STORY LINES

The Murray State Racers open play in the 2012 Charleston Classic Thursday (Nov. 15) against the Auburn Tigers at TD Arena in Charleston, S.C. The game will tip off at 7 p.m. CT and will be aired on ESPN3. MSU is appearing in the Charleston Classic a year after winning the Great Alaska Shootout in 2011. MSU played in the Anaheim Classic in 2010. This season marks the 10th straight season that the Racers have played in an early-season tournament.

The Racers are coming off winning their season and home opener last Friday (Nov. 9) over Brescia at the CFSB Center in Murray, Ky., by a score of 88-43. Stacy Wilson scored a career-high 21 points as MSU won their home opener for a 23rd consecutive season. MSU's All-America candidate Isaiah Canaan scored 11 points, dished out three assists and grabbed five rebounds in the MSU win.

The Racers are meeting Auburn for the first time since 2002 in a series that the Tigers lead 2-0. Auburn's win in 1996 was in Birmingham, Ala., and the another at home in Auburn, Ala., in 2002.

MSU is 9-22 all-time against teams from the Southeastern Conference. MSU last played an SEC team in a 77-61 loss at Ole Miss (Nov. 17, 2010). MSU's last win over an SEC team was in the NCAA Tournament in 2010. Danero Thomas' buzzer shot gave the Racers a 66-65 win in San Jose, Calif. MSU has played every current member of the SEC except: Florida, Kentucky, LSU and South Carolina.

The Tigers come into the game 1-0 after winning their season and home opener (Nov. 9) 61-50 over IPFW. Frankie Sullivan scored a game-high 26 points while Rob Chubb had a double-double with 10 points and 15 rebounds. An 18-4 run starting at the 10:00 mark in the second half pushed the Tigers to the win.

All of the games in the Charleston Classic will be held at TD Arena, the home court of tournament host College of Charleston. The Racers have never played in the arena that seats 5,100. The Racers have never met St. John's, Charleston or Boston College before. MSU played Dayton at home last season and posted a 75-58 win and play at UD this season (Dec. 23). MSU has met Colorado once and Baylor four times.



The Racers are playing in a preseason tournament for the 10th straight season.

MSU is facing a team from the Southeastern Conference for the first time since a road loss at Ole Miss 77-61 (11-17-10). MSU's last win against an SEC team was in the NCAA Tournament in a 66-65 win over Vanderbilt in San Jose, Calif. (3-18-10).

MSU is 9-22 all-time against the SEC.

MSU's first game against an SEC team was at Vanderbilt (1-7-32).

The Racers are 55-11 (.833) in the last two seasons and 87-16 (.844) in the last three seasons.

Freshman Jeffery Moss hit his first three-point attempt at MSU vs Brescia last Friday.

HEAD COACH STEVE PROHM



Steve Prohm was named Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year after his team produced a record-breaking 2011-12 season. The Racers' 31-2 storybook season came under a first year head coach who was ready to lead when his name was called.

MSU had an OVC record 23-0 start, which was the top win streak and best start to a season in the history of the OVC. The 23-0 start was the third-best in NCAA Division I history for a first-year head coach, trailing only a 33-0 start by Indiana State's Bill Hodges (1978-79) and a 26-0 start by North Carolina's Norman Shephard (1923-24). The Racers also had the distinction of being the last undefeated team in NCAA Division I.

The Racers won their 23rd OVC title and experienced their highest national rankings in team history of No. 7 in the ESPN/USA Today Poll and No. 9 in the Associated Press Poll (Feb. 9). MSU finished with their highest rankings No. 12 and No. 16.

Prohm was named the OVC Coach of the Year and was honored as the Basketball Times National Coach of the Year. He was also named to the inaugural Joe B. Hall Coach of the Year Award and NABC District 19 Coach of the Year. He was also a candidate for the Hugh Durham and Jim Phelan Coach of the Year awards.

He was introduced as the 15th head coach in MSU Basketball history on May 23, 2011, promoted after serving as an assistant coach between 2006-11 (5 seasons) under Billy Kennedy, who became head coach at Texas A&M University.

Prohm has been a key part of one of the most successful periods of Racer Basketball from 2006-11 which has included three straight outright Ohio Valley Conference regular-season championships 2010, 2011 and last season in 2012. He was also part of MSU's 15th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, where the Racers scored their third win in program history with a victory over Colorado State after they had achieved the program's highest seed of No. 6. MSU missed a Sweet 16 berth only after a close loss to Marquette.

Prohm was associated with Coach Kennedy for 12 seasons, which include stops at Southeastern Louisiana University (1999-2005) and Centenary University (1998-99). Prohm also served as assistant coach at Tulane University during the 2005-06 season.

Prohm graduated from the University of Alabama in 1997 with a degree in education. He worked as a student assistant coach and student manager for the Crimson Tide for five years, which included two NCAA Tournament appearances and one trip to the NIT Final Four.

Racers tournament history

MSU is playing in a pre-conference tournament for the 10th straight season. MSU won the Great Alaska Shootout a year ago with wins over host Alaska-Anchorage, San Francisco and Southern Miss. The title game against USM was a double-overtime winner for the Racers. Isaiah Canaan was named MVP of the event and averaged 25.3 points in the three wins on 25-of-45 (.555) from the field and 12-of-22 (.545) from three-point range.

In 2010, the Racers played in the Anaheim Classic and had a win over Stanford to go with losses to UNLV and Oklahoma State. MSU's tournament wins before last season at Alaska were at OU Sooner Classic (1998), Racer Thanksgiving Classic (1997), Puerto Rico Classic (1990), Lamar Classic and McDonnell Classic (1989), Bayou Classic (1986), UAB Classic (1982), Kentucky Invitational Tournament (1955), Marshall Invitational (1950) and Midwest Tournament (1944).

Murray State-Auburn Series

The Racers and Tigers have played twice with the Tigers taking one game at home and on a neutral floor in Birmingham, Ala. MSU was coached by Scott Edgar in 1996 and Tevester Anderson in 2002.

OVC Preseason Rankings & Picks

For the first time, the Ohio Valley Conference is using divisions in men's basketball and that was reflected in the preseason poll that was released during OVC Media Day activities in Nashville (Oct. 23). The Racers were the choice to win the west division with a total of 131 points off of 22 first-place votes ahead of SE Missouri who had 108 points. Austin Peay, SIUE, Eastern Illinois and UT Martin made up the rest of the west division predictions. OVC newcomer Belmont was picked to win the east division ahead of Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, Morehead State, Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State.

Isaiah Canaan was named the OVC Preseason Player of the Year and joined Ed Daniel on the All-OVC Preseason Team.

Returning production

The Racers return about 57 percent of their scoring and 55 percent of their rebounding from last season, but must also replace the intangibles that the senior trio of Ivan Aska, Jewuan Long and Donte Poole provided. Isaiah Canaan is the Racers' leading returning scorer at 19.1 points per game, while Ed Daniel is the best returning rebounder at 5.5 per game.

Prohm sets fast pace

MSU Head Coach Steve Prohm is on pace to be among the Racers' fastest to 40 wins in 2012-13. Mick Cronin (2003-05) set the mark of 53 games when he was 40-13. Prohm currently has 32 wins in 34 games.

Racers start season on road win streak

The Racers carry a school record 13-game road winning streak into the 2012-13 season. MSU was the only team in the nation to avoid a loss away from home last season at 13-0 and the first in 87 years of Racer Basketball. MSU has already broken the previous best streak of 11 set by the teams from the 1975-76 and 1976-77 seasons. MSU hasn't lost on the road since March 15, 2011 at Missouri State in the NIT.

MSU's home court advantage

MSU started off the season with another home win in the win over Brescia. The Racers ranked 12th in the nation coming into the season with a .935 winning percentage (29-2) at home over

the last two seasons. Duke and Kentucky led the way with each undefeated at 34-0 and 35-0. MSU's home advantage is among the best in the nation. They're 42-3 (.933) in the last four seasons and 68-7 (.906) in the last six.

The Racers set various attendance records in the CFSB Center last season with a 86,010 total and 6,144 per game average, both were MSU records for the 14 seasons in the building. The previous best average of 5,130 came from the first season in the arena in 1998-99. The previous best total attendance of 67,328 was from the 2003-04 season.

Senior class goes for record wins

Seniors Isaiah Canaan, Ed Daniel and Jordan Burge begin the season in a small group of 13 MSU players that have won three straight OVC titles and can join a group of only four that have won four titles. MSU will be trying to win four straight titles for the first time since 2000 when they won the last of seven straight under head coaches Scott Edgar, Tevester Anderson and Mark Gottfried.

The Racer seniors are also in line to become the all-time winningest class at MSU. The record of 104 was just set last season by the senior class of Ivan Aska, Jewuan Long and Donte Poole. This season's senior class now has 86 wins after the season opening win over Brescia. The 1996-2000 class won four OVC titles and featured the likes of Isaac Spencer, Aubrey Reese, Mike Turner and Rod Murray that won 99 games.

MSU goes for four-peat

The Racers enter the 2012-13 season having won the last three Ohio Valley Conference regular season titles. Their combined record in that period is 46-6 (.884).

Historic numbers coming soon

The Racers enter the 2012-13 season one win from 600 all-time wins in the Ohio Valley Conference. MSU opens OVC play at UT Martin (Jan. 3). After the win over Brescia, MSU needs 21 wins to get to 1,600 all-time victories.

Racers preseason rankings

The Racers were ranked No. 23 in the Sporting News preseason poll ahead of No. 24 Notre Dame and No. 25 VCU. The Racers received votes in the Associated Press preseason poll, but just missed cracking the top-25.

MSU's defensive emphasis

MSU has led the OVC in scoring defense in the last four seasons. MSU held opponents to 60.6ppg last season. MSU has led the OVC in 3-point defense in five of the last six seasons. They held opponents to 29 percent last season. In 2011-12, MSU was first in the OVC and 6th in the nation in 3-point percentage at .406. MSU led the OVC and was 15th in the NCAA in defending the 3-point shot at .295.

MSU featured on ESPNU Midnight Madness

The Racers were the only mid-major team that was included on this year's ESPNU Midnight Madness program on the night of Oct. 12. The ESPNU program also visited schools including: Baylor, Florida State, Georgetown, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.

Practice facility construction update

Work continues on the Racers' new practice facility adjacent to Murray State's CFSB Center. Ground was broken last February on the 3.1 million dollar building and it's on track for completion this coming January. The 180,000 square-foot facility will have offices for both the MSU men's and women's coaching staffs and a practice court with six goals.






