THE TIP-OFF

- Gonzaga faces Auburn in the third game of the Rocket Mortgage Fort Myers Tip-Off on Friday, at 8 a.m. Pacific Time, in the Suncoast Credit Union Arena in Ft. Myers, Fla.
- The Bulldogs opened the 2020-21 season with an exciting 102-90 win over #6/5 Kansas Thursday.
- GU made 64.5 percent from the field, and had three 20-plus scorers led by Drew Timme's 25 points.
- The Zags are No. 1 in the Associated Press preseason poll entering 2020-21. Its the first-ever No. 1 preseason ranking in program history.
- Coach Few reached 600 wins in his career with Thursday's victory. He tied Roy Williams as the fastest to 600 wins in years coaching (22). Few boasts the best winning percentage among active head coaches at 82.8 percent.
- Corey Kispert joined Gonzaga's 1,000-point club in Thursday's win. He needed nine points to reach the milestone and finished with 23. He is eight made three-pointers from joining the program's Top-10 career makes. He has helped the Zags win 96 of the 106 games he has played in.
- Gonzaga is 39-10 under Mark Few in tournaments during the week of Thanksgiving. The Zags are 28-4 in the last seven Thanksgiving week tournaments.
- The Zags has now won 17 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.
- Gonzaga returns two starters and eight letterwinners from last season's squad that claimed the Zags' eighth consecutive West Coast Conference regular season title.
- In 2019-20, the Bulldogs qualified for their 22nd straight NCAA Tournament, before the pandemic ended the season.
- GU brings back 50.1 percent of its scoring, and 52.3 percent of its rebounding from last season.
- Gonzaga won 31 games last season, including 16-0 in WCC play. It was the fourth straight 30-win season, fifth in the last five seasons and sixth in the last eight seasons. GU is the only program in the nation to have reached 30 wins in each of the past four seasons.

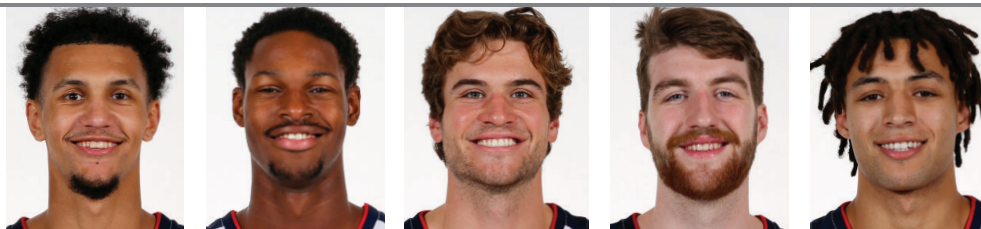

SERIES NOTES

- This will be the first-ever meeting between Gonzaga and Auburn.
- The Bulldogs are 15-9 all-time versus current members from the Southeastern Conference.
- GU has won eight of its last 10 meetings with an SEC opponent, including a 79-49 victory in its latest matchup with the league, at Texas A&M last season.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Auburn opened its season with a 96-91 overtime win over Saint Joseph's Thursday.
- The Tigers outrebounded St. Joe's 56-39. Jaylin Williams scored 18 points and grabbed 11 rebounds. Four other AU players finished in double-digit scoring as well.
- Auburn has recorded three straight seasons with 25 or more wins under Bruce Pearl, including a 30-win campaign in 2018-19 that saw the Tigers notch their first Final Four appearance in program history.
- Entering his seventh season with Auburn, Pearl returns a young roster and welcomes one of the top recruiting classes in the nation.
- Devan Cambridge, Jamal Johnson and Allen Flanigan each appeared in all 31 games for the Tigers last season, with Cambridge and Johnson leading the team in 3-point shooting percentage.
- Auburn's five-man recruiting class is comprised of highly touted players, including top-100 prospects Sharife Cooper, JT Thor and Justin Powell.

GIVING THANKS FOR THESE TOURNAMENTS

- Gonzaga is 39-10 under Mark Few in tournaments during the week of Thanksgiving.
- The Zags are 28-4 in the last seven Thanksgiving week tournaments.
- Under Mark Few, GU has won six tournaments during the week of Thanksgiving, and played in 10 of the 14 tournament championship games.

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

- The Zags have won 16 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in New York City.
- GU has won 30 consecutive regular season home-openers since a 73-65 loss to Boise State on Dec. 7, 1988.
- Gonzaga has won all 15 regular season home-openers in the McCarthy Athletic Center.
- The Bulldogs have won all 20 regular season home-openers under Mark Few.

VIRTUAL KRAZINESS A HIT

- The 2020 version of Numerica Kraziness in the Kennel was broadcast on KHQ and ROOT Sports Northwest and fans were given the chance to meet the team with interviews and video elements.
- The Zags put on an exciting 16-minute scrimmage, with the white team pulling away from the blue team, 45-36.
- The white team was led by Corey Kispert's 14 points. Jalen Suggs added 13 points and five rebounds. Joel Ayayi grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds, the most in the last 10 years of the event. Aaron Cook dished out four assists. Drew Timme paced the blue team with 14 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the field.

- Listed Drew Timme as the most underrated player in the country.

- Predicts Mark Few will lead the Zags to their 22nd consecutive NCAA Tournament, as the top-seed in the West, and the top overall seed.
- Lists Drew Timme as the top breakout candidate in the nation.
- Ranks Corey Kispert as the second top candidate for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award.
- Ranks Jalen Suggs as the fourth most impactful freshman in the country.
- Ranks Joel Ayayi as the fifth-best candidate for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award.
- Names Gonzaga one of the top offenses to watch.

JEFF GOODMAN ON STADIUM SPORTS:

- Ranked Gonzaga third in his preseason poll.
- Listed Drew Timme on his All-American Third Team.

ZAGS OPEN SEASON RANKED NO. 1

- For the first time in program history, Gonzaga was ranked No. 1 in the preseason Associated Press poll.
- Gonzaga had 1,541 points in this year's preseason poll, with 28 first-place votes. Baylor followed at No. 2 with 1,540 points and 24 first-place votes. The Bulldogs and Baylor square off in Indianapolis on Dec. 5.
- Villanova received 11 first-place votes at No. 3. Virginia and Iowa rounded out the top-five. GU faces Iowa in Sioux Falls, S.D., on Dec. 19.
- It's the sixth time in program history that Gonzaga receives

the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll.

- The Zags have now been ranked No. 1 in five of the last nine seasons.

- This marks the 20th straight season Gonzaga has been ranked in the AP poll.

- It's the 11th consecutive year the Zags have appeared in the preseason poll, starting in the top-20 for the eighth straight season.

- It's the seventh time GU has been ranked in the Top-10 in the preseason AP ranking.

- The Zags earned their previous highest-ever preseason ranking in the 2018 AP Top 25 poll at No. 3 with one first-place vote, before ending the season at No. 4.

KISPERT NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- Gonzaga's Corey Kispert was named Preseason All-American by the Associated Press.

- Kispert was joined on the team by Iowa senior Luka Garza, who was a unanimous selection, Baylor senior Jared Butler, Oklahoma State freshman Cade Cunningham, Illinois junior Ayo Dosunmu, and Arizona State senior Remy Martin.

GU RECEIVES BEST EVER PRESEASON COACHES RANK

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 2 in the USA TODAY Coaches' preseason poll.

- Baylor beat out GU by only two points for the No. 1 spot.

- In the preseason balloting, the Bears received 764 poll points and 12 first-place votes to narrowly edge out Gonzaga and Villanova for the top spot.

- The second-ranked Zags picked up 10 firsts and 762 total points, and the Wildcats got 755 points with eight top nods to open at No. 3.

- This is the closest preseason vote since the 2015-16 season, when Kentucky and North Carolina started out the year tied for first.

- Gonzaga opens in the top-20 of the poll for the eighth straight year. GU appears in the coaches' preseason poll for the 11th straight season.

- The Zags were ranked seventh in last year's USA Today preseason coaches' poll, before ending the season at No. 2. Last year's ranking matched the Bulldogs' 2005-06 previous highest ranking ever in the Preseason Coaches' Poll at No. 7.

PRESEASON WCC FAVORITES ... AGAIN

- For the 19th time in the last 20 seasons, Gonzaga was selected as favorites in the West Coast Conference preseason coaches' poll.

- With the exception of 2017-18, the Zags have been first place in every WCC preseason poll since 2001.

- GU received nine of the league's 10 first place votes in this year's poll. Coaches are not allowed to vote for their own program. BYU collected the other first place vote.

- The Zags had 81 points in the poll, while BYU was second with 69 and Saint Mary's was third with 63.

TRIO TABBED PRESEASON ALL-WCC

- Joel Ayayi, Corey Kispert and Drew Timme were all named to the conference's preseason team.

- Preseason All-WCC voting is restricted to returning student-athletes. Incoming freshmen and transfers are not eligible for consideration.

- Ayayi was named the 2020 West Coast Conference Tournament Most Outstanding Player. He was honorable mention All-Conference.

- Kispert was First Team All-WCC last season.

- Timme is the only sophomore on the league's preseason

team, after being named WCC All-Freshman last season.

FOUR BULLDOGS ON HOOPHALL STARTING FIVE LISTS

- Jalen Suggs was named to the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Preseason Watch List.

- Joel Ayayi was named to the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Preseason Watch List.

- Corey Kispert was named to the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Preseason Watch List.

- Drew Timme was named to the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Preseason Watch List.

- A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates each.

- In late January, the watch lists of 20 players for the awards will be narrowed to just 10.

- In late February, five finalists to the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

- College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting in each of the three rounds.

- The winner of the awards will be presented on April 9.

- Gonzaga and Villanova are the only teams in the country that had four players on the position award watch lists.

GONZAGA INKS DUO ON SIGNING DAY

- The Bulldogs added Ben Gregg and Kaden Perry to their 2021-22 roster.

- Gregg, who is No. 29 in ESPN's top 100, is a 6-10 225-pound forward from Clackamas, Ore.

- Following his junior season at Clackamas High School, he was named the Oregon Gatorade Player of the Year, after averaging 21.1 points, 9.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game.

- Gregg is a two-time First-Team All-State honoree.

- Perry is a 6-9 225-pound forward from Battle Ground, Wash. He ranks No. 75 on ESPN.com and No. 34 on 247Sports.

- He averaged 23.7 points, 15.3 rebounds and 3.3 blocks per game last season at Battle Ground High School.

QUICK NOTES

- The Bulldogs 33 average wins per season since 2014-15, leads the nation.

- Gonzaga has won 161 games over the past five seasons, the most in Div. 1.

- The Bulldogs have won 15 NCAA Tournament games in the past five tournaments, which ranks second in the country, behind only UNC (16) and tied with Duke and Villanova.

- Gonzaga is the only program in the nation that has appeared in the last five Sweet 16's.

- The Zags made their 10th appearance in the Sweet 16 in 2018-19. Nine of GU's 10 Sweet 16 appearances have come under Mark Few.

- GU has appeared in three of the last five Elite Eights.

- Only GU, Duke and Kentucky have appeared in three Elite Eights in the last five tournaments.

- The Bulldogs 21 straight berths to the field is the fourth-longest current streak in the nation (Kansas, Duke, Michigan State).

- Gonzaga is one of only two teams to win its opening-round NCAA Tournament game each of the last 11 tournaments, Kansas is the other.

THIRTY-WIN CLUB

- GU is the only program in the nation to have reached 30 wins in each of the past four seasons.

- GU has reached 30 wins in a season six times, all coming in the last seven years; 32-3 in 2012-13, 35-3 in 2014-15,

- GU has finished with 29 wins three previous times.

THAT'S EIGHT STRAIGHT:

- The Zags have won the West Coast Conference regular season title in each of the last eight seasons, seven times winning it outright.

- GU extended its current nationally-best active streak of regular season titles, owned or shared.

- The Bulldogs have won 21 of the last 23 WCC regular season championships, 18 of which have been won outright.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME:

- During the Zags' 39-game home win streak, GU has won 21 times by 30-plus points, 26 times by 20 or more points, and 19 of the wins have been versus WCC opponents.

- Since the McCarthey Athletic Center opened in 2004, Gonzaga boasts a 224-15 record at home.

- The Zags' 93.7 winning percentage at home since 2004-05 ranks second in the nation.

- GU has sold out every game since the 6,000-seat McCarthey Athletic Center opened, a streak of 239 games.

- The Bulldogs currently have a home sell-out streak of 272 consecutive games, dating back to the second game of the 2001-02 season, in which 3,900 fans attended a matchup against Montana in the then-4,000-seat Martin Centre.

LIFE ON THE ROAD:

- Since the 2005-06 season, Gonzaga is 216-66 in road or neutral games. The Zags' 76.3-win percentage in road or neutral games tops the nation over that span.

- Also since the 2007-08 season, the Zags are 107-26 in true road games. GU's 80.2-win pct. in true road games is best in the nation over that span.

- The Zags have won 51 of their last 53 road games in conference play. Since 2014-15, GU is 49-2 in WCC road games.

- Since losing 69-66 at San Diego on Feb. 22, 2014, the Zags have gone 90-0 (including conference tournament games) vs. WCC teams not named St. Mary's or BYU.

LETS TAKE A LOOK BACK

- Last season, the Bulldogs were first in the nation in winning percentage (93.9), scoring offense (87.4), scoring margin (19.6), second in field goal percentage (51.5), fourth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.49) and rebound margin (9.2), fifth in total assists (550), seventh in assists per game (17.1) and total rebounds (1,321), and eighth in three-point percentage (38.6).

- The Zags were the lone team in the nation that had six players average double-digit scoring per game, with a seventh scoring 9.8 points per outing. No Division I team in the last 20 years has finished a season with seven players averaging 10.0+ point per game.

- Last season, Gonzaga beat conference opponents by an average of 20.1 points during league play. Over the last four seasons, Gonzaga has a 65-3 record during West Coast Conference play, with an average margin of victory of 22.9 points.

ZAGS HIT 25 WINS ... AGAIN

- Gonzaga has won at least 25 games in each of the

last 12 consecutive seasons.

- The Zags have reached the 25-win plateau in 15 of the last 16 seasons, and 19 of the last 21.

- Only Kansas (13), Duke (11) and GU have reached 25 wins in each of the last 11 seasons.

20/20 VISION:

- Last season, Gonzaga captured its 23rd straight 20-win season.

- The Zags' 23-straight 20-win seasons ranks third behind for the longest active run in the country. (Kansas 31, Duke 24)

- Prior to the previous 22 seasons, the Bulldogs reached 20 wins in a season eight times since 1907-08

VIVA LAS ZAGAS

- Gonzaga has won eight of the last 10 WCC tournaments in Las Vegas.

- The Zags are 26-3 in the WCC Tournament since 2009, when the event moved to Las Vegas.

- Gonzaga's three losses in the tournament in Las Vegas have all been to Saint Mary's, the 2010, 2012 and 2019 finals.

- The Bulldogs were 33-13 in the conference tournament prior to it coming to Vegas.

- The Zags have never lost an opening game of the tournament in Las Vegas, winning all 12.

- GU is 59-16 all-time in the WCC Tournament with 17 titles and 26 finals appearances, including each of the last 23 seasons.

- GU is 45-5 under Mark Few in the WCC Tournament with title-game appearances in all 21 seasons.

- Gonzaga has won in the WCC tournament semifinals in each of the past 23 years. The Zags last loss in the WCC semifinals was 1994, 83-75, to San Diego.

- The Bulldogs are 26-2 in semifinal games at the tournament, winning all 12 in Las Vegas.

- Gonzaga has won the opening game of tournament the past 23 years, dating back to a loss in 64-59 in the 1997 quarterfinals to fourth-seeded San Diego as a fifth-seed.

FEW HONORED AT VITALE GALA

- Gonzaga's Mark Few was honored at the 15th annual Dick Vitale Gala that benefits The V Foundation for Cancer Research.

- The event raised a record \$7.4 million in conjunction with Vitale's year-round fundraising. Net proceeds from event were awarded to pediatric cancer research and related programs through The V Foundation.

- Few was honored alongside Tampa Bay Buccaneers' head coach Bruce Arians and ESPN commentator Stephen A. Smith.

- The event, which is usually held in person in Sarasota, Fla., was transformed into a pre-recorded virtual show. The event was hosted by ESPN's Kevin Negandhi.

- The event has now raised \$37 million over 15 years.

- Building on their success with Coaches vs Cancer, the Fews and others in the Spokane region launched the Community Cancer Fund in 2014 to keep more money in the local market while devoting more resources to cancer patients, their families and the local organizations that serve them. In the last six years, the Community Cancer Fund has raised over 17 million dollars bringing the total raised over 18 years between the organizations to well over 25 million dollars.

NOTES

- Mark Few has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA Div. I basketball annals in his 21 seasons at the helm, serving as an assistant coach at GU for 10 seasons prior to take the reins of the program.
- The Zags have won or shared 19 regular season league titles in his 21 seasons (all but the 1999-2000 and 2011-12 seasons) and taken home the conference tournament championship 16 times.
- Few led Gonzaga to the national championship game in the program's first-ever Final Four in 2017, three Elite Eight appearances (2015, '17, '19) and nine Sweet 16 appearances (2000, '00, '06, '09, '15, '16, '17, '18, '19).
- 16 All-Americans, eight Academic All-Americans, 88 all-conference selections, 14 WCC Players of the Year, eight league newcomers of the year and eight league defenders of the year have been coached under Few.
- The Bulldogs qualified for their 22nd straight trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2020, a streak that started when Few was an assistant coach in 1999 and currently ranks the Zags tied for fourth among current active streaks behind Kansas, Duke and Michigan State.
- Few has also cultivated NBA talent, including current NBA players in Domantas Sabonis, Kelly Olynyk, Zach Collins, Nigel Williams-Goss, Rui Hachimura and Brandon Clarke. He also helped recruit and develop Dan Dickau, Richie Frahm, Adam Morrison, Jeremy Pargo, Elias Harris, Austin Daye, Rob Sacre and Ronny Turiaf, all NBA players. Morrison became the highest-drafted player in GU history when he was taken No. 3 overall by the Charlotte Bobcats in 2006.

Entering the 2020-21 Season, Few:

- Is the winningest active coach by percentage at .828 (599-124)
- Tied for 17th for fastest to 100 wins in Division I, accomplishing the feat in 126 games
- Third fastest to 200 wins, reaching the milestone in 247 games
- Tied for sixth fastest to 300 wins, achieving his 300th win in his 347th game
- Fifth fastest to 400 wins, achieving the milestone in 499 games
- Third fastest to 500 wins, reaching the milestone in 612 games
- Ranks ninth in winning percentage after five seasons at .806 (133-32) and six seasons .811 (159-37); sixth after seven seasons at .821 (188-41); seventh after eight seasons .802 (211-52); seventh after 10 seasons .800 (264-66); sixth for 11 seasons .799 (291-73); ninth after 12 seasons .792 (316-83); ninth after 13 seasons .792 (342-90), fourth after 14 seasons at .801 (374-93), sixth after 15 seasons at .801 (403-100), third after 16 seasons at .810 (438-103), fourth after 17 seasons at .808 (466-111), fourth after 18 seasons at .817 (503-113), third after 19 seasons at .819 (535-118), fourth after 20 seasons at .823 (568-122) and second after 21 seasons at .828 (599-124).

For all that Few has accomplished on the court, his achievements off of it are equally impressive. In 2002, Mark and his wife Marcy initiated the Spokane branch of Coaches vs Cancer. The Few's annual event would become the largest Coaches vs Cancer fundraiser across the country. Quietly and without fanfare, Few has created a culture of giving at Gonzaga. In 2007, Gonzaga began hosting the Ronald McDonald House Charities Classic. For six seasons, these annual games helped raise over \$750,000 for Spokane's Ronald McDonald House. Building on their success with Coaches vs Cancer, the Fews and others in the Spokane region launched the Community Cancer Fund in 2014 to keep more money in the local market while devoting more resources to cancer patients, their families and the local organizations that serve them. In the last six years, the Community Cancer Fund has raised over 17 million dollars bringing the total raised over 18 years between the organizations to well over 25 million dollars. Among the highlights, the charity established a 3-million-dollar endowment to fund Camp Good Times, a week-long summer camp for kids with cancer. And this year, the Community Cancer Fund worked to increase lodging options for cancer patients and their families traveling to the region for treatment, which included the completion and opening of a 5-million-dollar Hospitality Center at Kootenai Health and a campus expansion of Spokane's Ronald McDonald House.
