Auburn Post-Game Notes

Auburn vs. Clemson Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium September 18, 2010

- The pre-game flight was made by Spirit from the flag pole on the Northeast ramp.
- Auburn team captains were OT Lee Ziemba and DE Antoine Carter.
- Clemson won the toss and elected to receive. Auburn chose to defend the north goal.
- Kickoff was at 6:06 p.m. CT.
- Game attendance was announced as a sell-out at 87,451.

TEAM NOTES

- Auburn now leads the all-time series with Clemson 34-11-2 and has won 14 consecutive games against the Tigers.
- Auburn now has a 6-5 all-time record when playing in ESPN GameDay's on-site game, including a 4-2 record at home.
- Auburn is now 21-4 in night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium since the 2000 season.
- Auburn has now won 27 of its last 31 games played in September and has won seven in a row.
- Auburn overcame a 17-0 deficit, marking the first time the Tigers were down by at least 17 points and came back to win since Sept. 28, 2002, when Auburn trailed Syracuse 17-0 before coming back to win 37-34 in three overtimes.
- Auburn's last overtime game was the 2010 Outback Bowl against Northwestern. Auburn won that game 38-35 in just one overtime period.
- Auburn had won its last two overtime games, both coming in bowl games (vs. Clemson in the 2007 Chick-fila Bowl)
- Auburn's last regular-season overtime game was a 26-23 loss to South Florida on Sept. 8, 2007.
- Auburn's last regular-season overtime win was 37-34 victory over Syracuse on Sept. 28, 2002.
- Auburn is 6-5 all-time in overtime games and has won three straight
- Auburn is now 2-0 all-time against Clemson in overtime games, also defeating Clemson 23-20 in the 2007 Chick-fil-a Bowl
- Auburn quarterback Cam Newton has thrown at least two touchdown passes in each of the first three games, marking the first time an Auburn team has thrown at least two touchdown passes in each of the first three games since the 1999 season.
- Clemson struck first on an 8-yard TD pass from Kyle Parker to Jamie Harper. It marked the second straight home game in which Auburn's opponent scored first.
- Auburn trailed 17-3 at the half, marking the first time this season that Auburn did not lead at halftime.
- Auburn led 217 at the end of the third quarter. The Tigers have now lead after three periods in every game this season.
- Auburn outgained 258-46 in the third quarter after totaling 116 in the first half and eight in the first quarter.
- Auburn opponents are 0-for-7 on third-down conversions in the fourth quarter this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- OT Lee Ziemba extended his consecutive starts streak to 41 games, which is eight shy of the school record held by Will Herring.
- WR Trovon Reed made his collegiate debut, becoming the 13th true freshman to play for Auburn this season.
- RB Michael Dyer made his first career start for Auburn, while LB Craig Stevens made his first start of the season.
- Darvin Adams had his fifth career 100-yard receiving game and first this season, finishing with five receptions for 118 yards. He moved into 16th place on Auburn's career receiving chart, and now has 1,229 career receiving yards.
- Adams had his 12th career receiving touchdown late in the third quarter and second of the year, catching an 8-yard touchdown pass from Cameron Newton. Adams now ranks tied for seventh in Auburn history with his 12 TD receptions.
- Cameron Newton completed 7-of14 passes with two touchdowns. It marked the third straight game he has thrown at least two touchdown passes.

- Wes Byrum finished the night scoring nine points, and now needs 49 more points to become Auburn's alltime leading scorer. He made his 46th career field goal to end the first half, which moved him into sole possession of second place on Auburn's career field goals made list.
- Wes Byrum's overtime field goal was the fourth game-winning field goal of his career
- In just his 16th game at Auburn, Demond Washington moved into Auburn's all-time top 10 for career kickoff return yardage when he returned Clemson's first kickoff 28 yards. The return gave him a career total of 715 yards, moving past Brent Fullwood (1983-86) for 10th.
- Onterio McCalebb's 12-yard touchdown run in the third quarter was his first touchdown of the season, and the fifth of his career.
- Terrell Zachery's 78-yard touchdown reception late in the third quarter was tied for the 10th-longest pass play in Auburn history. It was the second-longest catch of Zachery's career. He holds the Auburn record with a 93-yard catch against Louisiana Tech last season.
- Zachery's 78-yard touchdown catch was also the fourth touchdown of his career of at least 65 yards.
- Nick Fairley had a sack midway through the fourth quarter, and has now had at least one sack in every game this season.
