» QUICK HITTERS

- Auburn's Justin Camp was named SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week following his 2-hit shutout win over Tennessee. He allowed just three base runners and faced the minimum after the first inn.
- Over the last five games, freshman RHP Casey Mize has 10 K, 1 BB and .167 BAA in 10.0 IP.
- Niko Buentello has 40 RBI this year the most for an AU player since Creede Simpson's 40 in '12.
- The Auburn pitching staff is averaging 9.1 K/G over the last eight games.
- Senior Jordan Ebert is 3rd among active SEC hitters (15th NCAA) with 228 career hits, the most for an Auburn player since Justin Hargett finished with 234 in 2011.
- Auburn has had nine or more hits in 18 of its last 22 games and its .314 team batting average (15th, NCAA) through 36 games is more than 30 points higher (.281) than in 2015 at this point.
- Anfernee Grier, the SEC's leader in hits with 65, has reached base in 35 of 36 games this season with a hit in 34 games. Grier, Ebert and Palacios rank 1-3-6 in the SEC in hits.
- Joshua Palacios and Grier are the only two players ranked in the top 5 in the SEC in batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage.

Butch Thompson was named Auburn's head baseball coach, Auburn Director of Athletics Jay Jacobs announced on October 22, 2015. Thompson, who spent three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Auburn from 2006-08, returns to the Plains after seven seasons at Mississippi State as both associate head coach and pitching coach.

Widely regarded as one of the premier pitching coaches in the country, Thompson was named the 2014 Baseball America and American Baseball Coaches Association National Assistant Coach of the Year while at Mississippi State.

In 23 years of coaching at the collegiate level, including 13 in the Southeastern Conference, Thompson has coached seven College World Series participants, including a national runner-up finish, won nine conference championships and made 14 postseason appearances. He has also served as an assistant under three National Coach of the Year recipients.

In seven seasons at MSU, Thompson made four NCAA regional trips, two Super Regionals, won the SEC Tournament and advanced to the College World Series finishing as NCAA runner-up in 2013. In three of the last four seasons, the Bulldogs' staff ERA finished no higher than 3.06. Thompson's 2013 pitching staff was one of two nationally to finish in the top 15 in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and hits allowed per nine innings.

Additionally, Mississippi State was 168-4 under Thompson the last four seasons when holding a lead after eight innings.

Thompson is considered one of the top recruiters in the country. Since 2003, he has secured nine recruiting classes that were ranked in the top 10 by either Baseball America or Perfect Game. His classes signed from 2006-08 at Auburn each ranked in the top 18 nationally including the No. 5 class nationally in 2008 which included All-American and SEC Player of the Year Hunter Morris.

Player development has been equally important for Thompson, who has turned 23 student-athletes who went undrafted out of high school into Major League Baseball draft picks.

A native of Amory, Miss., Thompson has coached 22 Division I All-Americans and 29 all-conference honors. In 2014, former Mississippi State pitcher Kendall Graveman became the ninth player Thompson tutored to pitch in the big leagues.

Thompson had three pitchers drafted in the first 11 rounds of the 2014 MLB Draft, and in 2013 five of his pitchers were drafted including three in the top 10 rounds.

In addition to his experience at Auburn and Mississippi State, Thompson also spent five seasons at Georgia from 2002-05, including a trip to the College World Series in 2004.

Thompson launched his coaching career as pitching coach and top assistant at Huntingdon College (Montgomery, Ala.) in 1993, before returning to his alma mater in Birmingham, where he helped lead the Panthers to back-to-back Southern States Conference championships and in 1995 coached BSC to its first NAIA World Series berth.



Thompson left BSC briefly to serve as head coach at Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham in 1997. While at JSCC, he was honored as the Regional Tournament Coach of the Year, the ABCA Alabama Junior College Coach of the Year and the Southeast Region Coach of the Year after guiding JSCC to a 39-21 mark, the AJCAA Region 22 State Championship and a third-place finish in the NJCAA Division II World Series.

He returned to Birmingham-Southern as top assistant the following season, beginning a four-year run during the most successful span in BSC baseball history. The Panthers won 196 games and four TranSouth Conference championships and made three-consecutive appearances in the NAIA World Series. BSC's 2001 team posted a school-best 55-11 mark and captured the NAIA National Championship.

In 2002, Thompson joined the SEC baseball coaching fraternity, beginning a four-year term as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. Georgia's 2003 recruiting class was ranked 10th nationally, while capturing the SEC title in 2004 en route to advancing to the NCAA College World Series.

Thompson, honored as the 2006 Fellowship of Christian Athletes SEC Coach of the Year, has shared his expertise as a featured speaker at numerous baseball coaching clinics throughout the United States.

Thompson prepped at Amory (Miss.) High School and later starred as a pitcher at Itawamba (Miss.) Community College from 1989-90. On Oct. 25, 2014, Thompson was inducted into the ICC Athletic Hall of Fame.

He earned a bachelor's degree in history at BSC in 1992 and completed a master's degree in sports administration at UAB in 1996. He is married to the former Robin Ashe of Birmingham, Ala., and they are the parents of three daughters --- Anna, Olivia and Madelyn Gail.

» **QUICK HITTERS** (continued)

- Joshua Palacios' four triples this season are the most by an Auburn player since 2012.
- Grier (7 HR, 16 SB) and Louisville's Corey Ray (10 HR, 31 SB) are the only two players in the country with at least seven HRs and 16 or more stolen bases.
- Grier ranks eighth nationally and second in the SEC with 45 runs. He has scored at least one run in all but seven games in 2016 and a season-high three runs four times.
- Auburn's 25 homers through 36 games eclipses the team's 2015 total of 18. Two Tigers have seven home runs, only five other players in the SEC have hit 7 or more.
- Auburn has scored double digit runs 11 times in 36 games this season after scoring 10 or more runs a total of eight times in 2014 and 2015 combined (118 games).

UP NEXT

» Auburn travels to Oxford, Miss. to face off with No. 16 Ole Miss at Swayze Field. Auburn trails the all-time series with the Rebels 77-78-1 and was swept in three games at Swayze Field in 2014. Henri Lartigue leads the team with a .339 batting average. Colby Bortles has a team-high 28 RBI. JB Woodman leads the Rebels with five homers.

SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION

» Alabama State enters with a 23-13 record overall including a perfect 15-0 mark in SWAC competition. The Hornets are led at the plate by outfielder Carlos Ocasio with 11 homers and 44 RBI. Freshman infielder Eriq White has a team-best .336 batting average. ASU holds a team ERA of 3.95 with 307 strikeouts in 307.2 innings.

STRIKEOUT SUCCESS

» Auburn pitchers recorded double-digit strikeouts three times over a five game stretch from April 5-9 including a season high 15 in consecutive games against Georgia State and Missouri.

» It was the first time Auburn's pitching staff has struck out 15 batters in an SEC game since May 11, 1997, vs. Ole Miss and the first time the Tigers have struck out at least 15 batters in consecutive games since doing so in four straight from Feb. 9-16, 1997.

» A huge part of the 15 K night vs. Missouri was 11 strikeouts by Auburn reliever Ben Braymer. The last Auburn reliever with at least 11 strikeouts was Hayden Gilemmo, who had 12 vs. Winthrop on May 29, 1999.

» Auburn pitchers have recorded double digit strikeouts in three of the last five after only four in first 28 games.

» Tiger hurlers had nine punchouts on the road at KSU.

TABLE SETTERS

» Auburn has the luxury of two of the top statistical hitters in the SEC sitting at the top of its batting order in junior outfielders Anfernee Grier and Joshua Palacios.

ALL-SEC FIRST TEAMER ANFERNEE GRIER

- » Anfernee Grier was named to the preseason All-SEC first team by the league's coaches. He is the first AU player to receive the honor since the team's inception in 2015.
- » Grier has a penchant for fast starts, the junior opened the 2015 season with a 15-game hitting streak and had an 11-game hitting streak to start 2014. Grier recorded a hit in the first 21 games to start 2016 (22-game streak overall).
- » Grier has made 106 consecutive starts dating back to May 6, 2014 against Bethune-Cookman. It is the most consecutive starts for an Auburn player since Ryan Tella started 115 consecutive games from 2012-13.
- » The speedy outfielder is 16-for-19 in stolen bases, a total that is fifth in the SEC. His 16 stolen bases are a new career high.
- » Grier, who is second nationally with 65 hits, has a hit in 108 of his 136 career starts (79.4%) and has recorded multiple hits in a game 52 times (38.2% of his starts).
- » Grier has scored a run in 29-of-36 games in 2016. He's scored a season-high three runs three times. He's second in the SEC and ranks eighth nationally with 45 runs scored.
- » Grier ranks in the top six in the SEC in eight statistical categories: batting average (.414), SLG (.618), on-base (.500), homers (7), runs (43), total bases (97), hits (65) & SB (16).

BREAK OUT THE BATS

- » Auburn is enjoying 2016 at the plate in home games. The Tigers are batting .332 in 24 games played in the friendly confines of Plainsman Park.
- » Overall, Auburn ranks third in the SEC with 410 hits (8th, NCAA) and third in batting average (.315, 16th NCAA) through 36 games. Auburn's team .406 OBP is 3rd in the SEC and 20th nationally.
- » Auburn has homered nine times in 15 SEC games, a 300% increase from the three homers the Tigers hit in 30 SEC games in 2015.
- » Auburn players own three of the top five

batting averages in the SEC: Grier (.414, 2nd), Palacios (.408, 3rd) and Ebert (.378, 5th).

- » Auburn scored seven-plus runs in seven of its first 15 SEC games after only scoring 7+ runs two times in 30 SEC games in 2015.
- » Auburn's 25 home runs through 36 games this season are more than the Tigers finished with in 2015 (18) led by Buentello with eight and Grier with seven.
- » Auburn scored a total of 27 runs in the Texas A&M series and recorded 38 hits. The 27 runs scored were AU's highest total in a SEC series since 2012 against Tennessee (35 runs).
- » Buentello (17) and Grier (16) lead the Tigers in two-out RBI. Blake Logan has 12.

#DOUBLESANDDABS

- » Auburn has piled up extra base hits this season with 108 overall, specifically 68 doubles, 11 triples and 25 home runs.
- » Cody Nulph has 12 doubles ranking him sixth in the SEC, while Jordan Ebert has 11 to rank seventh in the league. Joshua Palacios leads Auburn with 18 extra-base hits. Grier is second with 16 followed by Niko Buentello (16), Nulph (13), Ebert (12) and Blake Logan (10).
- » The Tigers have three players with 53+ hits: Anfernee Grier (65), Jordan Ebert (59), and Joshua Palacios (53) while there are only six other SEC players with 53+ this season. Only UNC-G has more players (5) with 53+.

P-LO PARTY

- » Junior outfielder Joshua Palacios has made a strong impression both on the field and at the plate in the first half of the season. The Brooklyn, N.Y. native **is second in the SEC with seven outfield assists from left.**
- » Palacios is hitting a .408 on the season which is third in the SEC. He has five homers, four triples (3rd SEC/22nd NCAA), nine doubles (with accompanying DAB), 23 RBI, 12 steals (10th SEC) and 34 runs (10th SEC).
- » Palacios, who had recorded multiple hits in 12 of his last 17 games, was the first Auburn

- player to have three consecutive 3-hit games since Garrett Cooper from April 17-20, 2012.
- » Over his last seven games, P-Lo is hitting .400 (14-of-35) with eight runs, one double, one triple, 3 homers and eight RBI. He has reached base in all but one game in 2016.
- » Palacios has not played since April 7 due to injury.

BUENTELLO BYTES

- » Junior 1B Niko Buentello's 10 RBIs in Auburn's 3-game series against Sacramento State are the most RBIs by an Auburn player in the first three games of a season since Josh Donaldson had 11 RBIs in a 3-game series against Hofstra to begin the 2007 season.
- » His 10 RBIs were the most in a 3-game series overall since Blake Austin drove in 10 runs against Tennessee from April 27-29, 2012.
- » Buentello's 22 RBI through his first 12 games were the third most by an Auburn player since 2000 joining Brian Fletcher's 26 RBI in the first 12 games of 2010 and Gabe Gross' 27 RBI in the first 12 games of the 2000 season.
- » Buentello has driven in 40 runs on the season. His 40 RBI rank fifth in the SEC and 41st nationally. It is the highest RBI total for an Auburn player since 2012.
- » His eight home runs in 2016 rank second in the SEC and are more than any Auburn player has recorded since 2011.

SENIOR JORDAN EBERT

- » Jordan Ebert has started 181 games in his career, including starts at second base, designated hitter and in both left & right field.
- » As a sophomore in 2014, Ebert led the SEC in hitting for most of the season. He finished with the 2nd-best AVG in the league at .353.
- » Ebert received his undergraduate degree in physical education in December 2015 and is currently pursuing a Master's degree.
- » Ebert ranks seventh in Auburn history with 192 singles, just one behind sixth.
- » Ebert is batting .378 (4th, SEC) in 2016

GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE: SAMFORD STADIUM-HITCHCOCK FIELD AT PLAINSMAN PARK

» Auburn's baseball home for the past 64 seasons, Samford Stadium-Hitchcock Field at Plainsman Park seats 4,096, including 3,227 chairback seats. Auburn's baseball field has been called a renaissance of Camden Yard proportions since receiving a \$4.2 million facelift in 1998.

 » Ebert needs one RBI to reach 100 for his career.
 » Ebert has an outside shot at reaching the Auburn all-time top 10 lists for at-bats, games played and hits.

JUSTIN CAMP, THE STARTER

» After recording eight saves in 2015 as Auburn’s closer, senior Justin Camp returns to the rotation in 2016.
 » In his first start of the season, Camp turned in his first quality start since March 11, 2014 vs. Kennesaw State. it was his first start overall since April 15, 2014.
 » Camp turned in his strongest start of the season against Southern with 8.0 innings of two hit, shutout ball and a career-high 9 Ks.
 » Camp was named SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week following his 2-hit shutout win over Tennessee. He allowed just three base runners and faced the minimum after the first inning.
 » He has a 3-2 record with a 3.30 ERA in nine starts in 2016.
 » **Camp currently owns a scoreless inning streak of 16.0 and has not allowed an earned run in his last 17.0 innings.**

JR RHP COLE LIPSCOMB

» Cole Lipscomb, who finished third in the SEC last season with a 2.53 ERA, had seven straight quality starts from April 10 through May 19 and had a total of nine quality starts in his 12 starts in 2015.
 » During his stretch of seven straight quality starts, Lipscomb tossed 49.2 innings and allowed 14 runs (12 earned) on 40 hits and 13 walks and 40 Ks.
 » Lipscomb turned in his second quality start of 2016 with 6-plus innings, three hits and one run allowed with eight strikeouts at No. 18 Arkansas (3/27).
 » **Lipscomb has 17 K and only one BB in 15.2 IP through three SEC starts.**

THOMPSON AND DAVIS TO MISS 2016

» Auburn junior pitchers Keegan Thompson and Kevin Davis will both miss the 2016 season due to injury.
 » The NCAA granted Auburn a roster waiver and neither player will be on the 35-man active roster for the season. Both are expected to return for 2017.

VETERAN SEC COACHING STAFF

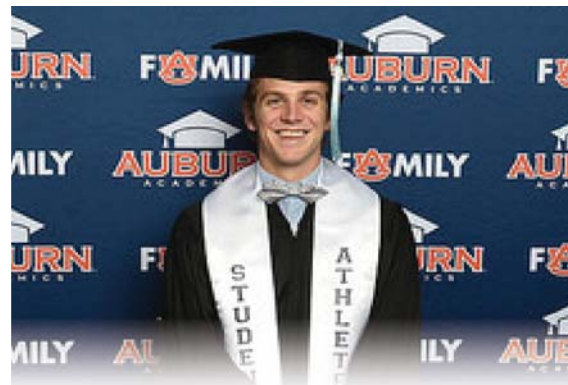
» Auburn’s coaching staff led by head coach Butch Thompson, despite being new on the Plains, is not new to the Southeastern Conference. In total, the staff features 39 years of SEC experience.
 » Thompson has spent 14 years in the league, while assistant Doug Sisson spent a pair of seasons at Georgia. Assistant Brad Bohannon has 12 years at Kentucky and volunteer Greg Drye spent the previous 11 seasons at Mississippi St.

DRAFT SUCCESS

» Following the 2015 season pitchers Rocky McCord (Baltimore) and Trey Wingenter (San Diego) were selected in the MLB First Year Player Draft. Auburn has now had at least one player selected in the MLB Draft in 41 consecutive seasons, which ties for the second-longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference.
 » The Tigers are tied with Arkansas and trail only Georgia. Auburn has had multiple players selected in 10 consecutive seasons (since 2006).

NATIONAL ASSISTANTS OF THE YEAR

» The Auburn coaching staff is fortunate to feature the two most recent Baseball America. Head coach Butch Thompson received the award in 2014 at Mississippi State, while assistant coach Brad Bohannon was the 2015 recipient for his efforts at Kentucky.
 » Auburn joins Virginia as the only staff to feature multiple winners of the award. Virginia head coach Brian O’Connor won the award while an assistant at Notre Dame in 2001, and assistant Kevin McMullen was the 2009 winner.

» There were 13 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2015 season, including current team members Kevin Davis, Anfernee Grier, Cole Lipscomb, Blake Logan, Sam Mason, Cody Nulph, JJ Shaffer, Keegan Thompson and Izaak Yarbrough. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher.

» Junior right-handed pitcher Cole Lipscomb was named a 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-American. The Prattville, Ala. native holds a 3.76 grade point average in finance.

SIS' APPROACH SIZZLES

» New Auburn assistant coach Doug Sisson has brought a totally new hitting approach to the Auburn lineup and it has shown immediate results. Auburn’s offense is on pace to eclipse nearly every offensive statistical total from 2015.

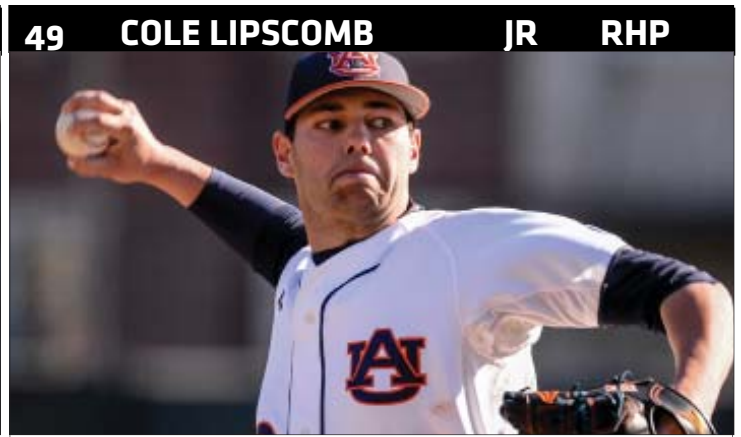
