FOOTBALL CONTINUES ROAD PLAY AT NO. 9 OLE MISS

>> The Auburn Tigers (3-3, 1-2 SEC) travel to No. 9 Ole Miss (6-0, 2-0 SEC) on Saturday, October 15, for an SEC West matchup at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford, Miss. ESPN will televise the 11:00 a.m. CT contest, the Tigers' final game before an open date on the 2022 schedule.

SERIES HISTORY

» Auburn leads 35-11 all-time against Ole Miss. The Tigers have won six straight in the series, outscoring the Rebels 166-102 (27.7-17.0 ppg). Auburn leads 17-3 in Auburn and 13-3 in Oxford, while the series is tied 5-5 at neutral sites.

The Tigers were 31-20 winners last season in an October 30 game at Jordan-Hare Stadium, and Auburn was a 35-28 winner in the teams' last meeting in Oxford during the 2020 season.

Twelve of the last 18 games in the series have been decided by double digits; Auburn has a 10-2 record in those games. Prior to the last 18 games, the previous five games were decided by eight points or fewer.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 334-264-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 143-65-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-198-12 overall.

IN OCTORER

Auburn is 320-169-18 (.649) all-time in October. Auburn's October home record is 175-37-3 (.821). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 145-132-15 (.517) in October. Auburn is 12-4 in games played on October 15 all-time, 6-3 against SEC teams and 10-4 away from Auburn on that date.


KICKOFF COVERAGE

- » John Samuel Shenker is now the Auburn career leader for receptions by a tight end. Shenker passed Cooper Wallace (63 from 2002-05) with five receptions at Georgia, giving him 65 catches for his career
- » Robby Ashford ranks second in the SEC and sixth nationally in passing yards per completion, averaging 14.81 yards per reception.

Ashford and Jarquez Hunter have combined for a 60+-yard completion in the last two games (61 vs. LSU, 62 TD at Georgia). Hunter is the only running back and one of 10 players nationally with two 60+-yard receptions this season

Auburn ranks second in the SEC in net punting at 41.68 yards, ranking 16th nationally. Punter Oscar Chapman ranks third in the SEC in average (44.2) this season

- Placekicker Anders Carlson is one of only players from all divisions of college football named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for their efforts in community service. He is also a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, awarded to the top student-athlete in college football
- The Auburn defense has held the opponent scoreless in the first quarter in five of six games this season
- All-American Ben Tamburello, a four-year starter at guard and center from 1983-86, is Auburn's 2022 SEC Legend honoree. Tamburello was a finalist for both the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award his senior season of 1986 as he anchored an offensive line that led the Southeastern Conference in rushing with 312.5 yards per game

THE GRADUATES

» On the 2022 Auburn roster, 17 players have already received bachelor's degrees: Marcus Bragg (Western Kentucky), Nick Brahms; Marquis Burks; Zach Calzada (Texas A&M); Anders Carlson; Brandon Council (Akron); Luke Deal; Alec Jackson; Shedrick Jackson; Morris Joseph Jr. (Memphis); Eku Leota (Northwestern); Barton Lester; Jacob Quattlebaum; John Samuel Shenker; Kameron Stutts; Austin Troxell; and Kilian Zierer.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

>>> Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms earned 2021 CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors, only the second time that Auburn has had two first-team honorees in the prestigious program, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes. LB Gregg Carr and K/P Matt Hawkins were both first-team honorees in 1984. Carlson, a 2020 first team Academic All-American, is just the second two-time honoree in Auburn history, along with Hawkins (1984-85). Carlson graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and has since completed his MBA. Brahms graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.89 GPA in professional flight management and also completed his MBA.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 43 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2021 season, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Tank Bigsby, Jackson Billings, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Sammy Cohen, Luke Deal, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Alec Jackson, Tate Johnson, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Jake Levant, Trey Lindsey, Trent Mason, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith, Sawyer Pate, Jacob Quattlebaum, John Samuel Shenker, Wesley Steiner, Zykeivous Walker, Jeremiah Wright and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had six representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Cort Bradley, Jarquez Hunter, Donovan Kaufman, Kyle Vaccarella and Garrison Walker.

AD HONOR ROLL

» Undergraduate student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. TOTAL OFFENSE

Auburn has scored in 123 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 31.17 ppg (3,834 total points) during that stretch. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

The longest streak of not being shut out in program history is 149 games, beginning with a 55-16 victory over Richmond on Oct. 4, 1980, in Doug Barfield's final season as the Tigers' head coach and lasting until the final game of Pat Dye's 12-year tenure as Auburn head coach when the Tigers lost 17-0 to No. 2 Alabama in the 1992 Iron Bowl.

" Junior tailback Tank Bigsby got his 2022 campaign off to a productive start with 147 rushing yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns in the season opener against Mercer. His 39-yard score was the longest rushing TD of his career.

The 19th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 2,000 career yards, he ranks 14th with 2,278 career yards and 19 career scores. Bigsby's 10 career 100-yard rushing games are tied for 12th in program history.

With 1,099 yards last season, Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games of 2021.

He ranks third among Auburn rushers in yards gained through their sophomore season: Michael Dyer (2,355/2010-11); Bo Jackson (2,042/1982-83); Tank Bigsby (1,933/2020-21).

In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen); his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS

freshmen. Bigsby was the first Tiger to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993.

Jarquez Hunter opened his sophomore campaign by rushing for three touchdowns on only eight carries against Mercer. It was Hunter's first career game with multiple rushing touchdowns. Hunter's three rushing scores against the Bears matched his total in 13 games as a freshman.

He was the first Auburn player to rush for three touchdowns since JaTarvious Whitlow did so against Mississippi State in 2019.

Hunter (3 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) and Bigsby (2 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) were the first Auburn teammates to rush for multiple touchdowns in the same game since Whitlow and Joey Gatewood each rushed for a pair of scores against Kent State in 2019.

Hunter added another rushing score against San Jose' State to give him four TD runs for the season and scored his first receiving touchdown of the season on a 22-yard throw from Robby Ashford against Penn State, giving him five total rushing scores for the season.

At Georgia, Hunter's 62-yard touchdown reception from Robby Ashford was the Tigers' longest play of the season to date.

Hunter is the only running back and one of 10 players nationally with two 60+-yard receptions this season. He is the first Auburn running

back with a 60+yard reception since Harold Joiner recorded a 78-yard reception from Bo Nix against Ole Miss in 2019 and the only Tiger running back with multiple 60+-yard receptions in a season since at least 1996.

Hunter is 14th in the SEC in scoring at 6.0 points per game.

>> Hunter ranked ninth among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 597 yards as a true freshman during 2021.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run tied for seventh longest in the nation that season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

Against Akron last season, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo lackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

» Robby Ashford ranks second in the SEC and sixth nationally in passing yards per completion, averaging 14.81 yards per reception.

Ashford is the only FBS freshman quarter-back with four 50+-yard passes and one of only three FBS quarterbacks with four passes of at least 50 yards. Ashford is one of four freshmen signal callers with four 20+-yard rushes and one of 14 FBS quarterbacks with at least four rushes of at least 20 yards.

Tight end John Samuel Shenker is now the Auburn recordholder for career catches by a tight end with 65, passing Cooper Wallace (63 catches from 2002-05).

Shenker is also third in career tight end receiving vardage at 750.

Shenker's 33 catches during the 2021 campaign set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season. His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn TE season record.

Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU last season was the first 100yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times last season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had five catches this season at Georgia.

>> Junior Ja'Varrius Johnson led Auburn with 117 yards on four receptions in the Tigers' season-opening win over Mercer. It was Johnson's second career 100-yard receiving game (107 yards vs. Mississippi State in 2021).

Johnson's 117 receiving yards were the most by an Auburn player since Anthony Schwartz finished with 123 yards and a TD on four catches against LSU in 2020. The last Auburn 100-yard receiver was Shedrick Jackson (111) last season at South Carolina.

Johnson ranks 17th in the SEC in receiving yards per game (54.2) and fourth in the conference in yards per reception (19.12).

y Ja'Varrius Johnson now has 36 career receptions for 599 yards. Shedrick Jackson now has 60 career receptions for 798 yards.

FOR THE DEFENSE

- With a team-best eight tackles at Georgia, Owen Pappoe became the 17th Auburn player since 2000 with more than 200 career tackles. Pappoe now has 206 to his credit.
- >> Auburn's defense has allowed only 25 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 72 games.
- Prior to allowing a 1-yard rushing TD against San Jose' State, Auburn had held its opponents without a rushing touchdown in six straight games dating back through the 2021 season, the longest such streak for the Tigers since not allowing a rushing score in eight straight games during the middle of the 2016 campaign.
- » Captain Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play in the overtime win against Missouri. Hall had three tackles for loss, two sacks, a 39-yard interception and six tackles overall in the 17-14 Auburn victory. He also earned Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week honors and was a Lott IMPACT Trophy player of the week finalist.
- Linebacker Cam Riley's 16 tackles against Mercer were a career high for the junior; he led the team in tackles for the first time in his career. Riley had the most tackles by an Auburn player since Zakoby McClain had 17 tackles against Texas A&M in 2020.

Riley and Owen Pappoe were Auburn's leading tacklers against Penn State with six stops each. Pappoe led the Tigers with eight tackles against Missouri.

Riley led the Tigers this season with 31 tackles through the first four contests; he did not play against LSU. He had 23 career tackles entering the season.

>> Senior Derick Hall has 16.5 career sacks, all in his last 25 games dating back to the middle of the 2020 season.

Hall recorded six tackles, 3.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks and registered his first career interception against Missouri, the first Auburn player with a sack and INT in the same game since Smoke Monday in the 2019 Iron Bowl.

Hall is fifth in the SEC with 4.0 sacks and 7.0 TFL this season. Hall has 24.5 career tackles for loss and 117 career tackles.

Colby Wooden is seventh in the SEC with 3.0 sacks and 5.5 TFL. Wooden now has 131 career tackles, 12.0 career sacks and 24.0 career TFL at Auburn.

Eku Leota, who recorded at least one tackle for a loss in five straight games dating back to the final game of 2021 (6.0 TFL during streak), has 15.0 TFL and 9.0 sacks during his Auburn career. Adding two seasons at Northwestern, he has 25.0 TFL and 15.5 sacks.

Auburn is 64-29 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 39-10 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 13-16 when it fails to force a turnover. Auburn got its first interception of the season on a Derick Hall pick in the Missouri win. Career interceptions by current Auburn players:

- ... Limiting LSU to only 85 yards through the air, Auburn held an SEC opponent to less than 100 yards passing for the first time since the 2019 Ole Miss game (99 yards).
- The Tigers have allowed just 472 passing yards to SEC opponents, fewest in the conference. Auburn SEC opponents are 46-82-1 for an efficiency rating of 102.01, third best in the SEC.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas last season.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» All-America kicker Anders Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, has moved into second place in Auburn career scoring with 384 points, passing Wes Byrum (363 points from 2007-10).

He ranked ninth in the SEC in scoring at 7.7 ppg last season and was fifth in the league with 1.40 field goals made per game.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is third in career PAT made (165) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (73). He needs 11 made PATs to crack the SEC's career top 10.

He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT in 2021, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

Carlson ranks seventh in SEC career scoring (384), just one point behind Alabama's Leigh Tiffin (385 from 2006-09).

He is also eighth in SEC career field goals made (73), behind Georgia's Blair Walsh (76 from 2008-11).

- Carlson, whose older brother Daniel (a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist) holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders, has five career FG of at least 50 yards:
 - 33 Washington (2018)
 - 53 Liberty (2018)
 - 52 Alabama (2019)

- >> Carlson has nine career games with at least three field goals:

- With 858 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).
- >> Punter Oscar Chapman ranks third in the SEC in average (44.2) this season.

Chapman averaged 45.9 yards on eight punts against Missouri, including a 61-yard boot that was his longest kick of the season. He was recognized as one of Ray's 8 by the Ray Guy Award for that performance, and received

the same Ray's 8 recognition vs. LSU, with a 46.2-yard average on four punts.

Chapman had a season-high nine punts at Georgia, averaging 44.7 yards with a long kick of 56 yards.

Auburn ranks second in the SEC in net punting at 41.68 yards, ranking 16th nationally.

- » Keionte Scott ranks sixth in the SEC with a 9.5-yard punt return average, ranking 26th nationally.
- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (172) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- >> Auburn has seven field goal blocks and nine punt blocks since the start of 2016.

- Auburn is 116-174-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 54-46-2 at home against ranked teams, 29-75-2 on the road and 33-53-2 on a neutral field.
- Auburn is 56-105-3 all-time against AP top 10 teams (27-29-2 at home, 29-76-1 away from Auburn).
- >> The Tigers are 92-138-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (44-36-2 at home, 29-67-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 60-55-3 overall (30-11-1 at home, 19-34-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).
- Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 334-126-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 191-34-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 142-91-4 all-time.

When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 82-80-4 (37-14-1 at home, 22-43-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

- Auburn has held the opponent scoreless in the first quarter in five of six games this season.
- » Robby Ashford's 62-yard touchdown pass to Jarquez Hunter was Auburn's longest pass play of the season and a career long for both.
- Defensive notes: D.J. James' TFL was his first of the season. Colby Wooden's fumble recovery was the second of his career.

Among those is Auburn kicker Anders Carlson, who is active in his worship center Church of the Highlands and many Christian vouth service initiatives.

The final roster features 11 players from NCAA FBS and 11 players from all other divisions of NCAA and NAIA football. Allstate will reward these athletes with an NIL opportunity as well as a charity match from The Allstate Foundation

- Carlson, a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American, is also a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy. Celebrating its 33rd year, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.
- Auburn is 8-13 on fourth down this season. The Tigers' eight conversions are tied for 23rd nationally, while their 13 chances are tied for 34th among FBS teams and their 61.54 success rate is 39th.

Against Missouri, Auburn converted 3-4 fourth-down opportunities, just the second time in the last four seasons the Tigers converted three fourth-down chances in a game (3-5 vs. Georgia in 2021).

Prior to Georgia, Auburn had converted at least one fourth-down opportunity in six straight games for the first time since the 2015-16 seasons.

Team captains for the 2022 season are defensive lineman Derick Hall, linebacker Owen Pappoe and tight end John Samuel Shenker.

Pappoe, who was also a 2021 captain, is just the fourth two-time captain in Auburn annals, along with two-time captains Reese Dismukes (2013-14), Gusty Yearout (1966-67) and Curtis Kuykendall (1944-45).

Along with its three permanent team captains, Auburn will select an additional game captain each week:

Since 2001, Auburn is 163-33 (.839) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 219-41-1 (.847) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 559-61-9 (.898) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 351-10 (.977) when scoring 30 points, 177-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

- There are 17 players on the Auburn roster who have already earned their bachelor's degrees, second best in the SEC behind South Carolina (20).
- Auburn has an all-time record of 341-90-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .787 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 62 capacity crowds of 87,451 since seating was increased in 2004, the latest coming against Penn State and LSU this season.

- >> In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 259-71-6 (.781). Before the Penn State game, Auburn had won 17 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.
- On the current Auburn roster, 45 players have at least one college start to their credit, 25 on offense and 20 on defense.

There are 11 Tigers who have started 20 or more collegiate games: Brandon Council 44 (24 at Akron), Owen Pappoe 35, John Samuel Shenker 33, Colby Wooden 30, Derick Hall 25, Nehemiah Pritchett 25, Tank Bigsby 23, Marcus Harris 23 (5 at Kansas), Shedrick Jackson 22, Keiondre Jones 21 and Austin Troxell 20 games.

Three players on the current roster have played more than 50 career games for Auburn: John Samuel Shenker (56), Anders Carlson (53) and Alec Jackson (51).

The school record for career games played is 59, set by T.D. Moultry from 2017-21.

THE LAST TIME VS. OLE MISS #18 AUBURN 31, #10 OLE MISS 20

>> Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns, Tank Bigsby rushed for 140 yards and No. 18 Auburn kept No. 10 Ole Miss out of the end zone in the second half in the No. 18 Tigers' 31-20 win Saturday at soldout Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Jaylin Simpson's end zone interception in the fourth quarter preserved Auburn's two-score lead and the Tigers stopped the Rebels three times on fourth down inside AU's 20-yard line in the second half.

The Tigers' defense held Ole Miss (6-2, 3-2) to a 49-yard field goal in the third quarter, forcing two three-and-outs. Zakoby McClain led the way with 14 tackles and two sacks.

In SEC West wins over LSU, Arkansas and Ole Miss, the Tigers have outscored opponents 27-0 in the fourth quarter.

Anders Carlson's 28-yard field goal gave AU a 31-20 lead with 10:52 left in the fourth to culminate an 11-play, 76-yard drive that included a 24-yard Bigsby run and a 24-yard pass from Nix to Kobe Hudson.

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its five firsthalf drives to take a 28-17 halftime lead.

The Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays on their opening possession with Nix rushing for an 11-yard touchdown. Nix was 3-for-3 on the drive for 33 vards while rushing for 18 yards, including another of his patented, sack-avoiding scrambles.

Picking up where he left off in Auburn's win at Arkansas. Marcus Harris set the tone defensively with a tackle for loss on the Rebels' first play, one of seven TFLs for the Tigers' defense.

After Ole Miss kicked a 29-yard field goal on its first drive, Auburn answered with a 10-play, 72-yard touchdown drive.

Bigsby began the drive with a 26-yard run, then went airborne on third-and-goal from the 1 to put Auburn ahead 14-3 late in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Ole Miss drove 88 yards in 15 plays, cutting Auburn's lead to 14-10 on Snoop Conner's 13-yard touchdown run.

Auburn answered quickly, gaining 35 yards on Nix's pass to Demetris Robertson and scoring on Nix's 7-yard touchdown run to lead 21-10 with 6:20 left in the half.

Ole Miss quarterback Matt Corral led the Rebels on a 75-yard drive, scoring on an 11-yard touchdown run to trim Auburn's advantage to 21-17 with 2:42 remaining in the second quarter.

The Tigers executed their two-minute offense to perfection, driving 69 yards in 11 plays and scoring on Nix's 9-yard pass to Jarquez Hunter with 11 seconds left in the half.

Nix completed 22 of 30 passes for 276 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 30 yards and a pair of TDs.

- >> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.
- >> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 85-33 overall as a head coach including one season at Arkansas State and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.
- >> His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.
- >> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.
- >> The first alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.
- >> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.
- >> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.
- >> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 431 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 341, losing 90 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .786 against some of the best teams in college football.

The big-play Tigers produced seven plays of 20 yards or more

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its first five drives with Jarquez Hunter scoring the season's first points on a 19-yard run on the Tigers' first drive.

Auburn gained 88 yards in two plays on its second possession on a 49-yard run by quarterback Robby Ashford and a 39-yard pass from T.J. Finley to Ja'Varrius Johnson. Auburn made it 14-0 on Finley's 2-yard touchdown pass to John Samuel

Hunter's 2-yard touchdown put the Tigers on top 21-0 early in the second quarter with 84,562 in attendance. Bigsby, who led Auburn with 147 rushing yards on 16 carries, scored on a 2-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 28-0 lead with 5:04 remaining in the first half.

Mercer capitalized on an Auburn interception to score on a 5-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left in the half.

Derick Hall recorded a third-down sack to force a punt in the third quarter. Ashford threw a 56-yard pass to Johnson to

set up Hunter's third touchdown, a 1-yarder that gave Auburn a 35-7 lea'd before lightning within eight miles of Pat Dye Field delayed the game late in the third quarter.

The Bears added nine fourth-quarter points on a field goal and a touchdown with 25 seconds remaining

Linebacker Cam Riley led Auburn with a career-high 15 tackles, exceeding his 2021 season total of 14.

Johnson made four receptions for 117 yards, averaging 29.3 yards per catch.
Ashford, a redshirt freshman, produced 168 yards of total offense, completing 4-of-7 passes for 100 yards while rushing for 68 yards on six carries.

Auburn answered in the second quarter, converting twice on third-and-long with a 24-yard pass from Finley to Landen King and Finley's 18-yard scramble on third-and-16. Auburn had first-and-goal at the 10 but had to settle for Carlson's 22-

Leading 17-14 at the half, Auburn forced a three-and-out to start the second half, but LSU stopped the Tigers on fourth down and drove 63 yards on seven plays to take a 21-17 lead on John Emery Jr.'s 20-yard run with 3:32 left in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, Auburn drove 65 yards to LSU's 5-yard line, but on second-and-goal from the 10, LSU inter-

cepted Koy Moore's reverse pass, Auburn's second turnover. A muffed punt with 5:31 left in the game accounted for Auburn's third turnover.

Auburn built a 17-0 first-half lead with Ashford throwing for 247 yards and two touchdowns.

The Tigers scored on the opening drive by twice converting on third down, first with Ashford finding Moore for 10 yards on third-and-6, then scrambling and hitting Ja'Varrius Johnson for a 53-yard touchdown to put Auburn up 7-0 in the first two

Late in the opening quarter, LSU's punt pinned Auburn at its 1-yard line but the Tigers drove 99 yards on six plays to take a 14-0 lead. Ashford escaped LSU's pass rush and threw to Jarquez Hunter, who raced 40 yards after the catch for a 61-yard gain. On the next play, freshman Camden Brown leaped in the end zone to snag Ashford's pass for his first career touchdown. Ashford finished with 337 yards and two TDs, completing 19-of-38 passes.

Auburn extended its lead to 17-0 on Anders Carlson's 29-yard field goal with 9:38 remaining in the first half.

LSU scored a defensive touchdown midway through the second quarter when Jay Ward recovered a fumble and returned it 23 yards to trim Auburn's lead to 17-7.

The Bengal Tigers made it 17-14 with 15 seconds left in the half when quarterback Jayden Daniels scored on a 1-yard run to

cap an 11-play, 77-yard drive.
Wesley Steiner led Auburn's defense with a career-high 11 tackles. The Tigers held LSU to 270 yards of total offense, including 10-for-26 passing for 85 yards. Colby Wooden, Marcus Bragg and Derick Hall each recorded sacks. Hall and Wooden each made two of Auburn's eight tackles for loss.

A promising start to the second half sparked Auburn and Jarquez Hunter scored a touchdown but No. 2 Georgia beat the Tigers 42-10 Saturday at Sanford Stadium in the 127th meeting of the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry.

Hunter caught a short pass and spun away from two defenders, racing down the left sideline for a 62-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Trailing 14-0 to start the third quarter, Auburn pressured Georgia quarterback Stetson Bennett on third-and-7 with Colby Wooden forcing and recovering a fumble at UGA's 19-yard line. Anders Carlson kicked a 29-yard field goal to get the Tigers on the scoreboard at the 11:51 mark of the third quarter.

Georgia answered with its longest drive of the game, moving 81 yards on 11 plays, taking a 21-3 lead on Daijun Edwards' 2-yard touchdown run, his second score of the game.

Auburn converted on third-and-13 on Robby Ashford's 20-yard completion to Ja'Varrius Johnson but the drive ended with a punt when Georgia made its first tackle for loss on a third-and-8 rush from UGA's 43. $The \ Bull dogs\ broke open\ the \ game\ on\ the\ first\ play\ of\ the\ fourth\ quarter\ on\ Bennett's\ quarter\ back\ draw\ when\ he\ raced\ 64$

yards for a touchdown to put Georgia ahead 28-3

After Georgia forced a three-and-out, the Bulldogs drove 63 yards on six plays with Edwards scoring his third touchdown on a 7-yard rush to make it 35-3 before Hunter answered for Auburn.

The Bulldogs added their sixth rushing touchdown on Branson Robinson's 15-yard run with 4:45 to play.

Special teams figured prominently in Georgia's first-half touchdown drives, with the Bulldogs capitalizing on short fields after stopping Auburn's fake punt on the Tigers' 36-yard line, and Ladd McConkey's 38-yard punt return.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Bulldogs took a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter, driving 36 yards on seven plays after

the fourth-down stop, scoring on Kenny McIntosh's 1-yard run.

The Bulldogs (6-0, 3-0) then forced a three-and-out and McConkey's return gave Georgia excellent field position at Au-

burn's 31. Two plays later, Édwards scored his first touchdown on a 1-yard rush. Shenker made five receptions for 32 yards, passing Cooper Wallace to become Auburn's career leader in tight end receptions with 65

Auburn held Georgia to 25 passing yards in the first half on 7 of 13 attempts while recording three three-and-outs.
