FOOTBALL HOSTS ALABAMA STATE

>> Auburn (1-0) continues its early season homestand hosting the Alabama State Hornets (1-0) on Saturday, September 11, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala. The SEC Network will televise the 11:00 a.m. CT non-conference matchup. A Hometown Heroes salute and a 9-11 Remembrance will be the presentations.

THE HARSIN DEBUT

>> Head coach Bryan Harsin began his tenure on the Plains with a 60-10 victory over Akron. Harsin now holds a 77-24 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State).

He was a 62-11 winner over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in his first game as head coach at Arkansas State in 2013. In his first game at Boise State, the Broncos fell 35-13 to No. 18 Ole Miss in the 2014 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta.

Auburn's 60 points were the most by an Auburn coach in his first game; the previous best was 37 points in Gene Chizik's opener vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009.

SERIES HISTORY


- Auburn leads the all-time series with Alabama State by a 1-0 count. The only previous gridiron meeting between the two schools came on September 8, 2018, a 63-9 victory for No. 7 Auburn at Jordan-Hare Stadium.
- >> The Tigers are 3-0 all-time against members of the SWAC, 1-0 against Alabama State and 2-0 against Alabama A&M (both those wins coming at home in 2012 and 2016).

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Auburn's 613 yards of total offense vs. Akron were the second most in a season opener in program history, behind only 695 yds vs. SW Louisiana in 1985
- The Tiger defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards, the fewest rushing yards allowed since Florida in 2001 (-36 yards)
- Sophomore tailback Tank Bigsby led the Tigers with 119 rushing yards in the opener, his fifth career 100-yard game
- Auburn joins Florida International, Nebraska and Texas A&M as the only FBS teams that have had a game this season with at least 275 passing yards and 275 rushing yards.
- Team captains for the 2021 season are linebackers Owen Pappoe and Chandler Wooten. Additional game captains will also be selected

- » Bo Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards
- >> Tank Bigsby is 47 yards shy of 1,000 career rushing yards, while senior Shaun Shivers is 43 yards from joining Auburn's 47 other 1,000-yard career rushers.
- Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league's coaches include Tank Bigsby (first team), Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Zakoby McClain and Smoke Monday (second team) and Brodarious Hamm, Roger McCreary, Bo Nix and Owen Pappoe (third team)
- Auburn is 100-27-2 (.783) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their past 16 openers dating back to the 2006 season

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson earned CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors for 2020, the 15th player so honored in Auburn history. Carlson graduated in December with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and is currently pursuing an MBA at Auburn. Carlson was a second-team All-American and a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2020.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 35 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2020 season, including current team members Tank Bigsby, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Shedrick Jackson, Jacob Jasinski, Tate Johnson, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Tashawn Manning, Zakoby McClain, Roger McCreary, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, Zion Puckett, Jacob Quattlebaum, Malcolm Russell, John Samuel Shenker, Zykeivous Walker, Brooks Walton and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had 17 representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included John Reese Bellew, Jackson Billings, Elijah Canion, Oscar Chapman, Trey Elston, Brandon Frazier, Reed Hughes, Jake Levant, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Sawyer Pate, J.J. Pegues, Jay Sharp, Wesley Steiner and Jeremiah Wright.

AD HONOR ROLL

Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 16 players honored in 2020-21, including current team members Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, David Shannon and Brooks Walton.

Auburn holds an all-time football record of 97-52-2 against teams from the state of Alabama, including Alabama, UAB, Alabama A&M, Birmingham Southern, Camp Sheridan, Marion Institute, Maxwell Field, Montgomery, North Alabama A.C., Samford and Spring Hill.

IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn is 179-58-5 (.749) all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 113-22-1 (.833) all-time at home in September, and 66-36-4 (.633) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 44 of 51 seasons.

The Tigers are 4-1 all-time in games played on September 11, 3-1 at home.

AT JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Auburn has an all-time record of 335-85-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .793 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 56 capacity crowds of 87,451 since the seating was increased in 2004.

IN SEASON OPENERS

» Auburn is 100-27-2 (.783) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their past 16 openers dating back to the 2006 season.

Auburn is 54-8-1 (.864) in season openers at home, 16-5-1 (.750) in openers on the road and 30-14 (.682) in openers at neutral-site locations. Auburn's total of 100 season-opening victories is behind only Alabama (102) and tied with Arkansas (100) for the most among current SEC schools.

The Tigers are 103-16-3 (.856) all-time in home openers; there were no games played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938. Although Jordan-Hare Stadium opened in 1939, the Tigers did not open a season there until 1951; since then, Auburn is 68-12-2 at the stadium in home openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their last 15 home openers, the only loss coming to eventual national champion Clemson

in 2016 by a 19-13 score.

Auburn is 56-15 (.787) in 71 season openers against non-conference opponents since the inception of the SEC in 1933.

Coach Bryan Harsin is now 8-1 in season openers (1-0 at Auburn, 6-1 at Boise State, 1-0 at Arkansas State).

TOTAL OFFENSE

Since 2001, Auburn is 156-30 (.838) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 212-38-1 (.842) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 552-58-9 (.899) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 346-9 (.975) when scoring 30 points, 175-3 (.977) when scoring 40 points, 82-0 when scoring 50 points and 28-0 when scoring 60 points.

Auburn has scored in 104 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

- Auburn has scored first in 38 of its last 56 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign.
- Auburn is one of nine FBS teams that have already had a game with two 100-yard rushers this season, joining Air Force, Appalachian State, Baylor, Florida, NC State, Tennessee, Texas A&M and UTEP.

The Tigers have won 33 straight games when they have had multiple 100-yard rushers dating back to the beginning of the 1979 season.

2020 SEC Freshman of the Year Tank Bigsby led Auburn with 119 rushing yards and two scores in its season-opening win. It was Bigsby's fifth career 100-yard game.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Akron: Bo Nix (O), Zakoby McClain (D), Brodarious Hamm (OL), T.D. Moultry and Marquis Burks (DL), Wesley Steiner (ST), Kilian Zierer and Donovan Kaufman (scholars)

In seven career games where the sophomore has gotten double-digit carries, he has averaged 115.3 yards on the ground and scored all seven of his career rushing TDs.

Bigsby is 47 yards shy of 1,000 career rushing yards, while senior Shaun Shivers is 43 yards from joining Auburn's 47 other 1,000-yard career rushers.

» In 2020, Bigsby was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games and four total; previously only Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010) rushed for three 100-yard games against SEC opposition as Auburn freshmen.

Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993

Against Akron, Jarquez Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He's the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs La Tech in 2009).

The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yds in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

>> Third-year starting quarterback Bo Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards.

The junior passed his father, Patrick, who threw for 4,957 yards from 1992-95, after entering the night tied with him on the school's all-time career passing yardage list.

Going 20-22 with three TD passes against the Zips, Nix' pass efficiency rating of 240.91 was the second-best rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

>> Nix is now 451-756 (59.7%) in his career for 5,232 yards and 31 passing scores.

Nix recorded his fourth career game with three passing TDs against the Zips. In the process, he tied his father in eighth place with 31 career TD passes.

In the opener, Nix tied a career-best mark by completing 11 straight passes to begin the game. He previously completed 11 straight passes in Auburn's victory at Ole Miss in 2020.

>> Nix has currently thrown 122 consecutive passes without an interception dating back

to last year's Iron Bowl. The junior has three streaks of at least 100 passes without an interception in his career, including a school record 250 consecutive passes without an interception from 2019-20 and a streak of 118 in 2019.

- » In 2019, Nix set the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16), earning SEC Freshman of the Year honors.

- Auburn has eight returning offensive linemen with at least one collegiate start; that's the eighth most of any FBS program.
- Shedrick Jackson led Auburn with five catches and 79 receiving yards against Akron. The senior totaled 10 catches and 130 yards in his first three seasons at Auburn.

Sophomore Ja'Varrius Johnson caught the first three passes of his career for 51 yards, including a 34-yard TD, against the Zips. Sophomore Kobe Hudson caught a 28-yard TD for his first career score. Graduate transfer Demetris Robertson caught three passes for 28 yards and rushed once for seven yards in his first action as a Tiger.

FOR THE DEFENSE

- >> The Auburn defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards. That marks the fewest rushing yards allowed since the 2001 Florida game (-36 yards).
- >> Linebacker Zakoby McClain led the nation with 113 tackles in 2020, averaging 10.3 per game. That average ranked third in the SEC and 19th nationally. He was the first Auburn player to average 10 tackles per game since Dontarrious Thomas in 2001 (10.2 avg.).
- Against Texas A&M, McClain posted a career-high 17 tackles, the most by an Auburn player since Demetruce McNeal (18) at Mississippi State in 2012.

McClain has seven career double-figure tackle games (five last season) and he has led the Tigers in tackles nine times in his career, including seven tackles in the opener vs. Akron.

The junior now has 179 tackles for his career. Only 15 Auburn players since 2000 have recorded more than 200 career tackles.

- McClain is looking to become Auburn's first player with 100+ tackles in back-to-back seasons since Takeo Spikes in 1996 (119) and 1997 (136).
- Last season, McClain was the first Auburn player since Deshaun Davis in 2018 with double-figure tackles in three straight games (Georgia 11, Arkansas 14, South Carolina 13).

Owen Pappoe also put together three consecutive double-figure games against Arkansas (10), South Carolina (10) and Ole Miss (14), and added 12 tackles against Tennessee.

- SEC all-freshman team honoree Colby Wooden was sixth in the SEC with 9.5 TFL last season; Wooden recorded at least 0.5 TFL in eight games, fourth among all FBS freshmen.

Wooden started the 2021 campaign with 1.5 sacks; the Tigers recorded eight sacks against Akron, led by T.D. Moultry and Marquis Burks with two each.

- Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 54 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers allowed only 149 total TD during that span (2.29 per game).
- Auburn has allowed a touchdown on 50.3 percent (97-193) of its opponents' red zone trips since 2016, which ranks fourth among FBS teams.

- » Auburn's defense has allowed only 20 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 54 games.
- » Roger McCreary was tied for fourth, just two off the SEC lead, with three interceptions last season. McCreary was the first Auburn player to record three interceptions in a season since Joshua Holsey in 2016.

- » Auburn is 58-22 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 37-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 11-13 when it fails to force a turnover.
- The experienced Tiger linebacking corps counts 37 career starts and 397 career tackles at Auburn.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 22-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Smoke Monday's 100-yard interception return against Tennessee, Barton Lester's TD recovery of a Jordyn Peters blocked punt against Arkansas, and Christian Tutt's fumble recovery TD against LSU last year.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks fourth in Auburn career scoring with 285 points.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is sixth in career PAT made (123) at Auburn and is third in career field goals made (54).

Carlson made 20 of 22 field goal attempts last season, and has made 27 of his last 29 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including the last eight in a row.

His 50-yard field goal vs. Northwestern was his fifth career FG of at least 50 yards:

- 53 Washington (2018)
- 53 Liberty (2018)
- 52 Alabama (2019)
- 50 Tennessee (2020)
- 50 Northwestern (2020)

In 2019, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

>> Carlson has eight career games with at least three field goals:

2020: Arkansas, South Carolina, Tennessee, Mississippi State;

- With 759 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are now the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).
- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (155) without having a punt blocked. The Tigers last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

MORE NOTES FROM THE AKRON GAME

- Scoring their first Auburn touchdowns: Ja'Varrius Johnson, Kobe Hudson, T.J. Finley and Jarquez Hunter.
- "Auburn leads the FBS in total offense after piling up 613 total yards against Akron, a mark that ranks 20th all-time in program history and the most since the Tigers gained 633 yards against Kent State in 2019. Those were the second most yards in a first game in program history. The most came against SW Louisiana in 1985 (695 yards).

- >> The 60 points scored by Auburn tied for the fifth-most points scored by Auburn in an opening game of the season and the most since 1971 (vs. UT-Chattanooga, 60-7).
- >> The Tigers' 50-point win is the 12thlargest season-opening win all-time and the largest since a 55-0 win over Pacific to start the 1989 campaign.
- Auburn's 382 yards total offense in the first half were the most since the 2018 Music City Bowl vs. Purdue and the most at home since the 2017 Ole Miss game.
- Auburn's 37 points in the first half were the most since 42 scored against Mississippi State in 2019.

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

- There are 22 players on the Auburn roster who have already earned their bachelor's degrees, eighth best of any FBS institution and most in the SEC.
- Team captains for the 2021 season are linebackers Owen Pappoe and Chandler Wooten.

Additional game captains are also being selected: Nick Brahms, Bo Nix (Akron).

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 255-69-6. Auburn has won 13 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

- >> In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 330-257-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 141-61-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 189-195-12 overall.
- Edge defender T.D. Moultry has played in 50 Auburn games, most on the current squad and just three shy of tying the Auburn record of most games played in a career (54) set by running backs Tre Smith (2002-06) and Mario Fannin (2006-10). Moultry made his first career start in the season opener against Akron and tied for the team lead in tackles (7).
- >> The Tigers have 783 total victories since 1982, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. All-time, 31 FBS programs have posted more than 700 wins.
- Among teams that played at least 10 games last season, Auburn (0.82) was one of just six teams averaging fewer than 1.0 turnovers lost per game; others were Texas A&M, Texas, BYU, Notre Dame and Alabama.
- On the current Auburn roster, 41 players have at least one college start to their credit, 21 on offense and 20 on defense.

Six Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Bydarrius Knighten (44 overall; 43 games at SE Missouri State), Caylin Newton (25 at Howard), Brandon Council (30 overall; 24 at Akron), Bo Nix (25), Owen Pappoe (25) and Nick Brahms (22).

- The Akron game was also a debut for the Southeastern Raptor Center, as bald eagle Independence made its first pregame flight at Jordan-Hare Stadium.
- Next up, the Tigers visit Penn State September 11 for a 6:30 p.m. contest. Alabama State hosts Bethune-Cookman September 25.

THE LAST TIME VS. AUBURN 63, ALABAMA STATE 9

>> The message all week was to improve. Improve from Week One. On Saturday, No. 7 Auburn answered that call with a dominant 63-9 win over Alabama State.

Auburn finished with 429 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns against Alabama State.

Redshirt freshman JaTarvious Whitlow led the way with 122 yards on 14 carries while true freshman Shaun Shivers added 117 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries. Including Shivers, six players (Shivers, Kam Martin, Harold Joiner, Malik Miller, Jarrett Stidham and Anthony Schwartz) scored rushing touchdowns. Three of the six were true freshmen.

Stidham and Schwartz also hooked up through the air for a 57-yard touchdown, the long play of the night for Auburn. Stidham, who gave way to Malik Willis in the second quarter, went 6 of 11 passing for 113 yards with the lone touchdown.

For Schwartz, it was a breakout performance. The true freshman didn't see a touch the week before but finished with three catches for a team-high 67 yards, three carries for 50 yards and scored his first two career touchdowns. He averaged 19.5 yards per touch.

But as impressive as the offense looked, it wasn't the only unit to find the end zone for Auburn on Saturday. Safety Daniel Thomas

returned an interception 29 yards for a touchdown late in the first quarter, and later in the first half, Devan Barrett picked up a blocked punt and returned it 10 yards for a score to make it 35-0. The punt was blocked by cornerback Jordyn Peters.

It was the first time since 2003 that the Tigers scored on an interception return and a blocked punt return in the same game.

Though the Tigers gave up a touchdown late in the third quarter, the defense forced four turnovers and allowed only 47 yards rushing for the game. Thomas added another interception in the first half, and true freshman Jamien

Sherwood recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter.

In all, 21 true freshmen saw the field.





BRYAN HARSIN » HEAD COACH



- >> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 77-24 overall as a head coach including one season at Arkansas State and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.
- >> His impressive resume at Boise saw him led the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.
- >> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.
- >> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.
- >> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.
- >> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.
- >> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 427 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 335, losing 85 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Auburn kicked off the Bryan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the 2021 season opener.

Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on firstand-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0. Auburn stopped Akron on fouth-and-1 from the Zips' 34-yard line to give the Tigers excellent field position to start the

Nix found Ja Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead.

Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to

Shedrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion.

The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his

second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half.

Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

Bigsby eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in his career on his second carry of the second half, a 32-yard pickup.

Shivers gave Auburn a 44-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown run, his second score of the pight.

After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first

drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

Akron avoided the shutout with a 4-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter on an 80-yard drive and added a field

Hunter scored his first Auburn touchdown on a 9-yard run with 28 seconds left to close out the scoring, finishing with 110 yards on nine carries.

Making his first start in his 50th Auburn game, T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss, Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles. Marquis Burks made two of Auburn's six sacks. Moultry, Derick Hall, Colby Wooden and Marcus Harris also registered sacks.

The Tigers scored on their first eight possessions and did not punt until the 5:11 mark of the third quarter. Auburn welcomed the return of full stadium capacity, with 83,821 on hand to witness Harsin's debut.
