THE GAME

Auburn (10-10, 2-5 SEC) heads to Knoxville, Tenn., to take on the Tennessee Volunteers (12-7, 4-3 SEC) on Saturday afternoon at Thompson-Boling Arena. Tip is set for 11 a.m. CT on ESPN2.

THE OPENING TIP

- Auburn is 9-3 at home, 0-6 on the road and 1-1 on neutral sites
- KT Harrell has scored 20-or-more points in 10 games this season. He has now topped the 20-point mark 22 times at Auburn. He has also scored 10-plus points in 46 out of 50 career games at Auburn, including 16 this season
- Cinmeon Bowers has had 12 double-doubles and currently leads the SEC and is sixth nationally in rebounding (11.2 rpg) and is 13th in the league in scoring (13.5 ppg). His 12 double-doubles are tops in the SEC and sixth nationally
- Cinmeon Bowers is one of 19 players in the nation to be averaging a double-double, and one of only seven from a major conference
- KT Harrell (17.1 ppg), Antoine Mason (14.1) and Cinmeon Bowers (13.5) account for 67 percent (44.7 out of 66.9) of Auburn's scoring on the year
- Bruce Pearl is facing Tennessee for the first time in his career. He has a winning record against 10 of the 13 SEC teams he has faced in his coaching career
- Auburn is in its 109th season of basketball and has an all-time record of 1,262-1,128-1 (.528)



Bruce Pearl will hold a meet & greet on Friday, Jan. 30, in Knoxville, Tenn., to establish the Bruce Pearl Family Scholarship to Camp Koinonia. All proceeds will go to benefit Camp Koinonia & The Pearl Family Foundation.

In 2010 Pearl and his wife, Brandy, created the OUTLIVE Cancer campaign to benefit the University of Tennessee Medical Center's Cancer Institute. The 2011 *An Evening in Orange* was and still is the only million-dollar fundraiser in Knoxville's history.

The \$1 million from *An Evening In Orange* helped fund a new wing at the cancer institute that added 18 new chairs, doubling the number of chairs to 36, for patients to receive chemotherapy treatment; the new area was named the Pearl Family Chemo Hut.

In SEC play he is the third-winningest coach in regular season SEC games among active coaches by percentage [.650 / 67-36], trailing John Calipari [.778 / 70-20] and Billy Donovan [.655 / 196-103].

Bruce Pearl in conference play

In 19 years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 15 times. In six years at Tennessee he won the SEC East outright or tied for it three

times and finished second once. In four years at Milwaukee he was in the top two all four years (two first-place finishes). In nine years at Southern Indiana he finished first four times and second three times.

After the buzzer

Auburn remains on the road, traveling to Baton Rouge for a game at LSU on Thursday, Feb. 5. The game tips off at 6 p.m. CT and will air live on ESPN2.

Ole Miss game sold out

Auburn's home game against Ole Miss on Saturday, Feb. 7, has already sold out. Auburn has had a full house once already this year, packing 9,121 into Auburn Arena for the South Carolina game.

Auburn's big three

KT Harrell (17.1 ppg), Antoine Mason (14.1 ppg) and Cinmeon Bowers (13.5) account for 66.8 percent (44.7 out of 66.9) of Auburn's scoring, 48.3 percent of its rebounding and 57.4 percent of the team's shots. The three have also combined to take 59.3 percent of the team's free throw attempts on the season, making 57.1 percent of the team's free throws.

Granger protecting the rim

Jordan Granger recorded a career-best three blocks against Texas A&M, all of them coming in the second half. The team leader in blocks with 18, he has five blocks over the last three games

and six over the last four. Half of his blocks (nine) have come in SEC play, where his 1.3 blocks per game are ninth in the league.

30-point first halves

In seven league games this season, Auburn has broken the 30-point barrier just twice in the first half, both of which have resulted in wins. The five times it has failed to break 30 first-half points have resulted in losses.

Auburn is averaging 22.2 first half points in its five SEC losses and 40.0 first half points in its two SEC wins. Auburn's opponents are averaging 32.0 first half points in the five losses and 34.5 points in the two wins.

Four-game losing streaks

In 11 years as a head coach at the Division I level and nine at the Division II level, Bruce Pearl has never had a team endure a four-game losing streak.

From 1992-01 while the head coach at Southern Indiana, Pearl's teams never lost more than two consecutive games. In four years at UW-Milwaukee (2001-05) he had just three three-game losing streaks and in six years at Tennessee (2005-11) the Volunteers had just two three-game losing streaks.

Mr. Double-Double

Cinmeon Bowers recorded his 12th double-double of the season against Mississippi State with 16 points and 17 rebounds. His 12 double-doubles are the most in a season at Auburn since Korvotney Barber had 13 in 2008-09 (36 games).

Bowers is one of 19 players nationally to average a double-double and is one of seven from a Power 5 conference.

Bowers big boards

Cinmeon Bowers has recorded an SEC-high 17 rebounds on three separate occasions this year (vs. Milwaukee, vs. Winthrop, vs. Mississippi State) and has recorded five games with at least 15 rebounds.

Bowers' five games with at least 15 rebounds are the most in a season for an Auburn player since Korvotney Barber did it six times during the 2008-09 season.

From the 2009-10 season through the 2013-14 season, Auburn had a total of one 15-or-more rebound game - Rob Chubb vs. IPFW on Nov. 9, 2012 (15 rebounds).

Stepping out and stepping up in SEC play

KT Harrell is shooting 47.2 percent from 3-point range (17-for-36) in SEC play after shooting 41.7 percent (35-for-84) from beyond the arc in non-conference play.

As a team Auburn is shooting 34.6 percent (47-for-136) from 3-point range in SEC play after shooting 31.1 percent (85-for-272) in non-conference play.

Breaking the 60-point barrier

Auburn is 10-3 this season when breaking the 60-point barrier and 0-7 when it fails to score 60-or-more points. Auburn's fewest points in a win were the 61 it scored in a one-point victory over Texas Southern.

SEC starts

Auburn is 2-5 to start the SEC season and is in search of its first .500-or-better finish in league play since 2008-09. That team started out 2-5 before rallying to win eight of its last nine to finish 10-6, receiving a bid to the NIT at the end of the season.

Attacking the glass

Cinmeon Bowers has already pulled down a team-best 224 rebounds on the year, which is the most by an Auburn player since Kenny Gabriel had 227 (in 31 games) in 2011-12. Bowers

needs 62 more rebounds to tie Mike Mitchell for 10th in the record books with 286 rebounds in the 1974-75 season.

Bowers accounts for 34.0 percent of all of Auburn's rebounds on the season. His 81 offensive rebounds are 36.7 percent of the team's total offensive rebounds and are more than any other player on the team has total rebounds, with Jordon Granger next on the team with 66 total rebounds.

Grand theft

K.C. Ross-Miller leads the SEC and is 29th nationally in steals per game at 2.1 and his 42 total steals are 31st nationally. He has recorded at least one steal in 17 out of 20 games this season and seven times he has recorded at least three steals, topping out with five against Oregon State.

As a team Auburn is 51st nationally in steals per game (7.7) and 52nd in total steals (154). Auburn has had double digit steals eight times this season.

Auburn tied a season-high with 12 steals against Mississippi State, a mark it previously reached this season at Clemson and against Middle Tennessee State.

Auburn has also forced at least 15 turnovers 12 times this season. It forced a season-high 24 turnovers against Middle Tennessee State, the most Auburn has forced in a game since forcing 24 turnovers vs. Grambling State on Dec. 11, 2012.

Masonry work

Antoine Mason has scored at least 10 points in 13 of the 14 games he has played at Auburn and has been the team's leading scorer four times. The team averages 69.9 points when he is in the starting lineup, 8.6 points per game more than when he isn't (61.3).

Auburn at the charity stripe

Auburn's 496 free throw attempts are currently second-most in the SEC and 23rd nationally. It is also 64th nationally in free throws made with 332, which is fourth in the league. Georgia leads the conference with 515 free throw attempts while Ole Miss leads the league in free throws made with 353.

Auburn has shot at least 15 free throws in 18 of 20 games, has shot at least 20 free throws 14 times and at least 25 free throws nine times. Auburn is 9-3 when it attempts more free throws in a game.

Bruce Pearl 'Fore the Children' raises over \$233,000

Bruce Pearl's Fore the Children Golf Classic was a huge success, raising over \$233,000 for Children's Harbor through a weekend full of events on October 26 and 27.

"Our monetary goal was lofty," Pearl said. "We thought we would be able to write a check for \$100,000 to Children's Harbor. I'm pretty pleased to say that we will be writing a check closer to the area of \$150,000 after everything gets paid for." [A check for \$233,345.83 was presented to Children's Harbor on Dec. 23 prior to the Auburn vs. Texas Southern game.]

"I really appreciate everything coach has done for us and all the support he has lent to us," Myrle Grate, COO of Children's Harbor said. "Children's Harbor raises every dime we have every year. We don't get any government subsidies or funding, we raise everything through private individuals so this fundraiser means that 5,000 kids can come to camp next summer and 35,000 people can come through our family center next year and receive support services."

The event, which was presented by Russell Lands and Alabama Power, began with a dinner auction at the Pearl's house and concluded with a golf tournament at Willow Point Golf and Country Club.

"Historically, educational things, kids and cancer have been the areas that my wife (Brandy) and I focused on," Pearl said. "At Children's Harbor, over 5,000 young people every summer get an opportunity to enjoy the beauty of camping at Lake Martin. They don't have to pay anything because of the efforts of the leadership."

Children's Harbor's mission is to help children with serious illness and their families. This is done at both the Lake Martin campus and the Birmingham Family Center. The 66-acre lake campus provides no cost camping facilities to over 23 different non-profit organizations. The Family Center at the Benjamin Russell Hospital for Children offers seriously ill children and their families free counseling for everyone involved, education services and tutoring, scheduled activities, an exercise room, a library, salon, laundry facilities and much more.

Antoine Mason led the nation in both free throws attempted (357) and free throws made (260) last season (72.8 percent) at Niagara. This season he has made 55 out of 76 free throws (72.4 percent).

Cinmeon Bowers leads the team in free throw attempts with 135, which is 29th nationally, and free throws made with 67. K.C. Ross-Miller's 79.6 percent success rate (43-for-54) is best on the team.

Bowers went 11-for-18 from the free throw line against Missouri. His 11 made free throws are a season-high for an Auburn player and his 18 attempts are the most by an Auburn player since Chris Porter shot 20 (and made 14) against Navy on Dec. 19, 1998.

Getting to the line

Auburn is 9-2 this season when out-scoring its opponents at the free throw line, the lone exceptions coming against Florida when it lost despite sinking 17 free throws (in 26 attempts) to Florida's 12 (in 18 attempts) and at home vs. Texas A&M (Auburn was 25-for-35 at the line, Texas A&M was 9-for-17).

Auburn is 1-6 when its opponent out-scores it at the free throw line, the lone exception coming against Xavier when Auburn was 18-for-29 from the free throw line and Xavier was 24-for-27.

Taking care of the ball

Auburn point guard Malcolm Canada has dished out 35 assists against just 13 turnovers over the past 13 games (5/0 vs. Winthrop, 2/1 vs. Xavier, 4/0 vs. Texas Southern, 2/2 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 5/2 vs. North Alabama, 4/1 at Vanderbilt, 2/1 vs. Missouri, 1/0 at Florida, 2/0 vs. South Carolina, 5/3 vs. Mississippi State, 1/2 at Alabama, 2/1 vs. Texas A&M).

Ain't no mountain high enough

Three of Auburn's wins this season have come when it was trailing by 11-or-more points during the second half while a fourth came when it was down by as many as eight in the second half.

Auburn trailed UW-Milwaukee by 12 with 11:09 to go and came back to win by 10, 83-73; Auburn trailed Xavier by 14 with 14:31 left and came back to win by a point, 89-88, in two over-times; Texas Southern led by 11 with 14:42 left only to see Auburn claim a 61-60 win. The latest was against Missouri, which led by eight with 16:31 to play before Auburn rallied for a five-point win, 85-79. All four games were played at Auburn Arena, where Auburn is 9-2 on the season.

Leading from wire to wire

Auburn led wire-to-wire in its win over Middle Tennessee State, scoring just 18 seconds into the game for a 2-0 lead. Auburn built a 14-point lead midway through the first half and then enjoyed a lead as big as 22 points in the second half. It was the second game Auburn never trailed in this season, also accomplishing it in the 80-62 win over Winthrop.

The Reed factor

Since Trayvon Reed joined the team against Clemson, Auburn has seen a dramatic improvement on the defensive end of the floor. Below is a statistical comparison between the last 13 games with Reed and the first seven games without him. Despite playing in only 13 of the 20 games this season, Reed is third on the team with 12 blocked shots (0.9 blocks/game), a total that is 22 percent of Auburn's blocks on the season.

50-point halves

Auburn scored 50 points in the second half of the win over North Alabama, the third time this season Auburn has scored at least 50 in a half. Auburn scored 54 points in the second half of the season-opening win over Milwaukee and 60 points in the second half of a 105-80 win over Louisiana. Auburn's highest first-half point total is 45 points, also against Louisiana.

Locking down the 3-point line

On the season Auburn is allowing its opponents to shoot 32.0 percent from 3-point range, which is seventh in the SEC and 99th nationally. Six of Auburn's opponents have failed to hit better than 30.0 percent from deep in a game this season: Louisiana 20.0, Texas Tech 11.1, Coastal Carolina 28.0, Clemson 14.3, Winthrop 14.8, Alabama 27.8.

That board is mine

Cinmeon Bowers is sixth in the country in rebounds per game (11.2), ninth in offensive rebounds per game (4.1) and 12th in defensive rebounds per game (7.4). He has registered 10-plus rebounds in 12 games this season, including a SEC-high 17 against Milwaukee, Winthrop and Mississippi State.

The last Auburn player to finish a season averaging double-figure rebounds was Mike Mitchell in 1974-75 with 11.4 rebounds per game. Since the 1950-51 season only 14 times has an Auburn player finished the year with a 10.0 rebounds per game average or better.

4x10

Auburn had four or more players score in double figures for the seventh time this season against Missouri. Auburn is 7-0 this season when having at least four players in double figures and 3-10 when having three or fewer in double figures.

Wins vs. losses

Auburn is scoring 79.1 points per game in its 10 wins while holding its opponents to 68.8 points per game. In the 10 losses, Auburn is averaging 54.7 points, and has scored more than 60 points just three times, while allowing 66.4 points per game.

Auburn is shooting .466 from the floor and .372 from 3-point range in its wins and .345 from the floor and .281 from 3-point range in the losses.

Home vs. away

Auburn is 9-3 at home this season, averaging 75.5 points per game and shooting .439 from the floor and .357 from 3-point range while its opponents are scoring 68.8 points per game, shooting .437 from the floor and .320 from 3-point range.

Auburn is 0-6 in away games this season, averaging 54.3 points per game and shooting .340 from the floor and .283 from 3-point range while its opponents are scoring 67.3 points per game, shooting .472 from the floor and .279 from 3-point range.

Auburn is 1-1 in neutral site games, averaging 53.0 points per game and shooting .409 from the floor and .231 from 3-point range while its opponents are scoring 61.0 points per game, shooting .489 from the floor and .417 from 3-point range.

Graduate student transfer Antoine Mason became the 522nd player in NCAA history to record 2,000 career points when he hit a layup with 10:10 to go in the second half of the win over Texas Southern on Dec. 23. A four-year student-athlete at Niagara, he came to Auburn having scored 1,934 points and now has 2,131 points in his career.

In Auburn history Chuck Person (2,311 points from 1982-86), Mike Mitchell (2,123 points from 1974-78) and Wesley Person (2,066 points from 1990-94) have scored over 2,000 career points.

KT passes 1K

With a 3-pointer with 13:49 to go in the first half against Winthrop, senior KT Harrell surpassed the 1,000 career points barrier. He finished the game with 14 points and now has 1,191 career points, having poured in 890 points in 50 career games at Auburn (17.8 points per game). During a two-year run at Virginia (2010-12), he averaged 7.2 points in 32 games before transferring closer to his hometown of Montgomery, Ala., prior to the 2012-13 season.

Special Ks

When Antoine Mason scored his 2,000th career point, Auburn became the only school in the country to have an active 2,000- and 1,000- (KT Harrell) career point scorer on its roster.

KT looking for 1K at Auburn too

KT Harrell has topped the 1,000 career points barrier and is now in search of 1,000 points at Auburn. At his current pace of 17.1 points per game, he would finish the 31-game regular season with 530 points, which would give him 1,078 points in 61 games at Auburn for a career average of 17.7 points per game. Of the 34 1,000-point scorers in Auburn history, Lee DeFore (1963-66) played in the fewest total games (72) and scored 1,386 points, finishing with a 19.0 scoring average. John Mengelt was the fastest Auburn player to 1,000 points, reaching the milestone in his 46th career game.

The RPI factor

Auburn moved up 20 spots, from 167 to 147, following its victory over Xavier. Xavier came into the game number 51 in the RPI but dropped to 72 following the loss. Xavier is the highest-ranked RPI team to fall at Auburn Arena in its four-plus year history.

Auburn is now 161 in the official NCAA RPI and 146 in the ESPN.com RPI.

Road warriors

Auburn played three away games and two neutral site contests in the non-conference season. Among the 14-team SEC, only Arkansas and Ole Miss played as many true road games as Auburn.

Tough sledding to start

Texas Southern was the seventh team on Auburn's schedule that played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, joining Milwaukee, Colorado, Louisiana, Tulsa, Coastal Carolina and Xavier. It has also faced a 2014 NIT team (Clemson) and a 2014 CBI team (Oregon State), giving Auburn nine of 13 non-conference games against 2014 post-season teams to start the season.

#CimCity

Junior Cinmeon Bowers posted an 18-point, 17-rebound double-double in his Auburn debut. The 17 rebounds were an Auburn Arena record and were the most by an Auburn player since Korvotney Barber pulled down 18 boards in 2009.

Bowers' double-double was the first in a season-opener by an Auburn player since Kenny Gabriel went for 18 points and 13 rebounds in the inaugural game at Auburn Arena in 2010.

The last player to record a double-double in his Auburn debut was David Hamilton, who scored 11 points and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds in a 114-60 win over Southeast Louisiana to open the 1998-99 season.

Bowers followed that up with three more double-doubles and now has 12 on the season, fifth in the country.

KT carrying the torch

KT Harrell has been Auburn's leading scorer in 12 out of 20 games this season, topping 20 points 10 times. He currently is second in the SEC in scoring at 17.1 points per game, ninth in field goal percentage (.460), second in 3-point field goal percentage (.433), first in 3-point field goals made per game (2.6) and ninth in minutes played (32.4).

KT for 3!

KT Harrell set a career high with seven made 3-pointers in the game against Coastal Carolina. The seven made 3s was an Auburn Arena record for Auburn and the most made by an Auburn player in a single game since Tay Waller hit eight at Ole Miss in 2010.

Harrell has hit at least one 3-pointer in 19 of 20 games this year and has only failed to hit a three in a game twice in his Auburn career.

At his current pace of 2.6 made 3's per game, Harrell would finish the 31-game regular season with 81 made 3-pointers, which would be sixth in Auburn history. Lance Weems holds the school record with 108 made 3-pointers in 1995-96.

#CimCity Part 2

Cinmeon Bowers leads the SEC and is sixth nationally in rebounding. If Bowers were to keep up his current pace of 11.2 rebounds per game over the rest of the regular season, he would finish the year with 347 rebounds, tying the school single-season rebound record of 347 set by Korvotney Barber set in 2008-09.

Home starts

Auburn started the season 9-1 at home, marking just the 17th time in program history it has started the home season that well. Six times the program was 10-0 over the first 10 home games.

Double OT thriller

Auburn claimed an 89-88 win over Xavier on Saturday, Dec. 20, clawing back from a 13-point halftime deficit and a 14-point deficit with 14:31 left in the second half. The win was Auburn's first overtime win since a 69-68 home double-overtime win over Ole Miss on Jan. 14, 2012. Auburn had lost the last four overtime games it had played in and is now 48-50 (.490) all-time in overtime games.

Big debut for Thompson

Alex Thompson, who missed the first eight games after taking a personal leave of absence, returned to the floor against Winthrop and had an immediate impact, matching his career-high with 8 points and pulling down a career-best 6 rebounds in 15 minutes.

Trayvon Reed joins team

Trayvon Reed, a 7-foot-2, 230-pound center originally from Mobile, Ala, was added to the Auburn basketball roster, head coach Bruce Pearl announced on Friday, Dec. 12.

A consensus four-star prospect coming out of high school, Reed played AAU for Atlanta Xpress. ESPN ranked him as the 68th best prospect in the nation, 247sports.com ranked him 90th and Rivals.com ranked him 91st. As a senior he played at Life Center Academy in New Jersey. He spent the last semester at Elev8 Academy in Delray Beach, Fla.

Alex Thompson rejoins team

Alex Thompson rejoined the team at the semester break following a leave of absence for personal reasons. A sophomore forward, he played in 20 games last season, averaging 1.0



points and 1.5 rebounds in 7.8 minutes per game. Twelve of his 24 field goal attempts (50 percent) came from 3-point range last season.

Caps and gowns

When senior KT Harrell graduated from Auburn with a degree in psychology on Saturday, Dec. 13, he became the third player on Auburn's roster to have earned his undergraduate degree, joining Antoine Mason (Niagara '14, finance) and K.C. Ross-Miller (New Mexico State '14, sports management). Harrell will be working on a second major in public administration during the spring semester. Senior Malcolm Canada is set to graduate this spring with a degree in public administration.

As a team Auburn posted a 3.0 GPA over the first semester of the season.

Harrell 20 point games

Senior KT Harrell has scored 20-or-more points in 10 games this season and has now topped the 20-point mark 22 times in 50 career games at Auburn.

Charge it

As a team Auburn has drawn 31 charges on the year, including a team-best eight by K.C. Ross-Miller. Below is the season tally of charges taken by Auburn players.

Don from deep

Jordon Granger has gone 16-for-39 (41.0 percent) from 3-point range this season, knocking down a pair of 3-pointers against Milwaukee, Louisiana, Texas Tech, Winthrop, Vanderbilt and Missouri. A junior, he was a combined 0-for-2 from 3-point range over his first two seasons in an Auburn uniform.

Hitting the century mark

Auburn's 105-point output against Louisiana marked the first time Auburn has scored 100 points in a game since a 105-56 win over Grambling State on Nov. 29, 2003, a span of 340 games.

The 100-point game marked the 53rd time in Auburn history that it has topped the 100-point mark while it was the 99th time a team led by Bruce Pearl scored 100 points.

20-point scorers

Auburn had three different players top the 20-point mark in its 105-80 win over Louisiana in KT Harrell (24 points), Tahj Shamsid-Deen (21) and Cinmeon Bowers (20). The last time Auburn had three players score at least 20 points in the same game was Nov. 26, 2002, when Marquis Daniels (27 points), Marco Killingsworth (24) and Derrick Bird (23) all did it in a 100-71 win over Georgia State.

Career-high nights

Auburn received career-high point tallies from Tahj Shamsid-Deen (21) Cinmeon Bowers (20), Jordon Granger (14) and Malcolm Canada (10) in the 105-80 win over Louisiana. Canada also had a career-best six assists (against one turnover) in the win while Shamsid-Deen tied his career-best by hitting five 3-pointers (four in the second half) after entering the game 0-for-6 from deep.

Harrell SEC Player of the Week

KT Harrell was named SEC Player of the Week on Dec. 22 after averaging 19 points, five rebounds, 1.5 assists and one steal in wins over Winthrop and Xavier. He led Auburn with 24 points, seven rebounds and two assists in a double overtime win against the Musketeers. He made seven of his 12 shots in the second half. His 3-pointer with 2:24 left in regulation to completed Auburn's comeback from a 13-point second half deficit. The Xavier game marked his sixth 20-point effort of the season. He surpassed the 1,000 career point milestone in a 14-point outing against Winthrop.

Bowers named SEC Player of the Week

Cinmeon Bowers was named the SEC Player of the Week on Nov. 17 following his 18-point, 17-rebound performance in the opener against Milwaukee.

Harrell named preseason All-SEC

KT Harrell was named to the coaches' preseason All-SEC second team in a vote by the league's 14 head coaches.

A senior guard from Montgomery, Ala., Harrell is the top returning scorer in the SEC after averaging 18.3 points per game during the 2013-14 season. Last year he scored in double figures in 29 out of 30 games, including each of the first 21, to finish sixth in the league in scoring. He shot 43.3 percent from the floor, 35.9 percent from 3-point range and 87.0 percent from the free throw line. In SEC games, Harrell scored 17.9 points per game.

Harrell is the first Auburn player to be voted

to the coaches' preseason All-SEC team since DeWayne Reed in 2009-10.

Atewe out

Matthew Atewe, a 6-foot-8 center, has missed the entire season thus far after injuring the same left leg he had a steel rod inserted into during off-season surgery. The Brampton, Ontario, Canada, native re-injured the leg during the second half of Auburn's exhibition win over West Alabama.

Bruce Pearl ruled Atewe out for the rest of the season prior to the Alabama game on Jan. 24th.

Playing with a short deck - Part I

Auburn's roster features six returning letter winners in sophomore center Matthew Atewe, senior guard Malcolm Canada, senior guard KT Harrell, junior forward Jordon Granger, sophomore guard Tahj Shamsid-Deen and sophomore forward Alex Thompson.

With the injury to Atewe, that reduces the number of scholarship returnees to just five for Bruce Pearl's first Auburn team.

Across the country, there are just 43 teams that return five-or-fewer letter winners. In the Power Five conferences, there are just seven teams: Auburn (5), LSU (5), Miami (2), Missouri (4), Oregon (3), Tennessee (4) and Vanderbilt (5).

Playing with a short deck - Part II

Auburn's scholarship players have an average height of 6.5 inches and there is just one player taller than 6-foot-9 on the roster (Trayvon Reed, 7-foot-2).

Top Scorers

Auburn will have two of the nation's top scorers from a year ago on the floor this season. Graduate student Antoine Mason transferred from Niagara for his final season after averaging 25.6 points per game last year, which was second nationally only to Doug McDermott of Creighton (26.9 ppg).

Additionally, senior KT Harrell is the SEC's top returning scorer after finishing sixth in the league last season at 18.3 points per game, which was 80th nationally.

All-conference players

During his 19-year head coaching career, Bruce Pearl has had at least one player selected First Team All-Conference in every season.

Pearl loves playing at home

Bruce Pearl has led his teams to an incredible



277-34 (.891) home record during his 20-year coaching career. Auburn is 51-33 (.607) at home in Auburn Arena, 9-3 (.750) under Pearl.

Spreading out the minutes

During his six-year tenure as head coach of Tennessee, Bruce Pearl had a total of 28 players average over 10 minutes per game on 55 occasions. During the Volunteers' run to the Elite Eight in 2009-10, 12 players averaged 10-plus minutes per game.

Through 20 games this season, Auburn has nine players averaging double-figures in minutes and seven that have averaged over 20 minutes.

46 percent of scoring returns

Despite having lost three of its starters from last year's team, Auburn returns 46 percent of its scoring from the 2013-14 squad with senior guard KT Harrell (18.3 ppg) and sophomore guard Tahj Shamsid-Deen (9.5 ppg) accounting for 39 percent of the team's scoring last year.

Late Night with Bruce Pearl

Auburn will play all but one of its games on television this year, which means a lot of late starts. Of Auburn's 31 scheduled games, 18 of them start at 7:30 p.m. CT or later, 15 start at 8 p.m. CT or later and three tip at 9 p.m. CT or later.

Arena sellouts

In the four-year history of Auburn Arena, the facility has reached its max capacity of 9,121 fans six times, the last time coming Jan. 17 against South Carolina.

Auburn averaged 7,468 fans during the non-conference season, which was larger than any year-end average in arena history.

Bruce Pearl undergoes successful surgery

Bruce Pearl underwent successful back surgery on Tuesday morning, Nov. 4. The surgery was performed by Dr. Colby Maher of the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Fla. He was back on the sidelines for Auburn's exhibition game against West Alabama three days later.

Season tickets sold out

Auburn has sold out of men's basketball season tickets for the first time in Auburn Arena history. Individual game tickets and standing room only tickets are still available.



Bruce Pearl is a proven winner. In 19 seasons as a head coach he has never had a losing season. He has also guided his team to the NCAA Tournament 17 times. And when he's not winning basketball games, he's winning the hearts of a fan base badly wanting a winner.

In the month following Auburn's hiring of Pearl, deposits towards Auburn general public season tickets were up 258 percent over the previous season from the same point while donations towards scholarship ticket were up 560 percent in that same time period. All this for a man that has

a .700 (231-99) winning percentage at the Division I level and a .761 (462-145) winning percentage overall.

"Tremendous hire by Jay Jacobs," ESPN Basketball Insider Jeff Goodman said the day Pearl was hired. "He is a proven winner – and it's just a matter of time before he makes Auburn relevant nationally in basketball. He is one of those rare guys that can both coach and recruit – and get his guys to play hard on a consistent basis. This is the ultimate home run hire."

Heading into the 2014-15 season, Pearl is one of just 10 current head coaches at a Division I school with a minimum of 10 years of experience and no losing seasons. The top three on that list – Jim Boheim of Syracuse (38 years), Roy Williams of North Carolina (26) and Tom Izzo of Michigan State (19) – have all led their teams to National Championships, something else Pearl did as he led Southern Indiana to the NCAA Division II Championship game in back-to-back seasons, winning it all in 1995.

Pearl's impact on the Auburn community has been apparent since the day he was hired on March 18, 2014. A crowd in excess of 3,000 fans, half of which were students, showed up to Pearl's press conference in Auburn Arena, for which Pearl bought the students pizza. Ever since he has been visible throughout the Auburn campus, showing up on the concourse in a dunk tank as part of a fraternity fundraiser and returning two weeks later alongside football coach Gus Malzahn, women's basketball coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, baseball coach Sunny Golloway and university president Dr. Jay Gogue encouraging students to 'Crush Finals.' He also regularly eats meals amongst the students on campus, engaging himself unlike any other coach or staff member on Auburn's campus.

"Bruce Pearl is a great hire for Auburn," ESPN's Jay Bilas said. "He will bring an energy and enthusiasm to the program that will be contagious, and he's a truly outstanding coach. Pearl has the goods, and he can really sell them too."

Pearl's 19 years of coaching experience covers three stops. He began his head coaching career with a nine-year stay at Southern Indiana, taking the program to the tournament each season, going 231-46 (.834) from 1992-2001. From there he made the move to Wisconsin-Milwaukee, taking the Panthers to the NIT once and the NCAA Tournament twice, including a 2005 Sweet 16 appearance. After compiling an 86-38 (.694) record at UW-Milwaukee, Tennessee tabbed him as its leader in 2005 and he responded by taking the program to six straight NCAA Tournament appearances, two Sweet Sixteens (2007, 2008) and the 2010 Elite Eight, which was the most successful six-year run in Volunteers history.

During Pearl's stay at Tennessee, the Volunteers topped the 20-win mark five times and was the SEC's winningest program during his six seasons, winning the 2008 SEC regular season SEC Championship, the 2006, 2008 and 2009 SEC Eastern Division titles and earned the school's first-ever No. 1 national ranking. From 2006-11, Tennessee went 65-31 (.677) in league play, better than every team in the conference during that time period.

Pearl's preferred style of play, a high-scoring, pressure-type scheme, has proven to be very exciting and very successful throughout the years. His teams have led their

conference in scoring 16 of the 19 years that he has been a head coach. His Tennessee squads were the SEC's scoring champion in four of his seasons on Rocky Top, averaging 77.4 points per game while allowing 70.5 ppg. At the Division I level, his teams have topped the 100-point mark 14 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 points in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg. Twice he has coached the league's leading scorer in UW-Milwaukee's Dylan Page in 2004 (20.9 ppg) and Tennessee's Chris Lofton in 2007 (20.8 ppg).

"(Pearl) has taken down a lot of high-flying teams as the coach at Tennessee," ESPN.com's Pat Forde wrote in March 2010. "Playing his Volunteers is hazardous to your ranking."

During Pearl's stay at Tennessee, he attracted outstanding players to Knoxville. Wayne Chism was Pearl's first marquee signee at Tennessee. The Volunteers went 104-38 during Chism's four-year career, and he walked off the court in 2010 as the school's all-time leader in games played and wins. Chism also appeared in more NCAA Tournament games and logged more wins in the "Big Dance" than any Vol in history.

But perhaps more important is the fact that Chism extended a trend that followed Pearl throughout his stay at Tennessee. Every player that played four years for Pearl at Tennessee earned their college degree.

Boasting a .700 winning percentage over 10 Division I seasons, Pearl has done it against some of the toughest schedules in America. Tennessee sought out non-conference matchups with the most prominent teams and players on the collegiate landscape. During his stay at Tennessee the Volunteers defeated Kevin Durant and Texas, Derrick Rose and Memphis, Greg Monroe and Georgetown, Matt Bouldin and Gonzaga, Sherron Collins and Luke Aldrich of Kansas and Ohio State with National Player of the Year Evan Turner. That's in addition to logging SEC wins against future NBA standouts such as Ronnie Brewer, Glen Davis, Joakim Noah, Rajon Rondo and John Wall.

Playing such a difficult schedule led to an average year-end RPI of 17 as well as three top-five seeds in the NCAA Tournament. Twice Tennessee landed in the top 10 in the final national rankings, with a high of No. 5 after logging a school-record 31 wins in 2007-08.

Tennessee's on-court success never came at the expense of academics. Tennessee had 31 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections under Pearl and nine members of the 2006-07 squad earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition.

"You can't serve unless you are called upon."

That has been an oft-quoted Pearl mantra throughout his time at Tennessee and has been carried over to his early days at Auburn. An ambassador for the university, Pearl's selfless community service work and generous stewardship made him one of the most influential public figures in the state of Tennessee. He was named "Knoxvillian of the Year" by Knoxville Metro Pulse in 2008 and also received the prestigious "Knoxville Award" in 2010. The UT basketball program also earned the UT Men's Community Outreach Team Award twice in his six seasons.

Pearl realized a lifelong dream in the summer of 2008 when his country called upon him to serve as head coach of Maccabi USA's open men's basketball team at the 18th World Maccabiah Games in Israel. He led the American squad to the gold medal for just the third time in 24 years, toppling favored Israel in the title game.



The Maccabiah gold marked Pearl's 16th championship during his head coaching career. In 19 seasons at the collegiate level, his teams have made a remarkable 17 NCAA Tournament appearances and racked up 26 NCAA Tournament wins. Only three times in 19 years has a Pearl-coached team not led its conference in scoring, and his squads have finished either first or second in their respective leagues an astounding 14 times.

Pearl has garnered six National Coach of the Year awards, and his teams have set school records for wins at three different universities (29 at Southern Indiana in 1995, 26 at UW-Milwaukee in 2005 and 31 at Tennessee in 2008). His teams have also won at least 10 games in league play in nine out of his 10 seasons as a Division I head coach.

His NCAA Tournament resume is equally as impressive – as he is one of only seven active head coaches who has led his teams to 10 NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances. From 2007-2010, Tennessee stood alongside Kansas, Memphis, Michigan State, UNC and Xavier as the only programs in America to reach the Sweet 16 three times.

While Pearl often exults that “it’s all about the players,” some of his most successful pupils direct the praise Pearl’s way.

“When BP first got (to Tennessee), I was just a shooter,” three-time All-America Chris Lofton said. “But by the time I left, he and his staff had made me into a scorer.”

Current Indiana Pacers guard C.J. Watson is one of more than a dozen players Pearl and his staff have developed in NBA contributors.

“Coach Pearl gets all the credit for my success because he turned me into the player I’ve become,” Watson said. “He was the one who got me to attack the basket and allowed me to play more aggressive.”

During the Pearl era, Tennessee played more than 70 games on national television, and a Volunteer appeared on the cover of Sports Illustrated four times. In addition, Tennessee was featured in an ESPN College GameDay matchup four straight seasons.

“Pearl has done a magnificent job of building confidence and belief in his players – and of selling his program to those closest to it – his own students and fans,” Bilas said.

Pearl’s coaching career began at his alma mater, Boston College, as a student assistant coach to the legendary Dr. Tom Davis. After 14 seasons seated to the right of Davis, the 32-year-old Pearl embarked on his own head coaching career. But Pearl’s first break came during his undergraduate career at BC when Davis offered him a position of student assistant in 1978. In 1981, the Eagles won the Big East Conference championship and reached the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament. The following season, BC advanced to the Elite Eight.

When Davis moved on to Stanford in 1982, Pearl joined his staff as an assistant coach and then, at the age of 23, was promoted to associate head coach for the Cardinal. While in Palo Alto, Calif., they ended a streak of 20 consecutive losing seasons with a 19-12 overall record in 1983-84, laying the groundwork for a resurgence in Stanford basketball. During that time, they recruited four players who were drafted by the NBA, including Todd Lichti, who finished his career as Stanford’s all-time leading scorer with 2,336 career points.

After four seasons on the West Coast, Pearl followed Davis to Iowa in 1986. Over the course of the next six seasons, the Hawkeyes received five NCAA Tournament berths while compiling a 129-63 overall record. In 1987, the Hawkeyes recorded a 30-5 mark and advanced to the Elite Eight before falling to UNLV. And in 1988, Pearl was recognized as one of the top Division I assistants in the country by Basketball Weekly while helping direct the Hawkeyes to the Sweet Sixteen.

His six seasons in Iowa City helped produce 11 NBA draft picks for the Hawkeyes, including Brad Lohaus, Kevin Gamble, B.J. Armstrong, Roy Marble and Acie Earl.

“From the time I met him he was able to get the most out of me as a player,” Lohaus said. “He understood my personality and knew how to motivate me. He believed in me when others did not.

“He still stays in touch, offering his friendship and advice.”

These 14 seasons with Davis provided Pearl a foundation of basketball knowledge that enabled him to move on to a head coach position.

“I feel like I had a great mentor in Dr. Tom Davis,” Pearl said. “If you’re any good at anything, chances are you had somebody pretty good who taught you how to do it. I had the pleasure of being by his side for 14 years. He was a brilliant defensive strategist. He taught me how to press and how to run, but more than anything else, he taught me how to work with young people, how to be patient, how to be disciplined and how to get the most out of them, even more than they ever dreamed they could have.”

Pearl’s first head coaching opportunity came at Southern Indiana, a Division II school located in Evansville, Ind.

Inheriting a team that had won only 10 games the previous season, Pearl’s first squad at USI posted a 22-7 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. That first season was a precursor of things to come for the school. Over the next nine seasons, the Screaming Eagles posted a 231-46 (.834) record and won four Great Lakes Valley Conference championships.

They received NCAA Tournament bids in each of Pearl’s nine seasons and advanced to the Sweet Sixteen six times. USI experienced unparalleled postseason success under Pearl’s guidance. The Screaming Eagles won a national championship in 1995 and finished second in 1994. In nine postseason appearances, USI won 16 NCAA Tournament games.

After winning the national championship in 1995, Pearl was named the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division II Coach of the Year. Twice (1993 and 1994) he was named the Great Lakes Valley Conference Coach of the Year, and in 2000, he garnered NABC Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year honors.

Late in the 2000 season, Pearl earned his 200th career win, making him the fastest coach in NCAA history to reach the 200-victory mark at one school. Needing just 240 games, Pearl easily broke the record of 250 that had been held by North Carolina State’s Everett Case.

In Pearl’s four years as head coach at UW-Milwaukee, the Panthers won a pair of Horizon League regular-season titles (2004 and 2005) and two Horizon League Tournament championships (2003 and 2005). They advanced to Division I postseason play for the first time in school history, making two NCAA Tournament appearances (2003 and 2005) and receiving an NIT bid (2004).

In 2005, Pearl led the Panthers to the most successful season in school history. In addition to winning regular season and conference tournament titles, UWM made its’ first-ever appearance in the Sweet Sixteen.

Pearl’s 51-13 (.797) record in Horizon League games gave him the best winning percentage of any coach in league history. He became the second-fastest coach to win 300 career games with a 73-56 win over Loyola Jan. 8, 2005.

A native of Boston, Mass., Pearl received his bachelor’s degree in business administration from Boston College in 1982, graduating cum laude. Pearl has two daughters, Jacqui and Leah, and two sons, Steven and Michael. He is married to the former Brandy Miller of Sevierville, Tenn.

"We started off the game, and I am sure it is a line that he has heard before, but the house was on fire. It was a great environment. They are building a good culture here and great, tough environment to play in."

Auburn trailed by just four at the half but ran out of gas in the second period, falling to Colorado, 90-59, in Boulder, in the third game of the ESPN College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon.

Tippling at 11 p.m. local time (midnight in Auburn) and playing without starter Antoine Mason, Auburn shot 38.9 percent from the floor in the first half and was then held to 18.2 percent in the second to fall to 1-1 on the season. Colorado shot 51.9 percent in the first half and 65.4 percent in the second as it moved to 2-0 on the season.

KT Harrell scored a game-high 20 points, the second straight game he has gone for 20, while Cinmeon Bowers had a second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds.

Colorado had three players in double figures. Forwards Josh Scott and Xavier Johnson each went for 17 points while forward Wesley Gordon scored 16 points and pulled down 12 rebounds.

Colorado won the battle of the boards convincingly, 46-31, and recorded six blocks to just one for Auburn.

Auburn erased an 11-point second-deficit to knock off Texas Southern, 61-60, Tuesday night at Auburn Arena.

Senior K.C. Ross-Miller hit a pair of clutch free throws with 14 seconds remaining and Auburn (6-5) had to fend off two Texas Southern (2-9) possessions in the final 10 seconds of the game, getting a late steal from junior big man Cinmeon Bowers to give the Tigers its second-straight comeback victory on their home floor.

Mason now has 2,005 points in his career, the second-most by an active player in the country behind BYU's Tyler Haws. Auburn is the only team in the nation with a 2,000-point scorer (Mason) and a 1,000-point scorer (Harrell).

Auburn trailed for most of the opening 20 minutes, but slowly worked its way back to cut the Texas Southern lead down to 28-27 at the intermission. A 10-2 Texas Southern run to open the second half put Auburn back down by 11 with 14:08 to go.

Auburn's pressure defense came alive down the stretch forcing 10 Texas Southern turnovers as Mason and Harrell dropped in back-to-back lay-ups to put the Tigers up 59-58 at the 1:19 mark. The Tigers scored 15 points off turnovers in the game's final 20 minutes.

After Texas Southern's Derrell Biggs hit two free throws with just 20 seconds left, Ross-Miller led Auburn down the floor and drew contact to earn two shots at the charity stripe. The senior, who finished with 11 points on 4-of-8 shooting with four assists, hit his only two free throws of the night to put Auburn back in the lead for good.

Despite getting outshot from the field 42 percent to 36 percent and being out-rebounded, 37-34, The Tigers finished with 11 steals in the game, getting three apiece from Bowers and Ross-Miller.

Auburn moved to 6-0 this season when four players scored 10-plus points. The victory also marked the third time this season the Tigers have overcome a double-digit deficit in the second half to earn a victory.

Antoine Mason scored 19 points and Auburn forced a season-high 24 turnovers to propel the Tigers to a 64-48 victory over Middle Tennessee State on Monday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (7-5) led the entire way to earn their fourth-straight victory, shooting 51 percent (22-of-43) in the win, including 55 percent (6-of-11) from deep against Middle Tennessee State (7-6). Auburn's defense used pressure all night to tie a season-high with 12 steals.

Mason's 19 matched his season high, done in the opener against UW-Milwaukee, finishing as one of three Tigers in double-figures. The Queens, N.Y., native knocked down three from beyond the arc and finished a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line.

KT Harrell added 12 points, three assists and a team-high seven rebounds, while Cinmeon Bowers collected 11 points and six boards. K.C. Ross-Miller recorded seven points and led the Tigers with a season-high five steals. Jordon Granger also finished with seven points in 12 minutes of action, hitting a pair of three-pointers.

The Tiger's defense was strong in the first half, holding the Blue Raiders to just 20 points – the fewest by an Auburn opponent this season. Auburn also shot 44 percent from the field in the game's first 20 minutes as Mason recorded 12 to lead all scorers at the break.

In the second half, Auburn used a 14-3 run to put the game out of reach at 58-37 with 6:48 left. Harrell poured in 10 of 12 points during the final 20 minutes of action.

The Blue Raiders' 48 points were the fewest by an Auburn opponent in a victory since the Tigers' 49-37 win over Alabama in 2013.

Auburn held Middle Tennessee to 41 percent shooting from the field, including 35 percent (6-of-17) from behind the 3-point line. Jaquel Richmond led the Blue Raiders with 11 points off the bench, while Jawayn Raymond recorded 10 points and three rebounds. Middle Tennessee State's bench contributed 31 of its 48 points.

The Tigers improved their home record to 6-1 during the 2014-15 season. The victory also marked Auburn's 40th all-time win over a Conference USA opponent.

KT Harrell tied a season-high with 25 points and Cinmeon Bowers recorded his eighth double-double of the year to lead Auburn to a 82-61 victory against North Alabama on Saturday in the Tigers' non-conference finale.

Auburn (8-5) overcame a slow start and shot 58 percent (21-of-36) in the second half to put the game away late. The Tigers picked up 31 points off turnovers and outscored North Alabama (5-6), 32-10, in the paint in the game's final 20 minutes.

The win marked the Tigers' fifth-straight victory heading into SEC play and moved their record to 7-1 at Auburn Arena this season.

Harrell's performance gave the senior his seventh 20-point game of the season and the 19th of his career. The Montgomery, Ala., native finished 9-of-16 from the floor, including 4-of-7 from behind the arc. The senior also chipped in six rebounds, four on the offensive glass.

Bowers finished with 20 points and 11 rebounds in the win, finishing with double-digit points for the sixth-straight contest and his second 20-point game of his Auburn career. The junior shot 8-of-14 from the field and also chipped in three blocks. His eight double-doubles this season leads the SEC heading into conference play.

Antoine Mason added in 16 of his 18 points in the second half, leading the team with 6-of-7 shooting from the free throw line while pulling down four boards. Mason has scored in double-figures in all seven games in which he has played in this year.

Malcom Canada's eight points off the bench came in 28 minutes of action, finishing with a career-high six rebounds. Alex Thompson added in seven points in a season-high 20 minutes, while K.C. Ross-Miller dished a season-high five assists from the point-guard spot.

North Alabama led throughout most of the first half until a trey from Harrell put Auburn in the lead, 23-22, at the 5:31 mark. Harrell, who scored 13 in the first half, hit another triple just two minutes later to put the Tigers back in the lead for good with 3:39 before the half.

Auburn finished the game shooting 47 percent from the field (31-of-65) and out-rebounded the Lions, 43-32. The Tigers scored 44 points in the paint and finished with 31 points coming off of North Alabama turnovers.

The 8,169 fans marked the second-best attendance for a non-conference game since the facility opened in 2010.

Not even Bruce Pearl could change Auburn's luck in Memorial Gymnasium on Tuesday night.

Vanderbilt beat Auburn 64-52 in their SEC opener in a place where the Tigers haven't won since 2000, and not even Pearl's success here from his days at Tennessee could change that.

Oh, Auburn tried, though. The Tigers trailed by 19 in the first half, but were down only 5 points with two minutes left. That was enough for Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings to be impressed with Pearl's first season at Auburn.

"Bruce has done a great job with them," Stallings said. "They're so much better right now than they were early in the season. That's a testament to his, and his staff's, coaching ability and what they've done."

Auburn fell to 8-6. Vanderbilt improved to 11-3, thanks to a solid first half and Auburn struggling to find the basket. The Tigers only shot 21 percent in the first half.

"We can't have the first half like we had, especially on the road," said Auburn guard Antoine Mason. "We missed too many shots and we didn't get into our defense."

Vandy led 11-9 with 11:57 left in the first half, but then it was 23-11, 33-14 and then 33-19 at halftime. Mason led Auburn with 16 points. James Stakam led Vandy with 14.

"They played hard and physical and we played hard and physical," Stallings said. "I thought they guarded the fire out of us, especially in the half-court. They made us look ugly."

Pearl was 8-4 against Vandy when he was Tennessee's coach, including a 3-3 mark in Memorial Gymnasium. But he couldn't add to that after the Tigers started so slowly.

"When we don't play with that energy, getting after people, and turning people over, then what we do is just OK. I think our guys learned that. I think our guys saw that," Pearl said.

That assessment applied to the first half. Auburn outscored Vandy 33-31 in the second half, including making it 55-50 down the stretch. Pearl said that run had him thinking about some of his Tennessee's wins here.

"When we were making our run, I thought we were going to steal another one in here. I really did. 'Here it comes...'" he said.

"I'm proud of the way with the way our guys competed, but not pleased with our execution, especially in the first half."

But, overall, "we just keep making runs and keep coming at you. I'm proud of my guys. We're trying to carve out our identity. Our kids didn't quit."

Vandy outrebound Auburn 47-27, but Pearl said a lot of that was because Auburn took 13 more shots than Vandy.

"We took more shots and missed more shots. It was really about us taking more shots," Pearl said.

Junior Cinmeon Bowers tied a season-high with 20 points and grabbed 14 rebounds and senior KT Harrell scored 14 points as Auburn defeated Missouri, 85-79, on Saturday at Auburn Arena. The win gives Auburn an 8-1 record at home and its sixth second half comeback victory of the season.

Auburn (9-6, 1-1 SEC) held a 41-40 advantage at the break, but Missouri stormed out of the gates, scoring the first nine points in the second half to take an eight point lead. Auburn responded with a 10-0 run over the next 2:39 to tie the game at 51 with 13:15 remaining.

With Missouri up 65-61, Auburn went on a 12-2 run. Sophomore Tahj Shamsid-Deen scored six of Auburn's eight points before Harrell buried a three to give Auburn a six point lead, 76-67, with 4:04 remaining.

After Missouri trimmed the lead to two, 74-72, junior Jordon Granger hit his second trey of the game with 2:24 to give the Tigers a five point advantage, 77-72. Missouri's Wes Clark cut the lead back down to two with a three of his own, before Malcolm Canada scored six of his 10 points in the final 46 seconds to seal the victory for Auburn.

Bowers' performance gives the Racine, Wisc., native his SEC-leading ninth double-double of the season. Bowers finished 4-of-13 from the field, but made a career-high 11 free throws, while grabbing nine offensive and five defensive rebounds.

Harrell, one of five Tigers to finish in double figures, went 5-of-6 from the field, including 3-of-3 from beyond the arc. Senior K.C. Ross-Miller tied a season-high 13 points, while Shamsid-Deen added 10, all in the second half.

Missouri was led by Keith Shamburger, who scored 21 with six rebounds and Wes Clark who scored 16.

KT Harrell scored a game-high 24 points and Cinmeon Bowers posted his SEC-leading 11th double-double of the season as Auburn claimed a 71-68 win over South Carolina at a sold out Auburn Arena on Saturday night.

Auburn built a 10-point lead at the half, 39-29, riding 10 points from Antoine Mason and eight from Harrell. Auburn shot 37.1 percent in the half and was a near-perfect 90.9 percent at the free throw line, going 10-for-11 while South Carolina, which was third in the conference in free throw percentage, was 0-for-1 at the free throw line in the first 20 minutes.

South Carolina whittled Auburn's lead away quickly in the second half, scoring the first seven points out of the break. Auburn would up the lead back to six on a Mason 3-pointer, 42-36, before South Carolina took the lead with 11:23 left, 46-45.

Auburn responded and took the lead on a Harrell three, 50-47, and would go up by four, 53-49, before South Carolina responded with a 9-0 run to go up 58-53 with 4:43 left.

Auburn answered with a 12-1 run of its own to go up 65-59 with 1:52 left, sparked by a Harrell 4-point play and four points by Bowers.

Duane Notice led South Carolina with 16 points, one of four Gamecocks to finish in double figures. He was joined by Laimonas Chatkevicius (15 points, 11 rebounds), Sindarius Thornwell (13 points) and Tyrone Johnson (13 points).

Auburn out-rebounded South Carolina, 36-34, and surrendered just nine offensive rebounds to South Carolina.

Auburn's win was its seventh straight at home, where it is now 9-1 on the season.

The sellout was the sixth in the four-plus year history of Auburn Arena and the first since Jan. 19, 2013 against Kentucky.

A furious second-half comeback by Auburn was not enough Wednesday night as the Tigers fell 78-71 to Mississippi State, snapping a seven-game home winning streak at Auburn Arena.

KT Harrell led Auburn (10-8, 2-3 SEC) with a game-high 22 points on 8-of-15 shooting from the floor. The senior hit a game-high four three-pointers and added in three steals. The Montgomery, Ala., native has scored 20-plus points in nine games this season.

Cinmeon Bowers picked up his 12th double-double of the year, scoring 16 points and tying a career-high with 17 rebounds. The junior's 17 boards were the most by an Auburn player in SEC play since former Tiger Korvontey Barber grabbed 17 against LSU in 2009. Bowers finished 7-of-14 and poured in 13 of his 16 points in the second half.

Mississippi State (9-9, 2-3 SEC) finished with four players in double figures led by IJ Ready's 18 points. Gavin Ware posted 16 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the floor and pulled down 17 boards to finish with a double-double. Fred Thomas and Demetrius Houston both scored 10 points apiece.

The Tigers shot 40.3 percent (25-of-62) from the field, including 50 percent (18-of-36) in the second half. The Bulldogs started the night off hot from the floor and finished with a 46.4 shooting percentage (26-of-56) from the floor.

Antoine Mason finished with 10 points for the Tigers, while K.C. Ross-Miller chipped in seven points, three assists and a pair of rebounds. Malcolm Canada added in six points and a team-high five assists off the bench.

Auburn trailed by as many as 18 in the second half, but worked its way back into the game down the stretch. Harrell nailed a three-pointer that made it 67-65 with 2:03 to go, but the Bulldogs answered on the next trip down the floor with a triple from Ready.

After both teams traded early runs to begin the contest, Auburn upped the defensive pressure and put the game in transition giving the Tigers a 21-16 lead midway through the opening frame. But Auburn went cold offensively from the floor, failing to hit a basket over the final 8:18 in the half.

Mississippi State capitalized on the Tigers' slump with a 14-1 run to give the Bulldogs a 31-22 advantage at the half. Auburn also committed 10 first-half turnovers and shot just 28 percent from the field as Mississippi State picked up 17 points off of turnovers and 12 from its bench in the game's first 20 minutes.

The Bulldogs continued their hot shooting into the second half and extended their lead to 18 with 15:22 to go. Auburn made it 52-43 with 12 minutes left, but Mississippi State continued to match the Tigers shot-for-shot to fend off the run.

(AP) Rodney Cooper grabbed the rebound off of Levi Randolph's jumper and laid it in with 5.8 seconds left to give Alabama a hotly contested 57-55 win over Auburn Saturday night in the 150th meeting between the two in-state rivals.

Randolph gave the Crimson Tide the lead three times in the final 2:13, including a 55-53 advantage with :44 left. K.T. Harrell hit a pair of free throws two seconds later to make it 55-55.

After an Alabama time out, Randolph took an open from the free throw line extended, but the errant shot bounced high off the iron and Cooper, looped around an Auburn block to knock down the game winner.

With 4.7 seconds left Tahj Shamsid-Deen quickly dribbled down the court but lost the ball without getting off a shot.

Randolph finished with 18 points to lead Alabama (13-6, 3-3 SEC).

Alabama held a 25-23 lead at the half, but Auburn took control on a jumper by Cinmeon Bowers with 17:37 left to play, sparking a 15-5 run to jump out to a 44-35 lead on a field goal and free throw by Antoine Mason.

The Crimson Tide cut the lead to 44-39 on four free throws by Ricky Tarrant, who picked up his second technical foul of the game with 8:11 left and was disqualified from the game.

Auburn hit both free throws for a 47-39 lead, but the loss of Tarrant energized the Crimson Tide, who regained the lead, 51-50, on a put back and a free throw by Randolph.

Auburn led throughout by as many as five points in the low-scoring first half. The score was tied 21-21 when Alabama tallied four of the final six points of the half to take a 25-23 lead at intermission.

Harrell led Auburn (10-9, 2-4) with 22 points. Bowers added 14 points and eight rebounds and Mason added 13 points.

Antoine Mason scored 16 points and Cinmeon Bowers added in 14 and eight rebounds as Auburn fell 71-61 to Texas A&M Tuesday night at Auburn Arena.

The loss marked the Tigers (10-10, 2-5 SEC) third-straight as Texas A&M (14-5, 5-2 SEC) picked up its fourth-consecutive win in conference play.

The Aggies shot 50 percent (28-of-56) from the field, including 43 percent (6-of-14) from three-point range as Auburn finished the night with a 34 percent (15-of-44) shooting percentage. Texas A&M out-rebounded Auburn, 36-29, on the boards and finished with a 42-14 advantage in points in the paint.

Mason's 16 points match a season-high in SEC play to lead the way for the Tigers. The Queens, N.Y. native was 5-of-14 from the field, collecting three rebounds and two steals. Bowers finished in double-figures for the 17th time this season, pulling down a team-high eight rebounds. The junior finished with one of his most productive nights at the charity stripe in his Auburn career, knocking down 7-of-10 from the free throw line.

KT Harrell finished with 11 points, despite being held scoreless in the first half. Jordan Granger added in seven points and five rebounds.

Texas A&M's Daniel House finished with 22 points, scoring 13 of the first 15 points for the Aggies to open the contest by knocking down four from behind the arc. The junior was 6-of-7 from deep and shot 7-of-10 from the field to lead a balanced scoring attack. Jalen Jones added in 13 points, while Alex Robinson posted 12 points.

The Aggies jumped out to a 15-4 lead quickly to begin the opening half thanks in part to hot shooting from three-point range, but Auburn steadily chipped away at the deficit to close the half.

The Tigers cut the A&M advantage down to 26-24 with 3:41 left as Auburn took advantage of a Texas A&M four-minute scoring drought and continued to get consistent offensive production out of Bowers and Mason.

In the second half, Texas A&M pushed its advantage to double-digits quickly out of the locker room as House knocked down another triple with 13:14 to go. Auburn got within eight points of the lead at the 8:42 mark as Bowers knocked down a free throw, but the Aggies mustered a quick response as Jones dropped in six straight points.
