WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This is the 44th meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Auburn dating back to 1928.
- The Tigers lead the all-time series 32-10 and are 15-3 in Auburn ... Original record is 32-11, but Ole Miss' win in 2012 was vacated due to NCAA ruling.
- · 84.5 percent of Ole Miss' offense (2,936 of 3,473 yards) have come from freshmen, the most by any team in the country.
- Six different freshmen have started at least one game this season for the Rebels.
- Ole Miss has forced at least one turnover in seven of its eight games this season.
- The Rebels' 276.6 yards rushing per game in SEC contests lead the conference.
- Ole Miss has only thrown three interceptions all season, which is the fewest in the SEC.
- The Rebels have started the same five offensive linemen in all eight games this season.
- Thirteen different Rebels have started all eight games of the season.
- QB John Rhys Plumlee's 508 yards rushing on the season are a program record by an Ole Miss freshman QB and are the fifth-most by any quarterback regardless of classification.
- Plumlee needs just 36 more yards to break the school rushing record for a quarterback in a single season.
- NT Benito Jones ranks fourth in the SEC in tackles for loss with 8.0.
- DB A.J. Finley leads the SEC and is No. 8 nationally in fumble recoveries with two.
- RB Jerrion Ealy has three 50-yard rushes this season, the fourth-most in the country.

Ole Miss is tied for third in the SEC with 13 total team sacks in conference contests.

Ole Miss has rushed for 200 or more yards in four straight games in the same season for the first time since 1998.

Ole Miss has 14 explosive runs of 30 yards or more, the most in the NCAA. Five of those attempts are greater than 50 yards, the third-most in the country.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST AUBURN

October 11, 2018 • Oxford, Miss. • Auburn 31, Ole Miss 16: It was just a four-point game at halftime in Oxford, but a big third quarter by the Auburn offense spelled the difference. Explosive plays by JaTarvious Whitlow and Seth Williams led to 21 third-quarter points as the Tigers pulled away. Ole Miss responded with a fourth-quarter scoring reception from AJ. Brown, but it was too little, too late in the defeat.

October 7, 2017 • Oxford, Miss. • #12 Auburn 44, Ole Miss 23:
Ole Miss outscored Auburn 20-9 in the second half, but it was too little,

ole his duscored waturn 20 hin the section hall, but it was too hitter, and despite the Rebels' improved play in the second half, the deficit was too much to overcome in the defeat.

October 29, 2016 • Oxford, Miss. • #15 Auburn 40, Ole Miss 29:

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly threw for a school-record 465 yards and three touchdowns, but Ole Miss came up just short in a 40-29 loss to No. 15 Auburn in front of 65,927 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. Kelly completed 36 of 59 passes and broke Archie Manning's 47-year-old Ole Miss single-game passing record with 465 yards.

October 31, 2015 - Auburn, Ala. - #19 Ole Miss 27, Auburn 19: No. 19 Ole Miss held off a feisty Auburn team for a 27-19 victory at Iordan-Hare Stadium. Ole Miss racked up 558 yards of total offense, including 402 passing yards. Kelly's 33 completions tied a season high, and he was three yards short of a season best in passing yards. Kelly tossed a 45-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Jones and a 21-yard touchdown to Laquon Treadwell. Treadwell also completed a pass of his own for 21 yards.

November 1, 2014 • Oxford, Miss. • #3 Auburn 35, #4 Ole Miss 31: The No. 4 Ole Miss football team played a hard-fought game against No. 3 Auburn, but two fumbles near the Auburn goal line in the fourth quarter proved to be too costly to overcome and the Rebels lost 35-31. Trailing by four with less than two minutes to play, wide receiver Laquon Treadwell caught a pass down the middle. Dragging a defender, Treadwell fought his way toward the goal line, but had his ankle rolled over and fumbled into the end zone, and the Tigers recovered the ball.



OLE MISS HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke (Ole Miss, 2000) is in his 12th season at Ole Miss and third season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in program history. He was born a Rebel as his family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. During his 25 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), spent five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach before being promoted to interim head coach for the 2017 season. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), he served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe. Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1999, helping the Rebels to an 8-4 mark with regular-season wins against Auburn, South Carolina, LSU and Arkansas as well as a 27-25 triumph over Oklahoma in the Independence Bowl. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in business administration. His father, Tommy, was a defensive back at Ole Miss in the 1960s while his brother, Tom, quarterbacked the Rebels from 1989-91. Tom is also on the Ole Miss football staff as assistant athletics director for player development.

AUBURN HEAD COACH GUS MALZAHN

Gus Malzahn (Henderson State, 1990) is in his seventh season as the Auburn head coach and is 6-2 in 2019. He owns a 59-29 record as the Tigers' head man and a 68-32 mark in eight seasons as a college head coach overall. Last year, he directed Auburn to an 8-5 record and a win in the Music City Bowl. In 2017, the Tigers reached as high as No. 2 in the College Football Playoff Poll and played in the SEC Championship Game for the second time in five seasons, knocking off No. 1 Georgia and No. 1 Alabama in November, the first time in poll history that a program has defeated two top-ranked teams during the same regular season. In 2013, he led the Tigers to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA history, guiding them all the way to the BCS national championship game, which they lost 34-31 to Florida State. Auburn was SEC champion, and Malzahn earned numerous SEC and national coach of the year honors. Prior to taking the Auburn job, Malzahn had a 9-3 record (and Sun Belt Conference title) in one season at Arkansas State. Malzahn was the Broyles Award winner when he was offensive coordinator for Auburn's national championship team in 2010.

TIGERS SCOUTING REPORT

Auburn is currently ranked No. 11 and is 6-2 overall and 3-2 in conference play entering this week's game with Ole Miss. Since starting the season 5-0, including a season opening win over No. 11 Oregon, Auburn has dropped two of its last three contests, including a 23-20 loss at No. 2 LSU on Saturday. The Tiger offense ranks seventh in the SEC with 415 yards of total offense, with 189 yards through the air and 226 rushing yards per game. True freshman Bo Nix has thrown for 1,458 yards with 12 passing TDs and six interceptions. Sophomore JaTarvious Whitlow leads the Tigers on the ground, averaging 79 rushing yards per game and seven rushing touchdowns, the third-most in the SEC. Wide receiver Seth Williams has hauled in 29 catches for 523 yards and eight TDs. Auburn is holding its opponents to 342 yards and 17.9 points per game. The Tigers rank 18th nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game) and are second in the SEC in sacks (2.9 per game). Sophomore Christian Tutt ranks sixth in the nation with 14.5 yards per punt return.

RUN, RUN, RUN SOME MORE

Ole Miss ranks second in the SEC and 18th nationally in rushing offense, averaging 232.5 yards per game. In SEC play, the Rebels have run for a leaque-best 1,383 yards and 11 touchdowns. Ole Miss has averaged 48.8 carries per conference game, over 13 more carries per game more than the league average (35.6). Ole Miss' 413 yards rushing vs. Vanderbilt during Week 6 were the most by Ole Miss against an SEC opponent since 1979 (Vandy, 443).

EALY-SIVE

HB Jerrion Ealy is a player that has made the most of the touches he has gotten this season. Always a difficult player to tackle, of Ealy's 8.0 yards per carry this season, 5.4 have come after contact. That mark is good for third among all SEC running backs with at least 25 carries. On 48 carries, Ealy has forced 18 missed tackles, for an SEC-leading 0.38 missed tackles per carry. Ealy has also been measuring exceptionally well on PFF's elusive rating scale (189.3). The elusive rating measures the impact of a ball carrier past the point of his blocking, and Ealy is a distant first place in that metric among 37 qualifying SEC RBs. Ealy excels between the tackles, gaining 181 yards (8.7 YPC) and three TDs on 27 carries, forcing 14 missed tackles in the process. With Ole Miss' high rate of runs on first downs, Ealy surely has made a case to gain an increased amount of early down carries to help minimize long yardage needed situations as the year closes out.

CORRAL'S QUICK TRIGGER

QB **Matt Corral** has shown flashes over the course of his second season with the team. Of the 22 SEC quarterbacks that have thrown 50+ passes this season, Corral ranks seventh with a 70.9 passing grade. He also owns the third highest overall grade (72.8) among qualifying players on the Ole Miss offense. Despite not starting a game since Week 4, Corral has still managed to come off the bench in Weeks 7 and 8 and provide the team with solid QB play. Corral has thrived when getting the ball out quickly. On throws of 2.5 seconds or less, Corral has completed over 68 percent of his passes (73/107) for 821 yards and four TDs. His four Big Time Throws (PFF's highest graded passes) of 2.5 seconds or less in the pocket is tied for second most in the SEC.

STRONG AGAINST THE RUN

The Ole Miss defense currently ranks 32nd in the NCAA in rushing defense, allowing 124.3 yards per game. Ole Miss has held four opponents to under 70 yards rushing this season, including limiting Vanderbilt to just 62 yards on the ground in the Rebels' win during Week 6. In Weeks 2, 3 and 4, the Rebels held their opponents to 61, 66 and 60 yards respectively. It was the first time since 1999 that Ole Miss had allowed 70 or less rushing yards in three straight games.

RUN-JRP

In just five appearances and four career starts, QB **John Rhys Plumlee** has put up some record-breaking numbers on the ground. Plumlee has carried the ball 86 times for 508 yards and four touchdowns. His 508 yards on the season are the most ever by an Ole Miss freshman QB and just 36 yards shy of setting the school record, regardless of year. He needs 104 yards to set Ole Miss' freshman rushing record. Plumlee is the only Ole Miss quarterback in school history to rush for 100 yards in three straight games. He's also the first Power 5 QB to rush for 100 or more yards in each of his first three starts since Nebraska's Taylor Martinez and Michigan's Denard Robinson in 2010. In SEC contests, Plumlee leads the conference in rushing attempts (83) and rushing touchdowns (four) and is second in yards on the ground per game (113.8).

MORE MOORE = LESS DROPS

All season long, WR **Elijah Moore** has been the lead playmaker for the Rebels offense. As far as slot receivers go, Moore has been among the most productive in the entire country in 2019. Moore's 49 catches out of the slot rank second in the SEC, third among all Power 5 players, and fifth among all FBS players. What makes this statistic even more impressive is that he has done so without a single drop this season. All 49 of his catchable targets have resulted in completions. His streak of 49 consecutive catches without a drop to start the season is the longest one running in the nation, and his accompanying 92.0 drop grade is the highest of any player in college football. Despite a QB rotation in recent weeks and a run-heavy offense all season, Moore is also ranked near the top of the conference in yards per route run. His 2.49 yards per route run are tied for ninth most among the 36 SEC receivers with 25- targets this year.

A SPECIAL WEAPON

Through eight games, P **Mac Brown** has averaged 44.6 yards per punt. Nine of Brown's 41 punts this season have been more than 50 yards. Brown, a member of the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List and Ray Guy Award Watch List, only had six punts that surpassed 50 yards last season.

A FORCE IN THE MIDDLE

DT **Benito Jones** leads the Rebels defense with 20 pressures on the season, while also being one of the team's best run defenders up front. Jones' 20 pressures rank sixth among all interior defensive linemen in the SEC. They also represent a new career-high tally for the senior. His previous high of 19 in 2018 came on 309 rushes. His new career high this year has been produced on nearly 100 less pass rushes (215). Against the run, Jones has been very solid. He has earned 11 tackles for loss against the run in 2019, and that ranks T-7th among all SEC interior linemen. He has also tallied five tackles for loss or no gain, and that is tied for sixth best among interior linemen in the conference.

COATNEY A KEY COG IN DEFENSIVE UNIT

DE **Josiah Coatney** is tied with **Benito Jones** for second on the team, with 15 defensive stops on the season. Also like Jones, Coatney has contributed 11 of his defensive stops against the run, tying for seventh best among interior defensive linemen in the SEC. Coatney's 12 total pressures (one sack, 11 huries) rank sixth on the team, but he has an additional 13 wins rushing that passer that did not result in formal pressures. That mark is by far the most on the team and tied with Javon Kinlaw of South Carolina for the most among SEC interior linemen. As far as grading, Coatney owns a 76.8 overall grade through Week 9 and has set himself up with a very good chance to finish with his third straight season of at least a 75.0 overall mark (75.8 in 2017, 82.0 in 2018).



125 SEASONS OF OLE MISS FOOTBALL

This year is the 125th season of football at Ole Miss. The Rebels boast an all-time record of 641-529-35 (.546 winning percentage) after vacated wins. Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.

- 84.5 percent of Ole Miss' offense (2,936 of 3,473 yards) has come from freshmen, the most by any team in the country ... 21 of Ole Miss' 26 touchdowns on the season have come from freshmen.
- QB John Rhys Plumlee's 508 yards rushing on the season are a program record by an Ole Miss freshman QB.
- Plumlee needs just 36 yards to set the Ole Miss single-season rushing record by a quarterback and 104 yards to own the freshman rushing record.
- Plumlee is the only Ole Miss quarterback in school history to rush for 100 yards in three straight contest and the first SEC quarterback to do so since 2010 when Tim Tebow tallied four such games.
- He's the first Power 5 QB to rush for 100+ yards in each of his first three starts since Nebraska's Taylor Martinez and Michigan's Denard Robinson in 2010.
- RB/KR Jerrion Ealy is the first player since 2012 (Jaylen Walton) to record a rushing, receiving and return touchdown in the same season.
- WR **Elijah Moore**'s 49 catches out of the slot rank second in the SEC, third among all Power 5 players, and fifth among all FBS players.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss has forced at least one turnover in seven of its eight games this season.
- The Rebels currently rank 32nd in the NCAA in rushing defense, allowing 124.3 yards per game.
- Ole Miss has held four opponents to under 70 yards rushing this season, including limiting the Vanderbilt to just 62 yards on the ground in the Rebels' win during Week 6.
- In Weeks 2, 3 and 4, the Rebels held their opponents to 61, 66 and 60 yards, respectively. It was the first time since 1999 that Ole Miss had allowed 70 or less rushing yards in three straight games.
- Seven different Rebels have tallied at least one interception in 2019.
- ILB Lakia Henry ranks eighth in the SEC in tackles per game (7.4).
- NT **Benito Jones** ranks fourth in the SEC in tackles for loss (8.0).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- P Mac Brown is averaging 44.6 yards per punt, No. 20 in the NCAA.
- Nine of Brown's 41 punts this season have been more than 50 yards ... He had six punts that surpassed 50 yards last season.
- K Luke Logan leads the Rebels in scoring with 6.4 points per game.
- Logan has made at least one field goal in seven of the eight games this season.
- KR **Jerrion Ealy** ranks No. 1 in the SEC in kick return average (24.9).
- **A.J. Finley** leads the SEC and is No. 8 nationally in fumble recoveries with two ... Both fumble recoveries have come on muffed punts.

MAC BROWN RAISES NEARLY 75K FOR ALS

When he was in seventh grade, Ole Miss punter **Mac Brown** had a modest goal of raising \$500 for a childhood friend's dad who had been diagnosed with ALS. Along with a group of neighborhood friends, Brown started a lemonade stand, Awesome Lemonade Stand, in Eden Prairie, Minnesota, to help his friend's family. Eight years later, that \$500 goal has ballooned to nearly \$75,000 raised by Brown and his friends for ALS research. This year alone, the Awesome Lemonade Stand has raised more than \$21,000 alone, including \$4,500 during the Vanderbilt game when the stand was set up outside Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

After the 2018 campaign, **Matt Luke** found himself in the market for both an offensive and defensive coordinator, and he delivered in a big way. **Mike MacIntyre**, a two-time national coach of the year and coaching veteran with nearly three decades of experience, will take over the reigns as the Rebels' defensive coordinator while **Rich Rodriguez**, considered one of the most innovative offensive minds in college football, will serve as Ole Miss' offensive coordinator. Ole Miss is one of only two teams in the nation, along with Alabama, to have three coaches with Power 5 head coaching experience.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

In the spring, senior DE **Austrian Robinson** became the 29th different Rebel to be awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a standout defensive player each year. The award honors the late **Chucky Mullins**, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Robinson wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

DEGREES IN HAND

Earning a degree from the University of Mississippi is one of the top priorities for Ole Miss student-athletes. Nine current Rebels have already accomplished that goal with eligibility remaining this fall.

HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke was born a Rebel. His family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. Now, he has achieved a lifelong dream by taking over the reins of his alma mater. Ole Miss made it official on Nov. 27, 2017, removing the interim tag and introducing Luke as the 38th head coach in program history.

Headed into his third year at the helm, Luke has bolstered his staff by adding more than 60 years of coaching experience with the addition of new coordinators and former Pac 12 Coach of the Year winners, Mike MacIntyre and Rich Rodriguez. The Gulfport native continued that momentum by assembling a top-25 recruiting class in February.

Luke's 2018 Rebels finished amogst the top 20 nationally in multiple statistical categories including total offense, passing yards per completion, passing efficiency, fumbles lost and defensive touchdowns.

Nine Rebels received invitations to the 2019 NFL Combine, the fourth-most invitees by any school in the country. Six were drafted, which is Ole Miss' most since 1971.

A.J. Brown, earned multiple All-America honors after a season that saw him become Ole Miss' all-time leading receiving in yards, as well as set single-season marks in both receiving yards and receptions. Senior quarterback Jordan Ta'amu led the SEC and ranked fourth nationally with 326.5 yards passing per game. Ta'amu's 3,918 passing yards were second-most on the Ole Miss single-season charts.

Sophomore MoMo Sanogo led the Rebel defense with 112 tackles and became just the second Ole Miss player in the last 12 years to tally 100-plus tackles in a single season.

In his first year at Ole Miss, Luke faced the daunting challenge of taking over the team just a week before 2017 fall camp and responded by helping the Rebels bounce back from a losing season to post a 6-6 record. Ole Miss won three of its final four games, including a 31-28 road victory at Mississippi State to return the Golden Egg to Oxford.

During his 25 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others.

Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), just wrapped up his 11th season as a coach at Ole Miss. Prior to taking over as interim head coach, Luke spent five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), Luke served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

A product of Gulfport High School, Luke lettered four seasons (1995-98) as a center at Ole Miss. A starter in 33 career games for the Rebels, he served as team captain in 1998 as Ole Miss posted a 7-5 ledger and defeated Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. He was named the 1998 Ole Miss Most Valuable Senior by the Jackson (Miss.) Touchdown Club and twice earned Academic All-SEC honors.

Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1999, helping the Rebels to an 8-4 mark with regular-season wins against Auburn, South Carolina, LSU and Arkansas as well as a 27-25 triumph over Oklahoma in the Independence Bowl. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in business administration.

His father, Tommy, was a defensive back at Ole Miss in the 1960s while his brother, Tom, quarterbacked the Rebels from 1989-91. Tom is also on the Ole Miss football staff as assistant athletics director for player development.

Luke is married to the former Ashley Grantham of Oxford, Mississippi, and the couple has two sons, Harrison and Cooper.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Ole Miss football gave itself a chance late at the Liberty Bowl, but an outstanding fourth-quarter punt by Memphis' Andy Williams led to a safety and ultimately quelled a Rebel comeback attempt in the 15-10 defeat.

The Tigers mustered just those two points in the second half as the Landshark defense swarmed all day, holding the home team to just 364 total yards. Scottie Phillips notched the lone touchdown of the day for the Rebel offense early in the fourth quarter, but the comeback just wasn't meant to be as Ole Miss opened the season with a close loss.

The Rebels opened with the football and went three-and-out on their first two possessions. The Landshark defense turned in a three-and-out to start its day as well and was on its way to a stop on the Tigers' second possession, but a pair of costly penalties—a facemask and a roughing the passer call—both against junior outside linebacker Sam Williams, kept the drive alive and led to a Memphis touchdown. Quarterback Brady White drove a head on a QB sneak from one yard out for the game's first score.

The Rebel defense managed to force a punt, but after another Rebel three-and-out, a 21-yard punt return by John Williams gave the Tigers the field position they needed to score once more. Ole Miss nearly held at the goal line, but on 3rd-and-goal from the one, Patrick Taylor punched in the 1-yard score. Riley Patterson's extra point attempt clattered off the right upright, keeping it a 13-0 game just before the half.

Ole Miss broke through to put points on the board late in the third quarter. The Rebels used a heavy dose of Phillips, as well as a 36-yard connection between Corral and Moore to drive to the Memphis 18-yard line, where Logan hit a 35-yard field goal to make it 13-3.

The ground game then led the Rebels to their first touchdown of the season. Corral and Phillips combined to run 38 yards on the drive, while freshman receiver Jonathan Mingo drew a critical pass interference call in his collegiate debut to set up the score. After the flag, Corral scampered for a 15-yard gain down to the Memphis 2-yard line. It took two attempts, but Phillips was able to drive his way in to make it a three-point game, 13-10.

On the following drive, Memphis was able to chip its way across midfield thanks to a 4th-and-1 conversion, but the Landshark defense continued to swarm. On 3rd-and-6 following that conversion, Bivens and Ryder Anderson combined on a sack to force a punt.

Andy Williams' ensuing punt rolled all the way down to the 2-yard line. On the first play of the drive, Corral was sacked in the end zone for a safety, making it 15-10, Memphis. From there, the Tigers were able to drain the clock and hold off the Rebel comeback attempt.

GAME TWO OLE MISS 31, ARKANSAS 17

Sept. 7, 2019 Attendance: 47,915 • Vaught-Hemmingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — A balanced offensive attack and the revamped Ole Miss defense took center stage against Arkansas, powering the Rebels to a 31-17 victory in the 2019 SEC opener at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels (1-1, 1-0 SEC) stymied the Razorbacks to 361 yards of total offense, the fewest allowed by Ole Miss since stifling UT Martin to 334 yards on Sept. 9, 2017. Ole Miss had a superb day on offense as well, tallying 483 yards (246 passing, 237 rushing) behind big days from redshirt freshman quarterback Matt Corral (16-of-24, 246 yards, 2 TD) and senior running back Scottie Phillips (26 carries, 143 yards, 2 TD).

The Landshark defense racked up 10.0 tackles for loss and three sacks, led by Jacquez Jones' nine tackles and 1.5 TFL.

Ole Miss covered 85 yards on 13 plays to open the scoring on its second drive of the game as Corral found Moore for his first touchdown catch of the season from two yards out. Both teams traded field goals in the second quarter, and Ole Miss entered the half up 10-3.

At the end of the third quarter, a nimble 18-yard gain by Octavious Cooley pushed the ball across midfield on the following possession. Phillips would then use a 21-yard burst to reach the one-yard line. He'd punch the ball in on the very next play for a one-yard touchdown, extending the Rebel lead to 17-3.

The Razorbacks stole the momentum right back, though, with a strip and a 73-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown on the next Rebel drive by Kamren Curl, cutting the Rebel lead to 17-10

The Rebels regained a 14-point cushion when Moore caught the ball in space and juked out three defenders for a 46-yard score, giving the Rebels a 24-10 edge.

After yet another excellent effort on the defensive end from Lakia Henry and Charles Wiley, Ole Miss freshman running back Snoop Conner broke through the middle for a 25-yard rush to set Ole Miss up with the ball back. Phillips then scored two plays later on a 25-yard run, carrying two defenders with him into the end zone to give Ole Miss a convincing 31-10 advantage.

Arkansas put together a quick seven-play, 81-yard touchdown drive behind quarterback Nick Starkel with 1:21 left to play, but it was too little, too late as an onside kick attempt went out of bounds to ice the game.

GAME THREE <u>Ole Miss 4</u>0, southeastern Louisiana 29

OXFORD, Miss. — Matt Corral threw for two touchdowns and the Ole Miss defense made a pair of game-saving stops on downs in the final six minutes as the Rebels defeated Southeastern Louisiana 40-29.

Corral finished 21-of-30 for 239 yards and directed a pair of fourth quarter field goal drives that preserved the Ole Miss (2-1) win over the FCS Lions (1-1). Jerrion Ealy added two touchdowns, a 94-yard kickoff return and a 30-yard run, to finish with 273 all-purpose yards.

Ealy's 273 yards from scrimmage eclipsed the Ole Miss all-purpose rookie record (172 kickoff return, 95 rushing, 6 receiving) breaking Dexter McCluster's record of 267 yards set back in 2006

Southeastern Louisiana, trailing 34-29, drove inside the 50-yard line twice in the final period before the drives ended. Virgil Kelly threw for 309 passing yards and two touchdowns on 29-of-44 passing, but was intercepted three times.

The Rebels never trailed but could not break away from the Lions despite rolling up 459 yards of total offense, including a game-high 103 rushing yards by Scottie Phillips. Corral threw touchdown passes of 9 and 5 yards to Elijah Moore and Jason Pellerin, respectively.

Kelly threw touchdown passes of 45 and 5 yards to Juwan Petit-Frere and Bransen Schwebel, respectively, in the third guarter to pull the Lions within 34-29.

The consistency of Phillips was complemented by continued improvement of Corral and the big-play versatility of true freshman Ealy. Defensively, the Rebels struggled, but made enough big plays - three interceptions, a fumble recovery and two late stops on fourth down - and Luke Loqan added fourth-quarter field goals of 22 and 32 yards to seal it.

A loss to an SEC team did nothing to hurt the reputation of a solid FCS program from a strong conference, the Southland. The Lions rallied from a 17-point deficit in the third quarter and were more than competitive throughout. Devonte Williams finished with 206 all-purpose yards, but was limited in the final period.

OXFORD, Miss. — A valiant fourth-quarter comeback attempt fell just short for the Ole Miss football team to allow No. 23 Cal to escape with a 28-20 victory at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday.

Ole Miss (2-2, 1-0 SEC) was mere feet away from tying the game on its final drive. A two-yard Elijah Moore catch and a John Rhys Plumlee sneak were both called short of the goal line as time expired in the fourth.

Quarterback Chase Garbers powered the Cal offense (4-0, 1-0 PAC-12) with 357 yards passing, four touchdown tosses and one interception. The Rebels struggled to stop the Golden Bears through the air, but held Cal to 60 yards rushing. It was the third straight game Ole Miss held its opponent to under 100 yards on the ground, the longest streak since 2008.

For the Rebels, Matt Corral went 22-for-41, tallying 266 passing yards. He also ran for a team-high 56 yards and a rushing touchdown before exiting the game with an injury late in the fourth quarter. Elijah Moore was Corral's primary target, catching 11 passes for 102 yards.

Lakia Henry was everywhere on defense, racking up a career-high 11 tackles. The defense totaled four tackles for loss, including three sacks.

After Corral went down, Plumlee entered and immediately put a charge in the Rebel offense, running the ball 47 yards on his first career snap. Jerrion Ealy cut up the middle and scored, cutting the deficit to 28-20.

With Cal at midfield needing just two yards on two snaps, the defense held with back-to-back stops to give the offense the ball back with 2:45 left. Plumlee completed six straight passes to help Ole Miss march down the field, including an outstanding 43-yard leaping snag by Gregory to setup a first-and-goal situation.

Two rushing plays led to third down where Plumlee found Moore. Moore was called just short of the goal line with the clock under 10 seconds. With no timeouts left, Plumlee attempted a quarterback sneak on 4th-and-inches, but was stuffed short of the line as time expired.

GAME FIVE #2 Alabama 59, OLE MISS 31

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Ole Miss football became the first team to hold a lead over No. 2 Alabama so far this season, but the lead didn't last long as the Crimson Tide followed a career day by receiver DeVonta Smith to a 59-31 victory at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

It was a strong offensive day for Ole Miss. The Rebels racked up 476 yards of total offense, including 279 yards rushing—the most given up by an Alabama team since 2011. With Matt Corral sidelined with a rib injury, freshman John Rhys Plumlee made his first career start at quarterback and amassed 250 yards of total offense, including a team-high 109 on the ground. Plumlee notched one rushing score in addition to two through the air.

Defensively, the Rebels struggled to slow the explosive Alabama passing attack, but they were solid against the rush, holding the Crimson Tide below their season average with just 155 rushing vards allowed.

Ole Miss held a three-point lead through the end of the first quarter, but the second quarter was all Tide. Alabama exploded for 31 points in the second frame to make it a 38-10 game at the half.

The second half was back-and-forth, and included Ole Miss touchdowns from a trio of freshmen. Plumlee threw the first two Rebel touchdowns of the second half to Jerrion Ealy for nine-yards and Jonathan Mingo for 26 yards.

Fellow freshman quarterback Grant Tisdale entered the game late to make his collegiate debut. He hit Jadon Jackson for a 28-yard score with just five seconds remaining, the first career touchdown for both Tisdale and Jackson.

GAME SIX OLE MISS 31, VANDERBILT 6

Oct. 5, 2019 Attendance: 47,601 • Vaught-Hemmingway • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. - A dominant rushing and defensive performance propelled the Ole Miss football team to a 31-6 Homecoming victory over Vanderbilt at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Ole Miss (3-3, 2-1 SEC) ground attack racked up 413 yards, the most against an SEC opponent since racking up 443 against Vanderbilt in 1979. The defense gave up the fewest points since 2015 (Texas A&M, 3) and stayed off the field, holding Vanderbilt (1-4, 0-3 SEC) to 2-for-17 on third downs and 0-11 on third down attempts from seven yards or longer.

John Rhys Plumlee ran for 165 yards and a score. He also connected on 10-of-18 passes for 99 yards. Jerrion Ealy and Snoop Conner each added long touchdown runs of 78 and 84 yards on consecutive drives, respectively, the first time in Ole Miss history that the Rebels have recorded runs of 75 yards or more in the same game.

Lakia Henry tallied a career-high 15 tackles and added one of three sacks for the Landshark defense, which also racked up nine tackles for loss for the fourth time this season.

The Rebel offense opened with a strong drive courtesy of a 54-yard rush by Plumlee which set up a field goal to give Ole Miss a 3-0 early advantage.

The Rebel defense took advantage of the miscue and came away with a quick three-and-out, allowing just two yards on the drive. Ole Miss took over at the Vanderbilt 44, and it took just three plays for Plumlee to dash 33 yards into the end zone to make it a 10-0 Rebel lead.

The Commodores got on the board early in the second after a 43-yard connection between Riley Neal and Kalija Lipscomb which set up a 22-yard Ryley Guay field goal.

Vanderbilt tacked on three more points just before the break after the Rebels failed to convert on fourth down at the Vanderbilt 38. Neal found Ke'Shawn Vaughn and Ben Bresnahan for a couple of big gains to set up a 43-yard Guay field goal to make it 10-6 at the half.

After a stop by the Rebel defense, Ealy broke free for a 78-yard touchdown two plays into the ensuing drive. Ole Miss scored again when Conner outran the Vanderbilt defense for an 84-yard score, the first of his career that pushed the Rebel lead to 24-6.

The Rebels got on the board again when Scottie Phillips cut up the middle for a 24-yard rushing score with 4:29 left to play, giving Ole Miss its final 31-6 edge.

COLUMBIA, Mo. — A few missed opportunities and self-inflicted miscues spelled the difference Saturday night as Ole Miss (3-4, 2-2) fell 38-27 to Missouri (5-1, 2-0) at Memorial Stadium.

Missouri followed a strong night by quarterback Kelly Bryant, who threw for 329 yards and a touchdown. Larry Rountree paced the Tigers on the ground with 126 yards and two scores on 21 carries. Johnathan Johnson totaled 110 yards on eight receptions to lead the Mizzou receiving corps.

John Rhys Plumlee led the offensive effort for Ole Miss, throwing for 103 yards and two touchdowns, while adding 143 yards and another pair of touchdowns on the ground. Matt Corral had a strong night through the air, going 10-of-16 for 133 yards passing. Elijah Moore led the Rebel receiving effort with 102 yards and a touchdown on eight receptions.

Ole Miss was stopped on the game's opening drive, but Mizzou's Johnson muffed the ensuing punt, and A.J. Finley pounced on the loose ball to send the Rebel offense back on the field. The Rebels made the most of it as Plumlee hit Scottie Phillips for a 21-yard score through the air, the first scoring reception of the season for Phillips.

Missouri scored the next nine points, which prompted a QB change for Ole Miss. The Rebels then went with Corral at quarterback and quickly carved through the Mizzou defense all the way inside the 1-yard line. However, the Tigers walled off the end zone, stopping the Rebels on 3rd-and-goal, then 4th-and-goal from the 1-yard line to keep it a 12-7 game at the break.

A dissastorous third quarter for Ole Miss saw the Rebels outscored 23-7 in the frame, bringing the score to 35-24 entering the final quarter. Ole Miss was unable to pull off the comeback and ultimately fell 38-27.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss eclipsed 200 rushing yards for the fourth consecutive game, but timing was of the essence as key momentum shifts played a critical role in a 24-17 loss to Texas A&M on a foggy Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Rebels (3-5, 2-3 SEC) ran for 250 yards (the most given up by Texas A&M this season) and the Ole Miss defense kept the game close, but a timely Aggie defense forced a game-defining 62-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown by Buddy Johnson in the third quarter that ended up being the difference.

Neither offense could muster much on third down, going a combined 7-of-29, but Texas A&M (4-3, 2-2 SEC) used a near nine-minute advantage in time of possession (34:07-25:53) and some favorable second-half field position to hold the tug-of-war in its favor.

Both Ole Miss quarterbacks saw playing time, with Matt Corral finishing 10-of-17 for 124 yards while John Rhys Plumlee tacked on 70 yards of total offense. Freshmen running backs Jerrion Ealy (six carries, 80 yards, 1 TD) and Snoop Conner (five carries, 52 yards, 1 TD) added scores for the Rebel offense, while Scottie Phillips chipped in 67 yards on the ground. All three Rebel backs had runs of at least 36 yards long.

Lakia Henry was the top Rebel tackler yet again with nine stops, while Sam Williams recorded five tackles, including 1.5 sacks. The Rebels finished with two interceptions and have now recorded a turnover in seven games this year.

It was a one-score game the whole way before Texas A&M would eventually cushion its lead to 24-14 with 2:34 left after a 22-yard touchdown run by Isaiah Spiller. But Ole Miss kept it interesting with two fourth down conversions on the next drive that led to a 35-yard Luke Logan field goal with 26 seconds to play to cut the Aggie lead to 24-17. Logan received a favorable bounce on the ensuing onside kick, but the ball was batted out of bounds, thus sealing the Texas A&M victory.
