Game 30: Florida 70, Auburn 60 (SEC Tournament First Round)

March 1, 2012 * Nashville, Tenn. * Bridgestone Arena

Jordan Jones scored 17 points, Jennifer George posted her 15th double-double of the season and the University of Florida earned a 70-60 victory against Auburn in the first round of the 2012 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament on Thursday at Bridgestone Arena.

On Thursday, George scored the first points of the entire four-day event with a short jumper inside en route to a 12-point, 14-rebound effort to extend her SEC-leading double-double total. George was one rebound shy of her career high on the boards, as Florida outrebounded Auburn, 48-41, during the game, with 24 rebounds coming on the offensive end. Senior point guard Lanita Bartley pulled down eight boards to go along with 13 points, while Azania Stewart finished with 10 points, six rebounds and three blocked shots that included the 300th block of her career. Stewart became just the third Gator to block as many, joining Vanessa Hayden (357 blocks, 2000-04) and Quietella Bonner (230 blocks, 1976-81).

Florida used a 10-0 run midway through the first half that provided some breathing room after the first seven and half minutes of the game were fairly even, although the Gators never relinquished their lead at any point during the contest. Jones scored five points during the run that included her converting a three-pointer in her 13th consecutive game. Madu started the run with a pair of free throws, while Stewart hit an inside jumper and George followed with one free throw that resulted in a 25-13 Gator lead with 4:03 remaining in the first half.

Florida's lead dipped to nine points after Tyrese Tanner, who finished with 10 points, nailed a three-pointer as the halftime buzzer sounded and the Gators took a 34-25 lead into the locker room. George had already compiled 10 points and nine rebounds for Florida, which shot 34.2 percent (13-38) in the first half and 35.4 percent for the game.

Auburn's Blanche Alverson scored 12 of the Tiger's 25 first half points, finishing with 16 in the game along with a team-best seven rebounds. Freshman Hasina Muhammad scored a career and game-high 20 points, all of which came in the second half.

The teams traded scores to start the second half before Florida, which held a nine-point lead, used a 10-1 run that included three-pointers from Jones and Bartley and helped the Gators assume a 46-28 advantage with 14:47 remaining.

Both teams answered each other's scores and mini-runs again, but Auburn kept chipping away and cut Florida's lead to 11 points, 57-46, with 6:59 remaining. Florida responded with two free throws from Deana Allen, but the Tigers were playing hard for coach Nell Fortner, who announced she would retire at the end of the season, and continued to battle, eventually clawing to within eight points a few times, the last coming with 1:33 remaining.

The Gators stepped up down the stretch from the free throw line, where in several games throughout the year they had struggled, and converted 9-of-11 in the final 1:44 to seal the victory.

"I was proud of the way we played collectively because it's hard to keep playing hard when you're not playing as perfect as you want to," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "I thought we did a good job of maintaining our composure, the push at the end, stepping up to the free throw line and having a lot of poise and knocking down those ones that really kept them from really getting in striking distance."

Game 24: Auburn at Florida

Senior Lanita Bartley led the Gators in scoring for the second straight game with 17 points and Florida earned a 70-56 victory over Auburn Thursday evening at the O'Connell Center. The victory was the third consecutive for the Gators (16-8, 6-5 SEC), who used strong defense throughout and forced 22 Auburn turnovers that led to 26 points. Florida was also able to get out in transition and score 13 fast-break points, compared to just two for the Tigers. The Gators and Tigers exchange buckets for the majority of the first half, when there were five lead changes and six tied scores, with the lead getting no larger than five for either team. With Auburn holding a 29-27 lead with 2:26 remaining in the opening period, Florida went on a 7-2 run to end the half and headed into the locker room with a 36-31 lead. The backcourt of Deana Allen, Bartley and Jatterra Bonds led the way for the Gators during the first 20 minutes, when the trio combined for 27 first-half points. Allen finished with 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the floor in addition to three assists and three steals in 23 minutes of action. Bonds tallied 12 points, converting 4-of-5 shots, with a team-high four assists, as the Gators dished 18 in the game. Bonds started that final spurt with an acrobatic layup and drew contact and Allen followed with a steal on the other end of the floor and dished to Jordan Jones for the layin and forced an Auburn timeout. Jennifer George then stole the ball from Parrisha Simmons and Florida took advantage as Bonds nailed a three-pointer on another assist from Allen and the Gators held a 43-29 lead with 1:04 remaining. Blanche Alverson, who finished with a game-high 19 points, converted a jumper to halt Florida's run, but Nndi Madu found George under the basket and completed the high-low game that ended the first half's scoring. The Gators continued their momentum at the start of the second half by scoring the first seven points and pushing their lead to 15 points, 43-31, with 18:04 remaining in the game. Florida's defensive pressure kept the Tigers from converting a field goal for more than three and a half minutes, a span that covered the end of the first half and into the second. The Gators continued to get offensive contributions from every position, as nine out of the 10 Gators who suited up scored and helped maintain a double-digit lead for the remainder of the contest. Auburn cut Florida's lead to 11 points with 12:06 remaining, but freshman Andrea Vilaró Aragonés answered with a three-pointer, before Tiger rookie Hasina Muhammad sank a layup and kept the Gator lead at 12 points, 53-41, with 11:11 to play. That's when Florida mounted a 10-4 spurt for a 63-45 advantage and took an 18-point lead, its largest of the game, with 5:25 remaining and Auburn never recovered. Jones capped that final run with a free throw, marking her 900th career point at UF, as her overall career total swelled to 1,319. A three-point basket from the wing by Allen with 1:25 remaining in the game extended the lead to 68-51 and ended any hopes for an Auburn comeback. With Bonds converting two free throws from the line with 45 seconds remaining in the game, the Gators reached the 70-point mark for the fourth straight game. George collected a team-high eight rebounds, helping Florida to a 36-35 rebounding edge. The Gators also shot a steady 44.8 percent (26-58) for the game, including an 8-of-17 effort from the three-point arc. Auburn shot 48 percent (12-25) in the first half and finished with a 39.2 percent clip.

Game 16: Auburn 73, Florida 56

January 6, 2011 * Auburn, Ala. * Auburn Arena

Auburn used a 22-9 run in the final 6:43 of the game and blew open a close game to post a 73-56 decision against Florida Thursday evening at the new Auburn Arena. The Gators held a 33-28 halftime lead, but the Tigers roared out of the locker room and started the second half scoring the first four points and whittled the deficit to one. Azania Stewart and Jordan Jones followed with buckets and returned the Gator advantage to five, 37-32. Auburn, however, tallied six consecutive points and sparked a 13-2 run and assumed a six-point lead with 11:15 to go in the game. Jennifer George, who finished with a team-high 10 points, scored the lone field goal during the stretch, as Stewart hit an inside jumper to stop the spree. The teams then traded scores for the next seven opportunities, as the Gators could get no closer than four points, including 51-47 with 7:19 remaining. That's when the Tigers (9-6, 2-0 SEC) went on their game-ending run to earn their fifth consecutive victory and deny Florida (11-5, 1-1 SEC) its first true road win in five tries. Auburn also won the rebounding battle, 34-25, handing the Gators their worse deficit margin this year, including a seven rebound differential in the deciding second half, when the Tigers shot 57.7 percent and made 16 of their 24 trips to the free throw line. AU shot 50 percent overall during the game, the best by a UF opponent this season. Florida shot 41.5 percent overall (22-53), including 5-of-11 from the three-point arc, but found their way to the free throw line only 10 times, all in the first 20 minutes of play. "They won the paint, there's not any question," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "They dominated us on the boards, did a great job of getting to the rim and posting us up and scoring. It's really disappointing because that was our emphasis. We didn't come in with the determination and fight that it's going to take to win on the road in this league. I thought we played a real soft game. When we're at our best, we're playing with toughness and we didn't bring that toughness tonight." Stewart, who was plagued with foul trouble and whistled for her fourth with 10 minutes remaining, pulled down a team-high five rebounds along with seven points in 19 minutes of action. Nine of the 10 Gators who played scored during the game. Chantel Hilliard scored a career and game-high 17 points for Auburn, leading four Tigers in double-figure scoring. Nndi Madu opened the game's scoring 12 seconds after the initial ball went into the air, but Auburn sharp-shooter Blanche Alverson came back with a three-pointer and Parrisha Simmons followed with a pair of free throws and gave the Tigers the early 5-2 lead. Jones nailed a trey for the Gators to even things up, but Alli Smalley hit a bucket and Alverson went deep again to give Auburn a 10-5 advantage with 16:38 remaining in the opening half. Florida settled after a pair of turnovers and marched off a 12-4 run, with scoring from Deana Allen, Madu, Deandra Young, Lanita Bartley and Jatterra Bonds and took a 17-14 lead with 9:21 remaining, as Bonds capped the spree with a three-pointer en route to a team-best seven first-half points. The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes before Auburn came right back with two consecutive scores and held a 20-19 edge with 5:17 on the clock. That started a trend of six lead changes and one tied score over the next three minutes. With Auburn holding a 28-27 advantage and 2:39 on the clock, Bonds hit two free throws, Azania Stewart converted a three-point play and Bartley capped the first-half scoring with one from the charity stripe and gave Florida a 33-28 halftime lead.

Today's Story Lines

Florida returns to the court following a mid-week bye and begins and two-game road trip - first stop: Sunday in Auburn, Ala., where the Gators and Tigers will meet for the 50th time.

Last Timeout

Florida is coming off a much-needed 87-54 win against Alabama on Sun., Feb. 3, when the Gators snapped their five-game losing streak.

Auburn just missed upsetting No. 9/10 Georgia in Athens on Thur., Feb. 7, but a 3-of-15 free throw effort contributed to the 61-58 loss, the Tiger's seventh straight setback.

Each of Auburn's last four games have been decided by 10 points or less, while seven of its 10 SEC games have been decided by that small margin.

Gripping Gators

Seven of the Gator's nine SEC games this year have been decided by eight points or less.

Overall, 11 of Florida's game this season have been decided by 10 points or less (5-6 record).

You Want Thrillers? We Play Them!

Florida's last meeting against 11 of the 13 other teams from the SEC has been decided by 10 points or less.

The two that were not: this year's game at Georgia (Jan. 27, 17-point loss) and this year's game at home against Alabama (Feb. 3, 23-point win).

Rookies on the Road

Entering the season, only three current players had suited up with the Gators for an away game in the last two years, with senior **Jennifer George** joining juniors **Lily Svete** and **Jaterra Bonds** with recent experience playing in hostile arenas.

Redshirt-sophomore **Kayla Lewis** had not played a road game since Jan. 23, 2011 at LSU, as she missed the final 19 games of her freshman year while the three games she played last season prior to redshirting were at home.

SEC Preseason Picks

Auburn was voted to finish tied for 10th in a preseason poll of the SEC's head coaches and the media, who also selected Florida to place eighth and ninth, respectively.

Individual Notice

Florida senior **Jennifer George** was named as preseason first-team All-SEC selections by the league's coaches and media.

Gators vs. Tigers

Auburn leads the 49-game series against Florida, 32-17, including a commanding 15-4 record when playing in Auburn.

The Gators won both meetings against the Tigers last season, including the 70-60 victory in the first round of the SEC Tournament held in Nashville, Tenn.

Florida's last win at Auburn was Feb. 29, 2004, when the Gators took the 71-60 decision.

Nine is just Fine

Due to injuries Florida has had just nine players suiting up for the majority of its games - and ALL nine contribute.

All nine average at least 5.0 points per game and see at least 14.6 minutes of action.

Behind the Five-Game Slide

During UF's five-game losing streak, the Gators won the rebounding battle just once (48-41 vs. Tennessee). Prior to the Gator's win against Alabama on Feb. 3 that snapped the skid, the team had lost the rebounding battle six times and was even once (at Missouri).

Another statistical change was the team's effort at the free throw line, where the Gators had converted a woeful 53.8 percent (50-93) during those five games and sent their opponents to the charity stripe 130 times (that's an average of 26 times per game).

Florida also struggled shooting the ball from the three-point arc, connecting on a mere 24.7 percent (18-73), while foes hit at a 38.8 percent clip (33-85).

Who's Hot!

Over the last two games, freshman **Christin Mercer** is averaging team-bests of 12.5 points and 7.5 rebounds - and that includes her 18-point, 11 rebound (both career-highs) night against Alabama (Feb. 2), when she also earned her fourth career starting assignment.

She hit 75 percent (12-16) of her shots from the floor during those last two games.

Bonds, Jatterra Bonds

Overall, **Jatterra Bonds** is averaging 12.0 points (second on the team) with 3.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists (leads the team) per game.

Bonds, who is the only Gator who has started every game, ranks ninth in SEC games for scoring (15.1 ppg) and ninth for free throw percentage (74.6%).

**Battered & Bruised but Still Ballin' - until
Sunday (Jan. 20)**

Leading scorer and rebounder **Jennifer George** came off the bench in UF's Jan. 10 win at Mississippi State because she dislocated her shoulder with 5:06 remaining in the Jan. 6 victory against LSU. George played a season-low 17 minutes against the Lady Bulldogs and did not score, but still managed three rebounds, three blocked shots and an assist.

George suffered the same injury with 3:56 remaining in the first half of UF's overtime loss to Tennessee (Jan. 13) and had been the team's leading scorer in the game with eight points before the setback.

She was not cleared to dress for UF's Jan. 20 home game against South Carolina, marking just the second game she has missed during her career.

Battered & Bruised, Part 2

Jatterra Bonds, who leads UF in scoring in SEC games with 15.1 ppg, has been wearing a sleeve on her right arm since the team's Jan. 10 game at Mississippi State.

Bonds required three stitches in her right elbow following the win against the Lady Bulldogs after a hard foul sent her to the floor. Bonds needed to leave the court because she was bleeding with 57.8 seconds remaining and wasn't able to shoot the free throws, but freshman **January Miller** stepped up and made one of two in her place and gave UF a 59-55 lead.

Gator Watch

Preseason Naismith Player of the Year candidate **Jennifer George** has scored in double-figures in 13 of the 21 games she has played this year.

George, who is the **SEC's ACTIVE career leader in double-doubles** with 26, most

George also is the **SEC's ACTIVE career leader in rebounds** (818 and is second for blocks (167) and fifth for steals (145).

George leads the Gators in scoring (12.3), rebounding (8.0), steals (1.9) and field goal percentage (52.2%) and ranks second for blocked shots (32).

Bonds Worth Banking

Jaterra Bonds, the only returning player that boasted experience in the backcourt for the Gators this year, leads the team in trips to the free throw line (110), where she converts 75.5 percent of her attempts.

During the Jan. 6 game against LSU (UF's 16th game), Bonds made her 57th free throw - passing the 54 she converted through 33 games last year.

Bonds was 18-of-19 from the free throw line in the two games, sporting a career-best 17 made streak during the stretch.

Bonds tied a program record by hitting 100 percent (11-of-11) from the charity stripe while scoring a season and game-high 21 points at sixth-ranked Kentucky (Jan. 3).

In UF's win against Pacific (Dec. 7), Bonds scored a game-high 20 points, hitting 12-of-15 free throws, an effort that tied for the fourth-most made free throws in a game in program history.

Moss is BOSS!

Freshman **Sydney Moss** was voted the MVP of the Gator Holiday Classic after leading UF to two wins and the team title. During the two-game run, Moss led the Gators with 16.5 points - converting 63.2 percent (12-19) of her shots, along with 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.0 steals.

More on Moss

Sydney Moss is tied for the Gator lead in assists (3.3 apg), ranks second on the team for steals (1.6 pg), while ranking third for scoring (10.1), and rebounding (6.1 rpg). She has flirted with a triple-double four times.

Among SEC freshmen entering the games of Feb. 10, Moss ranks second for assists, fourth for rebounding and third for scoring.

She has been the Gator's game leader for assists 10 times, for rebounding six times and scoring four times.

Svete Stepping Up!

Through the first third of the year, redshirt-junior Lily Svete is on pace to have the best season of her career. She has **at least doubled her average in every stat category** and improved her shooting percentages from long range and overall.

Last year she averaged 2.3 points and 1.0 rebounds while hitting 23.3 percent (14-60) of her three-point tries and playing 8.7 minutes per game.

This season, Svete is recording 5.0 points, 2.0 rebounds, sinking 41.6 percent (32-77) from beyond the arc and playing 16.8 minutes per game while starting 19 games.

Everyone Scores!

Eleven times this season every Gator who has suited up for a game has scored, most recently in the Feb. 3 game against Alabama

Six games last year every player who dress, scored.

Threading the Needles

Carlie Needles has converted 41-of-126 for an average of 32.5 percent from long range this season - including the record-setting 9-of-17 performance against North Florida on Nov. 23.

Overall, Needles contributes 7.4 points per game - fifth-most on the team.

George Moving on Up Despite Injury

Jennifer George collected her 800th career rebound during the Jan. 24 game against Ole Miss, as she became the 11th Gator in program history with 1,000 points and 800 rebounds.

Secret Scouter

Gator junior **Vicky McIntyre** played her first two seasons at Oklahoma State before transferring to Florida in May of 2012.

McIntyre two-year stint at the Big XII school had her square off against the Tigers four times, totaling 24 points and 15 rebounds. Her top statistical game against Missouri was a 14-point, seven-rebound effort against the Tigers in Columbia as a freshman.

In her first game against the former Big XII foe, McIntyre tied her Gator-career-high of 12 points at Missouri (Jan. 31), while contributing four rebounds and two blocked shots.

What Time is It?

In SEC games, freshman **January Miller** is averaging 7.6 points, while hitting 37.5 percent (6-16) three-pointers. Three of her five double-figure scoring games have come during conference action.

In the 14 non-conference games, Miller tallied 4.6 points, while converting 5-of-20 (25%) three-point attempts and 12-of-19 free throws (63.2%).

Ranked Row

The Gator's game on Jan. 27 at Georgia marked Florida's third time during a four-game stretch it faced a nationally-ranked opponent. The Gators missed out on upset wins in both outings, falling in overtime to No. 9 Tennessee (78-75) and to No. 19/18 South Carolina (52-44) - then lost to Ole Miss (88-81) before falling to No. 14 Georgia (69-52).

The Gators are 0-4 this year versus ranked teams (at the time of tip-off).

Florida's last win over a ranked team was on March 17, 2012, when the unranked Gators upset No. 16/18 Ohio State, 70-65, in the first round of the NCAA Championship.

Eight Wasn't Great

In UF's Jan. 20 game against No. 19/18 South Carolina, the Gators had just eight players suit up for the contest because **Jennifer George** was unable to play with the injury she suffered in the team's previous game (Jan. 13 vs. Tennessee).

Ronni Williams Signs with Gators

Ronni Williams * Forward * 6-2 * Daytona Beach, Fla. * Atlantic High School

Ronni Williams, the top-ranked basketball recruiting prospect in the state of Florida, officially signed a National Letter of Intent with UF on Wed., Nov. 14, 2012.

Williams was one of 20 high school seniors selected to the 2013 WBCA High School All-America Game presented by NIKE.

Topped the 2,000-point plateau on "Senior Day" and led Atlantic High School to the District 7-4A championship on February 2, 2013, with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Through that game, Williams is averaging 19.9 points, 10.6 rebounds, 3.2 steals, 3.0 assists and 3.0 blocks per game during her senior season. Her individual game high this year was a 38-point, 17 rebound performance in a win against New Smyrna Beach on Jan. 24, 2013.

A three-time Daytona Beach News-Journal Player of the Year selection, Williams is ranked as the No. 13 best player in the country on ESPN's Class of 2013 national recruiting list. Williams also was recognized by ESPN HoopGurlz Super 60 rankings as the second-best wing-position player in the 2013 recruiting class.

Williams, a 6-foot-2 forward from Daytona Beach, is the highest-ranked player ever to sign with the Gators and will begin her college career in the 2013-14 season.

"There is a long list of attributes of Ronni as a basketball player, starting with her competitiveness, how great she wants to be and how great she wants the Gators to be," Coach Amanda Butler said. "From purely a basketball skill standpoint, Ronni is a player who can excel at any position on the court. She's a matchup nightmare for opposing defenses.

"Ronni has true versatility. When you see her play, you know that you're watching a professional athlete. All of her talent is fuelled by an intense competitive spirit and willingness to work."

During her freshman year at Atlantic High School, Williams averaged 20.5 points and 13.5 rebounds and she amazingly has been stronger each year despite having a larger target and receiving more attention from the opposition. She averaged 21.9 points, 13.6 rebounds, 4.2 assists and 4.2 blocks her sophomore season and 20.1 points (636 total points), 10.8 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.6 blocks last year as a junior.

During her junior year, Williams helped the Sharks to a 21-6 record, as she totaled 553 points, scoring a season-high 34 points on Jan. 17, 2012, vs. Crooms Academy.

Williams' sophomore year was highlighted with a 66-65 win against Apopka on Jan. 22, 2011, when she scored a career-high 45 points with 19 rebounds and five steals. She totaled 636 points.

During her freshman year when she totaled 451 points, her statistical highlight game came on Jan. 14, 2010, against Jones when she recorded 29 points, 25 rebounds and dished seven assists in the win.

And Then There Was One ...

Vicky McIntyre is the only Gator who has scored in every game this season. **Jennifer George** has scored in every game she has played this year, but missed the season-opener for personal reasons.

Entering the Jan. 3 game at Kentucky, **Sydney Moss**, **Carlie Needles** and **Lily Svete** each had scored in every game, but all were shutout offensively for the first time this season.

SEC Schedule Breakdown

Missouri and Texas A&M joined the SEC in women's basketball this year with 14 schools competing in the league for the 2012-13 season.

The number of conference games played (16) remained the same, but each school now plays a single round with one permanent opponent and two random opponents.

Florida's permanent opponent is Georgia and also has home-and-home dates this year with Alabama and South Carolina.

First Third in the Books

Head coach **Amanda Butler** likes to break the season down into three parts: non-conference, SEC and postseason.

Florida capped the non-conference portion of its season with an 11-3 record, earning an 81-50 victory against Holy Cross on Fri., Dec. 28. That win was the Gator's 15th consecutive home victory against a non-conference opponent. The run is tied for the fourth-longest of its kind in program history.

Back from the Road

UF's Dec. 16 trip to Philadelphia was the Gator's sixth of their first 11 games they played away from the friendly confines of the O'Connell Center.

Thanks to the 74-50 victory against La Salle on Dec. 17, Florida is 1-2 in true road games this year after falling at Florida State and at Michigan.

The Gators logged a 2-1 record in Las Vegas at the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout, playing N.C. State, Northern Iowa and Arizona State on a neutral court.

Third Time was a Charm

Florida's 74-50 win at La Salle (Dec. 16) marked the team's first true road win in its third attempt.

Moss Earns SEC Rookie Award

Sydney Moss was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 10 after her stellar week leading the Gators to two wins. The Florida rookie was Florida's leading scorer in its two wins during the week, averaging 16.5 points, while hitting a team-best 66.7 percent (14-27) of her shots and dishing a team-high eight assists with just three turnovers.

The Gator rookie also averaged 6.0 rebounds, the second-highest average on the team last week.

Moss scored a career and game-high 18 points in the win against Troy that snapped the team's two-game losing streak and began a two-game win streak, which included Florida's 89-82 win against Pacific that had entered the game as one of 17 undefeated teams in the country.

George Joins 1,000-Point Club!

Senior **Jennifer George** scored 17 points against Pacific on Dec. 7 and ended the game with exactly 1,000 career points, becoming the 21st Gator to reach the 1,000-point plateau. The final point for George came at the free throw line with 22 seconds remaining as she helped Florida take an 87-80 lead and make it a three-possession game.

George is the first Gator to reach the scoring milestone was **Marshae Dotson** (2005-09), who scored her 1,000th career point on Feb. 10, 2008 vs. Mississippi State and finished her career with 1,529 points.

Tough Shooting Stretch

During the Gator's back-to-back losses, the team converted a mere 15.6 percent (5-32) of its three-point attempts.

News from the Training Room

Freshman guard **Chandler Cooper** played in the first three games of the year but has been sidelined since with a foot injury. Her return date has not been determined.

Redshirt-freshman **Viktorija Dimaite** tore the ACL in her left knee during practice on Nov. 3 and will miss the 2012-13 season.

Injuries to Cooper and Dimaite, plus the news that redshirt-freshman **Cassie Peoples** would not be granted immediate eligibility this year by the NCAA, has left the Gators with no more than nine players suiting up for the every game since the third one of the year.

Fans Get their Money's Worth!

Florida has played **66 games over the last three-plus seasons with outcomes decided by 10 points or less - that's an AVERAGE of 18.3 games per season of thrillers!** Florida is 34-32 record in those tight ballgames, including 5-6 this year and seven SEC games (2-5).

Seventeen games fit into that category during the 2011-12 season, when UF posted a 7-10 record.

10 of UF's 16 SEC regular-season games in 2011-12 were decided by six points or less, with 11 of 16 by decided by single digits.

Twenty-three of UF's program-record 35 games during the 2010-11 season were decided by 10 points or fewer, with 16 being six-point differences - including the final two of the season. The Gators were 14-9 in games decided by 10 points or less in 2010-11.

During the 2009-10 season, the Gators played 15 games decided by fewer than 10 points and posted an 8-7 in those outings.

Coach Butler Earns 100th Win at UF

Florida's 84-65 win against Georgia State on Nov. 11 was **Amanda Butler's** 100th coaching victory with the Gators.

Butler joins Carol Ross as the only two coaches in Gator history to guide Florida to 100 wins. Ross finished with 247 wins in 12 years.

The 98 wins Butler accumulated during her first five seasons with the Gators are the most by any coach in program history through their first five years at UF.

Let's Get it Started

In Florida's season-opener, **Jaterra Bonds** started her team-leading 34th consecutive game, while redshirt-junior **Lily Svete** earned her first collegiate start.

Freshman **Sydney Moss** became the first rookie to start her Gator debut since **Kayla Lewis** was on the floor for the season-opening tip for the 2010-11 campaign. Lewis started the opener for her eighth career start, while junior newcomer **Vicky McIntyre** jumped center against Fairfield.

Moss was Boss

Freshman **Sydney Moss** had quite the impressive collegiate debut, just missing a triple-double, as she recorded 9 points, 10 rebounds and 9 assists against Fairfield.

The nine assists set the record for a Gator debut, breaking the previous mark of six set by **Sarah Lowe** (2002-03), **Brandi McCain** (1998-99) and **Amanda Butler** (1990-91).

She became just the seventh Gator - and third freshman - to collect at least 10 rebounds in a debut. The other two freshmen were Olympian Tammy Jackson (1981-82) and 2004 WNBA first-round draft pick Vanessa Hayden (2000-01).

Get Your Roster Card Ready!

The Gators had just nine players available for the season-opener against Fairfield, with six of those newcomers, including five freshmen!

Quick Season Preview

A 2012 First Team All-Southeastern Conference performer, **Jennifer George** headlines a very young and inexperienced 2012-13 Florida women's basketball team (ranked as the fifth-most inexperienced team in the country) that is coming off its fifth consecutive postseason berth.

George is the lone senior on the 12-player roster that features eight newcomers, including six freshmen. George, who led Florida in scoring (12.8 ppg) and rebounding (8.8 rpg) last year, will be joined on the court by junior guard **Jaterra Bonds**, who was the only Gator who played and started all 33 games a year ago when Florida compiled its third 20-win season in five years with coach **Amanda Butler** at the helm and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament where it bowed out to eventual national champion Baylor.

The Gators graduated five players from last year's team, including 2012 Olympian Azania Stewart, who used her 6-foot-4 frame to rank third all-time among the program's shot blockers.

While Florida will miss Stewart's size inside, the Gators welcome 6-foot-7 transfer **Vicky McIntyre** and 6-foot-4 redshirt freshman **Viktorija Dimaite** to the paint to help George in the front court. Florida also welcomed the nation's 20th-ranked signing class to campus, as the Gators will be young in 2012-13 but very talented.

Unfortunately for the Gators, Dimaite tore the ACL in her left knee during practice on Nov. 3 and will miss the 2012-13 season.

Bonus Butler Byte

Coach Butler has led the Gators to three 20-win seasons in her five years on the sideline. There have been 12 total 20-win seasons in program history, including Butler's three.

When Florida earned the No. 23 spot in the Dec. 8, 2008 Associated Press ranking, Butler became only the sixth woman in the history of NCAA Division I Basketball to play for and coach the SAME team that earned a top-25 ranking.

Head Coach Amanda Butler

Amanda Butler in 2012-13 is in her sixth year as head coach of her alma mater.

Butler enters the 2012-13 season having already amassed 98 victories with the Orange & Blue, the most of any coach in program history through their respective first five seasons. **Carol Ross** (1990-2002) tallied 97 wins through her first five years en route to becoming the winningest coach in Gator history with 247 victories in 12 seasons.

Butler also has made the O'Connell Center a tough venue for opponents, as her Gators have won 89.0 percent of their games against non-conference foes, posting a 40-5 home record during her five-year tenure.

During her five years at Florida, Butler has guided 10 different Gators to 16 spots on the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll, six Gators to the Freshman Academic Honor Roll and one to the Capital One Academic All-District 4 Team. Additionally, three different Gators have been voted First Team All-SEC, with three on the SEC All-Freshman Team and one named the SEC 6th Woman of the Year.

In the 38-year history of the Florida women's basketball program, the team has posted 20 wins 12 times, with Butler accounting for three of those, including the 20-victory campaign in 2011-12, as the squad reached the NCAA Tournament for the 13th time in school history. The 2008-09 team – Butler's second year at UF - tied the school record with 24 victories.

When Florida earned the No. 23 spot in the Dec. 8, 2008 Associated Press national poll, Butler joined an elite list of women. She became one of only 24 women in the history of NCAA Division I women's basketball who had played for a team that was ranked in the AP Top-25 and later coached a team that earned a top-25 ranking. Even more rare was the fact the Butler played for and coached the SAME team that earned a top-25 ranking, becoming only the sixth woman ever to accomplish that feat.

Florida has had eight different full-time women's basketball head coaches and Butler is the only one to lead the Gators to a postseason berth in each of her first five years with the program.

Butler was the Gator's starting point guard when UF earned its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth (1992-93 season). She started 99 of the 114 games she played during her four-year career (1990-94).

#20 Antoinette Bannister * Freshman * Guard * 5-10 * Jacksonville, Fla.

Antoinette Bannister has enrolled at the University of Florida and is officially a member of the Gator women's basketball team. Her first day of class was Fri., Jan. 11, 2013.

She will be eligible to compete for the Gators one day after the fall of 2013 final exams (Dec. 14, 2013) have been completed.

Bannister is a 5-foot-10 guard from Jacksonville, Fla., and spent the 2012 fall semester at the University of North Carolina, where she played in eight of 14 games.

She averaged 4.3 points, 1.6 rebounds and 1.0 assists while playing 8.6 minutes per game with the Tar Heels, netting a game-high 13 points in the Dec. 16 win at Coastal Carolina when she played 19 minutes, hitting 4-of-7 from the floor, including 3-of-5 from beyond the arc and both free throw attempts.

"Back in October, I found out my mom got sick, so I had been battling whether or not "Do I want to go home?" Bannister shared. "I just prayed to God about it and finally decided I wanted to move closer to home. She just had surgery Thursday morning (Jan. 10) and she's doing pretty good. I'm excited to be back home in the state of Florida."

Bannister, who played her prep ball at The Potter's House Christian Academy where she was coached by her father, Tony Bannister, set the state of Florida's all-time prep scoring record with 4,758 points.

"Antoinette is a very complete offensive ballplayer," Butler said. "She's been well-coached, brought up by a daddy who was all-basketball, all the time so she knows that game. She has a very high basketball I.Q. She comes from a very successful and accomplished high school program here in our state. Antoinette is a player who can dribble, pass and shoot and has a great feel for the game. We're excited about her bringing all parts of her game to our team and adding to what we already have."

During her senior year, Bannister guided the Christian Lions to a 24-7 record and the 2012 National Christian School Athletic Association (NCSAA) Basketball Championship, scoring 35 points in a 72-64 win against Life Center Academy to capture the best-of-three series and the title.

PHCA won the NCSAA Basketball championship all four years with Bannister on the court. During junior year at PHCA, Bannister averaged 27.2 points, 7.5 steals, 7.1 rebounds and 5.2 assists per game, while shooting a sizzling 69 percent from the floor overall, 67 percent from the three-point arc and hitting 92 percent of her free throw attempts, helping the Christian Lions compile a 37-1 record.

Bannister, who committed to UNC during her sophomore season, participated in the invitation-only American Family Insurance National High School Slam Dunk & 3-Point Championships in 2012 in New Orleans, where she finished third. The sharp-shooting guard totaled a tournament-high 21 points in the opening round, advanced to the semifinal and just missed reaching the final round.

During a game on Jan. 30, 2012, against Gill St. Bernard's (NJ), Bannister totaled 51 points, 11 rebounds, seven steals and five assists.

In the final game of her stellar prep career, Bannister scored 45 points with 14 rebounds and eight steals in a four-point win against IMG Academy.

Because PHCA is not a member of the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) and as a result not part of the National Federation of High School Associations, Bannister's statistical accomplishments are not recognized nationally.

If they had been, Bannister's 4,758 career points would rank second nationally behind Goodrich (TX) High's Adrian McGowen, who recorded 5,424 points from 2003-06. According to ESPN's HoopGurlz, "Bannister's 657 threes made would rank first nationally if it were acknowledged by the NHSF, well ahead of current record of 500, set by Ashley Wirtzberger of Gila Bend (Ariz.) from 2007-10. Her assist totals also would be enough for top honors in the national career list, ahead of the current record of 1,169 assists set by Mary Johnson of Longview (Texas), set from 1980-83."

At the end of her illustrious high school career, Bannister was honored all four years to the five-member National Association of Christian Athletes (NACA) All-America Girls Division 1 Team, was a 2012 Second-Team All-American by USA Today and tabbed an honorable mention All-American by MaxPreps in 2012.

Bannister was voted the 2010, 2011 and 2012 NCSAA National Player of the Year in the Large-School Division.

Bannister rated as the No. 26 overall recruit by the All-Star Girls Report and No. 59 by ESPN's HoopGurlz.

Game 1: Florida 71, Fairfield 49 Nov. 9, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * O'Connell Center

Freshman Sydney Moss nearly had a triple-double in her Gator debut Friday night as her nine points, 10 rebounds and nine assists helped Florida to a 71-49 season-opening win over Fairfield in the O'Connell Center. Moss, who logged 29 minutes in her first collegiate game, stepped up big for the Gators with her all-around play, but it was the play of many new Gator faces that contributed to the solid 22 point victory. Vicky McIntyre and Kayla Lewis led the Gators in scoring with 12 each, while it was Moss who controlled the boards and led all players with her 10 rebounds.

It was very much a team-effort on the court Friday as all nine players who dressed out recorded at least three points in the scorebook. For Moss, her nine assists not only led the team, but it was the most for a Gator in her debut since Sarah Lowe recorded six against Lamar on November 24, 2002. For Amanda Butler, who also held the debut assist record with Lowe, it was also her 99th win as the Gator head coach in her career, putting her one shy of the century mark.

The new-look Gators got a quick start from some of their new faces early in the game. Moss scored the first Florida points of the season after scoring on a put-back of her own shot, but Fairfield actually held the early lead before the first break in the game.

Florida started to get warm after a turnaround jumper from McIntyre followed by a steal and a fast-break layup by freshman Chandler Cooper to give the Orange and Blue the 6-5 lead, its first lead of the game going into the first media timeout. The Stags had a hot hand early on going up by as much as six through the first five minutes, but UF started to find its shooting touch just before the midway point of the first half and went on an 11-0 run to re-take the lead at 20-15 with 10:10 to go in the first half. During that run, freshman Carlie Needles also got her first points as a Gator with a three-pointer from the right wing off a nice assist from Cooper. Those points were then followed by another three-ball, this time from Lewis to tie the game at 15. McIntyre dropped in another bucket down low before another three from Lewis to complete the run.

Three-pointers were a common occurrence for UF early as three of its first seven made shots from the field all were from behind the arc. For the half, Florida shot nearly 46 percent on three-pointers (5-of-11).

Fairfield was able to score five straight points to get the game back even at 20 with 6:42 to go in the half, but it would be the last points the Stags scored until nearly halftime. The Gators behind strong defense were able to cause a number of turnovers and went on a 14-0 run over three minutes of play to break the game wide open. Five different Gators scored during the run to take a 34-20 lead with 3:45 to play in the half. Fairfield did score two more buckets before the first half buzzer, but it was the Gators who had the nice 34-24 lead at the break. Defense and a quick pace was the key to UF taking a big lead into halftime as it caused 13 Fairfield turnovers and scored 19 points off those turnovers.

Lewis led all scorers in the first frame with 10 points, followed by McIntyre, who added in eight points and was 4-of-6 from the field. As a team, Florida was 13-of-33 (39.4%) from the field and held Fairfield to 18 percent three-point shooting.

Out of the locker room in the second half, Florida had a little trouble pulling away from the Stags as the lead dropped down to as low as five points with 12:10 to go in the game, but freshman Christin Mercer got in on the action as she drained three straight buckets for the Gators to push their lead back to double-digits at 52-42 with 8:56 to play. Mercer ended up with eight points in the game and was a perfect 4-for-4 from the field. The five-point deficit earlier in the second half was the closest Fairfield got for the remainder of the game as Florida continued to play with pressing defense and fast break scoring. As a team, UF scored 14 points on fast break and 31 points off Fairfield's 24 turnovers. For the remaining eight minutes in the game, Florida kept its lead above double-digits as both teams traded buckets for over three minutes. After a made layup by Fairfield's Katie Cizynski to make the score 56-46 with 6:34 to play, UF went on a big scoring spree to end the game. 13 of the final 16 points in the game went for the Orange and Blue as the final buzzer sounded with the 22-point win, which was its biggest lead of the night.

Game 2: Florida 84, Georgia State 65 Nov. 11, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * O'Connell Center

Senior Jennifer George scored a game-high 19 points and led four Gators in double-figure scoring to help the University of Florida women's basketball team to an 84-65 win over Georgia State at the O'Connell Center on Sunday afternoon.

Along with George's, junior Jaterra Bonds added 17 points, which is her most in a game since scoring 23 against Charlotte on March 24, 2011. Sophomore Kayla Lewis added 11 points along with a career-high 12 rebounds for her first double-double of her career and freshman Sydney Moss, who had 10 points for the first double-figure point outing in her young Gator career.

The win was also head coach Amanda Butler's 100th in her six seasons as the head Gator. As was the case in the season opener on Friday, Florida benefited from scoring off turnovers, as 40 of the Gators' 84 points were made off of the Panthers' 28 turnovers.

Scoring was hard to come by in the early part of the game when both UF and Georgia State had four turnovers through the first five minutes, but the Gators got things going after the first points of the contest came from George to give Florida the early 2-0 lead.

Much like Friday's game, the first 10 minutes of Sunday's game came down to who had the stronger defense. Only 22 combined points were scored between the Panthers and Gators during that opening span, but it was Florida holding Georgia State to a mere 25 percent shooting from the field that was the early difference.

After a few traded buckets, the Orange and Blue re-built a 14-10 lead by the midway point in the first half with four different players contributing. After Georgia State tied the game at 10 with 12:06 to play in the half, Florida went on a nice 15-2 run to get to a 25-12 lead with just seven minutes to go. During the run, freshman Christin Mercer was the big contributor scoring six of the first 12 points, before Bonds started to find her rhythm by draining the Gators first three-pointer of the night and then scoring on a nice individual effort for a fast break layup to finish off the run.

GSU did cut the lead to single digits with four minutes to play in the half, but, once again, it was Bonds, who came to the

Game 3: Florida State 98, Florida 67 Nov. 15, 2012 * Tallahassee, Fla. * Donald L. Tucker Center

Jennifer George scored a season-high 20 points but it wasn't enough as the Gators faltered in their first road tip of the season, falling 98-67 at Florida State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Gators (2-1) were in control of the first 12 minutes of the game before Florida State ripped off a 28-2 run and the Gators would never recover.

"They played like the team that they are, full of seniors with a couple of juniors and we looked like all freshmen, unfortunately, with no upperclassmen," coach Amanda Butler said. "This is something we have to learn from, we were very exposed. When things were going our way we looked like Florida Basketball. When things didn't go our way we didn't handle the adversity at all."

It was George's fifth 20-point performance of her career, as she hit 9-of-15 from the floor and 2-of-5 from the free throw line. Florida's lone senior was joined in double-figure scoring by Jatterra Bonds, who recorded 13 points and six assists. Redshirt-sophomore Kayla Lewis added 10 points and seven rebounds for the Gators, who shot 35.6 percent (26-73) from the floor and committed 21 turnovers that Florida State converted into 33 points.

Prior to Thursday's game, only three current players had suited up with the Gators for an away game in the last two years, with junior Lily Svete joining George and Bonds with recent experience playing in hostile arenas. Lewis, who record her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds against Georgia State, has not played a road game since Jan. 23, 2011 at LSU.

"We're not going to use anything as an excuse because I think we've got good ball players," Butler said when asked if her team's youth made a difference in the game. "Florida State made the experience gap very important. We played like a very scattered and inexperienced team and they did a great job of looking primarily like a unit of seniors. That's no excuse for the way we played. I'm really disappointed with our defensive effort. Defense and rebounding. I don't care how many years you've been playing or who you're playing against, you have to show up with a whole lot more toughness and awareness than we did."

Four Seminoles (2-0) tallied a double-figure scoring effort, paced by senior Leonor Rodriguez's 21 points. Junior Natasha Howard added 18 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, pacing FSU's effort on the boards where the hosts held a 46-36 advantage.

The teams traded buckets in the first seven minutes of the game, as FSU took a 10-7 lead. The Gators countered with a 7-0 spurt and took a 15-10 lead with 12:08 remaining in the first half, as George used a power move inside for the first bucket. Bonds followed by converted three consecutive free throws after being fouled from beyond the arc and George capped the march with a three-point play.

The teams again exchanged scores before freshman Sydney Moss nailed a three-pointer and Kayla Lewis completed a three-point play and gave the Gators a 23-14 lead with 10:16 on the clock and FSU called a timeout to halt the momentum.

"They did a great job of calling a timeout and making adjustments when we made a run and took the lead," Butler said. "Then they just outplayed us the rest of the ballgame. We didn't do a good job coming out of timeouts of making adjustments. We did a horrible job of handling their zone which they played the entire game and I have to take the blame for that. We have to be ready to handle their zone pressure. You have to give them credit."

FSU chipped away with the next five points before George scored again inside as part of a back-and-forth scoring trend.

With Florida holding a 27-21 lead with 8:15 remaining in the period, Florida State called a timeout and went on a devastating 28-2 run to end the half and take a 49-29 halftime advantage.

During the game-changing run, the Seminoles hit 12-of-17 shots from the field and out-rebounded the Gators 12-2. George scored Florida's lone basket, breaking up a 21-0 run with a tough inside shot, as the Gators turned the ball over six times during the span.

Game 4: Florida State 74, North Florida 44 Nov. 19, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Carlie Needles scored a career-high 27 points all coming off a program-record nine three-pointers and Florida earned an impressive 74-44 win against North Florida at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Monday night.

With 1:24 to play in the contest, Needles hit her ninth and final shot from long distance and finished 9-of-17 on the night, making her just the fifth player in Southeastern Conference women's basketball history to make nine three-point baskets in a single game and tying her for the second-most threes in a game by any SEC women's basketball player.

Needles broke a 20-year Florida Gator record held by Bridget Pettis, who drained eight three-pointers versus Georgia on Jan. 20, 1993.

"It's pretty cool. It's not about the individual record; it's about what we do as a team" said Needles about breaking the program record. "My teammates really looked for me and so without them, I wouldn't have shot the ball well. I noticed they had a couple good screens, and they really found me well. It wasn't just me."

"Carlie had a pretty good night, but I thought the thing that was fantastic about that was not that she shot the ball - we all know she's capable of that - but that her teammates screened for her, found her and she did a great job of finding her shots," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "Every shot she took was a good shot. There was nothing that was lucky or freakish about it."

Needles outscored North Florida (0-4) by herself through the first 20 minutes and had seven three-point field goals in the first half, which were as many field goals as the entire North Florida team combined through that stage of the game.

Jatterra Bonds and Lily Svete joined in on the three-point shooting spree for the Gators as well as they each added a long range jumper of their own and help Florida sink 11 from long range, the most three-pointers since hitting 11 at Ole Miss on Jan. 31, 2010.

The game started with a slow pace on both sides with the Gators and Ospreys committing a combined seven turnovers in the first 4:08. The teams reached the first media timeout at the 15:52 mark with North Florida leading 5-2 and the Gators' first points of the game coming on a Kayla Lewis (Decatur, Ga.) layup from Bonds.

The Gators came out of a media timeout and exploded on a 19-0 run that turned the three-point deficit into a 21-5 lead with 8:30 remaining in the first half. Octavia Langston stopped the spree with a jumper, but Jennifer George hit one free throw and started a 9-0 march that featured scoring by freshman Sydney Moss and two more threes from Needles that ended with the Gators holding a 30-7 advantage with 6:47 to play in the first half and Florida never looked back.

Game 5: Florida 66, N.C. State 64 (South Point Thanksgiving Shootout) Nov. 23, 2012 * Las Vegas, Nev. * South Point Arena

Carlie Needles hit a three-pointer with six seconds remaining and helped the Florida women's basketball team earn a hard-fought 66-64 victory against N.C. State on Friday in the first day of action at the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout at the South Point Arena in Las Vegas.

There were 14 lead changes and 13 tied scores in the game, as the Gators improved to 4-1 this season and handed the Wolfpack (4-1) their first loss of the year.

With N.C. State using a 7-0 run to take a 54-49 lead with 5:58 remaining, Florida's Vicky McIntyre hit an 8-foot baseline jumper to halt the spurt and spark a 5-1 march for the Gators, who closed to within 55-54 with 4:30 on the clock.

The Wolfpack came right back with an offensive rebound putback by Kody Burke, but the Gators rallied as Jaterra Bonds converted two free throws, Sydney Moss banked in a six-foot pull-up jumper on a fast break and Jennifer George hit one free throw and Florida took a 59-57 advantage with 2:37 remaining.

As the entire game flowed, both teams answered each other's run with one of their own and N.C. State came right back with one free throw followed by a three-pointer from Marissa Kastanek and the Pack regained the lead, 61-59, with 1:43 to play. UF called a timeout to settle and Needles came out of the 30-second break nailing her second of three 3-pointers and swung the lead back to the Gators, 61-62, with 59 seconds remaining.

N.C. State then called a timeout and Florida seemed to play solid defense, as Burke missed an outside jumper that was tipped, but the Gators couldn't find the flailing ball in the air, as it landed right into Markeisha Gatling's waiting arms under the basket and she put in the short uncontested jumper that gave the Pack the lead with 42 seconds left.

Florida missed its shot on its next offensive possession and N.C. State collected the rebounded and the Gators were forced to foul Kastanek because the shot clock was off with 21 seconds. Kastanek made the first but missed the second and the Pack held a 64-62 lead.

That set up Needles' three-point heroics, as she calmly nailed it from the left corner while standing directly in front of the Gator bench, as Florida took the 65-64 lead.

After the Pack called a timeout, they turned the ball over dribbling up the court and were forced to foul Moss, who sank one of two with 0.9 seconds remaining for the final score.

Moss led Florida with a career-high 15 points and collected 10 rebounds to post the first double-double of her young career, while collecting four steals. George added 13 points with seven rebounds, four steals, three blocks and two assists. Needles finished with nine points all from beyond the arc and all nine Gators who entered the game scored.

UF shot 45.8 percent (27-59) for the game, including a mere 21.1 percent (4-19) from the three-point arc. The Wolfpack, who held the 41-38 rebounding advantage, in the game, hit 39.1 percent from the floor, including 3-of-13 from long range.

Freshman January Miller came off the bench and sparked the Gators midway through the second half, as she helped UF overcome a 6-2 run that had the momentum shift in N.C. State's favor. The Gator rookie checked in and collected a quick offensive rebound and kept the possession alive as fellow freshman Christin Mercer powered up an inside bucket after a great dish from Bond and tied the game. Miller then ran the floor after a Wolfpack miss and Bonds rewarded her with the pass that she converted into a layup that gave the Gators the two-point lead.

The first half was just as exciting. Florida led the majority of the frame and held a 22-14 lead with 8:43 to play before N.C. State erased the entire advantage with a 10-2 march. The teams traded baskets for the next couple of minutes and the game was tied with 1:38 left in the period. With 54 seconds remaining in the first half, N.C. State's Krystal Barrett scored her eighth points of the period on a driving layup to break the 28-28 tie. Lewis was fouled with 31.8 seconds on the clock and went to the line where she made one free throw, missed the second. George corralled the offensive board and UF had the ball for the last shot of the period. The Gators had three short shots under the basket but none would drop and the Pack took the 30-29 lead into the locker room.

Game 6: Florida 80, Northern Iowa 63 (South Point Thanksgiving Shootout) Nov. 24, 2012 * Las Vegas, Nev. * South Point Arena

Five Gators produced a double-figure scoring effort and Florida contained a dangerous three-point shooting team to earn a 80-63 win against Northern Iowa on Saturday in the second day of action at the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout at the South Point Arena in Las Vegas. The Gators (5-1) won their third consecutive game by hitting 51.6 percent (33-64) of its shots from the floor and a steady 10-of-14 from the free throw line. Florida also limited the Panthers (2-3) to a 31.8 percent (7-22) mark from the three-point arc and held a 38-30 rebounding edge. The Gators forced 16 turnovers and converted those into 13 points.

Florida did committed 15 miscues, but UNI managed only four points off them. The Gators also held a 10-0 margin in fastbreak points.

"I thought this was a really solid team win," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "There are certainly areas where we have to improve. I thought we could have done a better job of defending the drive, but all and all we beat a very good team that poses some unique challenges to us, especially on defense. We had some spurts when we looked great and other spots that we have to fix. But again, that's why you play such a challenging schedule this early in the season so you can find out what you do well and what you can't do well yet so you still have practices to fix it."

Freshman Carlie Needles scored a team-best 14 points, on 5-of-8 shooting that included a 3-of-6 effort from the three-point arc, while freshman January Miller scored a career-high 12 points, hitting 6-of-8 from the floor and collecting four offensive rebounds.

Senior Naismith Player of the Year Candidate Jennifer George scored 12 points with five rebounds despite foul trouble for the entire game. Sophomore Kayla Lewis was close to a double-double with 11 points and a team-leading eight rebounds and junior Jaterra Bonds added 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting, while dishing five assists.

For the fourth time this season, freshman Sydney Moss flirted with a triple-double, as she recorded eight points, seven assists and six rebounds along with four steals.

UNI scored the first points of the game, but Florida answered with a 9-2 run and held an early 9-4 lead, as Lily Svete hit a three-pointer to begin the Gator scoring, followed by Jaterra Bond's layup after a steal and outlet from Sydney Moss and a pair of inside jumpers from Jennifer George, who picked up two fouls during the opening 5:32 and went to the bench for the majority of the half.

Game 7: Arizona State 74, Florida 58 (South Point Thanksgiving Shootout) Nov. 25, 2012 * Las Vegas, Nev. * South Point Arena

Florida's defense that had been a staple in its first two victories at the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout didn't produce and the Gators lost to Arizona State, 74-58, on Saturday in the third and final day of action held at the South Point Arena in Las Vegas.

Arizona State (2-3) shot a blistering and UF-opponent season-best 58.2 percent (32-55) during the game, while the Gators (5-2) managed to hit just 30.6 percent (19-62) from the floor, including a season-low 25 percent effort (8-32) in the first half, falling behind 35-22 at the break.

"Arizona State came to play right from the get-go and established who the more dominate team was and we fell in line with that, unfortunately," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We didn't do very much to change or shift their momentum except for a little fight here in the second half. It's a game that we really have to learn from. We made a lot of critical errors and most of them were defensive."

ASU scored the first points of the second half with another inside bucket and the teams traded scores for the first four minutes of the period, with the Sun Devils lead alternating between 13 and 15 points.

Sydney Moss hit one free throw with 16:08 remaining and Jennifer George followed with two more and a tough inside jumper to start a 9-2 run with Jatterra Bonds and George hitting driving layups and cut their deficit to eight points, 45-37, with 12:53 remaining.

Florida had additional chances to get even closer, but missed several short jumpers under the basket and made a number of uncontested turnovers that allowed ASU a 10-3 run, as the Sun Devils took a 57-42 lead with 8:35 on the clock and the Gators never recovered.

The Gators went to the free throw line a season-high 26 times and made 19 of their attempts, but that wasn't the game plan.

George and Bonds finished with 11 points each to lead Florida, with George collecting a game-high nine rebounds and four steals, but connected on just 3-of-12 shots from the floor. Bonds corralled a season-best six rebounds and dished a team-high three assists.

Redshirt-freshman Carrie Needles, who was named to the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout-All-Tournament Team, finished with eight points. Moss chipped in nine points and five rebounds, while Christin Mercer also added nine points.

Florida struggled with its shot early, missing 10 of its first 11 shots from the floor and fell behind 14-4, with only Christin Mercer able to connect from the floor and Lily Svete converted two free throws during the opening five-plus minutes.

Meanwhile the Sun Devils were 9-of-14 in the first 9:51 of the game that helped them sprint to an 18-7 lead, as ASU dominated the inside game.

ASU increased its lead to 14 points, 24-10, with 6:37 remaining in the first half when the Gators showed some life and marched off the next six points with Bonds, Vicky McIntyre and Moss connecting from the floor and brought the deficit to eight, 24-16, with 3:03 to go in the first half.

The Sun Devils came right back with 9-2 run with the aid of two three-pointers and pushed its lead to 33-18, with 47 seconds remaining.

McIntyre stopped the march with an eight-footer and Needles hit two free throws that brought Florida to within 11 points with 6.2 seconds on the clock. The Gators then intercepted ASU's long in-bounds pass, but immediately turned it over, as the Sun Devils capitalized by hitting yet another layup, this one at the buzzer, and took a 35-22 halftime advantage.

Florida shot a season-low 25 percent (8-32) in the first half and committed 11 turnovers that ASU converted into 15 points. The Sun Devils hit 57.1 percent (16-28) in the opening frame with 26 points coming in the paint compared to just 10 for the Gators.

The Gators tallied a season-low 22 first-half points, seven points lower than in any other half this year. Seven different players scoring during the first half, with Carrie Needles' five points leading the group. Jennifer George corralled six rebounds to lead UF's 24-13 advantage on the boards.

Game 8: Michigan 59, Florida 53 December 1, 2012 * Ann Arbor, Mich. * Crisler Center

Jennifer George scored 15 points with nine rebounds, but it wasn't enough for Florida to overcome a woeful second-half shooting effort in a 59-53 loss at Michigan at the Crisler Center Saturday afternoon.

The Gators (5-3), who dropped their second consecutive game, connected on just 21.6 percent (8-of-37) from the floor during the final 20 minutes and a season-low 30.3 percent (20-66) overall. It seemed the majority of U-M's shot attempts came with 10 or fewer seconds on the shot clock.

"That's typically how they play," UF head coach Amanda Butler shared about Michigan's offensive attack. "They like a low possession ball game and we didn't do a good job defensively of maintaining our focus. I felt like we would put a lot of pressure on them and then we would have a breakdown with 10 seconds left. It's got to be the other way around. Those last 10 seconds, your defense needs to get tighter and sharper."

After Lily Svete nailed a three-pointer in the opening seconds of the second half, Michigan (6-2) ripped off 10 consecutive points and sparked a 22-7 run that reversed a 35-27 Gator lead into a 49-42 Wolverine advantage over a 10-minute span.

The Gators finally scored on consecutive possessions when Carrie Needles dropped in a layup off a Christin Mercer steal and Jennifer George put in an offensive rebound and cut Florida's deficit to three points, 49-46, with 7:54 remaining. U-M came right back with the next four points of the game and increased its lead back to seven, 53-48, with 2:31 remaining in the game.

Svete buried a three-pointer from the left corner and had UF within four points with 2:18 on the clock, but the Wolverines made good on their trips free throw line, where they

Game 9: Florida 87, Troy 62

December 4, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Florida used big scoring nights from a pair of freshmen along with the combination of crisp outside shooting and a strong post presence to defeat Troy, 87-62, at the O'Connell Center on Tuesday night.

Rookies Carlie Needles and Sydney Moss each scored 18 points in a myriad of ways to combine for 36 points with the pair reaching double-figures in the first half alone as they scored a combined 21 points in the game's first 20 minutes and helped UF to a 44-36 lead at the break.

Jennifer George posted her first double-double of the season and the 20th of her career, as she contributed 14 points and a season-high 12 rebounds, while junior transfer Vicky McIntyre also recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds, her first double-double as a Gator and the third one of her career.

Redshirt-junior Lily Svete scored a career-high 14 points and led the Gators with four of the team's seven three-point baskets, as Florida drilled 7-of-11 from long range, as well as 52.5 percent (31-59) overall from the floor en route to its highest scoring output of the season.

"I thought it was great balance," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We've got a lot of people that can be threatening. I thought offensively we did a really good job of working well together, but everyone individually took their shots at the right time. I thought we had great teamwork and great shot selection. For the most part we knocked most of them down, but that was because they were good shots."

After Troy opened the second half with a three-point bucket and cut UF's lead to five, 44-39, the Gators responded with a quick 9-0 run that became an 18-4 spurt, as Florida got stronger during the opening minutes of the second half and held a 64-43 lead with 10:41 remaining.

Florida, which outscored its visitors 43-26 in the second half, also took advantage of its size against Troy (1-6) and outscored the Trojans, 40-20, in the paint.

With a fast-paced offense from the start, the Gators jumped out to a 14-6 lead with a pair of three-point baskets, a couple of easy buckets from McIntyre and six points from Moss, who finished with a game-high five assists.

After trading a couple of baskets from beyond the arc, the Gators (6-3) used their size to their advantage as McIntyre and Moss combined for 11 of Florida's first 17 points with nine of those points coming from inside the paint.

With the Gators leading 18-14 and 9:44 remaining in the first half, Svete made back-to-back three-pointers and McIntyre put in another shot down low and give Florida a nine-point advantage.

Florida made their three-point attempts count in the first half by making 5-of-7 from behind the arc and nearly 52 percent from the field.

George was quiet early on, but after making a layup with 6:23 until the half, the Gators' lone senior reeled off a total of seven points and pulled down five rebounds to put Florida out front 44-36 heading into the break.

Florida's four-player bench made its presence felt early on by accounting for 23 of 44 first-half points and finished with 45 points.

The Gators kept fighting on every play against a Troy team that continuously made five-person substitutions in an effort to keep up with Florida's up-tempo offensive attack.

Florida withstood a three-point barrage from the Trojans, who attempted 18 three-point field goals in the first half and 34 overall with the Gator defense allowing Troy to connect on nine for the game.

Senior Jennifer George scored her 1,000th career point and the Gators used a balanced offensive attack and made their free throws in the final minute to defeat Pacific, 89-82, in the O'Connell Center Friday night.

Florida (7-3) took down a Pacific team that had arrived in Gainesville as one of 17 undefeated NCAA Division I women's basketball teams in the country, but an evenly distributed offense and persistent defensive pressure by the Gators from the start was too much for Pacific to overcome. The Gators, however did need all 40 minutes to post their 11th consecutive home victory, as well as their 12th straight home win versus non-conference opponents.

The two teams remained close early, as both sides fought hard on each possession, until George and a fast-paced Gator offensive attack jumped out front and gave Florida a 43-29 advantage at the break.

The Tigers (7-1) showed why they had won seven consecutive games to start the season, as they battled back from a 21-point deficit with 6:15 remaining and trimmed Florida's lead to five, 81-76, with 1:53 seconds remaining.

Freshman Sydney Moss found George inside and she converted the bucket to step a four-point run by Pacific, as Kendall Kenyon missed a layup on the Tiger's ensuing offensive possession and Pacific sent the Gators to the free throw line for the final 1:14 of the game.

Florida came through by sinking 6-of-14, including a 4-for-6 effort from junior Jaterra Bonds, during the last 74 seconds, as the Tigers continued to battle until the final hour.

"A really good win, it was a really good win," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "I think that team

Senior Jennifer George totaled 19 points and 11 rebounds and Florida captured the 74-50 victory against La Salle at Tom Gola Arena for its first road win of the season.
George's double-double was her third straight, as the Preseason Naismith Candidate, who has totaled 12 in her career, converted 9-of-12 shots from the floor.
Jaterra Bonds tallied 13 points with five assists for her sixth double-figure scoring game this year, while redshirt-freshman Carlie Needles added 12 points, all off of a 4-of-7 three-point effort, along with four assists and two steals. Freshman Sydney Moss traded a handful of short-range shots for assists, as she finished with a game-high six to accompany her seven rebounds and helped Florida to the 41-36 edge on the boards.
"I thought there were moments when we had some great individual performances, but there were also moments where we struggled with consistency and our toughness," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "When we had some folks who got determined and made up their minds they stepped up and made some tough plays. Lily Svete was one of those players. She came through in a couple of moments that were really important to us. January Miller was another player who played tough and hard. Jaterra, especially in the first half, really propelled us to that lead we took into the locker room."
Svete finished the game with seven points and three rebounds, while Miller added six points, two rebounds and two assists.
Florida scored the final 10 points of the first half, but it was La Salle that came out firing in the second, netting the first 12 points and cutting the Gator's 19-point lead to seven, 35-28, with 15:35 remaining.
Kayla Lewis came out of a Florida timeout and immediately nailed a deep field goal to halt the spree and added two free throws that gave Florida a 39-28 lead.
The Gators played solid defense on the next possession, but La Salle's Chanel Harrison tossed up a three-pointer as the shot clock horn sounded and the hosts were back in business, as they followed with a pair of three throws and cut UF's lead to six points, 39-33, with 12:31 to play.
Florida then turned to its inside game, where Vicky McIntyre connected on a pair of field goals that ignited a 13-0 run and Florida again assumed a 19-point advantage, 52-33, with 8:19 remaining. Bonds converted a pair of layups during the march, the first one coming off a Moss steal and behind-the-back dish, and second her sixth three-point play of the season, while George provided the final two field goals.
The teams traded scores for the rest of the contest and Florida (8-3) notched its first three-game win streak of the season.
George converted her first nine shots from the floor during the game and helped Florida hit 48.4 percent (30-62) overall from the floor.
The Gators sank 7-of-16 from the three-point arc, the third time the team hit at least seven from long range this year. Needles led the way with four from deep, while Bonds hit both of her long attempts and Svete canned one from the top of the arc during a key moment in the second half.
Harrison led La Salle (1-9) with 15 points, while Brittany Wilson added 14 points for the Explorers, who hit just 28.8 percent from the floor overall during the game, but it was an improvement from the first 20 minutes. The Gator defense stepped up in the first half when La Salle converted just 18.5 percent (5-27) of its attempts and Florida held a 22-16 rebounding advantage while shooting 50 percent (14-28) overall from the floor.
Ebonee Jones hit a three-pointer that brought the Explorers within nine points, 23-14, with 6:11 remaining in the half, but that was La Salle's final field goal of the period as it managed just two points from the free throw line for the remainder of the game. Florida capped the half by scoring the final 10 points, with McIntyre converting an inside feed from Moss. George sinking her seventh field goal of the half for a team-leading 14 points and Bonds drilling a pair of three-pointers, including the final one at the buzzer for the 19-point halftime cushion.

Redshirt junior Lily Svete and freshmen Christin Mercer and January Miller each posted a career-high scoring night as five Gators contributed a double-figure scoring effort in Florida's 88-38 win over Savannah State Thursday night to cap the first day of the Gator Holiday Classic.
In addition to Svete's and Miller's 15 points and Mercer's 14-point night, Sydney Moss scored a game-high 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting with eight rebounds, six assists and two steals.
Preseason Naismith Candidate and UF's lone senior Jennifer George added 14 points and 11 rebounds for her fourth consecutive double-double, the 23rd of her career. It was also George's 50th double-figure scoring game of her Gator career.
It wasn't just a big night for Svete and company as UF got well-balanced contribution from a variety of sources. Not only was Florida shooting well from the field as a team, 35-of-74 (47%), but defensively, UF caused chaos towards Savannah State's offense, as the Gators caused 21 turnovers which led to 20 points.
For Svete, it was her three-point game that ended up being the dagger for Savannah State. The Gator junior drained 5-of-10 from behind the arc. At one point in the second half, Svete sank three straight long balls as Florida poured it on and built led by as many as 57 points with just over three minutes to play.
The defensive effort went hand-in-hand with the balanced scoring, as it was the third time this season that five Gators had double-digit point totals.
The Gators got off to quite the start in the first 10 minutes of play with a 21-3 run to open things wide open. Strong defense along with timely rebounding allowed UF to get on the fast break and score in bunches. After solid inside play from Moss and George to take the early 4-1 lead, the Orange and Blue moved out beyond the arc and got two straight threes from Svete and Miller. For Miller it was her first made three-pointer of her career.
The scoring barrage continued from there as both Miller and Moss practically traded baskets between each other on the backs of the strong Gator defense to give Florida the 21-3 lead by the midway point in the first half. With 10 minutes still to go in the half, Florida was holding Savannah State to just 15 percent shooting from the field.
Tough defense remained the theme for the remainder of the frame as Florida caused 16 Savannah State turnovers and scored 13 points off those turnovers, but it was the performance from the bench players that really set the tone. 26 of Florida's 37 first half points all came off the bench. Moss actually led all scorers at the half with 10 points off the bench, followed by Miller with nine points and Mercer with seven.
As for the starters, Svete and George contributed 10 points together with all six of Svete's points coming from three-point land. The balanced scoring worked perfectly for UF heading into the locker room at half as it held a solid 37-13 lead.
The 13 points scored by Savannah St. were the fifth fewest by a UF opponent in a half in program history as the Tigers could only muster 5-of-20 (25%) from the field against the extremely quick Gator defense. Tiger junior Ezinne Kalu, the team's leading scorer, left the court with an injury just 3:31 into the contest and was unable to return.
As the second half began, it was much like how the first half ended as Florida went right back to the same strategy that worked for them earlier. Nine straight points by the Gators were scored before Savannah State made its first bucket of the second half, a drought of almost five minutes. The closest the Tigers ever got to the Gators for the rest of the night was a 24 point difference right at the 15:00 minute mark of the second half before UF ripped off 15 straight points to break the game open even more to a 59-20 lead with 11:45 to play. From there, it was a matter of how high could the Gators go. The largest lead of 57 points was reached at the 3:07 mark of the second half after a fast-break layup by Moss. Savannah State did get the difference back into the 40's, but a final free throw by junior Vicky McIntyre, who collected 10 rebounds with seven points, kept Florida right at the 50-point-lead mark at the final buzzer.

Game 13: Florida vs. Central Michigan (Gator Holiday Classic) December 21, 2012 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Kayla Lewis scored a career-high 18 points and guided Florida to an 81-75 victory over Central Michigan in the championship game of the Gator Holiday Classic on Friday night in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. Freshman Sydney Moss was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player after helping Florida withstand an intense late rally by the Chippewas, who whittled the Gator's 17-point lead with 5:50 remaining down to six with 2:06 on the clock.

With Florida (10-3) clinging to a 76-70 lead, senior Jennifer George, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, converted a tough inside bucket. CMU missed on its next possession, but the Gators turned the ball over and that same sequence happened on the next trip down the court, as the Gators committed three turnovers in a 54-second span with Jalisa Olive finally able to make UF pay as she converted layup and had CMU within six points, 78-72, with 27 seconds remaining.

The Chippewas (5-5) then fouled Carlie Needles, who converted 3-of-4 free throws over the next 13 seconds and gave Florida an 81-72 lead with 10 seconds left. CMU's Jessica Green knocked down a three-pointer with four seconds remaining to cap the game's scoring, as Florida captured its third consecutive Gator Holiday Classic title, as well as its 18th in the 21 times the event has crowned a team champion.

Lewis collected a double-double for the second time this season and in her career, pulling down 10 boards to go along with her 18 points, shooting 8-of-13 from the floor. Moss scored 16 points in the title game after netting a game-high 17 points on Thursday.

Coming out of the half, Lewis collected back-to-back buckets with a layup coming off an in-bound play, and a corner jumper to extend the Gator lead, 40-28. CMU's Jessica Green and Crystal Bradford combined for six points at the 15:06 mark to cut the Gator lead to nine. Needles answered with a jumper in the lane, but Central Michigan was able to enhance their pressure in the backcourt on the Gators and force turnovers.

Jessica Schroll, who finished with 15 points on the night and a spot on the All-Tournament Team, laid in a shot to cut the Florida lead to seven, 46-39. With an intense period of scrappy play, Bradford, who tallied 10 points for Central Michigan, nailed a three to draw the Chippewas within striking distance of the Gators.

After the Gators found their way to the free throw line for the first time in the game at the 13:14 mark, CMU's Taylor Johnson, who ended the night with 11 points, converted on a layup to cut the lead to the smallest it had been all evening, 49-46. UF fired back with an eight-point run thanks to two lay-ins by George, another trey from redshirt junior Lily Svete and a free throw from Moss.

Junior Jatterra Bonds was having a solid game until she was whittled for two offensive fouls and earned a technical foul in a three-second span, and with 7:59 remaining fouled out of the game for the first time in her collegiate career. Bonds went to the bench with 15 points on 7-of-8 shooting with eight assists and five rebounds.

The momentum easily could have shifted in Central Michigan's favor with Florida's floor general unable to return to action. The Chippewas, however, were only able to convert on 1-of-3 free throws on the Bonds' foul calls and Florida held a 59-51 lead.

That's when Moss stepped up her game, scoring seven points in a 2:09 span.

Needles came up with a steal and Moss launched a desperation three-pointer which found the bottom of the net as the shot clock expired. Moss then drove and finished in the lane and Lewis connected on another inbounds play to put the Florida lead at 68-53 with 6:14 remaining.

Free throws also came into play in the closing 6:18 of the contest and Florida stepped up and converted 9-of-12, with makes from Moss, George, Needles and January Miller.

The Chippewas managed to give the Gators a scare in the final three minutes as they went on a 12-6 run, getting a pair of layups and three-pointers from Green, who finished with 12 points.

Florida shot a season-best 55.4 percent (31-56) from the floor during the game, including a 6-of-15 effort from the three-point arc and 13-of-19 showing from the free throw line. The Gators also held a 39-32 rebound edge, but committed a season-high 29 turnover that led to 25 points.

Game 15: #6 Kentucky 76, Florida 69 January 3, 2013 * Lexington, Ky. * Memorial Coliseum

Jaterra Bonds scored a season-high 21 points, freshman January Miller scored career-best 17 points and senior Jennifer George posted her 25th career double-double but Florida fell just short at sixth-ranked and preseason Southeastern Conference favorite Kentucky, 76-69, on Thursday in the league opener for both teams.

The Gators (11-4, 0-1 SEC) were within two points, 60-58, with 6:03 remaining but went cold from the floor, missing their next six shots and the Wildcats (13-1, 1-0 SEC) took advantage by scoring six straight points and led 66-58 with 3:18 remaining.

Kayla Lewis ended the run with an inside jumper, but the teams traded scores and Florida's deficit alternated between six and eight points for the next couple of minutes and couldn't string back-to-back scoring opportunities until Bonds converted two free throws and George hit an inside bucket with 21 seconds remaining that brought the Gators within four, 72-68.

UK made 4-of-6 free throws in the final 20 seconds to secure its 30th consecutive win in Memorial Coliseum, as well as its program-record 12th straight overall.

Bonds tied a program-record by hitting 11-of-11 free throws en route to her game-high of offensive output, while Miller hit 5-of-7 from the floor, including 2-of-3 three-pointers with 5-of-6 from the line. George recorded 14 points, a game-high 11 rebounds with a game-high three steals for the Gators, who committed just three turnovers in the second half after 16 in the opening 20 minutes of the game. Florida held a 40-36 rebounding edge.

UK entered the game leading the nation in turnover margin at +12.9, having forced at least 21 turnovers in every game this year while averaging 15.8 per game. The Wildcats committed 16 miscues overall, but just four in the second half.

A'dia Mathies, the 2012 SEC Player of the Year and the 2013 preseason favorite, scored 20 points for UK to lead four Wildcats in double-figure scoring. Junior transfer DeNesha Stallworth posted 17 points and 10 rebounds for UK, which shot 43.5 percent and hit 9-of-23 three-pointers.

Kentucky scored the last five points of the first half and carried that momentum into the second where they scored the first seven points and took a 46-35 lead. Florida calmly answered with the next six points that started a 12-2 run and the Gators were within one point, 48-47, with 13:29 remaining. Bria Goss, last year's SEC Freshman of the Year, halted the run with a jumper and Jennifer O'Neill followed with a pair of 3-pointers that had the Wildcat lead back to nine with 9:55 on the clock.

Vicky McIntyre hit two more free throws for UF before O'Neill hit a deep jumper and again UK's lead was at nine points, 58-49, with 9:21 remaining. Miller drove hard to the hoop and was fouled and converted two free throws before nailing her second 3-pointer to spark a 6-0 spurt that had Florida within two, 58-56, with 6:54 remaining.

Stallworth hit a jumper, but George answered with a tough inside shot and Florida was again within two points, 60-58, with 6:03 on the clock. Florida went cold from the floor, missing its next six shots, as UK scored six straight points and led 66-58 with 3:18 remaining. Lewis ended the run with an inside jumper, but the teams traded scores and Florida's deficit alternated between six and eight points for the next couple of minutes.

To the disappointment of a huge hometown crowd that made the trip from nearby Union, Ky., freshman Sydney Moss, was whistled for her fourth personal foul with 10:21 remaining and struggled all night in what was her toughest collegiate showing to date.

The Gators committed a turnover on their first two possessions and Kentucky took advantage both times with buckets. Florida managed a shot on its next two offensive trips down the court, but missed and the Wildcats collected the rebound. After two more UK points from the free throw line, Bonds finally got the Gators on the scoreboard with an eight-foot jumper from the side 2:50 into the game. The Wildcats came back with a three-pointer and stretched their early lead to seven points, but Florida regrouped with the next four, as Christin Mercer connected on a tough inside jumper and Bonds converted a pair of free throws and brought the Gators within three.

Jaterra Bonds scored a game-high 19 points, senior Jennifer George collected her 26th career double-double and Florida defeated LSU, 77-72, to earn its first Southeastern Conference victory in a thriller manner on Sunday afternoon in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

With LSU (10-5, 1-1 SEC) leading by nine points, 58-49, with 11:46 remaining, the Gators (12-4, 1-1 SEC) scored 11 consecutive points in a two-minute span and took a two-point lead with 9:08 left in the game.

Freshman Sydney Moss put back an offensive rebound to start the march, before redshirt-sophomore Kayla Lewis nailed just her fifth three-pointer of the season. Freshman January Miller came up with a steal and dish to Bonds, who made the layup and tied the game at 58-all. Moss then secured a defensive rebound and found a Lewis down court and she made the layup to give Florida its first lead since the 10:16 mark of the first half.

The Lady Tigers, who committed two of their 15 turnovers during Florida's run, halted the spree with a layup by Shanece McKinney that produced the fourth tied score of the game.

Theresa Plaisance tacked on two more for LSU inside and swung the lead back in the visitor's favor, as there were three lead changes and four tied scores in the final 9:31 of the contest.

George then converted both ends of a one-and-one from the free throw line with 6:09 remaining, bringing the Gators within one, 62-61.

George blocked Adrienne Webb's shot and collected a defense rebound with 5:06 remaining, but injured her shoulder on the play and would not return to the court after having a strong performance of 15 points, 11 rebounds, three assists and two steals, including her seventh double-double of the season.

Junior Vicky McIntyre stepped in for George at the line and made both ends of her one-and-one trip that gave Florida a 64-62 lead.

LSU came right back with an inside bucket from Danielle Ballard, but Moss calmly nailed two free throws with 3:53 on the clock and Florida would not trail again, as Lewis scored the next four points of the game and gave the Gators a 70-64 advantage with 2:51 remaining.

LSU closed within three points three times in the last 51 seconds, but Bonds answered with a driving, athletic bucket the first time with 29 seconds remaining. McKinney came back with a score and the Tigers forced a turnover with 20 seconds remaining and had the ball with a chance to tie, but 5-foot-6 redshirt-freshman Carlie Needles came up with the first blocked shot of her career, swatting Adrienne Webb's three-point attempt, then collected the miss and was fouled. She then converted two free throws that gave Florida a 75-70 lead with 12 seconds left.

Webb did hit a shot from inside the arc with four ticks and LSU fouled Bonds, who drilled two more from the line and ended the game's scoring, helping Florida capture its 15th consecutive home victory, as well as present head coach Amanda Butler with the 150th win of her eight-year overall tenure.

Bonds also dished a game-high five assists with three steals for the Gators, while Lewis added 10 points and six rebounds.

Game 17: Florida 61, Mississippi State 55

January 10, 2013 * Starkville, Miss. * Humphrey Coliseum

Jaterra Bonds scored 17 points and the Gator's post players stepped up and helped Florida earn a 61-55 victory against Mississippi State at Humphrey Coliseum on Thursday evening.

Kayla Lewis scored 12 points with nine rebounds, Sydney Moss scored 10 points with nine boards and Vicky McIntyre contributed 10 points, eight rebounds and four blocked shots for the Gators who earned their first SEC road victory of the year.

It was a tight ballgame throughout with Florida's largest lead of the contest was nine points twice, as the Bulldogs quickly answered both times.

With the Gators (13-4, 2-1 SEC) holding a 51-42 lead with 8:30 remaining, MSU ripped off a 10-0 run behind a pair of three-pointers from Kendra Grant, who finished with a game-high 23 points, and took a 52-51 lead with 4:30 remaining.

Bonds answered 25 seconds later with a driving layup through traffic and started a game-ending 10-3 run that included six points from the free throw line.

Throughout the game Florida would score on more consecutive possessions, however, the Gators had several of those from the free throw line and came away with one point.

MSU entered the game with a tendency of sending its opponent to the free throw line, with their previous two foes making a combined 75 trips. Thursday's game continued that trend, as Florida attempted 39 shots from the charity stripe and made 25, with eight different Gators finding their way to the line paced by Bonds, who converted 8-of-10.

With Florida leading 57-55, Bonds was fouled with 57.8 seconds remaining, but came up with blood on her arm and needed to be subbed out. Freshman January Miller came in a made the first and missed the second, but Moss grabbed her eighth rebound of the game and the Gators maintained possession.

Moss dishd to Carlie Needles, who was immediately fouled. Needles converted one of two and Florida held a 60-55 lead with 51.8 seconds remaining. MSU missed its shot on its next offensive possession and Moss came away with the board, where she again found Needles, who hit one of two and the Gators held the 61-55 edge with 27 seconds left.

The Bulldogs were able to get off just one shot in the final seconds that went awry.

Florida committed 19 turnovers that MSU converted into 22 points, but held a commanding 47-30 rebounding advantage in the game.

McIntyre scored the first points of the second half and gave Florida a 32-25 lead and similar to the start of the game, the teams traded scores, with MSU within four points before the Gators scored four straight and took a 38-30 advantage.

The Gators used their sixth different starting lineup of the year, having to replace Jennifer George, who suffered a shoulder injury against LSU on Sunday. George, UF's leading scorer and rebounder, played a limited role on Thursday.

Florida's other post players rallied for George, who did play in spurts, as Lewis stepped up with seven points and four rebounds in the first half, McIntyre added four points and Christin Mercer chipped in three points and two rebounds.

Neither team shot the ball well to begin the game, as UF made just one of its first four, but better than MSU's 1-of-6 effort. McIntyre, who got her second start of the year, scored the first points of the game before Bonds added two free throws. The teams traded scores for the next few minutes when both teams continued to struggle with their respective shots. McIntyre's second bucket of the game sparked a 7-0 run, as Lewis scored five straight and UF held an early 14-5 lead.

"I was really proud of the way Vicky played," Butler praised. "She was a difference-maker tonight. She knew she had to be and really stepped up and made the plays we expected her to make. Those blocks were huge. Her rebounds were huge. It was a really, really good all-around game for Mac and a great confidence builder for her going forward."

MSU came right back with a 13-3 march and tied the score at 18-all with 6:31 remaining. Mercer completed her fourth 3-point play of the year during the run, as the Bulldogs began to find their stroke.

Game 18: #9 Tennessee 78, Florida 75 - OVERTIME

January 13, 2013 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Jaterra Bonds scored 18 points and Florida nearly overcame the absence of senior All-American Jennifer George, who missed the final 29 minutes, but ninth-ranked Tennessee converted 4-of-6 free throws in overtime to escape the O'Connell Center with a 78-75 victory over the Gators.

The game remained close throughout, with the largest lead being nine points by Tennessee early in the second half. The score was tied six times - twice during overtime - and there were seven lead changes, including three in the overtime frame.

UT struck first in the extra period, as Isabelle Harrison converted an inside layup 11 seconds into overtime. Redshirt-sophomore Kayla Lewis, who finished with 11 rebounds and five points, connected on one free throw before freshman Christin Mercer hit jumper in the paint and gave Florida a 73-72 lead with 2:24 remaining.

The Vols then connected on one from the charity stripe and evened the game, but Bonds came right back with a layup and the Gators held a 75-73 lead with 1:23 to go.

Meighan Simmons, who finished with a game-high 27 points, answered with a jumper 11 seconds later. Florida had two shots at the basket during its next offensive possession, but neither would fall and UT went back to the line where Kamiko Williams connected on one more that gave the Vols the 76-75 lead with 27 seconds remaining.

Florida called a timeout with 16.9 left in the overtime period and after the inbounds, Mercer was fouled on her shot and went to the line to shoot two. She missed both and a foul on the rebound sent Tennessee's Bashaara Graves to the line where connected on both and gave the visitors the three-point advantage.

The Gators had one final chance to tie the game, but Lewis' three-point attempt bounced off the side of the rim and Florida had its 15-game home winning streak come to an end.

With Tennessee holding a 53-44 lead with 16:02 remaining in regulation, Bonds drilled a jumper and ignited a 13-5 run over the next 6:39 and Florida was within one point, 58-57, with 9:23 remaining. Four different Gators (13-5, 2-2 SEC) scored during the run, with Bonds accounting for four points, Mercer for three, Lewis with two and freshman January Miller, who finished with 11 points, contributed a gutsy jumper for two.

Tennessee scored the next four points and held a five-point lead with 7:45 on the clock and teams traded scores for the next 36 seconds before Florida staged a 7-0 run, as Bonds canned a three-pointer, junior Vicky McIntyre connected on a shot from the paint and Bonds capped the spree with another jumper at 4:27 that gave Florida a 66-64 lead, its first since the 14:09 mark of the first half.

The Vols (13-3, 4-0 SEC) came back with three free throws and a bucket from Simmons and regained a three-point edge. Freshman Sydney Moss, who finished with seven points and nine rebounds, hit a tough jumper and then found Miller with nailed a bucket with 29 seconds remaining that gave Florida a 70-69 lead. Graves hit one free throw for UT and evened the score with 13 seconds left in regulation. Florida had one last chance to win the game before overtime, but Bonds wasn't able to get off a clean shot and the game entered an extra period.

Also scoring in double-figures for the Gators was redshirt-freshman Carlie Needles, who added 11 points, connecting on 3-of-8 from the three-point arc while playing a career-long 39 minutes for the Gators, who outrebound Tennessee 48-41 and shot 43.2 percent (32-74) from the field, but connected on just 6-of-13 free throws.

Graves had 17 points and 12 rebounds for Tennessee, while Ariel Massengale added 12 and Isabelle Harrison chipped in 10 points with nine rebounds for the Vols, who hit 39.4 percent from the field and 16-of-22 (72.7%) from the charity stripe.

Florida's bench proved to be huge in the game with George going down with 3:56 remaining in the first half after reinjuring her shoulder. It scored 33 points, outscoring the Volunteers' bench that tallied three points.

Game 18: #19/18 South Carolina 52, Florida 44

January 20, 2013 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

With Florida's leading scorer and rebounder Jennifer George unable to play because of injury, No. 19/18 South Carolina took advantage on the boards and captured a 52-44 decision over the Gators on Sunday at the O'Connell Center.

Appearing on the floor for the first time since the heartbreaking 78-75 overtime loss to ninth-ranked Tennessee last Sunday, the Gators (13-6, 2-3 SEC) were flat on offense from the start, hitting just one of their first 14 shots from the floor, as the Gamecocks (16-3, 4-2 SEC) jumped out to an early eight-point lead and were ahead by as many as 11 in the first half, maintaining a lead for the entire game.

Florida shot a season-low 29.8 percent (17-57) from the floor during the game, while South Carolina hit a mere 23.4 percent (15-64), the lowest by a Gator opponent this season, but overcame its inept shooting performance with a commanding 59-41 rebounding advantage that included 26 on the offensive end.

The rebounding margin was the worst deficit of the year for the Gators, who had entered the game having out-rebounded its last 13 opponents and had lost the battle just three times.

After Vicky McIntyre connected on an eight-foot jumper at the 17:15 mark of the first half, the Gators went cold from the floor, missing 10 consecutive attempts over the next 6:32, hitting a woeful 1-of-14 as South Carolina went on an 8-0 run. Jatterra Bonds, who finished with a game-high 16 points, ended the drought with a tough layup at 10:33 remaining and pulled Florida to within six points, 12-6. The Gators then missed their next five shots, as the Gamecocks took a 17-6 lead with 8:43 remaining.

The teams traded scores for the rest of the half and South Carolina carried a 24-17 halftime advantage, as UF hit just 23.1 percent (6-26) during those first 20 minutes and South Carolina just 24.2 percent (8-33), but enjoyed its 29-18 rebounding edge, scoring six second-chance points while Florida was unable to capitalize on any.

The Gators came out with energy in the second half, cutting their deficit to three twice from a layup by Bonds and triple from Lily Svete.

Bonds tied the game at 35-all with 12:14 remaining, but Khadijah Session came right back with her third three-pointer of the game and gave SC the 38-35 lead with 11:51 left in the game.

Florida attempted and missed its only shot on its next three offensive possessions, as South Carolina capitalized with inside buckets from Ashley Brunner and Aleighsa Welch along with one free throw from Welch and the Gamecock's lead was back to eight, 43-35, with 10:42 remaining.

The Gators had a chance to stop the run, but Needles couldn't connect from the free throw line. UF maintained possession but again missed its shot and USC came away with the rebound and Bruner hit the fastbreak layup that gave the visitors a 45-35 lead with 9:39 on the clock.

Florida called a timeout after SC's 2:10 scoring outburst and McIntyre was able to halt the march with a layup inside with 9:23 remaining.

Sydney Moss, who finished with six points and tied for a team-high eight rebounds, then converted one-of-two from the line and Florida cut its deficit to seven points, 45-38. USC took its turn from the free throw line, where it missed both, but collected the offensive board, however, was unable to convert and gave the Gators another chance to inch closer. Both teams missed shots on their next two ensuing possessions and Florida was unable to make up any ground.

USC was called for offensive foul with 48.8 seconds remaining while holding a 45-42 lead.

Florida took possession but January Miller's three-pointer was off the mark and SC got the rebound, where Bruner was fouled on a layup attempt. She made the first and missed the second, but a lane violation game gave third try, where she missed it again with 31.4 seconds left, however, Welch collected the loose ball and SC called a timeout with 29.7 second on the clock and a 46-42 lead. The Gators were forced to foul quickly and tapped Sessions, who hit the first and missed the second. Lewis corralled the miss and Moss quickly answered with a layup for the Gators with 19.3 ticks left, as Florida called an immediate timeout, down 47-44.

Mitchell then went to the line and hit both free throws and the Gators missed their ensuing shot attempt. Bruner was then fouled and missed the first but made the second to give USC a 50-44 lead with seven seconds remaining and Session's capped the game's scoring with two more from the line for the Gamecocks, who didn't convert a field goal in the final 9:39 of the game.

Game 20: Ole Miss 88, Florida 81

January 24, 2013 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Ole Miss nailed a season-best 11-of-16 three-pointers and staved off Florida's second-half rally and defeated the Gators 88-81 at the O'Connell Center Thursday evening. The loss was the third straight at home for the Gators, who had won 15 consecutive in Gainesville prior to this current slide, while Ole Miss halted a five-game losing streak. UF led by as many as 17 points, but the Gators were able to cut their deficit to three points, 76-73, with 3:30 left in regulation, but couldn't overtake the hot-shooting Rebels though and lost their sixth SEC game by eight points or less.

Kayla Lewis led the way for UF with a career-best 23 points, hitting 9-for-13 from the field and was three rebounds shy of her third double-double of the season. Jatterra Bonds, January Miller and Sydney Moss all scored in double figures, with 16, 14 and 12, respectively.

Junior Valencia McFarland recorded 24 points and 10 assists to pace Ole Miss. It marked McFarland's first double-double of the season. In total, five Rebels scored in double figures.

All five Rebels who attempted a three-pointer made at least one, led by freshman Gracie Frizzell who hit all four of hers during the first half when Ole Miss built a 50-39 lead thanks in part to a 9-of-10 effort from beyond the arc during the opening 20 minutes.

The Rebels were red-hot from downtown from the onset of the game. Ole Miss shot an absurd 9-for-10 from beyond the arc in the first half. The team ended up finishing 11-for-16 from three (68.8%). Florida was 30-for-78 (38.5%) shooting and was out-rebounded 48-44. Both were improvements from its performance against South Carolina.

The two teams alternated baskets in to begin the game. Neither team held a lead greater than three points in the first seven minutes of the game. Fueled by consecutive three-point field goals by Ole Miss; Gracie Frizzell, the Rebels took a four-point lead at the 12:19 mark of the first period. The Gators then went on a 4-0 run to knot the score at 18-18 with 10:40 remaining. Bonds and Moss each contributed two points on the UF's run. Over the final nine minutes of the first half, Ole Miss outscored the host-Gators 26-16 to take a 50-39 advantage heading into the locker room. The Rebels' 50 points at halftime were the most points allowed by UF in the first half this season.

In addition to great three-point shooting, the visitors made more than half of their shots (51.5%) in the first half. UF was 15-for-44 (34.1%) from the field in the first half, which was a slight improvement from their last game, but not enough to keep up with the Rebels.

The final half of play started off much like the previous one with the two teams exchanging baskets in the first few minutes of the period. Ole Miss recaptured some of the same momentum it had in the first half, going on a 9-4 run to take a 65-51 advantage with 15:01 left in regulation. The score difference fluctuated between 10 and 12 points for the next three minutes.

McCray nailed an 8-footer and increased UM's lead to 12 points, as Florida missed a shot on its next possession, but Miller came up with a steal and dribbled the length of the court where she made the layup but missed the and-one free throw so UF remained 10 points down. Miller recovered on defense from the miss and came away with another steal and nailed the 8-foot pull-up jumper that had Florida within

Game 21: #14 Georgia 69, Florida 52 January 27, 2013 * Athens, Ga. * Stegeman Coliseum

Each of Florida's first six games in Southeastern Conference action were decided by eight points or less, but the Gators were unable to continue that trend against No. 14 Georgia, which used three significant runs to post a 69-52 win at Stegeman Coliseum on Sunday afternoon.

The Lady Bulldogs' (17-3, 5-2 SEC) first spurt of 10 straight points came early in the game when the hosts built a double-digit lead. The teams then battled back and forth and Florida couldn't make up any ground, as Georgia closed the half with a 15-6 run and held a commanding 39-20 halftime lead.

As the Gators were able to regroup and shave a 22-point deficit to 16 points early in the second half, Georgia countered with a devastating 17-2 march over an 8:38 span and Florida (13-8, 2-5 SEC) wasn't able to recover, dropping its fourth consecutive game.

For the ninth game this year, every Gator who suited up scored, with Jennifer George (Fresno, Calif.), January Miller (Orlando, Fla.), Kayla Lewis (Decatur, Ga.) and Sydney Moss (Union, Ky.) each netting eight points.

Lewis, one of two Georgia-natives on the Gator squad, collected a team-best 10 rebounds for Florida, which also dropped the rebounding battle, 44-40, for the third straight game.

Freshman Christin Mercer, who is a native of nearby Douglasville, recorded five points with a career-high seven rebounds with two blocks in front of several family and friends.

Florida shot 34.3 percent (22-64) in the game, including just 3-of-16 from the three-point arc and 5-of-14 from the free throw line. Georgia converted 43.1 percent (25-58) from the floor, with 4-of-15 from the arc and 15-of-21 from the stripe, while scoring 35 points in the paint.

The game opened with fast-paced scoring for both teams, with George, who is still working her way back into the lineup after a shoulder injury either limited her minutes or held her out of the last four games, accounting for Florida's first four points of the game, as she tied the score just over two minutes into the contest.

Over the next 3:05, the Lady Bulldogs ripped off a 10-0 run, as the Gator missed four straight shots and didn't collect an offensive rebound, which turning the ball over twice. Miller finally ended the spree with a three-pointer at the 14:31 mark, but Georgia came right back with the next four points between another Gator turnover.

Lewis then hit an inside bucket and traded scores with the hosts, before Moss converted a nifty spin move jumper in the paint and Lewis drilled a shot from just inside the arc that brought the Gators within 10 points, 24-14, with 10:43 remaining.

The spurt caused Georgia to call a timeout, after which it regrouped to mount a 15-6 run to end the half and take a commanding 39-20 halftime advantage.

Florida turned the ball over 10 times that resulted in nine points during the opening period, but Georgia did the most damage in the paint where it out-scored the Gators 25-14, thanks in part to 11 offensive rebounds that contributed to 16 second-chance points.

The Gators hit 30 percent from the floor, including 1-of-7 from the three-point arc. Lewis and George both scored six points for Florida, which also was out-rebounded, 27-18.

Florida began to show signs to a rally, cutting a 22-point deficit to 16 points early in the second half, as Mercer hit a jumper inside and George followed with an offensive rebound putback that sparked a 7-1 run, with the final three points coming from Moss with 16:26 remaining.

Georgia, however quickly answered with a three-pointer from Merritt Hempe with 16:07 on the clock that ignited a 17-2 run during the next 8:38 and the Lady Bulldogs were able to put the game away, assuming a 64-33 lead with 7:29 left in the game.

Jasmine Hassell finished with a game-high 13 points, while Tiaria Griffin added 12 points and Krista Donald 11 for Georgia.

For the most part, Florida contained Missouri's potent three-point attack, holding the nation's third-best outside shooting team to seven treys. The Tigers, however, outscored the Gators 30-22 in the paint and handed Florida its fifth consecutive loss, 69-64. The Gator's struggle at the free throw line followed them to Mizzou Arena, where they hit just 13-of-24 from the stripe.

Game 23: Florida 87, Alabama 54 February 3, 2013 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Freshman Christin Mercer (Douglasville, Ga.) notched her first career double-double, as five Gators scored in double-figures and Florida overwhelmed the Alabama, 87-54, in the O'Connell Center on Sunday afternoon.

The Gators (14-9, 3-6 SEC) shot a season-best 58.3 percent (35-60) from the floor and held a 51-33 rebounding advantage against the Crimson Tide (12-10, 2-7 SEC), who managed to hit just 25.7 percent of their shots, including a 3-of-23 three-point effort.

"I think it was a great win for our program in a lot of different ways," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We had a fantastic crowd, being able to honor our alumni in the fashion that we have all weekend long. Celebrating and trying to raise awareness of breast cancer, research and raising money and being in pink and then obviously getting a very big win, not just winning the ball game, but winning in a convincing fashion."

Mercer led all scorers with a career-best 18 points on 9-of-12 shooting to accompany her game and career-high 11 rebounds to net her first double-double.

"Christin really showed a lot of growth in our Georgia game and she was just a lot more consistently aggressive and made plays and pursued the ball in a way that makes it not surprising at all that she got 11 rebounds," Butler said. "We've been challenging her to bring that consistent energy and drive. She's been practicing really, really well."

Junior guard Jaterra Bonds (Gainesville) chipped in 16 points, while freshman Sydney Moss (Union, Ky.) added 14 points on 6-of-11 shooting with seven rebounds. Juniors Lily Svete (Granger, Ind.) and Vicky McIntyre (Omaha, Neb.) each recorded 12 points as all nine Gators who dressed for the game, scored and helped snap a five-game losing streak.

"I was really proud of the bounce back because we have had a lot of reasons to hang our heads and we've had a lot of reasons to accept less," Butler said. "They just wouldn't allow that to happen."

Playing in the annual Pinkzone game and in front of more than 30 basketball alumni in attendance, UF took control early, beginning the game on a 6-1 run forcing an Alabama timeout. Svete kept things going with a three followed by a layup in transition by Mercer to give the Gators an 11-1 run just four minutes into the game.

Alabama challenged the Gators early, cutting the lead to five with 14:52 to play but Bonds answered with a jumper and Svete's three-pointer pushed the lead back to 10. The Crimson Tide stayed within single digits until a layup by Moss with 9:24 gave the Gators an 11-point lead.

Redshirt sophomore Kayla Lewis (Decatur, Ga.), who finished with six points and eight rebounds, sparked another Gator run with 4:05 left in the first quarter. Lewis' layup worked an 11-0 to close out the first half as Alabama went scoreless for the final 5:24.

It was all Gators in the first half, using a combination of point scorers led by Mercer who dropped 10 points before the break.

The Gators led 43-23 at the break and picked up where they left off to start the second half, leading by as many as 26 early in the final period. But that wasn't enough for the Orange and Blue, who used an 8-0 run to lead by 30, 64-34, with 12:21 to play, forcing an Alabama timeout.

The Crimson Tide responded out of the time with a three-pointer from Shafontaye Myers, but the Gators continued to keep their large lead for the remainder of the game, enjoying a lead as large as 34 points with 1:28 remaining.

Not only was UF able to find a variety of point scorers, the Gators played unselfishly recording 17 assists in the contest including a career-high six assist from senior forward Jennifer George (Fresno, Calif.) and a game and career-high eight assists from redshirt freshman Carrie Needles (Highlands Ranch, Colo.).
