Notables

Auburn head coach Nell Fortner was the head coach at Purdue for the 1996-97 season, Auburn assistant coach Kerry Cremeans was a Boilermaker assistant from 1997 to 2003 and Auburn video coordinator Kelly Komara played at Purdue from 1998-2002, playing in two national championship games.

The series is even at 1-1.

Purdue is without two starters for the fifth consecutive game. Drey Mingo is recovering from meningitis and KK Houser had ACL surgery on Dec. 1.

The Boilermakers cancelled their trip to Mexico after redshirt junior Drey Mingo was hospitalized with meningitis on Nov. 23.

Purdue won the Preseason WNIT championship with a 67-58 victory over DePaul on Nov. 21. The 4-0 start was the best since a 6-0 start in 2006-07.

The Opponent

Auburn is 4-5 and is coming off a 52-45 win at George Washington on Wednesday. The Tigers have played a challenging nonconference schedule and two of their five losses were to ranked opponents - No. 4 Duke and No. 15/14 Florida State. Auburn has two players averaging double-figure scoring, 5-foot-8 guard Alli Smalley at 12.9 ppg and Blanche Alverson at 10.1 ppg. Senior Jordan Greenleaf leads Auburn in rebounding with an average of 8.7 per game. Auburn head coach Nell Fortner is in her seventh season with the Tigers but is quite familiar with the Hoosier state. She spent one year as the Boilermakers' head coach before taking over as the U.S. National Team head coach. She also spent three seasons as the head coach of the Indiana Fever.

The Series

This is the third meeting between Purdue and Auburn and the series is tied at one win each. In the first matchup, the 11th-ranked Boilermakers defeated No. 5 Auburn 61-57 on Dec. 7, 1989, in Mackey Arena. The second and most-recent meeting was the following season and No. 7 Auburn triumphed over the No. 3 Purdue 75-65 on Jan. 5, 1991, at the Big Ten/SEC Challenge in Iowa City, Iowa.

Next Up

The Boilermakers will play five games in 14 days during the holiday season. Purdue starts by playing host to Southern Illinois on Monday, Dec. 20 in a contest broadcast live on the Big Ten Network at 7:30 p.m. The Boilermakers follow that up with a game at Gardner-Webb on Dec. 22. The team will have a brief break for Christmas before hosting games in Mackey Arena on Dec. 28 (Western Illinois) and Dec. 30 (Wisconsin). Purdue will hit the road for the second Big Ten game of the season at Northwestern on Jan. 2.

Boilermaker BlockBuster

Saturday's game is the 12th Purdue women's basketball game held in Indianapolis designated as the Boilermaker BlockBuster and the first since 2004, when the Boilermakers lost to Duke 66-48 on Dec. 18. Purdue's first Boilermaker BlockBuster game was Dec. 10, 1993, a 95-53 dismantling of Louisville. Current Purdue assistant coach Martin Clapp was an assistant coach on Louisville's staff at that time. The Boilermakers have a 7-3 record in Boilermaker BlockBuster games, plus in 1995-96, the BlockBuster game was an exhibition against the USA National Team which Purdue lost 90-50. Purdue's other past opponents have been DePaul, Old Dominion, Arizona, Louisiana Tech, Kentucky, LSU, UC Santa Barbara and UCLA.

Connections

Auburn has connections to both Purdue and Conesco Fieldhouse. Auburn head coach Nell Fortner was Purdue's head coach for one season, leading the Boilermakers to a 17-11 record and a tie for the Big Ten Conference regular-season championship with a 12-4 record in 1996-97. Purdue assistant Ukari Figgs was a sophomore on that team. Figgs and Auburn video coordinator, Kelly Komara were teammates on the 1999 national championship team. Auburn assistant coach Kerry Cremeans was a Boilermaker assistant coach during Purdue's title run, Figgs was a senior and Komara a freshman. Cremeans worked at Purdue for six years (1997 to 2003) and she and Komara returned to the Final Four in 2001, when Komara was a junior. Fortner has experience in Conesco Fieldhouse. She was the head coach of the Indiana Fever from 2001 to 2003, before taking over at Auburn.

Purdue In Consecro

The Boilermakers have a 23-7 record in Consecro Fieldhouse. Purdue is the designated home team for the Boilermaker BlockBuster but the game is the first neutral site contest for the Boilermakers this season. Purdue is 105-61 all time in neutral site games. Consecro Fieldhouse will be the site of the Big Ten Conference Women's Basketball Tournament for the 10th-consecutive year and the 11th time overall. Purdue is 20-5 in Big Ten Tournament games played in Consecro. The Boilermakers christened Consecro on Dec. 18, 1999, when they played Kentucky in the first-ever college basketball game in the venue. Purdue defeated the Wildcats 48-40 in that contest.

By The Numbers

Two keys to success for Purdue this season are rebounding and high-octane offense. Purdue is 5-0 when it outrebounds its opponents and is 3-0 when scoring 70 points or more.

Challenging Schedule

Purdue is winding up its most challenging stretch of nonconference games. Including Saturday's matchup with Auburn, five of the Boilermakers' last six contests have come against BCS automatic qualifier conferences, with Murray State being the exception. Purdue split against Big East teams, defeating DePaul and losing at Notre Dame, lost by one to Maryland in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and lost at Texas A&M in the Big Ten/Big 12 Challenge. Auburn from the SEC is Purdue final nonconference opponent from a major conference.

Speaking Of The SEC

Purdue is 20-16 all time against SEC opponents, including a 1-1 record vs. Auburn. The Boilermakers are undefeated against Arkansas (2-0), Florida (3-0), Kentucky (2-0), Mississippi State (2-0) and South Carolina (2-0). Purdue has an even series record against Auburn, Georgia (1-1), LSU (2-2) and Mississippi (1-1). Purdue trails Tennessee (1-7) and Vanderbilt (3-4).

Record Setting Night

The Boilermakers set a school and Mackey Arena record by limiting Murray State to 12.2 percent from the field on Dec. 12. The Racers made just six field goals, also a record low for an opponent. The previous lows date back 34 years when Valparaiso hit 8 of 56 shots for 14.3 percent in an 81-22 loss to Purdue on Jan. 25, 1977, in Mackey Arena.

More Impressive Numbers

The Boilermakers held Murray State to 11 points in the second half, just one point shy of the school-record 10 second-half points by Minnesota in 2006. The Racers finished the game with only 25 points, the lowest point total by an opponent since Purdue defeated Savannah State 103-25 on Nov. 28, 2002. Murray State's 14 first-half points, 11 second-half and 25 point total are all season lows. The Boilermakers held the Racers to just two field goals in the second period. The 46-point margin of victory is the first 40+ point winning margin for Purdue since defeating Northwestern 72-30 on Jan. 25, 2007. The Boilermakers recorded a season-high 18 steals by forcing a season-high 28 turnovers by Murray State. Purdue also grabbed a season-high 31 defensive rebounds in the victory and tied a season high with eight blocked shots.

Four Boilermakers Reach Double-Figures

For the third time this season, Purdue had four players score in double-digits in the win over Murray State. Antionette Howard, Brittany Rayburn and Ashley Wilson - in her first start of the season - scored 11 points each and Alex Guyton contributed 10 points. Purdue has had five players in double-figures in one game this year, the 93-53 win against Austin Peay.

Scoring The Rock

The Boilermakers converted 65.5 percent of its field goals against Murray State in the second half, connecting on 19 of 29 shots. Purdue finished the game shooting 52.6 percent (30 of 57), despite making a season-low 1 of 12 three-pointers (8.3%). It is the third time this season that the Boilermakers have shot 50 percent or higher from the field.

Moses Scores Season High At Texas A&M

Courtney Moses scored a season-high 26 points at No. 7 Texas A&M and was the only Boilermaker in double-figures. She was an impressive 9 of 16 from the field, including 4 of 6 from three-point range. It was the second 20+ point game of the season for the freshman point guard. She scored 20 points in the season opener against Austin Peay.

Guyton Chips In

Junior forward Alex Guyton has helped filled the void created by Drey Mingo's illness by scoring a career-high 11 points and pulling down a season-high four rebounds against Maryland. She followed that up with 10 points on 5 of 9 from the field at Notre Dame and tied her career high with a game-high nine rebounds at Texas A&M. The Bloomington, Ind., native scored 10 points and tied Antionette Howard for team-high rebounding honors with seven against Murray State.

Rayburn's Contributions

Junior guard Brittany Rayburn returned to double-figures with 11 points against Murray State. She had scored in double-figures in eight consecutive contests, dating back to last season's 20-point performance against Eastern Michigan. The streak ended at Texas A&M where Rayburn contributed six points before being ejected for a flagrant foul for an elbow at 17:30 in the second half. She continues to lead the team in scoring with a 14.3 ppg average. As of Dec. 12, Rayburn was tied for 24th nationally for season free throw percentage and currently is shooting 90.0 percent (45 of 50) from the charity stripe.

Offensive Production

After averaging 59.7 points per game with a season high of 81 points vs. Iowa last season, the Boilermakers were averaging 78.0 points per game with Drey Mingo in the line up, including a season-high 93 points against Austin Peay. Purdue did not shoot 50.0 or higher in a game last year, but hit 52.5 percent against Austin Peay and 54.7 percent in the win over South Dakota State. In the four games since Mingo's illness the Boilermakers have averaged 58.0 points per game and just 53.7 points per game against the three ranked opponents in that stretch.

Moses Leads The Way

Against Maryland, freshman point guard Courtney Moses led Purdue with 12 points and five assists. She was 3 of 3 from beyond the arc and also contributed two steals. Moses is second on the team in scoring at 12.6 points per game.

Records Watch

- Brittany Rayburn has scored 933 points in her career and needs 67 points to become the 26th member of Purdue's 1,000 Point Club.
- Rayburn is currently 13th in career made three-point field goals at Purdue with 102. She made her 100th career three-pointer against South Dakota State.
- Rayburn is 12th in career made free throws with 285 and is third in career free throw percentage, averaging 81.7 percent (285 of 349).

Mingo On The Mend

Drey Mingo, a redshirt junior and Purdue's second-leading scorer, is out indefinitely while she recovers from bacterial meningitis. The 6-foot-2 forward was taken to the hospital Nov. 23 in critical condition. She was released Nov. 28, but has some damage to her hearing/auditory system, the extent of which will not be known for some time.

Wilson Returns

In early September, sophomore Ashley Wilson had a second surgery on her lower right leg which caused her to miss the first four games of the season. Wilson saw limited minutes at Texas A&M after suffering a contusion on her lower right leg in practice on Dec. 6. She made her season debut against Maryland, tallying three points, two steals and a rebound in eight minutes. At Notre Dame she recorded four points and five rebounds in 17 minutes. The Wheeling, Ill., native pulled down a team-best 57 offensive boards last season.

Head Coach Sharon Versyp

Former Purdue point guard, Sharon Versyp is in her fifth season as head coach of the Boilermakers. She has a 95-52 record at Purdue and a career mark of 212-117 in 11 seasons as a collegiate head coach. Versyp has led the Boilermakers to two Big Ten Tournament championships (2007 and 2008) and to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight twice (2007 and 2009). In April 2010, Versyp was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame.

Houser Out For Season

Sophomore point guard KK Houser tore the anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee and had surgery Dec. 1. Houser injured her knee at the 16:11 mark in the first half of Purdue's season opener against Austin Peay while attempting a fastbreak layup in traffic. The Lincoln, Neb., native was a starter in five of Purdue's 32 games last year. She averaged 5.8 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 19.0 minutes per game.

Caribbean Challenge

The Boilermakers were scheduled to fly to Mexico the morning of Nov. 24 to participate in the Caribbean Challenge, but the team cancelled the trip due to Drey Mingo's illness. The travel party had arrived in Indianapolis on Tuesday night in preparation for its flight when the decision was made not to participate in the two-day tournament. The Boilermakers were to have played Montana on Nov. 25 and Florida Gulf Coast on Nov. 26. Purdue had an 11-day layoff before facing Maryland on Dec. 2.

Preseason WNIT

Purdue's 67-58 win over DePaul was the second Preseason WNIT Championship for head coach Sharon Versyp at Purdue. Versyp led the Boilermakers to the title in 2006, defeating No. 16 Baylor, 69-55, in Waco, Texas. This year, Brittany Rayburn was named Preseason WNIT Most Valuable Player and Drey Mingo was named to the all-tournament team. The juniors scored 21 points each in the championship game, while Mingo pulled down 13 rebounds for a double-double.

Mingo Steps Up

Drey Mingo had a career night in the win over DePaul. She recorded her first double-double as a Boilermaker with 21 points and 13 rebounds while dishing out a team-high three assists. The 6-foot-2 forward was 3 of 3 from beyond the arc and hit 10 of 12 free throws.

Freshman of the Week

Purdue point guard Courtney Moses was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Nov. 15. The Sweetser, Ind., native scored a game-high 20 points, hitting 63.6 percent of her shots, including 80.0 percent (4 of 5) from three-point range against Austin Peay. Moses dished out a team-high five assists and is the first freshman to score 20+ points in a season opener since Natasha Bogdanova dropped 23 on IPFW in 2004. As a senior at Oak Hill H.S., Moses led the state in scoring with an average of 31.7 points per game. Moses is the eighth Indiana Miss Basketball to play at Purdue.

No (Senior) Class

In an informal poll of NCAA Division I women's basketball programs, Purdue is one of seven schools without a senior on the roster. Interestingly, the Boilermakers play three of the seven in the regular season - Illinois, Maryland and Murray State. Miami, Oral Roberts and Rutgers are the other three schools. Purdue has the largest junior class of the group with six.

Big Ten Honors

Brittany Rayburn was chosen by the media to the Preseason All-Big Ten team. The junior guard was Purdue's leading scorer last year, averaging 14.6 points and 3.4 rebounds. As a sophomore, Rayburn was tabbed second team All-Big Ten by the coaches and third team by the media. The Attica, Ind., native was second on the team in assists (63) and steals (44) and set the school record for consecutive made free throws with a streak of 38. The media selected Purdue and Michigan State No. 3 in the preseason poll.

Welcome Back

The Boilermakers are anxious to put last year's 15-17 season behind them, the first losing season in 25 years at Purdue. On the plus side, the Boilermakers welcome back three starters, including leading scorer Brittany Rayburn who averaged 14.6 ppg. Junior center Chelsea Jones tied for third-highest scoring average at 6.5 ppg and Samantha Woods averaged 5.1 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. Purdue returns its top six rebounders led by sophomore Sam Ostarello's 5.0 rpg average.

Team Captains

Juniors Drey Mingo and Samantha Woods were chosen as team captains for the 2010-11 season.

Speed, Strength and Conditioning

The Purdue women's basketball team had a successful offseason of strength and conditioning. Sophomore Ashley Wilson continues her ownership of the all-time bench press record, increasing to 185 pounds. Courtney Moses is second all time at 175 pounds and Drey Mingo and Chantel Poston are third at 170 pounds. Poston set records for the squats with a max of 335 pounds and the power clean at 91 kg. The Boilermakers have six players at 65 kg and above in the power clean, the most in school history. Purdue also had three student-athletes run sub-six minute miles. Freshman Dee Dee Williams posted the fastest time at 5:33, while Moses was right behind at 5:34 and KK Houser came in at 5:48.

Among Nation's Best In Attendance

Purdue fans' loyal support makes Mackey Arena a tough place to play and has placed the Boilermakers in the top 10 in national attendance for 15-straight seasons. Purdue has finished No. 5 each of the last three years and has averaged 6,238 per game this season.

Versyp Signs 10th-Ranked Recruiting Class

Purdue head women's basketball coach Sharon Versyp announced that for the fifth-straight year, the Boilermakers have inked a top 15 recruiting class. Liza Clemons from Fort Wayne, Ind., and Torrie Thornton of Carmel, Ind., will join the Boilermakers in the fall of 2011. Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ranks this class 10th nationally while the All-Star Girls Report has the two-person class ranked 23rd. Both Clemons and Thornton have helped their teams to state titles. As a sophomore at Elmhurst, Clemons helped lead the team to the school's first girls' basketball state championship. She has transferred to Snider after Elmhurst closed this summer. Thornton was a key to Carmel High School's Class 4A state title in 2008 when she was a freshman.

Purdue to Host NCAA Tournament First- and Second-Round

The NCAA announced that Mackey Arena will serve as one of 16 sites for first- and second-round NCAA Tournament games in March 2012. Purdue has hosted initial rounds 13 times, but has been on a three-year hiatus from hosting due to the Mackey Arena construction. The last time Purdue played host to NCAA Tournament was March 23 to 25, 2008. That was the last year of the eight-site format with eight teams at each site.

Big Ten Tournament

Celebrating its 16th year in Indianapolis, the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will be played for the 10th-straight year at Consecro Fieldhouse, March 3-6, 2011. The 17th annual tournament features 10 games over four days with the champion earning the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Big Ten Conference is in its fourth year of a five-year agreement with the City of Indianapolis to host both the Big Ten Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments. The men's event will be held at Consecro Fieldhouse March 10 to 13. The women's tournament bracket will be announced Sunday, Feb. 27, the final day of the regular season. All 11 Big Ten teams participate in the tournament with the top five finishers receiving first-round byes. The bracket is seeded according to the final regular-season standings with the team or teams finishing atop the standings named Big Ten Champion. Tickets can be purchased at the Purdue Athletic Ticket office, Consecro Fieldhouse box office and Ticketmaster. The Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will feature general admission seating for the first time, allowing fans to witness the action from the best available seats in Consecro Fieldhouse. Purdue head coach Sharon Versyp has led her teams to two Big Ten Tournament championships and two NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearances in four years at her alma mater. In that span, her teams have averaged 22.5 wins per season and under her direction the Boilermakers have finished in the top five of the Big Ten regular season standings each year, including two runner-up finishes. Versyp recently signed a contract extension that will secure her presence on the Boilermaker sidelines through the 2014-15 season.

Versyp's impact on basketball in the Hoosier state was recognized on April 24, 2010, when she was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in her first year of eligibility.

The Mishawaka, Ind., native is known for her prowess in defense, game preparation, individual player development and team building. Recruiting is a key to success and Versyp and her staff have proven that they can attract elite players to Purdue. Each of Versyp's four signing classes has been ranked in the top 15.

Equally impressive to the on-court accolades are the team's academic achievements under Versyp's guidance. For three-straight years, the Boilermakers have earned a team GPA of 3.10 or better.

The 2009-10 season was a rebuilding one. Versyp lost five seniors, two (Danielle Campbell and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton) were WNBA draft picks. Before official practice was underway, Chantel Poston was lost for the year with an Achilles tendon injury and Alex Guyton and Ashley Wilson were limited the entire season due to stress fractures. Versyp earned her 200th career victory with a 53-42 win over Northwestern on Jan. 10 and led Purdue to back-to-back victories over ranked opponents with a 63-61 decision against No. 4 Ohio State and an 80-76 overtime win at No. 23 Penn State. With a fifth-place finish in the Big Ten regular season Purdue earned a first-round bye for the 16th consecutive year and remains the only team to have never played on the first day of the Big Ten Tournament.

Versyp returned to her alma mater as Purdue's eighth head coach on April 10, 2006. Versyp, a former Boilermaker point

guard, as a player led her teams to three consecutive winning seasons when the program had enjoyed only one winning campaign in the previous 10 years.

In her first year as head coach at Purdue, Versyp compiled a 31-6 record that included a second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season, a Big Ten Tournament title and an appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight. Versyp was named the 2007 WBCA Region VI Coach of the Year.

Versyp's win percentage in 2006-07 of 83.8 percent (31-6) was tops for a first-year coach. The 31 wins equals the second-most in school history and Versyp is the only first-year head coach to achieve a 30-win record.

Versyp was the head coach at Indiana prior to Purdue, where she led her team to a 19-14 season, 9-7 in the Big Ten and the quarterfinals of the post-season WNIT. The nine-game improvement was the second largest turn-around in school history for a first-year head coach.

Prior to her stint with the Hoosiers, Versyp was the head coach at Maine for five seasons where she amassed a 98-51 record, including a 67-19 America East Conference record. Versyp's teams won three straight America East regular season championships (2003, 2004, 2005) and in 2004 also won the America East Tournament title earning an NCAA Tournament berth.

The Purdue Boilermakers had a strong offensive showing in the first game of the 2010-11 regular season in a 93-53 win over Austin Peay in the opening round of the Preseason WNIT. Freshman Courtney Moses led the way with game highs of 20 points and five assists. It was Purdue's ninth-straight win in a season opener - a school record - and improves the Boilermakers to 21-0 all time in season opening games in Mackey Arena. Purdue never trailed in the contest, clicking offensively from the start. The Boilermakers hit 41 percent of their shots in the first half, 66.7 percent in the second half for 52.5 percent for the game. Junior Brittany Rayburn made her first four three-point attempts, scoring 12 of the Boilermaker's first 20 points. And despite Austin Peay also making 41 percent of its shots, the Boilers led 42-27 at halftime. Contributing to this lead was Purdue garnering seven first half steals and forcing the Lady Gows into 13 turnovers in the period. Purdue would finish with 10 steals and 19 forced turnovers for the game. The second half began with a 27-6 run by Purdue in the first eight minutes. Nine of those came in the first 1:33, highlighted by Moses scoring five straight. Sophomore Sam Ostarello also shined in the second half, at one point scoring eight in a row. She went 8 of 9 from the floor after connecting on seven shots straight shots, finishing with 18 points total. This eclipsed her previous career high of 17 points. Purdue made 66.7 percent of its shots in the second half and clamped down on defense, holding Austin Peay to 37.9 percent. The Boilers also outrebounded Austin Peay, 42 to 25, and pulled down 17 offensive boards compared to Austin Peay's 10. On the defensive end, junior forward Samantha Woods tied a career high with three blocked shots. Purdue got 64 points from the bench and 11 Boilermakers scored. About the only negative in the game was an injury to starting point guard KK Houser. Houser went down early in the first half when attempting a layup in traffic and did not return to the contest.

The Purdue Boilermakers never trailed as they knocked off South Dakota State 73-40 to advance to the Preseason WNIT finals for the third time in program history. Junior Brittany Rayburn had the hot hand early for Purdue as she made her first five shots including knocking down her 100th career three-pointer. She was fouled on the shot which set up a four-point play and sparked a 19-5 run over the next 6:33 to push the Boilermakers' lead to 35-16. Rayburn scored eight of the 19 points in the run and junior guard Antionette Howard chipped in seven. Howard and Rayburn combined to score 27 of Purdue's 37 first half points on 11 of 13 shooting from the floor. Purdue's defense was equally as tough. It is the second time in three games that the Boilermakers shot above 50 percent from the field. The Boilermakers took complete control of the game in the second half as they opened with a 27-7 run. The run, which featured scoring from eight different players, was led by junior Drey Mingo who scored 10 points in the stretch. Mingo was the second leading scorer with 17 points. Rayburn finished with a game-high 19. Howard added 15 points, six rebounds, four assists and two steals for Purdue. Led by Howard and Mingo, the Boilermakers outscored the Jackrabbits 48 to 16 in points in the paint. Freshman Dee Dee Williams played the best game of her young career as she totaled career highs in rebounds with six and assists with five. Purdue's defense was equally as tough in the second half as it again gave up just 20 points. The Boilermakers held South Dakota State to 36 percent shooting in the half and 34.1 percent for the game. The Jackrabbits had two players reach double figures. Freshman guard Megan Waytashek scored 13 points and junior guard Jill Young added 12.

Purdue won the Preseason WNIT 67-58 over a talented DePaul team to move to 4-0 on the season. Brittany Rayburn scored 21 points and was named the tournament most valuable player, while forward Drey Mingo was named to the all-tournament team with a 21-point and 13-rebound performance. Free throws were the difference in the game as Purdue was held to 15 made field goals in the contest - just five in the second half - but outscored DePaul 32 to 12 from the charity stripe. Early second period fouls by the Blue Demons put the Boilermakers in the bonus at the 14:41 mark of the second half and Purdue converted 26 of 30 after the break. Purdue regained the lead for the first time since the 1:12 mark in the first half with a 9-0 run in the middle of the second period. Purdue outscored DePaul 39-28 in the second half after trailing by two at the half. In a defensive battle, the Blue Demons were held to 30.6 percent from the field (19 of 62) and the Boilermakers were only slightly better at 31.9 percent (15 of 47). Purdue finished with eight steals, forced 19 turnovers, blocked five shots and Rayburn took three charges. Mingo and Rayburn led the Boilermakers in scoring, with 21 points each. Rayburn got off to another strong start for Purdue, scoring nine of Purdue's first 14 points. Mingo recorded her first career double-double and Purdue's first double-double of the season, with a career-high 13 rebounds to go with her 21 points. Mingo also hit a career-best three of three from the three-point line. Freshman Courtney Moses was the third Boilermaker to finished in double digits with 11 points. It was a back-and-forth game in the first half with DePaul leading by a bucket, 30-28 when the teams headed to the locker room. The Boilermakers outrebounded DePaul 19-14 in the first half and 36-33 for the game. For DePaul, three players finished with double-digit points. Keisha Hampton, also named to the WNIT All-Tournament Team, had 15 points and five rebounds. Sam Quigley totaled 13 and Anna Martin ended with 12 total points. It is the second Preseason WNIT title for head coach Sharon Versyp at Purdue, the first was in 2006 in Versyp's first season as head coach.

Lynetta Kizer scored 20 points to help No. 22 Maryland rally past Purdue 56-55 on Thursday night in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Freshman Courtney Moses led Purdue with 12 points and five assists, but had seven turnovers and missed what could have been a game-winning shot in the closing seconds. Alyssa Thomas and Diandra Tchatchouang each scored 12 points for the Terrapins (6-1), who trailed by 11 with 5:24 remaining. Maryland outrebounded Purdue 40-27 and scored 20 points off offensive rebounds. It was Purdue's first game since Nov. 21. The Boilermakers were scheduled to participate in the Caribbean Challenge at Playa del Carmen, Mexico, but the trip was canceled when forward Drey Mingo was diagnosed with bacterial meningitis. She has been released from the hospital, but she missed Thursday's game against the school she transferred from last year and is out indefinitely. Purdue led 21-15 after two free throws by Brittany Rayburn, but Maryland rallied with a 6-0 run. Moses made a three-pointer with 1:10 left in the first half to give the Boilermakers a 25-23 lead. Maryland tied the game with a pair of free throws in the final minute, then Alex Guyton banked in a shot on an assist from Moses as time expired in the first half to give Purdue a 27-25 lead at the break. Maryland led 37-34 before Purdue went on a 10-0 run. A three-point play and a three-pointer by Moses helped Purdue take a 44-37 lead with eight minutes remaining. A layup by Rayburn, on another assist from Moses, pushed the advantage to 51-42 and brought the crowd to its feet. A 6-0 run by Maryland cut Purdue's lead to 53-48. Moses, who had left the game because she had four fouls, came back in and almost immediately had an assist to Guyton to push the lead back to seven with 4:10 to play. Two baskets by Tchatchouang cut Purdue's lead to 55-54 with 1:27 remaining. Antionette Howard missed a jumper, and Maryland moved quickly downcourt. Thomas' layup with 52 seconds left gave Maryland a 56-55 lead. Purdue had another chance, but Moses committed her seventh turnover with 36.5 seconds left. Maryland looked for a shot, but turned the ball over with 8.9 seconds left, giving Moses and Purdue one more chance.

Purdue held Murray State to the lowest point total by an opponent since 2002 and set a school record for opponent field goal percentage in a 71-25 victory in Mackey Arena. The 25 points scored by Murray State (2-7) was a result of Purdue's smothering defense which limited the Racers to 12.2 percent from the field - a school and Mackey Arena record. The previous low was 14.3 percent by Valparaiso on Jan. 25, 1977. Murray State did not make its first basket until the 16:43 mark of the first half and scored just three more baskets and four free throws for the rest of the half. At the 12:19 mark, Purdue led 12-10. The Boilermakers went on an 18-4 run to finish the half with a 30-14 lead. Purdue continued its strong offense in the second half, hitting 65.5 percent of its shots and holding the Racers to 9.1 percent field goal percentage. Murray State did not make a field goal in the second period until 13:58 remained. The Racers managed only two field goals and 11 points in the second half. Purdue forced a season-high 28 turnovers and tied a season high with eight blocked shots, three of them by sophomore Sam Ostarello. Purdue's offense was a balanced one, with three players tying for scoring honors. Brittany Rayburn, Ashley Wilson and Antoinette Howard each contributed 11 points. In addition, all 10 players scored at least one field goal and played at least 12 minutes. Alex Guyton and Howard pulled down seven rebounds each to lead the Boilermakers on the boards. The seven rebounds is a season high for Howard. Guyton also scored 10 points to give Purdue four in double-figures while not allowing a single Murray State player in double-digits. It is the third time this season that four Boilermakers have scored in double-figures. Murray's State' was led by Mariah Robinson with eight points and Kayla Lowe with seven. Murray State made three three-pointers in the game, two more than the Boilermakers whose sole triple was by Samantha Woods in the second half. The Boilermakers had season highs with 31 defensive rebounds and 18 steals.
