Auburn (2-7, 0-6 SEC) hosts No. 5-ranked Georgia (8-1, 6-1 SEC) in an SEC matchup on Saturday, November 10, 2012, at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in Auburn. Kickoff is 6:00 p.m. CT; the game will be televised by ESPN2. Renewing the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry, this will be the 116th overall and the 69th consecutive meeting between the teams.

FIRST AND 10

- Auburn leads the series against Georgia with a 54-53-8 record. Georgia has won seven of the last 10 matchups in the series
- The Tigers and Bulldogs have met every year since 1944 in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry
- Tre Mason's 152 yards rushing vs. NMSU were the most by an SEC player last week, and a career best for the sophomore tailback
- The Auburn field goal defense unit has blocked three kicks this season, two of those by Angelo Blackson and one by Corey Lemonier
- Auburn is 97-139-6 all-time against ranked opponents
- Linebacker Daren Bates' 62 yards fumble return for a touchdown against New Mexico State was the second lonegest such play in Auburn records
- Bates is third in the SEC (9.56 tackles/game); teammates Demetruce McNeal (9.33) and Jermaine Whitehead (8.11) rank fourth and seventh among conference tacklers
- Onterio McCalebb is just the second player in SEC history to tally more than 2,000 yards rushing (2,469), 1,000 kick return yards (1,246) and 500 receiving yards (528)
- Auburn has won 76 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points
- Linebacker Ashton Richardson has been chosen as a Rhodes Scholar finalist; he is one of 12 finalists to interview for two scholarship positions Nov. 16-17 in Birmingham

Series Records

Auburn leads the series against Georgia with a 54-53-8 record. Georgia has won seven of the last 10 in the series, which is the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry.

World war has been the only thing to prevent Auburn and Georgia from playing football. The two teams did not play in 1943, only because Auburn did not field a team due to World War II. The two teams did not play in 1917 and 1918 because of WWI and the subsequent influenza outbreak. With those two exceptions, Auburn and Georgia have played continuously since 1898.

The Auburn-Georgia series (115 games) is older than the Georgia-Georgia Tech (103 games) and the Auburn-Alabama series (76 games). Auburn and Georgia first met in 1892; each first played its in-state rival in 1893.

Some additional Auburn-Georgia series notes:

Through 115 meetings, Georgia has outscored Auburn by just 76 points (1,854-1,779), only 0.6 points per game.

In the last 21 meetings (1991-2011), the team that has won the turnover battle has gone 14-2-1, with the only exceptions coming in 2010 and 1991.

In games decided by three points or less, Auburn leads, 8-5-8.

In games decided by seven points or less, Georgia leads, 23-19-8.

Road-Field Advantage

The Auburn-Georgia series has taken hospitality to a new level. Auburn owns a winning record in Athens (18-12) while Georgia has a winning mark on the Plains (14-10-2). The Tigers have won 10 of their last 15 games at Sanford Stadium and Georgia has won on five of its last eight trips to Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Former Auburn coach Terry Bowden never beat Georgia in Auburn (0-1-1), but never lost to the Bulldogs in Athens (3-0). Tommy Tuberville had a better road record (3-2) than home record (2-3) against Georgia and Pat Dye had a better record in Athens (4-2) than he did against Georgia in Auburn (3-3). Legendary Georgia coach Vince Dooley (1964-88), an Auburn graduate, had better success against the Tigers in Auburn (7-5-1) than he did in Athens (4-8).

SEC Numbers

In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 291-229-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 118-51-6 all-time, and are 9-6 in SEC home contests under Gene Chizik since 2009.

In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 173-178-12 overall. Under Chizik, Auburn is 7-9 in SEC road play.

In Night Games

In games starting at 5 p.m. or later local time during the Chizik era, the Tigers are 16-7 overall. At home in night games, Auburn is 10-3; the Tigers are 4-3 at an opponent's stadium and 2-1 in neutral site games.

30+ Points Equals Victory

Auburn has won 76 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 293-4 all-time when scoring at least 30 points.

First College Action

A total of 21 different players have seen their first career action for Auburn during the 2012 season. The complete list: Mike Blakely, Sammie Coates, Kris Frost, Justin Garrett, Corey Grant, Forrest Hill, Joshua Holsey, Jonathan Jones, Jake Lembke, Ricardo Louis, Cassanova McKinzy, Patrick Miller, JaBrian Niles, Jay Prosch, Melvin Ray, Greg Robinson, Jordan Spriggs, Anthony Swain, Jonathan Wallace, Christian Westerman, Avery Young.

Seven of those are true freshmen and eight are redshirt freshmen. Freshmen have made 25 starts for Auburn this season (17 by true freshmen; 8 by redshirt freshmen).

The O-Zone

Auburn's versatile Onterio McCalebb is just the second SEC player all-time to record more than 2,000 career rushing yards, 1,000 career kick return yards, and 500 career receiving yards. The first was Kentucky's Derrick Locke (2,618 yards rushing, 1,464 yards on kick returns, and 883 receiving yards from 2007-10.)

McCalebb now has 2,469 yards rushing to rank ninth among Auburn's career leaders. His 6.40 yards per carry average places him third all-time at Auburn, behind Brent Fullwood (7.15) and Bo Jackson (6.62). That 6.40 average ranks McCalebb second among the NCAA's active players in that statistic.

His 113-yard performance on the ground in the win over New Mexico State was Mc-Calebb's fifth career 100-yard rushing game and his second this season. His 128 yards vs. ULM were the second-highest single game total of his career. With two TD runs of 38 and 7 yards against New Mexico State, McCalebb now has 22 career rushing touchdowns (10th best in AU history), and 27 touchdowns overall. McCalebb is fifth among Auburn's career all-purpose yardage leaders with 4,243 yards.

He is third on the receptions by a running back list with 57 and fifth for RB receiving yardage with 528; next is Carl Stewart (612/2004-07). McCalebb had a streak of 23 straight games where he caught at least one pass stopped against Texas A&M; he had 49 receptions for 430 yards during that span.

McCalebb's kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half at Mississippi State was the second such score of his career; the senior from Fort Meade, Fla., scored on an 83-yd return vs. Alabama in 2011. It was Auburn's first 100-yard return since Tim Carter vs. LSU in 2000. The last player to return a kickoff for a touchdown vs. Mississippi State was Arkansas' Darren McFadden in 2006. During the Chizik Era, five kickoff returns have gone for touchdowns. AU had its previous five kickoff returns for TD in a 298-game span from 1984-2008.

The Line On Lutz

With Philip Lutzenkirchen sidelined by season-ending surgery, one of the most productive tight end careers in Auburn annals has concluded. Lutz finishes his career third all-time in Auburn career receiving yards by a tight end, with 628, passing Fred Baxter (1991-92) who had 584 career receiving yards. Lutz is second in career catches by a tight

end with 59, behind only Cooper Wallace (63 rec/2002-05). Lutzenkirchen finished with the Auburn record for career touchdowns by a tight end with 14.

The 1-2-3 Punch

The third member of Auburn's skilled senior 1-2-3 Punch has been receiver Emory Blake, also making a mark on the record book. Blake had 106 yards on five catches versus Texas A&M, his seventh career 100-yard game, and followed up with 78 yards on four cathes against New Mexico State.

Starting the season with a then career-best 109 receiving yards versus Clemson, Blake topped that total with 118 yards receiving on 10 catches against Arkansas, both career highs. This was the most catches by an Auburn receiver in a game since the 2009 season, when Darvin Adams had 10 receptions against Northwestern in the Outback Bowl.

With 117 receptions to date, Blake is just the ninth receiver in Auburn history to record 100 career catches; his current per-catch average of 15.74 yards is fifth among that group.

Blake is fifth on the Auburn career touchdown receptions list with 16 scores, including a 27-yard TD against Texas A&M. Blake is sixth on Auburn's all-time receptions list (117) and eighth in career receiving yardage (1,842).

Tackling Daren Bates

Senior linebacker Daren Bates, now with 308 career tackles, is 12th among Auburn's career tackle leaders.recorded a career-best 16 tackles at Ole Miss, his fourth double-digit tackle game of the 2012 season.

Bates led Auburn with 104 tackles last year, and has recorded 86 tackles this season, an average of 9.56 per contest. Bates is third in the SEC in tackles per game average. No AU player since the NCAA began using press box tackle totals instead of coaches' film (2004) has had back-to-back 100+ seasons; the last to do so was Takeo Spikes in 1996-97.

Bates' fumble return for a touchdown of 62 yards against New Mexico State was the longest fumble return for a score in Auburn records since 1969; the previous long was 60 vards by Ed Graham at Florida State in 1984. (The longest ever at Auburn is believed to be a 91-yard return by Gusty Yearout in 1966 vs. Florida.) It was Bates' first career touchdown and the first defensive touchdown by Auburn this season.

Top Ten Tacklers

Three Auburn defenders rank among the top 10 tacklers in the SEC thus far this season. Linebacker Daren Bates is third in the conference averaging 9.56 tackles per game. Safety Demetruce McNeal, whose best effort was an 18-tackle performance at Mississippi State, ranks fourth in the SEC at 9.33 tackles per game. Safety Jermaine Whitehead, at 8.11 tackles per game, is seventh among the SEC leaders.

Tre Mason On The Carry

Sophomore Tre Mason's second-quarter touchdown run against New Mexico State was his fifth touchdown run in the last four games. It was Mason's sixth score of the season, most on the team.

Mason recorded his second 100-yard game of the season, gaining a career-high 152 against New Mexico State; his first came with 106 yards against Clemson. His 22 carries versus NMSU were also a career best.

Items Of Note/Vs. New Mexico State

Onterio McCalebb and Tre Mason each passed the 100-yard rushing mark vs. New Mexico State. The last time Auburn had two 100-yard rushers in a game was vs. LSU in 2010 (Cam Newton and Michael Dyer).

With 311 rushing yards against New Mexico State, Auburn topped the 300-yard rushing mark for the first time since gaining 315 against Georgia in 2010.

Auburn opponents have missed nine of their last 14 field goal attempts and are 9-of-19 for the season on field goal tries. New Mexico State was 0-1 on field goal attempts.

Quan Bray's 38-yard punt return was a career long for him; it was the longest by an Auburn player since a 66-yard return for a score by Robert Dunn in 2008 vs. ULM.

2012 is the ninth season since 1969 that Auburn has had two guarterbacks make their first career start in the same season. The previous seasons: 1972, 1977, 1980, 1984, 1998, 2001, 2005, 2011.

The last time Auburn started three quarterbacks in a season was 1999: Gabe Gross (one game); Ben Leard (six games); Jeff Klein (four games).

Saturday was the second consecutive AU game vs. New Mexico State in which an Auburn QB made his first career start. Kodi Burns made his first career start vs. New Mexico State in 2007.

This was the 35th time in the modern era (since 1946) that Auburn played consecutive games against teams with the same nickname; the pairings included the Texas A&M and New Mexico State Aggies; Georgia, Mississippi State, Louisiana Tech and Samford Bulldogs; and the Eagles of Boston College and Southern Miss.

The D-Line

Auburn's veteran defensive line can account for 101 career starts among seven Tigers: Nosa Eguae, Corey Lemonier, Jeffrey Whitaker, Kenneth Carter, Gabe Wright, Dee Ford and Angelo Blackson. They are averaging more than 16.2 tackles and four quarterback hurries per game.

That group accounted for 22 tackles in the opener with Clemson. Preseason All-American Corey Lemonier was credited with nine tackles and a pair of sacks (-7); that marks the third time in eight games that Lemonier recorded a multiple-sack game. Junior Dee Ford had two sacks of Clemson's Tajh Boyd for -14 yards; those two sacks and his seven tackles overall were both career bests for Ford.

Against Mississippi State, the defensive line came up with 17 tackles, 3.5 TFL and a sevenyard sack by Lemonier. Angelo Blackson also blocked a Mississippi State field goal attempt, the first blocked field goal by Auburn since Jake Ricks had a field goal block versus Kentucky in 2009.

In the win over ULM, the defensive line accounted for 19 tackles, including an 8-yard sack by Ford, and 9 quarterback hurries; Lemonier led the group with 5 tackles and 4 hurries, and he blocked a third-quarter ULM field-goal attempt, the second blocked kick of his career (he previously blocked a South Carolina PAT attempt in 2011). And in overtime, Blackson tipped a ULM field goal attempt for his second block in as many weeks.

Lemonier came through with two sacks (-15) against LSU to give him 16.5 sacks for his career, placing him among Auburn's career top 10 in that statistic. The junior from Hialeah, Fla., has recorded four multiple-sack games during his career, twice this season. 2012 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

Against LSU, both Whitaker and Blackson forced opponent fumbles and Lemonier was credited with a fumble recovery.

Blackson also forced fumbles against Arkansas and Vanderbilt. Lemonier recovered a VU fumble. Eguae recorded his first sack of the season against Texas A&M.

Auburn got sacks from Blackson, Ford and Kemiya Harrell (a career first) against New Mexico State.

Average Per Down

Here's a breakdown of how the 2012 Auburn offense is operating on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Tigers have run a total of 239 plays, gaining 1,441 yards for an average of 6.0 yards per play. On second down, AU has tried 170 plays for 961 yards, an average of 5.7 per play.

On third down, the Tigers have run 109 plays, gaining 362 yards for a 3.8 average. Auburn has tried only six fourth-down attempts this season, gaining four yards.

Auburn's touchdowns this season have come five times on first down (3 rush, 2 pass), nine times on second (4 pass, 5 rush), and four times on third down (3 rush, 1 pass).

When Scoring 20+ Points

Since 2001, Auburn is 100-14 (.877) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 143-21-1 (.869) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

Scoring By Quarters

This season in the first quarter, the Tigers have been outscored by the opposition 68-21. In the second quarter, Auburn holds a 64-54 advantage in scoring. In the third quarter, Auburn outscores trails its opponents 65-48. Opponents have outscored Auburn 76-20 in the fourth quarter thus far this season. Auburn has held its opponents scoreless in nine quarters this year.

Dazzling Debut

Linebacker Cassanova McKinzy, a true freshman who recorded 12 tackles in his first career start at Vanderbilt, tallied the secondhighest tackle total in an Auburn first start since press box defensive stats became official in 2004.

In Non-Conference Games

Richardson Rhodes Scholarship Finalist

Senior linebacker Ashton Richardson has been named a finalist for the Rhodes Scholarship, marking the fourth straight year an Auburn student-athlete has become a Rhodes finalist.

The Rhodes Scholarships, founded in 1904, are the oldest international fellowships. Winners of the scholarship have the opportunity to

do graduate work at the University of Oxford in the United Kingdom.

Richardson is an Honors College student majoring in Animal Sciences (pre-veterinary medicine) in Auburn's College of Agriculture with a cumulative grade point average of 3.94. Richardson is a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll honoree and earlier this year was a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, presented to the top football scholar-athlete in the country. Richardson, who grew up helping his father raise quarter-horses, has aspirations to become an equine surgeon.

The four-year letterman has played in 32 career games, registering 13 tackles. In 2012 Richardson has played in all eight games, making four tackles, recording one sack and recovering one fumble. Richardson walked on to the football team as a freshman and earned a scholarship prior to his junior season.

A New Orleans, La., native, Richardson is writing his Honors thesis tentatively titled "Comparison of Articular Cartilage Thickness in Cadaveric Equine Limbs" under the direction of Reid Hanson, Professor of Equine Surgery in the College of Veterinary Medicine. He is scheduled to graduate from Auburn in December. Off the field, Richardson has volunteered each week for the past four years as a mentor at the Lee County Youth Development Center.

The next step for Richardson is a two-day interview process. He will appear before the District VII Selection Committee Nov. 16-17 in Birmingham, joining 12 other finalists from the district. Two finalists from District VII will be selected as 2013 Rhodes Scholars.

"The Auburn Family has been tremendous in helping me pursue my dreams," Richardson added. "From the day I walked on to campus, there have been numerous people who have embraced me and have gone above and beyond to help me handle the challenges of being a student. My experience in athletics has taught me hard work and perseverance, and applying yourself every day. If I can go to the interviews and adequately represent what I have learned and experienced at Auburn, it will be an incredible experience."

Richardson is the fifth Auburn studentathlete to be named a Rhodes finalist in the past four years. Other past finalists include former diver Dan Mazzaferro, swimming and diving student-athletes Erica Meissner and Jordan Anderson and former gymnast Krissy Voss. Anderson won the Rhodes Scholarship in 2009.

Good Works Team

Auburn senior Philip Lutzenkirchen is one of 22 members of the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team[®], one of college football's most prestigious off-the-field honors recognizing a select group of players committed to making a difference in their communities.

Lutzenkirchen has made supporting children with cancer his personal mission, by visiting them and bringing teammates along, corresponding with them, and offering encouragement to siblings and family. A member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, he is scheduled to graduate in December with a bachelor's degree in communication.

James Owens Among SEC Legends

The Southeastern Conference 2012 Football Legends Class includes 14 former SEC stars who have made a name for themselves as great athletes on the playing field. Auburn's 2012 recipient is James Owens, the first African-American football player at Auburn.

A Fairfield native, Owens lettered at Auburn as a fullback from 1969-72. During three seasons on the varsity, he helped Auburn to a 28-5 record and played a key role on the 1972 Amazin's team, which defied the odds and finished the season with a 10-1 record and a top five national finish.

The class will be honored at the 2012 SEC Football "Weekend of Champions" Nov. 30-Dec. 1 in Atlanta, Ga. The annual SEC Legends Dinner presented by AT&T will be held Nov. 30 at the Atlanta Hyatt Regency; the group will be recognized prior to the SEC Football Championship Game at the Georgia Dome on Saturday, December 1.

Where They Go Next

Auburn hosts Alabama A&M on Senior Day at Jordan-Hare Stadium Saturday, November 17; kickoff time for that game is 1 p.m. Central. The contest, which is Auburn's final home game of the 2012 season, will be televised on pay-per-view. Georgia hosts Georgia Southern that day.

Kickoff Kings

Auburn is sixth in the NCAA in kickoff return coverage (17.08 yards per return); only eight of the nation's 120 FBS teams hold opponents to 17.5 yards/return or less in that category.

The Tigers are third in the SEC in kickoff return average (25.32 yards/return), ranking 20th among NCAA leaders in that statistic. The Auburn season record for team kick return average is 27.3, set in 2005.

Onterio McCalebb ranks third in the SEC in kickoff return average, gaining 25.56 yards per run on his 16 returns this season. He is 33rd among NCAA leaders. The senior from Fort Meade, Fla., has six returns of 20 yards or better this season: 100 (Miss St); 45 (new Mexico State); 43 (LSU); 24 (ULM); 22 (Texas A&M); 20 (Miss St).

McCalebb's kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half at Mississippi State was the second of his career; he scored on an 83yard return vs. Alabama in 2011. It was AU's first 100-yard return since Tim Carter vs. LSU (2000). The last player to return a kickoff for a

touchdown versus Mississippi State was Darren McFadden (Arkansas, 2006).

It was the fifth kickoff return touchdown of the Chizik era. Prior to that, Auburn had just five kickoff returns for a TD in a 298-game span from 1984-2008.

Three Blocked Kicks

Auburn blocked two ULM field goal attempts and has three blocks on the season. Corey Lemonier blocked one with 3:52 left in the third quarter; Auburn was ahead 28-14 at the time. Lemonier has two career blocks, the other on an extra point against South Carolina in 2011.

Angelo Blackson had the second blocked field goal vs. ULM, tipping the Warhawks' try in overtime. With a block of a field goal attempt at Mississippi State as well, Blackson hadblocks in back-to-back games. Auburn has blocked five opponent kicks (3 FG, 2 punt) in the last five games. The Tigers have 12 total blocked kicks during the Chizik era.

Parkey For Three

Cody Parkey, who kicked the game-winning 35-yard field goal in overtime against ULM, converted on nine straight three-pointers dating back through last season, before missing on a 49-yarder vs. Arkansas. That tied the third best string of consecutive field goals at Auburn since 1981.

With two successful field goals at both Ole Miss and Vanderbilt, Parkey is now 11-14 on field goals this year, and 20-20 this season on PAT kicks. His 46-yard field goal at Ole Miss tied his career long.

He made four field goals versus Clemson (37-46-27-36 yards), tying a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic record. Parkey's 46-yard field goal in the third quarter vs. Clemson was a career long, earning him Lou Groza Award star of the week honors. Parkey's game-winner against ULM earned him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

Parkey ranks fourth in Auburn career field goal percentage at .750 (24-32), just behind Scott Etheridge (.791/1992-93), Matt Hawkins (.788/1994-95) and Win Lyle (.763/1987-89).

No Return Policy

Punter Steven Clark, a 2011 Ray Guy Award finalist, continues to excel. Only four of his 53 punts this season have been returned.

Clark is averaging 41.1 yards per punt, placing 13 kicks inside the 20. His long kick of the season was 54 yards against LSU; he has six punts this year of 50 yards or more.

For his career, Clark has a 40.6 average on 134 career punts, with 48 punts landing inside the 20 and 19 kicks of 50 yards or longer.

LAST MEETING WITH GEORGIA

Aaron Murray threw four touchdown passes, Isaiah Crowell rushed for 132 yards and a touchdown and Carlton Thomas had 127 rushing yards as No. 14 Georgia downed No. 24 Auburn, 45-7, Nov. 12., at Sanford Stadium in Athens, Ga.

Sophomore Michael Dyer eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark on the season with a 17-yard gain on the first play of the second half to become just the fourth Tiger to record consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons. Dyer, who has 1,037 rushing yards this year, ran for an Auburn freshman-record 1,093 yards last season. The Little Rock, Ark., native joined James Brooks (1978-79), Stephen Davis (1994-95) and Carnell Williams (2003-04) in the exclusive club.

Georgia took a 7-0 lead on the opening drive of the game as Murray threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Tavarres King on third down, the fourth such conversion on the 70-yard drive that included a pivotal 44-yard completion to Malcolm Mitchell to the Auburn 11 on a 3rd and 15.

Auburn came right back as Clint Moseley tossed an option reverse to freshman wide receiver C.J. Uzomah, who completed his first career pass, a four-yard touchdown to Philip Lutzenkirchen with 6:13 left in the opening quarter. The play was set up by Moseley's 45-yard play-action pass to Emory Blake down to the Bulldog 9. The Tigers drove 76 yards on eight plays in 2:47. It was all Georgia after that as the Bulldogs scored 38 straight points to end the game.

Georgia continued the first quarter shootout on Murray's second touchdown pass, a 27-yard beauty to a diving Michael Bennett on tight coverage by Neiko Thorpe to put the Bulldogs up 14-7 with 3:02 on the clock.

Eltoro Freeman, who had two fumble recoveries and one forced, recovered his first Bulldog fumble at the Auburn 45 less than two minutes into the second quarter. On the next play, Onterio McCalebb mishandled a toss on a reverse from Dyer and Georgia recovered at the Auburn 40. That led to Murray finding fullback Bruce Figgins out of the backfield for a 15-yard touchdown completion, giving Georgia a 21-7 lead with 10:36 left in the half.

On Auburn's next possession, Baccari Rambo picked off Moseley and returned it 24 yards for a touchdown as Georgia went ahead 28-7 after back-to-back turnovers led to 14 Bulldog points in 55 seconds.

Georgia increased its lead to 35-7 as Murray and Mitchell teamed up for the second time, this time on 25 yards for a touchdown. The score came on another third down conversion by Georgia, its seventh in seven tries to open the game.

The Bulldogs scored the only points of the third quarter as Brandon Bogotay kicked a 26-yard field goal for a 38-7 lead with 7:32 left in the period. Crowell closed out the scoring on a nine-yard touchdown run with 5:59 remaining for a 45-7 Georgia lead.

Emory Blake had six receptions for 101 yards for Auburn while Moseley completed 11-of-22 passes for 140 yards. Dyer finished with 48 yards rushing on 13 carries.

Corey Lemonier forced two fumbles in the first half, becoming the first Auburn player to accomplish the feat since Quentin Groves in 2006 while Freeman's two fumble recoveries were the first for a Tiger since Sen'Derrick Marks.

GAME 1

Cody Parkey made a career-high four field goals and Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards for Auburn but No. 14 Clemson edged past the Tigers for a hard-fought 26-19 victory in the Chick-fil-A Game in the season opener for both teams at the Georgia Dome on Saturday.

Emory Blake caught four passes for a career-high 109 yards and a touchdown while sophomore Kiehl Frazier threw for 194 yards and one touchdown on 11-of-27 passing and one interception in his first career start for Auburn. Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards while Onterio McCalebb add 82 yards.

The game was tied at 16 entering the final quarter after Parkey tied with a field goal with 55 seconds left in the third. Daren Bates intercepted Tajh Boyd and returned it 12 yards to the Clemson 35 on the first play of the fourth quarter. It set up Parkey making his career-high fourth field goal of the game, a 36-yarder to give Auburn a 19-16 lead with 12:50 remaining.

Clemson then scored the final 10 points of the game to outlast Auburn.

In the back-and-forth game, Clemson came right back on a 10-play, 75-yard drive as Boyd threw a 4-yard fade route to DeAndre Hopkins, who had a Clemson single-game record 13 receptions for 119 yards, in the back right corner of the end zone as Clemson took the lead for good, 23-19, with 9:17 left.

Clemson stopped Auburn on the next possession and drove 79 yards on the strength of Andre Ellington's 45-yard run to the Auburn 8. Auburn's defense stopped Clemson at the 1-yard line for the second time to give itself another shot. Chandler Catanazaro made his fourth field goal of the game for a 26-19 Clemson lead with 1:24 left.

Ellington rushed for 231 yards on 26 carries while Boyd threw for 208 yards and a touchdown on 24-of-34 passing.

Clemson opened the game's scoring as Catanazaro made a 39-yard field goal with 5:22 left in the first quarter. Auburn's defense held after Clemson drove 83 yards down to the Auburn 1-yard

line.

GAME 2

Tyler Russell threw for three touchdowns and 222 yards to lead Mississippi State to 28-10 victory over Auburn in the SEC opener for both teams at Scott Field on Saturday. Demetruce McNeal led the Tigers with a career-high 18 tackles.

With the Auburn offense struggling in the first half, Onterio McCalebb returned the second half kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown to give the Tigers a 10-7 lead. It was the second of his career, the other an 83-yarder vs. Alabama last year, and Auburn's first 100-yarder since Tim Carter vs. LSU in 2000.

However, it was all Mississippi State after that.

Mississippi State (2-0, 1-0) answered quickly as the Bulldogs drove 75 yards in eight plays to regain the lead, 14-10, on Russell's 13-yard touchdown pass to Chad Bumphis touchdown with 11:35 left in the third.

After holding Auburn (0-2, 0-1) to another three and out, State drove 58 yards and took a 21-10 lead on Russell's third touchdown pass, a 3-yard play action to a wide-open Marcus Green, who scored his second of the day, in the back corner of the end zone with 4:38 to go in the third.

The Bulldogs iced the game as LaDarius Perkins scampered 21 yards breaking four tackles to give State a 28-10 lead with 12:33 left in the game.

Mississippi State outgained Auburn 388 to 216 as the Tigers didn't score an offensive touchdown. The Tigers had 91 yards rushing, led by freshman Mike Blakely's 42 yards on 11 carries. Kiehl Frazier completed on 13-of-22 passes for 125 yards to go along with five turnovers, three interceptions and two fumbles. Quan Bray had six receptions for 50 yards while Emory Blake caught two passes for 31 yards.

GAME 3

Cody Parkey's overtime field goal clinched Auburn's first win of the season as it defeated Louisiana-Monroe, 31-28, on Saturday afternoon at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Angelo Blackson made Parkey's game-winning kick possible as he blocked a ULM field goal attempt just minutes earlier during ULM's first overtime possession.

Auburn (1-2) saw a 14-point lead disappear late in the fourth quarter as ULM (1-1) rallied from a 28-14 deficit to tie the game with 1:18 left in regulation before the overtime heroics from Blackson and Parkey.

Auburn finished the game with a season-high 418 yards of total offense, including 255 on the ground. Onterio McCalebb finished with a 128 yards, his fourth career 100-yard rushing game, while Tre Mason had 90 yards rushing on a game-high 22 carries.

Kiehl Frazier was 10-of-18 for 130 yards with a touchdown and an interception while his counterpart from ULM, Kolton Browning, was 28-of-46 for 237 yards with three touchdowns.

ULM went 89 yards on its first drive of the game, a 12-play march, and converted on a fourth-and-goal from the one to take the early touchdown lead, 7-0. The drive was capped by a Browning to Harley Scioneaux pass into the corner of the end zone, the first of two touchdown catches for the ULM tight end.

Auburn answered with a five-play, 76-yard scoring drive of its own on its first possession. Mc-Calebb had three carries on the drive, including the 27-yard touchdown run, while Mason had a 34-yard reception on the previous play to get Auburn into ULM territory as Auburn tied it at 7-7.

Browning put ULM back up a touchdown, 14-7, with his 39-yard touchdown run up the middle with 3:52 left in the first half. The run capped a six-play, 80-yard drive that ate up just 2:54 of clock time. Auburn immediately answered with a quick strike of its own, using a Quan Bray pass back to Frazier for the score. The pass covered 33 yards as Auburn went 75 yards in four plays to tie it at 14-14 with 2:18 left in the half.

Auburn struck one more time before the half as Frazier's 33-yard pass to Sammie Coates as time expired put Auburn ahead. 21-14. Auburn took advantage of a 33-vard punt by the

GAME 4

Auburn's defense held LSU to a season-low 351 total yards and only three points in the final three quarters but fell to the visitors from Baton Rouge, 12-10, on Saturday night before 86,721 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn (1-3, 0-2 SEC) got an outstanding performance from its defense, forcing a pair of LSU turnovers, but could not get a crucial stop late in the fourth quarter with enough time left to have a final scoring chance as LSU's final drive ate up most of the final four minutes.

LSU (4-0, 1-0 SEC) had a chance to extend its lead with less than a minute to play, but Drew Alleman's 34-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right. Auburn had one final possession with 37 seconds left, starting from their own 20, but could only manage 17 yards with no timeouts remaining, and Kiehl Frazier's final desperation heave with no time left was intercepted to end the game.

LSU appeared to be driving for the end zoneon their first possession, but Mettenberger fumbled the snap at the Auburn 2-yard-line, where it was recovered by Jeffery Whitaker to end the LSU threat. It was just the second fumble lost by LSU so far this season.

But LSU would find its way onto the scoreboard on Auburn's next play from scrimmage, taking a 2-0 lead on a safety when Tre Mason was tackled in the end zone by Sam Montgomery. It was the first safety scored against Auburn since the Tigers' 3-2 victory over Mississippi State in 2008.

LSU would then take advantage of the good field position after the safety, driving 59 yards in nine plays and taking a 9-0 lead on a one-yard touchdown run by Michael Ford with 4:18 to play in the first quarter.

After taking over deep in LSU territory when Corey Lemonier sacked Mettenberger and forced a fumble that was recovered by Angelo Blackson, Tre Mason went around left end for 26 yards to the LSU 4-yard-line. On the next play, McCalebb walked into the end zone for Auburn's first touchdown of the night, cutting the deficit to 9-7 as time expired in the opening period.

The Arkansas Razorbacks forced five Auburn turnovers and sacked Tiger quarterbacks eight times in a 24-7 Razorback win Saturday afternoon before 85,819 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Razorbacks outgained the Tigers, 372-321, including a 130-40 advantage in rushing yards, yet Auburn had 22 first downs to Arkansas' 19. Auburn also matched a season-high with five turnovers and was unable to take advantage of Arkansas' two giveaways.

Emory Blake paced the Auburn offense with 10 catches for 118 yards and Auburn's only score. During the game, he hauled in his 100th career reception, becoming the eighth Auburn player to reach that mark, and now has 1,573 receiving yards for his career to move into a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn.

The Tigers used three quarterbacks for the first time this season. Kiehl Frazier earned the start and finished 9-of-14 for 118 yards and one interception, but was sacked four times in the game. Clint Moseley saw his first game action of the season, starting the second half an dfinishing 13-of-21 for 163 yards and a touchdown, but he also threw two picks and was sacked four times. Jonathan Wallace did not attempt a pass but rushed twice for 11 yards.

The Razorbacks struck first, taking their second possession of the game 80 yards in 10 plays, capped by a two-yard touchdown run from Dennis Johnson to take a 7-0 lead with just more than a minute left in the first quarter.

Arkansas took advantage of an Auburn turnover deep in Tiger territory midway through the second quarter and increased its lead to 10-0 on a 27-yard field goal from Zach Hocker with 6:33 to play in the half; the score would remain 10-0 at the half.

After neither team could generate much offense throughout the third quarter, Auburn mounted a 5-play, 68-yard scoring drive late in the period, cutting the deficit to 10-7 on a 21-yard touchdown pass from Moseley to Blake with 0:33 left. All five plays on the AU scoring drive went for positive yardage, including a 22-yard completion to Tre Mason and a 13-yard rush by

After Auburn scored 17 straight second quarter points, Ole Miss outscored Auburn 27-3 to run away with a 41-20 victory at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday. Tre Mason rushed for two touchdowns and 82 yards on 18 carries for the Tigers while Clint Moseley threw for 118 yards on 11-of-18 passing.

Ole Miss (4-3, 1-2) opened the game's scoring on a toss sweep to running back Randall Mackey, who threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to quarterback Bo Wallace down the left sideline with 7:14 left in the first quarter.

On Auburn's next possession from its own 28, backup center Tunde Fariyike, who was filling in for injured starter Reese Dismukes, snapped the ball over Moseley's head and C.J. Johnson recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown and a 14-0 Ole Miss lead less than two minutes later.

Auburn (1-5. 0-4) bounced right back and drove 74 yards in 13 plays and 6:43 as it cut the lead in half on a Mason 1- yard touchdown run just over a minute into the second quarter. That marked the Tigers' longest scoring drive of the season in plays and time of possession.

Auburn's defense continued to hold Ole Miss after the Rebels' opening drive as the Tigers took over on the Ole Miss 48. Two plays later, Auburn tied it 14-14. On first down, it was a Leroy High to Leroy High connection as Moseley completed a 42-yard pass to Sammie Coates to the Ole Miss 6. Tre Mason and Onterio McCalebb combined for 265 rushing yards and three touchdowns, and Auburn snapped a five-game losing skid with a 42-7 Homecoming victory over New Mexico State at Jordan-Hare Stadium Saturday afternoon.

Mason carried 22 times for a career-high 152 yards and a touchdown, averaging 6.9 yards per carry. Meanwhile, McCalebb made the most of his eight touches, picking up 113 yards (14.1/carry) while scoring two touchdowns.

Freshman Jonathan Wallace made his first start at quarterback, completing 9-of-16 attempts for 164 yards and a touchdown along with one interception.

Auburn outgained New Mexico State 475-305, including a 311-83 advantage on the ground. The Tigers also converted on 5-of-12 third-down opportunities and held NMSU to a 2-for-13 conversion rate. Auburn turned the ball over just once while the Aggies had two giveaways.

McCalebb got his first score when he broke loose on a 38-yard run around the right end for Auburn's fourth score of the day, its third via rushing touchdown, to make it 28-0 Tigers at the 2:58 mark of the third auarter. His run finished off a 96-vard scoring drive - Auburn's longest of the season by yardage - that lasted just seven plays and 3:26.

The Auburn senior would add his second touchdown of the day on a 7-yard run with 11:20 to play in the game, giving the Tigers a 35-7 lead. McCalebb's scoring run was set up by his own 45-yard kickoff return to near midfield, and a 40-yard run by Mason got Auburn in the red zone two plays later.

Trovon Reed capped off the scoring for Auburn with a 40-yard reception from Wallace for his first career touchdown, giving the Tigers a 42-7 lead with 7:19 to play. After a scoreless first quarter, the Tigers struck first with a five-yard touchdown run from

Mason that capped a 13-play, 89-yard drive to give Auburn a 7-0 lead with 4:56 to play in the half. It marked the longest scoring drive of the season for the Tigers. That would be the halftime score as NMSU would be unable to cross midfield.

The Tigers went to the ground game to open the third quarter, putting together a seven-play,

New Mexico State found its way onto the scoreboard early in the fourth quarter as Tiger Powell dove in from two yards out to make it a 28-7 game with 12:36 to play. The scoring play was set up by a 51-yard completion from Manley to Franklin down to the Auburn 6-yard-line.

In Homecoming activities at halftime, Auburn women's basketball player Blanche Alverson was named 2012 Miss Homecoming.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM



Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The most recent addition to the stadium was the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame

coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 19 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 28 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.2 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its inception in 1939 and hold an overall record of 287-73-7 there.

COACHING LEDGER

The 2012 season is Gene Chizik's 25th season as a coach in the collegiate ranks. Chizik began his career as a graduate assistant at both Middle Tennessee (1990-91) and Clemson (1988-89) before heading to Stephen F. Austin (1992-97). He then moved to Central Florida from 1998-2001 before making his first stop on The Plains (2002-04). Texas was his final post as an assistant coach. Chizik served as defensive coordinator with the Longhorns from 2005-06. Two seasons as the head coach at Iowa State (2007-08) preceded Chizik's tenure as head coach at Auburn (2009-current). He also spent two seasons coaching at the high school level in Florida.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

In 2010, in just his second season as head coach at Auburn, Gene Chizik led the Tigers to their first national championship in more than 50 years, defeating Oregon, 22-19, in the BCS Championship Game on Jan. 10, 2011, in Glendale, Ariz.

SEC CHAMPS

Chizik led Auburn to the Southeastern Conference Championship in 2010, the seventh in program history. The Tigers routed South Carolina, 56-17, at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta on Dec. 4, en route to the national title. It was also Auburn's seventh SEC West Title.

.653 WINNING PERCENTAGE

Auburn has a 32-17 record the last threeplus seasons under Gene Chizik for a .653 winning percentage. The Tigers have posted no fewer than eight wins in each of his seasons as head coach. When playing at home, Auburn is 22-6 under Chizik.

ALL-SEC

Under Coach Chizik, eight Auburn players have been named All-SEC First Team, including current Tigers Steven Clark and Corey Lemonier.

Auburn has been to three straight bowl games under Chizik, including the 2010 BCS Championship Game. In his first season as

head coach, the Tigers brought home a 38-35 overtime win over Northwestern at the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1, in Tampa, Fla. The following season, Auburn defeated Oregon, 22-19, for the national title, and in 2011, the Tigers earned a decisive, 43-24, victory against Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in Atlanta on Dec. 31.

Auburn has signed three straight Top 10 national recruiting classes under Chizik.

Since Chizik arrived on the Plains, four different Auburn players have been first-team All-America while also winning the Heisman Trophy, Lombardi Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Walter Camp Award and Maxwell Award. Chizik himself was named National Coach of the Year for 2010.

Since Chizik was hired, 63 Tig er football players have earned their academic degrees from Auburn.

Chizik has coached seven former Tigers who went on to become NFL draft picks, including Cam Newton, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers.
