LEADING OFF

- Today is the home opener for the 119th season of Auburn baseball.
- This will be head coach Sunny Golloway's first game at Plainsman Park.
- Auburn is 7-0 all-time against Alabama State will all seven meetings coming at Plainsman Park.
- Last year, Auburn won twice against Alabama State, winning 10-2 on March 19 and 2-1 on April 10.
- The Tigers went 2-1 in the season-opening weekend, defeating Indiana State and Connecticut while dropping a 1-0 heartbreaker to Ohio State at the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte, Fla.
- Auburn has stolen 10 bases through three games (4 vs. Indiana State, 6 vs. Connecticut). Last year, Auburn did not steal its 10th base of the season until the 14th game.
- Auburn's six stolen bases vs. Ohio State were more than in any game last year and its most since swiping 8 in a win over Alcorn State in 2012.
- Keegan Thompson had nine strikeouts in his career debut vs. UConn (2/16), the most by any Auburn pitcher since Jon Luke Jacobs had 11 vs. South Alabama in 2012.
- The Tigers have yet to record an extra-base hit this season.

SETTING THE STAGE

Auburn opens the 2014 home season Wednesday, Feb. 19, with a 3 p.m. first pitch vs. Alabama State at Plainsman Park. The Tigers enter the week at 2-1 after winning two out of three games in a season-opening tournament in Port Charlotte, Fla. Auburn defeated Indiana State (4-0) and Connecticut (7-3) and dropped a 1-0 heartbreaker to Ohio State at the Snowbird Classic.

Alabama State is 3-1 as well, winning two of three at home last weekend over Eastern Kentucky, then taking a 5-0 win at South Alabama last night.

GOLLOWAY'S AUBURN COACHING DEBUT

Sunny Golloway is the 17th head baseball coach in Auburn history, and he made his Auburn debut last Friday vs. Indiana State. Dating back to 1949, Auburn coaches are 7-3 in their first game at the helm of the Tigers.

Golloway was the fourth-straight Auburn coach to win his debut game, and the first since records are available to earn a shutout victory in his first game as head coach:

LAST TIME: AUBURN 2, ALA. ST. 1 (4/10/13)

Blake Austin's one-out double off the wall in left in the bottom of the ninth helped Auburn rally for a 2-1 win over Alabama State at Plainsman Park.

Tied at 1-1 going to the ninth, Garrett Cooper drew a leadoff walk and Damek Tomscha singled to put the winning run in scoring position. After a failed sac bunt by Bobby Andrews got Cooper at third, Austin launched his seventh double of the year off the green monster in left, scoring pinch runner Sam Gillikin from second for the win.

Auburn struggled to get hits off of the Alabama State pitching staff as it was no-hit until there was one out in the eighth and the team finished with just three hits total. Jordan Ebert broke up the no-hit bid with a single back up the middle, extending his hitting streak to 10 games, his second double-digit hitting streak of the season.

STEALING THE SHOW

Sunny Golloway said when he was hired that the Tigers were going to run, and run, and run some more. They did just that in the season-opening Snowbird Classic, swiping a combined 10 bases (on 12 attempts) during the weekend. The Tigers did not steal their 10th base until the 14th game of the 2013 season, and Auburn's six steals vs. Connecticut were more than in any game last season.

Dan Glevenyak, Ryan Tella and J.J. Shaffer are leading the way with two steals apiece.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Five freshmen were in Auburn's opening-day lineup - 1B Keegan Thompson, 2B Damon Haecker, OF J.J. Shaffer, OF Anfernee Grier, and DH Daniel Robert. Two other freshmen - IF Brett Binning and C Blake Logan - saw the first action of their careers during the opening weekend.

Grier is the only Auburn player to hit safely in each of the first three games, and freshmen accounted for 10 of Auburn's 21 hits (48%) on the opening weekend.

CAN'T SPELL KEEGAN WITHOUT 'K'

In his collegiate pitching debut, freshman RHP Keegan Thompson was masterful, allowing just one unearned run on two hits in a 5.2-inning start vs. Connecticut, picking up the win. He also struck out nine Huskies on the day, which ranked as the most strikeouts by an Auburn pitcher since Jon Luke Jacobs had 11 vs. South Alabama during the 2012 season.

SEASON-LONG NOTES

EXPERIENCED LINEUP

Auburn returns 24 letterwinners from its 2013 roster, including eight of nine Opening Day position starters from last year. Sophomore LF Jordan Ebert is the leading returning hitter after batting .303 last year with four home runs and 22 RBI. Senior 3B Damek Tomscha tied for the Auburn home run lead last year with seven, and he hit .274 with 26 RBI. Senior C Blake Austin was a .290 hitter last year with 3 HR and 23 RBI, and senior CF Ryan Tella was the team leader in RBI (37) and stolen bases (14) last season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Auburn welcomes the No. 13-ranked recruiting class according to Baseball America, and several of the newcomers figure to make an immediate impact. Four freshmen - 1B Keegan Thompson, 2B Damon Haecker, RF Anfernee Grier and 1B/DH Daniel Robert - figure to be in the Opening Day lineup. Thompson will also be part of the Tigers' starting rotation.

Thompson, Grier and Kevin Davis were ranked in Baseball America's top 500 prospects for the 2013 MLB Draft. Grier was drafted in the 39th round by the Detroit Tigers. Thompson and Davis also have significant international experience, winning gold medals with USA Baseball.

Sunny Galloway was named Auburn's 17th head baseball coach on June 14, 2013. Galloway spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at the University of Oklahoma, where he led the Sooners to seven NCAA Regional berths, four NCAA Super Regionals and the 2010 College World Series.

"I'm really excited about this opportunity because I've always held the Auburn baseball program in very high regard," Galloway said. "The history of the Auburn program was a huge factor in making this decision. Secondly, the Southeastern Conference is the top baseball conference in America. Being able to compete in the SEC is a challenge that we look forward to. With our location, we are in a hotbed of talent. We will be able to hit the road recruiting right away, and we look forward to recruiting the best student-athletes to represent this outstanding university."

Galloway said he and his family were impressed with Auburn as soon as they arrived on campus for a visit with Jacobs.

"I had heard quite a bit about Jay and really wanted to meet him," Galloway said. "And right after I met him, I knew it was going to be a great fit. I think that's very important - who you're working with on a daily basis, the commitment to the student-athletes in your program, and making sure that everything is in place to pursue an opportunity to win championships. That's what we want to be about - we want to win championships."

Galloway has been a proven winner at each of his head coaching stops. In 16 full seasons as a head coach - eight seasons each at Oklahoma and Oral Roberts - Galloway has amassed a record of 681-337-1 (.669), including 12 seasons with at least 40 wins. He recorded a mark of 346-181-1 (.656) in eight-plus seasons as the Oklahoma head coach, an average of more than 40 wins per season. Prior to the 2013 season, Galloway's winning percentage ranked No. 15 nationally among active head coaches.

Last season at Oklahoma, Galloway led the Sooners to a 43-21 overall record, a Big 12 Tournament title, an NCAA Regional title and a Super Regional appearance. His final team at Oklahoma also produced a pair of All-Americans, including pitcher Jonathan Gray, the No. 3 overall pick in last week's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Under Galloway, Oklahoma posted the program's fifth-straight 40-win regular season in 2013, making Oklahoma one of few programs nationally to win at least 40 games in five consecutive years. The Sooners finished third in the Big 12 standings while making the program's sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance (36th overall). OU finished the 2013 campaign ranked as high as No. 18 in the nation after falling to LSU in the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional.

"The goal in this search was to find a proven winner who can put our baseball program in a position to compete for championships, and we found our man in Coach Galloway," Jacobs said. "His program at Oklahoma is one of only a handful nationally to have won 40 or more games each of the past five years, so his record speaks for itself. After having the chance to hear his vision for Auburn baseball, there is no doubt in my mind he has the tenacity, the passion and the drive to get our program back to a level that matches our strong baseball heritage."

The Sooners hosted three NCAA Regionals under Galloway while appearing in the program's only Super Regional appearances (2006, 2010, 2012 and 2013) and making it back to the College World Series in 2010 for the first time since 1995.

Galloway has 22 years' experience as a collegiate coach. He served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma from 1992-95, helping lead the Sooners to three trips to the College World Series in those four years and a national title in 1994. He took over as head coach at Oral Roberts in 1996, and the Golden Eagles won the Mid-Continent Conference title and advanced to an NCAA Regional in each of his final six seasons at ORU.

He returned to Oklahoma as associate head coach in 2004 and was elevated to interim head coach on May 1, 2005. Two months later, he was named Oklahoma's eighth head baseball coach.

Galloway has produced 80 MLB draft picks in his 16-year tenure as a collegiate head coach, and a total of 113 players have been draft selections in his 22 years in college baseball. He has

also coached 94 all-conference selections between his two head coaching stops, including 61 All-Big 12 selections at Oklahoma in the last eight years.

Three of OU's recruiting classes under Galloway have ranked in the top 10 in Collegiate Baseball's national rankings, including the 2007 group of newcomers that was tabbed the fourth best in the country, the highest ranking since 1987 and tied for the second best in program history. At ORU, Galloway posted a mark of 335-156 (.682). He coached 16 All-Americans, three Freshman All-Americans and 26 of his ORU players were drafted or signed professional contracts. He was honored four times as Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year by his peers (1998, 1999, 2000, 2002).

In his final six seasons at Oral Roberts, Galloway was responsible for turning the Golden Eagles into one of the nation's winningest programs. The program flourished under Galloway's guidance and tallied 277 wins in that time, an average of more than 46 victories per season, and a .731 winning percentage. Galloway and the Golden Eagles dominated the Mid-Continent Conference after joining the league in 1998, winning six consecutive regular season and tournament titles, and advancing to six consecutive NCAA Regionals. ORU was an amazing 85-5 in conference play over his last four seasons.

Galloway is a former Team USA assistant and head coach of several collegiate summer teams. In the summer of 2002, he was selected to serve as pitching coach for the USA Baseball National Team. Under his direction, the team recorded the lowest ERA in its history. Galloway also helped team USA to a silver medal.

Born in Springfield, Mo., Galloway grew up in Stillwater, Okla., and graduated from Stillwater High School in 1979. He attended Northeastern Oklahoma A&M Junior College in Miami, Okla., for one year before transferring to Oklahoma Christian College where he received his bachelor's degree in business in 1984. He has also done graduate work at the University of Central Oklahoma and the University of Oklahoma.

Galloway and his wife, Charlotte, have three children: Sunni Kate, Taylor and Callen.
