FOOTBALL CELEBRATES MILITARY APPRECIATION DAY

» No. 16 Auburn (6-3, 3-2) hosts SEC West opponent Mississippi State (5-4, 3-3) on Saturday, November 13, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn. ESPN will televise the 11:00 a.m. CT matchup.

Auburn hosts its annual Military Appreciation Day. Bald eagle Spirit will be making her final stadium flight; this will be her 47th flight since her first flight before the 2002 Syracuse game.

THE HARSIN DEBUT

>> Head coach Bryan Harsin began his tenure on the Plains with a 60-10 victory over Akron. Harsin now holds an 82-27 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State).

Auburn's 60 points were the most by an Auburn coach in his first game; the previous best was 37 points in Gene Chizik's opener vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009. Auburn's 142 points in the first three contests set a new program record for the most points in a head coach's first three games.

SERIES HISTORY

>> The Tigers hold a 65-27-2 (.702) record all-time against Mississippi State and have won eight of the last 12 matchups against the Bulldogs. Auburn was a 56-23 winner in Auburn in 2019 and a 24-10 victor in Starkville last season; the home team has won seven of the last 10 games.

Auburn has a 30-7 advantage in all games played at Auburn, a 14-7-1 lead in all games played at Starkville, and a 21-13-1 advantage in games played at neutral sites.


Those include Birmingham, Ala. (AU leads 14-11-1); Columbus, Miss. (AU leads 1-0); Jackson, Miss. (AU leads 5-2); and Montgomery, Ala. (AU leads 1-0).

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Auburn leads the SEC and is 12th nationally in team TFL at 7.44 per game (67 total TFL for the season)
- » John Samuel Shenker's 102-yard receving total at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn TE since 1994 (Andy Fuller vs. Florida)
- Auburn leads the SEC in net punting (44.09) and ranks fifth nationally in that statistics.
 Oscar Chapman leads the league with a 46.0 punting average, 16th best nationally
- Auburn's wins over Arkansas and Ole Miss were the Tigers' first wins over ranked teams in consecutive games since the 2013 season
- » Auburn's 282 points are the 21st-most scored through the first nine games of a season in program history
- Cornerback Roger McCreary is one of 18 semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Award

- >> The Tigers are seventh nationally in 4thdown defense percentage (.278)
- With 14 tackles and a career-best two sacks vs. Ole Miss, Zakoby McClain was the SEC, Lott IMPACT and Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week. He's the first Tiger to record at least 14 tackles in consecutive games (also 15 at Arkansas) since Rudy Ford in 2016
- Defensive end Colby Wooden earned SEC defensive lineman of the week honors for the second straight game with five stops against Ole Miss
- » Nehemiah Pritchett is sixth in the SEC in combined kick return yards. His 165 KOR yards vs. Georgia State were the seventh-most in a game in Auburn history
- Auburn is 24th nationally having allowed only 12 sacks this season, including four games not allowing a sack

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson earned CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors for 2020, the 15th player so honored in Auburn history. Carlson graduated in December with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and is currently pursuing an MBA at Auburn. Carlson was a second-team All-American and a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2020.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 35 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2020 season, including current team members Tank Bigsby, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Shedrick Jackson, Jacob Jasinski, Tate Johnson, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Tashawn Manning, Zakoby McClain, Roger McCreary, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, Zion Puckett, Jacob Quattlebaum, Malcolm Russell, John Samuel Shenker, Zykeivous Walker, Brooks Walton and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had 17 representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included John Reese Bellew, Jackson Billings, Elijah Canion, Oscar Chapman, Trey Elston, Brandon Frazier, Reed Hughes, Jake Levant, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Sawyer Pate, J.J. AD HONOR ROLL

Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. IN NOVEMBER

Auburn is 244-187-20 (.563) all-time in November. Auburn's November home record is 105-38-5 (.725). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 139-148-15 (.486).

Auburn is 8-7 in games on November 13 alltime, 7-4 against SEC teams, 4-4 against ranked teams and 2-2 in Auburn on that date.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn's 282 points are the 21st-most scored through the first nine games of a season in AU history; the most was 360 points in 2010.

It took Auburn only eight games to surpass its total of 276 points from 2020.

This is the third season Auburn scored at least 60 points in each of its first two games, along with 1932 and 1922.

» Auburn overcame double-digit deficits to win consecutive games for the first time since 2010. The Tigers trailed Georgia State 24-12 before scoring the game's last 22 points in a 34-24 victory, highlighted by a 13-play, 98-yard drive in the fourth quarter.

At LSU, Auburn was down 13-0 in the second quarter before rallying for a 24-19 victory, the Tigers' first win in Baton Rouge since 1999.

That was the Tigers' largest come-frombehind win on the road since the 2010 Iron Bowl. The game-winning drive totaled 92 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 1-yard Jarquez Hunter TD run with 3:11 remaining.

- Auburn's 1,151 yards of total offense through the first two games to start the season were the most in recorded history, surpassing the 2009 season (1,145).
- Since 2001, Auburn is 161-31 (.839) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 217-39-1 (.847) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 557-59-9 (.898) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 350-9 (.977) when scoring 30 points, 176-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

Auburn has scored in 113 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

- >> Auburn piled up 613 total yards against Akron, 20th most in program history and the most since the Tigers gained 633 yards vs. Kent State in 2019. Those were the second most yards in an opener in program history. The most came against SW Louisiana in 1985 (695 yards).
- The duo of Jarquez Hunter and Tank Bigsby is averaging 142.1 rushing yards per game this season (1,279 total yards) and has totaled nine TD on the ground.

As a duo, Bogsby and Hunter rank second in the SEC, joining Texas A&M's Isaiah Spiller and Devon Achane as the only sets of teammates to both be ranked among the top 10 rushers in the league. Hunter ranks seventh among all FBS players and third among freshman averaging 7.45 yards per carry, which would rank sixth on Auburn's single-season yards per carry list.

Bigsby has four 100-yard games this season, while Hunter has two.

Sophomore Tank Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games this season; that gave him four consecutive 100-yard rushing games back through last season, the first Auburn RB to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

The 48th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 1,000 career yards, he now ranks 28th with 1,569 career yards and 12 career scores.

Against Alabama State, he rushed for 122 yards on 11 carries; his 51-yard run in the third quarter was a career long.

Against Akron, Bigsby led Auburn with 119 rushing yards and two scores in its season-opening win. He added 102 yards and two scores at Penn State and 140 yards rushing with a TD vs. Ole Miss.

» In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen.

Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993. He ranks seventh in the SEC this season at 5.23 yards per carry.

True freshman Jarquez Hunter already ranks 10th among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 544 yards through nine games.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run is tied for fifth longest in the nation this season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

Against Akron, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was also the last freshman to open the season with back-to-back 100-yard games at Auburn (148, La Tech and 114, Miss St) in 2009.

» Shaun Shivers became Auburn's 49th career 1,000-yard rusher against Georgia; he now has 1,013 career rushing yards. Shivers' five receptions for 38 yards at LSU were both career highs for the senior; he eclipsed those marks with six catches for 40 yards at Texas AGM.

» Auburn is averaging 243.6 passing yards per game, on pace to be the fourth-most productive season in Auburn history. The Tigers are on pace to finish the regular season with 2,923 yards, which would be sixth in Auburn history and with a bowl game, on pace for 3,166 passing yards, which would rank third in program history.

Ouarterback Bo Nix rushed for two touchdowns and passed for another in the win over Ole Miss. He was 22-30 passing, gaining 276 yards with a TD pass to Jarquez Hunter. His TD runs were 11 and 7 yards.

Nix now has nine career games with a passing and rushing TD, passing Cam Newton (7) for the most such games among Auburn quarterbacks since 2000.

>> Nix is now 601-1016 (59.2%) in his career for 6,874 yards and 37 passing scores.

He ranks second in career pass completions (601) and attempts (1,016), fourth in career passing yardage (6,874) and sixth in career TD passes (37).

Nix recorded his fourth career game with three passing TDs against Akron. In the opener, Nix tied a career-best mark by completing 11 straight passes to begin the game. He previously completed 11 straight passes in Auburn's victory at Ole Miss in 2020.

- Bo Nix' 200-yard passing games: 340 (30-44) vs. Ole Miss, 2019 335 (16-21, 2 TD) vs. Mississippi St., 2019 300 (18-24, 3 TD) vs. LSU, 2020 292 (21-26, 2 TD) at Arkansas, 2021 292 (25-42, 1 TD) vs. Northwestern, 2020 276 (22-30, 1 TD) vs. Ole Miss, 2021 275 (20-22, 3 TD) vs. Akron, 2021 272 (24-47, 1 TD) at South Carolina, 2020 255 (23-44, 1 TD) at LSU, 2021 245 (30-50, 1 TD) vs. Georgia, 2019 238 (23-30, 1 TD) at Ole Miss, 2020 233 (16-27, 3 TD) vs. Kentucky, 2020 227 (23-38) at Alabama, 2020 220 (17-26, 1 TD) vs. Tennessee, 2020 217 (21-38) vs. Georgia, 2021 207 (19-37, 1 TD) vs. Tulane, 2019
- "In Auburn's win at LSU, Bo Nix made things happen on the ground and through the air, rushing for 74 yards and a TD, and showing off his fancy footwork on a pair of fourth-down conversions where he scrambled from multiple would-be tacklers, finding Tyler Fromm for a touchdown and Demetris Robertson to keep alive a late second-quarter drive. Nix earned SEC offensive player of the week honors.

Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards.

The junior passed his father, Patrick, who threw for 4,957 yards from 1992-95, after entering the night tied with him on the school's all-time career passing yardage list.

Going 20-22 with three TD passes against the Zips, Nix' pass efficiency rating of 240.91 was the second-best rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

- » Nix threw a school record 256 consecutive passes without an interception dating back to last year's Iron Bowl before his interception against Georgia. The junior has now had three streaks of at least 100 passes without an interception in his career, including the previous school record 250 consecutive passes without an INT from 2019-20 and a streak of 118 in 2019.
- Nix has made 33 consecutive starts at quarterback back through the 2019 season opener. That's tied with Pat Sullivan (1969-71) for the third most consecutive starts by an Auburn signalcaller since 1969.

The top two in consecutive QB starts: 45, Stan White (1990-93) and 34, Phil Gargis (1974-76).

- T.J. Finley engineered a 13-play, 98-yard go-ahead scoring drive against Georgia State, culminating in a 10-yard fourth-down touchdown pass to Shedrick Jackson with just 0:45 remaining. Only six Auburn scoring drives since 1970 have been longer than 98 yards.
- Shedrick Jackson caught the go-ahead 10yard pass from T.J. Finley with 0:45 remaining in the Georgia State game, one of four receptions against the Panthers.

Jackson led Auburn with five catches and 79 receiving yards against Akron. The senior totaled just 10 catches and 130 yards in his first three seasons at Auburn.

Sophomore Ja'Varrius Johnson caught the first three passes of his career for 51 yards, including a 34-yard TD, against the Zips.

Sophomore Kobe Hudson caught a 28-yard TD for his first career score, and was Auburn's leading receiver against Penn State (66 yds) and Georgia State (76 yds). Hudson leads the squad with 29 receptions for the season for 383 yards.

>> Grad transfer Demetris Robertson scored his first Auburn touchdown in the second quarter against Alabama State, a 6-yard reception from Bo Nix. His second TD reception was 28 yards in the third quarter and he added a 36-yard rush for a third score, the first Auburn player with three TD in a game since JaTarvious Whitlow vs. Mississippi State in 2019. The last Tiger with two TD catches in a game was Seth Williams vs. Kentucky last season.

Robertson had a team-best six receptions for 60 yards in the win at LSU and a 71-yard TD catch at Arkansas.

Tight end John Samuel Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker has had five catches in a game three times this season (vs. Akron for 38 yards and at Penn State for 62 yards). He had four receptions for 50 yards at Texas A&M.

His 25 catches this season rank him third among the season leaders for TE receptions at Auburn. His 323 yards this season are alsp third-most ever by an Auburn tight end.

Shenker is ninth in career catches by an Auburn tight end with 36, and he is 10th in career tight end receiving yardage with 431.

FOR THE DEFENSE

>> With 14 tackles and a career-best two sacks vs. Ole Miss, linebacker Zakoby McClain was the SEC, Lott IMPACT and Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week. He's the first Tiger to record at least 14 tackles in consecutive games (also 15 at Arkansas) since Rudy Ford in 2016.

- >> Auburn has not allowed a fourth-quarter point in any of its three SEC wins (at LSU, at Arkansas, vs. Ole Miss). In those three SEC wins, Auburn is outscoring its opponent 27-0 in the fourth quarter.
- Auburn has held its last two opponents, Ole Miss and Texas A&M, without a passing TD. It's the first time the Tigers have held consecutive opponents without a passing touchdown since 2017, when they did it against Georgia Southern and Clemson.

It is the first time Auburn has gone consecutive games without allowing a passing TD when both games were against SEC opponents since 2006, when the Tigers held Mississippi State and LSU without a passing

- Auburn hasn't allowed an offensive touchdown in its last six quarters of play, dating back to the second half of the Ole Miss game, which is the longest streak without allowing an offensive touchdown since 2019 (didn't allow a TD in the fourth quarter against Georgia, shut out Samford and didn't allow a TD in the first quarter vs. Alabama).
- Sophomore Colby Wooden was named SEC co-defensive lineman of the week with four tackles and two sacks in the win at Arkansas. He repeated that award with five tackles against Ole Miss.
- >> The 10 points allowed by Auburn in the first two games of the season marked the fewest points the Tigers have allowed in any two-game span since giving up three points each vs. Ole Miss and Tennessee Tech in 2007.

That was the fewest points Auburn allowed in the first two games of a season since the Tigers opened the 1996 season with shutouts of UAB and Fresno State.

The shutout of Alabama State was the 244th all-time shutout for Auburn.

- The Auburn defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards. That marks the fewest rushing yards allowed since the 2001 Florida game (-36 yards). LSU rushed for 33 yards, Alabama State gained only 46 yards on the ground and Penn State was held to 94 yards rushing.
- >> Zakoby McClain led the nation with 113 tackles in 2020, averaging 10.3 per game. That average ranked third in the SEC and 19th nationally. He was the first Auburn player to average 10 tackles per game since Dontarrious Thomas in 2001 (10.2 avg.).
- » McClain, a Lott IMPACT Trophy quarterfinalist, has 12 career double-figure tackle games (five last season) and he has led the Tigers in tackles 13 times in his career, including seven tackles in the opener vs. Akron, 10 against Alabama State, 12 at LSU, 15 at Arkansas and 14 vs. Ole Miss.

The junior now has 243 tackles for his career, the 10th most tackles recorded by any Auburn player since 2000.

McClain is looking to become Auburn's first player with 100+ tackles in back-to-back seasons since Takeo Spikes in 1996 (119) and 1997 (136).

- Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 61 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 166 total TD during that 74-game span (2.24 per game).
- » Bednarik Award semifinalist Roger McCreary ranks third in the SEC and 15th nationally with 1.2 passes defended per game (2 interceptions and 9 PBU).
- With 27 career passes broken up, McCreary is tied for seventh with Javaris Davis (2016-19) in career PBU among Auburn players since 1996. The leaders in that group is Jim Thorpe Award winner Carlos Rogers (40 from 2001-04).
- y Jaylin Simpson's key fourth-quarter interception vs. Ole Miss was the first of his career and Auburn's fifth pick of the season.

Bydarrius Knighten's interception of a fourth-down LSU pass with 1:09 remaining sealed Auburn's win at Tiger Stadium.

Smoke Monday's 36-yard interception for a touchdown with 0:31 remaining sealed the win over Georgia State; it was the senior's third career pick six (also Tennessee, 2020, and Alabama, 2019).

Roger McCreary, who had a pick six against Alabama State, is the first Tiger to record interceptions in consecutive games since Jeremiah Dinson vs. Southern Miss and Mississippi State in 2018.

McCreary scored his first career touchdown with a 35-yard interception return against Alabama State; his interception at Penn State gives him six picks for his career.

Last season, McCreary was the first Auburn player to record three interceptions in a season since Joshua Holsey in 2016.

Auburn is 63-24 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 38-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 11-14 when it fails to force a turnover.

The Tigers have lost only nine turnovers this season in 631 plays: six fumbles and three interceptions. That ties for 23rd nationally.

Auburn's three interceptions thrown this season are tied for sixth-fewest among all FBS teams. The Tigers are one of four teams that has thrown at least 300 pass attempts with no more than three interceptions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks third in Auburn career scoring with 348 points.

He ranks eighth in the SEC in scoring at 8.1 points per game this season and is second in the league with 1.56 field goals made per game.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is fourth in career PAT made (147) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (67).

He is 14-19 on field goal attempts and 31-32 on PAT this season.

Carlson made 20 of 22 field goal attempts last year, and has made 36 of his last 39 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

He has five career FG of at least 50 yards:

- 53 Washington (2018)
- 53 Liberty (2018)
- 52 Alabama (2019)
- 50 Tennessee (2020)
- 50 Northwestern (2020)

In 2019, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

- With 822 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).
- Nehemiah Pritchett's 165 kickoff return yards against Georgia State ranked seventhbest for a game in Auburn history. Pritchett's 72-yard return was the longest by Auburn since Noah Igbinoghene (96 yards) in the 2020 Outback Bowl.
- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (162) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- Oscar Chapman had a career-high seven punts at Texas A&M. His four punts inside the 20 against the Aggies also marked a career high.

His 63-yard punt in the third quarter was the third-longest of the Aussie's career. With his 65-yarder vs. Ole Miss (Oct. 20), it marked the first time that Chapman's recorded 60+ yard punts in back-to-back games in his career.

Auburn leads the SEC in net punting (44.09) and ranks fifth nationally in that statistics. Oscar Chapman leads the league with a 46.0 punting average, 16th best nationally.

Barton Lester blocked a punt against Alabama State, Auburn's first of three blocked kicks this season.

Colby Wooden blocked an Alabama State field goal attempt; it was recovered by Nehemiah Pritchett for a 80-vard return and his first career score. It was Auburn's first blocked field goal for a touchdown since Neiko Thorpe vs. Kentucky in 2009 (69 yards).

Auburn blocked a punt and a field goal in the same game for the first time since the 2013 Alabama game.

Caylin Newton blocked a Georgia State punt returned by Barton Lester for a touchdown. The Tigers have recorded seven field goal blocks and eight punt blocks since the start of 2016.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

>> Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

MORE FROM THE TEXAS A&M GAME

This was the first 3-3 halftime tie since the 1997 Ole Miss game (an Auburn win) and the first 3-3 halftime tie on the road since the 1987 game at North Carolina (also an Auburn win).

- Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 334-125-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 191-33-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 142-91-4 all-time.

When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 82-80-4 (37-14-1 at home, 22-43-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

- Edge defender T.D. Moultry has played in 55 Auburn games, most on the current squad and setting the Auburn record of most games played in a career, breaking the previous mark of 54 set by running backs Tre Smith (2002-06) and Mario Fannin (2006-10).
- Auburn is outscoring opponents 56-10 in the fourth quarter in its six wins this season, including 27-0 in the Tigers' three SEC victories. In those three SEC wins, Auburn has outgained its opponents 366-185 in the final period.

Overall, the Tigers have outgained their opponents 656-305 in the fourth quarter in six victories this season and have scored six offensive TDs while allowing just one score in the final quarter of those games.

- There are 22 players on the Auburn roster who have earned their bachelor's degrees, eighth best in the FBS and most in the SEC.
- In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 333-259-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 142-62-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-196-12 overall.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 257-70-6 (.781). Auburn has won 15 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

On the current Auburn roster, 48 players have at least one college start to their credit, 26 on offense and 22 on defense.

Ten Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Bydarrius Knighten (48 overall; 43 games at SE Missouri State), Brandon Council (37 overall; 24 at Akron). Caylin Newton (26 overall; 25 at Howard), Bo Nix (33), Nick Brahms (30), Owen Pappoe (29), John Samuel Shenker (23), Roger McCreary (20), Smoke Monday (20) and Colby Wooden (20).

Auburn has an all-time record of 338-86-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .794 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 58 capacity crowds of 87,451 since seating was increased in 2004, the latest this season against Ole Miss.

>> Tank Bigsby rushed for a career-high 192 yards, Bo Nix threw and ran for fourth-quarter touchdowns and Anders Carlson kicked three field goals to lead Auburn to a 24-10 win.

Auburn's defense intercepted two passes and made six sacks while allowing only one TD.

Nix and Seth Williams teamed up twice on third downs on a 95-yard drive, gaining 25 yards on third-and-7 from Auburn's 8-yard line, then connecting on third-and-14 for a 32-yard TD pass to give Auburn a 16-3 lead with 10:03 left in the fourth quarter.

A long kickoff return led to Mississippi State's only touchdown, cutting Auburn's lead to 16-10 with 8:24 to play.

Bigsby rushed on four straight plays, gaining 57 yards, setting up Nix's 3-yard touchdown run. Nix then completed to Ze'Vian Capers for a 2-point conversion to put Auburn ahead 24-10 with 6:03 to play.

Bigsby's 192-yard performance on 26 carries is the third best by an Auburn freshman behind only Travis Tidwell's 222-yard in 1946 and Tommie Agee's 219 yards in 1983.

The Tigers' defense sealed the victory by sacking Mississippi State QB Will Rogers three times on the Bulldogs' final two possessions. Owen Pappoe, Derick Hall and Big Kat Bryant each sacked State's QB in the closing minutes. Pappoe led the Tigers with nine tackles.

Carlson kicked a pair of field goals to give Auburn a 6-3 halftime lead. Carlson's first field goal, a 27-yarder, capped a 15-play drive to make it 3-0 with 6:37 left in the first quarter.

Dre Butler recorded his first sack on the next play. Hall made two sacks. Zion Puckett and Colby Wooden also tallied sacks. Auburn held MSU to 19 rushing yards on 16.

After Puckett's tackle for loss early in the second led to a third-and-12, Roger McCreary intercepted a pass and returned it 28 yards to MSU's 46, but the Tigers were unable to capitalize.

After MSU kicked a field goal for a 3-3 tie, Eli Stove returned the kickoff 47 yards to midfield. The Tigers punted, but Auburn's defense forced a three-andout. Bigsby's longest run of the night, 34 yards, set up Carlson's 37-yarder gave Auburn a 6-3 lead as the first half expired.

In the third quarter Smoke Monday returned an interception 31 yards to set up Carlson's third field goal, a 45-yarder, giving Auburn a 9-3 lead.

Auburn rushed for more than 200 yards for the fifth time this season, gaining 218 yards on 36 carries.



BRYAN HARSIN » HEAD COACH

- >> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.
- >> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 81-26 overall as a head coach including one season at Arkansas State and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.
- >> His impressive resume at Boise saw him led the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.
- >> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.
- >> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.
- >> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.
- >> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.
- >> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 430 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 338, losing 86 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Auburn kicked off the Bryan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the 2021 season opener.

Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on firstand-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0.

Nix found Ja'Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead. Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion.

The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his

second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half.

Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first

Auburn touchdown on a 1-yard sneak to give the Tigers a 53-Ó lead. True freshman running back Jarquez Hunter began the drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

Making his first start in his 50th Auburn game, T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss. Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles. Marquis Burks made two of Auburn's six sacks. Moultry, Derick Hall, Colby Wooden and Marcus Harris also registered sacks.

The Tigers scored on their first eight possessions and did not punt until the 5:11 mark of the third quarter. Auburn welcomed the return of full stadium capacity, with 83,821 on hand to witness Harsin's debut.

Playing in front of the largest crowd ever to witness an Auburn football game, the No. 22 Tigers had two potential game-tying possessions in the final seconds before falling to No. 10 Penn State 28-20 Saturday at Beaver Stadium.

Trailing by eight with 7:02 to play, Auburn drove 73 yards in four minutes before an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal at PSU's 2-yard line with 3:08 left. Auburn's defense forced a punt, giving the Tigers another opportunity, starting at AU's 38yard line with 38 seconds left and no timeouts.

Bo Nix completed three passes to advance to PSU's 26, but his final throw fell incomplete against Penn State's prevent defense as time expired.

Trailing by 11, Auburn responded to the adversity with a run-oriented, 15-play drive, rushing 12 times for 59 yards, including

Bigsby's 6-yard touchdown run on a toss sweep to trim PSU's lead to 21-17 with 5:52 left in the third quarter.

Auburn then stopped Penn State short of a first down on a fake punt, leading to Carlson's 43-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter that pulled the Tigers within one point at 21-20.
