## Auburn Women's Basketball Ouick Hitters

- This is the third all-time meeting between Auburn and Samford in women's basketball
- Auburn is 2-0 all-time against the Bulldogs
- Auburn won the last meeting 64-41 on Dec. 14, 2014, in Auburn
- Auburn's 81-70 win at St. Joseph's on Dec. 6 gave the Tigers a7-1 start to the season, their best under Coach Flo and the best since the 2008-09 team won its first 20 games
- The Tigers have five players averaging double-figure scoring, more than any other SEC team
- Auburn is $74-30$ in non-conference games under Terri Williams-Flournoy and has won 17 out of their last 18 at home
- The Tigers have won 11 consecutive home non-conference games dating back to the 2016-17 season
- Auburn is $234-55$ all-time in the month of December; Coach Flo is $34-9$ in December at Auburn
- Auburn set a school record with 133 -pointers in the win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2; previous record was 12 vs. Colgate in 2007
- Since 2001, Auburn has made at least 10 3-pointers in a game on 10 occasions; five of those have come under Coach Flo
- The Tigers' 95 points against Oklahoma (Dec. 2) were the most against a Power-5 conference opponent since 1990 (def. Vanderbilt 96-93 in 20T)
- Under Coach Flo, Auburn is $5-0$ when scoring at least 90 points and $27-1$ when scoring at least 80 points
- Auburn's win over Oklahoma snapped an eight-game losing streak to Big 12 opponents
- The Tigers' win at Xavier (La.) was the 250th career coaching victory for Auburn head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy
- Senior Janiah McKay moved up to 18 th all-time in scoring at Auburn with a season-high 21 points at St. Joseph's; she now has 1,311 points
- McKay is second in the SEC with 5.5 assists/game; she is 10th all-time at Auburn with 358 career assists
- Sophomore Unique Thompson has recorded five double-doubles in eight games, including three straight against New

Mexico, lowa State and UL-Lafayette

- With 12.5 rebounds per game, Thompson leads the SEC and ranks 6th in the nation
- Thompson's 8.9 defensive rebounds per game are second in the SEC and rank 5th nationally
- Thompson now has 12 career double-doubles, tied for 12th in Auburn history
- Thompson's 19 -point, 14 -rebound double-double at lowa State was her 3rd of the season and 9th of her career
- Thompson's 19 rebounds at New Mexico were a career-high and the most by an Auburn player since 2015
- Six Auburn players scored in double-figures vs. Grambling; the first time Auburn has done that since 2008 vs. Sam Houston State
- McKay ( $16 \mathrm{pts} / 10 \mathrm{assists}$ ) and Thompson ( $14 \mathrm{pts} / 13$ rebs) both had double-doubles in the season-opening win over Grambling
- Senior Emari Jones was Auburn's leading scorer for the first time in her career with 16 points at Xavier (La.)
- Auburn returns four starters and six letterwinners from the 2017-18 squad that finished $14-15$ overall ( $5-11$ SEC)

## OPENING TIP

After a week off for final exams, the Auburn Tigers begin a busy week of four games in seven days by hosting the Samford Bulldogs at Auburn Arena.
" Auburn is 7-1 on the season; the Tigers have won four straight, including an 81-70 victory at St. Joseph's on Dec. 6 in their last game.
" Samford is 3-7 on the year and dropped a 53-48 decision at Memphis on Dec. 9 in its last outing.

## LAST TIME OUT

" Janiah McKay scored a season-high 21 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a furious late rally by St. Joseph's to pick up an 81-70 win on the road.
" The victory was not without its tense moments as St. Joseph's (3-6) went on a tear in the second half to nearly erase a 15 -point Auburn lead.
" McKay's 21 points led all scorers and she was key in the fourth quarter when she scored nine points and hit 6-of-8 free throws in the closing minutes.
" Auburn had five total players in double-figures for the second straight game. Daisa Alexander
finished with 16 after an 11-point first quarter, Crystal Primm scored 14, Unique Thompson had 12 and Brooke Moore added a season-high 10. Thompson was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.
" The Tigers led by as many as 15 in the third quarter at 49-34 but saw St. Joseph's go on a furious tear, hitting eight shots in a row and 12-of-14 over a stretch that spanned the third and fourth quarters, to cut the lead to just one at 65-64 with just over six minutes to play. But Auburn would finally get some defensive stops and put some distance between themselves and the Hawks, going on a 9-0 run to take a 74-64 lead with 2:52 left.

## UP NEXT

" Auburn hits the road for its next three games, beginning with a pair of contests at the Carolinas Challenge in Myrtle Beach, S.C. The Tigers face Coastal Carolina on Tuesday and North Carolina on Thursday; both games start at 5:30 p.m. CT.

## AN AUBURN WIN WOULD...

" Be Auburn's 14th non-conference win in its last 15 games.
" Be Auburn's 12th straight home non-conference win.
" Give Auburn a 3-0 record all-time against Samford.
" Give the Tigers a 8-1 start, their best of the Coach Flo era and the best since Auburn won its first 20 games to open the 2008-09 season.

## AUBURN VS. SAMFORD

" This is the third meeting between Auburn and Samford; both previous meetings were in Auburn. " Auburn has won both prior meetings, most recently a 64-41 victory on Dec. 14, 2014.

## SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

") Samford is 3-7 on the season with wins over Rhodes College, Alabama State and Presbyterian. The Bulldogs come into Sunday's game having dropped two straight to UAB and Memphis.
" The Bulldogs average 57.4 points per game and give up 66.1 per outing.
" Charity Brown is one of the nation's top point guards statistically; she averages 5.7 assists/game and is also the Bulldogs' leading rebounder with 5.4/ game. Natalie Armstrong leads Samford in scoring
with 8.2 points/game.
" Samford was picked to finish seventh in the Southern Conference by the league's coaches.

## SCOUTING AUBURN

" Auburn is 7-1 on the season. The Tigers have wins over Grambling, Nicholls, New Mexico, ULLafayette, Xavier (La.), Oklahoma and St. Joseph's while dropping a 3-point game at lowa State. The Tigers are No. 45 in the latest NCAA RPI (as of Dec. 4). " Sophomore forward Unique Thompson is a force under the basket and has been key to Auburn's success early this year. She has five double-doubles in seven games and leads the Tigers with 14.4 points and 12.5 rebounds. As a freshman last season, she averaged 11.5 ppg and 8.4 rpg with 7 double-doubles, tying the Auburn freshman record.
" Senior point guard Janiah McKay averages 14.0 points/game; she is also third in the SEC with 5.5 assists/game. McKay is the Tigers' leading returning scorer for the second straight season after averaging 16.6 ppg last season. McKay ranks 18th in career scoring at Auburn with 1,311 points.
" Junior Daisa Alexander had a breakout sophomore season where she scored 14.2 points/game and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game, earning a nod to the SEC All-Defensive Team. So far this season, Alexander is averaging 12.8 points/game and had a career-high 8 assists vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.
" Senior Emari Jones has been one of Auburn's most consistent scorers so far in 2018-19, averaging 11.5 points/game and scoring in double-figures in five games so far. In 2017-18, she started 16 games and averaged 5.0 points. She transferred to Auburn prior to the 2016-17 season after a year at Shawnee CC in Ullin, III., where she was the nation's leading junior college scorer with 746 points in 2015-16.
" Redshirt junior Crystal Primm has given Auburn consistent minutes through her first four games on The Plains, averaging 10.1 points and 3.3 rebounds. Primm transferred from Duke following the 2016-17 season.
") The Tigers' incoming freshman class was ranked No. 13 by ESPN HoopGurlz and included two top-50 prospects in Robyn Benton (\#17 overall; \#6 guard) and Brooke Moore (\#42 overall; \#11 guard).

## BALANCED SCORING RETURNS

" Through the first eight games, Auburn has five players averaging double-digit scoring, more than any other SEC team.
") For the first time since 2008, Auburn had six players finish in double-figures in the Tigers' 97-48 win over Grambling on Nov. 6.
" Junior Janiah McKay and freshman Robyn Benton led the way with 16 points, followed by junior Crystal Primm (15), sophomore Unique Thompson (14), and junior Daisa Alexander and senior Emari Jones (13).
" The last time Auburn had at least six players score $10+$ points, seven players did it against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008, when the Tigers set a school record with 119 points. That night, it was KeKe Carrier (19), DeWanna Bonner (18), Alli Smalley (16), Whitney Boddie (13), Reneisha Hobbs (13), Chantel Hilliard (13) and Sherell Hobbs (13).

## RAINTHREE COUNTY

" Auburn set a school record with 13 made 3-pointers in a 95-79 win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2. The Tigers got four apiece from Emari Jones and Robyn Benton, three from Daisa Alexander and two from Brooke Moore.

[^0]" The previous record for a single game was 12, set on Dec. 5, 2007, in a 99-47 win over Colgate. Since 2000, the Tigers have made at least 10 treys in a game 10 times; the most recent was an 82-75 win at Florida on New Year's Day in 2017 when Auburn hit 11 from long range.
" Auburn is averaging 7.4 made 3-pointers per game this season with 59 makes through eight games. The program record for 3 -pointers in a season is 181 (5.7/game), set during the 2016-17 season.

## OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

" With 97 points in the season-opening win over Grambling, Auburn hit the 90-point plateau for the fourth time in the Coach Flo era and the first since scoring 92 on Nov. 17, 2014 - also against Grambling.
" The Tigers have scored at least 80 points in four games this season; Auburn scored $80+$ in six games combined over the previous two seasons.
" Auburn's 95 -point effort against Oklahoma on Dec. 2 gave the Tigers two 90-point games in the same season for the first time since the 2008-09 season, when Auburn topped the 90 -point mark six times.
" The Tigers' 95 points against Oklahoma were the most scored by Auburn against a Power-5 conference opponent (SEC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12) since 1990, when the Tigers beat Vanderbilt 96-93 in 20 T. " Under Coach Flo, Auburn is $5-0$ when scoring at least 90 points and 27-1 when scoring at least 80 points.
" Auburn's total of 644 points through eight games ( 80.5 average) are its most since the 2008-09 season, when the Tigers scored 683 in their first six contests (85.4 average).

## SEEING DOUBLE

" Auburn players have recorded six doubledoubles through seven games with five coming from sophomore Unique Thompson.
" Thompson earned her fifth double-double with 14 points and 17 rebounds in a $95-79$ win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2.
" Thompson had 16 points and 13 rebounds for her third straight double-double and fifth of the season vs. Louisiana-Lafayette (11/25). She has now had 3 straight double-doubles in back-to-back seasons.
" With her 19-point, 14-rebound effort at lowa State, Thompson recorded her 10th career doubledouble. She had reached the milestone by halftime with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the opening 20 minutes; it was the second time in her career she had a double-double by halftime.
" Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound double-double at New Mexico was her second of the season and marked a career-high in rebounding for the Auburn sophomore.
" Thompson picked up where she left off in 201718 with her eighth career double-double, notching 14 points and 13 rebounds in the season-opener against Grambling. And Janiah McKay earned the second of her career with 16 points and 10 assists.
" The last time two Auburn players had a doubledouble in the same game was Dec. 13, 2015, at
Marquette, when Tra'Cee Tanner ( $13 \mathrm{pts} / 12$ rebs) and Brandy Montgomery ( $24 \mathrm{pts} / 12$ rebs) did so.

## CRASHING THE BOARDS

" After rebounding had been a struggle for Auburn much of the last two seasons, the Tigers have been a force on the glass so far in 2018-19. The Tigers average 39.6 rebounds/game and had 53 in the opener vs. Grambling, their most in a game in two seasons.
" Unique Thompson is the Tigers' leading rebounder, averaging 12.5 through eight games. Her 19-rebound effort at New Mexico was a career-high, surpassing the 16 boards she pulled down in her collegiate debut at Virginia Tech on Nov. 13, 2017. She was one board shy of another rare Auburn milestone - the Tigers have not had a 20 -rebound game since 1995. She also added 17 against Oklahoma, giving her the three top rebounding performances for Auburn over the last three seasons.
" Through games of Dec. 12, Thompson leads the SEC and ranks 6th in the country in rebounds/game (12.5) and 5th nationally in defensive rebounds/game (8.9).
" Emari Jones had the first double-digit rebounding game of her career with 10 against Louisiana-
Lafayette on Nov. 25. She was 2 points shy of her first career double-double.

## TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

" The Tigers are 2-0 this season and 46-8 under Coach Flo when forcing at least 25 turnovers.
" Auburn has forced at least 20 turnovers in five games so far in 2018-19.
" Auburn forced a season-high of 26 turnovers against Louisiana-Lafayette on Nov. 25, turning those into 27 points.
" Auburn ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals (13.2/ game) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9) for the 2017-18 season.
" Last year, the Tigers forced at least 20 turnovers in 23 of 29 games last year, including 10 games with at least 25 opponent turnovers. Auburn was 8-2 last year and has won 26 of its last 29 when forcing at least 25 turnovers.
" Auburn's season high of turnovers forced last year was 35 against ULM, which tied for the secondmost by Auburn under Coach Flo and the eighth-most in program history.

## CROSS-COUNTRY TREK

" From Nov. 10-14 as part of the Preseason WNIT that featured road games at New Mexico and lowa State, the Tigers traveled 3,741 miles and visited six states in five days:
--Auburn to Atlanta Airport: 100 miles
--Atlanta to Albuquerque: 1,271 miles
--Albuquerque to Phoenix: 330 miles
--Phoenix to Des Moines: 1,155 miles
--Des Moines to Ames (and back): 80 miles

--Atlanta to Auburn: 100 miles
" Auburn has also made treks to New Orleans
and Philadelphia in the non-conference season, and has a 6-day trip to Myrtle Beach, S.C., and Elon, N.C. remaining.

## TIGERS IN THE PROS

" DeWanna Bonner completed her ninth season in the WNBA in 2018, all with the Phoenix Mercury, after taking the 2017 season off for the birth of her twins. Bonner had one of her best pro seasons, averaging 17.3 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while starting all 34 games. She was a beast in the 2018 playoffs, averaging 24.0 points and 11.1 rebounds in seven postseason games. Bonner was named the Associated Press' WNBA Comeback Player of the Year.

AUBURN --Janiah McKay and Unique Thompson both recorded double-doubles as the Auburn women's basketball team posted its highest scoring output of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era with a 97-48 victory over Grambling State Tuesday at Auburn Arena.

Led by 16 points from McKay and freshman Robyn Benton, Auburn (1-0) had six players in double figures, the first time for the Tigers to hit that mark since the 2008-09 season.

Along with the 16 points from McKay and Benton, the Tigers got 15 points from redshirt junior Crystal Primm in her Auburn debut, 14 points from Thompson, and 13 each from Daisa Alexander and Emari Jones.

Thompson posted her eighth career double-double with a team-high 13 rebounds to go with her 14 points. And McKay recorded the second double-double of her career, notching 10 assists to go with her 16 points. It was the first time for Auburn to have two players with a double-double in the same game since the 2015-16 season when Tra'Cee Tanner and Brandy Montgomery pulled off the feat.

Auburn shot 53.5 percent from the field, scored 97 points and had 53 rebounds - all higher totals than in any game last season. The Tigers' 97 points were the most of the Coach Flo era and the highest output since scoring 119 against Sam Houston State in 2008 - also the last time the Tigers had at least six players in double-figures.

Every player that dressed for Auburn scored. Sophomore Abigayle Jackson had four points along with five rebounds, and freshmen Kiyae' White (3 points, 4 rebounds), Erin Howard (2 points, 3 rebounds) and Natalie Kelly ( 1 point, 1 rebound) found the stat sheet in their Auburn debuts.

After Grambling scored the first four points of the game and took a 6-3 lead, Auburn went on a 16-1 run over the next four-plus minutes to take a 19-9 lead. Grambling would get no closer than 9 points the rest of the way. Auburn ended the first half on a 12-0 run to take a 44-20 lead to the break.

## Game 2: Nov. 9, 2018 Auburn 80, Nicholls State 59 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala. Preseason WNIT - Round 1



AUBURN -- Auburn jumped out to a big early lead and had another strong offensive performance Friday night in an $80-59$ win over Nicholls State in the first round of the Preseason Women's NIT.
It was Auburn's second-straight game scoring at least 80 points; the Tigers scored 80 or more just twice all of last season. Despite a cold fourth quarter, Auburn shot $45.1 \%$ from the field and made 12 -of- 13 free throws.

Daisa Alexander led Auburn with 20 points while also racking up five rebounds and two steals. Emari Jones added 15 points and pulled down 8 rebounds for the second straight game along with three assists and two steals. Janiah McKay finished with 14 points and seven assists. And Unique Thompson scored six points and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds to go along with four steals and two blocks while playing just 24 minutes.
Auburn jumped out to a 9 -0 lead in the first two minutes and had another $9-0$ run in the first quarter to take a 23-10 lead after 10 minutes. Nicholls took advantage of an Auburn cold stretch in the second to cut the lead to as few as seven points, but the Tigers took a 37-26 lead to the break.
The Tigers pulled away in the third quarter and increased their lead to as many as 29 in the fourth before a cold stretch late saw the final margin trimmed to 21.

The Tigers took full advantage of being several inches taller at most every position, out-rebounding the Colonels 42-28 and racking up five blocked shots. Auburn also had 18 steals in forcing 24 Nicholls turnovers, turning those into 29 points.

Nicholls' Cassidy Barrios, the defending Southland Conference Player of the Year, shared the game lead in scoring with 20 points and pulled down 11 rebounds for her first double-double of the year.

Game 3: Nov. 11, 2018
Auburn 79, New Mexico 76 The Pit Albuquerque, N.M. Preseason WNIT - Ouarterfinal


ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- Sophomore Unique Thompson had 19 points and a career-high 19 rebounds as Auburn won a thriller at New Mexico, 79-76, to advance to the semifinals of the Preseason Women's NIT.

With 17 seconds to play and the score tied 76-all, junior Daisa Alexander hit a baseline jumper, got fouled, and made the free throw to give the Tigers (3-0) a three-point lead. New Mexico (1-1), who had hit 123 -pointers in the game, had two looks at a tying trey in the final three seconds but missed both as the clock expired.

Thompson's 19-point, 19 -rebound effort marked her second double-double in three games and the ninth of her career. The 19 rebounds were the most by an Auburn player since Tra'Cee Tanner also had 19 at Florida Gulf Coast during the 2015-16 season.
Auburn took advantage of early New Mexico fouls, hitting 8-of-12 free throws in the first quarter and 15-of-20 in the first half. Those points were sorely needed because the Tigers managed just 30.3 percent from the field in the opening half. Despite that, Auburn finished the second quarter on a 7-0 run - a 3-pointer from Emari Jones and four points from Janiah McKay - to take a $36-33$ lead to the break.

The foul count went down and the shooting percentages went up in the second half as the Tigers shot 52.9 percent in the final 20 minutes. The lead changed hands 10 different times during the second half alone including the closing seconds of the third quarter. The Lobos took a $56-54$ lead with five seconds to play on a pair of free throws, but freshman Erin Howard drained a buzzer-beating 3 -pointer to give the Tigers a $57-56$ lead through three periods.

Auburn then moved ahead by as many as five points with $4: 40$ to play, taking a $70-65$ lead out of the final media timeout on a pair of Thompson free throws. But in a span of two New Mexico possessions, the Lobos were back ahead 71-70 on a pair of 3-pointers.

McKay hit a jumper to give the Tigers a $76-73$ lead with exactly a minute to play, but the Lobos answered with their 12th 3-pointer of the game to knot the score at 7676 , setting up Alexander's game-winner.

## Game 4: Nov. 13, 2018 Iowa State 67, Auburn 64 Hilton Coliseum Ames, Iowa Preseason WNIT - Semifinal



AMES, Iowa -- A furious comeback by the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short Tuesday night as the Tigers dropped a 67-64 battle at lowa State in the Preseason WNIT semifinal.

Trailing by 10 with less than two minutes to play, senior Janiah McKay made three straight 3-pointers in less than a minute - the last coming with 41 seconds left - to tie the game at 64 -all. But the Tigers were unable to get a shot away in their final two possessions, and a Cyclone layup with 9 seconds to play was the difference.

Sophomore Unique Thompson had her second straight double-double and third of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds. Emari Jones matched a season-high with 15 points, and McKay's late flurry gave her a 14 -point night.

Auburn was playing its third game in five days in three different states and will have traveled over 3,700 miles since Saturday by the time the team returns home Wednesday.

Thompson dominated both ends of the floor in the first half, racking up 16 points and 10 rebounds by halftime. Meanwhile, lowa State started cold, shooting 18 percent in the first quarter and 28 percent in the first half as the Tigers were able to build an early lead. Auburn led by as many as 15 late in the second quarter before the Cyclones cut the lead to nine at the break, $38-29$.

A 3-pointer from Jones to start the second half pushed the Tigers' lead to 12. But from there, the Cyclones caught fire. A 10-0 ISU run cut the lead to two with 6:34 left in the quarter, and a buzzer-beating 3-pointer tied the game at 45-45.

The Cyclones took their first lead nine seconds into the fourth quarter and never trailed again, going on an $8-0$ run to push the advantage to 10 points at $64-54$ with 2:21 to play. But after a Jones free throw cut the deficit to nine, McKay, who had been quiet most of the night, hit three 3 -pointers in a span of 47 seconds to tie the game.

Auburn shot 41.1\% for the game, but just 31\% in the second half. Meanwhile, Iowa State shot $47 \%$ in the second half, including $40 \%$ on 3 -pointers. The Cyclones won the rebounding battle 42-36, including 16 offensive rebounds which turned into 14 second-chance points.

## Game 5: Nov. 25, 2018 Auburn 71, Louisiana-Lafayette 59 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.



AUBURN -- Returning to the court for the first time in 12 days, the Auburn women's basketball team picked up a 71-59 victory over Louisiana-Lafayette at Auburn Arena on Sunday afternoon.

The win was the 10th straight home non-conference victory for Auburn (4-1), dating back to the 2016-17 season.

Sophomore Unique Thompson recorded her third straight double-double and fourth of the season grabbing 13 rebounds while dropping 16 points; she also led the team with four steals.

Freshman Robyn Benton added 15 points going 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point line. Senior Janiah McKay finished with 13 points and six assists. Emari Jones had eight points and a career-high 10 rebounds, and Daisa Alexander finished with a career-high eight assists.

Auburn jumped out to a quick 15-5 lead behind five points apiece from Thompson and Benton in the opening five minutes. Louisiana (2-3) answered back to cut the Tigers' lead to four at 17-13 after the first quarter. Auburn again pushed ahead by as many as 12 following a Benton jumper with 59 seconds remaining in the half. Louisiana hit a late pair of free throws to cut the Auburn advantage to eight at the half, 34-26.

After the two teams exchanged buckets for much of the 3rd period, the Tigers began to pull away in the fourth quarter opening on an 11-3 run to increase their lead to as much as 16 points at 61-45 with just over five minutes to play. But the Cajuns answered back with a 16-5 run of their own to cut the Auburn lead to as little as five points with 1:25 to play. Auburn would force five turnovers in the last 85 seconds and took advantage of free-throw opportunities to seal the win.

The Tigers forced a season-best 26 turnovers, scoring 27 points on those takeaways. Auburn shot 44.3 percent from the floor and held the Cajuns to 33.3 percent.

Louisiana was paced by Ty'Reona Doucet, who finished with 13 points along with 13 rebounds. Brandi Williams finished with 15 points for the Ragin' Cajuns.

Game 6: Nov. 28, 2018 Auburn 77, Xavier (La.) 58 Convocation Center New Orleans, La.


NEW ORLEANS -- Senior Emari Jones scored 16 points to lead three Tigers in double-figures as Auburn women's basketball defeated Xavier (La.) 77-58 Wednesday night.

It was the 250th career head coaching victory for Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy, now in her seventh season at Auburn and 15th as a collegiate head coach.

Auburn (5-1) took advantage of 25 turnovers by the Gold Nuggets, turning those into 24 points. The Tigers also used a big early run in the third quarter to break open what had been a nine-point game at the half.

Jones' 16 points led all scorers; she also added four rebounds and a pair of assists. Unique Thompson finished with 15 points and a game-high eight rebounds, and Daisa Alexander used a 10-point third quarter to finish with 13 along with six rebounds and five assists. Janiah McKay had a team-leading seven assists along with nine points and five rebounds.

The Tigers shot 43.9 percent from the floor and hit a season-high 10 3-pointers - four from Jones - and had 22 assists on their 29 field goals. Auburn also recorded 14 steals; Thompson and Alexander had three apiece.

Auburn opened the third quarter on a $7-0$ run to push a nine-point halftime lead to 16 at 46-30. The Gold Nuggets would cut the lead to as few as nine late in the period, but a 3-pointer at the buzzer from Alexander gave Auburn a 59-44 lead headed to the fourth.

Auburn saw balanced scoring through a well-played first half on both sides that saw the Tigers take a 39-30 lead to the break. Jones had 10 first-half points and 10 of 11 Auburn players scored as the Tigers shot 46.9 percent from the floor. But Xavier was hot from outside, hitting four 3-pointers to keep things within single-digits.

All 11 players in uniform saw extended playing time, including 14 minutes from freshman Brooke Moore, who had three points in her Auburn debut.

Jas Hill led Xavier with 13 points and Nahrie Pierce added 10. The Cold Nuggets played the game as an exhibition, but the records and statistics count for Auburn.

Game 7: Dec. 2, 2018 Auburn 95, Oklahoma 79 Auburn Arena
Auburn, Ala. SEC/Big 12 Challenge


AUBURN-- Auburn hit 13 3-pointers to set a new school record Sunday afternoon as the Tigers defeated Oklahoma 95-79 at Auburn Arena in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

Led by a double-double from sophomore Unique Thompson, five players scored in double-figures for the Tigers (6-1), who snapped an eight-game losing streak against Big 12 opponents and earned their 11th straight home non-conference win.

The Tigers made 133 -pointers on the night, breaking the previous record of 12 that was set Dec. 5, 2007nearly 11 years ago to the day - against Colgate. Daisa Alexander's third triple of the night with 3:48 to play gave the Tigers an 83-65 lead and set the new program mark.

Thompson finished with 17 points and 14 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the year. She now has 12 dou-ble-doubles for her career, tied for 12th in Auburn history. Alexander led the Auburn attack with 19 points and also had a game-high five assists along with five rebounds.

Emari Jones hit four of Auburn's 13 treys and finished with 16 points, and Crystal Primm and Robyn Benton added 14 points apiece; Primm had a team-leading three steals, and Benton also knocked down four 3-pointers.

Auburn got off to a slow start as the Sooners opened up with a flurry of 3-pointers, taking a 24-17 lead after one quarter. But the Tigers started the second period on an 11-0 run to take a lead they would never relinquish. Auburn shot 52.6 percent in the second quarter and held the Sooners to just 2-of-11 from the field, outscoring Oklahoma 27-6 in the period to take a 44-30 halftime lead.

The Tigers' lead ballooned to as much as 22 points early in the third quarter at 52-30, but the Sooners mounted a charge with a $19-2$ run over the next five minutes to cut the deficit to as few as five points.

Auburn let loose in the fourth, shooting 64.7 percent in the final 10 minutes to put the game away. The Tigers hit three straight 3-pointers in a stretch of less than three minutes, pushing the lead to 18 on Alexander's record-setting shot with 3:48 to play.

## Game 8: Dec. 6, 2018

Auburn 81, St. Joseph's 70
Hagan Arena

PHILADELPHIA -- Janiah McKay scored a season-high 21 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a furious late rally by St. Joseph's to pick up an 81-70 win on the road Thursday night.

At 7-1, the Tigers are off to their best start of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era and their best since the 2008-09 SEC Championship team won their first 20 games. But the victory was not without its tense moments as St. Joseph's (3-6) went on a tear in the second half to nearly erase a 15-point Auburn lead.

McKay's 21 points led all scorers and she was key in the fourth quarter when she scored nine points and hit 6-of-8 free throws in the closing minutes.

Auburn had five total players in double-figures for the second straight game. Daisa Alexander finished with 16 after an 11-point first quarter, Crystal Primm scored 14, Unique Thompson had 12 and Brooke Moore added a sea-son-high 10. Thompson was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

The Tigers led by as many as 15 in the third quarter at 49-34 but saw St. Joseph's go on a furious tear, hitting eight shots in a row and 12-of-14 over a stretch that spanned the third and fourth quarters, to cut the lead to just one at 65-64 with just over six minutes to play.

But Auburn would finally get some defensive stops and put some distance between themselves and the Hawks, going on a 9-0 run to take a 74-64 lead with 2:52 left. The run was punctuated by a steal and fast-break basket by redshirt freshman Kiyae' White, drawing a huge cheer from a group of friends and family from her nearby hometown of Macungie, Pa.

St. Joe's cut it to four points again at 74-70 after a pair of treys, but Auburn took care of business at the freethrow line in the final minute to put the game away.
