### GAME 17 SET-UP

■ #9/9 Tennessee (13-3/4-0 SEC) and Auburn (13-4/2-2 SEC) will meet for the 47th time, facing off Thursday night at 8:05 p.m. Central time (9:05 Eastern) in a game televised live on CSS and available on ESPN3.

■ UT is coming off a thrilling, 78-75 overtime victory on the road at Florida on Sunday that kept the Lady Vols unbeaten in league play.

■ The Tigers had a tough game on the road Sunday at No. 20/21 Texas A&M, losing by a score of 78-56 in College Station.

■ The Lady Vols enter Thursday night's contest on a six-game winning streak, defeating Davidson, #NR/RV Rutgers, #18/15 South Carolina, #10/11 Georgia, Missouri and Florida during that spree.

■ Auburn is 2-2 in SEC action, winning home games vs. #23/RV Arkansas (50-47) and Ole Miss (76-52), but falling on the road to Missouri (82-76) and #20/21 Texas A&M (78-56).

■ Auburn is 9-0 at home this season, while Tennessee is 5-2 in road games.

■ First-year Auburn coach Terry Williams-Flournoy was previously at Georgetown. Under her direction, the #12/13 Hoyas defeated #4/4 UT in the 2010 Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands, 69-58 in the first-ever meeting between the schools.

■ Tennessee was the SEC runner-up a year ago (27-9/12-4 SEC) and was picked to finish fourth this season by the media and fifth by the coaches.

■ Auburn finished ninth in the SEC last season (13-17/5-11) and was predicted to place 10th by both the media and coaches in the SEC race this season.

### COMMON FOES

■ Auburn owns a victory at home over Chattanooga (53-40) this season on Dec. 19 and a loss at Missouri (82-76) on Jan. 6.

■ Chattanooga handed Tennessee a road loss in the season opener on Nov. 9, 80-71, while the Lady Vols handled Missouri with ease, 84-39, in Knoxville on Jan. 10.

### "WE BACK PAT" WEEK

■ The SEC, in cooperation with its 14 member institutions, announced the second "We Back Pat" Week, a week-long initiative focused on bringing awareness and recognition to the Pat Summitt Foundation Fund, a fund of East Tennessee Foundation, and its fight against Alzheimer's disease.

### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

To apply, please visit: <http://www.sportssystem.com/seccredentials>. Applications for single-game credentials should be submitted five days prior to a game. Once you receive your approval letter via email, you will be provided options for credential pick-up.

### PHOTOGRAPHER CREDENTIALS

Credentials will be issued only to accredited photographers or those individuals on special assignment. During regular season games, work area includes the floor area at both ends of the court and alongside the corners of the playing floor opposite the team benches. Special arrangements for strobes or catwalk access must be made through the Media Relations and Arena Management Offices no later than one week in advance of the game. UT's arena security policy requires that all photographers placing strobes will go through a screening process and must be accompanied by a UT police officer or representative when placing strobes.

» Despite losing all five starters from 2011-12 and losing two 2012-13 starters to injury, UT is averaging a league-best 78.5 ppg. vs. SEC foes.

### MOST RECENT UT-AU GAME

■ No. 8 Tennessee started a new homecourt conference win streak on Feb. 5, 2012, with an 82-61 victory over Auburn in Knoxville.

■ Glory Johnson and Ariel Massengale led all scorers with 14 points each. Johnson also grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds and had four blocks for her ninth double-double of the season, while Massengale added four assists and four steals.

■ Shekinna Stricklen posted a double-double as well, her third of the season and first since Nov. 27 against Baylor, with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

■ UT moved to 17-6 overall and 8-2 in the SEC, while Auburn lost for the fourth time in five games and fell to 11-13 (3-8).

■ Tennessee has won 14 games in a row at home vs. Auburn, dating back to 1989.

■ After trailing very early in the game, Tennessee made easy work of Auburn, pulling away in the second half. A layup by Vicki Baugh with 4:05 left in the first half gave the Lady Vols their first double-figure lead of the afternoon (38-27) and they continued to hold a margin of at least eight for the remainder of the game.

### LAST TIME ON THE COURT (FLORIDA)

■ Tennessee scored the final five points in overtime to capture a 78-75 road win over Florida at the O'Connell Center in Gainesville on Sunday afternoon.

■ Meighan Simmons (27 points) tied the game at 75 on a jumper with 1:12 left, then Kamiko Williams and Bashaara Graves combined for three free throws in the final 24.3 seconds to secure the win.

■ Graves had sent the game to overtime with a free throw with 12.6 seconds left in regulation.

■ Kayla Lewis' 3-point attempt at the buzzer rimmed out for the Gators, who fell to 13-5 overall, 2-2 in the SEC.

■ The Lady Vols (13-3 overall) now have won six games in a row and remain perfect in the SEC at 4-0.

■ Simmons led all scorers with 27, 17 of which came in the first half.

■ Graves notched her seventh double-double of the season with 17 points and 12 rebounds.

■ After sitting much of the first half with foul trouble and not scoring, Isabelle Harrison netted 10 points -- all in the second half and overtime. She also added nine rebounds.

■ Ariel Massengale chipped in 12 points and handed out four assists.

■ The Gators were led by Jattera Bonds, who had 18. January Miller and Carlie Needles each added 11.

■ Florida was without its top player Jennifer George for most of the afternoon after she suffered an injury late in the first half.

## NEXT UP FOR THESE TEAMS

■ Tennessee returns home to host Alabama on Sunday in a 1 p.m. game televised by CSS.

■ The game is UT's home "We Back Pat" game and the Lady Vols' third "WBP" contest during this week of recognition.

■ Auburn hits the road for two games following its home date vs. Tennessee.

■ The Tigers play next at Kentucky on Sunday at 2 p.m. Eastern time (1 p.m. CT) on the SEC Network.

## IN-STATE PAINT POWER

■ Tennessee is getting a strong inside presence from a pair of Volunteer State products.

■ Freshman Bashaara Graves, who hails from Clarksville (Clarksville H.S.), is averaging 14.6 points and 8.8 rebounds per contest, ranking second and first in those categories on the team and seventh and third, respectively, in the SEC.

■ Sophomore Isabelle Harrison, a product of Hillsboro High in Nashville, is carding 10.5 points, 8.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocked shots per game to rank third, second and first on the team and sixth in the SEC for boards and second for blocks.

■ Graves (6-foot-2) and Harrison (6-foot-3) are team leaders and rank among the SEC leaders with seven and six double-doubles, respectively.

■ Graves had a career-high 23 points vs. Georgia on Jan. 6 and is coming off a 17-point, 12-rebound performance vs. Florida on Sunday.

■ Harrison had a career-best 15 rebounds, the highest by a Lady Vol this season, vs. Missouri and overcame foul trouble vs. Florida to tally 10 points and nine rebounds, all of it coming after halftime of UT's overtime win over the Gators on Sunday.

## SOMETHING TO TALK ABOUT

■ The win over Florida by three points was Tennessee's first by fewer than five points since a 61-58 win at Ole Miss on Feb. 11, 2010.

■ Keep in mind UT has two starters currently out of action due to injuries and lost five start-

ers from last year's team, not to mention the NCAA's all-time winningest basketball coach.

■ It's a different time, with different expectations, but Holly Warlick already has guided her squad to 13 wins.

■ Pat Summitt guided her first two teams to 16-win seasons before producing a 28-5 record in year three.

■ Tennessee is in the midst of a four-game span where three of those contests are on the road.

■ Back-to-back trips to Florida (Jan. 13) and Auburn (Jan. 17), a home date with Alabama (Jan. 20) and a road game vs. Vanderbilt (Jan. 24) comprise that challenge.

■ Tennessee has hit six or more three-pointers in the past four games.

■ UT is 26 of 62 during that span for a 41.9 shooting percentage from long range.

■ The Lady Vols have been out-rebounded in two of four SEC games (S.C., Fla.), but have still found ways to win.

■ Tennessee enters the Auburn game on a six-game winning streak, which is the second-longest current spree in the SEC this season.

■ Taber Spani has hit double figures in scoring in three of her past four games, just missing with nine points against Florida.

■ She has raised her averages to 8.3 points and 3.9 rebounds per contest.

■ Tennessee players have recorded 16 double-doubles this season, including Bashaara Graves (7), Isabelle Harrison (6), Cierra Burdick (2) and Kamiko Williams (1).

■ Meighan Simmons is the only Lady Vol to start every game this season and leads UT regulars in scoring (16.6 ppg.), steals (1.7 spg.) and free throw percentage (82.1).

■ Four different UT players have led the team in scoring and six different Lady Vols have paced the squad in caroms in 2012-13.

■ Tennessee won the program's 1200th game vs. Rutgers, a victory total that is the most in NCAA women's college basketball.

## SEC NOTABLES

■ UT leads the SEC and ranks No. 8 nationally in scoring offense at 79.0 per contest.

■ Bashaara Graves was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Jan. 14, marking her fourth award this season.

■ No one else has won more than three FOW awards this season and only A&M's Kelsey Bone (four Player of the Week honors) has matched her total of awards.

■ Graves' total of seven double-doubles ranks her fifth among freshman in UT history and ties her for 30th all-time among all Lady Vols.

■ The four Lady Vols ahead of Graves on the freshman list are: Chamique Holdsclaw (16), Sheila Frost (11), Candace Parker (10) and Tamika Catchings (9).

■ Graves was one of only two SEC players to score in double figures in the first eight games of the season. Her streak stopped when she had only six points vs. Baylor.

■ UT leads the SEC in free throw percentage at 73.3.

■ The Lady Vols are on top of the league for rebounds per game at 45.9 and are fourth in rebound margin at 6.4.

■ Tennessee is holding SEC opponents to only 35.7 percent field goal shooting, which is second in the conference.

■ The Lady Vols improved to 13-0 in games where they score more points in the paint than their opponents after edging Florida, 32-28.

■ Bashaara Graves is shooting 53.8 percent from the field in SEC play and 82.1 from the charity stripe.

■ Tennessee has a +20.2 scoring margin in SEC games, leading all schools.

■ Tennessee is hitting 41.9 percent (26-62) of its three-point attempts in SEC action, which ranks second in the league.

■ Tennessee is holding SEC opponents to only .324 percent shooting from the field, which is the lowest percentage in the conference at this point.

■ The Lady Vols are rejecting a league-leading 6.5 shots per contest in SEC play.

■ Tennessee also has the best assist-to-turnover ratio in league action at 1.3.

■ Isabelle Harrison ranks second in the SEC in blocked shots at 2.5 per game.

■ Harrison is averaging a double-double of 11.0 points and 11.8 rebounds vs. SEC opponents thus far.

■ Taber Spani is Tennessee's third-leading scorer and rebounder in SEC play, averaging 12.3 points and 5.3 rebounds.

#### BEAST MODE

■ To say that UT freshman forward/center Bashaara Graves has been an impact player would be an understatement.

■ Her teammates affectionately call her a "beast" for her productive play.

■ After coming off the bench in the opener, Graves has been a staple in the starting lineup.

■ She was the only player on the team to score in double figures in every game until the Baylor contest, when she had only six points.

■ Graves is the team leader in rebounding (8.8 rpg) and ranks second for UT in scoring (14.6 ppg.), minutes per game (29.2) and steals per contest (1.4).

■ She has been UT's scoring leader five times (18 vs. Ga. Tech/20 vs. Miami/15 vs. Stanford/16 vs. Davidson/23 vs. Georgia) and paced UT's rebound effort on eight occasions,

including vs. Georgia Tech, Middle Tennessee, Texas, Stanford, Davidson, Rutgers, Georgia and Florida, posting double-doubles of 18/10 in UT's first win of the season vs. GT, 15/12 vs. Middle Tennessee, 15/12 vs. Stanford, 16/10 vs. Davidson, 11/14 vs. Rutgers and 17/12 vs. Florida.

■ Graves' efforts led to her being named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Nov. 12, Dec. 3, Dec. 31 and Jan. 14.

### INJURY BUG IS BITING

■ Tennessee lost its second starter this season, when it was learned on Jan. 1 that Cierra Burdick broke a bone in her right hand (fourth metacarpal on shooting hand) and will be out most likely until the first week in February.

■ Burdick, who had started 11 of UT's first 12 games, was putting in some extra work on shooting and defense on her day off on Dec. 31 when the injury occurred.

■ The team's third-leading rebounder and fourth-leading scorer, she was averaging 6.5 rebounds and 8.8 points per contest and had scored in double figures in four of her past six games.

■ UT lost freshman guard Andraya Carter for the season to a recurring shoulder injury and subsequent surgery (on Dec. 13). She had started five of seven contests and was averaging 5.3 points and nearly two assists per game.

■ Sophomore Isabelle Harrison injured her right ankle late in the Texas game and missed the Baylor game before returning.

■ Sophomores Ariel Massengale and Jasmine Phillips missed both exhibition contests due to injury, but Massengale has played in

every regular season game.

■ Massengale was held out of the pre-season slate as a precautionary measure after experiencing Achilles tendinitis (left foot).

■ Phillips was dealing with a strained quad in her left leg during the preseason and missed the first two games of the regular season.

■ Starting with the Middle Tennessee game on Nov. 28 and ending when she appeared in the South Carolina game on Jan. 3, Phillips missed six games to focus on her school work, per a directive from coach Warlick.

### INJURY ENDS CARTER'S CAMPAIGN

■ Freshman Andraya Carter underwent arthroscopic surgery Dec. 13 to repair a labral tear in her right shoulder.

■ Doctors Greg Mathien and Russell Betcher performed the procedure to address instability in Carter's shoulder.

■ The 5-foot-9 guard suffered an injury to that shoulder last year in high school and re-injured it this season vs. Miami with aggravations of that ailment occurring in the Middle Tennessee and North Carolina games.

■ Carter's recovery is expected to take four to six months. Tennessee will apply for a hardship waiver after the season for Carter.

■ She is expected to meet the requirements (playing in less than 30 percent of the team's scheduled contests in the first half of the season) and would still have four years of eligibility remaining if the waiver is granted.

■ The rookie from Flowery Branch, Ga., played in Tennessee's initial seven games in 2012-13, starting the first five. She was averaging 5.3 points, 1.9 assists, 1.6 rebounds, 1.3 steals and 20.6 minutes per contest.

### CARTER-SMITH HUSTLE PLAYER

■ With freshman Andraya Carter out for the season after having shoulder surgery on Dec.

13, everyone needs to step up and provide the hustle and determination the 5-9 dynamo brought to the court.

■ To recognize the player who does just that each game, the Andraya Carter-Adam Smith Hustle Player of the Game Award will be announced in the locker room afterward. Carter helps decide the winner.

■ The winning player is awarded a small, stuffed bear named Adam, in honor of Carter's late high school friend.

■ For coming off the bench and contributing 10 points and nine boards vs. Texas and doing her best to channel Carter's competitive effort and energy on both ends of the floor in the victory, Carter's classmate, Jasmine Jones, was named the first recipient.

■ Other winners include: Kamiko Williams (Baylor), Isabelle Harrison (Davidson, Rutgers, co-South Carolina), Taber Spani (co-South Carolina), Bashaara Graves (Missouri), Meighan Simmons (Florida) and Jones (Georgia).

■ Adam Smith was a high school friend and basketball player at Carter's prep alma mater, Buford High School in Georgia. He collapsed during conditioning drills and passed away on Sept. 16, 2012.

■ Carter had been wearing an armband with Smith's initials during practices and games. Cierra Burdick now wears it.

### NO MERCY VS. FAMILY

■ Holly Warlick is 1-0 as head coach vs. teams directed by former Lady Vols and 4-0 against teams with former UT staffers on the basketball staff payroll.

■ Tennessee beat Alcorn State (90-37), which was led by former UT player Tonya Edwards as the Lady Braves' head coach.

■ The Lady Vols toppled Middle Tennessee (88-81 ot), which employs former Lady Vol Alex Fuller as an assistant coach and former UT video coordinator Dustin Edwards as director of operations.

■ UT also handled North Carolina, 102-57, with former Lady Vol graduate assistant Sylvia Hatchell at the helm for the Tar Heels.

■ The Lady Vols went on the road and handled South Carolina, which had former Lady Vol Nikki McCray on the sideline as assistant coach.

### LEADING THE NATION AGAIN

■ Fans in Big Orange Country are highly supportive of their sports teams.

■ Tennessee is the only school to rank in the top five for attendance in football and women's and men's basketball.

■ UT has led the nation in home women's basketball attendance average 17 times, including nine-straight seasons and in 15 of the past 16 years.

■ The Lady Vols lead the NCAA in home attendance through nine home games at 11,482 fans per contest, followed by Louisville in second at 9,101.

■ A season-best total of 13,016 attended the Stanford game on Dec. 22, while 12,347 turned out for Rutgers on Dec. 30 and 12,319 were on hand for Georgia on Jan. 6.

## FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

■ Tennessee ranks among the youngest teams in the nation this season, tying for 20th with Southern Mississippi with 1.091 years of experience per player.

■ UT opponents with young teams include 5. Florida (9.09), t6. North Carolina (1.000), 13. Georgia Tech (1.067), 14. Texas (1.069), 19. Rice (1.083) and 39. South Carolina (1.250).

■ The Lady Vols have five newcomers, including four freshmen, on their roster.

■ Tennessee has only two seniors this season, including 6-1 guard/forward Taber Spani and 5-11 guard Kamiko Williams. Both missed time with injuries last season.

■ The junior class consists of Meighan Simmons, a 5-9 guard who started 22 games last season and played in all 36.

■ There are three sophomore returnees, including 6-2 forward Cierra Burdick, 6-3 center Isabelle Harrison and 5-6 point guard Ariel Massengale.

■ Burdick played in all 36 games as a rookie and got three starts, Massengale played in 33 contests and started 24, while Harrison had 31 appearances without a start.

## WORKING THE BOARDS

■ Tennessee is outrebounding its opponents, 45.9 to 39.5, thus far.

## ■ NO. 2 SIGNING CLASS

During the early signing period, Tennessee grabbed the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation, according to Dan Olson Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. HoopGurlz/ESPNU has UT signing the No. 1 player (Mercedes Russell, 6-6, post, Springfield, Ore.), the No. 8 player (Jannah Tucker, 6-0, guard, Randallstown, Md.) and the No. 42 player (Jordan Reynolds, 5-11, guard, Portland, Ore.). Tennessee signed the No. 5 class in 2012 and its group of players in 2011 earned a No. 3 overall rating.

■ The Lady Vols have outrebounded their opponents in 11 of 16 games, with Miami, Baylor, South Carolina and Florida being the only squads to win the battle vs. the Big Orange and Stanford equalling UT's total of 41 boards.

■ When they played, Tennessee was the only team to rebound Texas.

■ Freshman Bashaara Graves is leading the way, pulling down 8.8 per contest.

■ Sophomore Isabelle Harrison is second, averaging 8.5 per contest, while sophomore Cierra Burdick is tallying 6.5 per outing, though out currently due to an injury.

■ Harrison had a career-high 15 boards vs. Missouri and grabbed 14 vs. South Carolina, 12 vs. Chattanooga and Rice, and 11 vs. North Carolina and Rutgers.

■ Graves posted 14 vs. Rutgers, 12 vs. Georgia Tech, Middle Tennessee and Stanford, 11 vs. Florida, and 10 vs. Texas and Davidson.

■ Jasmine Jones had 11 against Alcorn State.

■ Burdick posted 10 vs. Miami, North Carolina and Davidson.

■ Kamiko Williams had 10 vs. Baylor.

## PHILLIPS PLAYS IN HOME STATE

■ After sitting out seven games, sophomore guard Jasmine Phillips returned to the lineup at South Carolina.

■ The Hartsville, S.C., native played two minutes, hitting one of two free throw attempts and grabbing a rebound in her home state.

■ After not dressing for the Middle Tennessee and North Carolina games, Phillips travelled with UT to the Texas and Baylor games. She did not play, but has been practicing with the team since then.

■ Holly Warlick held Phillips out of workouts and games, starting just before the Middle Tennessee contest, requiring her to make a stronger commitment to her academic work.

■ Phillips also suffered a strained left quad in the preseason that has limited her to only two game appearances, coming vs. Rice and Alcorn State.

## CHANGES AT THE SUMMITT

■ Pat Summitt attended both of UT's exhibition contests and the season opener at Chattanooga, but she was not in the crowd at Georgia Tech on Nov. 11.

■ It marked the first time the NCAA's all-time winningest coach was not at a Lady Vol game since Margaret Hutson was on the bench for UT in 1974.

■ The home opener vs. Rice marked the first time someone other than Summitt has been head coach for the Lady Vols in a regular season home game since the 1974 campaign.

■ Summitt also did not attend the game at Miami, as her son Tyler, an assistant coach for the Marquette women's team, was in Atlanta for the Golden Eagles' game vs. Georgia Tech. She was on hand for that contest.

■ Summitt was in Milwaukee for Marquette's "We Back Pat" game on Dec. 15, so she was not on the Texas/Baylor trip and has not been at any UT road games other than the opener at Chattanooga.

■ She attends all of UT's home games and sits behind the TV broadcast position in sec-

### TALES FROM THE ROAD

■ Tennessee opened the 2012-13 campaign with its first two games on the road and three of the first four contests away from Knoxville.

■ The Lady Vols opened up at Chattanooga on Nov. 9 and Georgia Tech on Nov. 11, losing the opener and bouncing back against the Yellow Jackets.

■ The last time Tennessee opened a campaign with back-to-back road games was 2004-05, when the top-ranked Lady Volunteers defeated Chattanooga, 68-34, and NC State, 64-54, respectively, on Nov. 19 and 21.

■ UT also played three out of its first four on the road that year as well, defeating George Washington at home on Nov. 23, 71-41, and dropping a 74-59 decision at No. 4 Texas on Nov. 25.

■ Through the Florida game, UT is 5-2 on the road this season, defeating ranked foes and Florida in five triumphs and losing to No. 3/3 Baylor and unranked Chattanooga.

### FIRST OPENER LOSS SINCE 1999

■ Tennessee opened its campaign on Nov. 9 at Chattanooga, dropping an 80-71 decision to the Lady Mocs in front of 8,468 at McKenzie Arena.

■ UT outrebounded UTC, 53-31, but 26 turnovers and 38-percent shooting from the field (3-16 from 3FG) could not be overcome by the Big Orange.

■ The loss in the opener was the Lady Vols' first initial-game loss since No. 2/2 UT fell at home to No. 6/6 Louisiana Tech, 69-64, on Nov. 14, 1999, in the State Farm Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic at Thompson-Boling Arena.

■ The loss vs. Chattanooga was UT's first to the Lady Mocs since Jan. 26, 1973, a 58-55 setback in Knoxville.

■ Tennessee is now 25-7 all-time vs. UTC.

### SUMMITT DROPPED OPENER TOO

■ Not that it's any solace for Lady Vol coach Holly Warlick, but her mentor, Pat Summitt, also dropped her first game as UT head coach.

■ Summitt's 1974-75 squad fell to Mercer in Knoxville on Dec. 7, 1974, by a score of 84-83.

■ The troops were rallied by Summitt, UT won the next six games and the squad went on to a 16-8 mark that season.

■ Tennessee had five seniors and a junior on that 1974-75 squad, while the 2012-13 edition includes two seniors and a junior for its upperclass.

■ While Summitt's unit reeled off six straight wins after its opening-day loss, Warlick's club one-upped that year's team, ripping off seven in a row before faltering again.

### TAKE THE BATON AND LET'S GO!!

■ UT head coach Holly Warlick, who arrived at UT in 1976 as a scholarship track & field athlete, walked on and later earned a basketball scholarship and became a three-time All-American on the hardwood, used a well-known track & field prop to demonstrate to her team what the expectations are and what needs to be done in this time of transition.

■ During a team meeting in August, Warlick gave everyone involved with the program a white baton with inscriptions providing a simplified explanation of what is occurring, emphasizing that the program's values remain the same and encouraging everyone to hit the ground running.

■ "TENNESSEE LADY VOLS Tradition...All we are doing is passing the baton."

■ "NEW TEAM, NEW STAFF, NEW GOALS...SAME HEART, SAME PRIDE, SAME FIGHT."

■ "TAKE THE BATON AND LET'S GO!!"

### A LOOK AT THE RANKINGS

■ After a 1-1 opening week, UT fell to No. 24 in the AP Poll and No. 20 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

■ After winning its next seven contests, UT rose to No. 10 in the AP Poll and No. 11 in the USA Today Poll.

■ UT moved to its season high of ninth in each poll on Jan. 7 (AP) and Jan. 8 (USA Today).

■ Tennessee has been in every AP rankings list since the 14th poll of the 1984-85 season.

■ After week one, the Lady Vols fell outside

the AP top 20, however, for the first time since the 13th poll of the 1984-85 campaign.

■ UT began the campaign ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll and No. 16 in the USA Today Coaches Preseason Poll.

■ It marked UT's lowest preseason AP Poll position since not being ranked in the inaugural AP Poll in 1976-77, Holly Warlick's freshman season at Tennessee.

■ The previous regular season low before this season came when Tennessee dropped to 19th in the 16th AP Poll of the 2008-09 campaign before finishing in 18th position.

■ The Lady Vols concluded the 2011-12 campaign at Poll and No. 7 in the USA Today/ESPN Poll.

### COACHING ALMA MATER TO TOP 25

■ Holly Warlick is the 30th women's coach to play for and coach a team ranked in the AP Poll.

■ She's just the seventh to do it at the same school.

### SEC PRESEASON POLLS, ACCOLADES

■ Tennessee was picked to finish fourth in the SEC by the media and fifth by the coaches in the preseason polls.

■ UT ranked behind Kentucky, Georgia and Vanderbilt in the media poll and was picked to wind up behind Kentucky, Georgia, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt by the coaches.

■ In SEC media poll history, fourth is the lowest the Lady Vols have been predicted behind nods for third in 1990-91, 1995-96 and 1996-97, all years in which Tennessee won NCAA titles.

■ Junior guard Meighan Simmons was a Preseason All-SEC First Team selection by the coaches and a second-team choice by the media, while the coaches put Ariel Massengale on the second team.

### GOLDEN ARCHES CLUB

■ Freshman Bashaara Graves adds to the current list of Tennessee players who were McDonald's All-Americans during their high school days.

■ Also in that club are Cierra Burdick, Ariel Massengale, Meighan Simmons and Taber Spani.

### HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

■ Head coach Emeritus Pat Summitt and former Lady Vol player Michelle Marciniak were inducted into the Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame on Nov. 2.

■ There is a 10-year post-career waiting period for student-athletes and a five-year period for coaches and staff, but the selection committee voted to waive that requirement for Summitt.

■ Summitt and Marciniak join Holly Warlick and a host of other hoops heroines in UT's women's sports hall.

■ Warlick was inducted as a player in the 2002 class.

### RETIRED #22 JERSEY FOR HOLLY

■ Holly Warlick already had her #22 jersey retired at UT, and she added another retired #22 this fall.

■ A number of family, friends, colleagues, basketball staff and players and former high school coach Buddy Fisher were on hand for the special occasion.

■ Warlick was a two-sport star who graduated in 1976 and came to UT on a track scholarship. She walked on to the basketball team and went on to become a three-time All-American on the hardwood for Pat Summitt.

#### NEW FACES, NEW ROLES

■ In addition to Holly Warlick filling the head coaching position and Pat Summitt working in the role of head coach emeritus, there are other changes to the staff.

■ Former Lady Vol player (1996-2001) Kyra Elzy returned to UT as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator after spending the past four seasons coaching at Kentucky and serving as recruiting coordinator.

■ Former Iowa standout and Harlem Globetrotter Jolette Law is UT's second new assistant coach. Known as a key contributor to Rutgers' success during her 12 seasons there, Law most recently served as head coach at Illinois from 2007-12.

■ Elzy and Law fill the spots previously occupied by Warlick and Mickie DeMoss, who left after last season to take an assistant coaching job with the WNBA's Indiana Fever.

■ Veteran assistant Dean Lockwood is back for his ninth year with the Lady Volunteers.

#### SENIORS GRADUATE EARLY

■ Seniors Taber Spani and Kamiko Williams already have earned their degrees.

■ Spani completed her degree in communication studies in August and now is pursuing a master's in kinesiology with a concentration in sports psychology and motor behavior.

■ Williams earned a degree in sociology/criminal justice in spring 2012 and is working on a second undergraduate degree in psychology.

■ Both kept UT's 100-percent graduation rate perfect.

#### SEC GROWS, TOURNAMENT EXPANDS

■ The SEC welcomed Missouri and Texas A&M into the conference this season, bringing the total of league teams to 14.

■ Each program is playing a 16-game slate.

■ The 2013 SEC Tournament will be held in Duluth, Ga., at the Arena at the Gwinnett Center, March 6-10.

■ The tournament, which had been a four-day event featuring 12 teams, has expanded to 14 teams, adding an extra day of competition. The tournament will now typically begin on Wednesday with two additional games that feature seeds 11 and 12 and 13 and 14.

■ With Ole Miss self-imposing a postseason ban in 2012-13, there will be only one Weds. game, a matchup between seeds 12 and 13.

### A LOOK BACK TO 2011-12

#### UT FINISHES IN ELITE EIGHT

■ During a difficult and emotionally-charged season, with speculation in the air about how much longer Pat Summitt would coach, Tennessee was somehow able to focus on the task at hand and finish with a 27-9 overall record and 12-4 SEC mark, good for second in the league standings.

■ The Lady Vols recorded their 36th-consecutive campaign with 20 or more wins and made the NCAA tournament field for the 31st-straight season.

■ The Lady Vols reeled off NCAA tournament wins over UT Martin (72-49) and #23 DePaul (63-48) in Chicago NCAA First/Second Round games.

■ Tennessee advanced to the Des Moines Regional, where the Big Orange turned back Kansas, 84-73, in the Sweet 16.

■ Appearing in its 25th NCAA Regional Final, Tennessee saw its season, and Summitt's head coaching career as it turned out, come to an end in the Elite Eight. Eventual NCAA champ Baylor proved too much to overcome, prevailing, 77-58, in Des Moines.

■ The Lady Vols ended the year ranked number nine in the AP poll and seventh in the USA Today/ESPN rankings.

■ Seniors Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen were named to the NCAA All-Regional Team for their play in Des Moines.

#### SEC TOURNEY CHAMPS AGAIN

■ For the third-consecutive season, Tennessee reigned as SEC Tournament champions, defeating LSU in the final, 70-58, in front of a partisan Big Orange crowd of 12,441 at Nashville's Bridgestone Arena.

■ It marked the 16th tourney trophy that UT had won since the event first was held in 1980.

■ The Lady Vols also knocked off #25 South Carolina in the semifinals, 74-58, and defeated Vanderbilt, 68-57, in the quarterfinal round.

■ Seniors Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen were named to the SEC All-Tourna-

ment Team, and Johnson walked away as the SEC Tournament Most Valuable Player.

■ Johnson's MVP recognition marked the third-straight year a Lady Vol won, as she followed Stricklen in 2011 and Alyssia Brewer in 2010.

#### FOUR TAKEN IN WNBA DRAFT

■ Lady Vols Shekinna Stricklen, Glory Johnson and Kelley Cain (finished UT career in 2010-11) were all taken in the first round and Vicki Baugh was selected in the third round of the 2012 WNBA Draft presented by Boost Mobile, on Monday, April 16, at the ESPN headquarters in Bristol, Conn.

■ It was the best first-round showing ever in the draft for Tennessee with three players taken. The Lady Vols had two first-round selections in 1997, 1999, 2003 and 2008.

■ In all, 15 UT players have been first-round WNBA picks on draft day.

■ Stricklen was taken by Seattle with the second pick, Johnson went to Tulsa on the fourth pick, and Cain was taken by New York at No. 7. Baugh was drafted by Tulsa in the third round with the event's 25th selection.

■ Johnson, a 6-3 forward, made the 2012 WNBA All-Rookie Team. She averaged 11.5 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.2 steals per contest while playing in 34 games and starting 28.

#### WBCA ALL-AMERICAN NO. 21

■ Glory Johnson became the 21st Lady Vol all-time to receive kudos and earned UT's 36th total WBCA/State Farm/Kodak All-America honor when she was named to the 2012 squad.

■ Johnson averaged 14.2 points and 9.9 rebounds per game, starting all 36 contests for Tennessee.

#### SEC ACCOLADES

■ Glory Johnson was named 2012 SEC Defensive Player of the Year and was a member of the SEC All-Defensive Team for the second season in a row.

■ Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen were members of the first team of both the AP and Coaches All-SEC squads.

■ Stricklen led UT in scoring (15.4 ppg.)

and was third in rebounding (6.6 rpg.), while Johnson was UT's second-leading scorer (14.2 ppg.) and top rebounder (9.9 rpg.).

■ Johnson also earned a spot on the SEC Community Service Team.

■ Point guard Ariel Massengale was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team after tallying a UT freshman record of 162 assists and leading the SEC with a 2.1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

#### FIVE PLAYERS END CAREERS

■ Briana Bass, Vicky Baugh, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Shekinna Stricklen concluded their careers at Rocky Top, with the quintet accumulating four NCAA Tournament bids, three SEC Tournament titles, an SEC regular-season crown and a record of 114-26.

■ Baugh, Johnson and Manning completed their undergraduate degrees early and began work on master's degrees during their final season at Tennessee.

#### ACADEMIC ACCLAIM

■ Glory Johnson was a 2012 Capital One Academic All-America Women's Basketball First Team honoree, posting a 3.60 grade point average while working on a master's in communication and information studies.

■ Johnson and Taber Spani were named to the Capital One Academic All-District 3 Women's Basketball Team.

■ Briana Bass, Vicki Baugh, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Taber Spani made the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

■ Cierra Burdick and Isabelle Harrison were named to the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

### ► PASSING THE BATON: PAT SUMMITT HANDS OFF TO HOLLY WARLICK

#### SUMMITT STEPS INTO NEW ROLE

■ On April 18, 2012, the all-time wins leader among NCAA basketball coaches, Pat Summitt, announced in a press conference at Thompson-Boling Arena that she was stepping away from her head coaching position and into the role of head coach emeritus after 38 seasons (1974-2012) at the helm of the Tennessee Lady Vols.

■ Summitt will report to Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart and will serve in a variety of endeavors. In that capacity, she will continue to serve the women's basketball program and its coaching staff and as a liaison to the director of athletics, remain involved in on-campus recruiting and serve as a personal mentor to players, including life skills coaching.

■ Summitt finished her head coaching career at Tennessee with a 1,098-208 record and an .841 winning percentage.

■ The Lady Vols won an unparalleled eight national championships under her leadership (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008) and played in 13 national championship games.

■ Tennessee also won the SEC Championship and SEC Tournament title 16 times

each, and Summitt was named SEC Coach of the Year eight times and NCAA Coach of the Year in seven seasons.

■ Her sixth national championship team, the 1997-98 team, finished a perfect 39-0.

■ "It is extremely difficult to adequately express what Pat Summitt has meant to the University of Tennessee, the sport of basketball and the growth of women's athletics nationally," said Hart. "She is an icon who does not view herself in that light, and her legacy is well-defined and everlasting. Just like there will never be another John Wooden, there will never be another Pat Summitt. I look forward to continuing to work with her in her new role. She is an inspiration to everyone."

#### WARLICK CHOSEN TO LEAD UT

■ After Summitt's announcement was made, associate head coach Holly Warlick, a long-time assistant on the Tennessee staff and a three-time All-American as a player for the Lady Vols, was named Summitt's successor by Dave Hart.

■ Warlick, who in 2011-12 completed her 27th season as an assistant coach for Tennessee and her 31st overall with the pro-

gram as a player or coach, is the first head coach of the Lady Vols other than Summitt since 1974, when Margaret Hutson completed a four-year tenure as the leader of the program (1971-74).

■ Named associate head coach before the 2005-06 season, Warlick has been on the Tennessee coaching staff for all eight NCAA titles, and as a player or assistant, she had a role in 949 of Summitt's 1,098 victories at Tennessee.

■ "Holly Warlick has earned the opportunity to be the head women's basketball coach at the University of Tennessee and to lead the Lady Vol program she has embraced as a player and a coach," Hart said. "I watched Holly grow tremendously as a coach throughout this past season. Under unique circumstances, the job she did away from the glare of the lights and crowds was as impressive as the job she did during game action. At this time in our historic program, which Pat Summitt built from scratch, Holly Warlick, the former player and long-time assistant coach, is deserving of the head coaching position. Her mentor will be available for insight and advice, but this is Holly's team now."

For more than three decades, Holly Warlick has been instrumental in the phenomenal success story that is Tennessee Lady Vols basketball. Her impact on the program stretches from her ground-breaking days as a three-time All-America point guard at UT (1976-80), to her 27 highly-productive years as a loyal assistant for Hall of Fame coach Pat Summitt, to her ascension to the head coaching position at UT.

Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart named Warlick head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

While Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23 announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's Type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, a league-best 16th SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

As Warlick embarks on her 28th season on the staff at Tennessee, it is important to note that she was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of the coach's NCAA-record 1,098 wins and all eight NCAA National Championships. Her value to the program has been evident for some time, as she has held the role of associate head coach since the 2005-06 campaign.

The WBCA also recognized Warlick's contributions to Tennessee's success through the years, naming Warlick the nation's top assistant coach after she helped lead UT to its seventh national title in 2007. The NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches also recognized Warlick as one of the nation's top assistants in 1998, ranking her prominently in The Women's Basketball Journal poll.

In addition to the NCAA title and coaching honor in 2007, Warlick also teamed up for the first time with former fellow Lady Vol player and assistant Nikki Caldwell, the current head coach at LSU, to pursue her other passion. That pursuit is riding a motorcycle and raising money for the fight against breast cancer.

Warlick and Caldwell created the Champions For A Cause Foundation, a long haul motorcycle ride dedicated to raising funds and awareness for a cure for breast cancer. The charitable organization has raised and donated more than \$125,000, and in the spring of 2011 the

duo led a fifth annual trip - this time from the Badlands to Las Vegas. Past trips include the inaugural ride from San Francisco to Knoxville as well as trips to Key West, Fla., New Orleans and Niagara Falls.

On Feb. 10, 2008, Warlick and Caldwell presented a \$10,000 check to the late N.C. State Head Coach Kay Yow and the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund.

With all of her accomplishments in coaching and in her charitable endeavors it might be easy to overlook the fact that Warlick left just as powerful a mark on women's hoops as a player at UT. It doesn't seem that long ago that the charismatic Knoxville native was flying up and down the court as a Lady Vol All-America point guard.

For more than three decades, Warlick has been considered the finest point guard to ever play for the Lady Vols. In addition to being selected to the CONVERSE/Lady Vol Team of the Decade for the 1980s in January of 1994, five different halls of fame opened their doors to her.

On Feb. 27, 2004, she was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. In October 2002, she became a member of the University of Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame in the second class of inductees. In June 2001, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame selected Warlick as one of 10 inductees into the Hall for the Class of 2001. For the hometown girl, who grew up in the Rocky Hill section of Knoxville and graduated from Bearden High School (where her No. 22 basketball jersey was retired on Oct. 26, 2012), it was a dream-come-true.

In the summer of 1994, Warlick gained admission to her first hall of fame. She was honored as one of the City of Knoxville's finest all-time athletes with her inclusion in the Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

Including this season, Warlick has invested 32 years in the program, having helped shape UT into a national powerhouse with tenure as both a player and a coach. Warlick's expertise and major contributions to the team have come from her work with the guards. In 2010-11, freshman point guard Meighan Simmons was the SEC Rookie of the Year, and guard Shekinna Stricklen was the 20th Lady Vol named to the WBCA/State Farm All-America Team.

Additionally, Warlick has been a highly-successful recruiter for the backcourt, attracting some of the nation's finest players to UT to continue the excellence she helped establish as a player. The Lady Vols welcomed another top flight guard to the Orange and White for 2010-11 when she landed McDonald's All-American Ariel Massengale.

As a rookie in 2011-12, Massengale lived up to her billing, earning Full Court Freshman All-America and SEC All-Freshman Team honors. The point guard posted a UT freshman record of 162 assists, ranking second in the SEC in that category, and leading the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.1.

Warlick's tutelage also helped to strengthen the game of four-time All-SEC selection Angie Bjorklund, Kodak All-American and four-time Lady Vol All-SEC performer Kara Lawson and three-time All-SEC selection Shanna Zolman. That trio accounts for the school records for most of UT's three-point marks.

Warlick's association with the Lady Vols started in 1976 when she joined the program as a scholarship 400-meter track athlete who walked on to the basketball team. Soon, she would become the most prolific player in the history of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball. Warlick was the first player in Tennessee athletics (men or women) to have her jersey retired (No. 22) at the end of her career in 1980.

Known as a play-making wiz during her four years as UT's point guard, Warlick was once tabbed the "best player in the South." As a rookie, Warlick helped lead the Lady Vols to their first Final Four appearance in school history in 1977. She had no trouble adjusting her enthusiasm and knowledge of the game into the coaching role.

In 19 of the past 31 years Warlick has been affiliated with UT, she has found herself at the Final Four as a player (1977, 1979, 1980) or as a coach (1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). Her best Final Four showing as a player was national championship runner-up in her senior season. As a coach, she has helped the Lady Vols grab the brass ring all eight times (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).

A three-time All-American while playing for Summitt from 1976-80, Warlick previously held UT records for most assists in a game (14), most steals in a contest (nine), most assists in a season (225) and most games in a career (142). She continues to hold the Lady Vol

single-season steals record with 141 in 1978-79.

Warlick brings vast international experience to the Lady Vols as well. A member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic basketball team, Warlick also participated in the Jones Cup, Pan American Games and World Championship competition. In addition, she was a WPBL All-Star, leading the Nebraska Wranglers to the championship of the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1981. She has served as a player representative on the USA BASKETBALL council and was a member of the USOC Advisory Council for Basketball.

In recognition of being a former Olympian, Warlick earned the honor of running the Olympic torch through Knoxville on its way to the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff for the 1985-86 season, Warlick gained experience at two other stops on the coaching circuit. She was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech from 1981-83 and an assistant from 1983-85 at Nebraska.

A native of Knoxville, Warlick earned her B.S. in marketing from Tennessee in 1981 and her master's degree in athletic administration from Virginia Tech in 1983. Warlick added "biker" to her vitae in 2001. To commemorate her induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, a number of Warlick's friends got together and presented her with a Harley-Davidson "Sportster" motorcycle. Just six years later, Warlick already was using her love of the bike towards a greater cause, establishing the Champions For A Cause Foundation with Caldwell.
