 2,550 in 2014-15).

CRIMSON TIDE INKS TOP 25 CLASS

Alabama signed a top 25 recruiting class for next season that contains four talented playmakers in Taylor Doan, C'coriea Foy, Trista Magee and Shaquera Wade. The class, which is ranked 24th in the nation by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report and fourth in the Southeastern Conference has a mix of all positions and features players from Alabama, Mississippi, Missouri and North Carolina. All four were recently named nominees for the 2015 McDonald's High School All American game.

TIDE HAS MOST SEC WINS SINCE 2002

Alabama earned seven wins in Southeastern Conference action in 2014, marking the most for the Tide since it went 7-7 under Rick Moody during the 2001-02 season.

SHAFONTAYE MYERS SIGNS PROFESSIONAL CONTRACT OVERSEAS

Recent graduate and former guard Shafontaye Myers signed a professional contract for the 2014-15 season with Finland's Turun Riento and headed overseas to begin her career on Sept. 8. Myers, who joined the Crimson Tide in 2010 after ranking 13th in the nation in scoring as a high school senior, became one of the top three-point shooters to come through the program ending her career at No. 5 with 211 makes. The Newbern, Ala., native increased her scoring every season and became the 24th member of the 1,000 Point Club in the final home game of her career. Myers was named to two all-tournament teams throughout her time at The Capstone, including the 2012 Bank of Hawai'i Rainbow Wahine Invitational and the 2013 Saint Mary's College Hilton Concord Classic. Turun Riento is part of Finland's SM-sarja league. Their schedule runs from late September to early April.







FLORIDA A&M 44 ALABAMA 60

Alabama won its 2014-15 season opener by a score of 60-44 over Florida A&M on Friday evening in Coleman Coliseum. Sophomore Ashley Williams recorded the sixth double-double of her career to pace the Crimson Tide with 21 points and 11 rebounds.

The game was the first the women's basketball team played in Coleman Coliseum since it moved back in Foster Auditorium at the end of the 2010-11 season. The Tide is 17-2 when opening the season in Tuscaloosa.

Williams was joined in double figures by freshmen Hannah Cook and Meoshonti Knight, who added 10 points apiece. The Rattlers were led in scoring by junior Olivia Atilla with 14 points and in rebounding by senior Taneka Rubin, who had nine boards.

For the game, Alabama shot 36.1 percent (22-61) from the floor, while limiting Florida A&M to 27.3 percent (18-66) of its attempts. The Tide outrebounded the Rattlers, 55-45, and outscored Florida A&M 32-14 in the paint.

The Rattlers scored six points in just over a minute to take the early lead in the contest, but Alabama would go on a 17-2 run over the next 10 minutes to distance itself from Florida A&M. The Tide led by nine or more for the duration of the half and took a 30-18 advantage into the locker room at halftime.

Florida A&M used a 12-6 run out of the break to pull within six, but a three-pointer by Cook at the 11:10 mark put the Tide back in front by nine. Alabama outscored the Rattlers 13-6 to end the game.

No. 14/16 MISSISSIPPI STATE 57 ALABAMA 55

Alabama came up just short against No. 14/16 Mississippi State, 57-55, in front of a record crowd of 3.133 in Foster Auditorium.

Sophomore Ashley Williams, once again, led all scorers with 21 points, hitting eight of her 11 attempts from the floor. She was joined in double figures by redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook, who had 11 points after hitting 8-of-9 free throws. Mississippi State had four players finish in double figures. led by freshman Victoria Vivians with 14.

The first five points of the game were scored from the free throw line, four of which belonged to Alabama. Mississippi State evened the score at 4-4 at the 15:11 mark as Vivians hit the first basket from the floor for either team. With the exception of three more ties, UA led until the 4:38 mark when the second of two made free throws for senior Martha Alwal gave the Bulldogs a 16-15 edge. The game would go back and forth over the final minutes of the period, but a three for Mississippi State freshman Blair Schaefer with seven seconds remaining on the clock would give the Bulldogs a 27-25 advantage at the half.

Mississippi State continued to lead until a jumper from Williams with 13:24 to go put Alabama in front by one, 34-33. The Bulldogs scored a pair of quick buckets to give them the lead back, which sparked a 7-0 run for Mississippi State. The Bulldogs went on to lead by as many as eight, but the Tide would not back down and strung together a 6-0 run of its own late in the half to cut its deficit to two. Alabama forced a turnover on Mississippi State's final possession, giving the Tide one last shot to tie or win the game with 18.9 seconds left, but the attempt was unsuccessful, giving the Bulldogs the win.

For the game, Alabama shot 41.5 percent (17-41) and limited Mississippi State to 31.7 percent (19-60). The Tide also held the Bulldogs nearly 20 points below their season average and forced 21 turnovers.

The women's basketball team led for most of the second half, but was unable to hold off the Florida Gators in the game's final minutes coming up just short, 53-49.

In addition to it being the final home game of the year, it was also the final game inside Foster Auditorium for Alabama's two seniors - Briana Hutchen and Sharin Rivers, who went down in the first half with a knee injury and did not return.

Redshirt freshman Karyla Middlebrook led all Alabama scorers with 15 points and also hauled in a team-high seven rebounds, matching her career best. Sophomore Ashley Williams (9) and freshman Quanetria Bolton (8) rounded out the top scorers for the Tide. Florida junior Cassie Peoples dropped a game-high 18 points for the Gators.

Florida got on the board first, but back-to-back threes, one from Middlebrook and one from Rivers put Alabama on top at the 15:41 mark. From there, the Gators scored eight unanswered points over the next four minutes gave Florida the 12-6 edge. Alabama bounced back with a 10-2 run to end the half, capped off by a three-pointer from freshman Hannah Cook to lead 25-22 at the break.

The Tide continued its run in the second half, outscoring the Gators, 7-2, over the first four minutes. Alabama remained in front until a 9-2 run by Florida late in the half gave the Gators a one-point edge with 5:10 left on the clock. UA tied the game on two more occasions, but Florida held on in the end, making key free throws in the final seconds.

For the game, Alabama shot 39.1 percent (18-46), while Florida finished the night at 41.3 percent (19-46). The Gators scored on 14 of their 18 free throws and edged the Tide in rebounds, 30-29.
