FOOTBALL VISITS GEORGIA

» No. 8 Auburn visits No 4 Georgia for the 125th meeting in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry on Saturday, October 3, at Sanford Stadium in Athens, Ga. ESPN will televise the 6:30 p.m. CT conference matchup.

SERIES HISTORY

» Georgia leads the series 60-56-8, winning 15 of the last 19 games. Auburn owns a winning record in Athens (18-15) while Georgia has a winning mark on the Plains (17-12-2). The Bulldogs were 27-10 winners in the last game played in Athens (2018); Georgia was a 21-14 winner last season at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Auburn is 17-22-1 against ranked Georgia teams all-time (6-11-1 in Auburn), while the Bulldogs are 13-28-1 vs. the Tigers when they are ranked (7-11-1 in Auburn).

This is the earliest meeting during the season since the very first game between the schools in 1892 (played February 20) and will be only the sixth time the matchup has been played in October; the last was in 1936 (October 24).

» The Auburn-Georgia series is tied for the second-most played current FBS series entering this season [Minnesota-Wisconsin 129, Cincinnati-Miami, Ohio 124, North Carolina-Virginia 124]. The series is older than the Georgia-Georgia Tech (112 games) and the Auburn-Alabama series (84 games). Auburn and Georgia first met in 1892 at Atlanta's Piedmont Park; each first played its in-state rival in 1893.

» The two teams did not play in 1943, because Auburn did not field a team due to World War II, and did not play in 1917 and 1918 because of WWI and the subsequent influenza outbreak. With those exceptions, Auburn and Georgia have played continuously since 1898.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn's 2020 campaign is its 128th season of college football. The Tigers have 777 wins all-time, 13th-most among FBS schools

» Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league's coaches include first-team LB K.J. Britt and DE Big Kat Bryant, OL Brodarious Hamm on the second team and WR Seth Williams and DB/RS Christian Tutt as third-team selections

» Quarterback Bo Nix has a current streak of 218 consecutive pass attempts thrown without an interception, second nationally behind Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (276)

» Team captains for the 2020 season are LB K.J. Britt, DE Big Kat Bryant, QB Bo Nix and RB Shaun Shivers

» Auburn has been ranked in the AP Top 10 at least once during the last eight seasons, tying a school-best streak from 1983-90

» Eight players made their first Auburn starts in the Kentucky win: WR Ze'Vian Capers, OG Brandon Council, OT Brodarious Hamm, OT Alec Jackson, OG Tashawn Manning, DB Zion Puckett, DB Jaylin Simpson, LB Colby Wooden

» The Tigers rank first in this week's NCAA FBS statistics in red zone defensive percentage, allowing opponents to score on just 33.3% of their attempts

» At +3.0, Auburn is tied for third nationally in turnover margin with Kansas State; Virginia (4.0) and UCF (3.5) are the national leaders

» Redshirt freshman cornerback Jaylin Simpson earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors in his first career start vs. Kentucky, accounting for four tackles, a TFL and a PBU

» There were 31 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2019 season, including current team members Nick Brahms, K.J. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athletes will also be recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

AD HONOR ROLL

» Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had 13 representatives on the 2019-20 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included O.C. Brothers, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Trey Lindsey, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, Jacoby Puckett, Zion Puckett and Mark-Antony Richards.

» Auburn is 82-39-6 all-time in road openers and 378-354-39 all-time in all games played away from Auburn. The Tigers have won 11 of their last 16 road openers, including a 27-21 win over Oregon in Texas last season.

Auburn is 45-36-6 all-time in its SEC road openers and has won 19 of the last 24 SEC road debuts, including a 28-20 victory at Texas A&M last season.

IN OCTOBER

» Auburn is 314-164-18 (.651) all-time in October. Auburn's October home record is 172-35-3 (.828). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 142-129-15 (.520) in October.

Auburn is 17-8 in October under Gus Malzahn. Auburn is 12-3-1 on October 3 all-time, and 4-2-1 against SEC teams on that date.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 29 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn, the latest being 633 yards against Kent State last season.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 18 times; latest: 200 yards in the third quarter vs. Kent State 2019; and nine times vs. SEC teams (latest: 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss 2018).

» Auburn has scored in all 94 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

» Auburn has scored first in 32 of its last 45 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including seven times last season. The Tigers are 46-15 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

» Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 64-94 (.681) games, with 37 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State in 2019, the sixth time the Tigers gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 21.81 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 34 times in 92 games, 50+ points 17 times and 60+ points three times.

Auburn scored 50+ points in four games in a season for just the third season in program history; others were in 2010 (6) and in 2016 (4).

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 55 of 94 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Fourteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (69 100-yd performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher under Malzahn is 43-12; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

» Current players' 100-yard rushing games:

D.J. Williams (1): LSU, 2019 (130).

» 2019 SEC Freshman of the Year Bo Nix started the 2020 campaign with a 233-yard passing performance against Kentucky, connecting for two scores to Seth Williams and another to Eli Stove. Three TD passes tied his career best (also 2019 at Arkansas) and it was Nix' fifth career 200-yard passing game.

Nix' current string of 218 pass attempts without an interception is an Auburn record and ranks second nationally to only Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (276).

Nix was named to the Paul Hornung Award honor roll for his play against Kentucky.

STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE: FACILITIES

» An important upgrade in the recent Jordan-Hare Stadium renovation provides an expanded home locker room for Auburn football student-athletes, more than doubling the previous space, accented with state of the art lighting, speakers and sound system in a customized orange and blue decor in the south end zone.

» Nix set the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16). Those totals ranked ninth in passing yardage, second in passes attempted, third in passes completed and 10th in touchdown passes for a season at Auburn.

He was second in the SEC with six games with a passing and rushing TD in 2019, only trailing Texas A&M's Kellen Mond, who had seven such games.

» Junior receiver Seth Williams posted the fourth multiple-score game of his career with touchdown catches of 11 and 4 yards from Bo Nix against Kentucky. Williams gained 112 yards on six receptions against the Wildcats.

Williams ranks 15th among Auburn career leaders in receiving, with 1,476 yards to date. His 91 career receptions rank 17th among Auburn career leaders, and his 15 receiving touchdowns are tied for sixth best all-time at Auburn.

In his career, 71 of Williams' 91 catches have resulted in either a first down or a touchdown, including TD on eight of his red zone receptions and 12 of his 17 catches in the fourth quarter.

Williams led Auburn in 2019 with 59 catches for 830 yards and eight touchdowns. He was the first Auburn player with TD catches in five straight games since Emory Blake (seven games) in 2010-11.

» Senior Eli Stove is nearing 1,400 career yards from scrimmage (96 catches for 882 yards and four scores and 49 rushing attempts for 510 yards and four TD).

Stove caught a 21-yard touchdown from Bo Nix in the opener against Kentucky, one of four receptions on the day.

Last season, he had an 11-yard TD catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon; he added a 4-yard rushing touchdown against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State, the first Tiger to score in three straight games since Kerryon Johnson (2017).

» Speedster Anthony Schwartz entered the 2020 campaign with seven career rushing scores and 10 overall TD. Last season, 30 of his 52 touches resulted in a TD or first down.

Schwartz' 57-yard touchdown run at Texas A&M in 2019 was a career long for the speedster and Auburn's longest rushing play of the season.

In 2018, Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's longest offensive play of the year and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

» Auburn won the turnover battle against Kentucky, using a Roger McCreary interception and fumble recoveries from Jamien Sherwood and Owen Pappoe to post a 3-0 advantage in the turnover margin against the Wildcats.

» With 13 fumble recoveries and 15 forced fumbles last season, Auburn ranked fifth nationally in recoveries and ninth in forced fumbles.

» Auburn is 33-9 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 15-6 when turnovers are even, compared to 14-16 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +39 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -15 in turnovers during Malzahn's tenure.

The Tigers are 21-5 when they play turnover-free football and 43-17 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn. The Tigers are 19-5 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

» Auburn is 54-20 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 34-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 9-11 when it fails to force a turnover.

DOMINATING DEFENSE

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 13 first-quarter touchdowns in the last 43 games, and only 12 in the opening period since the start of 2017 (six last season).

» Linebacker K.J. Britt earned first team all-SEC honors from AP and second team from the league's coaches last season, totaling 69 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble. He is a preseason first-team all-SEC selection for 2020 and on the watch lists for the Lott IMPACT, Bednarik, Butkus and Nagurski awards.

Britt posted a career-best 11 tackles and a TFL in the season opening win against Kentucky, giving him 107 tackles and 13.0 TFL for his career.

» Auburn has allowed only 18.471 points per game in Steele's tenure as coordinator, 10th among FBS teams.

Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg.

» Auburn, Alabama, Clemson, Iowa and Washington are the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 20 nationally in scoring defense each of the last four seasons.

» Auburn has held 18 of 54 opponents (16-2 record) below 300 yards total offense in Kevin Steele's five seasons as defensive coordinator. That exceeds the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 in the previous six years combined (14 in 79 games).

» Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 39 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 113 total TD during that span.

» Auburn has allowed opponents to score a TD on just 46.2 pct. of their red-zone trips since 2016, which leads the FBS. Wisconsin, Clemson and Cincinnati are the only other FBS teams allowing a TD on fewer than 50 percent of opponents' red-zone chances during that span.

» Under Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 40 times, including 24 of the last 29 games (not including season openers). In 33 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.

» In 25 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 23.48 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points nine times. Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked foes to 17 or fewer points (18.4%).

» Auburn had at least four TFL in every game last season and ranked 19th nationally (second in SEC) with 86.0 TFL (6.62/gm); the Tigers led the league with 6.71 TFL per game in SEC play.

In 2020, the Tigers return 10 players who combined for 14.5 of their 28 sacks last season.

In 53 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 129 sacks (2.43 per game) and has been held without a sack only seven times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 33 of those games, including 8.0 TFL against Kentucky.

The Tigers have forced 79 turnovers (38 INT, 41 FR) and allowed only 35 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

» Auburn has 32 former lettermen on NFL rosters, representing 18 different NFL teams

» Former Auburn lettermen on NFL rosters who finished their college careers elsewhere: Byron Cowart (New England), John Franklin III (Tampa Bay)

» On practice squads: Arryn Siposs (Detroit), Duke Williams (Buffalo), Mike Horton (Carolina), Prince Tega Wanogho (Philadelphia), Javaris Davis (Miami), Nick Coe (Miami), Derrick Moncrief (LA Rams), Daren Bates (Tennessee)

» Auburn has had 31 players taken in the first round (most recent in 2020 Derrick Brown 1/7 and Noah Igbinoehene 1/30) and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) and Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 17 of the last 20 Pro Bowls, including Dee Ford in 2019. Auburn has had at least one former player in 12 of the last 15 Super Bowls

» Auburn ranks 14th nationally allowing just 4.93 yards per play since 2016.

» Auburn, Alabama and Iowa are the only FBS teams that haven't allowed more than 11 rushing TDs in a season since 2016.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Before the Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers score a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interceptions and one missed field goal, the latest being two interception return touchdowns vs. Alabama.

Against Minnesota, Auburn scored on a 96-yard kickoff return by Noah Igbinoehene, to make Gus Malzahn 19-1 in games with a non-offensive touchdown.

The last time the Tigers had lost a game in which they scored a non-offensive touchdown was at Mississippi State in 2012, when Auburn lost 28-10 despite a 100-yard Oterio McCalebb kickoff return to start the second half.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Christian Tutt ranked fifth in the country averaging 13.6 yards on 23 punt returns last season. Tutt tied for second nationally with six returns of at least 20 yards. He tied for fourth in the nation with three returns of 30+ yards; his long return was 41 yards vs. Oregon.

» Auburn is tied with Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (144) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Junior kicker Anders Carlson started the 2020 campaign going 3-3 on PAT kicks against Kentucky.

Last season, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl. He was 47-78 on touchbacks on kickoffs.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, an All-America kicker and three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, is now with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders, earning AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for Week One this season.

» With 668 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are fourth all-time in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college. Third are Nevada's Marty and Tony Zendejas (685 points from 1981-87).

In second place are Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (734 points from 2013-19); the leaders are Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

RANKINGS

» The Tigers opened the season with a win over an AP-ranked opponent for the third straight year. The Tigers are the only team in the country to defeat a ranked opponent to open 2018, 2019 and 2020.

In 2018, No. 9 Auburn defeated No. 6 Washington 21-16 in Atlanta, Ga. The 16th-ranked Tigers opened last season with a 27-21 victory over No. 11 Oregon in Arlington, Texas. Prior to 2018, Auburn was 1-7 in season openers against ranked opponents all-time.

» The matchup between No. 4 Georgia and No. 7 Auburn will be the sixth Top 10 contest in series history, with the Tigers holding a 4-1 record in the previous games. Previous Top 10 matchups in the Auburn-Georgia series:

» This is the sixth time all-time that a ranked Auburn team has played four straight games against teams in the AP Top 25. Others: 1968, 1983-84, 1987, 2002-03 and 2013.

» The Tigers play six teams ranked in this week's AP Top 25 as part of its 10-game schedule. The Tigers play No. 2 Alabama, No. 4 Georgia, No. 13 Texas A&M, No. 16 Mississippi State, No. 20 LSU and No. 21 Tennessee.

» Auburn is 114-163-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 53-42-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-70-2 on the road and 33-51-2 on a neutral field.

» Auburn has played 43 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 94 games as the Tigers' head coach (45.7 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 24 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 20-23 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including 8-16 against Top 10 teams.

» This was the 40th year the Tigers were ranked in the preseason AP poll since the preseason poll started in 1950, including six times in Gus Malzahn's eight seasons as the Tigers' head coach, and each of the last four.

» The Tigers are 90-131-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (43-33-2 at home, 28-63-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 59-51-3 overall (29-10-1 at home, 19-31-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 328-119-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 186-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-87-4 all-time.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 81-75-4 (36-13-1 at home, 22-39-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» This marks the 14th season ESPN's College GameDay has originated from the site of an Auburn football game. The Tigers are 10-10 all-time in those previous games.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 325-253-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 138-60-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 187-192-12 overall. The Tigers are 34-22 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 254-69-6. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 27-6.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 150-28 (.842) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 206-36-1 (.849) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 546-56-9 (.901) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 341-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 173-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 81-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» On the current Auburn roster, 33 players have at least one college start to their credit, 18 on offense and 15 on defense.

Four Tigers have started 15 or more collegiate games: Caylin Newton (25 at Howard), Brandon Council (25 overall; 24 at Akron), Eli Stove (22) and Seth Williams (17).

On the 2019 squad, 43 players had at least one college start to their credit, 24 on offense and 19 on defense.

» Auburn is now 99-27-2 (.780) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 13 of their past 15 openers dating back to the 2006 season, and have won seven of eight season openers under Coach Gus Malzahn, losing only to eventual national champion Clemson (19-13) in 2016 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

» This season is just the fifth time, and the first since 1962, Auburn has begun a season with at least two straight SEC games. This includes the 1949 season, in which Auburn's first seven games were against SEC opponents, the only other time before 2020 the Tigers have opened a season with more than two SEC games.

» Four Auburn defenders have opted out of the 2020 season for concerns related to COVID-19: linebacker Chandler Wooten, defensive back Traivon Leonard, linebacker Josh Marsh and defensive back Malcolm Askew.

THE LAST TIME VS. GEORGIA
GEORGIA 21, AUBURN 14

>> No. 13 Auburn rallied for two fourth-quarter touchdowns to earn two opportunities for game-tying drives before falling 21-14 to No. 5 Georgia at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Trailing 21-0 after three quarters, Auburn's comeback began with Bo Nix's 3-yard touchdown pass to Eli Stove with 10:04 left in the fourth quarter, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

After a three-and-out by Auburn's defense, the Tigers struck quickly, driving 57 yards on five plays in 68 seconds. Nix's 2-yard touchdown run, the first rushing TD allowed by Georgia this season, pulled Auburn within seven points with 7:03 remaining.

Again, the Tigers' defense came through, forcing a three-and-out to regain possession for Auburn at its 28-yard line with 6 minutes to play.

On fourth-and-5 from midfield, Nix scrambled for 8 yards to keep Auburn's hopes alive at Georgia's 42. On fourth-and-2 at UGA's 34, Nix's pass was incomplete, giving the ball back to Georgia.

Once again, Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, giving the Tigers' possession at Auburn's 30 with 2:03 to play, but the Tigers were unable to get closer.

Nix completed 30 of 50 passes for 245 yards and touchdown, adding 42 rushing yards on 13 carries and a TD.

Seth Williams made 13 receptions for 121 yards. Jeremiah Dinson led the defensive with eight tackles.

Auburn trailed 21-0 heading to the fourth quarter after Georgia drove 88 yards on 12 plays, scoring on Jake Fromm's third touchdown pass, a 5-yarder with 13 seconds remaining in the third quarter.

Auburn found success in the first half with slants to Williams. On the game's opening possession, Nix and Williams teamed up three times for 22 yards, twice picking up first downs and driving to Georgia's 29 before Auburn missed a 47-yard field goal.

Auburn then forced a three-and-out on Georgia's first possession, but the Bulldogs scored on their second drive on a 51-yard touchdown pass from Fromm to Dominick Blaylock for a 7-0 lead with 5:56 left in the first quarter.

Near the end of the first, Auburn defensive linemen Derrick Brown and Marlon Davidson made tackles for loss on successive plays, with Brown's TFL on second-and-10 preceding Davidson's sack on third-and-12.

Auburn drove again into Georgia territory before being stopped on fourth-and-1 from the 37.

The Tigers' defense delivered three consecutive three-and-outs, allowing zero yards on nine plays.

After the second three-and-out, Nix and Williams connected on another slant for 28 yards, Auburn's biggest play of the half, advancing to Auburn's 45. In the half, Williams made seven receptions for 66 yards.

On third-and-9, Nix found Anthony Schwartz for 10 yards to Georgia's 44, but the Bulldogs recovered a fumble on the next play to end the drive.

Georgia drove 81 yards to take a 14-0 lead on Fromm's 5-yard pass to Brian Herrien with 20 seconds left in the half.

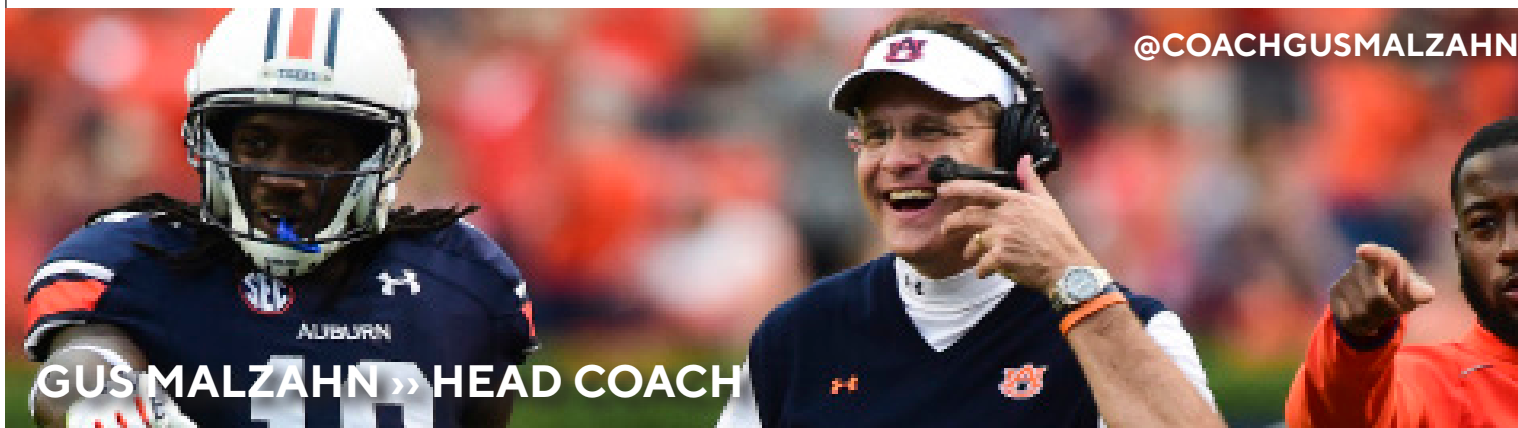

» Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).

» Since 2000, in the eight seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 25 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season four times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

» Malzahn is 47-11 (.810) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 1-0 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In nine seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 77 of 94 games (81%).

» Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.

» 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

» Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 55 of 94 games under Malzahn.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 414 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 324, losing 83 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .791 against some of the best teams in college football.

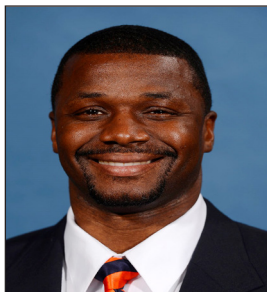
