### **FOOTBALL TRAVELS TO ALABAMA**

>> The Auburn Tigers (5-6, 2-5 SEC) visit the Alabama Crimson Tide (9-2, 5-2 SEC) on Saturday, November 26, at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa for the annual Iron Bowl. CBS will televise the 2:30 p.m. CT contest that concludes the regular season for both squads.

### **SERIES HISTORY**

- » In this 87th Iron Bowl, Auburn and Alabama will meet for the 75th consecutive year since 1948. Auburn trails the overall series by a 37-48-1 record. Auburn leads the Iron Bowl 17-12 when the game is played on campus and leads 7-6 in games played in Tuscaloosa. Before 1989, the series was primarily played in Birmingham (Alabama leads 36-20-1) and Montgomery (series tied 2-2).
- » Auburn has an all-time record of 53-69-7 in regular-season finales since 1892. The Tigers are 52-70-7 all-time in the final game of the regular season played away from Auburn.
- >> In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 335-267-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 144-66-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-200-12 overall.

### IN NOVEMBER

Auburn is 245-191-20 (.558) all-time in November. Auburn's November home record is 107-40-5 (.721). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 139-150-15 (.484).

Auburn is 3-10-2 in games played on November 26 all-time; the Tigers are 2-7 against SEC opponents and 3-9-2 in games played away from Auburn on that date.

### KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Colby Wooden was SEC defensive lineman of the week with a 10-yard fourth-quarter strip sack and forced fumble in the Texas A&M win
- » Robby Ashford rushed for 108 yards and two scores at Mississippi State, the first Auburn quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a game since Nick Marshall at Mississippi State in 2014.

Ashford also ranks third in the SEC and 14th nationally in passing yards per completion, averaging 13.71 yards per reception.

- Auburn is third in the SEC in net punting at 42.13 yards, ranking 10th nationally. Punter Oscar Chapman ranks third in the SEC in average (43.9) this season
- » Butkus Award semifinalist Owen Pappoe now has 246 career tackles to his credit, 11thbest among all Auburn players since 2000; his career high was 16 at Ole Miss this season

- >> Tank Bigsby has cracked the Auburn career rushing top 10. The junior now ranks seventh with 2,845 career yards and 23 career rushing scores. His eight 30+-yard rushes lead the SEC this year
- >> John Samuel Shenker holds the Auburn career record appearing in 61 career games
- >> Team captain Derick Hall, a Jason Witten Man of the Year Award semifinalist, has recorded 58 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 6.0 sacks, an interception, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and six QB hurries this season
- Placekicker Anders Carlson is the only FBS player selected for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for efforts in community service and also as a finalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, awarded to the top student-athlete in college football

### **STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE:** ACADEMICS

#### THE GRADUATES

» On the 2022 Auburn roster, 17 players (second most in the SEC) have already received bachelor's degrees: Marcus Bragg (Western Kentucky), Nick Brahms; Marquis Burks; Zach Calzada (Texas A&M); Anders Carlson; Brandon Council (Akron); Luke Deal; Alec Jackson; Shedrick Jackson; Morris Joseph Jr. (Memphis); Eku Leota (Northwestern); Barton Lester; Jacob Quattlebaum; John Samuel Shenker; Kameron Stutts; Austin Troxell; and Kilian Zierer.

### **COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA**

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms earned 2021 CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors, only the second time that Auburn has had two first-team honorees in the prestigious program, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes. LB Gregg Carr and K/P Matt Hawkins were both first-team honorees in 1984. Carlson, a 2020 first team Academic All-American, is just the second two-time honoree in Auburn history, along with Hawkins (1984-85). Carlson graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and has since completed his MBA. Brahms graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.89 GPA in professional flight management and also completed his MBA.

### **SEC HONOR ROLLS**

There were 43 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2021 season, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Tank Bigsby, Jackson Billings, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Sammy Cohen, Luke Deal, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Alec Jackson, Tate Johnson, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Jake Levant, Trey Lindsey, Trent Mason, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith, Sawyer Pate, Jacob Quattlebaum, John Samuel Shenker, Wesley Steiner, Jeremiah Wright and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These students are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had six representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Cort Bradley, Jarquez Hunter, Donovan Kaufman, Kyle Vaccarella and Garrison Walker.

### **AD HONOR ROLL**

» Undergraduates earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 17 players honored in 2021-22, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Jackson Billings, Cort Bradley, Oscar Chapman, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Jarquez Hunter, Jackson Kelly, Jake Levant, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith and Kyle Vaccarella.

### **TOTAL OFFENSE**

Auburn has scored in 128 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 31.11 ppg (3,982 total points) during that stretch. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

The longest streak of not being shut out in program history is 149 games, beginning with a 55-16 victory over Richmond on Oct. 4, 1980, in Doug Barfield's final season as the Tigers' head coach and lasting until the final game of Pat Dye's 12-year tenure as Auburn head coach when the Tigers lost 17-0 to No. 2 Alabama in the 1992 Iron Bowl.

y Junior tailback Tank Bigsby posted the second-highest rushing total of his career with 179 yards on 20 carries at Ole Miss, including TDs of 50 (career long) and 2 yards.

Bigsby got his 2022 campaign off to a productive start with 147 rushing yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns in the season opener against Mercer. He added 121 yards rushing in the win over Texas A&M.

The 19th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 2,000 career yards, he ranks seventh with 2,845 career yards and 24 career rushing scores (eighth all-time at Auburn). Bigsby's 13 career 100-yard rushing games are tied for third in program history.

With 1,099 yards last season, Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games of 2021.

In 2020, Bigsby was the SEC Freshman of the Year; his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. He was the first Tiger to average 6.0 yds/carry since James Bostic in 1993. >> Current players' 100-yard rushing games: **Tank Bigsby (13):** 192, Mississippi St, 2020

>> Jarquez Hunter opened his sophomore campaign by rushing for three touchdowns on only eight carries against Mercer. It was Hunter's first career game with multiple rushing TDs. Hunter's three rushing scores against the Bears matched his total in 13 games as a freshman.

He was the first Auburn player to rush for three TD since JaTarvious Whitlow against Mississippi State in 2019.

Hunter (3 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) and Bigsby (2 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) were the first Auburn teammates to rush for multiple touchdowns in the same game since Whitlow and Joey Gatewood each rushed for a pair of scores against Kent State in 2019.

Hunter added another rushing score against San Jose' State and scored his first receiving touchdown of the season on a 22-yard throw from Robby Ashford against Penn State.

At Georgia, Hunter's 62-yard touchdown reception from Robby Ashford was the Tigers' longest play of the season to date. His rushing scores against Arkansas and Mississippi State give him six rushing scores this season, along with two touchdown catches.

Hunter's 121 rushing yards in the win over Texas A&M were second-most of his career and he added 109 against Western Kentucky for hs fourth career 100-yard game.

Hunter now has 1,135 career rushing yards to rank 43rd among all Auburn career rushers.

He is the first Auburn running back with a 60+yard reception since Harold Joiner recorded a 78-yard reception from Bo Nix against Ole Miss in 2019 and the only Tiger running back with multiple 60+-yard receptions in a season since at least 1996.

And he added his first career TD pass against Western Kentucky, a 20-yard completion to Koy Moore.

» Robby Ashford ranks third in the SEC and 13th nationally in passing yards per completion, averaging 13.71 yards per reception.

Ashford and Georgia State's Darren Grainger (10 20-yard runs and 4 20-yard runs) are the only FBS quarterbacks with at least eight 20-yard runs and four 50-yard passes.

- >> Ashford threw for 285 yards and a TD on 24-33 passes and added 87 yards on 19 carries against Arkansas. Ashford now has two of the top seven passing performances by a freshman in Auburn history (also LSU, 337 yards) and he joins Bo Nix as the only Tiger freshman quarterbacks to have two 260+-yard passing performances against SEC opponents.
- Ashford rushed for 108 yards and two scores at Mississippi State, the first Auburn quarterback to rush for 100 yards since Nick Marshall (100) at Mississippi State in 2014.
- Among Auburn freshman career records, Ashford now ranks third in passing yardage (1,531), third in pass attempts (227), third in pass completions (112), fifth in rushing TD (5), fourth in TD passes (5), and 10th in rushing yardage (589).
- Tight end John Samuel Shenker is the Auburn recordholder for career catches by a tight end with 68, passing Cooper Wallace (63 catches from 2002-05).

Shenker is also second in career tight end receiving yardage at 779, behind only Wallace (829 yards).

Shenker's 33 catches during the 2021 campaign set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season. His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn TE season record.

Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU last season was the first 100yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times last season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had five catches this season at Georgia.

Junior Ja'Varrius Johnson led Auburn with 117 yards on four receptions in the Tigers' season-opening win over Mercer. It was Johnson's second career 100-yard receiving game (107 yards vs. Mississippi State in 2021).

Johnson's 117 receiving yards were the most by an Auburn player since Anthony Schwartz finished with 123 yards and a TD on four catches against LSU in 2020. The last Auburn 100-yard receiver was Shedrick Jackson (111) last season at South Carolina.

Johnson, who scored the Tigers' lone touchdown against Texas A&M on a 16-yard pass from Robby Ashford, ranks second in the SEC in yards per reception (18.92).

y> Ja'Varrius Johnson now has 44 career receptions for 747 yards. Shedrick Jackson now has 64 career receptions for 848 yards.

#### FOR THE DEFENSE

With a team-best eight tackles at Georgia, Butkus Award semifinalist Owen Pappoe became the 17th Auburn player since 2000 with more than 200 career tackles.

Pappoe now has 246 career stops and leads the Tigers with 82 tackles this year; his career high came against Ole Miss this season with 16 stops.

>> The number of career games current players have led the team in tackles:

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 29 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 77 games.

Auburn has held the opponent scoreless in the first quarter in seven of 11 games this season.

The Tigers held Texas A&M scoreless in the first half, the first shutout for a first half since the 2021 Alabama game.

- » Prior to allowing a 1-yard rushing TD against San Jose' State, Auburn had held its opponents without a rushing touchdown in six straight games dating back through the 2021 season, the longest such streak for the Tigers since not allowing a rushing TD in eight straight games during 2016.
- "Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play in the overtime win against Missouri. Hall had three tackles for loss, two sacks, a 39-yard interception and six tackles overall in the 17-14 Auburn victory. He also earned Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week honors and was a Lott IMPACT Trophy player of the week finalist.

Hall, who is a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Man of the Year Award and was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award mid-season watch list, has 56 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 6.0 sacks,

an interception, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery this season.

>> Hall has 18.5 career sacks, all in his last 30 games dating back to the middle of 2020.

Hall recorded six tackles, 3.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks and registered his first career interception against Missouri, the first Auburn player with a sack and INT in the same game since Smoke Monday in the 2019 Iron Bowl.

Hall is third in the SEC with 6.0 sacks and 10.0 TFL this season. Hall has 28.5 career tackles for loss and 145 career tackles.

Colby Wooden is seventh in the SEC with 55.0 sacks and 9.5 TFL. Wooden has 152 career tackles, 15.0 career sacks and 30.0 career TFL.

Eku Leota, who recorded at least one tackle for a loss in five straight games dating back to the final game of 2021 (6.0 TFL during streak), has 15.0 TFL and 9.0 sacks during his Auburn career. Adding two seasons at Northwestern, he has 25.0 TFL and 15.5 sacks.

Nineteen Auburn defenders have had a hand in at least one TFL this season; 12 have sacks to their credit.

- Colby Wooden was named SEC defensive lineman of the week with a 10-yard fourth-quarter strip sack and forced fumble in the Texas A&M win.
- Linebacker Cam Riley's 16 tackles against Mercer were a career high; the junior led the team in tackles for the first time in his career. Riley had the most tackles by an Auburn player since Zakoby McClain had 17 tackles against Texas A&M in 2020.
- » Auburn is 66-32 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 40-11 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 13-16 when it fails to force a turnover.

>> The Ole Miss game was the first time since the 2020 Georgia game (Jamien Sherwood 14, Jordyn Peters 13, K.J. Britt 12, Zakoby McClain 11) four Auburn players registered double-digit tackles: Owen Pappoe (16), Donovan Kaufman (11), Derick Hall (10), Wesley Steiner (10).

### N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 26-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being D.J. James' interception vs. Western Kentucky.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

>> Punter Oscar Chapman ranks third in the SEC in average (43.9) this season and has 12 kicks of 50+ yards.

Chapman averaged 45.9 yards on eight punts against Missouri, including a 61-yard boot that was his longest kick of the season. He was recognized as one of Ray's 8 by the Ray Guy Award for that performance, and received the same Ray's 8 recognition vs. LSU, with a 46.2-yard average on four punts.

He also received Ray's 8 honors for his work at Ole Miss, averaging 49.3 yards on three punts with a long kick of 57 yards.

Chapman had a season-high nine punts at Georgia, averaging 44.7 yards with a long kick of 56 yards.

Auburn ranks third in the SEC in net punting at 42.13 yards, ranking 10th nationally.

- >> Freshman Alex McPherson is 4-5 this season on field goal attempts. His 51-yarder against Western Kentucky was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2019. McPherson became Auburn's first freshman kicker to make a 50+ yarder since Anders Carlson did so twice in 2018.
- Neionte Scott ranks third in the SEC with an 11.2-yard punt return average, ranking 11th nationally.
- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (177) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- >> Auburn has seven field goal blocks and nine punt blocks since the start of 2016.
- >> Kicker Anders Carlson ranks second in Auburn career scoring with 410 points. A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is third in career PAT made (173) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (79).

He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT in 2021, including a career-long

string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

Carlson ranks fifth in SEC career scoring (410), fifth in SEC career field goals made (79) and 11th in SEC career PAT.

- Carlson, whose older brother Daniel (a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist) holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders, had five career FG of at least 50 yards:

With 884 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the alltime leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

- Carlson, a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American, is also one of 15 finalists for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy. Celebrating its 33rd year, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.
- Team captains for the 2022 season are defensive lineman Derick Hall, linebacker Owen Pappoe and tight end John Samuel Shenker.

Pappoe, also a 2021 captain, is the fourth two-time captain in Auburn annals, along with Reese Dismukes (2013-14), Gusty Yearout (1966-67) and Curtis Kuykendall (1944-45).

>> Since 2001, Auburn is 164-36 (.820) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 220-44-1 (.833) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 560-64-9 (.892) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 352-12 (.967) when scoring 30 points, 178-3 (.984) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

Auburn has outscored its last three opponents 57-19 in the second half since Carnell Williams became interim head coach after being outscored 121-78 in the second half in the first

eight games. In the last three games, the Tigers have outgained opponents 544-333 in the second half (450-53 on the ground).

- Auburn has an all-time record of 343-91-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .786 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally. There have been 63 capacity crowds of 87,451 since seating was increased in 2004, the latest vs. Penn State, LSU and Texas A&M this season.
- >> In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 260-71-6 (.783). Before the Penn State game, Auburn had won 17 straight home games against nonconference opponents dating back to 2016.
- On the current Auburn roster, 51 players have at least one college start to their credit, 29 on offense and 24 on defense.

### THE LAST TIME VS. ALABAMA ALABAMA 24, AUBURN 22 (4 OT)

>> Auburn kept No. 3 Alabama out of the end zone until the final minute before falling 24-22 in quadruple overtime at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Iron Bowl.

Bryce Young's two-point pass to John Metchie accounted for the winning points in the fourth OT.

The first OT in Iron Bowl history began with Alabama's 6-yard TD pass from Young to Slade Bolden to give the Crimson Tide its first lead of the at 17-10.

Auburn answered when Landen King scored with a one-handed catch of T.J. Finley's 5-yard pass to tie at 17-17 after Ben Patton's extra point.

Patton delivered again in the second OT, giving Auburn a 20-17 lead with a 49-yard field goal.

Will Reichard's 38-yard field goal sent the game to a third extra period with a 20-20 tie.

In the third overtime, a one-play shootout from the 3-yard line under new NCAA rules, Young hit Metchie for a 22-20 lead but Auburn answered when Finley rolled right and tossed back to his left to John Samuel Shenker to tie it at 22-22, sending the game to the decisive fourth OT.

Silencing Alabama's explosive offense that averaged 44 points per game, Auburn made five sacks in the first half and held the Crimson Tide to minus-2 yards rushing while pitching a shutout.

Auburn took advantage of a short field by driving 39 yards in four plays for the only TD of the first half.

On third-and-14, Finley threw a back-shoulder pass to Demetris Robertson for 29 yards, Auburn's longest gain of the game.

On the next play, Finley found Kobe Hudson in the slot 2 yards behind the line of scrimmage. Hudson faked out one defender and outraced another to the end zone for a 15-yard touchdown that put the Tigers ahead 7-0 with 6:50 left in the first half.

The Tigers kept up the defensive pressure in the second half, forcing a three-and-out on Alabama's opening possession. Marcus Harris sacked Young on returned 19 yards to Alabama's 21-yard line.

Patton's 33-yard field goal gave Auburn a 10-0 lead with 11:43 remaining in the third quarter.

Alabama's next drive ended when Bydarrius Knighten intercepted Young at Alabama's 45.

On their next possession, the visitors drove to Auburn's 19, but a mishandled hold denied Alabama a chance to attempt a 36-yard field goal, preserving the Tigers' 10-0 lead after three quarters.

After Derick Hall ended Alabama's next possession with a sack on fourth-and-2, the Crimson Tide intercepted Auburn's deflected pass on the next play at Alabama's 42-yard line.

Alabama drove to Auburn's 7, but Hall made another sack on third-and-goal, forcing a 30-yard field goal at the 8:44 mark of the fourth quarter. Hall recorded three of Auburn's seven sacks, a career best.

Tank Bigsby rushed for 22 yards to start Auburn's next drive, which ended when Shedrick Jackson downed Oscar Chapman's punt on Alabama's 2-yard line.

After driving to their own 46, Alabama went for it fourth-and-1, but the Tigers stopped running back Trey Sanders for no gain.

After Alabama used its remaining timeouts to stop the clock, Chapman and Jackson again pinned the Crimson Tide at their 3-yard line with 1:35 to play.

Alabama drove 97 yards on 12 plays, scoring the game-tying touchdown with 24 seconds left on Young's 28-yard pass to Ja'Corey Brooks, sending the game to overtime.

Colby Wooden led Auburn with 11 tackles. Zakoby McClain and Roger McCreary made seven tackles each while McCreary added four of the Tigers' seven pass breakups.

The Tigers stopped Alabama 14 times on 22 third-down attempts and held the Crimson Tide to 1-of-4 on fourth down.

- Carnell 'Cadillac' Williams was named the interim head football coach on October 31, 2022. Williams is in his fourth season as the Tigers' running backs coach.
- >> As a player at Auburn, Williams helped lead the Tigers to an undefeated season in 2004 while earning All-America honors that year. He helped guide the Tigers to one of the best seasons in program history, winning an SEC Championship en route to a perfect 13-0 season and a Sugar Bowl victory. He led Auburn in rushing with 1,165 yards and 12 touchdowns while tallying 1,718 all-purpose yards.
- He was was the 2004 SEC Special Teams Player of the Year, and named to the All-SEC team.
- >> In his four seasons at Auburn, Williams earned nine SEC Player of the Week honors, the most in league history. During his time on the Plains, the Tigers were 37-14 and won three SEC Western Division titles (2001, '02, '04).
- >> A native of Gadsden, Alabama, Williams finished his Auburn career | **BOWL EXPERIENCE** (2001-04) with 3,831 yards on 741 attempts with 45 touchdowns. He broke the Auburn career record of most running attempts, passing Joe Cribbs, and most touchdowns scored, passing Bo Jackson, while finishing second in total rushing yards and all-purpose yards.
- He remains as Auburn's No. 2 all-time rushing and is the Tigers' career leader in rushing attempts and rushing touchdowns.
- >> The fifth pick overall pick of the 2005 NFL draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Williams was named the NFL Rookie of the Year after leading all | NFL EXPERIENCE rookies in rushing yards with 1,178, while posting six 100-yard rushing games in 14 starts. Williams spent six seasons with Tampa Bay before spending his final season in 2011 with the St. Louis Rams.

- Williams finished his NFL career with 4,038 yards with 21 touchdowns and 148 receptions for 1,002 yards and four scores.
- Under Williams' tutelage as a coach, running back Tank Bigsby has posted a 1,000-yard rushing season and was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Year and Associated Press SEC Newcomer of the Year after leading all freshmen in the conference with 834 rushing yards in 2020.
- Bigsby rushed for 1,099 yards and 10 touchdowns during his sophomore campaign in 2021, while then-freshman Jarguez Hunter gained 593 yards.
- During his first season in 2019, the Tigers posted five 100-yard rushing games. D.J. Williams earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors for his performance against LSU.
- Williams' backs have tallied 11 100-yard games and four SEC weekly honors.



Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 432 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 343, losing 91 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .785 against some of the best teams in college football.

After lightning delayed Auburn's season opener for 90 minutes in the third quarter. Tank Bigsby provided his own lightning strike, racing 39 yards for a touchdown on the first play after the game resumed

Generating explosive plays on the ground and in the air, Auburn kicked off the 2022 season by defeating Mercer 42-16 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The big-play Tigers produced seven plays of 20 yards or more

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its first five drives with Jarquez Hunter scoring the season's first points on a 19-yard run on the Tigers' first drive.

Auburn gained 88 yards in two plays on its second possession on a 49-yard run by quarterback Robby Ashford and a 39-yard pass from T.J. Finley to Ja'Varrius Johnson. Auburn made it 14-0 on Finley's 2-yard touchdown pass to John Samuel

Hunter's 2-yard touchdown put the Tigers on top 21-0 early in the second quarter with 84,562 in attendance. Bigsby, who led Auburn with 147 rushing yards on 16 carries, scored on a 2-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 28-0 lead with 5:04 remaining in the first half.

Mercer capitalized on an Auburn interception to score on a 5-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left in the half.

Derick Hall recorded a third-down sack to force a punt in the third quarter. Ashford threw a 56-yard pass to Johnson to

set up Hunter's third touchdown, a 1-yarder that gave Auburn a 35-7 lea'd before lightning within eight miles of Pat Dye Field delayed the game late in the third quarter.

The Bears added nine fourth-quarter points on a field goal and a touchdown with 25 seconds remaining

Linebacker Cam Riley led Auburn with a career-high 15 tackles, exceeding his 2021 season total of 14.

Johnson made four receptions for 117 yards, averaging 29.3 yards per catch.
Ashford, a redshirt freshman, produced 168 yards of total offense, completing 4-of-7 passes for 100 yards while rushing for 68 yards on six carries.

In a most improbable ending, Cayden Bridges recovered a fumble in the end zone after Anders Carlson kicked a field goal to give Auburn a 17-14 overtime victory Saturday on Homecoming at Jordan-Hare Stadium

After Carlson connected from 39 yards on the opening possession of OT, Missouri's Nathanial Peat raced 20 yards but fumbled while reaching for the goal line, with Bridges recovering in the back of the end zone to secure Auburn's victory.

With a minute and half remaining in the fourth quarter, Missouri stopped Auburn on fourth-and-1 at the visiting Tigers'

29-yard-line, then hit a 39-yard pass play to Auburn's 3-yard line, but Mizzou missed a 26-yard field goal as time expired, sending the game to overtime tied 14-14.

After Colby Wooden's sack forced a three-and-out on the game's opening possession, the Tigers turned back the clock

with a 14-play, all rush, touchdown drive that consumed nearly half of the first quarter with 85,750 enjoying a sunny fall afternoon at Pat Dye Field. Tank Bigsby twice moved the chains on fourth-and-short, and first-time starter Robby Ashford scored on an 11-yard quar-

terback draw, his first career rushing TD for a 7-0 Auburn lead.

Derick Hall produced Auburn's first takeaway of the season, intercepting a deflected pass and returning it 19 yards to Missouri's 24-yard-line. Ashford connected with Omari Kelly for 12 yards on third-and-6, then completed to Camden Brown to set up Bigsby's

3-yard touchdown run to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead late in the first quarter. Koy Moore led Auburn with 74 receiving yards on four catches.

Missouri evened the score in the second quarter, scoring on a 9-yard rush to cap 54-yard drive and a Brady Cook quarterback sneak on fourth-and-goal from inside the 1-yard line with 30 seconds left in the half after a 79-yard drive. Auburn forced five three-and-outs in the second half while shutting out Missouri after the second quarter.

Auburn was plus-two on turnovers thanks to Hall's interception and Bridges' game-ending fumble recovery.

Robby Ashford's career passing night helped Auburn build a 17-point lead but LSU forced three fourth-quarter turnovers

to beat the Tigers 21-17 Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Trailing by four points with five minutes left in the fourth quarter, Donovan Kaufman forced a fumble that Jayson Jones recovered on Auburn's 32-yard line. Needing a touchdown to take the lead, Tank Bigsby rushed for 23 yards across midfield for a promising start to a potential game-winning drive. Jarquez Hunter then picked up a first down at LSÚ's 35, but the Tigers would get no closer. LSU's Greg Brooks Jr. made the Bengal Tigers' fourth takeaway, intercepting Ashford's pass and returning it 30 yards to Auburn's 45. LSU (4-1, 2-0) picked up a first down and ran out the clock

Leading 17-14 at the half, Auburn forced a three-and-out to start the second half, but LSU stopped the Tigers on fourth down and drove 63 yards on seven plays to take a 21-17 lead on John Emery Jr.'s 20-yard run with 3:32 left in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, Auburn drove 65 yards to LSU's 5-yard line, but on second-and-goal from the 10, LSU inter-

cepted Koy Moore's reverse pass, Auburn's second turnover. A muffed punt with 5:31 left in the game accounted for Auburn's third turnover.

Auburn built a 17-0 first-half lead with Ashford throwing for 247 yards and two touchdowns.

The Tigers scored on the opening drive by twice converting on third down, first with Ashford finding Moore for 10 yards on third-and-6, then scrambling and hitting Ja'Varrius Johnson for a 53-yard touchdown to put Auburn up 7-0 in the first two

Late in the opening quarter, LSU's punt pinned Auburn at its 1-yard line but the Tigers drove 99 yards on six plays to take a 14-0 lead. Ashford escaped LSU's pass rush and threw to Jarquez Hunter, who raced 40 yards after the catch for a 61-yard gain. On the next play, freshman Camden Brown leaped in the end zone to snag Ashford's pass for his first career touchdown. Ashford finished with 337 yards and two TDs, completing 19-of-38 passes.

Auburn extended its lead to 17-0 on Anders Carlson's 29-yard field goal with 9:38 remaining in the first half.

LSU scored a defensive touchdown midway through the second quarter when Jay Ward recovered a fumble and returned it 23 yards to trim Auburn's lead to 17-7.

The Bengal Tigers made it 17-14 with 15 seconds left in the half when quarterback Jayden Daniels scored on a 1-yard run to

cap an 11-play, 77-yard drive.

Wesley Steiner led Auburn's defense with a career-high 11 tackles. The Tigers held LSU to 270 yards of total offense, including 10-for-26 passing for 85 yards. Colby Wooden, Marcus Bragg and Derick Hall each recorded sacks. Hall and Wooden each made two of Auburn's eight tackles for loss.

Tank Bigsby and Jarquez Hunter both surpassed the 100-yard mark for the second straight week and Auburn shut out Western Kentucky in the second half to lead the Tigers to a 41-17 Senior Day victory Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Tied 17-17 at the half, Auburn outscored the Hilltoppers 24-0 in the second half, putting the game out of reach on D.J. James' 22-yard interception return for a touchdown with 6:15 to play.

Jaylin Simpson recorded the first of two Auburn turnovers, intercepting a pass to end Western Kentucky's first drive of the second half

After the teams exchanged punts, Bigsby rushed twice for 20 yards, then Robby Ashford faked a jet sweep pitch and threw deep to Ja'Varrius Johnson for 29 yards to set up Alex McPherson's 28-yard field goal to give Auburn a 20-17 lead.

The Tigers added to their lead late in third quarter on a seven-play, 78-yard drive. On third-and-4 from Auburn's 46-yard line, Ashford faked a toss to the right and ran to his left for 19 yards to WKU's 35.

From there, Ashford tossed left to Bigsby, who followed blocks by left tackle Kilian Zierer and fullback John Samuel Shen-ker 35 yards down the sideline to put Auburn head 27-17 with 1:08 remaining in the third quarter.

After stopping WKU on fourth-and-23 at Auburn's 38-yard line, the Tigers drove 62 yards on four plays, with Bigsby and Hunter both passing the century mark on the drive. One play after Bigsby's 23-yard gain, Hunter raced 40 yards to his right on a toss sweep to give Auburn a 34-17 lead before James' pick-six 93 seconds later concluded the scoring.

Bigsby rushed 18 times for 110 yards and two touchdowns while Hunter gained 109 yards on 13 carries, rushing for a TD

bigsby roshed to times for in yards and two touchdowns while number gained 10-9 yards on its carries, rushing for a 1D while throwing a touchdown pass.

Auburn scored on its first possession, marching 68 yards on 13 plays and scoring on Bigsby's 1-yard run. On fourth-and-3 from WKU's 44, Ashford threw to Shedrick Jackson for 9 yards to extend the drive.

The Tigers led 10-0 after the first quarter thanks to McPherson's 51-yard field goal. Ashford was 5-for-5 for 50 yards on third downs in the opening quarter, picking up three first downs in the process.

After a Western Kentucky field goal, Auburn extended its lead to 17-3 midway through the second quarter when Ashford pitched to Hunter, who threw a 20-yard touchdown pass to Koy Moore.

The Hilltoppers scored twice before halftime to tie it at 17-17 on a pair of touchdown passes from Austin Reed to Josh Si-

mon, the latter coming with six seconds left in the half.

Before the game, the Tigers honored 24 seniors. Two walk-on seniors figured in the game's final plays, with walk-on Hayden Brice sacking WKU's backup quarterback on fourth down and Auburn quarterback Trey Lindsey taking a knee to run out the clock. Cam Riley led Auburn with eight tackles. The Tigers held WKU to 106 yards in the second half.
