FOOTBALL HOSTS TENNESSEE FOR HOMECOMING

» No. 23 Auburn hosts Tennessee on Saturday, November 21, for an SEC game at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn; the 6:00 p.m. CT contest will be televised by ESPN.

It's Homecoming and also Military Appreciation Day at Auburn. Auburn is the only SEC institution to allocate the majority of its limited capacity (17,490) tickets to students. Auburn's all-time Homecoming record is 81-8-4; the Tigers have won their last 28 Homecoming games. Homecoming candidates: Madison Birckhead (Human Development & Family Science/Charlottesville, VA); Alicia Peralta (Nursing/Opelika, AL); Barrett Ramsey (Management/Alpharetta, GA); Brooks Triplett (Human Development & Family Science/Savannah, GA); Kelsey Wynne (Architecture/Dallas, TX).

It will be Gus Malzahn's 100th game as Auburn head coach. His first game was a 31-24 win over Washington State at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2013. During the Gus Malzahn era, Auburn is 9-1 after an open date during the regular season (8-1 in SEC games, 4-1 at home).

SERIES HISTORY

- >> The Tigers hold a 28-22-3 lead in the all-time series, and lead 7-3-1 in all games played at Auburn. The Tigers have won six of the last seven games in the series, although UT was a 30-24 winner in 2018 in Auburn in the teams' most recent meeting. Auburn leads 11-5 in neutral site games and Tennessee has a 14-10-2 advantage in all games played in Knoxville.
- Auburn and Tennessee played every year from 1956-91, but didn't play from 1991 until the 1997 SEC championship game because of league expansion and the rotating opponents' setup. The two played in 1998-99 and 2003-04 before rotating off each other's schedule until 2008-09.

From 1956-91, every meeting except 1968 was on the last Saturday of September. The two schools dominated the SEC in the mid-to-late '80s. In six of the eight seasons from 1983-90, either Auburn (1983-87-88-89) or Tennessee (1985-89-90) claimed an SEC championship.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- The Auburn defense is the only defense in the SEC that has not given up more than 30 points in a game this season
- » Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play against LSU, with four tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble
- Colby Wooden leads the SEC with 7.0 TFL this season; Wooden has recorded at least 0.5 TFL in every game. As a team, Auburn is fifth in the SEC with 36.0 TFL
- >> Zakoby McClain is fifth in the SEC with 62 total tackles; fellow linebacker Owen Pappoe ranks ninth with 53 stops
- » Bo Nix's 91-yard TD pass to Anthony Schwartz vs. LSU is tied for the longest pass play in the SEC and the third-longest in the FBS this season

- Auburn is the only SEC team to rush for 200 yards in four straight games this season
- >> True freshman Tank Bigsby is third in the SEC in all-purpose average (148.83/gm) and has accounted for almost a third (11-36) of Auburn's plays of 20+ yards this season (8 KOR, 3 rush). Seth Williams has 11 receptions of 20+ yards as well this season
- » Bigsby, whose 503 rushing yards is fourth among all FBS freshmen, was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games; previously only Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010) rushed for three 100-yard games against SEC opposition as Auburn freshmen
- The postponement of Auburn-Mississippi State was the first postponement for the Tigers since 2001 following the events of 9/11, when the LSU game scheduled for September 15 was moved to the end of the season

2020 AUBURN FOOTBALL

IN NOVEMBER

Auburn is 243-185-20 (.564) all-time in November. Auburn's November home record is 104-38-5 (.724). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 139-146-15 (.488). Auburn is 19-10 in November under Gus Malzahn. Auburn is 8-9 on November 14 all-time and 4-8 on that date against SEC opponents.

TOTAL OFFENSE

Auburn has scored in all 99 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

- Auburn has rushed for at least 200 yards in four straight games for the first time since 2017. If the Tigers rush for 200 yards against Tennessee, it will be the first time they have topped 200 rushing yards in five straight games since 2016. It would be the first time since 2013-14, when the Tigers rushed for 200-plus yards in 14 straight games vs. SEC opponents, that they have rushed for at least 200 yards in five straight SEC games.
- There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 30 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn, the latest being 503 vards against LSU this season.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained 200+ vards total offense in a quarter 18 times (the latest: 200 yards in the third quarter vs. Kent State in 2019); and nine times vs. SEC teams (latest: 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss 2018).

Auburn has scored first in 36 of its last 50 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign. The Tigers are 49-16 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

- Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 68-99 (.687) games, with 39 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State in 2019, the sixth time the Tigers gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 21.81 first downs per game under Malzahn.
- The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 35 times in 99 games, 50+ points 17 times and 60+ points three times.

In 2019, Auburn scored 50+ points in four games in a season for just the third season in program history; others were in 2010 (6) and in 2016 (4).

Auburn has passed and rushed for over 200 vards in each of the last three games, averaging 213.0 rushing yards and 270.0 passing yards in those games for an average of 483.0 yards of total offense. It's the first time the Tigers have passed and rushed for at least 200 yards in three straight games since doing so in four straight games in 2017.

In its last game against LSU, Auburn threw for 300 yards and rushed for 206 yards. It was the third time the Tigers have totaled 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards in a game under head coach Gus Malzahn.

Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 58 of 99 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Fifteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (72 100-yd performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher under Malzahn is 45-13; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

2019 SEC Freshman of the Year Bo Nix started the 2020 campaign with a 233-yard passing performance against Kentucky, connecting for two scores to Seth Williams and another to Eli Stove.

Three TD passes against Kentucky tied his career best (also 2019 at Arkansas) and Nix posted his sixth career 200-yard passing game with 238 yards passing and a 58-yard gamewinning TD pass to Williams at Ole Miss.

Against LSU, Nix was 18-24 passing for 300 yards and three more touchdowns, and he was Auburn's leading rusher with 81 yards on 11 carries, including a 5-yard score. Nix' pass efficiency rating of 221.3 vs. LSU was the second-best game rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

Nix is now 336-573 in his career for 3,949 yards and 25 passing scores.

Nix' Auburn record of 251 pass attempts without an interception, dating back through the 2019 LSU game, was snapped at Georgia.

- >> In 2019, Nix set the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16). Those totals ranked ninth in passing yardage, second in passes attempted, third in passes completed and 10th in touchdown passes for a season at Auburn.
- Nix' 200-yard passing games: 340 (30-44) vs. Ole Miss. 2019 335 (16-21, 2 TD) vs. Mississippi St., 2019 300 (18-24, 3 TD) vs. LSU, 2020 272 (24-47, 1 TD) at South Carolina, 2020 245 (30-50, 1 TD) vs. Georgia, 2019 238 (23-30, 1 TD) at Ole Miss, 2020 233 (16-27, 3 TD) vs. Kentucky, 2020 207 (19-37, 1 TD) vs. Tulane, 2019
- Against LSU, Nix threw three touchdown passes and rushed for one score, his ninth career game with a passing touchdown and rushing touchdown, two more than any other SEC quarterback since the start of the 2019

It was the second time Nix has thrown three TDs and rushed for a TD in the same game in his career (at Arkansas in 2019). He is the first Auburn quarterback to do that since Jarrett Stidham did so against Georgia in 2017 and the first to do so multiple times since Cam Newton did it four times in 2010.

The sophomore now has 25 career TD passes, putting him three behind Ben Leard (1997-2000) for 10th in Auburn history. He's five TD passes behind Cam Newton for ninth and six behind his father, Patrick Nix (1992-95), for eighth.

The 91-yard touchdown pass from Bo Nix to Anthony Schwartz against LSU was the longest career score for both and the third-longest pass play in Auburn history (the longest: 94, Cam Newton to Emory Blake vs. ULM in 2010).

It's tied for the longest pass play in the SEC and third-longest in the FBS this season, only trailing a 93-yard pass from UCF's Dillon Gabriel to Ryan O'Keefe and a 92-yarder from Brady White of Memphis to Tahi Washington.

Junior receiver Seth Williams caught the gamewinning TD from Bo Nix with 1:14 remaining at Ole Miss, a 58-yard completion; Williams finished with 150 vards on eight catches, his fifth career 100-vard game, earning him SEC offensive player of the week honors.

Williams ranks ninth among Auburn career leaders in receiving, with 1,875 yards. His 113 career receptions rank 10th among Auburn career leaders, and his 16 receiving touchdowns are tied for fifth best at Auburn. He has caught a pass in his last 19 games dating back to the 2018 Music City Bowl against Purdue.

Against Kentucky, Williams posted the fourth multiple-score game of his career with touchdown catches of 11 and 4 yards from Bo Nix. Williams gained 112 yards on six receptions against the Wildcats.

In his career, 87 of Williams' 113 catches have resulted in either a first down or a touchdown, including TD on eight of his red zone receptions and 15 of his 21 catches in the fourth quarter. All but four of his receptions this season have gone for a first down or TD.

Williams led Auburn in 2019 with 59 catches for 830 yards and eight scores. He was the first Auburn player with TD catches in five straight games since Emory Blake (seven in 2010-11).

- Williams' 100-yard receiving games: 161 (8 rec, 2 TD) vs. Mississippi St., 2019 150 (8 rec, 1 TD) at Ole Miss, 2020 121 (13 rec) vs. Georgia, 2019 112 (6 rec, 2 TD) vs. Kentucky, 2020 109 (5 rec, 1 TD) vs. Liberty, 2018
- >> The 58-yard game-winning TD pass to Seth Williams from Bo Nix at Ole Miss was Williams' third career game-winning catch (Texas A&M 2018, Oregon 2019, Ole Miss 2020). It was the fourth time Nix has led Auburn on a fourthquarter drive to put the Tigers ahead for good.
- Anthony Schwartz had a career-high 123 yards receiving on just four catches in the win over LSU, highlighted by a 91-yard touchodwn reception from Bo Nix, Auburn's longest pass play in 10 years.

Schwartz posted his first 100-yard game with a 10-reception, 100-yard performance in the win over Arkansas, scoring on a 17-yard pass from Bo Nix. The junior was also Auburn's top receiver at Georgia, with eight catches gaining 57 yards.

2020 AUBURN FOOTBALL

With his 59 yards on six receptions at South Carolina, Schwartz went over 1,000 career receiving yards; he now has 1,219 yards on 101 receptions. Schwartz is 24th on Auburn's career receiving yardage chart. He is 13th on Auburn's career receptions list.

Schwartz entered the 2020 campaign with seven career rushing scores and 10 overall TD. Last season, 30 of his 52 touches resulted in a TD or first down. Schwartz' 57-yard touchdown run at Texas A&M in 2019 was a career long for the speedster and Auburn's longest rushing play of the season.

>> True freshman Tank Bigsby ranks third in the SEC in all-purpose average at 148.83 yards per game, ranking 23rd in the country and second among FBS freshmen.

Bigsby rushed for more than 100 yards in three consecutive games (Arkansas 146, South Carolina 111, Ole Miss 129). He's the first Auburn player to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby is the first Auburn freshman with three 100-yard rushing games since JaTarvious Whitlow in 2018, and only the third Auburn freshman ever with three 100-yard rushing games against SEC competition; others were Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010).

Bigsby's 129 yards rushing on 24 carries with touchdowns of 4 and 18 yards, and three kick returns for 75 yards, at Ole Miss earned him SEC freshman of the week accolades.

He already ranks ninth among Auburn freshman rushers with 503 yards and is tied for fifth among AU freshman rushers with five rushing touchdowns scored.

Bigsby rushed for 146 yards on 20 carries against Arkansas, the 12th-best rushing day ever by an Auburn freshman. He's one of just 10 Auburn players, and the only freshman, to record more than 250 all-purpose yards in a game; Bigsby totaled 268 all-purpose yards against Arkansas (146 rush, 16 rec, 106 KOR).

Bigsby, who next rushed for 111 yards and his first career TD at South Carolina, was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games since redshirt freshman JaTarvious Whitlow in 2018 (122 vs. Alabama State; 104 vs. LSU). Bigsby was the first true freshman to do so and the first freshman, true or redshirt, to do it in consecutive SEC games since Michael Dyer in 2010 (100 vs. LSU; 180 at Ole Miss). He was named to the FWAA Freshman All-America watch list.

Bigsby led Auburn with 31 yards rushing and 68 yards receiving on seven catches against Georgia in his first career start; he was the first player to lead the Tigers in rushing and receiving yards since Kerryon Johnson totaled 167 rushing yards and 66 receiving yards against Georgia in 2017.

Senior Eli Stove has passed 1,500 career yards from scrimmage (113 catches for 1,028 yards and six scores and 53 rushing attempts for 543 yards and four TD). He is tied for 10th in Auburn career receptions and ranks 28th in career receiving yardage.

Stove caught a 21-yard touchdown from Bo Nix in the opener against Kentucky, one of four receptions on the day. He led Auburn with seven catches at South Carolina, including an 11-yard TD catch, and had five receptions for 64 yards with a 9-yard touchdown.

Last season, he had an 11-yard TD catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon, added a 4-yard rushing TD against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State, the first Tiger to score in three straight games since Kerryon Johnson (2017).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

>> Auburn won the turnover battle against Kentucky, using a Roger McCreary interception and fumble recoveries from Jamien Sherwood and Owen Pappoe to post a 3-0 advantage in the turnover margin against the Wildcats.

- » Auburn has 35 former lettermen on NFL rosters, representing 22 different NFL teams
- » Former Auburn lettermen on NFL rosters who finished their college careers elsewhere: Byron Cowart (New England), John Franklin III (Tampa Bay)

The Tigers were 2-0 in turnovers at Ole Miss on interceptions from Roger McCreary and Jordyn Peters.

Christian Tutt's fumble return for a touchdown and interceptions by Nehemiah Pritchett and Big Kat Bryant accounted for Auburn's three turnovers forced vs. LSU.

Auburn is 35-9 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 16-6 when turnovers are even, compared to 14-18 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +43 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -18 in turnovers during Malzahn's tenure.

The Tigers are 23-5 when they play turnover-free football and 46-18 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn. The Tigers are 21-5 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

Auburn is 56-21 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 36-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 10-12 when it fails to force a turnover.

FOR THE DEFENSE

With his 13 tackles at South Carolina, linebacker Zakoby McClain became the first Auburn player since Deshaun Davis in 2018 with double-figure tackles in three straight games (Georgia 11, Arkansas 14, South Carolina 13). McClain now has 121 tackles for his career.

Owen Pappoe also put together three consecutive double-figure games against Arkansas (10), South Carolina (10) and Ole Miss (14). He has 102 career tackles.

Jamien Sherwood crossed the 100-career tackle mark with his 11-tackle performance at Ole Miss and now has 109 for his career. Smoke Monday had a career-best 12 stops at Ole Miss.

Auburn had four players post double-figure tackles at Georgia: Jamien Sherwood (14), Jordyn Peters (13), K.J. Britt (12) and McClain (11); all four of those players set or tied career bests. It was the first time Auburn had four players with double-figure tackles since the 2019 LSU game, when Auburn had five.

McClain (14) and Pappoe (10) were the top tacklers against Arkansas.

Auburn, which has allowed a TD on 48.9 percent (85-174) of its opponents' red zone trips since 2016, is one of four FBS to allow a TD on fewer than 50 percent of its opponents' red zone trips during that time (along with Wisconsin, Clemson and Cincinnati).

» Senior linebacker K.J. Britt earned first team all-SEC honors from AP and second team from the league's coaches last season, totaling 69 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble. He was a 2020 preseason first-team all-SEC selection and on the watch lists for the Lott IMPACT, Bednarik, Butkus and Nagurski

Britt posted a then-career-best 11 tackles and a TFL in the season opening win against Kentucky, and topped that with a 12-tackle performance at Georgia. That gives Britt 119 tackles and 13.0 TFL for his career.

Britt underwent hand surgery following the Georgia game and has not yet returned to action.

Onder Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 42 times, including 26 of the last 34 games (not including season openers). In 34 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-ormore yards below its season average.

Auburn held LSU to 32 rushing yards, the third fewest in the long-time series (also 1999/26 yds, 1988/28 yds) and the 19th time against an SEC opponent that the Auburn defense allowed 32 rushing yards or fewer; the last was vs. Arkansas (25 yds) in 2016.

- » Auburn has allowed only 19.0 points per game in Steele's tenure as coordinator, 10th among FBS teams. Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg.
- Auburn has held 19 of 59 opponents (16-3 record) below 300 yards total offense in Kevin Steele's five seasons as defensive coordinator. That exceeds the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 in the previous six years combined (14 in 79 games).
- In 26 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 23.615 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points nine times. Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked foes to 17 or fewer points (18.4%).

>> Auburn's defense has allowed only 15 firstquarter touchdowns in the last 48 games, and only 14 in the opening period since the start of 2017 (six last season).

2020 AUBURN FOOTBALL

In 59 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 139 sacks (2.36 per game) and has been held without a sack only seven times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 36 of those games, including 8.0 TFL against Kentucky and 7.0 TFL against Arkansas, Ole Miss and LSU this season.

The Tigers have forced 85 turnovers (43 INT, 42 FR) and allowed only 43 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

- » Redshirt freshman cornerback Jaylin Simpson earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors in his first career start vs. Kentucky, accounting for four tackles, a TFL and a PBU.
- Sophomore Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play against LSU, with four tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble.

- Auburn held South Carolina to 297 yards of total offense, the first time this season the Tigers held an opponent to less than 300 yards total offense and the 19th time in 59 games under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele, compared to just 15 such games in the previous 89 games (back to 2009).
- >> Auburn has allowed 4.969 yards per play since 2016, which ranks 14th among FBS teams.
- Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 47 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 130 total TD during that span.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Gus Malzahn is now 21-1 in games where Auburn scores an non-offensive touchdown, the latest being Barton Lester's TD recovery of a Jordyn Peters blocked punt against Arkansas. and Christian Tutt's fumble recovery TD against LSU.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

Against Minnesota in that Outback Bowl, Auburn scored on a 96-yard kickoff return by Noah Igbinoghene, the last time the Tigers lost a game in which they scored a non-offensive touchdown since 2012 at Mississippi State.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Jordyn Peters' blocked punt against Arkansas was the fourth of his career; he had three during the 2018 season. That most recent block resulted in a Tiger touchdown when recovered by Barton Lester.

It was the first blocked punt for a TD by Auburn since the 2018 Alabama State game (blocked by Jordyn Peters, recovered by Devan Barrett) and the first by Auburn in an SEC game since the 2017 Texas AGM contest.

y Junior kicker Anders Carlson booted the gamewinning 39-yard field goal with 0:07 remaining in the Arkansas win.

With six PAT against LSU, Carlson ranks ninth in Auburn career scoring with 231.

Carlson is seventh in career PAT made (108) at Auburn and he is seventh in career field goals made (41).

Carlson started the 2020 campaign going 3-3 on PAT kicks against Kentucky and was 2-2 on field goal attempts at Georgia.

Last season, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, is now with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

With 705 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are now third all-time in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

In second place are Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (734 points from 2013-19); the leaders are Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

Auburn is one game ahead of Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (149) without having a punt blocked. The Tigers last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

RANKINGS

- Auburn, which reentered the AP poll at No. 24 last week after a two-week absence, has now been ranked in 26 of the last 28 AP polls.
- >> The Tigers opened the season with a win over an AP-ranked opponent for the third straight year. The Tigers are the only team in the country to defeat a ranked opponent to open 2018. 2019 and 2020.

This is the sixth time all-time that a ranked Auburn team has played four straight games against teams in the AP Top 25. Others: 1968, 1983-84, 1987, 2002-03 and 2013.

- Auburn is 114-164-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 53-42-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-71-2 on the road and 33-51-2 on a neutral field.
- Auburn has played 44 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 99 games as the Tigers' head coach (44.4 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 25 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 20-24 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including 8-17 against Top 10 teams.
- This was the 40th year the Tigers were ranked in the preseason AP poll since the preseason poll started in 1950, including six times in Gus Malzahn's eight seasons as the Tigers' head coach, and each of the last four.
- >> The Tigers are 90-132-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (43-33-2 at home, 28-64-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 59-52-3 overall (29-10-1 at home, 19-32-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).
- Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 329-121-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 1876-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-88-4 all-time.
- When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 81-76-4 (36-13-1 at home, 22-40-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).
- Auburn is 46-23 as a ranked team under head coach Gus Malzahn. The Tigers are 31-4 as a ranked team at Jordan-Hare Stadium under Malzahn. When Auburn is ranked and playing an unranked team under Malzahn, the Tigers are 30-5, including 22-2 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.
- Ranked Auburn teams are 12-9-2 against Tennessee all-time, including 8-4 against unranked Volunteer teams. In Auburn, ranked Auburn teams are 4-2-1 all-time (4-2 when Tennessee enters the game unranked).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

- During the Gus Malzahn era, Auburn is 9-1 after an open date during the regular season (8-1 in SEC games, 4-0 on the road).
- >> The Tennessee game will be Gus Malzahn's 100th game as Auburn head coach. His first game was a 31-24 win over Washington State at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2013. Malzahn's 25th game at Auburn was a 31-7 victory over Samford at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2014; his 50th game as Auburn head coach was a 13-7 loss at Georgia in 2016. Malzahn's 75th Auburn game was a 31-16 win at Ole Miss in 2018.

Malzahn is the fifth all-time to coach 100 games at Auburn; also Ralph "Shug" Jordan (265 games, 1951-75); Pat Dye (142 games, 1981-92); Mike Donahue (139 games, 1904-06, 1908-22); Tommy Tuberville (125 games, 1999-2008).

In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 328-255-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 140-60-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 188-194-12 overall. The Tigers are 37-24 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 27-6.

The season-opening win over Kentucky was Auburn's 325th victory all-time in SEC regular season competition. Previous SEC milestone wins:

Since 2001, Auburn is 153-29 (.840) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 209-37-1 (.849) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 549-57-9 (.899) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 344-9 (.976) when scoring 30 points, 174-3 (.985) when scoring 40 points, 81-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

On the current Auburn roster, 40 players have at least one college start to their credit, 22 on offense and 18 on defense.

Ten Tigers have started 15 or more collegiate games: Caylin Newton (25 at Howard), Brandon Council (29 overall; 24 at Akron), Eli Stove (23), Seth Williams (22), Bo Nix (19), Owen Pappoe (19), Christian Tutt (18), Big Kat Bryant (18), Nick Brahms (16) and Tyrone Truesdell (16).

THE LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE **TENNESSEE 30, #21 AUBURN 24**

>> Anthony Schwartz flashed his world-class speed on the Tigers' longest play of the season but Tennessee defeated No. 21 Auburn 30-24 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn started fast, driving 75 yards, mostly on the ground, on the game's opening possession with Chandler Cox's 1-yard touchdown putting the Tigers up 7-0.

The Tigers were 3-for-3 on third down on the drive, with Jatarviious Whitlow moving the chains each time. After Schwartz gained 17 yards to Tenessee's 3, Cox scored his second career rushing touchdown two plays later.

After Tennessee answered with a field goal, Auburn responded with a 20-yard Anders Carlson field goal to lead 10-3 after the first quarter.

The Volunteers tied it at 10 on a 42-yard yard touchdown pass from Jarrett Guarantano to Ty Chandler early in the second quarter. Guarantano completed 21 of 32 passes for 328 yards and two touchdowns.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Jarrett Stidham found Schwartz on an out route. The freshman track star broke a tackle then raced down the Auburn sideline for a 76-yard score to give a 17-10 lead with 3:26 left in the first half.

After the dash by "Flash," Tennessee kicked a field goal, trimming Auburn's lead to 17-13 at the half.

Tennessee forced three Auburn turnovers, hit several long pass plays, and outscored the Tigers 17-7 in the second half.

Late in the third guarter, the Volunteers took a 20-17 lead on a 25-yard pass to Jauan Jennings, then scored again 51 seconds to take a 10-point lead on Alontae Taylor's fumble return.

Seth Williams caught a 14-yard touchdown pass

with 37 second left to make it 30-24, but Tennessee recovered the onside kick to secure the win. Williams led Auburn with 85 receiving yards on five catches.

Stidham was 28-for-45 for 322 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions.

Marlon Davidson blocked a field goal for the second straight week. Auburn had three sacks and 10 tackles for loss. Deshaun Davis led Auburn with 10 tackles, including a TFL.

FAST FACTS

- » Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.
- » Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the secondmost in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.
- » His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.
- » Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last nine seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.
- » Now in his eighth season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): 176, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); 99, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); 85, Tommy Tuberville (10); 66, Gus Malzahn (8); 48, Jack Meagher (9); 47, Terry Bowden (6); 33, Gene Chizik (4); 29, Doug Barfield (5); 22, Chet Wynne (4).

- » Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).
- » Since 2000, in the eight seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 2550-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season four times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019).

- » Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).
- » Malzahn is 49-11 (.816) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 3-0 in 2020 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.
- » In nine seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.
- » Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 81 of 99 games (81%).
- » Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.
- » 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.
- » In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.
- » Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 59 of 99 games under Malzahn.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 423 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 332, losing 84 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .793 against some of the best teams in college football.

Bo Nix threw three second-half touchdown passes and No. 8 Auburn's defense forced three turnovers to lead the Tigers to

a 29-13 season-opening win over No. 23 Kentucky Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Nix connected twice with Seth Williams and once with Eli Stove, completing 16 of 27 passes for 233 yards with no turnovers. Nix and Williams teamed up six times for 112 yards and two touchdowns.

Trailing 7-O after Kentucky scored on its opening drive, Auburn answered with a 7-yard, seven-play drive to take the lead. After D. J. Williams' 1-yard touchdown run, Grant Loy's two-point conversion pass to John Samuel Shenker gave Auburn an 8-7 lead.

Late in the half, Kentucky threatened to take the lead, but Roger McCreary intercepted Terry Wilson's pass in Auburn's end

zone, returning 100 yards for a touchdown that was negated by a penalty on the return.

On third-and-goal from the 11, Nix rolled right and threw to Williams, who elevated in the end zone for a touchdown that extended Auburn's lead to 15-7 with 5:42 left in the third quarter. Four plays later on third-and-goal from the 4, Nix targeted Williams, who outmuscled his defender to record his second touchdown, putting Auburn in front 22-13 with 10:21 left in the game.

Kentucky tried a fake punt, but Jordyn Peters ran down the Wildcats' punter for a 3-yard loss, giving Auburn the ball on Auburn quickly capitalized two plays later when Nix connected with Eli Stove for a 27-yard touchdown that increased Au-

In a top-10 matchup, No. 4 Georgia beat No. 7 Auburn 27-6 Saturday at Sanford Stadium in the 125th edition of the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry

Bo Nix completed 21 of 41 passes for 177 yards and true freshman Tank Bigsby accounted for 99 yards of total offense to pace the Tigers.

After Georgia scored a touchdown and kicked a field goal on its first two drives to lead 10-0 after the first quarter, the Bulldogs added a 21-yard touchdown pass and Zamir White's second TD run to lead 24-0 with 6:26 remaining in the first half.

Auburn got on the scoreboard with a 20-yard Anders Carlson field goal to cap a 12-play, 65-yard drive for a 24-3 halftime

On the drive, Nix's 19-yard pass to Bigsby was Auburn's longest gain of the half. Making his first start, Bigsby made seven receptions for 68 yards while adding 31 rushing yards on eight carries.

Auburn began the second half with a 15-play drive that led to Carlson's 45-yard field goal, trimming UGA's lead to 24-6. The Tigers converted three third downs on the drive, with Nix hitting Seth Williams for 10 and 20 yards to move the chains twice while Nix rushed for 10 yards on third-and-5.

After Georgia kicked a field goal to lead 27-6, Auburn again drove into UGA territory, with 6-2, 300-pound true freshman tight end J.J. Pegues twice picking up first downs with 2-yard runs out of the Wildcat formation. The drive ended with a fourth-down interception.

Anthony Schwartz had eight receptions for 57 yards.

Jamien Sherwood highlighted Auburn's defensive effort, making a career-high 14 tackles. Sherwood tallied 13 stops in the first half, including a tackle for loss, while breaking up two passes. Jordyn Peters also had a career effort with 13 tackles. K.J. Britt added 12 tackles and Zakoby McClain made 11, both career highs. McClain also recorded a sack.

The Tigers and Bulldogs played in front of 20,524 in Auburn's first road game of the coronavirus pandemic. Auburn returns to Jordan-Hare Stadium next Saturday vs. Arkansas at 3 p.m. CT on SEC Network.

All Anders Carlson needed was a second chance Saturday. The junior kicker missed a 34-yard field goal late in the fourth guarter, but when his teammates picked him up and gave him another opportunity with less than 20 seconds left to win it, he delivered.

Carlson drilled a 39-yard field goal, his third made field goal of the game, to propel No. 13 Auburn to a 30-28 victory over

Arkansas on a wet, rainy day in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

It took all three phases for Auburn in the final sequence. Following the missed kick, the defense responded with a threeand-out to give the Tigers the ball back. On offense, it was Tank Bigsby who took over on the final drive. The freshman running back caught a pass for nine yards and then had back-to-back runs for 17 yards to set up the go-ahead kick from Carlson.

Bigsby finished with 146 yards rushing, 16 yards receiving and added 106 yards on kick returns. He ran for 106 yards in the

first half, becoming the first Auburn running back to reach 100 yards in the first half of an SEC game since Kerryon Johnson did it against Ole Miss in 2017.

In what was a sloppy start for both sides due to the weather, Auburn scored first with a blocked punt for a touchdown. Senior defensive back Jordyn Peters broke through the right side and blocked the punt while junior linebacker Barton Lester was right there to fall on it in the end zone.

For Peters, it was the fourth punt block in his career. It was Auburn's first blocked punt for a touchdown since 2018 against Alabama State when Peters blocked it and Devan Barrett returned it for six.

The Tigers kept the foot on the gas, adding a field goal late in the first quarter to make it 10-0.

On their opening drive of the second quarter, it was vintage Auburn football as the offense ran the ball 10 straight times and marched 80 yards down the field for a touchdown. Bigsby started the drive with runs of 13 and 17 yards. Fellow running back D.J. Williams picked up 11 yards and then converted a third-and-2 with a 5-yard run. Quarterback Bo Nix capped the Arkansas battled back in the second half to cut the lead to two, but the Tigers responded and mounted another impressive

touchdown drive. This time it was Nix and wide receiver Anthony Schwartz who took over. The two connected five times for 56 yards on the drive, including a 17-yard touchdown catch from Schwartz on 3rd-and-10 where he weaved through a handful of Razorbacks on his way to the end zone.

Schwartz finished with a team-high 10 receptions and 100 yards receiving, both career highs.

On defense, linebackers Owen Pappoe and Zakoby McClain stepped up for Auburn in the absence of senior leader K.J. Britt. McClain led the team with 13 tackles, a new career high, and Pappoe also set a career high in tackles with 10 while adding a sack as well.

Pappoe's sack was one of seven tackles for loss by the defense. Sophomore Colby Wooden, starting in place of the injured

Big Kat Bryant, recorded two tackles for loss, a sack and six total stops.

It was the fifth straight win in the series for Auburn who now leads 18-11-1 all-time.

The Tigers (2-1) will go back on the road next week to face a South Carolina team who earned their first victory of the season

Saturday. The game is scheduled to kick off at 11 a.m. CT and will be televised on ESPN.

Trailing by one point, Auburn (3-2) drove 80 yards on six plays, the Tigers' fifth long scoring drive of the game. Nix and Williams connected again for a two-point conversion pass that gave Auburn a seven-point lead.

Ole Miss (1-4) drove to Auburn's 29 with 3 seconds remaining, but Jordyn Peters made an interception on the game's final play on which Ole Miss was penalized for passing beyond the line of scrimmage.

Early In the third quarter Roger McCreary tackled Ole Miss kicker Luke Logan for a 4-yard-loss on a fake field goal after a special teams miscuse had given the Rebels a short field.

After an Auburn punt, Ole Miss drove 89 yards on three plays, scoring on Matt Corral's 10-yard run to lead 21-14 at the 7:09 mark of the third quarter.

Auburn answered with a 10-play, 88-yard game-tying drive. Tank Bigsby ran for 19 yards on third-and-2, then Nix rolled right and threw high down the middle to Seth Williams, who hauled in the pass at the Ole Miss 1-yard line. Shaun Shivers scored on the next play for a 21-21 tie with 2:57 to play in the third quarter.

The Tigers' defense delivered a key stop when Smoke Monday sacked Corral on third-and-5 to force an Ole Miss punt.

The Tigers then drove 80 yards on 11 plays to take the lead. Nix twice completed passes on third downs, first to Williams, then to John Samuel Shenker. Bigby stiff-armed a defender on an 18-yard touchdown run.

On the PAT attempt, Auburn was unable to cleanly convert the snap and hold, resulting in a 27-21 lead.

Bigsby recorded his third consecutive 100-yard game, rushing for 129 yards on 24 carries with two touchdowns.

Ole Miss drove for a touchdown to take a 28-27 lead with 5:43 to play, then forced a three-and-out from Auburn's offense. The Tigers defense responded with its own three-and-out to give the offense one more opportunity, setting the stage for the most recent Bo-to-Seth game

of the season.
The Tigers then drove 95 yards on 14 plays with Bigsby capping the drive with a 4-yard touchdown to give Auburn a 7-0

lead.

The Rebels answered with 75-yard drive to tie it at 7-7 on Corral's 6-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Moore with 13:46 re-

mining in the half.

Auburn responded with a 10-play, 79-yard scoring drive. Shaun Shivers crossed midfield with runs of 14 and 12 yards. On third-and-4, Nix hit Williams on a slant, with Williams hurdling an Ole Miss defender to gain 21 yards.

Nix scored on a 4-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-7 at the 9:11 mark of the second quarter.

The Rebels then drove 78 yards on 16 plays, converting on fourth-and-5 before scoring on Corral's quarterback run for a 14-14 tie with 3:35 left in the half.

Auburn didn't need any tricks on Halloween this year. It was all treats for the Tigers on Saturday as they dominated LSU, winning 48–11 inside Jordan–Hare Stadium.

It was Auburn's largest margin of victory over LSU, surpassing the previous total of 35 (1999, 2014), and it was also the most points either team has scored in series history.

After a scoreless first quarter, Auburn struck first in the opening minutes of the second quarter with a 9-yard touchdown pass from Bo Nix to Eli Stove. The score was set up by the Auburn defense and cornerback Nehemiah Pritchett who pulled down his first career interception and returned it 48 yards. Stove scored on the next play.

The Auburn defense made its presence felt again later in the quarter when Christian Tutt recovered a fumble and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown to put the Tigers up 14–0. The fumble was caused by Derick Hall who sacked LSU quarterback T.J. Finley on the play.

From that point on it was all Auburn, dismantling the defending national champions in all three phases.

The offense found its rhythm, scoring touchdowns on each their next five drives, including a 99-yard drive to close out the first half and a 75-yard drive to open the second half. The defense kept LSU out of the end zone until a touchdown midway through the fourth quarter with Auburn ahead 48–3.

Nix was responsible for four of Auburn's seven touchdowns. The sophomore quarterback finished 18 of 24 through the air for 300 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran for a career-high 81 yards on 11 carries, adding a fourth score on the ground. It was the third career 300-yard passing performance from Nix, who finished with a pass efficiency rating of 221.3.

On his final play before exiting the game, Nix connected with junior wide receiver Anthony Schwartz on a 91-yard touchdown pass in school history. With the catch, Schwartz finished as Auburn's leading receiver. He had four receptions for 123 yards.

Stove and fellow wide receiver Ze (Vian Capers also caught touchdowns Saturday. The earl

down at Auburn.

For the first time since week two, Tank Bigsby failed to go over 100 yards rushing. But the freshman running back still ran for 71 yards on 15 carries and scored two touchdowns in the third quarter to bring his total to five on the season. Bigsby is now ninth among Auburn freshman rushers all-time with 503 yards on the season.

As a team, Auburn rushed for 206 yards in Saturday's win. The Tigers have now surpassed 200 yards on the ground in four straight games.

On the visiting side, LSU finished with only 32 yards rushing thanks to an inspired performance from the Auburn defense. The group forced three turnovers, held LSU to 5 of 17 on third down and recorded four sacks – two from Hall, one from T.D. Moultry and one from Marquis Burks. It was the first two sacks of Hall's career.

Auburn was so dominant on defense that LSU never made it inside the Auburn 30-yard until midway through the fourth quarter. LSU crossed midfield just three times on its first 12 drives.
