

FOOTBALL VISITS TEXAS A&M FOR SEC OPENER

» No. 8 Auburn (3-0) visits No. 17 Texas A&M (2-1) for the 2019 SEC opener for both squads on Saturday, September 21, at Kyle Field in College Station, Texas. CBS will televise the 2:30 p.m. CT conference matchup.

SERIES HISTORY

» The all-time series between Texas A&M and Auburn shows the Aggies with a 5-4 advantage. The two teams first met in Dallas in 1911, a 16-0 Texas A&M victory, and also played in Dallas at the end of the 1985 season, when the two schools met in the 1986 Cotton Bowl on New Year's Day. Texas A&M was a 36-16 victor in that postseason contest.

Prior to last season's Auburn 28-24 win at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the visiting team has won every matchup since Texas A&M joined the Southeastern Conference in 2012. In the first matchup of the teams as SEC members, Texas A&M was a 63-21 winner in 2012 in Auburn. The Tigers won a 45-41 shootout at A&M in 2013, with the Aggies winning 41-38 in Auburn in 2014. Auburn was a 26-10 winner in College Station in 2015, and Texas A&M won 29-16 in the last meeting (2016) at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn. Auburn was a 42-27 victor at Texas A&M in 2017 and won 28-24 last season in Auburn on an 11-yard TD pass from Jarrett Stidham to Seth Williams with 1:41 remaining.

>> After its season-opening win over No. 11 Oregon in the AdvoCare Classic in Arlington, Auburn is 10-11-1 all-time in the state of Texas; the Tigers have won their last six games there and are 10-4-1 in their last 15 games in the Lone Star State.

IN SEC OPENERS

>> Auburn is 48-32-5 all-time in SEC openers since 1933, and 21-5 over the last 26 SEC opening games. Auburn is 44-36-6 all-time in its SEC road openers and has won 18 of the last 23 SEC road

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Against Kent State, Auburn had three players with 100+ rushing yards – JaTarvious Whitlow (135), Joey Gatewood (102) and Shaun Shivers (102) for the first time since 1983 --Tommie Aggie (219), Lionel James (115) and Bo Jackson (105) vs. Maryland

» For the second straight game, Marlon Davidson is the SEC defensive lineman of the week (6 tackles, 2.5 sacks vs. Kent State)

>> The Tigers face six of the top 12 teams in the Associated Press preseason rankings, with four of those contests away from home

N Auburn's comeback from a 15-point deficit against Oregon was its largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game (24-point deficit overcome for a 28-27 win)

>> Auburn is the only FBS team to open the last two seasons with a win over an AP-ranked opponent (#6 Washington, #11 Oregon)

The win against Kent State gives Auburn a
 3-0 start to the season for the 50th time in its
 127 seasons of football

>> The Tigers are one of only 21 FBS teams nationally allowing less than 5.5 yards per pass attempt (5.47 yds/att)

Auburn has held two of its first three opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing (90 yards by #11 Oregon and 92 yards by Kent State). The Tigers have now held 14 of its 43 opponents since defensive coordinator Kevin Steele took over for the 2016 season below 100 yards rushing.

>> Eli Stove has scored in all three games this season (11-yard reception vs. Oregon, 4-yard run vs. Tulane, 49-yard catch vs. Kent State); he's the first Tiger to score a TD in three consecutive games since Kerryon Johnson in 2017

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had 13 representatives on the 2018-19 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. debuts. The Tigers are 7-10-1 all-time in SEC openers against ranked opponents, including a 3-7-1 mark on the road.

In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 319-249-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 134-59-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 185-190-12 overall. The Tigers are 28-20 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

IN SEPTEMBER

>> Auburn is 175-58-5 all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 110-22-1 (.834) all-time at home in September, and 65-36-4 (.632) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 43 of 50 seasons. Auburn is 19-7 in September games under Gus Malzahn. The Tigers are 4-4 all-time in games played on September 21.

FRESHMAN DEBUT

» Bo Nix was the first true freshman to start an Auburn season opener at quarterback since Travis Tidwell in 1946, a 13-12 Auburn win vs. Southern Miss in Montgomery.

Record of true freshmen in their first starts at Auburn since 1969: 6-2

Nix was the first SEC true freshman quarterback to start a season opener since Tennessee's Brent Schaeffer in 2004.

» Nix was 13-31 for 177 yards passing with two scores against Oregon, going 4-6 passing on the gamewinning drive, capped by a 26-yard touchdown to Seth Williams, and converting a 4th-and-3 rushing, earning SEC freshman of the week.

Against Tulane, Nix was 19-37 passing for 207 yards including a 31-yard touchdown pass to Will Hastings.

For the season, Nix is 44-84 passing for 545 yards with a 117.83 efficiency rating, one touchdown run and and four TD passes.

STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE: FACILITIES

» An important upgrade in the recent Jordan-Hare Stadium renovation provides a new expanded home locker room for Auburn football student-athletes, more than doubling the previous space, accented with state of the art lighting, speakers and sound system in a customized orange and blue decor in the south end zone.



» Bo Nix' father Patrick made his starting debut as an Auburn junior in the 1994 season opener at Ole Miss, a 22-17 Auburn win. Patrick Nix was 17-5-1 as a starter during his career with the Tigers.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn totaled 633 yards of total offense against Kent State, the 21st 600-yard game in program history. The 633 yards of offense were the most since recording 688 yards vs. ULM in 2016 and 10th-most in program history.

There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 26 500-yard games during Gus Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 18 times, the latest being 200 yards in the third quarter against Kent State, and nine times against SEC teams, including a 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss last year.

 Auburn has scored in all 83 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No.
 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

>> The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 30 times in 83 games, 50 points or more 14 times and 60 points or more three times.

» Auburn has scored first in 25 of its last 34 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including nine times last season. The Tigers are 41-13 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State, the sixth time the Tigers have gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 22.06 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 53 of 83 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Thirteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (67 100-yd performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 42-11; with two 100yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

» The Tigers' 467 rushing yards against Kent State were the sixth most in program history and the most since running for 543 yards vs. Arkansas in 2016.

Auburn had three players with 100+ rushing yards – JaTarvious Whitlow (135), Joey Gatewood (102) and Shaun Shivers (102) for the first time since 1983 -- Tommie Aggie (219), Lionel James (115) and Bo Jackson (105) vs. Maryland.

» Current players' 100-yard rushing games: JaTarvious Whitlow (5): Alabama State, 2018 (122); LSU, 2018 (104); Ole Miss, 2018 (170); Oregon, 2019 (110); Kent State, 2019 (135).

» With his 135-yard, 2 TD performance against Kent State, Whitlow became Auburn's 47th career 1,000-yard rusher. Whitlow gained 787 yards as a freshman and started this season with a 110-yard performance against Oregon and 96 yards against Tulane, with a 14yard score.

Whitlow has nine career rushing touchdowns (two this season) and two career touchdown receptions.

This season, Whitlow's production in the second half has netted 209 rushing yards on 35 second-half carries (5.9 ypc), an average of 69.7 yards per game in the second half.

With 1,228 career rushing yards, the sophomore ranks 41st among Auburn leaders.

» Despite having its nine-year run of 1,000yard rushers end in 2018, Auburn is still tied with Nevada and Wisconsin for the most 1,000-yard rushers among FBS teams since 2009 with 11.

» Entering the 2019 season, Auburn's 99 combined career starts from its starting offensive linemen ranked 10th among FBS schools; Oregon was the leader with 153 combined starts. » Sophomore Seth Williams, who scored the game-winning touchdown against Oregon on a 26-yard reception from Bo Nix with just 0:09 remaining, caught three passes for 44 yards on the game-winning drive. He added a 40-yard reception in the win over Tulane.

As a true freshman, Williams led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in yards per reception (20.54) and finished the season ranked third in Auburn freshman receiving yards (534) and fifth in freshman receptions (26).

Williams scored on a pair of 11-yard catches vs. Texas A&M, the second the gamewinner with 1:41 remaining. He added a 45-yard TD catch against Liberty and finished that contest with 109 yards on five catches, his first career 100-yard game.

In his career, all but three of his 30 catches have earned a first down or TD, including scoring on all three of his red-zone receptions and on three of his six fourth-quarter catches.

» Redshirt junior Eli Stove has surpassed 1,000 career yards from scrimmage (71 receptions for 639 yards and two scores and 44 rushing attempts for 486 yards and four TD). Stove's first score of the 2019 campaign was an 11-yard touchdown catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon; he added a 4-yard rushing touchdown against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State.

» As a true freshman, Anthony Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's longest offensive play of the season and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

Schwartz scored his first TD against Alabama State, a 57-yard reception, then added a 23-yard rush in the second quarter for his first career TD run. Schwartz added rushing touchdowns against Alabama and Southern Miss and scored on a fumble recovery in the endzone at Ole Miss. He added a 6-yard rushing score in the Music City Bowl to give him seven touchdowns for the season.

Schwartz finished ranked sixth in Auburn freshman receiving yards (357) and ninth in freshman receptions (22).

DOMINATING DEFENSE

» Senior safety Jeremiah Dinson earned SEC defensive player of the week honors with his 13-tackle performance against Oregon; he also had two TFL and a 6-yard sack.

Dinson followed that performance up with an interception and a team-best six tackles vs. Tulane in week two and a team-high eight tackles vs. Kent State.

Dinson ranks third in the SEC in tackles averaging 9.0 per contest.

» Marlon Davidson has been selected as the SEC defensive lineman of the week twice already this season, recording six tackles, 2.0 TFL and three QB hurries against Tulane and six tackles, 2.5 sacks vs. Kent State.

Davidson ranks second in the SEC averaging 1.5 TFL per game this season.

SEC CHAMPIONS: 1957, 1983, 1987, 1988, 1989, 2004, 2010, 2013

With 42 consecutive starts, Davidson ranks second nationally among FBS players in consecutive starts.

>> Auburn's defense has allowed a total of 29 points and three offensive touchdown in its last 11 quarters. Over that span, the Tigers have allowed 700 yards of total offense on 179 plays, an average of 3.9 yards per play.

On the ground, Auburn has allowed 235 yards on 83 carries, an average of 2.8 yards per carry, and one TD. Through the air, the Tigers have allowed 465 yards on 48-91 passing with two TD passes allowed and one interception.

>> Auburn has allowed only 17.95 points per game in Kevin Steele's four seasons as coordinator, sixth among FBS teams.

Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg. In the season prior to Steele's arrival, Auburn allowed 26.0 ppg, 54th nationally.

>> Auburn has held 14 of its 43 opponents (13-1 record) below 300 yards total offense in Steele's four seasons. That equals the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 yards in the previous six years combined (79 games).

>> Auburn's defense has allowed only eight first-quarter touchdowns in the last 343 games, and only seven in the opening period since the start of 2017 (four last season).

>> Auburn is 18-32 (.563) on third-down conversions in its last two games. For the season, the Tigers have converted on 25 of 49 third-down opportunities (.510), second best in the SEC and 22nd nationally.

» Auburn joins Alabama, Clemson and Washington as the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense each of the last three seasons. » Auburn has allowed a touchdown on just 54 of its opponents' 123 red zone chances in Steele's four years as the Tigers' defensive coordinator. The 43.9 red zone touchdown percentage is second in the country, trailing only Wisconsin (43.2%) since the start of the 2016 season.

» In 18 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 22.8 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times (44.4 percent).

Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked opponents to 17 or fewer points (18.4 percent).

>> Five current players have totaled more than 100 career tackles at Auburn:

>> Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 30 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers are tied for seventh nationally allowing only 85 total TD during that span.

Auburn ranks 16th nationally allowing less than five yards per play since the start of 2016, allowing 4.92 yards per play during that period (43 games).

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) and Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 17 of the last 19 Pro Bowls, including Dee Ford in 2019. Auburn has had at least one former player in 11 of the last 14 Super Bowls >> Under Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 34 times, including 17 of the last 19 games (not including season openers), the latest being Kent State. In 27 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.

» In 43 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 108 sacks (2.5 per game) and has been held without a sack only six times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 28 of those games, most recently 11.0 against Kent State.

The Tigers have forced 58 turnovers (31 INT, 27 FR) and allowed only 29 rushing touch-downs during that stretch.

Auburn was one of just 13 teams nationally with at least three interceptions returned for touchdowns last season.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

» Big Kat Bryant's 83-yard fumble recovery against Oregon was the first of his career and the longest fumble return by Auburn through records back through the 1996 season; the previous long during that period was an 82yard fumble return for a touchdown by Justin Garrett vs. Louisville in 2015.

» Jeremiah Dinson grabbed the season's first interception with a third-quarter pick against Tulane, his third career interception.

» Auburn is 28-8 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 14-4 when turnovers are even, compared to 13-15 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +31 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -15 in turnovers during Malzahn's head coaching tenure.

The Tigers are 20-5 when they play turnover-free football and 39-14 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn.

» Auburn is 47-17 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 29-8 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 9-10 when it fails to force a turnover.

>> The Tigers are 15-3 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

Auburn kickers have converted 287
 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013
 Tennessee game, the longest active streak in

the FBS and the SEC record.

Cody Parkey (2013) Daniel Carlson (2014-17) and Ian Shannon (2015-18) were Auburn's previous kickers during the streak; Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating. The NCAA record is 302, set by Florida State from 2012-16.

» Marlon Davidson blocked three field goal attempts last season, second-best nationally. Jordyn Peters, also ranked second nationally, blocked three punts, making Auburn the only team nationally with two players with multiple blocked kicks/punts.

Auburn's seven blocked kicks/punts tied for best in the nation with Toledo and Baylor among FBS teams. Seven blocked kicks were the most for a season in Auburn records back through 1996.

» Auburn is tied with Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (133) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» In his debut last season, Anders Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yards), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PAT attempts and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

This season, Carlson is 11-11 on PAT and 5-6 on field goals, with a long of 45. He is 15-18 on touchbacks on kickoffs, ninth nationally.

With 589 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (694 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

» Auburn ranked fifth nationally last year in net punting (41.91), the highest net average at Auburn back through 1996. Punter Arryn Siposs averaged 44.2 yards per kick (18th ranked nationally), with 10 punts of 50+ yards. His career best was a 60-yarder vs. Arkansas.

Siposs is ranked 29th nationally this season (fourth in the SEC) with a 44.2 average.

>> Auburn and North Carolina were the only Power 5 schools in the Top 50 in kickoff return average, kickoff return defense, net punt and punt return average last season.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn has won 20 straight games (18-0 mark under Malzahn) when the Tigers score a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers have scored 22 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, nine interceptions and one missed field goal.

The last time the Tigers lost a game in which it scored a non-offensive touchdown was at Mississippi State in 2012, when Auburn lost 28-10 despite a 100-yard Onterio McCalebb kickoff return to start the second half.

RANKINGS

This is the 39th time the Tigers have been **>>** ranked in the preseason AP poll since 1950, the 13th time in the last 17 seasons and the fifth time in seven seasons under head coach Gus Malzahn. It's the 36th time the Tigers have been ranked in the preseason Top 20.

Auburn has played 35 games against **>>** ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 80 games as the Tigers' head coach (43.8 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 20 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 17-19 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including a 7-13 mark against Top 10 teams.

Auburn is 111-159-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 51-41-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-68-2 on the road and 33-50-2 on a neutral field.

Auburn is 16-19 all-time against ranked **>>** non-conference opponents in regular-season action, including 10-7 at home, 3-7 on the road and 3-5 at neutral-site locations.

The Oregon game was the fifth time in >> Gus Malzahn's seven seasons as Auburn's head coach that the Tigers have played a regularseason non-conference game against a ranked opponent (3-2 record). Prior to Malzahn's tenure, Auburn had only played four such games in the previous 22 seasons combined.

The Tigers are 87-128-5 all-time facing **>>** ranked SEC opponents (41-32-2 at home, 27-61-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 56-48-3 overall (27-9-1 at home, 18-29-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time **>>** is 321-115-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 181-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 140-83-4 all-time.

>> When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 78-71-4 (34-12-1 at home, 21-37-1 away and 23-22-2 on a neutral field).

>> In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 253-69-6. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 26-6.

Auburn is looking for its 32nd 4-0 start all->> time, including its second under Gus Malzahn (started 5-0 in 2014). The previous 49 times the Tigers have started 3-0 they have gone 31-16-2 (.653) in their fourth game of the season.

Since 2001, Auburn is 143-26 (.846) when **>>** scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 199-34-1 (.854) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 538-54-9 (.903) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 337-9 (.975) when scoring 30 points, 169-3 (.984) when scoring 40 points, 78-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

Five of Auburn's first eight games are away from Jordan-Hare Stadium, including all three games in the month of October. It is the first time since September, 1978, that the Tigers will play all of its games in a calendar month away from home (min. 3 games).

That year, Auburn opened the season by winning 45-32 at Kansas State on September 16, followed by an 18-7 victory at Virginia Tech on September 23 and a 29-10 triumph over Tennessee in Birmingham September 30 prior to playing its first home game of the season against Miami (Fla.) on October 7.

>> Auburn's record in all-time SEC openers by opponent: Arkansas 1-0; Florida 2-2; Georgia Tech 0-3; Kentucky 1-0; LSU 1-2; Mississippi State 10-3; Missouri 1-0; Ole Miss 11-3; Tennessee 16-13-2; Texas A&M 0-1; Tulane 2-4-3: and Vanderbilt 3-1.

On the 2019 squad, 36 players now have **>>** at least one college start to their credit, 21 on offense and 15 on defense.

Auburn had six first-time starters against Oregon: Bo Nix, Marquis McClain, Spencer Nigh, Shaun Shivers, K.J. Britt and Owen Pappoe. Defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell was a first-time starter against Tulane, and offensive tackle Bailey Sharp made his first start against Kent State

>> Auburn scored two late touchdowns to overcome a 10-point deficit, beating No. 25 Texas A&M 28-24 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Trailing 24-14, Noah Igbinoghene's interception gave Auburn possession at its own 29 with 7:14 remaining.

Jarrett Stidham then completed five passes, three to Darius Slayton for 43 yards, to give Auburn first-and-goal at the 1. Chandler Cox scored on the next play to cut A&M's lead to 24-21 with 5:14 to play.

Derrick Brown's sack helped force A&M's punt, which Christian Tutt returned 28 yards to Auburn's 42 with 2:04 to play.

On the next play, Stidham hit Ryan Davis, who zigged and zagged up the middle for 47 yards to the Aggies' 11.

Stidham then connected with Seth Williams for the game-winning score with 1:41 to play.

Stidham was 18 for 29 for 239 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Slayton had eight receptions for 107 yards.

Daniel Thomas forced a fumble and recorded a career-high 12 tackles. Auburn had five sacks and 12 tackles for loss.

Trayveon Williams' third touchdown, a 1-yard run to cap the opening drive of the second half, gave the Aggies a 10-point lead at the 10:27 mark of the third quarter.

Auburn trailed 17-14 after the first half.

After the Aggies kicked a field goal on their opening drive, Auburn's defense forced a turn-

over, with Jamel Dean recovering a fumbled option pitch at A&M's 20, with Thomas applying pressure on the pitch man.

Auburn took the lead on the next play as Stidham threw backwards to Ryan Davis, who fired to an open Sal Cannella for a 20-yard touchdown and a 7-3 lead with 1:37 left in the first.

Texas A&M regained the lead on Williams' 38-yard touchdown run to make it 10-7 early in the second quarter.

Stidham hit Slayton for 34 yards on a 9-play, 80-yard touchdown drive. On third-and-2 from the 11, Stidham zipped a pass across the field to a leaping Williams in the end zone for a 14-10 Auburn lead with 4:03 left in the half.

The Aggies took 17-14 lead before the half on a 14-yard screen pass to Williams.

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

>> His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last eight seasons - with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.

» Now beginning his seventh season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): **176**, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); **99**, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); **85**, Tommy Tuberville (10); **56** *Gus Malzahn* (5); **48**, Jack Meagher (9); **47**, Terry Bowden (6); **33**, Gene Chizik (4); **29**, Doug Barfield (5); **22**, Chet Wynne (4).

³³ Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).

» Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 23 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season three times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

» Malzahn is 42-10 (.808) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1in 2014, 3-4in 2015, 6-2in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2in 2018 and 2-0 in 2019 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In eight seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 68 of 83 games.

» Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers. » 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

» Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 54 of 83 games under Malzahn.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and longtime chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains. What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 415 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 326, losing 83 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Nine years ago, Auburn beat Oregon on a last-second field goal. On Saturday night, quarterback Bo Nix didn't want to put it on the kicker again. Instead, the true freshman tossed a 26-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams with nine seconds left to lead the Tigers past Oregon, 27-21, in the season opener.

On the play before, Nix completed a 13-yard pass to Williams to put the Tigers in field-goal range with a chance to win. But rather than play it safe, he took a shot on the next play, throwing a jump ball to Williams who wrestled it away from the defender at the goal line.

The touchdown gave Auburn its first lead of the game and capped a 15-point second-half comeback. It was the largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game when the Tigers overcame a 24-point deficit to win 28-27. What changed? For starters, the defense clamped down in the second half and made a huge stop on fourth down midway

through the fourth quarter to thwart an Oregon drive and keep it a one-point game. The offense also found its rhythm with Nix under center.

Nix, the first rue freshman to start at quarterback for Auburn since 1946, threw for 177 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 42 yards in his first college game. His first career touchdown pass came late in the third quarter when he threw a quick pass to Eli Stove who took it in from 11 yards out to cut the Oregon lead to 21-13.

On the opening drive of the fourth quarter, Auburn used a heavy dose of running back JaTarvious Whitlow to get down to the goal line where it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who took his first snap and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 21-20.

Whitlow recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards on 24 carries. The sophomore also surpassed 1,000 career all-purpose yards (897 rushing, 173 receiving). As a team, the Tigers ran for 206 yards and threw for 177 yards in Saturday's win.

Defensively, senior safety Jeremiah Dinson led Auburn with 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack - the third of his career. K.J. Britt, making his first at middle linebacker, finished second on the team with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

It was also a career night for defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell, another first-time starter, who made two clutch stops late and recorded six tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

At the half, Auburn trailed, 14-6, and it could have been worse if not for an 83-yard fumble recovery from Big Kat Bryant that led to an Anders Carlson field goal and swung the momentum. It was the longest fumble return by an Auburn player through records dating back to 1996.

With the win, the Tigers open the season 1-0 for the third straight year. They will return home next week to face Tulane in the first game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn did not allow a touchdown in the No. 10 Tigers' 24-6 home-opening win Saturday over Tulane. "Defensively, we did a super job against an offense that's been averaging a lot of points and a lot of yards rushing," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "They were 2-of-15 on third down. It was just a great third-down plan and execution." Jeremiah Dinson's interception led to a touchdown as the Tigers shut out the Green Wave in the second half. "The defensive line got a good push," Dinson said. "The quarterback tried to hit the tight end and the ball was in the air for

a long time. I was the middle field safety, just ran it down and made a play."

After Dinson picked off Tulane at Auburn's 18-yard line, the Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays with JaTarvious Whitlow rushing for a 14-yard touchdown and a 21-6 Auburn lead with 1:51 left in the third quarter Whitlow led Auburn with 96 yards on 23 carries.

Anders Carlson kicked a 22-yard field goal with 12:36 left in the game for the final score. Bo Nix completed 19 of 37 passes for 207 yards and a touchdown.

"The offense played well in the second half and the defense played lights out the entire game," said Nix, who made his Jordan-Hare Stadium debut. "In college football, any win is great."

Dinson, Daniel Thomas and Marlon Davidson paced Auburn's defense with six tackles each. Davidson made two of Auburn's five tackles for loss.

The Tigers gained 152 of their 172 rushing yards in the second half, outgaining Tulane 379-223 for the game. "Second half, we changed it up a little bit and we got our groove," offensive lineman Jack Driscoll said. "In big-time games coming up, we've got to be able to establish the run in the first half."

Trailing 3-0 after the first quarter, Nix hit Will Hastings for a 31-yard touchdown pass to give Auburn a 7-3 lead with 12:54

left in the half. Hastings gained 75 yards on five receptions. "It felt really, really good," said Hastings, who rehabilitated from two knee surgeries in the past 18 months. "It was awesome getting in the end zone and celebrating with my teammates."

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix connected with Seth Williams for a 40-yard gain to Tulane's 1 Eli Stove capped the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run to increase Auburn's lead to 14-3. Tulane kicked a 32-yard field

goal with 40 seconds left in the second quarter to make it 14-6 at the half. A crowd of 85,317 attended the Tigers' home opener. Auburn (2-0) remains at home next week, hosting Kent State at 6 p.m. CT for Homecoming.

"I think it's a quality win and we took care of business," Malzahn said. "They played extremely hard and that was a quality opponent. We're 2-0 and we're looking forward to playing at home next week

Revving up the running game, No. 8 Auburn rushed for 467 yards and six touchdowns in a 55-16 Homecoming win over Kent State Saturday in the Tigers' tune-up for SEC play. "It was a big victory for us," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "Our goal was to improve each game and we did that. I thought

our offensive line did an excellent job. They played their best game tonight." JaTarvious Whitlow gained 135 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns. Shaun Shivers and Joey Gatewood each rushed for 102 yards. It's the first time since 1983 a trio of Auburn rushers has topped the 100-yard mark. Kam Martin added 71 yards and a touchdown on seven carries. Quarterbacks Bo Nix (one) and Gatewood (two) added

rushing touchdowns. The Tigers averaged 7.5 yards on 62 carries. SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week Marlon Davidson recorded 2.5 of Auburn's five sacks. Tyrone Truesdell had 1.5 sacks

with Big Kat Bryant getting one. After Kent State kicked a field goal on the game's opening drive, Auburn answered with Whitlow rushing for a 3-yard TD with 5:47 left in the first quarter to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead.

Martin made it 14-3 on a 35-yard scoring run with 11 seconds remaining in the opening quarter. After a Kent State 53-yard touchdown pass, Nix hit Sal Cannella on a 27-yard pass to set up Nix's 1-yard TD run. Anders Carlson kicked a 45-yard field goal at the end of the half to give Auburn a 24-10 halftime lead.

Whitlow scored his second rushing touchdown on the opening drive of the second half putting the Tigers on top 31-10. Nix hit Eli Stove on a 49-yard flea-flicker for a 38-10 Auburn lead. Nix was 12 of 16 for 161 yards and a touchdown. 'We found our identity early in running the ball," Nix said. "We really moved them up front. We got in a rhythm running the

ball. That really opened up certain outside throws. Shivers' 27-yard run set up Carlson's second field goal, a 37-yarder on the opening play of the fourth quarter to make it 41-10

After Kent State's second touchdown, Malcolm Askew intercepted the Golden Flashes' pass to negate a two-point attempt.

Gatwood scored on a pair of 2-yard runs in the fourth quarter.

"It was fun for me to be in that environment with my teammates and the home crowd," Gatewood said. "The offensive line, the majority of the credit should always go to them. It all starts up front with them. It makes it easy when you have an O-line like them.

A Homecoming crowd of 84,542 saw the Tigers improve to 26-6 in non-conference games in the Malzahn era. Auburn (3-0) plays its SEC opener next Saturday at Texas A&M at 2:30 p.m. CT on CBS. "We have a very important game next week against a very, very good team." Malzahn said.
