Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the seventh meeting between Auburn and Missouri and the fourth in Auburn
- The all-time series is tied 3-3; Auburn has won two of the three meetings at home
- Missouri has won the last two meetings, including a 59-49 win in Columbia last season
- Auburn is 5-0 in February for the first time since the 2008-09 season
- Auburn's last six-game SEC win streak came across two seasons - won the final game of 2008 and the first five in 2009
- Auburn has not won six straight SEC games in one season since the 1992-93 season
- With the win over No. 16 Florida on Feb. 14, Auburn has multiple top-25 wins in one season for the first time since 2009-10
- Auburn has had two SEC Players of the Week (Frerking, Tanner) for the first time since 2008-09
- Auburn's win over Vanderbilt on Feb. 4 was the first home win over the Commodores since 1999
- Auburn's win over LSU in Baton Rouge on Feb. 1 was the first for the Tigers at LSU since 2010
- The Tigers are 2-1 in overtime this season; 3 OT games ties for the second-most in a season in team history
- Auburn got its first win over a top-10 opponent since 2010 with a 66-61 win over No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 3
- Auburn is second in the SEC and eighth in the nation in steals per game (11.8) and 15th NCAA in turnovers forced (21.2)
- Junior Katie Frerking leads the SEC in steals (2.7/game)
- During Auburn's five-game win streak, Frerking leads the team in scoring (16.2), rebounds (5.8), assists (4.3) and steals (3.0)
- Auburn tied a school record with 24 steals vs. East Carolina (12/5) and forced 33 turnovers, 9th most in AU history
- Auburn forced Winthrop into 35 turnovers (12/16), seventh-most in Auburn history
- Auburn has forced 25+ turnovers eight times this season (35 vs. Winthrop; 33 vs. ECU; 30 vs. George Mason; 29 vs. Vandy; 28 vs. Arkansas; 27 vs. Boise State; 26 vs. Kentucky; 25 vs. Savannah State); Tigers are 8-0 in those games
- Auburn's 21 steals vs. Arkansas (1/24) were the most in program history against an SEC opponent
- Auburn finished non-conference play with a 10-3 mark, one game better than their 2014-15 non-SEC record
- Senior Tra'Cee Tanner was named SEC Player of the Week (Jan. 4) after back-to-back double-doubles vs. FGCU and Kentucky
- Tanner has six double-doubles on the season (UAB, Boise State, Marquette, FGCU, Kentucky, Tennessee) and 14 career
- Tanner pulled down a career-high 19 rebounds at FGCU (12/30); first player with 19+ rebounds since KeKe Carrier (2010)
- With her 11th point vs. Boise State on Nov. 27 - a free throw in the third quarter - Tanner became the 30th player in Auburn history with 1,000 career points
- Tanner is first in the SEC and fifth in the nation in field goal percentage (61.6%)
- Junior Brandy Montgomery hit the 1,000-point mark for her career with her 14th point vs. Kentucky on Jan. 3, the 31st player at Auburn to surpass 1,000 career points and second this season
- Montgomery is seventh in the SEC in scoring with 15.1 points per game; she is sixth in the SEC in steals (2.0/game)
- Montgomery scored a season-high 28 points on 10-of-16 shooting (6-10 3FG) vs. George Mason (12/23)
- Montgomery scored 25 points and made the tying and game-winning 3-pointers in overtime win vs. Minnesota (11/28)
- Montgomery has scored 20+ points in nine games this year
- Montgomery and Tanner each had double-doubles in Auburn's loss at Marquette; first dual double-doubles for Auburn since Peyton Davis and Tyrese Tanner did so vs. Alabama A&M in 2013
- Auburn has won 22 straight games when scoring at least 70 points; Tigers are 41-4 under Coach Flo with 70+ points

OPENING TIP

» Auburn looks to stay perfect in the month of February as the Missouri Tigers visit Auburn Arena on Sunday, Feb. 21. Tip is set for 2 p.m.

» The Auburn Tigers enter Thursday's game at 18-8 overall, 8-5 in SEC play, winners of five straight and currently tied for fourth in the SEC standings. Mizzou is 20-6 overall, 7-6 SEC, and in seventh place in the league.

» Auburn is coming off an 80-58 win over No. 16 Florida on Sunday. Missouri's last outing was a 69-48 home win over Arkansas last Sunday.

LAST TIME OUT - AUBURN 80, #16 FLORIDA 58

» Katie Frerking's second career double-double led four players in double figures, and the Auburn women's basketball team pulled away in the second half for an 80-58 win over No. 16 Florida Sunday at Auburn Arena.

» The Tigers (18-8, 8-5) won their fifth straight game in SEC play and moved into a virtual tie for third place in the SEC standings with three games remaining. It was Auburn's second win over a nationally ranked opponent this year, the first time for the Tigers to accomplish that feat since the 2009-10 season.

» After a back-and-forth first half saw Auburn emerge with a 48-43 lead - the highest-scoring combined half in an Auburn game this season - the Tigers' defense stood tall in the second half and held the Gators to a season-low 15 points.

» Frerking scored 18 points along with 10 rebounds, five assists and four steals. It was the second double-double of her career, the first coming against Texas A&M in last season's SEC Tournament. She was 7-of-14 from the floor and knocked down a pair of 3-pointers. Frerking has averaged 19.0 points, 5.7 rebounds and 4.7 assists in the Tigers' last three games.

» Auburn shot 47.0 percent from the field and held Florida, the SEC's highest-scoring team at 80.5 points per game, to 42.3 percent shooting. The Tigers forced the Gators into 21 turnovers while committing just 10 themselves, a season-low in SEC play. Each team finished with 35 rebounds. It was Auburn's first regular-season win over Florida since 2011.

» Auburn plays its final home game of the 2015-16 regular season Thursday, Feb. 25, as 12th-ranked Texas A&M visits Auburn Arena at 6:30 p.m.

» This is the third meeting in Auburn since Mizzou joined the SEC. The teams have split the two meetings. Mizzou has won both prior meetings in Columbia.

LAST MEETING: MISSOURI 59, AUBURN 49 (2/8/15)

» Tra'Cee Tanner recorded her fifth double-double of the season, but Missouri came from behind for a 59-49 win at Mizzou Arena.

» Auburn led by as many as eight points early in the second half, but went cold over the final 11 minutes as Mizzou heated up from the floor and the free-throw line. Mizzou was 14-of-20 at the line in the game while Auburn hit just seven of 17 free-throw attempts.

» Tanner finished with 15 points and 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season, third in SEC play and second in the last three game. Brandy Montgomery added 10 points for Auburn.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

» Missouri is 20-6 overall, 7-6 in SEC play. The Tigers are receiving votes in both polls.

» Missouri has won its last two games, defeating Arkansas 69-48 and Alabama 63-52. The Tigers have also picked up wins over Mississippi State, Florida, Georgia, LSU and Ole Miss in SEC play.

» The Tigers are fifth in the SEC in both scoring offense (69.9 points/game) and scoring defense (57.7/game). They lead the league in free-throw shooting (74.1%), rebounding margin (+8.2), assists (16.1/game), defensive rebounds (28.2/game) and 3-pointers made per game (7.0).

» Freshman Sophie Cunningham leads Mizzou with 12.9 points/game and broke the school record earlier this season with 42 points vs. Wake Forest. Jordan Frericks is Mizzou's leading rebounder with 7.8/game.

SCOUTING AUBURN

» Auburn is 18-8 for the 2015-16 season and 8-5 in SEC play, and currently riding a five-game winning streak. Coach Flo has her best regular-season win total since arriving at Auburn (won 16 regular-season games in 2013 and 2014).

» Junior Brandy Montgomery is the SEC's seventh-leading scorer, averaging 15.1 points/game. She also averages 2.0 steals per contest, sixth-best in the league. Montgomery scored a season-high 28 in the win over George Mason and has topped the 20-point mark nine times in 18 games. She also had her second career double-double with 24 points and 12 rebounds at Marquette.

» Senior Tra'Cee Tanner leads the SEC and is fifth in the nation in field goal percentage (61.6%), and was a perfect 7-for-7 from the field in last Thursday's win at Ole Miss. She averages 12.8 points and a team-leading 7.4 rebounds per game.

» Junior Katie Frerking leads the SEC with 2.7 steals per game. She also averages 12.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per contest. She has played almost every position on the floor during her career, including some point guard this season. Frerking has had a career-high six steals in three games this season.

COMEBACK KIDS

» Auburn has overcome double-digit deficits four times this season to pick up come-from-behind victories with three of those in SEC play.

» Auburn's first big comeback came against Boise State in the San Juan Shootout when the Tigers trailed by as many as 12 late in the first quarter before fighting back for a 55-53 win.

» The Tigers were down by 17 points to No. 7 Kentucky with just under 3:00 to play in the first half but cut the deficit to nine at halftime and eventually pulled ahead for a 66-61 upset win on Jan. 3.

» On Feb. 11, Auburn trailed by 12 points midway through the third quarter at Ole Miss but outscored the Rebels 20-8 in the fourth quarter to pick up a 65-60

victory in Oxford.

» Auburn found itself down 10 points early to No. 16 Florida, but outscored the Gators 15-2 the rest of the first quarter and pulled away late for an 80-58 win on Feb. 14 at home.

SHE'S FRERKING AWESOME

» Junior Katie Frerking has been Auburn's do-everything player in conference play, leading the Tigers in scoring (13.2/game), assists (3.3/game) and steals (2.5/game) in SEC games.

» She was named SEC Player of the Week after her second career-double-double led the Tigers past No. 16 Florida on Feb. 14. She led the team with 18 points, 10 rebounds, 5 assists and 4 steals in the game.

» During Auburn's five-game winning streak, she has averaged a team-leading 16.2 points, 5.8 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 3.0 steals. And in two wins over Alabama this year, she's totaled 43 points (21 at home, 22 on the road).

WORKING OVERTIME

» Auburn is 2-1 in overtime games this season. Three overtime games ties for the second-most in a single season in program history.

» Auburn's 81-79 overtime win over Minnesota at the San Juan Shootout on Nov. 28 was the Tigers' first overtime game since the 2014 season when the Tigers lost in OT at Ole Miss.

» It only took two more games for Auburn to play its second OT game of the season, this a 70-69 loss at Marquette on Dec. 13.

» Brandy Montgomery hit a 3-pointer with 8.6 seconds left to force overtime against Arkansas on Jan. 24, and Auburn outscored the Razorbacks 15-4 in the extra period for a 71-60 win.

» Auburn is now 19-19 all-time in overtime games. The Tigers are 3-2 in OT under Coach Flo.

» Auburn's win over Arkansas on Jan. 24 was just the second overtime game at Auburn Arena. The first was a 70-65 double OT win over Alabama on Feb. 27, 2014.

WINNING WITH DEFENSE

» Auburn has forced 20 or more turnovers in 14 of its last 22 games and 25 or more in seven of those 14. Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 27-5 when forcing 25 or more opponent turnovers (8-0 this season).

» Auburn ranks 15th in the nation in turnovers forced (21.2/game) and 8th in the nation in steals (11.8/game).

» Against East Carolina on Dec. 5, Auburn tied a school record with 24 steals (previous: 24 vs. Tennessee State in 2001) and forced 33 turnovers, tied for the ninth

» Junior Katie Frerking was named SEC Player of the Week (2/16) after a double-double (18 points/10 rebounds) plus five assists and four steals led Auburn past No. 16 Florida, 80-58. She leads the SEC in steals (2.7/game).



most in program history.

» One home game later, Auburn forced Winthrop into 35 turnovers, the most under Coach Flo at Auburn and seventh-most in program history (fourth-most vs. a Division I opponent).

» Auburn forced No. 7 Kentucky into a season-high 26 turnovers in the Tigers' 66-61 upset victory on Jan. 3.

» In the OT win over Arkansas on Jan. 24, Auburn had 21 steals, tied for ninth in program history and the most ever against an SEC opponent. The Tigers forced 28 Razorback turnovers.

» The Tigers forced Vanderbilt into 29 turnovers in a home win on Feb. 4, tied for the second-most ever by an SEC opponent.

» Brandy Montgomery (8 steals) and Katie Frerking (6 steals) set career highs vs. ECU. Montgomery's eight tied for the sixth-most in program history. Frerking later had six steals against Winthrop and Arkansas.

BIG-TIME BRANDY

» Junior Brandy Montgomery has been a major offensive weapon for Auburn, leading the Tigers in scoring 11 times this year while averaging 15.4 points/game.

» With her 14th point vs. Kentucky on Jan. 3, she became the 31st player in Auburn history with 1,000 career points. She was the second this season to reach that milestone, joining senior Tra'Cee Tanner.

» She has scored 20+ points in nine games this year. Her season-high of 28 came on Dec. 23 against George

Mason when she was 10-of-16 from the field and 6-of-10 from 3-point range.

» Montgomery has also been a big defensive threat as she ranks seventh in the SEC with 2.1 steals per game. She had a career-high 8 steals in Auburn's win over East Carolina on Dec. 5.

» In the win over George Mason on Dec. 23, Montgomery had a stretch where she hit seven consecutive shots - five of them 3-pointers - including a bank-shot trey at the first-half buzzer. She scored 21 of her 28 points in the game in a 10-minute stretch spanning the second and third quarters.

» In a 25-point night against Minnesota at the San Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico, Montgomery hit the game-tying and game-winning 3-point field goals in overtime in the Tigers' 81-79 victory.

» In Auburn's win over No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 3, she scored 27 points, grabbed a key offensive rebound with 13 seconds left and hit four free throws in the closing seconds to ice the victory for Auburn.

SEEING DOUBLE

» Brandy Montgomery and Tra'Cee Tanner each collected a double-double in Auburn's loss to Marquette on Dec. 13. Montgomery had 24 points and a career-high 12 rebounds, and Tanner had 13 points and matched her career-best with 12 boards.

» Tanner opened the season on a high note with her ninth career double-double, posting 18 points and 10 rebounds in the opener vs. UAB (Nov. 13).

» Tanner posted her second double-double of the year with 17 points and 11 rebounds in a 55-53 win over Boise State in Puerto Rico (Nov. 27).

» Tanner's fourth double-double included 15 points and a career-high 19 rebounds at Florida Gulf Coast (Dec. 30). It was Auburn's first 19-rebound game since KeKe Carrier had 19 vs. Valparaiso on Dec. 28, 2010. She followed that up with 17 points and 10 rebounds to help Auburn to a 66-61 upset of No. 7 Kentucky, then got her sixth double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds at Tennessee (Jan. 10).

» Jazmine Jones had the first double-double of her career with 13 points and 10 rebounds in the win over East Carolina on Dec. 5. She followed that up with a season-high 16 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Alabama on Jan. 14.

» Katie Frerking picked up her second career double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds in Auburn's win over No. 16 Florida on Feb. 14.

MAGIC NUMBER: 70

» Auburn has been nearly unbeatable under Terri Williams-Flournoy when scoring 70 or more points. The Tigers are 10-0 this season and 41-4 in four years under Coach Flo when hitting the 70-point mark.

» The Tigers have won 22 straight games when scoring at least 70 points. Auburn's last loss when scoring 70+ came on March 2, 2014, when the Tigers fell 73-71 in overtime at Ole Miss on the final day of the regular season.

» Auburn pulled out its biggest win in several years on Jan. 3 as the Tigers defeated No. 7 Kentucky 66-61 at Auburn Arena. It was the 42nd all-time win over a top-10 opponent for Auburn and the first since 2010.

» The last top-10 win for Auburn came on Jan. 31,

2010, when the Tigers defeated #9 Georgia 69-53.

» With Kentucky ranked No. 7, it was the highest-ranked opponent for Auburn to defeat since the 1997 SEC Tournament final when the Tigers defeated No. 6 Florida 52-47 in Chattanooga to claim the SEC Tournament title.

» Auburn got its second win over a ranked opponent on Feb. 14 when the Tigers ran past No. 16 Florida 80-58. It was the first time since 2009-10 for Auburn to pick up multiple wins over ranked foes, and it was the largest margin of victory over a ranked opponent since a 30-point win over No. 10 Georgia in 2008.

MILESTONE FOR TRA'CEE...

» Senior Tra'Cee Tanner hit the 1,000-point career mark in Auburn's win over Boise State in Puerto Rico on Nov. 27, getting her 1,000th point on a free throw late in the third quarter.

» In doing so, she became just the fifth player in Auburn history with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 100 assists, 100 blocks and 100 steals - one of whom is her older sister, Tyrese Tanner:

...AND FOR BRANDY

» Junior Brandy Montgomery topped the 1,000-point career mark with her 14th point of the game on Jan. 3 as she scored a game-high 27 points to lead Auburn to an upset win over No. 7 Kentucky.

» Montgomery is the 31st player in Auburn history to score 1,000 points.

STELLAR DEBUT

» Freshman Janiah McKay made the most of her collegiate debut on Nov. 13 vs. UAB, scoring 20 points and dishing out 7 assists off the bench. It was the best performance by an Auburn freshman in their collegiate debut since Hasina Muhammad scored 20 points vs. Maine on Nov. 9, 2012, which was also Coach Flo's debut.

» McKay followed that up with a 14-point night at Southeastern Louisiana that included two stellar plays in the fourth quarter to help seal the victory for the Tigers. She then scored a team-leading 16 points vs. Virginia.

» McKay made her first collegiate start vs. Winthrop on Dec. 16, and three games later, scored 23 points and had 7 rebounds vs. Towson, earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors. She started seven straight games from Dec. 16-Jan. 7.

LOVING THAT ISLAND LIFE

» Auburn put together a 2-0 weekend at the San Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico over Thanksgiving weekend, earning a pair of close wins over Boise State (55-53) and Minnesota (81-79, OT).

» It was the second trip Auburn has made to Puerto

Rico for women's basketball; the Tigers have amassed a 5-0 record when playing in Puerto Rico.

STATE OF AUBURN

» Auburn is 3-0 vs. in-state foes this season, defeating UAB in the season opener 85-71 and taking down Alabama 72-59 on Jan. 14 and 59-55 on Feb. 7.

» The Tigers have four straight wins over in-state competition, dating back to a win over Alabama on March 1 of last season. Under Coach Flo, the Tigers are 15-2 against competition from the state of Alabama.

ON THIS DATE

» Auburn is 9-5 all-time on February 21. The Tigers last played on this date in 2013, falling at Tennessee 83-61. Auburn's last win on this date was 2010, a 50-36 win at Mississippi State.

IN FEBRUARY

» Auburn is 170-112 all-time in the month of February (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that year).

TOUGH SCHEDULE

» Five of Auburn's first six games in SEC play came against teams ranked in the nation's top 12 - #7 Kentucky, at #6 Mississippi State, at #12 Tennessee, at #9 Kentucky and vs. #2 South Carolina.

» Auburn faced 2015 NCAA participants Savannah State, Boise State, Minnesota and Florida Gulf Coast in the pre-SEC slate, along with WNIT participant Virginia.

» Six of Auburn's first seven SEC contests were against teams that were NCAA participants last season - Kentucky (twice), Mississippi State, Tennessee, South Carolina and Arkansas.

» After a stretch of six games against unranked opponents in the middle of the SEC schedule, three of Auburn's final four conference games will come against ranked opponents - twice against Florida and one with Texas A&M.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

» Auburn is 59-31 at Auburn Arena since moving into the facility for the 2010-11 season. The Tigers are 9-2 at home for the 2015-16 season (5-1 SEC).

» The Tigers have dominated non-conference opponents at Auburn Arena, amassing a 38-6 record against non-SEC opponents. Auburn has won 19 of its last 20 home non-conference games; a loss to Virginia on Nov. 19 snapped a 16-game home non-conference winning streak.

» Auburn is on pace for its fifth-highest average attendance in program history. Through nine games, the Tigers have averaged 2,467 fans, 400 more per game than last season.

» A season-high crowd of 3,383, the eighth-largest Auburn women's basketball crowd in arena history, saw Auburn defeat Alabama 72-59 on Jan. 14.

SISTER ACT

» For the fourth-straight season, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin sophomores Jazmine and Jessica Jones return for the Tigers.

» Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha Hobbs (2006-10); and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola Bolton (1984-88).

NEW FACES

» Auburn welcomes three newcomers to the roster for 2015-16, with two freshmen and one junior.

» Joining the Tigers to compete this season are G Janiah McKay (Gainesville, Fla.) and G Erica Sanders (San Antonio, Texas).

» Junior G Tiffany Lewis (Chattanooga, Tenn.) transferred to Auburn from Clemson during the offseason, but she will be ineligible for the 2015-16 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

» Tyra Johnson of Decatur, Ala., signed with Auburn in the early signing period in November.

» Johnson was the Decatur Daily's Player of the Year as a junior, a first-team all-state selection in 2015, and averaged 15.4 points and 3.2 assists as a junior.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY, PART TWO

» Sira Toure of Kennewick, Wash., joined the Auburn women's basketball team in mid-January after transferring from Weber State. She will be eligible to compete for the Tigers following the 2016 fall semester.

» Toure played in 19 games at Weber State last season, averaging 2.7 points and 1.3 rebounds as a freshman.

THIS, THAT AND THE OTHER

» Senior Tra'Cee Tanner majors in apparel merchandising/production design and management, and she designs and makes most of her own clothes.

» Tanner and her sister, Tyrese, have helped the women's team develop a relationship with Expressions of a BraveHeart, a program in the Auburn-Opelika area for youth and young adults with moderate to severe disabilities. The group spends a day with the team playing basketball and comes to one or two games per season.

» Auburn has received votes in the USA Today

Coaches' Poll six times this season, including the most current poll. Auburn also picked up votes in this week's AP poll. The Tigers had not received a vote in either of the two national polls since the preseason poll in 2010-11, and had not received votes in both polls since the preseason rankings in 2009-10.

» ESPN.com's "Bracketology" had Auburn listed as one of nine SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament in its release on Feb. 16. The Tigers were slotted as a No. 10 seed in Columbus, Ohio, facing West Virginia.

Auburn's "Big Three" - Montgomery, Frerking & Tanner

For the 2015-16 season, Auburn has gone as its "Big Three" have gone. The Tigers are 11-1 when all three - Brandy Montgomery, Katie Frerking and Tra'Cee Tanner - score in double-figures, 7-1 when two of the three have 10+ points, and 0-6 when only one or none score 10 or more.

AUBURN -- The Auburn women's basketball team got off to a fast start against No. 2 South Carolina, but was not able to hold on down the stretch falling 74-58 on Thursday in Auburn Arena.

Auburn (12-7, 2-4 SEC) was unable to find a rhythm offensively against the Gamecocks' defense, shooting 34.5 percent (19-of-55) for the game while South Carolina overcame a sluggish start to hit 60 percent (15-of-25) from the floor over the final two periods and 51.9 percent for the game.

Katie Frerking led the Tigers with 17 points, all but two coming from behind the arc (5-of-12). She added seven rebounds and a team-high four assists. Jazmine Jones led the Tigers with eight boards – five on the offensive glass – to go with her six points.

South Carolina opened the game with an 8-0 run before Jessica Jones hit a pair of free throws with 7:28 to go in the first quarter to give the Tigers their first points. Janiah McKay then rattled off 10 unanswered points to tie things up at 12-12. Frerking sank a trey just before the game's first media timeout to give Auburn a 15-12 lead that they held for the rest of the period. The Tigers ended the first period on a 13-1 run over the final 5:10.

The tables turned quickly in the Gamecocks' favor as they went on an 18-0 run over the final 7:00 of the second period to take a 33-20 lead into the half. Auburn struggled mightily from the floor in the second period connecting on only 12.5 percent (2-of-16) of their shots.

South Carolina's momentum carried over from the locker room into the third period scoring 20 and leading by 17 entering the fourth quarter. The Gamecocks led by as many as 24 in the final period, but a late run that included three Frerking treys cut the final margin to 16.

South Carolina used size to its advantage under the rim, scoring 36 points in the paint to Auburn's 16. The Gamecocks also outrebounded the Tigers 34-30, but Auburn pulled down 13 offensive rebounds on the night, leading to 14 second-chance points..

OXFORD, Miss. -- Auburn rallied from a 12-point second half deficit to earn its fourth-straight win, defeating Ole Miss 65-60 Thursday night in SEC women's basketball action at the new Pavilion at Ole Miss.

Senior Tra'Cee Tanner led three Tigers in double figures with 19 points, nine rebounds and had a key blocked shot in the closing seconds as Auburn (17-8, 7-5 SEC) outscored the Rebels 20-8 in the fourth quarter to pick up its third road win in SEC play.

Ole Miss (10-14, 2-9 SEC) pushed ahead to a 12-point lead in the third quarter on the strength of a 9-for-14 (64.3%) shooting percentage in the third quarter that included four 3-pointers. Auburn closed it to a seven-point game at 52-45 at the end of the third quarter, then opened the fourth on a 7-0 run, tying the game on a Brandy Montgomery 3-pointer with 8:15 to play.

After the teams traded baskets over the next three minutes, Tanner converted a three-point play and then hit another layup to give Auburn a 57-55 lead - its first since the 3:28 mark of the first quarter - with 6:38 to play. The Tigers would never trail again.

Ole Miss cut the lead to one on a Brettia Hart layup with 1:49 left, but Katie Frerking converted two free throws with 22 seconds to play to make it 63-60. Tanner came up with a huge block on the Rebels' final possession, and then she hit two free throws with less than a second remaining to secure the final margin.

Auburn shot 53.3 percent for the game, its best in SEC play and second-best overall this season, including a 58.3-percent mark in the second half. The Tigers attempted just four 3-pointers in the game but connected on three of them.

The Tigers overcame 21 turnovers - 13 of them in the first half - and poor free-throw shooting early to pick up their first win in Oxford since 2012.

Frerking finished with 17 points, including two crucial free throws in the closing seconds of the fourth quarter that pushed Auburn's lead to three points, and a game-high six assists. Freshman Janiah McKay added 12 points, and Brandy Montgomery finished with eight.

AUBURN -- Katie Frerking's second career double-double led four players in double figures, and the Auburn women's basketball team pulled away in the second half for an 80-58 win over No. 16 Florida Sunday at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (18-8, 8-5) won their fifth straight game in SEC play and moved into a virtual tie for third place in the SEC standings with three games remaining. It was Auburn's second win over a nationally ranked opponent this year, the first time for the Tigers to accomplish that feat since the 2009-10 season.

After a back-and-forth first half saw Auburn emerge with a 48-43 lead - the highest-scoring combined half in an Auburn game this season - the Tigers' defense stood tall in the second half and held the Gators to a season-low 15 points.

Frerking scored 18 points along with 10 rebounds, five assists and four steals. It was the second double-double of her career, the first coming against Texas A&M in last season's SEC Tournament. She was 7-of-14 from the floor and knocked down a pair of 3-pointers. Frerking has averaged 19.0 points, 5.7 rebounds and 4.7 assists in the Tigers' last three games.

Brandy Montgomery added a 16-point effort - all coming in the first half - as she knocked down four 3-point attempts in the early going. Tra'Cee Tanner added 12 points, and Khady Dieng scored a season-high 10 off the bench along with two assists and two steals.

Florida jumped out to a 15-5 lead in the first five minutes, but the Tigers closed the quarter on a 17-2 run to take a 20-17 lead after the first period. The teams then traded leads 16 times in the second quarter before Auburn went ahead 42-41 on a pair of Montgomery free throws with 2:15 to play. The Tigers then scored twice in the final 10 seconds as Jazmine Jones hit a layup and McKay got a steal in the backcourt and scored as time expired to give the Tigers a 48-43 halftime lead.

In the third quarter, Auburn controlled a defensive struggle as it held Florida to just two field goals and outscored the Gators 9-5 to take a 57-48 lead to the fourth. In that fourth period, the Tigers exploded and never let the Gators any closer than 11 points as they pulled away.

THIS IS AUBURN ... ATHLETICS

ACADEMICS

- » In the 2014-15 academic year, 108 student-athletes graduated from Auburn University.
- » A record 346 student-athletes received the Top Tiger Award in 2014-15 with a GPA of 3.0.
- » During the 2014-2015 academic year, more than 200 Auburn University student-athletes were honored as members of the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- » All 12 players on the 2014-15 Auburn volleyball roster were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- » Junior volleyball player Stephanie Campbell was named an Academic All-District selection by the College Sports Information Directors of America.
- » During Autumn of 2014, Auburn swimmer Tofey Leon was selected as a Rhodes Scholarship Finalist. Former Auburn University football player Partick Young was a nominee for the Rhodes Scholarship while former Auburn University football player Ashton Richardson was selected as one of 40 Marshall Scholarship recipients.

FINANCIALS

- » In the last 23 years, the Athletics Department budget has grown from \$21 million to \$128.7 million.
- » In back-to-back years, the Auburn football program had its highest sale of season tickets in school history in 2014 and 2015. In 2015, Auburn sold out of season tickets on June 8, two months earlier than in 2014.
- » Men's basketball season ticket sales increased 122.8% for the 2014-15, selling out premium seating for the first time in the history of Auburn Arena. TUF sales are up 75% year-to-date in 2015-16.
- » Baseball season ticket sales increased 23.4% in 2015.

FACILITIES

- » During 2014, Auburn Athletics funded more than \$7.5 million in facility improvements.
- » Installed prior to the 2015 season, Jordan-Hare Stadium boasts the nation's largest video board, which is 57 feet tall by 190 feet wide.
- » Opened in August 2014, the state-of-the-art Auburn Wellness Kitchen provides student-athletes, students and the general population a dining facility that has six action stations and accommodates those with special dietary needs.
- » The 2014-15 academic year witnessed the launch of the SEC Network which saw major infrastructure work completed necessary to support the SEC Network and War Eagle Productions.

GAME DAY

- » Auburn's game day experience named by outside parties as offering the best tailgating and the best traditions.
- » Per a survey done by the SEC, in which they measured 60 attributes related to the overall game day experience, Auburn scored better than the SEC average on 56 of the 60 measured attributes. Two of the below average rated attributes related to food & beverage prices, for which we in response reduced the price of water and hot dogs to very positive response from our fans.
- » Over 96% of Auburn's donors and fans indicate that the frequency of communication, the transparency of communication, and the content of communication from Auburn Athletics meets or exceeds their needs.

WINNING

- » Auburn has finished in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Director's Cup for 10 consecutive years.
- » Auburn has won 13 national titles since 2004, which is third-most in the SEC. National Champion teams include Football, Men's Swimming and Diving, Women's Swimming and Diving, Equestrian, and Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- » Auburn has won 20 SEC titles in the past 10 years, tied for fourth-most in the conference.
- » Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sports participated in postseason competition in 2014-15, with four programs achieving Top 10 finishes nationally.
- » The Auburn football team has won a National Championship and two Southeastern Conference Championships in the last five years, and played for the national title for the second time in four years in 2013.
- » No school has won more SEC Football Championships in the last 10 years than Auburn.
- » The Auburn softball team had its best season in school history, advancing to its' first-ever Women's College World Series, where it advanced to the semifinals.
- » Gymnastics advanced to the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years and second time in school history in 2015, finishing sixth while breaking 52 program records.
- » Men's Swimming & Diving team has recorded 23 consecutive top-10 NCAA finish and has won 18 of the last 22 SEC Championships (including 16 consecutive titles from 1997-2012).
- » Women's Golf has won three SEC titles in the last seven years, five in the last 11 years, and seven in the last 16.
