» March Madness is here and No. 9-seeded Auburn (20-12) has unpacked its shoes ready to dance. The Tigers have a challenging first-round draw in No. 8-seeded Iowa (19-13) as both teams square off in a first-time meeting on Thursday at Legacy Arena in Birmingham. The winner will face either top-seeded Houston (31-3) or No. 16 Northern Kentucky (22-12) in the second round on Saturday.

» Iowa and Auburn are two of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I over the last four years along with the likes of Kansas, Baylor, Arizona, UCLA, Duke, USC, Arkansas, Purdue, Alabama, Creighton, Villanova and Illinois. The Hawkeyes are tied with Virginia with the 13th-most wins in that span (87), while the Tigers are 15th (86).

» With a week's rest to prepare for their first-round matchup, the Tigers look to get over the hump after a tough stretch to end SEC regular season and postseason play. It's evident with eight teams from the league punching their NCAA ticket.

» In the team's last 12 contests, seven have come down-to-the-wire and decided in single digits (average margin of -4.3) including a 3-point loss to Arkansas, 76-73, in the second round of the SEC Tournament on March 9.

» The Tigers turned in a 20-win campaign for the 14th time in program history and in back-to-back seasons under Head Coach Bruce Pearl. Auburn has now recorded 20-win seasons in five out of the last six years. It was also only the second time in program history to record 10-or-more wins in SEC play in five out of six years next to Joel Eaves-coached squads during the 1957-58 to 1962-63 seasons.

SERIES HISTORY

» The Tigers meet Iowa for the first time in program history. Auburn is 1-0 when facing an opponent for the first time this season, which ironically was against another Big Ten team in Northwestern (W, 43-42) on Nov. 23 in the Riviera Division championship game at the Cancun Challenge in Cancun, Mexico.

» Should Auburn advance to the next round, it is 1-6 versus Houston in the all-time series between both schools, but have never faced Northern Kentucky. The Tigers last went head-to-head with the Cougars, a.k.a. Phi Slama Jama, during the 1982-83 season in Houston (L, 65-77).

TIGERS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

» The Tigers earned an at-large bid and their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 117 seasons of Auburn Basketball next to 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2018, 2019 and 2022. It was the program's fourth berth in the last five tournaments.

» AU is 18-11 (.621) all-time in NCAA Tournament games including 6-3 under Coach Pearl.

» This is the first time for the Tigers to be a No. 9 seed playing a No. 8 seed.

» Last season, Auburn reached the second round of the tournament with a first-round victory over Jacksonville State (W, 80-61) on March 18, 2022 in Greenville, S.C.

AUBURN IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

» The Tigers were previously ranked a program-best 32-consecutive weeks in The Associated Press Top 25 Poll this season. The previous school record was 30 weeks from Dec. 19, 1998 to Feb. 29, 2000 under then head coach Cliff Ellis. The all-time school record (AP Poll or Coaches Poll) is 33-consecutive weeks from Dec. 8, 1998 to March 14, 2000 in the Coaches Poll. AU is the 41st program to have two-or-more streaks of at least 30-consecutive AP Poll appearances.

» AU was one of 10 schools to be ranked in the AP Top 25 throughout the 2022 calendar year - one of the goals Auburn Head Coach Bruce Pearl hoped the program and team would achieve as it continues to "Make History."

BIRMINGHAM, HERE WE COME!

» After logging more than 31,000 travel miles since August, and first-and-second-round sites as far as Denver and Sacramento, Auburn landed in its own backyard on Selection Sunday - just a short two-hour drive North to Birmingham.

GAME NOTES

» Auburn's "Road Witnesses" will have another chance to watch the Tigers in-person this season as droves of die-hard fans have filled the arenas of opposing schools in the SEC as well as neutral-site and road games in Cancun, Mexico, Atlanta, Seattle, Los Angeles, Morgantown, W.Va. and Nashville.

» Tiger Walk gatherings at the team hotel this season have stretched from the hotel elevator straight to the team bus. Birmingham will be no exception.

» This will be the fourth time in recent seasons for the Tigers to play in Birmingham at Legacy Arena next to the Mike Slive Invitational versus Middle Tennessee (W, 76-70) in December of 2017, UAB (W, 75-71) in December 2018 and Saint Louis (W, 67-61) in December 2019 respectively.

PEARL AMONG THE DEANS OF COLLEGE BASKETBALL

» Auburn Head Coach Bruce Pearl (15th, 634) ranks among the Top 15 NCAA Division I active coaches with most career wins - one of three coaches in the SEC to top the list next to Kentucky Head Coach John Calipari (4th, 789) and Tennessee Head Coach Rick Barnes (6th, 777).

» Pearl is a three-time SEC Coach of the Year honoree and is the fourth-winningest coach in program history with 172 victories behind Joel Eaves (213), Cliff Ellis (186) and Sonny Smith (173).

» Pearl also ranks eighth amongst the winningest coaches all-time in the SEC having coached at Tennessee (145) and Auburn (172) for 317 victories combined.

A LOOK AT IOWA

» The Hawkeyes are making their fourth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in the last four tournaments held. They received an at-large bid and finished tied for fifth in the Big Ten Conference regular-season standings with an 11-9 mark.

» Iowa handles the ball well averaging just 9.9 turnovers per game, which ranks 12th nationally. Led by graduate guard Connor McCaffery and his nation-leading 3.93 assist-to-turnover ratio, the Hawkeyes are third in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.67) and No. 13 assists per game (16.6).

» The Hawkeyes also boast one of the nation's top scoring offenses (No. 18) averaging 80.2 points per game, which leads the Big Ten. They are 15-1 this season when scoring more than 80 points in a contest.

» They are one win away from their 5th-straight 20-win season under Head Coach Fran McCaffery.



GAME NOTES

TIGERS IN THE NBA

» Auburn has six former players currently playing in the NBA or NBA G League including No. 3 overall draft pick Jabari Smith, who recorded his first career double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds with the Houston Rockets versus the Milwaukee Bucks on Oct. 22. Meanwhile, Utah Jazz big man Walker Kessler tallied 20 points, 21 rebounds and two blocks against the Minnesota Timberwolves on Jan. 16 to become the first rookie in franchise history to record a 20-20 double-double. Kessler is also the first rookie in the NBA to achieve that feat since 2014.

» Jabari Smith and Walker Kessler recently played in the Jordan Rising Stars Game during NBA All-Star Weekend in Salt Lake City, Utah.

HOW THEY GOT THERE

» The Tigers tied Indiana, Iowa State, TCU, West Virginia and Arkansas with the fourth-most head-to-head meetings (17) with NCAA Tournament teams this season including 6 in non-conference (Memphis, Colgate, Texas Southern, USC, West Virginia and Northwestern) and 11 during SEC play. School-record 13 teams besting 10 in 2021. Only Kansas (21), Texas (18) and Baylor (18) had more head-to-head matchups against NCAA squads.

» Although Auburn went 7-10 against the tournament field, it locked up two key Quad 1 wins against nationally-ranked foes in No. 13 Arkansas (W, 72-59) on Jan. 7 and No. 12 Tennessee (W, 79-70) on March 4, to secure a spot in the Big Dance.

» The Tigers beat two automatic qualifiers in Colgate (Patriot League regular-season and tournament champion) and Texas Southern (SWAC tournament champion). They also defeated Northwestern (Big Ten), Washington (Pac-12) and Saint Louis (Atlantic 10).

» Prior to Selection Sunday, Auburn was No. 32 in the NET rankings with 20 games against Quad 1 (13) and Quad 2 (7) opponents. It was the second-most behind 21 games versus Quad 1 and Quad 2 in 2021-23 and the program's highest ever NET ranking (13).

TOURNAMENT SIDEBARS

» This is just the second time that Pearl and McCaffery have coached against each other on the sidelines. Pearl led No. 12-ranked Tennessee to a 78-64 win over McCaffery and Siena College on Nov. 27, 2008, in the first round of the Old Spice Classic in Lake Buena Vista, Fla.

» Pearl served as an assistant coach at Iowa under his mentor Tom Davis from 1986-1992. During their time together in Iowa City, the Hawkeyes made five trips to the NCAA Tournament including an Elite Eight run in 1987 and Sweet 16 appearance in 1988.

» Iowa Assistant Coach Matt Gatens, a four-year starter for the Hawkeyes from 2009-12, previously served as a graduate assistant on Pearl's staff during the 2017-18 season. The Tigers reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 15 years and won a SEC Championship title during his time on the Plains. Gatens aided in the development of the team's guards including All-SEC selections in Bryce Brown and Jared Harper.

WHAT 2 WATCH 4

» Wendell Green Jr. is currently on a career-best consecutive-free throw streak having made 26 of his last 26 attempts from the charity stripe since making his last 9-for-9 against Ole Miss on Feb. 22. He previously made 25-straight free throws from Jan. 7 through Jan. 21. Former Tigers Danjel Purifoy (2016-20) and Frankie Sullivan (2009-10) hold the school record with 27-consecutive made free throws.

THE AUBURN MEN OF MARCH

» Lior Berman, Dylan Cardwell, Allen Flanigan, Wendell Green Jr., Zep Jasper, K.D. Johnson, Chris Moore and Jaylin Williams are all making their second NCAA Tournament appearance having played minutes in last year's historic season. Johnson paces the group averaging 11.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 0.5 steals in two career NCAA games followed by Williams (10.0 ppg, 2.5 rpg, 72.7 FG%), Green Jr. (10.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 5.5 apg) and Flanigan (7.5 ppg, 6.5 rpg).

» Johni Broome is making his second NCAA Tournament appearance, but with two different schools. Broome previously faced West Virginia during his freshman season at Morehead State in the 2021 NCAA Tournament First Round (L, 67-84) notching 10 points and nine rebounds in the No. 3 vs. No. 14 game.



BACK-TO-BACK 20-WIN SEASONS

» Auburn turned in back-to-back 20-win campaigns under Head Coach Bruce Pearl. The Tigers have now turned in 20-win seasons in five of the last six years including the program's 30-10 Final Four run. It was just the 14th time in 117 seasons of Auburn Basketball.

» Prior to Pearl's arrival on The Plains, Auburn had not posted a 20-win season since a 24-12 campaign under former head coach Jeff Lebo in 2008-09 (nine years in-between).

» Pearl (5) boasts the most 20-win seasons of any head coach in program history ahead of Sonny Smith (3), Cliff Ellis (3), Lebo (1), Joel Eaves (1) and Mike Papke (1).

LAST TIME OUT

» Auburn's bench outscored Arkansas' bench, 28-25, in the second round of the SEC Tournament.

» The Tigers made 12 steals versus Arkansas. It was the seventh time this season to make 10-or-more steals in a ballgame and third time against a SEC opponent.

» K.D. Johnson registered a game-high 20 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the field against Arkansas. It marked his 13th game this season in double figures and best career scoring output in a SEC Tournament game. It was also his ninth career 20-point game.

» Johni Broome extended his double-digit scoring streak to seven-consecutive contests with 13 points including 10 in the second half of play against Arkansas.

TOP OF THE PACK

» Over the last six years, Auburn has won the most games of any SEC school with 142 victories against non-conference and conference opponents combined. Tennessee (141) and Kentucky (137) are second and third.

TAKING CARE OF THE BASKETBALL

» The Tigers dished out 18 assists with just 6 turnovers (3.0 assist-to-turnover ratio) versus the Volunteers behind seven assists with zero turnovers from senior forward Jaylin Williams on March 4 - the team's second-best assist-to-turnover ratio behind 4.4 (22-to-5) against Georgia on Feb. 1.

» It was the seventh time this season that Williams had a flawless game behind 7-to-0 against Texas A&M on Jan. 25.

» Auburn is 7-1 this season when making single-digit miscues on the floor.

TOP WINS IN THE BRUCE PEARL ERA

» The Tigers' upset of No. 12-ranked Tennessee on March 4 was among the top home wins against a Top 25 opponent in the Bruce Pearl Era. AU also beat No. 13 Arkansas, 72-59, on Jan. 7. It was the largest margin of victory (+13) of those victories against Top 15 opposition.

WINNING WITH (SENIOR) CLASS

» This year's senior class comprised of Allen Flanigan, Jaylin Williams, Zep Jasper, Babatunde Akingbola, Lior Berman and Chandler Leopard are one of the winningest in program history.

» 'Make History,' they did, being crowned 2021-22 SEC regular-season champions, securing a NCAA Tournament berth and earning the program's first No. 1 national ranking in 2022.

» This year's senior class has also compiled an impressive 86-38 overall record and went 44-28 in SEC play over the last four seasons. This ranks as the fifth-most league wins in a four-year span behind 50 from 1958-62, 49 from 1957-61, 46 from 1959-63 and 45 from 2018-2022.

AGAINST THE TOP 25

» Auburn is 77-222 all-time against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and 2-3 this season. The Tigers last beat a team ranked inside of the Top 5 during their 2019 NCAA Final Four Run - No. 7 Kentucky (77-71) in overtime in the Elite Eight on March 31, 2019.

» The program's highest win over a ranked opponent was an upset of No. 1 Kentucky (W, 53-52) on Jan. 9, 1988.

SWEET HOME ALABAMA ... AND AUBURN

» The state of Alabama is not only known for football, but also basketball. Over the last four years, Auburn has compiled an impressive 86-38 overall record, 44-28 SEC mark under Bruce Pearl and was ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation in 2021-22. Meanwhile, Alabama has posted an 90-41 overall record, 49-23 SEC mark and has been ranked as high as No. 1 this season under Nate Oats.

» The Tigers and Crimson Tide have won a combined five SEC Championship titles over the last six years - Auburn in 2018 (co-regular season champions), 2019 (tournament champions) and 2022 (regular season champions). Alabama in 2021 (regular season and tournament champions) and 2023 (regular season and tournament champions).

» Minus the COVID 2019-20 season, both teams have gone dancing twice in the last five years including a memorable 2019 Final Four run for the Tigers and 2021 Sweet 16 appearance for the Crimson Tide.

GAME NOTES

DENY THE THREE

» Auburn held Mississippi State to 0-for-18 shooting from beyond the arc on Jan. 14. It was the first time this season to hold an opponent to zero threes made.

» The Tigers currently rank No. 5 nationally in 3-point field-goal percentage defense holding opponents to 28.8% from beyond the arc behind Tennessee (26.2%), Houston (27.8%), Alabama (28.1%) and St. Bonaventure (28.7%).

» They also denied No. 13-ranked Arkansas to just 2-of-16 from three (12.5%) on Jan. 7 as well as USF (2-of-14, 14.3%) and Texas Southern (1-of-11, 9.1%) in non-conference play.

HOME SWEET HOME

» Auburn had 16-straight capacity crowds of 9,121 during the 2022-23 season. The Tigers have now seen 39-consecutive regular-season capacity crowds (minus the COVID season in 2020-21) at Neville Arena.

» The Tigers have sold out season tickets every season under Coach Pearl making a seat in Neville Arena the toughest and hottest ticket in town.

» For the first time in Neville Arena history, Auburn sold out 16-of-16 regular-season home games during the 2021-22 season. The Tigers were one of only nine schools to sell out all of its home games next to Arkansas, Dayton, Duke, Gonzaga, Grand Canyon, Michigan State, Purdue and Villanova.

MAKING CHARITY COUNT

» Junior guard Wendell Green Jr. (83.5%) is one of four players shooting 70 percent or better when going to the line this season along with Allen Flanigan (76.7%), Jaylin Williams (76.8%) and Chris Moore (71.4%).

» The Tigers shot a season-best 91.7 percent from the charity stripe versus Ole Miss (22-of-24) on Feb. 22 - their best percentage of the season next to the Alabama (84.6%), Ole Miss (81.8%), Missouri (80.0%), Memphis (79.2%), USC and Arkansas (77.3%) games.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

» With an 11-to-12 player rotation, the Tigers are one of the top teams in the nation in bench points per game (84th, 22.4 ppg) showing their depth.

» Ten players are averaging double-digit minutes, including one true freshman in Tre Donaldson (10.5 min.).

BLOCK PARTY

» Auburn ranks No. 12 nationally and third in the SEC in blocks per game (5.1) behind its two-headed monster: Johni Broome (11th, 2.3 bpg) and Dylan Cardwell (76th, 1.4 bpg).

» The Tigers finished the 2020-21 (163) and 2021-22 seasons (272) as the NCAA Division I statistical leaders in the category. They are looking to defend that title in 2022-23.

WILLIAMS ON SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

» Jaylin Williams was named to the SEC Community Service Team for his volunteer work off-the-court. Throughout his four-year career, he has been active in team-and Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC)-led community service projects. Last summer, he and his teammates volunteered at Our House, a local mission outreach program that assists children and families who live in Auburn Public Housing.

» Williams also spent time at Oak Park Retirement Home visiting and playing bingo with residents as part of Tigers Give Back Community Service Day. Through the Jason Dufner Foundation, he helped stuff backpacks to aid in the organization's mission to end child hunger in Lee County, Alabama. Every week, volunteers pack over 1,400 bags of food for children in the county.

» In addition to his involvement in the surrounding community, Williams had the unique opportunity to serve the campus community as an intern with Auburn Wheelchair Basketball, a wheelchair basketball team developed through a collaboration between the Auburn University Office of Accessibility and School of Kinesiology, which is his major. Every week during the fall semester, Williams would coach and motivate wheelchair student-athletes, who named the "J-Will Drill," after him.

BEST OF THE BEST

» Auburn is the winningest program, by wins and percentage, over the last six years in the SEC with an impressive 74-15 overall record (.831) versus non-conference opponents. AU (15th) is among an elite list of schools that have won the most games (86) over the last four seasons.

FREQUENT FLYERS

» The Tigers have racked up lots of frequent flyer miles this year including Cancun (880 miles), Los Angeles (1,946 miles) and Seattle (2,182 miles). The Cancun Challenge was the team’s second international trip after taking a preseason foreign tour to Israel in August (6,437 miles).

» Auburn is one of only six Power 5 schools to play three true road games on campus of a non-conference opponent this season (USC, Washington and West Virginia). AU the only school of those six to play against another Power 5 foe in each of those three contests.

ATLANTA A HOTBED FOR AUBURN TALENT

» If you build it, they will come ... from Atlanta. Since 2019 and Auburn’s Final Four run, Atlanta has been a recruiting hotbed for the Tigers with five being developed into next-level players. It all started with Chuma Okeke, currently a power forward with the Orlando Magic, who was drafted 16th overall in the 2019 NBA Draft. He signed with Auburn out of Westlake High School in Atlanta.

PLAYER TO WATCH: LIOR BERMAN

» It will be a homecoming for senior guard and Birmingham native, Lior Berman, who has risen from walk-on player to a regular member in the Tigers’ rotation this season. Berman previously starred at Mountain Brook High School, where he won three state championship titles under Head Coach Bucky McMillan, now the head coach at Samford. During his senior year, he led his alma mater to a No. 5 national ranking. Berman is a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll and Academic All-District student majoring in industrial design. He has played in 23 of the team’s 32 games this season averaging a career-best 2.3 points and 1.2 rebounds, while shooting 40.7 percent from behind the 3-point arc.



GAME NOTES

TIGERS INK HOLLOWAY

Charlotte, North Carolina, native Aden Holloway became the first recruit in the Class of 2023 to sign his NLI continuing the five-star recruiting pipeline that Head Coach Bruce Pearl and his staff have successfully installed on the Plains. The Tigers have consistently nabbed top-rated talent on the recruiting trail including NBA Lottery picks in the 2019 and 2021 classes, three ESPN 100 prospects in the 2020 class and two ESPN 100 prospects in the 2022 class. The 6-foot-1, 165-pound point guard currently attends Prolific Prep in Napa, Calif. He is ranked No. 21 overall in the Class of 2023 by ESPN and No. 33 overall by Rivals.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY COMES TO THE PLAINS AGAIN

- » For the third time in program history, Auburn hosted ESPN's College GameDay on The Plains for its in-state rivalry game versus Alabama on Feb. 11
- » Auburn, Duke and Kansas are the only three basketball schools to host College GameDay the last three seasons of the show in 2020, 2022 and 2023. The show did not air during the 2020-21 COVID season.
- » The Tigers are now 2-1 in their College GameDay campus visits which include victories over then No. 13-ranked Kentucky (W, 75-66) on Feb. 1, 2020, and Texas A&M (W, 75-58) on Feb. 12, 2022, as the No. 1 team in the land.
- » Auburn is tied for ninth all-time with UConn, Arizona, Memphis, Notre Dame and Baylor, as a College GameDay host school (3) in basketball.

1,000 POINT CLUB WATCH

» Johni Broome collected his 1,000th career point versus Winthrop on Nov. 15. He also recorded his 36th career double-double with 18 points and 13 rebounds. He reached that milestone in 67 career games played for Morehead State and Auburn combined. Wendell Green Jr. joined Broome by reaching the 1,000-point benchmark against Georgia State on Dec. 14.

Auburn Head Coach Bruce Pearl is in his ninth season on The Plains.

He has guided the Tigers to over 150+ wins in eight seasons, the program's first-ever No. 1 ranking in both national polls and a memorable run to the NCAA Final Four in 2019.

Pearl's accomplishments also include three Southeastern Conference Regular Season Championships, one SEC Tournament Championship and four NCAA Tournament berths with the Tigers.

Last season, Auburn posted a 28-6 overall record - the third-most wins in school history, turned in the program's first-ever undefeated season at home at Neville Arena (16-0) and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

The Tigers finished the historic campaign ranked No. 8 in the final Associated Press Poll and No. 14 in the final USA TODAY/Coaches Poll. They also finished No. 13 overall in the final NCAA Men's Basketball NET Rankings.

The postseason saw two of its very own drafted in the NBA First Round with All-American Jabari Smith being selected No. 3 overall by the Houston Rockets and All-American Walker Kessler selected No. 22 overall by the Memphis Grizzlies (traded to Minnesota Timberwolves and Utah Jazz).

Smith took home National Freshman of the Year honors, while Kessler was tabbed National Defensive Player of the Year. Both joined Chuma Okeke (No. 16 overall in 2019), Isaac Okoro (No. 5 overall in 2020), JT Thor (No. 37 overall in 2021) and Sharife Cooper (No. 48 overall in 2021) as Tigers drafted into the NBA and developed by Pearl and his coaching staff.

Off-the-court, Auburn was one of six NCAA Division I men's basketball programs to finish in the Top 25 of the Final Associated Press Top 25 Poll and achieve a 3.0 or higher team grade-point average. during the 2021-22 season.

The Tigers were among nine schools to sell out all of its home games during the 2021-22 season.

Since he arrived at Auburn for the 2014-15 season, Pearl has produced one of the biggest turnarounds in the college basketball landscape. Prior to his arrival, Auburn has an average RPI of 191.8.

In the past four seasons, the Tigers finished their campaign 16th, 13th, 27th and 11th respectively in the final RPI.

His teams have been just as successful off the court as Auburn has had 31 graduates since 2014 - the most in the SEC.

The 2018-19 season was arguably the greatest season in Auburn basketball history. The Tigers won 30 games for the first time ever en route to becoming the first team from the state of Alabama to reach the Final Four.

'It was tough' Inside Allen Flanigan's Recovery Process, Return to Auburn Basketball

AUBURN, Ala. – Ahead by six points with 1:24 left to play against Georgia State earlier this season, Jaylin Williams lofted an inbound pass down the court to a streaking Allen Flanigan that would've made Cam Newton proud.

Flanigan, who had a step on his defender like his name was Darvin Adams, caught the pass in stride and took one dribble from halfcourt before slamming it down at the rim with two hands, shutting the door on the Panthers and their would-be upset bid.

Less than a minute later, he forced a steal and punched a tomahawk dunk on the ensuing fast break with enough violence to make him lose his balance upon crashing to the Neville Arena floor. It wasn't his best game of the season – he scored just six points on 40% shooting from the field – but it showed the explosiveness Auburn basketball missed while he was recovering from a partially ruptured Achilles tendon.

"Al's dunk last night was an energy booster," teammate Chris Moore said the day after the game. "We needed that. The whole bench went crazy."

Flanigan ruptured his Achilles in an accident involving a scooter more than a year ago during the offseason between his sophomore and junior seasons. He was coming off a campaign in 2020-21 during which he averaged 14.3 points and 5.5 rebounds per game as Auburn's starting small forward.

There was NBA draft buzz around his name, and another season on the Plains like he had as a sophomore would've surely been enough to punch his ticket to the league, and maybe even garner some first-round attention.

But then the injury threw a wrench in his plans.

"It was tough," Flanigan said. "Just being in the spot where I wanted to be, and then having that taken away from me. But God doesn't make mistakes. You've got to trust him through everything, so just accept it as it is. It happened. I can't change it."

Flanigan began a long and tedious recovery process immediately after the injury. Dr. Norman Waldrop of Andrews Sports Medicine & Orthopaedic Center in Birmingham conducted his surgery and handed him off to Auburn's physical therapist, Dave Walsh, and the university's senior athletic trainer, Clark Pearson, upon the completion of the operation.

The path for Flanigan to get back on the floor had a few big checkpoints. First was surgery, then rehab, then strengthening his leg before finally getting cleared for on-court work. Seems simple enough, but the nature of Flanigan's rupture presented some unique challenges.

Instead of a complete tear of the Achilles, which is typically the case with athletes, Flanigan's tendon was approximately 75% ruptured. It allowed him to come back more quickly than most players who've suffered similar injuries, but it clouded what the recovery would look like.

"I have not dealt with a partial (tear) before," Pearson said. "In sports, they're just not common. That's more of a trauma-related type (of) injury that happens in car wrecks or farm accidents and things of that nature that we don't see a whole lot. All of my Achilles have been complete ruptures, and they're a little more streamlined. They're a little more regimented."

Pearson worked with Flanigan daily to get him in a good enough shape to be handed off to Damon Davis, the team's strength and conditioning coach, for the next step in the process. Pearson said his team essentially had to retrain Flanigan how to run.

They had him working on an AlterG treadmill, a device that uses air pressure to limit the impact on an athlete's lower body while running, and utilized force plates to determine the impact Flanigan was using to catch himself after jumping. It was an analytic- and technology-filled affair.

"We started at the bottom of his feet and went north," Pearson said.

Once Davis got ahold of Flanigan, he began the project of restrengthening his injured leg. After Flanigan could complete tasks like heel raises and have control while doing them, Davis had the exercises become more dynamic to get him comfortable exploding off that leg again.

Davis also worked on other parts of Flanigan's body before getting cleared to strengthen his leg. The two focused on his upper body and his uninjured leg, the latter due to a phenomenon called the "cross-transfer effect." The idea behind it, according to Davis, is that if you train a healthy limb that is opposite of an injured one, the nervous system will keep the injured limb stronger than it would if nothing was done at all.

"We all have some gray area that overlaps within there," Davis said. "But like I said, the docs have to hand it to the PTs, the PTs give it to Clark, Clark gives it to me and then once I've had him for a certain amount of time, that's when the on-court work starts to happen."

Flanigan returned to the floor roughly four months after his surgery. His first game back was a win against Murray State in which he played 12 minutes, but he followed that a week later with a 10-point performance against LSU. He also added six rebounds and three steals in that game.

"Everybody (was) thinking he's back, but at the end of the day that was all on adrenaline," said Wes Flanigan, Allen's father and an assistant coach on the team. "He was excited; it was all on adrenaline. Two or three weeks later, the real havoc hits us (and Allen was like), 'Hey man, my body is not where it was a year ago.'"

Flanigan would finish his truncated junior season averaging 6.3 points on 39.5% shooting from the field and 20.5% shooting from 3-point range, a far cry from the numbers he put up a year prior. He briefly tested the NBA waters and had a solid showing at the NBA G League Elite Camp – 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting over two games, as well as six rebounds and five assists – but ultimately decided to come back to Auburn for his senior season.

In a role off the bench so far in 2022, Flanigan has stepped up and flashed some of the talent he showed as a sophomore. He's proven to be one of the more reliable 3-point shooters on the team, as he knocked down shots from long range at a 36.7% clip through the first ten games of the season, and his length and reacquired lateral quickness makes him arguably the roster's most dynamic perimeter defender.

But Wes is still waiting for a defining game to signify his son has fully returned to form. He thinks he's been solid through the nonconference schedule but also believes he has another gear to tap into.

"That game to me would look like me going out and physically dominating ..." Flanigan said. "Just using my athleticism, speed, quickness and strength to the best of my ability. Just dominating the game, knocking down shots (and) getting stops defensively."

Although Flanigan conceded he had to clear a few mental hurdles when he first returned to play, he said the Achilles is no longer bothering him and isn't on his mind while on the court. Pearson, who would cringe at times when Flanigan first came back, said he doesn't worry anymore, either.

But if the Tigers are really lucky, that game Wes is waiting for to fully mark his son's return will come sooner rather than later. And if Flanigan has anything to say about it, those thundering dunks against Georgia State won't be his last highlight-reel plays of the season.

"I never wanted to change who I am (as a player) because it's like a part of my personality," Flanigan said. "I'm a downhill player. I like contact. I'm not going to shy away from contact. I want to feel you and then be able to jump into you and get contact finishes. When I first came back, I remember the first practice Clark let me in, the first or second play I went downhill and jumped into Jabari (Smith Jr.) and them.

"Seeing me run and jump, (Pearson) was like, 'Whoa. Slow down just a little bit.'"

Auburn's Bryant Smith Mentors Tigers: 'That's Why I'm Here'

AUBURN, Ala. – When members of Auburn’s men’s basketball team started referring to Bryant Smith as “Smooove,” the former Tigers hoop star knew he’d been accepted.

The progression from B. Smith to B. Smooth to “Smooove” came soon after Smith joined Auburn as a student assistant in September.

“I’m embracing it,” Smith said. “When the team gives you a nickname, it says they’re bringing you in the fold.”

Smith serves as both a teacher and a student. Like the players he mentors, he’s working on completing his Auburn University degree.

A four-year letterwinner on the Plains from 1996-99, Smith helped the Tigers go 29-4 and earn a No. 2 ranking while winning the program’s second SEC championship as a senior in 1999.

“When they come in the locker room and see me on my computer doing my work, they’ll call me by nickname: ‘Hey Smooove. What are you doing? Why are you in school? You have everything.’

“I do but I don’t,” he said. “I think that helps them bring it all together. As a student-athlete, regardless of how old you are, the education part is a part you want to have.”

Smith arrived at Auburn from Huntsville at age 17. He attributes his 14-year professional basketball career overseas to attributes he learned at Auburn: being humble, genuine, a hard worker, hospitable and keeping faith his top priority.

When his playing career ended, Smith returned to Huntsville and founded the Winning Foundation to help at-risk kids. Returning to Auburn in a new role, Smith says, allowed him to pursue his calling on a bigger stage.

“It was a step up,” he said. “It was like I was being promoted.

“I’ve had a lot of mistakes and experiences when I was here on the Plains two decades ago. That’s my role, to have those meaningful conversations with a young man to help him understand how to become a student-athlete.

“We have enough basketball minds. I have some input there but more so I keep my focus on the young men.”

Smith encourages student-athletes to pursue their academics with the same zeal they have for on-court skill development, video study and weight training.

“That’s the easy part for us because basketball is our passion,” he said. “How do you motivate and have it make sense for a young man on the educational side? How do you help them

understand that you can play basketball for only so long? What are you going to do at the age of 40 when you walk away from the game? What is your plan?

“I try to have those conversations with these young men to plan for life after basketball. They have to buy into the Auburn Creed: hard work, education, your faith. To not just be conscious of it, but to live it. To help them understand this is the Auburn way.

“The things I learned at Auburn two decades ago carried over with me when I was traveling abroad.”

That’s why Smith, at age 45, is back on the Plains. To complete his degree, and to urge others to earn theirs.

“This whole opportunity to come back to Auburn, not only to pour into the young men but to obtain my education as well at Auburn University,” he said. “It’s special.”

Scheduled to graduate in sociology in May, Smith began talking to head coach Bruce Pearl about the coming back to Auburn last year, shortly before Bryant’s mother died of pancreatic cancer.

“It’s going to be a hard moment, but it’s going to be joyful,” he said of Auburn’s spring Commencement. “I always knew she wanted me to finish. She’ll have to look down on me when I walk across that stage. I can see that being bittersweet.”

Smith says sociology, the study of human society, is a great fit for him because he learned to respect other people’s cultures while living and playing professionally in Italy, France, Bulgaria and Cyprus, among other stops.

“It’s not just my major, it’s part of my life,” he said. “I like to say I’m a professional people watcher.”

A listener more than a talker, Smith saves most of his conversations for one-on-one settings, preferring to lead by example and let his actions do most of the talking.

“Even when I don’t think they’re watching me, they’re watching,” he said. “Our young people are always watching us. I have a responsibility to carry myself in the right way and speak to them in the right way.”

Smith appreciates Pearl’s commitment to develop Auburn’s student-athletes in all areas: athletically, academically, spiritually and in community involvement.

“That’s what attracted me back to Auburn,” said Smith, who has returned to the Plains the past five summers to work at Pearl’s basketball camps. “I love how BP speaks to young men about their faith and their education.

“When you implement those two things within your program, you have a chance to develop the young man. After that, then your program takes off. I saw how he was a player’s coach. That’s what attracted me.”

Pearl prioritizes the involvement of Auburn’s former players, Smith says.

“That kept me coming back because I felt welcomed,” Smith said. “He created that culture.

“I’m in a win-win situation. How can I not be? I’m at Auburn University. I’m learning from one of the best coaches in the nation, and his coaching staff. I’m still able to spend time with young adults because I love kids.

“I’m having fun. Even if it doesn’t look like it, I’m enjoying myself. I’m still learning and I’m still able to pour out into our young people.”

Smith stresses the importance of networking, leveraging student-athletes’ platforms to make connections that will help them once they leave Auburn.

“I try to ensure that our young men have the information to be able to connect to what they want to do outside of basketball,” Smith said. “BP wants the best for all his players. Let’s help you navigate and overcome barriers so you can you become the success story we want you to be.”

With his basketball exploits a quarter century ago, Bryant Smith played an important role in Auburn’s past.

With his investment this season, he’s filling a key role in its present while preparing student-athletes for their futures.

“Being able to live out my passion of mentoring and helping young people realize their potential,” he said. “I couldn’t ask for a better movie to play out than to be able to come back, be part of a great, growing men’s basketball program, and show by example.

“I love Auburn. This is in my DNA. Any way I can help our young men become better, I feel like that’s why I’m here.”

Moments To Remember: Experience at ECU Key To Wendell Green Jr.'s Growth

The essence of Wendell Green Jr., from Mike Allen's perspective, started with a struggle — although that can be hard to picture when charting Green's Auburn career.

Now in his second season on the Plains, Green was a model of consistency coming off the bench last year, logging splits that — whether home or away, or a win or loss — looked nearly identical. He's gone from key reserve to starter this year, and, as No. 25 Auburn gets set to face No. 2 Tennessee at 1 p.m. Saturday in Knoxville, he's been crucial to the Tigers' success.

Consistency has been vital in that, but the results weren't always so consistent.

Before he was the Tigers' feature guard and leading scorer, he was someone Allen — an Eastern Kentucky assistant men's basketball coach — had a direct hand in developing and recruiting, and Allen now remembers Green's beginning.

"Wendell, as you look at his stats," Allen said, "he had a rough shooting start to the beginning of the season. But mind you, when he came into the game, you could feel the difference, because he's a complete winner."

Then a freshman for Eastern Kentucky, Green tested positive for COVID-19 ahead of the 2020-21 season. His return to practice was a day prior to the Colonels' season-opener against North Florida. He logged 28 minutes against the Ospreys, but he shot 4 of 12 with 12 points.

It began a career-opening slump. Double-digit scoring lines were peppered throughout, but in his first 10 games, he only shot better than 40% four times. It wasn't until the New Year that he had a breakout performance, logging 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting, to help beat Austin Peay.

"Through that process of recovering, he never lost the identity of who he was," Allen said. "By all means, he was missing (shots). He was still trying to get his body back, but his confidence stayed, that air stayed, that competitiveness stayed, and that's where the turning point came.

"Once his body caught up, that's where it came, to where everything else started flourishing."

Green's time in Eastern Kentucky was crucial. He told the Opelika-Auburn News this week that it was instrumental in carrying his confidence to college. In discussing it with him and his coaches, the mindsets instilled there and throughout his career show up in how he has performed as a Tiger.

"I don't think I could have played at Auburn my freshman year, being who I was my freshman year at Eastern Kentucky," Green said. "So I think that (season) just transferred my confidence to the collegiate level, because they let me play. They saw what I could do in high school. I came in, they let me start from day one."

Both Allen and ECU head coach AW Hamilton remembered what Green did in high school vividly. He was tough and fiery, Allen said, and both he and Hamilton saw a distinct chip on Green's shoulder.

"I loved him from the moment I saw him," Hamilton said. "He was a high-major player when we got him."

At La Lumiere School in LaPorte County, Indiana, Green facilitated for one of the best teams in high school basketball. He played alongside high-major standouts and first-round NBA Draft picks in Isaiah Stewart and Jaden Ivey. He went toe-to-toe with them, too, whether it was Cole Anthony or Josh Green.

"There was a sense that he played big for the biggest moments, that he wanted the biggest shots, he wanted the ball in his hands when his team needed at the most," La Lumiere assistant Brian Tonino said. "The passes, the lobs, the stuff that he does at Auburn — where it's like, 'there's no way he's gonna escape out of this situation' and then, all of a sudden, it's a dunk — he had that kind of flare back playing in high school."

But high-major programs weren't beating down his door. Tonino, Allen and Hamilton all wonder why the case wasn't different, and so does Green. The guard goes back to his size, at 5-foot-11, or not playing on big-shoe AAU circuits growing up. In Green's eyes, the lack of interest went hand-in-hand with a lifelong narrative.

"I think that's probably been the story of my life, just being overlooked," Green said. "Probably because of my size, but, you know, I just find a way to still get the job done."

So, Green went where he was wanted and, again, got the job done.

After busting his early season slump, Green ended his lone season in Richmond, Kentucky, averaging 15.8 points, and he averaged 18.7 points from the Austin Peay win to the season's end. The All-Ohio Valley first-teamer finished second behind current teammate Johni Broome in conference Freshman of the Year voting.

Green hasn't had many slumps to bust since Eastern Kentucky. He has only logged five back-to-back scoring performances of fewer than 10 points in 85 career games. Four of those have come at Auburn, but none this season.

With five single-digit scoring nights this year, Green has yet to score less than 10 points in the following contest. That includes going from a nine-point outing against West Virginia to dropping 18 points on 6-of-11 shooting against Georgia on Wednesday.

After games like West Virginia, Green said it's easy to look back to his start.

"If I have bad games now, I can always relate it back to that (slump) and be like, 'It's just gonna work out.'" Green said. "Because I work out so much, I work on my game so much. So I don't think me shooting bad is like, 'Oh, I'm not working out, or I'm being lazy.' It's just like, 'It's just not going in right now.' It's just keeping my mind steady."

'Still Life to Live': Grandfather of Auburn's Cardwell AUTLIVES Cancer

AUBURN, Ala. – Dylan Cardwell has always been a fan favorite at Auburn. Whether he's taking his shirt off on the jumbotron at football games or chest bumping fans during basketball games, he's always having fun and bringing joy to others.

His grandfather, Thomas Johnson, is the exact same way.

Like Cardwell, Johnson is always dancing, always laughing, always joyful. He's the center of attention in any room he walks into. He has that same infectious personality.

"We're the same person," said Cardwell, the center of attention at any sporting event he attends. "I learned who I wanted to be by watching him. He's the leader of our family tree, and he's a great example of the man I want to be.

"I always tell people if he went to Auburn, he'd be a better Auburn Man than me."

The two even share a namesake as Cardwell's middle name is Thomas after his grandfather.

Growing up, Johnson was Cardwell's biggest fan. When Cardwell transferred to Oak Hill Academy in Virginia as a junior in high school, Johnson still made an effort to attend as many of his games as he could from his home in Augusta, Georgia. When Cardwell was a freshman at Auburn, Johnson traveled to every single home game and made it to any of the road games within driving distance.

Even at 80 years old, Johnson did not miss an opportunity to watch his grandson play.

It was supposed to be that way again last year with Johnson coming to see Cardwell play any and every chance he got, but Cardwell got a phone call the same day Auburn opened the season against Morehead State and found out Johnson had been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. It was crushing. Johnson was unable to attend any of Auburn's games.

For Cardwell, it was especially difficult at last year's AUTLIVE game against Texas A&M where he held up one of the placards with Thomas Johnson's name on it.

"It was emotional because I wanted my grandfather to be at that game," Cardwell said. "It's just hard. From going to all my games to missing all my games, it was tough for me. I sent a picture to him at halftime and said, 'Hey, I've got you covered.'"

It's been over a year since Johnson got the initial diagnosis, and he's still battling the disease. He's got more radiation treatments this week. However, while Johnson has not been able to see Cardwell play in person since the 2020-21 season, the two talk almost every day.

"Our relationship has always been strong, but with him having cancer, it's grown a whole lot more because I get to be more intentional with the time I spend with him," Cardwell said. "Now

I know how fragile life is. I'm grateful I have a grandfather like my own and that I can talk to him each and every day and that he's still here on this earth. He's not gone."

This year's AUTLIVE game is Saturday. Cardwell will once again have his grandfather's name written on his placard, but there's a chance, if all goes well this week, that Johnson will be there in Neville Arena when Auburn hosts Alabama. Not because it's a rivalry game. Not because College Gameday will be in town. But because it's the AUTLIVE game.

"I honestly don't think my grandfather would be trying to come to the Alabama game if it wasn't the AUTLIVE Cancer game," Cardwell said.

AUTLIVE itself started in 2009 (as OUTLIVE) with Bruce Pearl when he was the head coach at Tennessee. It was in recognition of former Volunteer Chris Lofton who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and local treatment. Pearl brought the initiative to Auburn with him, and it has grown every year with the emphasis on raising awareness of cancer prevention and detection.

"Cancer is such a scary term," Cardwell said. "I just love the term AUTLIVE because it says to go beyond that – to outlive it and outlive the circumstances that you're in. I just feel like it's such an inspirational thing to get behind because of the stories behind it with Chris (Lofton) from Tennessee. Having cancer shouldn't put you in a box. That's not the end-all, be-all. There's still life to live.

"The fact that we get to go on the court and raise up a sign about who we're fighting for and who we're playing for, it just reminds us of our reason why."

That "why" for Cardwell is his grandfather, his best friend. He hopes more than anything that Johnson will be able to attend Saturday. He wants his grandfather to truly experience The Jungle for the first time. He wants him to see Auburn shock the world. But more importantly, Cardwell simply wants his grandfather to watch him play in person again. Because tomorrow is not promised.

"If I see my grandfather in the stands, it's going to mean the world to me," Cardwell said. "I pray it's the best game I've ever played in my life. That's what he deserves."

He's Got Jared: Auburn's Jalen Harper Follows Brother's Path to the Plains

AUBURN, Ala. – As a high school senior in 2019, Jalen Harper often drove to Auburn from his home in Atlanta to watch his favorite team play basketball.

While Auburn fans sang “We’ve Got Jared” during the Tigers’ magical run to the Final Four, Jalen hummed a different tune.

“He Ain’t Heavy, He’s My Brother.”

“That was amazing, seeing how big Auburn could be,” said Jalen Harper, Jared’s younger brother. “Seeing my brother’s college on the large scale in that sold-out arena in Minneapolis, it was crazy.”

Fast forward three years. Jalen Harper looked for a new college basketball program to join after beginning his career at Florida Gulf Coast then transferring to junior colleges in Indiana and Tuscaloosa.

Harper had another D-I scholarship opportunity but thought his playing time would be limited because of the team’s backcourt depth.

Then, it hit him.

“If I’m going to sit the bench, I might as well go home and go to my family,” Harper said.

That’s how four years after Jared Harper helped make history at Auburn, there’s another J. Harper on the Plains. No. 55, a 6-1 scout team point guard.

“For the first couple months I was in shock,” Harper said. “I’m like, ‘Wow, I’m in practice with Coach Bruce Pearl.’ My brother was here, it was all crazy.”

On the scout team, it’s Harper’s job to quickly learn and simulate the plays each Auburn opponent utilizes, a new role for Jalen but one that he’s embracing.

“I remember seeing Pat Keim around all the time but I never knew how big of a role his scout team played in getting them prepared,” Harper said. “It was a different look for me.

“It can be the difference between winning and losing. It really gives the team a look and what they’ll see. It’s how we get so many turnovers on out of bounds. We scout that and we have to do that perfectly in order for them to get the steals in a game.

“Some people may look at scout team like, ‘It’s not that important, I’ll never do that.’ Now I’m doing it and it’s actually very important. You definitely have to sacrifice yourself for the betterment of the team.”

When he played at Shelton State Community College, fewer than 10 miles from the home venue of Auburn's in-state rival, Harper represented the Tigers at every opportunity.

"I still wore my orange there, loud and proud," he said.

Now that he's part of Auburn's basketball program, Jalen carries on a family tradition.

"Feeling like family, people knowing my name and knowing my family, I love that," he said.

Scheduled to graduate from Auburn University in December in sociology, Jalen hopes to make it to the NBA in a different way.

"Personnel and scouting, the inside of the game rather than playing," he said. "I definitely want to be around the game."

While Jared now plays professionally in Valencia, Spain, Jalen still communicates with his big brother multiple times each day.

"By the time I get out of practice, he's in bed, about to shut it down," Jalen said. "He's enjoying it, definitely a new experience. He's getting better. They're teaching him another way of playing the game. They call fewer fouls so he's becoming a better finisher, getting crafter."

Wendell Green Jr. has assumed Jared's PG1 role at Auburn, running the offense, making deep 3-pointers, finding teammates in transition, and earning a nickname from Jalen.

"I call him my nephew because I tell him that's my brother's son," Jalen said, noting that Green puts a twist on the compliment.

"He tries to call me his nephew," Jalen said.

His role differs from that of his legendary brother, but Jalen Harper, in his own way, contributes to Auburn's basketball program, helping the Tigers continue their quest to make history.

"This is big-time, getting this coaching and seeing how a top 25 team operates, how we practice," he said. "I wake up some mornings and say, 'Wow, I'm on a top 25 basketball team, helping them in practice every day. I have to be locked in.'"

"I'm very hard-working and humble. Very grateful for this opportunity."

“Icy Wen” Helps Lead Auburn

AUBURN, Ala. – Since arriving on The Plains last year, junior guard Wendell Green Jr. has wasted no time becoming a fan favorite on and off the court. From draining three-pointers from the logo to providing a clutch defensive presence, Green does a little bit of everything.

Basketball is something that runs deep for Green.

“I’ve been playing basketball mostly my whole life, as long as I can remember,” he said. “With other sports too, but, you know, it came to a point where [I needed to] pick a sport. My dad was a coach; I was around it the most. Probably around (age) 10 or 11, I knew I wanted to take it seriously and was pretty good growing up.”

Green began his college career at Eastern Kentucky but joined the Tigers last year for his sophomore season.

“At the end of the day, it’s all basketball,” Green said on the transition. “It wasn’t too big of a challenge except learning the system and playing for a new coach. It was different at first; it took me a little while throughout the summer to learn how he (Bruce Pearl) wanted me to play. I guess the transition has been pretty smooth so far, especially last year playing with great players like that, but there was still a lot of learning curves. I think I’m still learning as we keep playing.”

Green made the transition from coming off the bench last year to being the starting point guard this year. The increased role is not something that Green takes lightly.

“Just trying to do whatever it takes to win,” Green said. “That’s the main goal: winning and trying to get a high seed in the [NCAA] tournament and SEC tournament. I know I got to score, I got to pass it out, so just doing whatever it takes to win for that certain game.”

Pearl has developed a reputation as one of the best coaches in college basketball, and Green said getting to play for such a high-caliber coach means a lot to him.

“It’s great — you know he’s a high-energy coach,” Green said. “He lets me play with freedom and he trusts me. We’re going to go out there and try to make a winning play or make a play for the team. He trusts me after all our history the past year and a half, two years. So it’s just fun, it’s free out there.”

The SEC has turned into one of the toughest divisions in college basketball over the past few seasons. Each game presents a challenge, and there is not a lot of time to rest or dwell on a bad performance. Green talked about how he stays locked in throughout the grind of the season.

“Just taking it one game at a time,” he said. “If you lose, don’t worry about that loss too much. Don’t beat yourself up on that loss too much. Just try and get to the next game because you can’t let one loss lead to two or three, or one good win lead to you being cocky and then you

lose the next game. So you just got to take it game by game and take every opponent as serious as the next.”

Like just about every athlete, Green looks up to some of the best in his sport.

“My team has always been the Detroit Pistons,” Green said. “Growing up in Detroit, it’s one of my main teams. I watched a lot of Isaiah Thomas from the Pistons, just a lot of tapes. ... LeBron James is probably my favorite player of all time.”

Green is a big part of this Auburn team both on and off the court. Time will tell how he continues to impact the games he plays in, as well as the community that he has so quickly become a part of.own just a little bit.”

'Enjoy Every Moment': How Allen Flanigan Got His Bounce Back

AUBURN, Ala. – When Allen Flanigan gets a head of steam, it's best to get out of the way.

On Wednesday night against Ole Miss, Flanigan was dribbling the ball up the court in transition. He hesitated briefly at the 3-point line and then put his head down and took off toward the basket where he elevated and threw down one of his patented left-handed slams.

It was violent. It was angry. It was classic Al.

"I just thought he was going to lay the ball up," teammate Zep Jasper said. "I saw him go outside and just rear back with his left hand, and I was like, 'Oh my goodness.' I didn't know he was going to do that. Somebody must have made him mad. He only does that when somebody makes him mad."

"That feeling when I do get a chance to throw one down, it's like a roller coaster for me," Flanigan said. "It boosts my adrenaline. Any time I have the chance to showcase my athleticism, it's tremendous."

Flanigan does not take that feeling for granted. He went nearly an entire calendar year without experiencing it. In August 2022, prior to his junior season at Auburn, he injured his Achilles in a freak accident and was forced to have surgery. Immediately, doubt started to creep in. Will my leg ever be the same? Will I be able to explode off the floor and do the things I'm used to doing?

Not knowing the answers to those questions, Flanigan put his head down and went to work. He started rehab. He was in the gym getting shots up in a chair before he could walk. He went from the chair to walking with a boot to finally putting a regular shoe on. From there, he started jogging, then sprinting, and the final step before he was cleared – he started jumping again.

With him every step of the way was his father, Auburn assistant coach Wes Flanigan, who went through a similar setback when he was a player at Auburn. As a junior, Wes found out he had bone cancer. Like Allen, basketball was taken away from Wes. Just like that.

"The good thing about the whole scenario (with Allen) is that I had my situation to kind of draw from," Wes said. "I knew it was going to be a struggle. He didn't realize that. He was just like me. He thought that once he came back, the light was going to be switched back on, and he was going to be the same Allen Flanigan he was as a sophomore. I knew better than that."

Allen Flanigan made his 2021-22 debut on Dec. 22, 2021, against Murray State, nearly four months after he suffered the injury, but he wasn't 100 percent.

Over the next two months, Auburn would rise to No. 1 in the polls for the first time in program history behind guys like Jabari Smith, Walker Kessler and Wendell Green Jr. Flanigan, still fighting pain in his leg, saw his role diminish from what it was the year before.

“It was definitely a bittersweet feeling knowing that I wasn’t one of the guys coming off the injury,” he said. “Seeing guys like Jabari, Walker and Wendell step up and be able to deliver, it was really eye-opening for me just knowing I didn’t have to do what I did the year before. I soaked into that role and tried to do what I could to help the team.”

That team, Flanigan included, won a ring as the SEC regular season champion.

For Flanigan, this season has been even more meaningful because he’s got his bounce back. In August, one full year after the injury, he was exploding off the floor, getting by guys in practice, knocking down shots – he felt like his old self again.

It’s translated to the court. Through the first 15 SEC games, Flanigan is averaging 10.8 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. It might not be the same numbers he put up two years before the injury, but that has more to do with this team and his role on it.

“For me this year, I’m one of those guys when you insert me into the game, I’m just trying to find ways to win,” Flanigan said. “I’m not really worried about numbers or anything. I just want to do whatever the team needs. If we need it more on the boards that night, I’m rebounding and blocking out and making defensive plays. If they need me to score, I can score the ball, too. It’s really just picking up the pieces.”

“We got through that moment (last year), and I think my child learned a lot from that situation moving forward,” Wes Flanigan said. “For me, as a father, to see the growth and to see the maturation process. To see him out there being a better teammate, trying to lead from a vocal standpoint – which is really not Allen’s characteristic – to see him being patient and not get as frustrated as maybe he did last year at times, you can see that whole scenario last year and what he went through has done a lot of things for him.

“I think as he moves forward with his career, whether it be pro or whatever he decides to do long term in life, he’ll be able to draw from these situations he’s learned here at Auburn.”

A senior this year, Allen Flanigan’s Auburn journey is nearing the end. He started some games as a freshman and then burst onto the scene as a sophomore where he led the team in scoring. Primed for another big season his junior year, Flanigan’s trajectory changed with the injury. He missed the first half of the season and was never fully healthy.

Flanigan is healthy now and playing some of the best basketball he’s played while at Auburn. He also has a new perspective on life because of what he went through.

“I cherish life more,” Flanigan said. “I enjoy every moment, just knowing that one day basketball can be taken from you. The thing you’ve done all your life, worked for, and the thing you love the most – it can be gone in a split second.

“I want the Auburn Family to remember me as a kid who came in hard-nosed. He put the work in, he gave effort and energy night in and night out. A guy who was confident. He fought his battles, played through when he wasn’t feeling the best, never gave up. I was a guy who played with heart.”

'Just Don't Let Them Down:' Family Comes First For Auburn's Wendell Green Jr.

AUBURN, Ala. – In the early stages of this season, Wendell Green Sr. was privy to a conversation between his son and a former teammate, Devan Cambridge, who opted to transfer following the Tigers' 2021-22 SEC championship campaign and landed at Arizona State, where he's playing with his brother.

The two were catching up on what things are like at Auburn, and how Cambridge is settling in the Pac-12. The athletic wing had high goals for himself this season, but there was one area of his game he knew wasn't going to be as prolific as it was with the Tigers.

"Hey, man, thanks for throwing me all those lobs," Green Sr. heard Cambridge joke on the phone. "I mean, maybe I get a few here or there. But they don't throw 'em up there like you did."

Not many do. Wendell Green Jr.'s passing prowess and offensive orchestration, as Auburn's now-veteran point guard, has been one of the major keys during his time with the program thus far. And it will continue to be this season, as the Tigers look to lock down an NCAA Tournament berth, faced with a daunting three-game stretch to close this season.

But as locked in as Green Jr. gets, especially during a crucial ending to the regular season, he tries not to forget his blessings.

"Now that I'm in this position, I just try to soak it in day by day," Green Jr. said in an sitdown with Auburn Undercover. "It's crazy, but it's something I've worked for my whole life."

It's easy for the junior point guard to reflect and be grateful, because he remembers quite vividly the feeling of uneasiness and doubt when he wasn't sure if he made the right decision to transfer from Eastern Kentucky.

The Detroit native had a big freshman campaign in the Ohio Valley Conference — at 15.8 points per game and 5.0 assists — but after he entered his name in the portal April 1 of 2021, his phone was more silent than he expected.

"My first couple weeks, I didn't really get any big schools," Green Jr. said. "Then it was a tough decision, too, because I didn't get to visit Auburn during COVID."

By the end of the transfer process, though, Green Jr.'s father, Wendell Green Sr., told Auburn Undercover that around 35-40 Division-I schools had shown major interest in his son. Green Jr.'s favorites were Auburn, Indiana and Marquette.

"It was all about fit," Green Sr. said. "It was a lot of Zoom meetings, but it got to the point where Auburn just made a lot of sense."

For the better part of the past decade, if Green Jr. is on the court playing, you could find Green Sr. in the stands. Usually rocking his son's NIL merch, it's not difficult to pinpoint Green Jr.'s contingent at games.

"You only have this experience one time, so we have to be there to support him," Green Sr. said.

After every road game, Green Jr. climbs the stands to find his supporters, which usually includes some of his extended family, as well. He's had a small pocket of the arena cheering him on in SEC country, along with other stops across the map.

"My dad has come to almost every game since he stopped coaching me in high school," Green Jr. said. "It doesn't matter where it is — USC, Washington, he always shows up. My mom works a lot behind the scenes. The support I get from those two, and my sister, my extended family, it's amazing."

Whenever Green Jr. gets down after a bad game, or needs a bit of extra juice to get motivated on a given day, it's his family and their unwavering support that he always circles back to in his mind.

"Me being here is bigger than myself," Green Jr. said. "One day I might wake up and not want to shoot as much that day or not want to work out as hard. But it's not about me. It's about everyone's expectations of me and me needing to exceed that and represent my family."

"I always say to myself, 'Just don't let them down.' That's the No. 1 thing."

Some of the passes that end up on Auburn's highlight reels are just old tricks for Green Jr.

"His vision was always there," Green Sr. said. "He was throwing lobbs when he was 8, 9, 10 years old."

As flashy as they appear, Green Jr.'s passing style is mostly out of necessity, he said.

Whether it's a no-look or a wrap-around, most of the time, Green Jr. said with a laugh, it's because he has to account for the fact that he knows he won't always be able to easily see his targets on the court. He's listed at a generous 5-foot-11.

"I've always been able to make those passes — they end up being highlight passes, but it's not intentional," Green Jr. said. "I'm a smaller guy, so if I see someone jumping in the air, I can't get over them so I have to throw a baseball pass. It's just about feel for the game. I feel like my patience in the paint has gotten better as the season has gone on."

Sitting at No. 4 in the SEC with 4.3 assists per game, Green Jr. said it isn't as simple as tossing a lob up high for his teammates, and putting a pass ahead of them in transition.

That's why mistakes happen early in the season, and he attributed it to Auburn's respectable turnover rate (10.7 per game in SEC competition) as the season has progressed.

"Over time it's just about figuring out how guys like the ball and where they want it," Green Jr. said. "Johni (Broome) is very different from Walker (Kessler). Walker you could just throw it as high as you can, but Johni isn't 7-1. That's just chemistry. It looks like you can build it over the summer but it takes real games and real time for it to happen."

Green Jr. sometimes had an unstoppable connection with Kessler in their high ball-screen action, and his rapport with Broome has become highly productive, too. Another transplant from the Ohio Valley Conference — where Green Jr. was edged by Broome at Murray State for freshman of the year in the league in 2020-21 — Broome gives Auburn a consistent interior presence to complement Green Jr.'s play in the backcourt.

The junior center remains the only player in the SEC who's top 5 in the conference in field-goal percentage (52.8), rebounds (8.9) and blocks (2.5).

As Auburn has faced one of the toughest schedules in college basketball, sometimes a good game from both Green Jr. and Broome still isn't enough for a victory. But the Tigers rarely have much of a chance at all if they're now playing well.

"If we turn it over or it's a bad play, we try to never get frustrated at each other," Green Jr. said. "We just talk it through real quick, right there on the court. That's just our maturity level. We try to talk about it during games, after games, before games and just try to make sure we're always on the same page."

That mindset permeates to the rest of the team, who have kept their heads high and been able to impressively wipe the slate clean during a string of losses against their elite competition — six defeats in their last night games, to be exact, with three of their toughest matchups of the entire year still approaching.

They know Green Jr. isn't going to blink because of a bad game, or even a rough stretch during a game. That was evident Wednesday night against Ole Miss, when the point guard bounced back from a 2-of-18 shooting stretch over his previous two games and was the reason the Tigers avoided a disastrous loss, with 23 points, including 14 points and 8-of-8 shooting at the foul line over the last eight minutes of the game.

"Wen's a baller," senior wing Allen Flanigan said Thursday. "You're going to miss shots, you're going to make shots. The best players in the world, they have games where they struggle and they shoot it worse. They come back the next night and they shoot it again. So him just trusting his stroke and trusting who he is as a player, just coming back out here and going at it again."

Auburn's players repeated this week that they need another win before the regular season is up, with games at Kentucky this Saturday, at Alabama next Wednesday, and against Tennessee at home the following weekend. Green Jr. has to play well for them to get it.

He and Auburn are more than okay with that. That's what he envisioned when he took that leap of faith in the transfer portal.

"I think Wendell is okay with as he goes, we go," Bruce Pearl said this week. "That's a great compliment. I trust him. I have confidence in him."

The Jay-Will Drill: Auburn's Williams Interns With Wheelchair Basketball Team

AUBURN, Ala. – When the coach of Auburn’s wheelchair basketball team wants his guys to pick up the pace in practice, Robb Taylor knows what to run.

The Jay-Will Drill.

Four possessions up and down the court, a minute on the clock.

“It helps us get into our offense and run our offense quickly,” Taylor said. “I think Coach Pearl does it where it’s four or five passes and then a shot. It’s the same thing with us.”

Taylor named the drill after an Auburn student who interned with the wheelchair team during the fall semester, senior forward Jaylin Williams.

Needing an internship to graduate in kinesiology, Williams emailed Taylor last summer.

“It was nice to have a member of the basketball team want to come and help us out,” Taylor said. “I thought it was going to be good for our guys to see him every morning.”

Williams showed up promptly at 7 a.m. during the fall semester, even on days when he played non-conference games that evening.

“At first it was tough but as the semester went on, it became normal,” Williams said. “It was a great experience. Probably my best semester. I’m close friends with them now.”

“He was always here in the morning to help us out,” Taylor said. “He did a lot of great stuff, helped us out in practice, rebounded and worked with some of the guys individually and in the weight room as well. Really pushed our guys. It was great to have him there.”

Williams’ quiet demeanor served him well during the internship. When he did speak, the wheelchair team listened.

“Once he does start talking, you want to listen because what he has to say is usually pretty spot on,” Taylor said. “They did a better job at times listening to him than they would to me. That was nice. He’s got the experience of playing on the men’s team and being part of an SEC championship last year that he’s been able to bring some of that to our program.”

Williams appreciated the effort the wheelchair athletes expend.

“They play hard,” he said. “No handouts. Very intense. They train just like the rest of us. They’re athletes just like anyone else in the world.”

Williams’ internship ended in December when the fall semester concluded and SEC play began. Though he’s no longer “Coach Williams,” he still tracks the wheelchair team’s progress via Instagram.

Williams has played key roles in two Auburn basketball teams this season, helping his team win 20 games by ranking second in rebounds and assists, and third in scoring, while also making a lasting impression on the wheelchair team.

In addition to coaching Auburn's wheelchair team, Taylor serves as head coach of the U.S. Paralympic Team, taking information gleaned from Jaylin Williams and the Auburn Tigers with him to Paris next summer in pursuit of a gold medal at the 2024 Paralympic Games.

"There are guys on the U.S. team who know the Jay-Will Drill and a little bit of the history behind it," Taylor said. "It's a way for Auburn wheelchair basketball to get up to that next level and what Jaylin's been able to do for us."

‘Bruce is Bruce’: Impact of Bruce Pearl’s Southern Indiana Tenure Runs Deep 30 Years Later

Butter dripped from Bruce Pearl’s chin when he first met the Gilbert family almost 30 years ago.

Chad Gilbert, a forward at Indiana State, had decided to transfer following the 1992-93 season. During his recruitment, Gilbert and his parents hosted Pearl, then head men’s basketball coach at the University of Southern Indiana, for an in-home visit.

Gilbert’s father liked to cook and crab legs were on the menu that night.

So, much like he’s always done with any recruiting pitch, halftime speech, or questionable whistle, Pearl attacked the crab legs with the intensity he’s always brought to his job.

“I saw Coach Pearl kill about five pounds of crab legs,” Gilbert says with a laugh. “I knew on the spot, man. I want to play for this guy.”

Gilbert grew up two hours west of Southern Indiana, and he’d known the basketball program’s lackluster history. But the past wasn’t in Pearl’s selling points.

Instead, he pitched what the program was becoming. He pitched who he was, and the impact he could make on Gilbert — albeit while cracking crab husk and slurping shellfish.

“He’s got me sold,” Gilbert continues. “From that point over, he’s not been my coach, but he’s been part of my family.”

It’s been 30 years since Pearl became a head men’s basketball coach. Long before Milwaukee, Tennessee, or Auburn, he started his career in Evansville, Indiana. It was there he took over then-Division II Southern Indiana after a decade as a Division I assistant.

During his USI tenure, Pearl led a turnaround that left a deeply felt impact on the program and his players. It’s been a blueprint the rest of his career.

“I needed to cut my teeth, and learn how to coach and be a head coach,” Pearl told the Opelika-Auburn News last month. “I think to some, it would be considered sort of a step down. It wasn’t for me.”

The Screaming Eagles only won 10 games the season before Pearl’s arrival. They went on to average nearly 29 wins a year with him. They reached the NCAA Division II Tournament each year during his nine seasons. They advanced to six Sweet 16s, appeared in two national title games, and won the school’s lone men’s basketball National Championship in 1995.

Since he departed, neither Pearl nor USI have slacked. Pearl has been a head coach at three Division I stops. He’s led all three to conference titles and NCAA Tournament bids, his most recent project being the turnaround of a disrepaired Auburn program, akin to what he came into at Southern Indiana.

USI has averaged more than 20 wins a season and made another 14 NCAA Division II Tournament appearances since Pearl left. This year, the Screagles moved up to Division I and the Ohio Valley Conference under Stan Gouard, who was a standout forward for his alma mater under Pearl.

“He was my coach, but he also felt like a father, felt like a brother,” Gouard says. “You could talk to him about anything. He’ll laugh and joke with you, but he’d push you to extreme measures to get the best out of you. ... He did that years ago and he’s still doing it to this day.”

Jon Mark Hall pulled up to his office early Monday after a big weekend.

Hall, the men’s tennis coach at Southern Indiana, led the Screagles to their first-ever Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament title in men’s tennis that weekend in Indianapolis.

Carrying the tournament trophy in from his car, Hall stepped into the lobby of USI’s athletics offices to see one person waiting on him. It was Bruce Pearl.

“I mean, he’s not there by chance, right?” Hall says. “Like, he is waiting on me to come in.”

A bear hug ensued — “I knew you guys were going to do it!” Hall recalls Pearl saying. “I knew it was going to happen! I knew you were going to kick their rear!”

Now USI’s athletics director, Hall is more than two decades removed from that Monday morning in 1999. But that’s always one of the stories he tells to describe Pearl’s character.

“That was real and I’ll never forget it,” Hall says. “When you see these pictures of him on the sidelines at a women’s basketball game or a baseball game or at a softball game at Auburn ... that’s who he is. That’s pretty real.

“There was no social media at that time to get some kind of pat on the back for being a great colleague. I mean, he was there first thing on Monday morning to make sure that ... we knew that he was proud of that group.”

That moment is emblematic of an approach Pearl’s had at every coaching stop: “Don’t rent. Buy.”

“Jump in with both feet,” Pearl says. “Our first houses — we couldn’t afford very big houses, but — we bought. Every place I’ve been, I’ve planned to be there forever, and worked like it. It’s hard because in coaching, when you’re winning, they’re worried you’re going to leave. When you’re losing, they’re packing your bags. You’re always coming and going in coaching, but I’ve never treated it that way.”

Pearl’s career-long investment is evident at all his stops, especially in Evansville. During his tenure, Pearl made an effort to get himself and his players involved in Evansville and the greater USI community. His players partook in volunteer opportunities, reading at elementary schools and running kids’ camps.

Pearl also got involved with USI’s Varsity Club, which still helps fund scholarships for the program’s athletes. According to department spokesperson Ray Simmons, both the club’s membership and revenue totals more than doubled within the first few years of Pearl’s tenure.

“Without Coach Pearl, I don't think we're where we are today,” Stan Gouard says.

Gouard starred on the court for Pearl. The former NCAA Division II Player of the Year helped lead USI to its 1995 National Championship. But in his current role, Gouard still sees his former coach's stamp.

There's pictures aplenty of Pearl hanging in Screaming Eagles Arena, the school's years-old \$66 million arena. Gouard walks past him hoisting the program's 1995 national title trophy daily, and sees his face again hanging in the team locker room. Gouard is also one of the many who attests Pearl Drive, a street about two miles east of campus, is named for his former coach.

“And I think in the years to come, you may see his name on the court,” Gouard says. “They may name it 'Pearl Court' or 'Pearl Arena.' He's definitely put USI on the map by what he's done here. His legacy will never go away.”

Even if Bruce Pearl wasn't able to attend, his presence was felt.

Pearl's second-ever USI team was honored with hall-of-fame status for its efforts during the 1993-94 season Feb. 3 in Evansville. The event drew former players and managers, among others.

Chad Gilbert made the drive from his hometown of Charlestown, Indiana. Stan Gouard was, of course, in attendance, as was Chris Bowles, Pearl's high-scoring stretch forward from his first two USI seasons. Tyrone Tate, a premier transfer who came to USI from Utah and played facilitator on those squads, made the commute from Chicago.

Time has moved on. Their faces are longer; more wrinkly. Hairs are thinning, grayed, or nonexistent. They're not the athletes they once were. These are men, some with children and families, whose college-aged faces live on only in the program's media guides and record books.

But they're still Pearl's players.

Their faces pack youthful smiles as they celebrate what they achieved. A prerecorded video message from Pearl plays before they take a stage to be recognized.

“You guys made history,” Pearl says. “You took that Southern Indiana program in basketball and put it on the map.”

Pearl's hair, including a beard on his once clean-shaven face, is gray now, too. While wearing an Auburn polo and sitting in front of an AU backdrop, he thanks them for their success, in spite of his youth and inexperience.

“I would venture to say,” Pearl adds, “that USI wouldn't be where it is right now if it wasn't for moments like what we had.”

And as much is true in the other direction.

If it wasn't for USI, Pearl wouldn't be where he is now, helming an Auburn program that's making its own history, soon to notch its fourth NCAA Tournament berth in six seasons.

Perhaps without Pearl, the Tigers never go from Southeastern Conference bottom-dweller to powerhouse.

"Bruce is Bruce," Brent Baker, an assistant on Pearl's first two USI staffs, says. "He kind of pretty much wears his emotions on his sleeve. He's not gonna back down from anyone," Baker adds. "He's gonna get all over the refs. He's gonna expect things out of his players, but he does out of — I mean, he does it out of love, right?"

"He is as passionate about winning and losing as anyone, and it just seems like he really hasn't changed a lot in terms of how he approaches the game."

'The Most Underrated Guy:' Tigers Can't Overstate Value of Zep Jasper's Defense

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – There's a reason opponents hate to see No. 12 in orange and blue on the floor. It's the same reason the sixth-year senior has been such an important piece to Auburn's success over the past two seasons.

His full impact rarely shows up in the stat sheet, but as the Tigers enter this postseason this week at the SEC Tournament in Nashville, Zep Jasper's defensive value can't be overstated for Bruce Pearl's defense-first squad.

Chatting with reporters after the team's shootaround Wednesday at Bridgestone Arena, Jasper's teammates lauded his impact as the spearhead of their defensive game plans.

"Zep's a huge key to what we do," senior wing Allen Flanigan said. "... Just slowing the game down for us so we can get back and get matched up. He plays a huge piece in that."

After serving as Auburn's starting point guard during the team's SEC championship run last year, Jasper moved off the ball in the starting lineup this season. That allowed Wendell Green Jr. to elevate to a full-time starting role running point.

"The most underrated guy on our team," Green said. "He gives me a break off the ball sometimes, just guarding their best player. ... He's not selfish offensively at all. He wants me to shoot before he shoots."

What Jasper succeeds so highly in isn't always the most noticeable aspect of the game — but occasionally his tenacious on-ball defense goes on full display, whenever he's matched up with the opposition's best player in the backcourt.

That was the case late in Auburn's all-important win over Tennessee on the final day of the regular season. Santiago Vescovi led the Volunteers with 21 points, including makes on five of his first seven looks from beyond the arc. In a tight game, Vescovi was easily Tennessee's best offensive option, and Auburn needed stops down the stretch.

Jasper was given the assignment when he checked in with 5:07 remaining. Vescovi didn't score for the rest of the game.

"He doesn't take a possession off," Bruce Pearl said Wednesday. "And that's infectious. He was in there at the end against Tennessee, and he'll be there at the end against Arkansas."

Jasper contributes just 3.0 points per night, but he rarely hunts for his shot, at an average of just 3.1 attempts. His teammates applauded the fact that Jasper, in his sixth season of college ball, has embraced his role and doesn't force shots or play above the game plan.

"A lot of guys go out there and try to be Kyrie Irving" senior forward Jaylin Williams said. "Zep is more like a Marcus Smart: He's looking to lock down the best player on the court. He's going

to whatever he takes to win — that's all he's out there to do. I know it's his last year, so he's always going to go out there and give it his all.”

Jasper's assignment Thursday in the SEC Tournament should be one of his toughest of the season. Arkansas guard Nick Smith Jr. was out with an injury the last time the teams met in January — a 72-59 Auburn win — and is averaging 19.4 points per night since fully returning to the starting lineup five games ago.

“I've got my hands full with Nick Smith Jr.,” Jasper said. “But it's nothing that I can't handle. Tomorrow will be a great game, and I look forward to guarding him and doing the best I can to stop him.”
