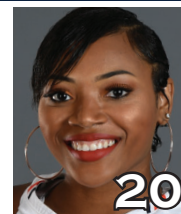

Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- Auburn is facing Xavier (La.) for the second time; the Tigers won 70-44 last year in Auburn
- Of Auburn's last 11 non-conference games, nine have come against schools from Louisiana
- Auburn is 18-12 in regular-season games against current NAIA schools; 24 of those 30 games came prior to 1980
- Sophomore Unique Thompson has recorded four double-doubles in five games, including three straight
- With 13.8 rebounds per game, Thompson leads the SEC and ranks sixth in the nation
- Thompson's 10.0 defensive rebounds per game rank first in the SEC and fourth nationally
- Thompson now has 11 career double-doubles, tied for 14th in Auburn history
- Thompson's 19-point, 14-rebound double-double at Iowa State was her 3rd of the season and 9th of her career
- Thompson's 19 rebounds at New Mexico were a career-high and the most by an Auburn player since 2015
- Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 4-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 25-1 when scoring at least 80 points
- Six Auburn players scored in double-figures vs. Grambling; the first time Auburn has done that since 2008 vs. Sam Houston State
- Janiah McKay (16 pts/10 assists) and Unique Thompson (14 pts/13 rebs) both had double-doubles in the season-opening win over Grambling; Thompson now has 8 double-doubles in 29 career games
- McKay moved up to 20th all-time in scoring at Auburn with 13 points vs. UL-Lafayette; she now has 1,275 points
- McKay leads Auburn in scoring through five games with 15.2 ppg; she also averages an SEC-leading 6.4 assists
- Senior Emari Jones had a career-high 10 rebounds vs. UL-Lafayette; she is averaging 11.2 points and 7.0 rebounds
- Auburn is 71-30 in non-conference games under Terri Williams-Fournoy and has won 16 out of their last 17 at home
- The Tigers have won 10 consecutive home non-conference games dating back to the 2016-17 season
- Auburn is 139-40 all-time in the month of November; Coach Flo is 31-13 in November at Auburn
- Auburn returns four starters and six letterwinners from the 2017-18 squad that finished 14-15 overall (5-11 SEC)
- Auburn finished the 2017-18 season ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals/game (13.2) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9)
- Senior guard Janiah McKay and sophomore forward Unique Thompson were named Preseason All-SEC (2nd team)
- McKay is Auburn's leading returner in scoring (16.6 ppg), assists (4.4/game) and minutes played (32.3/game)
- Thompson averaged 11.5 ppg last year and recorded 7 double-doubles, tying DeWanna Bonner for the Auburn freshman record; she was named to the All-SEC Freshman Team
- Junior guard Daisa Alexander averaged 14.2 ppg last season and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game; she was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team
- Auburn's 2018-19 freshman class was ranked the No. 13 signing class in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz
- Coach Terri Williams-Fournoy is in her seventh season at Auburn, her 15th as a head coach, and her 27th overall in college coaching
- In SEC preseason polls, Auburn was picked to finish 8th by both the media and the league's coaches

OPENING TIP

» Auburn hits the road for the second time this season, traveling to New Orleans to face NAIA squad Xavier University of Louisiana. Game time is 6 p.m. CT at the XULA Convocation Center.

» Auburn is 4-1 on the season; the Tigers came back from a 12-day break to defeat Louisiana-Lafayette 71-59 at home Sunday.

» Xavier comes in at 7-3 after a pair of wins at the University of the Virgin Islands tournament last week. The Gold Nuggets defeated UVI 61-51 and Carlow 61-45.

» Tonight's game counts towards Auburn's record and statistics, but Xavier is playing this game as an exhibition.

LAST TIME OUT

» Returning to the court for the first time in 12 days, the Auburn women's basketball team picked up a 71-59 victory over Louisiana-Lafayette at Auburn Arena on Sunday afternoon.

» The win was the 10th straight home non-conference victory for Auburn (4-1), dating back to the 2016-17 season.

» Sophomore Unique Thompson recorded her third straight double-double and fourth of the season grabbing 13 rebounds while dropping 16 points; she also led the team with four steals.

» Freshman Robyn Benton added 15 points going 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point line. Senior Janiah McKay finished with 13 points and six assists. Emari Jones had eight points and a career-high 10 rebounds, and Daisa Alexander finished with a career-high eight assists.

» The Tigers forced a season-best 26 turnovers, scoring 27 points on those takeaways. Auburn shot 44.3 percent from the floor and held the Cajuns to 33.3 percent.

» This is the second meeting all-time between Auburn and Xavier (La.). The Tigers earned a 70-44 win last season at Auburn Arena.

» Auburn is 18-12 all-time in regular-season games against current NAIA schools; 24 of those 30 games were played prior to 1980.

» Janiah McKay led four players in double-figures as the Auburn women's basketball team pulled away in the second half for a 70-44 win over Xavier University of Louisiana at Auburn Arena.

» The Tigers (9-3) won their sixth straight game to wrap up non-conference play and head into the SEC season having won all six of those games by double digits.

» McKay finished with 17 points and tied a career-

high with six steals along with three assists and two rebounds. Sophomore Daisa Alexander had a strong night across the board as well with 13 points, a team-leading six rebounds, four steals and four assists.

» Freshman Abigayle Jackson had a career-high 12 points off the bench along with four rebounds and a pair of blocks. Senior Jazmine Jones scored 10 points and pulled down five rebounds on her 22nd birthday.

SCOUTING THE GOLD NUGGETS

» Xavier (La.) is 7-3 on the year. The Gold Nuggets have won two straight and three of their last four coming into Wednesday's game.

» The Gold Nuggets won both their games in a tournament at the University of the Virgin Islands last weekend, defeating UVI 61-51 and Carlow 61-45.

» Jas Hill is Xavier's leading scorer with 15.1 points/game. The Gold Nuggets average 67.9 points while holding opponents to 64.3.

» XULA was picked to finish third in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference. The team picked to win the league, Dillard, earned a victory over Louisiana-Lafayette - Auburn's last opponent - earlier this season.

SCOUTING AUBURN

» Auburn is 4-1 on the season after advancing to the semifinals of the preseason WNIT. The Tigers have wins over Grambling, Nicholls, New Mexico and UL-Lafayette while dropping a 3-point game at Iowa State. The Tigers were No. 18 in the initial NCAA RPI release.

» Senior point guard Janiah McKay leads the Tigers in scoring with 15.2 points/game; she also leads the SEC with 6.4 assists/game. McKay is the Tigers' leading returning scorer for the second straight season after averaging 16.6 ppg last season. McKay ranks 20th in career scoring at Auburn with 1,275 points.

» Sophomore forward Unique Thompson is a force under the basket and has been key to Auburn's success early this year. She has four double-doubles in five games and is averaging 14.8 points and 13.8 rebounds. As a freshman last season, she averaged 11.5 ppg and 8.4 rpg with 7 double-doubles, tying the Auburn freshman record.

» Junior Daisa Alexander had a breakout sophomore season where she scored 14.2 points/game and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game, earning a nod to the SEC All-Defensive Team. So far this season, Alexander is averaging 10.8 points/game and had a career-high 8 assists vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.

» Senior Emari Jones has been one of Auburn's most consistent scorers so far in 2018-19, averaging 11.2 points/game and scoring in double-figures in three of five games so far. In 2017-18, she started 16 games and averaged 5.0 points. She transferred to Auburn prior to the 2016-17 season after a year at Shawnee CC in Ullin, Ill., where she was the nation's leading junior college scorer with 746 points in 2015-16.

» Redshirt junior Crystal Primm has given Auburn consistent minutes through her first four games on The Plains, averaging 9.8 points and 3.4 rebounds. Primm transferred from Duke following the 2016-17 season.

» The Tigers' incoming freshman class was ranked No. 13 by ESPN HoopGurlz and included two top-50 prospects in Robyn Benton (#17 overall; #6 guard) and Brooke Moore (#42 overall; #11 guard).

players finish in double-figures in the Tigers' 97-48 win over Grambling on Nov. 6.

» Junior Janiah McKay and freshman Robyn Benton led the way with 16 points, followed by junior Crystal Primm (15), sophomore Unique Thompson (14), and junior Daisa Alexander and senior Emari Jones (13).

» The last time Auburn had at least six players score 10+ points, seven players did it against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008, when the Tigers set a school record with 119 points. That night, it was KeKe Carrier (19), DeWanna Bonner (18), Alli Smalley (16), Whitney Boddie (13), Reneisha Hobbs (13), Chantel Hilliard (13) and Sherell Hobbs (13).

» Through the first five games, Auburn has four players averaging double-digit scoring and six players averaging at least 9.0 points/game.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

» With 97 points in the season-opening win over Grambling, Auburn hit the 90-point plateau for the fourth time in the Coach Flo era and the first since scoring 92 on Nov. 17, 2014 - also against Grambling.

» Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 4-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 25-1 when scoring at least 80 points.

» Auburn's total of 256 points through three games were its most since the 2008-09 season, when the Tigers scored 257 against Alabama A&M (91), Temple (95) and Georgia Southern (71).

SEEING DOUBLE

» Auburn players have recorded five double-doubles through five games with four coming from sophomore Unique Thompson.

» Thompson had 16 points and 13 rebounds for her third straight double-double and fifth of the season vs. Louisiana-Lafayette (11/25). She has now had 3 straight double-doubles in back-to-back seasons.

» With her 19-point, 14-rebound effort at Iowa State, Thompson recorded her 10th career double-double. She had reached the milestone by halftime with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the opening 20 minutes; it was the second time in her career she had a double-double by halftime.

» Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound double-double at New Mexico was her second of the season and marked a career-high in rebounding for the Auburn sophomore.

» Thompson picked up where she left off in 2017-18 with her eighth career double-double, notching 14 points and 13 rebounds in the season-opener against Grambling. And Janiah McKay earned the second of her career with 16 points and 10 assists.

» The last time two Auburn players had a double-double in the same game was Dec. 13, 2015, at Marquette, when Tra'Cee Tanner (13 pts/12 rebs) and Brandy Montgomery (24 pts/12 rebs) did so.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

» After rebounding had been a struggle for Auburn much of the last two seasons, the Tigers have been a force on the glass so far in 2018-19. The Tigers average 42.8 rebounds/game and had 53 in the opener vs. Grambling, their most in a game in two seasons.

» Unique Thompson is the Tigers' leading rebounder, averaging 13.8 through five games. Her 19-rebound effort at New Mexico was a career-high, surpassing the 16 boards she pulled down in her collegiate debut at Virginia Tech on Nov. 13, 2017. She was one board shy of another rare Auburn milestone - the Tigers have not had a 20-rebound game since 1995.

» Through games of Nov. 25, Thompson leads the SEC and ranks 6th in the country in rebounds/game (13.8) and 4th nationally in defensive rebounds/game (10.0).

» Emari Jones had the first double-digit rebounding game of her career with 10 against Louisiana-Lafayette on Nov. 25. She was 2 points shy of her first career double-double.

TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

» Auburn ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals (13.2/game) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9) for the 2017-18 season.

» Last year, the Tigers forced at least 20 turnovers in 23 of 29 games last year, including 10 games with at least 25 opponent turnovers. Auburn was 8-2 last year and has won 26 of its last 29 when forcing at least 25 turnovers.

» Auburn's season high of turnovers forced last year was 35 against ULM, which tied for the second-most by Auburn under Coach Flo and the eighth-most in program history.

» Auburn forced a season-high of 26 turnovers against Louisiana-Lafayette on Nov. 25, turning those into 27 points.

years of eligibility.

» Redshirt freshman Kiyae' White (Macungie, Pa.) will be in action this season after sitting out last year while rehabbing an injury.

» Auburn signed five players to NLI's during the early signing period in November.

» DeWanna Bonner completed her ninth season in the WNBA in 2018, all with the Phoenix Mercury, after taking the 2017 season off for the birth of her twins. Bonner had one of her best pro seasons, averaging 17.3 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while starting all 34 games. 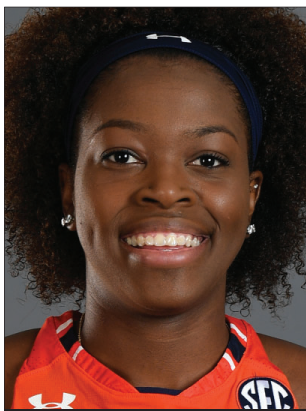

AMES, Iowa -- A furious comeback by the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short Tuesday night as the Tigers dropped a 67-64 battle at Iowa State in the Preseason WNIT semifinal.

Trailing by 10 with less than two minutes to play, senior Janiah McKay made three straight 3-pointers in less than a minute - the last coming with 41 seconds left - to tie the game at 64-all. But the Tigers were unable to get a shot away in their final two possessions, and a Cyclone layup with 9 seconds to play was the difference.

Sophomore Unique Thompson had her second straight double-double and third of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds. Emari Jones matched a season-high with 15 points, and McKay's late flurry gave her a 14-point night.

Auburn was playing its third game in five days in three different states and will have traveled over 3,700 miles since Saturday by the time the team returns home Wednesday.

Thompson dominated both ends of the floor in the first half, racking up 16 points and 10 rebounds by halftime. Meanwhile, Iowa State started cold, shooting 18 percent in the first quarter and 28 percent in the first half as the Tigers were able to build an early lead. Auburn led by as many as 15 late in the second quarter before the Cyclones cut the lead to nine at the break, 38-29.

A 3-pointer from Jones to start the second half pushed the Tigers' lead to 12. But from there, the Cyclones caught fire. A 10-0 ISU run cut the lead to two with 6:34 left in the quarter, and a buzzer-beating 3-pointer tied the game at 45-45.

The Cyclones took their first lead nine seconds into the fourth quarter and never trailed again, going on an 8-0 run to push the advantage to 10 points at 64-54 with 2:21 to play. But after a Jones free throw cut the deficit to nine, McKay, who had been quiet most of the night, hit three 3-pointers in a span of 47 seconds to tie the game.

Auburn shot 41.1% for the game, but just 31% in the second half. Meanwhile, Iowa State shot 47% in the second half, including 40% on 3-pointers. The Cyclones won the rebounding battle 42-36, including 16 offensive rebounds which turned into 14 second-chance points.

AUBURN -- Returning to the court for the first time in 12 days, the Auburn women's basketball team picked up a 71-59 victory over Louisiana-Lafayette at Auburn Arena on Sunday afternoon.

The win was the 10th straight home non-conference victory for Auburn (4-1), dating back to the 2016-17 season.

Sophomore Unique Thompson recorded her third straight double-double and fourth of the season grabbing 13 rebounds while dropping 16 points; she also led the team with four steals.

Freshman Robyn Benton added 15 points going 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point line. Senior Janiah McKay finished with 13 points and six assists. Emari Jones had eight points and a career-high 10 rebounds, and Daisa Alexander finished with a career-high eight assists.

Auburn jumped out to a quick 15-5 lead behind five points apiece from Thompson and Benton in the opening five minutes. Louisiana (2-3) answered back to cut the Tigers' lead to four at 17-13 after the first quarter. Auburn again pushed ahead by as many as 12 following a Benton jumper with 59 seconds remaining in the half. Louisiana hit a late pair of free throws to cut the Auburn advantage to eight at the half, 34-26.

After the two teams exchanged buckets for much of the 3rd period, the Tigers began to pull away in the fourth quarter opening on an 11-3 run to increase their lead to as much as 16 points at 61-45 with just over five minutes to play. But the Cajuns answered back with a 16-5 run of their own to cut the Auburn lead to as little as five points with 1:25 to play. Auburn would force five turnovers in the last 85 seconds and took advantage of free-throw opportunities to seal the win.

The Tigers forced a season-best 26 turnovers, scoring 27 points on those takeaways. Auburn shot 44.3 percent from the floor and held the Cajuns to 33.3 percent.

Louisiana was paced by Ty Reona Doucet, who finished with 13 points along with 13 rebounds. Brandi Williams finished with 15 points for the Ragin' Cajuns.

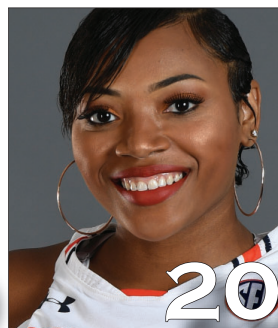

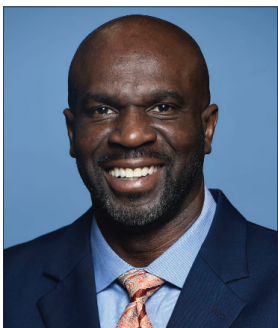
