» Auburn returns to action Monday night at UCF. The Tigers are 4-1 against the Knights all-time, including 3-0 in Orlando. Head coach Bruce Pearl is set to face UCF for the first time.

» Auburn is set to play a non-conference game in Florida for the first time under Pearl and the first time since 2012 when the Tigers played at Florida State on Jan. 4.

» The Tigers are 61-41 against teams from the currently-constructed American Athletic Conference, including 9-2 against the teams from Florida (4-1 vs. UCF, 5-1 vs. USF).

» Auburn recently played in the Fort Myers Tip-Off to begin the season, splitting results between Saint Joseph's and No. 1 Gonzaga. With the opener against the Hawks, it was the latest the Tigers have opened a season since also beginning on Nov. 26, 1994 when assistant coach Wes Flanigan was the point guard (W, 76-70 vs. Lynn).

» The Tigers have without a doubt one of the youngest rosters in college basketball with 15 underclassmen - six freshman and nine sophomores. Auburn and UC Irvine have the fewest upperclassmen on their respective rosters with two each.

» Auburn lost 84.1 percent of its scoring from a season ago - the fifth-most in the country - and graduated the winningest class in program history as the 2020 seniors had 99 wins through four years, besting the 2001 class (87).

» The 2020-21 Tigers are the youngest team that head coach Bruce Pearl has had as a Division I head coach.

- Has advanced to postseason play in 20 of 25 years as a head coach. Following a second-place finish in the SEC with a 25-6 record, including 12-6 in league play, that would be 21 of 25 had the postseason not been canceled due to COVID
- Set single-season wins records at four different schools (29 at Southern Indiana in 1995; 26 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2005; 31 at Tennessee in 2008; 30 at Auburn in 2019)
- Pearl has achieved a top-5 national ranking at Southern Indiana, Tennessee and Auburn. He has been in the top five in 10 seasons (1994-2001 at Southern Indiana, 2007-08 at Tennessee, 2019-20 at Auburn)
- Bruce Pearl's teams have led their conference in scoring 17 of the 25 years that he has been a head coach. His squads were the SEC's scoring champion in four of his six seasons at Tennessee, averaging 77.4 ppg while allowing 70.5 ppg
- One of 12 coaches to lead three different DI programs to the Sweet 16, joining Rick Barnes, Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Lon Kruger, Frank McGuire, Ralph Miller, Rick Pitino, Bill Self, Tubby Smith, Eddie Sutton and Bruce Weber. Including his stint at DII Southern Indiana, Pearl is one of only three coaches to take four programs (with three at the DI level) to the Sweet 16, joining Lon Kruger and Eddie Sutton
- With the win over Kentucky that sent Auburn to its first Final Four in program history, Pearl notched his 100th win as head coach of the Tigers. He is the first coach in Auburn history to have 100 wins in his first five seasons
- Bruce Pearl is the 11th coach in SEC history to win four conference crowns (overall or division) in a 10-year span. He is on the same list as Adolph Rupp (UK), Babe McCarthy (MSU), Billy Donovan (UF), Dale Brown (LSU), Joe Hall (UK), John Calipari (UK), Nolan Richardson (ARK), Rick Pitino (UK), Rick Stansbury (MSU) and Tubby Smith (UK)
- Auburn sold out of season tickets for the sixth straight time in 2019-20, all under Pearl, to continue the school record streak. Prior to Pearl, the only other time the Tigers sold out of season tickets came was 1999-2000
- In 25 full years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 17 times
- At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 20 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg
- In the past four seasons, Auburn has the best non-conference record in the SEC during the regular season at 47-5 (.904), while scheduling regular NCAA Tournament teams in Arizona, Davidson, Dayton, Duke, Iowa State, Middle Tennessee, Murray State, Oklahoma, Texas Tech, UConn and Xavier

- His teams have been just as successful off the court as Auburn has had 29 graduates in six years – the most in the SEC. In 2018, Auburn received an Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Award marking the first time the Tigers have been honored since the award began tracking data in 2004. The NCAA annually honors teams earning multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top 10 percent of all squads in each sport
- Auburn recently secured its fourth perfect APR score of 1,000 in mid-May, something that has never been accomplished in program history
- In the past five years, Auburn men's basketball has averaged an APR of 995 (out of 1,000). In the previous four seasons before Pearl and his staff arrived, Auburn's APR average score was 940
- Pearl started AURLIVE at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. AURLIVE raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients. He initiated the OUTLIVE program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease
- On Dec. 19, 2019, Children's Harbor in Birmingham, Ala. dedicated their on-site basketball court in honor of the charitable work done by Coach Pearl and the Pearl family over the last six years.
- Bruce Pearl has raised over \$1.2 million in only six golf tournaments at Auburn. Pearl and his wife, Brandy, have remarkably raised \$770,000 in the last three years benefitting Children's Harbor in Birmingham through the Bruce Pearl Fore the Children Golf Classic. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families
- The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015
- The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain

AUBURN VS. UCF SERIES

» The Tigers and Knights are set to meet for the sixth time in program history Monday night. Auburn holds a 4-1 lead in the series, including a perfect 3-0 in Orlando.

» The Tigers are 61-41 against teams from the currently-constructed American Athletic Conference, including 9-2 against the teams from Florida (4-1 vs. UCF, 5-1 vs. USF).

» Head coach Bruce is slated to face UCF for the first time in his career.

ACTIVE ROSTER

» Eleven players saw extended action in the opening two games of the season. The Tigers have 10 players that average double-digit minutes, including eight above 15 minutes per game.

STEADY AL

» The only player returning to log a start from last year's team, Allen Flanigan - who only started three games - scored in double figures in both games to begin the season.

» Flanigan scored 12 points to go along with five rebounds and a pair of assists vs. Saint Joseph's. The sophomore poured in a team-best and career-high 20 points on 7 of 11 shooting and contributed five boards.

BLOCK PARTY

» Auburn leads the SEC and is 23rd in the country with six blocks per game. Babatunde Akingbola is second in the league at two blocks per contest, while Dylan Cardwell and Jaylin Williams are tied for ninth at 1.5 swats per contest.

CASHING IN THE FREEBIES

» Auburn is second in the SEC in both free throws made (41) and attempted (58) to begin the season.

» The Tigers have three in the top 10 of the conference in made free throws in JT Thor (fifth, nine), Allen Flanigan (sixth, eight) and Justin Powell (eighth, six).

PLAYER TO WATCH: ALLEN FLANIGAN

In his second year as a Tiger, Allen Flanigan has led by example on the court as he currently paces Auburn in points per game (16.0) and field goal percentage (52.6). The Little Rock, Ark. native is also one of five Tigers to average five or more rebounds per contest and one of six to have at least three assists through two games.



AUBURN IN SEASON OPENERS

» With a 96-91 overtime win against Saint Joseph's Thursday night, Auburn improved to 84-31 (.730) in season openers, including 61-9 at home, 13-16 on the road, 5-3 in neutral-site games and 5-3 in games played in unknown locations. The 2020 season was the first time since 2007 that the Tigers have not opened the season at home. Auburn has won 40 of its last 47 season openers.

BP IN SEASON OPENERS

» Bruce Pearl improved to 25-1 (.962) in season openers, including 7-0 at Auburn. The Tigers defeated Georgia Southern 83-74 last season, South Alabama 101-58 in 2018, Norfolk State 102-74 in 2017, North Florida 83-66 in 2016, UAB 75-74 in 2015 and Milwaukee 83-73 in 2014 in Pearl's debut as Auburn's head coach. Overall, Pearl has won 15 consecutive season openers.

TIGERS SHINE BRIGHT IN FLORIDA MTEs

» Auburn is 15-6 in regular season multi-team events in Florida all-time, including Thursday's victory.

» The Tigers have been declared champions in four of 10 MTEs played in Florida in program history.

» The last time Auburn played in a MTE in the Sunshine State was 1995 when the Tigers defeated Norfolk State and Florida A&M to win the Capital City Classic in Tallahassee.

TIGERS IN OVERTIME

» With a 96-91 win in overtime Thursday, Auburn is 58-53 in overtime games all-time, including a 9-0 mark since the start of the 2018-19 season and 2-0 against Saint Joseph's.

» The Tigers are 12-2 in overtime under head coach Bruce Pearl, including a perfect 5-0 last season.

THE REPLACEMENTS

» Auburn is having to replace over 84 percent of its scoring from last season. That mark stands as the fifth-highest in the country.

» Auburn and Kentucky are the only two SEC programs to not return a player that averaged five or more points per game from a season ago.

» The Tigers have to replace the winningest class in program history as the 2020 seniors amassed 99 wins, besting the previous mark of 88 set by the 2001 seniors.

» The 2020 class also hold the most wins in a 3-year span with 81, most in a 2-year span with 56 and most in a single year with 30, which was accomplished during Auburn's run to the Final Four in 2019.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

» The Tigers have recorded three straight 20-win seasons for the second time all-time after first accomplishing the feat from 1983-84 to 1985-86. After a win against LSU last year, Auburn secured its third consecutive 21-win season, a first in program history for the Tigers.

» Bruce Pearl joins Cliff Ellis and Sonny Smith as the only head coaches to lead Auburn to three 20-win seasons.

» In the 25 seasons that Bruce Pearl has been a head coach, including the 2019-20 campaign, his teams have amassed 20 20-win seasons. In simple math, Coach Pearl has won at least 20 games in a season in 80 percent of his seasons as the head coach.

AUBURN VS. TOP-25 OPPONENTS

» Auburn is 70-214 against teams from the AP Top 25 all-time. In 2018-19, the Tigers set a program record by defeating six top-25 teams, including five in a row from the SEC Tournament title to a trip to the Final Four.

» The Tigers have won two of their matchups against top-25 competition last season, taking down No. 13 Kentucky (75-66) and No. 18 LSU (91-90 in OT) in a span of seven days. Auburn lost its most recent top-25 battle at No. 8 Kentucky, 73-66.

» Auburn has won seven of its last eight games against the AP Top 25, which is the best stretch in program history by far. The next-closest similar streak was when the Tigers defeated six of nine ranked foes between the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons.

» The Tigers finished the season at 16-1 at home, marking the most wins in Auburn Arena history and the second-most home wins ever in program history, trailing only the 18 by the 2008-09 team at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum.

MAKE ROOM IN THE TROPHY CASE

» Since the 2017-18 season, Auburn has won four trophies: 2018 SEC title, 2019 SEC Tournament crown, 2019 NCAA Midwest Regional championship and the 2019 Legends Classic.

» The Tigers lead the SEC in trophies in the last two-plus seasons. As a whole, the league has amassed 11 trophies through league championships, conference tournament championships, NCAA regional championships and in-season tournament championships. Auburn has four and Kentucky has three, while Florida, LSU, Tennessee and Texas A&M have all won one.

BURCHAM ON THE CALL

» Andy Burcham assumed his new role as Voice of the Auburn Tigers last season, taking the lead as the play-by-play radio broadcaster for the Auburn men's basketball, football and baseball programs. Burcham took over as Auburn's lead announcer this fall following the death in May of his best friend and baseball broadcast partner, Rod Bramblett.

» After calling Auburn women's basketball games for 31 seasons, Burcham made his debut as the primary men's basketball announcer in the season-opening win vs. Georgia Southern on Nov. 5 - what would have been Bramblett's 54th birthday.

» Over the years, Burcham handled play-by-play for a few men's basketball games when Bramblett was unavailable, most recently the season opener in 2013.

» Burcham is joined on the call with former Auburn head coach Sonny Smith. Smith was the head coach for 11 seasons from 1978-89 and led the Tigers to a 173-154 record in that span that included five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1984-88.

AUBURN MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM DAY

» Following the Tigers' run to the Final Four, April 24, 2019 was declared "Auburn University Men's Basketball Team Day" in a proclamation by Alabama Governor Kay Ivey.

» Governor Ivey: "This team said, 'Why not us?' And for the first time in the history of Auburn men's basketball, this team went to the Final Four. And on the court and off the court, these team members brought dignity and determination to everything they did. They did it with class."

AUBURN TO FORGO 2021 POSTSEASON

» The Auburn men's basketball program will forgo postseason competition for the upcoming 2020-2021 season. The NCAA and the SEC have been notified.

» The athletics department and university administration, in conjunction with Coach Bruce Pearl, made the decision after careful deliberation and in light of the ongoing matter that surfaced in fall 2017 regarding former assistant coach Chuck Person. Auburn has cooperated with the NCAA and will continue to do so.

» We regret the impact this decision has on our student-athletes, yet it was made in the best long-term interest of the program. Because of the ongoing matter, we will not comment further but hope for swift consideration and resolution of the matter.

Bruce Pearl Statement

» "This was a difficult decision but the right decision. I hate it for our current players. They lost the opportunity for the postseason last year because of COVID, and now they will miss the postseason again. It's a two-year postseason penalty for them. However, we need to take this penalty now to put it behind us."

OKORO MAKES HISTORY

Dreams became reality for former Auburn star Isaac Okoro Wednesday night when he was chosen with the No. 5 overall selection in the 2020 NBA Draft by the Cleveland Cavaliers.

Okoro's selection is tied for the third-highest selection in program history behind only Chris Morris (No. 4, 1988) and Chuck Person (No. 4, 1986). Charles Barkley was also chosen No. 5 in the 1984 NBA Draft.

The Powder Springs, Ga. native became the first one-and-done player in program history.

Okoro was just the sixth player in Southeastern Conference history to be named All-SEC, All-Defensive and All-Freshman in the same season.

Following Okoro's No. 5 selection and Chuma Okeke's No. 16 pick in the 2019 NBA Draft, Auburn has produced back-to-back first round draft picks for the first time in program history.

Okoro averaged 12.9 points, 4.4 rebounds, two assists, 0.9 steals and 0.9 blocks in 31.5 minutes per game while starting 28 games as a first-year player in senior-laden lineup. The Tigers posted a 25-6 record during the 2019-20 campaign.

Okoro scored in double figures 20 times and was named the SEC Freshman of the Week twice, becoming just the fourth freshman in program history to earn the conference distinction two times in a season.

Okoro is the second Tiger to be drafted by the Cavaliers, joining Mike Mitchell, who was taken with the 15th selection of the 1978 NBA Draft. Along with Mitchell (1978-82), former lettermen Eddie Johnson (1985-86) and Wesley Person (1997-2002) all played for the Cavs.
