STARTING XI

- » Auburn ramps up SEC play by welcoming in another ranked foe in No. 14/22 South Carolina to the Auburn Soccer Complex on Sunday night at 6 p.m.
- » Since head coach Karen Hoppa took over the program, the Tigers have amassed 27 wins against ranked teams, including 12 since 2010. Last season, Auburn accumulated four wins versus ranked competition, including three at home and in conference play.
- » The Tigers are search of their first 2-0-0 start to SEC play since 2011, when they went on to finish second in the West. Auburn has won its first two matches in league play three times since 2000.
- » Casie Ramsier passed Katy Frierson for second on the program's all-time shots list on Friday. Ramsier, who now has 231 on her career and trails just Sarah Steinmann (247) for tops on the programs shot chart.
- » Kristen Dodson currently leads the team in assists with three. However, Bri Folds, Brooke Ramsier and Courtney Schell have each tallied a pair of assists and trail Dodson by just one.
- » Getting off to a fast start has been key to Auburn's five wins so far in 2016. The Tigers have won all five of their matches when being the first team to find the back of the net.
- » Picked to finish third this season, the Tigers have ended up sixth or higher in the final SEC standings 18 times since the program started in 1993.
- » Since 2010, Auburn has posted 51 shutouts (36 percent of its games in that span).
- » The Tigers boast 18 underclassmen on their roster this season, including 13 freshmen. In contrast, Auburn touts 11 upperclassmen with six seniors leading the charge.
- » Head coach Karen Hoppa has coached 14 winning seasons at Auburn with eight of them being 12-win seasons.

GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE: AUBURN SOCCER COMPLEX

» Auburn Soccer Complex is in its 23rd season as home of Auburn women's soccer. The Tigers have played there in all but one season (1993), when they played at Wilbur "Bodie" Hinton Field. Since moving to the facility, Auburn boasts a record of 143-56-15 (.702). The Auburn Soccer Complex seats 1,500. Located across the street from the Auburn Athletic Complex, the soccer stadium's natural turf playing surface is 120 yards long, by 78 yards wide.

AN AUBURN WIN WOULD...

» A win by Auburn on Sunday evening would give the Tigers their first regular season victory over South Carolina since 2012 and send the home team to a 2-0-0 start in conference play for the first time since 2011.

FAMILIAR FACES

- » Auburn has a rarity in college soccer and that is having two sets of sisters on the same squad the Ramsier's (Brooke and Casie) and the Solaru's (Dani and Samantha).
- » There are only five other schools in the country that have two sets of sisters on the same team. The Tigers' quartet leads the nation in total career points. As a duo, the Ramsier's top the charts among all sister-sister combinations in the nation.

STAGGERING STATISTIC

» Three is the lucky number for the Auburn soccer program. Since head coach Karen Hoppa took over in 1999, the Tigers are an astounding 89-1 when scoring at least three goals in a match and have won their last 53 decisions.

APPROACHING 150-PLUS WINS

» The Auburn Soccer Complex has hosted a bevy of victories, 143 in fact, in its existence. That mark currently sits in third in the nation for home victories in the same stadium.

ON THIS DAY...

» On Sept. 18, 2011, goalkeeper Chandler Hillen saved a penalty kick in the final seconds to secure a 2-1 win at Denver, moving the Tigers to a 6-1-1 start to the season.

NATIONAL REACH

- » In 2016, Auburn will have 16 matches available on the SEC Network/SEC Network+.
- » The Tigers are slated to appear on the SEC Network four times during the regular season. The first SEC bout with Vanderbilt (Sept. 9) and a rematch of last year's SEC Tournament matchup with South Carolina (Sept. 18) will be the home games on tv. Back-to-back road contests at LSU (Oct. 20) and Texas A&M (Oct. 23) are set to be shown, too.

PLAYER TO WATCH: COURTNEY SCHELL

>> Junior midfielder Courtney Schell has been an anchor defensively and in possession this season for the Tigers. Schell has been surgical in the attack, as well, as 38 percent of her goals have ended up as the match winner. Earlier in 2016, Schell got on the end of a cross and placed a header into the upper 90 to record a golden goal in the 1-0 triumph over South Alabama.



WHAT A PERFORMANCE

» Auburn brought the fireworks in a 2-0 win against Cal State Fullerton in mid-August. Courtney Schell scored a goal and tallied an assist, becoming the first player since Casie Ramsier (Sept. 25, 2015) to accomplish the feat in a match.

OVERTIME SPECIALISTS

» Courtney Schell provided the heroics with a game-winner in overtime at South Alabama. In the past five years, Auburn is 7-3-9 when it enters extra time and has won the last six chances after 90 minutes.

QUICK MATCH WRAPS

- » Auburn recently split decisions against Clemson and South Alabama to begin a rigorous 2016 slate. The Tigers fell 2-0 to fellow ranked foe Clemson, before taking a 1-0 decision in a two-overtime battle in Mobile, Ala. against in-state rival South Alabama.
- » In the opening match, Auburn had its chances, but were unable to capitalize. In total, the Tigers outshot Clemson by one (12-11) and took four corners and allowed just one.
- » Auburn and South Alabama battled toeto-toe with both teams creating chances, but it was Courtney Schell who got the final say as she drilled a header into the net in overtime. She was assisted by both Brooke and Casie Ramsier, marking the first time the sisters have both assisted on a goal in their careers.
- » The Tigers extended their winning streak to three and put forth their best offensive showing in a year with a 4-3 victory at Samford. Kristen Dodson netted a brace, while Ellie Leek and Casie Ramsier also chimed in with goals.
- » Auburn's three-game winning streak came to a close in a home loss to lowa State, 1-0. The Tigers, however, held a substantial advantage in shots at 19-7. Casie Ramsier led the way with five shots.
- » The Tigers were shutout for the second match in a row with a 2-0 defeat to USC. Ellie Leek and Casie Ramsier each netted a pair of shots on goal, while Sarah Le Beau made two saves between the posts.
- » SEC play kicked off on the right foot for Auburn with a 2-1 win against Vanderbilt. Brooke Ramsier converted a penalty and Kristen Dodson netted the game-winner in the 72nd minute to guide the Tigers to a 1-0 start in conference play.

» Auburn wrapped up its non-conference schedule with a 1-0 win against Baylor at home. Taylor Troutman netted the match-winner in the 70th minute, while Sarah Le Beau made seven saves between the posts.

AUBURN PICKED THIRD IN SEC

- » Fresh off of its best season in program history, Auburn was slated to finish third in the conference, as voted by the coaches in the SEC.
- » The Tigers received 141 points based on a point system ranging from one to 13, with each coach not allowed to vote for their own squad.
- » Auburn was 13 points behind Texas A&M for second and trailed Florida for the top spot by 24.

TOUGH SLEDDING

» Auburn is one of only four ranked teams to open the season against consecutive teams in the polls (Penn State, Santa Clara and UCF).

REACHING NEW HEIGHTS

» Senior Casie Ramsier became the second player in Auburn history to be named to the prestigious MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. She scored 12 goals in 2015, the second-best season in program history.

PRESEASON WATCH LIST

» Seniors Kiana Clarke, Brooke Ramsier and Casie Ramsier were joined by junior Kirsten Dodson and sophomore Sarah Le Beau as honorees on the SEC Preseason Watch List.

ROSTER RUNDOWN

- » Auburn features 18 underclassmen (62 percent), including 13 freshmen (45 percent).
- » In contrast, there are 11 upperclassmen, with a solid leadership group of six seniors.
- » Auburn features 18 underclassmen (62 percent), including 13 freshmen (45 percent).
- » The Tigers hail from nine different states and even another country. The home state of Alabama leads the way with seven, while Texas (six) and Florida (five) are close behind. Ellie Leek, the lone player not from the United States, was born in Wales.

MA'AM UP!

- » Tabbed as a saying for the team, the phrase "ma'am up!" has served as a piece of motivation for the team.
- » The defensive standout from each week is awarded a belt, modelling the former WWE championship belt.
