FOOTBALL OPENS 2021 CAMPAIGN HOSTING AKRON

» Auburn opens the Bryan Harsin era hosting the Akron Zips on Saturday, September 4, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala. ESPN Plus/SEC Network Plus will televise the 6:00 p.m. CT non-conference matchup. Fans are asked to wear white to the season opener; the winners of the 2019 and 2020 Leah Rawls Atkins awards, Haley Pembroke and Kylee Carter, will be recognized during pregame ceremonies.

THE HARSIN DEBUT

» Head coach Bryan Harsin begins his tenure on the Plains with a 76-24 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State).

He was a 62-11 winner over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in his first game as head coach at Arkansas State in 2013. In his first game at Boise State, the Broncos fell 35-13 to No. 18 Ole Miss in the 2014 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta.

SERIES HISTORY

» Auburn leads the all-time series with Akron by a 1-0 count. The only previous gridiron meeting between the two schools came on October 15, 1988, a 42-0 Auburn victory at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

This is Auburn's first game against a team from the state of Ohio since a 2019 home win over Kent State. The Tigers are 5-0-1 all-time against teams from Ohio, having faced Akron, Cincinnati, Kent State and Ohio State.

It's Auburn's ninth meeting all-time with a current member of the Mid-American Conference. Auburn has won the previous eight matchups by an average of 32.9 ppg, all of those played in Auburn. Auburn last played a MAC school in 2019 when the Tigers defeated Kent State 55-16.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn's 2021 campaign will be its 129th season of college football. The Tigers have 782 wins all-time, 13th-most among FBS schools

» Team captains for the 2021 season are linebackers Owen Pappoe and Chandler Wooten. Additional game captains will also be selected

» It's the first game of the Bryan Harsin era on the Plains. Auburn coaches are 18-7-1 all-time in their first game with the Tigers

» The 2020 SEC freshman of the year, Tank Bigsby rushed for 834 yards last year in 10 games and added 306 kick return yards; his all-purpose average of 122.4 yards per game ranks fourth among SEC returning players

» In 2020, Zakoby McClain led the FBS with 113 total tackles, ranking third in the SEC in average per (10.3). Owen Pappoe was 10th in the conference with an 8.5 average (93 total)

» The Tigers face five teams ranked in the Associated Press preseason Top 25: Alabama, Georgia, Texas A&M, LSU, Penn State.

» Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league's coaches include Tank Bigsby (first team), Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Zakoby McClain and Smoke Monday (second team) and Brodarious Hamm, Roger McCreary, Bo Nix and Owen Pappoe

» Auburn is 99-27-2 (.781) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 13 of their past 15 openers dating back to the 2006 season

» The Tigers are 102-16-3 (.855) all-time in home openers; no games were played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson earned CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors for 2020, the 15th player so honored in Auburn history. Carlson graduated in December with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and is currently pursuing an MBA at Auburn. Carlson was a second-team All-American and a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2020.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 35 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2020 season, including current team members Tank Bigsby, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Shedrick Jackson, Jacob Jasinski, Tate Johnson, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Tashawn Manning, Zakoby McClain, Roger McCreary, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, Zion Puckett, Jacob Quattlebaum, Malcolm Russell, John Samuel Shenker, Zykeivous Walker, Brooks Walton and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had 17 representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included John Reese Bellew, Jackson Billings, Elijah Canion, Oscar Chapman, Trey Elston, Brandon Frazier, Reed Hughes, Jake Levant, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Sawyer Pate, J.J. Pegues, Jay Sharp, Wesley Steiner and Jeremiah Wright.

AD HONOR ROLL

» Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 16 players honored in 2020-21, including current team members Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, David Shannon and Brooks Walton.

IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn is 178-58-5 (.749) all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 112-22-1 (.833) all-time at home in September, and 66-36-4 (.633) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 44 of 51 seasons.

The Tigers are 4-0 all-time in games played on September 4.

AT JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

» Auburn has an all-time record of 334-85-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .792 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 56 capacity crowds of 87,451 since the seating was increased in 2004.

IN SEASON OPENERS

» Auburn is 99-27-2 (.781) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 13 of their past 15 openers dating back to the 2006 season; last season, Auburn defeated No. 23 Kentucky 29-13 in a game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn is 53-8-1 (.863) in season openers at home, 16-5-1 (.750) in openers on the road and 30-14 (.682) in openers at neutral-site locations. Auburn's total of 99 season-opening victories is behind only Alabama (101) and tied with Arkansas (99) for the most among current SEC schools.

The Tigers are 102-16-3 (.855) all-time in home openers; there were no games played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938. Although Jordan-Hare Stadium opened in 1939, the Tigers did not open a season there until 1951; since then, Auburn is 67-12-2 at the stadium in home openers. The Tigers have won 13 of their last 14 home openers, the only loss coming to eventual national champion Clemson in 2016 by a 19-13 score.

Auburn is 55-15 (.786) in 70 season openers against non-conference opponents since the inception of the SEC in 1933, the latest being a 27-21 neutral-site win over Oregon in 2019.

Coach Bryan Harsin is 7-1 in season openers (6-1 at Boise State, 1-0 at Arkansas State).

NOTABLE SEASON OPENERS

» Sept. 26, 2020: Auburn 29, Kentucky 13 – A season opener that many thought wouldn't happen amidst the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Tigers took the field at Jordan-Hare Stadium in front of 17,490 fans – mostly students – and started the season 1-0. Bo Nix threw three second-half touchdown passes, two of them to Seth Williams, and the Tigers' defense forced three turnovers as Auburn won its fourth straight home opener.

» Aug. 31, 2019: Auburn 27, Oregon 21 – A touchdown pass from freshman Bo Nix to Seth Williams with nine seconds left led the Tigers past Oregon at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas. Auburn never led until the final nine seconds, and the 15-point second-half comeback was the Tigers' biggest since the 2010 Alabama game.

» Sept. 4, 2010: Auburn 52, Arkansas State 26 – Cam Newton made a splash in his Auburn debut, accounting for five touchdowns and 357 yards of total offense as Auburn opened its national championship season with a 52-26 win over Arkansas State. Newton rushed for three touchdowns and passed for two others, and he set a then-school record for rushing yards by a quarterback with 171 yards on 15 carries.

» Sept. 7, 1985: Auburn 49, Southwest Louisiana 7 – After a shoulder injury cost Bo Jackson most of his 1984 season, he wanted to prove to the nation that he was back. Did he ever. Jackson kicked off his Heisman Trophy-winning senior season by rushing for 290 yards and four touchdowns on just 23 carries in a 49-7 win for the second-ranked Tigers over Southwest Louisiana. Jackson had 181 yards on his first six carries and 206 yards on 10 carries by halftime. As a team, the Tigers rushed for a school-record 565 yards.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Since 2001, Auburn is 155-30 (.838) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 211-38-1 (.842) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 551-58-9 (.899) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 345-9 (.975) when scoring 30 points, 174-3 (.9758) when scoring 40 points, 81-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» Auburn has scored in 103 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

» Auburn has scored first in 37 of its last 55 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign.

» 2020 SEC Freshman of the Year Tank Bigsby was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and accounted for a quarter (15-61) of Auburn's plays of 20+ yards last season (8 KOR, 7 rush).

Bigsby, whose 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen, was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games and four total; previously only Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010) rushed for three 100-yard games against SEC opposition as Auburn freshmen.

Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993. Bigsby and South Carolina's Kevin Harris were the only SEC players to rush for at least 800 yards while averaging at least 6.0 yards per carry in 2020.

» 2019 SEC Freshman of the Year Bo Nix started the 2020 campaign with a 233-yard passing performance against Kentucky, connecting for two scores to Seth Williams and another to Eli Stove.

Three TD passes against Kentucky tied his career best (also 2019 at Arkansas) and Nix posted his sixth career 200-yard passing game with 238 yards passing and a 58-yard gamewinning TD pass to Williams at Ole Miss.

Against LSU, Nix was 18-24 passing for 300 yards and three more touchdowns, and he was Auburn's leading rusher with 81 yards on 11 carries, including a 5-yard score. Nix' pass efficiency rating of 221.3 vs. LSU was the second-best game rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

Nix is now 431-734 (58.7%) in his career for 4,957 yards and 28 passing scores.

He has 28 career TD passes, tied with Ben Leard (1997-2000) for 10th in Auburn history. He's two TD passes behind Cam Newton for ninth and three behind his father, Patrick Nix (1992-95), for eighth.

Nix' Auburn record of 251 pass attempts without an interception, dating back through the 2019 LSU game, was snapped at Georgia.

» In 2019, Nix set the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16).

» Auburn has eight returning offensive line-men with at least one collegiate start; that's the eighth most of any FBS program.

FOR THE DEFENSE

» Linebacker Zakoby McClain led the nation with 113 tackles in 2020, averaging 10.3 per game. That average ranked third in the SEC and 19th nationally. He was the first Auburn player to average 10 tackles per game since Dontarrious Thomas in 2001 (10.2 avg.).

» Against Texas A&M, McClain posted a career-high 17 tackles, the most by an Auburn player since Demetruce McNeal (18) at Mississippi State in 2012.

McClain has seven career double-figure tackle games (five last season) and he has led the Tigers in tackles eight times in his career (six last season).

After an 11-tackle game in the Citrus Bowl, the junior now has 172 tackles for his career.

» McClain is looking to become Auburn's first player with 100+ tackles in back-to-back seasons since Takeo Spikes in 1996 (119) and 1997 (136).

» Last season, McClain was the first Auburn player since Deshaun Davis in 2018 with double-figure tackles in three straight games (Georgia 11, Arkansas 14, South Carolina 13).

» SEC all-freshman team honoree Colby Wooden was sixth in the SEC with 9.5 TFL last season; Wooden recorded at least 0.5 TFL in eight games, fourth among all FBS freshmen. As a team, the Tigers ranked fifth in the SEC with 62.0 TFL.

» The number of career games current players have led the team in tackles:

» Among the linebacking corps, the Tigers show 35 career starts and 373 career tackles entering the 2021 campaign.

» Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 54 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers allowed only 148 total TD during that span (2.3 per game).

» Auburn, which has allowed a TD on only 50.3 percent (96-191) of its opponents' red zone trips since 2016, ranks fifth among FBS teams in that statistic (behind Wisconsin, Cincinnati, Clemson and Northwestern).

» The returning players in the Auburn secondary have accounted for 36 career starts; graduate transfers Bydarrus Knighten and Dreshun Miller add another 54 career starts to that total.

» Roger McCreary was tied for fourth, just two off the SEC lead, with three interceptions last season. McCreary was the first Auburn player to record three interceptions in a season since Joshua Holsey in 2016.

» Auburn has 36 former lettermen on NFL rosters, representing 19 different NFL teams

» Former Auburn lettermen on NFL rosters who finished their college careers elsewhere: Byron Cowart (New England)

» Auburn has had 31 players taken in the first round (most recent in 2020 Derrick Brown 1/7 and Noah Igbinioghene 1/30) and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) and Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 17 of the last 21 Pro Bowls, and Auburn has had at least one former player in 13 of the last 16 Super Bowls, including Super Bowl LV starters Carlton Davis and Jamel Dean for the world champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 20 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 53 games.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn is 22-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being Smoke Monday's 100-yard interception return against Tennessee, Barton Lester's TD recovery of a Jordyn Peters blocked punt against Arkansas, and Christian Tutt's fumble recovery TD against LSU last year.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks fifth in Auburn career scoring with 275.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is sixth in career PAT made (116) at Auburn and is third in career field goals made (53).

Carlson made 20 of 22 field goal attempts last season, and has made 26 of his last 28 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019.

His 50-yard field goal against Northwestern was his fifth career FG of at least 50 yards:

- 53 Washington (2018)
- 53 Liberty (2018)
- 52 Alabama (2019)
- 50 Tennessee (2020)
- 50 Northwestern (2020)

In 2019, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

» Carlson has eight career games with at least three field goals:

- 2020:** Arkansas, South Carolina, Tennessee, Mississippi State;
- 2019:** Alabama;
- 2018:** Washington, Mississippi State, Liberty

» Carlson ranks third among Auburn career leaders in field goals made (53), and just one of five Auburn kickers to make 15+ FG in multiple seasons:

- Anders Carlson** (2018, 2019, 2020)
- Daniel Carlson** (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017)
- Wes Byrum** (2007, 2009, 2010)
- Jim Von Wyl** (1990, 1991)
- Win Lyle** (1987, 1989)

» With 749 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are now the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

» Auburn is two games ahead of Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (154) without having a punt blocked. The Tigers last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

RANKINGS

» The Tigers face five teams ranked in the Associated Press preseason Top 25: No. 1 Alabama, No. 5 Georgia, No. 6 Texas A&M, No. 16 LSU and No. 19 Penn State.

» Auburn is 114-167-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 53-43-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-72-2 on the road and 33-52-2 on a neutral field.

» The Tigers are 90-134-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (43-34-2 at home, 28-65-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 59-53-3 overall (29-10-1 at home, 19-33-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 330-122-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 188-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-89-4 all-time.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 81-77-4 (36-13-1 at home, 22-41-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» There are 22 players on the Auburn roster who have already earned their bachelor's degrees, eighth best of any FBS institution and most in the SEC.

» In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 254-69-6.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 330-257-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 141-61-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 189-195-12 overall.

» Edge defender T.D. Moultry will be playing in his 50th Auburn game, most on the current squad and just four shy of tying the Auburn record of most games played in a career (54) set by running backs Tre Smith (2002-06) and Mario Fannin (2006-10).

» The Tigers have 781 total victories since 1982, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. All-time, 31 FBS programs have posted more than 700 wins.

» Among teams that played at least 10 games last season, Auburn (0.82 was one of just six teams averaging fewer than 1.0 turnovers lost per game; others were Texas A&M, Texas, BYU, Notre Dame and Alabama.

» On the current Auburn roster, 39 players have at least one college start to their credit, 20 on offense and 19 on defense.

Six Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Bydarrus Knighten (43 games at SE Missouri State), Caylin Newton (25 at Howard), Brandon Council (29 overall; 24 at Akron), Bo Nix (24), Owen Pappoe (24) and Nick Brahms (21).

» Pregame honorees include Haley Pembroke and Kylee Carter, the 2019 and 2020 winners of the Leah Rawls Atkins Award, Auburn's highest honor presented to a female student-athlete for excellence in academics and athletics while modeling leadership, integrity and courage.

Pembroke was a member of two Auburn national championship equestrian teams during her career from 2016-20; the Bellevue, Wash., product graduated with honors in finance in 2020 and received an NCAA Women's Enhancement Graduate Scholarship.

The most prolific javelin thrower in school history, Kylee Carter was a three-time All-American at Auburn and the NCAA runner-up in 2019. A native of Beauregard, Ala., Carter not only holds the school record but owns the top 10 marks ever by an Auburn javelin thrower. Carter recorded 20 collegiate victories while on the Plains, including the 2019 SEC Outdoor Championship and twice claiming the historic Penn Relays title. An SEC Community Service Team representative, Carter received her undergraduate (2019) and graduate (2021) degrees from Auburn.

» Next up, the Tigers host Alabama State September 11 in an 11 a.m. contest at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Akron visits Temple for a 3:30 p.m. game that day.

BRYAN HARSIN » HEAD COACH



HARSIN FILE

>> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.

>> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 76-24 overall as a head coach - including one season at Arkansas State - and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.

>> His impressive resume at Boise saw him led the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.

>> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

>> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

>> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.

>> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

>> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 426 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 334, losing 85 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.


