LAST TIME AROUND

- The win against Georgia State broke a four-game losing streak against the Panthers and gave Georgia Southern its first win over Georgia State since the 1992 TAAC Championship at Hanner that advanced the Eagles to the NCAA Tournament.
- Ben Drayton III (St. Marys, Ga.) had 19 points against Georgia State to lead the Eagles in scoring for the sixth time this year.
- Eric Ferguson (Statesboro, Ga.) led the team in rebounds for the fourth time this season with seven. Ferguson was Georgia Southern's second leading scorer with 17 points.
- Jelani Hewitt (Oakland Park, Fla.) joined Drayton and Ferguson in double figures, scoring 10. Rory Spencer's (Atlanta, Ga.) three assists tied a career high while Zuri James (Stone Mountain, Ga.) scored a career-best six points.

HEAD COACH CHARLTON "C.Y." YOUNG

In his second year as head coach of his alma mater, **Charlton "C.Y." Young** was hired in April 2009 to lead the program after serving for four years as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech. Young is the 12th coach in the history of the program and third alum to lead the Eagles. Young, the MVP of the Trans America Athletic Conference championship in 1992, sparked Georgia Southern to the tournament title and NCAA bid. Young began his coaching career at Auburn (1994-97), then took assistant coaching positions at Jacksonville (1997-99) and Northeastern (1999-2000) before returning to Auburn (2000-2004). Named associate head coach at Chattanooga (2004-05), Young helped lead the Mocs to the Southern Conference title and NCAA tournament in 2005.

AUBURN TIGERS

Auburn comes into tonight's game on a one-game winning streak. The Tigers defeated USC Upstate, 68-54, to break a three-game losing streak. Earnest Ross led Auburn in scoring with a game-high 16 points. Ross, along with teammate Josh Langford, tied for the most rebounds in the game with six. Frankie Sullivan finished behind Ross with 14 points and six assists. Ross tops all Tiger players in scoring and rebounding, averaging 11.8 points and 6.6 rebounds a game.

OT

The 74-72 win against Georgia State in overtime on December 22nd gave Georgia Southern a 2-1 record in overtime under Head Coach Charlton "C.Y." Young. All three overtime games have been played at home in Hanner Fieldhouse. The Eagles lone loss in overtime came against eventual SoCon champion Wofford (76-82) on Feb. 20, 2010. Georgia Southern's first overtime win under Coach Young was a 86-77 victory over Arkansas-Fort Smith in the Legends Classic last season.

BOTH SIDES OF THE BENCH

Tonight's game against Auburn marks the third time that Head Coach Charlton "C.Y." Young will be watching the series as an assistant or head coach for one of the two programs. Young was an assistant coach under Cliff Ellis when the Eagles were defeated, 93-79, by Auburn in 2000. Last season, Young's Eagles lost to Auburn, 95-75, in his first season as the head coach of Georgia Southern. Coach Young spent seven years at Auburn from 1994-96 as an administrative assistant and 1996-97 and 2000-04 as an assistant coach under Cliff Ellis.

50%

Shooting 50 percent from the field has been the key to winning for the Eagles this season. Georgia Southern is 4-0 on the season when it shoots at least 50 percent from the floor but is 1-4 in games where it allows the other team to shoot 50 percent from the floor. Georgia State, having a 50.9 field-goal percentage, is the only team the Eagles have defeated when the opponent has shot over 50 percent.

UN-FER-GETTABLE

Since scoring 26 points against Notre Dame, the most points by a freshman in a first game in Georgia Southern NCAA Division I history. Eric Ferguson (Statesboro, Ga.) has been writing his name in the Georgia Southern record books. His 14 made free throws against the Irish rank only second to Michael Curry (15) for most free throws made in a game.

Ferguson's 14.1 scoring average currently ranks second all-time for freshmen and with 19 games still left to play, he is on par to break the freshmen record for most points scored in a season. In only 13 games, Ferguson is seven blocked shots away from being tied for fifth place on the freshman all-time blocked shots list. Four more steals will give Ferguson fifth place on the freshman all-time steals list as well.

ALABAMA TRIO

Auburn is one of three teams that Georgia Southern will play from the Yellowhammer state this season. The Eagles play host to SoCon foe Samford (Feb. 5) later this season and dropped a, 58-68, contest to South Alabama earlier this season.

Georgia Southern is 2-3 against schools from Alabama under Coach Young. The Eagles' two victories came last season against Troy (80-77) and Samford (83-77).

UNFAMILIAR TERRITORY

Georgia Southern only has three players on the active roster who participated in last year's contest against Auburn. Ben Drayton (St. Marys, Ga.), Rory Spencer (Atlanta, Ga.) and Cameron Baskerville (Marietta, Ga.) each came off the bench to produce 16 percent of the scoring, the trio combined to score 12 of Georgia Southern's 75 total points.

The trio, averaging 12.6 mins in last year's contest at Auburn, are averaging 27.7 minutes this season. Drayton has tripled his minutes played, averaging 36.4 minutes per game. Spencer and Baskerville have doubled their minutes played, averaging 26.7 and 20.0 minutes, respectively.

A FRESH TAKE

The Georgia Southern freshman class accounts for 62 percent of the Eagles' scoring. Eric Ferguson and Jelani Hewitt average 14.1 and 10.8 ppg, respectively, while the six total freshmen are responsible for 44.3 of GSU's 71.2 points on average.

Georgia Southern has started at least three freshmen in 10 of its 13 games this season. At least three freshmen have started in every win for Georgia Southern this season with four freshmen starting in the win over Brewton-Parker (86-74) earlier in this month.

SPENCER NAMED TO SPI ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Rory Spencer averaged 15.6 points and 5.6 rebounds in three games of the South Padre Invitational and was named to the SPI All-Tournament Team. He shot 51.7 percent (15-29) from the field and had one block, two assists and three steals.

THREE'S COMPANY

Eric Ferguson's 22 points and 10 rebounds vs. Brewton-Parker Dec. 11th was the third double-double for the Eagles this season. It was the second straight game an Eagle had recorded a double-double. Marvin Baynham's 11 rebounds and 10 points against College of Charleston Dec. 4th was the second double-double for the Eagles this season. The first was recorded against Texas Tech (Nov. 23) when Cameron Baskerville grabbed 13 rebounds and scored 11 points.

LAST GAME AGAINST GEORGIA STATE - Dec. 22, 2010

STATESBORO, Ga. - Two free throw shots by Ben Drayton (St. Marys, Ga.) put Georgia Southern up by two points, 74-72, with 10 seconds left in overtime and Georgia State could not get a shot off before time expired to preserve the win. Drayton and Eric Ferguson (Statesboro, Ga.) combined for eight of the Eagles' 11 points in overtime as Drayton scored 15 of his team-high 19 points in the second half. Ferguson led the Eagles with seven rebounds and was second behind Drayton in scoring with 17. Georgia State drops to 5-4 overall while Georgia Southern improves to 4-9 on the season.

Three ties and two lead changes in overtime ended with an Eagles two-point victory. Fueled by his late second-half effort, Ferguson would score six of the Eagles' first nine points in overtime to give Georgia Southern a 72-69 lead. A trey by Brandon McGee tied the game at 72 with 1:14 remaining. Ferguson forced a Georgia State turnover and recovered the loose ball, calling timeout while sprawled on the court.

Georgia State would have a last attempt to score, but Marvin Baynham (Miami, Fla.), taking a cue from Ferguson, would set his feet to take the charge. On the Eagles' possession, Georgia State would foul Drayton and send him to the line for two shots, Drayton made both.

The Eagles were up by 11 points, 63-52, with just under three minutes left in game when missed shots and turnovers helped the Panthers cut the lead to 63-59 with a minute left in the game. A layup by Devonta White would make it a one-possession game. The Eagles would inbound the ball, but a steal by James Fields drew a Georgia Southern foul. With an opportunity to cut the lead and tie the game, Fields missed, but a deadball foul gave Georgia State one more chance with 21 seconds left on the clock. Fields drove to the basket for a layin with seven seconds remaining. Georgia Southern's Jelani Hewitt (Oakland Park, Fla.) last-ditch-effort attempt from behind the arc would be off the mark and the game headed to overtime.

Georgia Southern took its first lead with 16:59 left in the game. Behind 66.7 percent shooting from the field in the second half and a 16-4 run, the Eagles took a 52-39 lead with 10 minutes left to play. Georgia Southern would hold off two runs by the Panthers and build its lead up to double digits with three minutes remaining. The Eagles' shooting went cold and Georgia State would score 11 unanswered points to tie the game at the end of regulation, 63-63.

LAST TIME AROUND AGAINST AUBURN - Jan. 2, 2010

Auburn, Ala. - Auburn counted on balanced scoring and hit a season best 13 three-point field goals to pull to a 95-75 win over Georgia Southern at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum Saturday (Jan. 2) afternoon. The Tigers' Brendon Knox scored a game-high 18 points and pulled down 11 rebounds to lead the Tigers off the bench. Senior guard Antonio Hanson (Fort Worth, Texas) hit five three-pointers and added a free throw to lead the Eagles with 16 points. Sophomore forward Colby Wohlleb (Boca Raton, Fla.) had 10 points, all in the second half, for his second straight game in double figures.

Down by six at the half, 33-39, the Tigers and Eagles kept within eight to 10 points to the first media timeout of the second half. Auburn was hitting 66.7 percent to the Eagles 33.3 percent over the first four and a half minutes. The Tigers' hot shooting cooled off slightly, to 54 percent, but they finished the half at 60 percent and 57.1 percent for the game.

Freshman forward Cameron Baskerville (Marietta, Ga.) came out of the first media timeout with a quick jumper and Auburn's Lucas Hargrove countered with a basket in the paint. Hanson hit a three pointer off a Willie Powers III (Gainesville, Fla.) pass to get the Eagles within eight, 45-53. Knox scored the next six straight points for the Tigers and Frankie Sullivan nailed a three-point bucket, interrupted only by junior forward Rory Spencer's (Atlanta, Ga.) layup, to stretch the Auburn lead to 15, 62-47.

Over the next two minutes, the teams traded free throws with the same irregularity as their shots before Knox hit a jumper and free throw off a Wohlleb foul. Tay Waller hit back-to-back threes to give the Tigers a 9-2 swing and 23-point advantage. With more free throws over the next 90 seconds, Hanson and Wohlleb broke the basket-less stretch, with Hanson hitting two threes and Wohlleb adding another. Layups by Powers and Johntavious Rucker (Decatur, Ga.) countered Tiger scoring and Wohlleb hit his second trey to pull the Eagles closer, 70-85. Andre Malone would hit back-to-back threes for the Tigers, and the bench would add four more points. Wohlleb scored four more points with a free throw and his third trey in the last minute of the game.






