# FOOTBALL OPENS 2022 CAMPAIGN HOSTING MERCER

» Auburn opens the 2022 football campaign, its 130th season of college football, hosting the Mercer Bears on Saturday, September 3, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala. ESPN Plus/SEC Network Plus will televise the 6:00 p.m. CT non-conference matchup. Fans are asked to wear white to the season opener; the winner of the 2021 Cliff Hare Award, men's tennis All-American Tad Maclean, will be recognized during pregame ceremonies.

# SERIES HISTORY

>> Auburn leads the all-time series with Mercer, which was first played in 1896, by a 12-0 advantage. Auburn leads 7-0 in games played at Auburn, 4-0 in games played at Macon, and also posted a victory in a game played at Columbus, Ga. Nine of the victories in the series have been shutout wins; the Tigers have outscored the Bears 530-22 (44.2-1.8) all-time.

The Tigers won the last matchup by a 24-10 score at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2017; prior to that, the last matchup was in 1922, a 50-7 Tiger win at Auburn.

>> Auburn holds a 73-1-1 all-time record against teams currently in the Southern Conference: Chattanooga (21-0), The Citadel (1-0), East Tennessee State (1-0), Furman (4-0), Mercer (12-0), Samford (28-0-1), Western Carolina (3-0) and Wofford (3-1).

# IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn is 181-59-5 (.749) all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 115-22-1 (.837) all-time at home in September, and 66-37-4 (.632) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 45 of 52 seasons. The Tigers are 2-3 all-time in games played on September 3.

# **KICKOFF COVERAGE**

» Auburn's 2021 campaign will be its 130th season of college football. The Tigers have 788 wins all-time, 13th-most among FBS schools

» Auburn and Arkansas are the only teams to have five AP preseason Top 25 teams on the 2022 schedule. The Tigers will face Georgia (3), Ole Miss (21), Arkansas (19), Texas A&M (6) and Alabama (1)

» Auburn opens with five consecutive home games at Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time since the 2016 season

» Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league's coaches include Derick Hall and Tank Bigsby (first team), Colby Wooden and Oscar Chapman (second team) and Anders Carlson (third team) » Team captains for the 2022 season are defensive lineman Derick Hall, linebacker Owen Pappoe and tight end John Samuel Shenker. An additional game captain per game will also be selected.

Pappoe, also a 2021 captain, is just the fourth two-time captain in Auburn annals, along with Reese Dismukes (2013-14), Gusty Yearout (1966-67) and Curtis Kuykendall (1944-45)

>> Auburn has won 15 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

>> Auburn is 100-27-2 (.783) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their past 16 openers dating back to the 2006 season

>> The Tigers are 103-16-3 (.857) all-time in home openers; no games were played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938

# THE GRADUATES

» On the 2022 Auburn roster, 17 players have already received bachelor's degrees: Marcus Bragg (Western Kentucky), Nick Brahms; Marquis Burks; Zach Calzada (Texas A&M); Anders Carlson; Brandon Council (Akron); Luke Deal; Alec Jackson; Shedrick Jackson; Morris Joseph Jr. (Memphis); Eku Leota (Northwestern); Barton Lester; Jacob Quattlebaum; John Samuel Shenker; Kameron Stutts; Austin Troxell; and Kilian Zierer.

# COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms earned 2021 CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors, only the second time that Auburn has had two firstteam honorees in the prestigious program, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes. LB Gregg Carr and K/P Matt Hawkins were both first-team honorees in 1984. Carlson, a 2020 first team Academic All-American, is just the second two-time honoree in Auburn history, along with Hawkins (1984-85). Carlson graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and has since completed his MBA. Brahms graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.89 GPA in professional flight management and also completed his MBA.

# SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 43 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2021 season, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Tank Bigsby, Jackson Billigs, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Sammy Cohen, Luke Deal, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Alec Jackson, Tate Johnson, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Jake Levant, Trey Lindsey, Trent Mason, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith, Sawyer Pate, Jacob Quattlebaum, John Samuel Shenker, Wesley Steiner, Zykeivous Walker, Jeremiah Wright and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had six representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Cort Bradley, Jarquez Hunter, Donovan Kaufman, Kyle Vaccarella and Garrison Walker.

# **AD HONOR ROLL**

» Undergraduate student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. # IN SEASON OPENERS

Auburn is 100-27-2 (.783) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their past 16 openers dating back to the 2006 season; last season, Auburn defeated Akron 60-10 in the season opener at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn is 54-8-1 (.865) in season openers at home, 16-5-1 (.750) in openers on the road and 30-14 (.682) in openers at neutral-site locations. Auburn's total of 100 season-opening victories is behind only Alabama (102) and tied with Arkansas (100) for the most among current SEC schools.

The Tigers are 103-16-3 (.857) all-time in home openers; there were no games played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938. Although Jordan-Hare Stadium opened in 1939, the Tigers did not open a season there until 1951; since then, Auburn is 68-12-2 at the stadium in home openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their last 15 home openers, the only loss coming to eventual national champion Clemson in 2016 by a 19-13 score.

Auburn is 56-15 (.789) in 71 season openers against non-conference opponents since the inception of the SEC in 1933.

Coach Bryan Harsin is 8-1 in season openers (1-0 at Auburn, 6-1 at Boise State, 1-0 at Arkansas State).

# **NOTABLE AUBURN SEASON OPENERS**

» Sept. 26, 2020: Auburn 29, Kentucky 13 – A season opener that many thought wouldn't happen amidst the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Tigers took the field at Jordan-Hare Stadium in front of 17,490 fans – mostly students – and started the season 1-0. Bo Nix threw three second-half touchdown passes, two of them to Seth Williams, and the Tigers' defense forced three turnovers as Auburn won its fourth straight home opener.

» Aug. 31, 2019: Auburn 27, Oregon 21 – A TD pass from freshman Bo Nix to Seth Williams with nine seconds left led the Tigers past Oregon at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas. Auburn never led until the final nine seconds, and the 15-point second-half comeback was the Tigers' biggest since the 2010 Alabama game.

» Sept. 4, 2010: Auburn 52, Arkansas State 26 - Cam Newton made a splash in his Auburn debut, accounting for five touchdowns and 357 yards of total offense as Auburn opened its national championship season with a 52-26 win over Arkansas State. Newton rushed for three scores and passed for two others, and he set a

» Sept. 7, 1985: Auburn 49, Southwest Louisiana 7 – After a shoulder injury cost Bo Jackson most of his 1984 season, he wanted to prove to the nation that he was back. Did he ever. Jackson kicked off his Heisman Trophy-winning senior season by rushing for 290 yards and four touchdowns on just 23 carries in a 49-7 win for the second-ranked Tigers over Southwest Louisiana. Jackson had 181 yards on his first six carries and 206 yards on 10 carries by halftime. As a team, the Tigers rushed for a school-record 565 yards.

# **TOTAL OFFENSE**

» Auburn has scored in 117 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 31.9 ppg (3,729 total points) during that stretch. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

>> The duo of Jarquez Hunter and Tank Bigsby averaged 130.2 rushing yards per game last season (1,692 total yards) and totaled 13 TD on the ground.

Hunter ranked 21st among all FBS players and eighth among freshman averaging 6.67 yards per carry, 11th on Auburn's single-season yards per carry list.

Bigsby had five 100-yard games in 2021, while Hunter had two.

>> With 1,099 yards last season, Tank Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games of the 2021 campaign; that gave him four consecutive 100-yard rushing games back through last season, the first Auburn RB to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

The 48th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 1,000 career yards, he ranks 20th with 1,933 career yards and 15 career scores.

He rankes third among Auburn rushers in yards gained through their sophomore season: Michael Dyer (2,355/2010-11); Bo Jackson (2,042/1982-83); Tank Bigsby (1,933/2020-21).

# NATIONAL CHAMPIONS: 1957, 2010

» In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993.

Jarquez Hunter ranked ninth among
 Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 597
 yards as a true freshman during 2021.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run tied for seventh longest in the nation this season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

» Against Akron, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was also the last freshman to open the season with back-to-back 100-yard games at Auburn (148, La Tech and 114, Miss St) in 2009.

Tight end John Samuel Shenker's 33 catches during the 2021 campaign set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season.
 His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn season record for tight ends.

>> In the Birmingham Bowl, Shenker also moved up the list in career numbers. Shenker is seventh in career catches by an Auburn tight end with 48, and he is fifth in career tight end receiving yardage at 571.

Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times last season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had four receptions for 50 yards at Texas A&M.

## FOR THE DEFENSE

>> Auburn is 63-27 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 38-10 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 11-15 when it fails to force a turnover.

The Tigers lost only 11 turnovers last season in 898 plays: seven fumbles and four interceptions. That tied for 10th nationally.

Auburn's total of four interceptions thrown last season tied for sixth among all FBS teams.

Auburn was fourth in the SEC and ranked
 17th nationally in tackles for a loss, recording 96
 last season (7.39/gm).

Derick Hall (12.5), Eku Leota (10.0), Smoke Monday (9.0), Colby Wooden (8.5), Zakoby McClain (8.0), T.D. Moultry (7.5) and Marcus Harris (6.0) led the Tigers individually; 23 different Auburn defenders had a hand in at least one TFL last season.

» Current players with 100 career tackles at Auburn; Morris Joseph Jr. had 117 total tackles in three seasons at Memphis:

Owen Pappoe (165) Colby Wooden (107)

» Career double-figure tackle games: Owen Pappoe (5) Zion Puckett, Colby Wooden (1)

» Senior Derick Hall has 12.5 career sacks, all in his last 19 games dating back to the middle of the 2020 season. Hall's 12.5 sacks the last two seasons are tied for fourth in the SEC over that period.

# SPECIAL TEAMS

» Senior preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson returns to action after suffering a season-ending knee injury at the end of the 2021 Mississippi State game.

» Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks third in Auburn career scoring with 352 points.

He ranked ninth in the SEC in scoring at 7.7 points per game last season and was fifth in the league with 1.40 field goals made per game.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is fourth in career PAT made (151) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (67). He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT in 2021.

Carlson has made 36 of his last 39 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

» With 826 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the alltime leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

» Second among SEC punting leaders last season, Oscar Chapman had a then-career-high seven punts at Texas A&M. His four punts inside the 20 against the Aggies also marked a career high.

His 63-yard punt in the third quarter was the third-longest of the Aussie's career. With his 65-yarder vs. Ole Miss, it marked the first time that Chapman recorded 60+ yard punts in back-to-back games in his career.

» Auburn ranked third in the SEC in net punting (41.79) and 20th nationally in that stat in 2021. Oscar Chapman was second in the SEC with a 44.1-yard punting average, 30th nationally.

>> Nehemiah Pritchett's 165 kickoff return yards against Georgia State last season ranked seventh-best for a game in Auburn history.

» Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (166) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Barton Lester blocked a punt against Alabama State, Auburn's first of three blocked kicks last season. Lester also returned a blocked Georgia State punt for a score.

Auburn has seven field goal blocks and nine punt blocks since the start of 2016.

# N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas last season.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 nonoffensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

» Auburn is 116-172-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 54-45-2 at home against ranked teams, 29-74-2 on the road and 33-53-2 on a neutral field.

>> Auburn is 56-104-3 all-time against AP top 10 teams (27-29-2 at home, 29-75-1 away from Auburn).

» The Tigers are 92-137-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (44-36-2 at home, 29-66-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 60-55-3 overall (30-11-1 at home, 19-34-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 334-126-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 191-34-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 142-91-4 all-time.

When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 82-80-4 (37-14-1 at home, 22-43-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

### MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» There are 17 players on the Auburn roster who have already earned their bachelor's degrees, second best in the SEC behind South Carolina (20).

>> The Tigers have 788 total victories since 1892, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. All-time, 32 FBS programs have posted more than 700 wins.

>> Among teams that played at least 10 games last season, Auburn (0.82) was one of just six teams averaging fewer than 1.0 turnovers lost per game; others were Texas A&M, Texas, BYU, Notre Dame and Alabama.

>> In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 333-262-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 142-64-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-197-12 overall.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 257-70-6 (.781). Auburn has won 15 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

>> On the current Auburn roster, 36 players have at least one college start to their credit, 20 on offense and 16 on defense.

Six Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Brandon Council 38 (24 at Akron), Nick Brahms 33, Owen Pappoe 29, John Samuel Shenker 27, Colby Wooden 24 and Keiondre Jones 20 games.

Pregame honorees include Tad Maclean, the **>>** 2022 winner of the Cliff Hare Award, Auburn's highest honor presented to a male studentathlete for excellence in academics and athletics while modeling leadership and integrity.

Maclean, twice an All-American in doubles, was a four-year fixture in the Tiger lineup. An honor student in accounting who graduated in May, Maclean finished among the Auburn career top 12 with 74 career doubles wins and 140 combined wins. Nationally ranked in singles and ranked as high as No. 6 in doubles, the threetime NCAA qualifier advanced to the 2021 NCAA doubles finals with Finn Murgett.

Next up, the Tigers host San Jose' State **>>** September 10 in a 6:30 p.m. contest at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Mercer hosts the Citadel on Saturday, September 17, in a 6 p.m. ET game.

# THE LAST TIME VS. MERCER AUBURN 24, MERCER 10

>> Quarterback Jarrett Stidham played easily his best game as an Auburn Tiger. Kamryn Pettway rushed for three touchdowns. But it was the Auburn defense that stood out once again and forced a key three-and-out in the fourth quarter that helped propel the Tigers past Mercer, 24-10, on Saturday.

Mercer had cut the lead to seven and had a chance to tie the game with a touchdown, but the defense was having none of it. On first down, Byron Cowart and Big Kat Bryant stopped the running back for a loss of three. After an incomplete pass on second down, Derrick Brown got pressure on the quarterback and knocked the pass down on third down. And backed up deep in their own territory, the Bears were forced to punt.

When Auburn got the ball back, the offense marched down the field and put the game out of reach with a four-yard touchdown run from Pettway. It was Pettway's third touchdown on the day and second out of the Wildcat position. He finished with 128 yards on the ground and also caught three passes for 32 yards.

It was a signature day for Stidham, too, who went 32 of 37 through the air for 367 yards and connected with nine different receivers.

Auburn outgained Mercer, 510 to 246, but five turnovers by Auburn -- four fumbles and one interception -- allowed the Bears to hang around into the fourth quarter.

Defensively, Jeremiah Dinson and Tre' Williams led Auburn with six tackles apiece, and thanks to seven tackles for loss, the Tigers held Mercer to 3.7 yards per play. Freshman Traivon Leonard made the game-clinching stop on fourth down with less

than two minutes remaining.

Fellow freshmen Noah Igbinoghene and Devan Barrett also made contributions on offense. Igbinoghene caught three passes for 24 yards, and Barrett added three grabs for 17 yards. In all, 11 freshmen participated for the Tigers on Saturday.

>> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.

>> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 82-30 overall as a head coach – including one season at Arkansas State – and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.

>> His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.

>> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

>> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

>> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.

>> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

>> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

# NATIONAL CHAMPIONS: 1957, 2010



Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and longtime chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

Statues of all three gentlemen were dedicated in the fall of 2021 in the South entrance plaza. What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 431 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 338, losing 88 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .789 against some of the best teams in college football.

# GAME 1 // AUBURN 60, AKRON 10 // SEPT. 4, 2021 // SEC+|ESPN+ // JORDAN-HARE STADIUM (83,821) // AUBURN, ALA

Auburn kicked off the Brvan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the 2021 season opener.

Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on firstand-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0.

Nix found Ja'Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead. Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion. The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his

second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half.

Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

Bigsby eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in his career on his second carry of the second half, a 32-yard pickup. Shivers gave Auburn a 44-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown run, his second score of the night. After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first

Auburn touchdown on a 1-yard sneak to give the Tigers a 53-0 lead. True freshman running back Jarquez Hunter began the drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

Making his first start in his 50th Auburn game, T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss. Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles. Mar-quis Burks made two of Auburn's six sacks. Moultry, Derick Hall, Colby Wooden and Marcus Harris also registered sacks.

The Tigers scored on their first eight possessions and did not punt until the 5:11 mark of the third quarter. Auburn welcomed the return of full stadium capacity, with 83,821 on hand to witness Harsin's debut.

Robertson caught a pair of touchdown passes from Bo Nix before scoring on a 36-yard reverse, the latter two TDs coming in Auburn's 35-point third quarter.

Colby Wooden blocked a field goal that Nehemiah Pritchett returned 80 yards for a touchdown, and Barton Lester blocked a punt that led to a field goal to help Auburn take a 20-0 halftime lead.

Roger McCreary returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown to put Auburn ahead 41-0 midway through the third quarter

For the second straight game, Tank Bigsby and Jarquez Hunter both rushed for more than 100 yards, with Hunter gaining most of his on one carry, a 94-yard burst that marked the longest run in Auburn history and gave the Tigers a 55-0 lead at the end of the third quarter

Hunter led Auburn with 147 yards on eight carries. Bigsby added 122 yards on 11 rushes, helping the Tigers pile up 364 rushing yards on 39 carries, an average of 9.3 yards per carry.

Nix completed 9 of 17 passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns. Finley was 2-for-2 for 66 yards and a touchdown. Anders Carlson kicked a pair of field goals to give Auburn a 6-0 lead after the first quarter. Nix and Robertson connected from 6 yards to put the Tigers on top 13-0 early in the second quarter.

T.J. Finley relieved Nix in the third quarter and threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Malcolm Johnson Jr. Zakoby McClain led Auburn with 10 tackles, his eighth career double-digit performance. The Tigers recorded 11 tackles for loss, including sacks by T.D. Moultry and Eku Leota.

The Tigers held the Hornets to 46 rushing yards on 29 carries, an average of 1.6 yards per rush.

Auburn has scored 60 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time since 1932. A crowd of 82,745 enjoyed a sunny afternoon on the Plains, in which Auburn honored first responders on the 20th anniversary of 9/11.

Playing in front of the largest crowd ever to witness an Auburn football game, the No. 22 Tigers had two potential game-tying possessions in the final seconds before falling to No. 10 Penn State 28-20 Saturday at Beaver Stadium Trailing by eight with 7:02 to play, Auburn drove 73 yards in four minutes before an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal at PSU's 2-yard line with 3:08 left. Auburn's defense forced a punt, giving the Tigers another opportunity, starting at AU's 38-

yard line with 38 seconds left and no timeouts. Bo Nix completed three passes to advance to PSU's 26, but his final throw fell incomplete against Penn State's prevent

defense as time expired. Tank Bigsby recorded his third 100-yard game of the season, rushing for 102 yards on 23 carries with two touchdowns.

Freshman Jarquez Hunter added 63 yards on nine carries. Auburn's defense stopped Penn State on fourth-and-1 on the opening drive to give the Tigers possession on Auburn's 44.

Bigsby rushed for 18 yards on the Tigers first play and Anders Carlson gave Auburn a 3-0 lead with a 45-yard field goal. The Nittany Lions scored on Sean Clifford's 4-yard touchdown pass to Jahan Dotson to cap an 88-yard drive to lead 7-3 with 2:24 left in the first quarter.

Auburn answered with an 11-play, 75-yard drive, converting three third downs. Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards on third-and-2, then on third-and-12, Nix hit Kobe Hudson for 36 yards to PSU's 13. Bigsby took over from there with three consecutive runs, completing the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run on third-and-1

to regain the lead for Auburn, 10-7 at the 12:28 mark of the second quarter. Penn State responded with a 91-yard touchdown drive, reclaiming a 14-10 lead on Clifford's 2-yard pass to Brenton Strange with 1:23 remaining in the half.

Penn State took advantage of an Auburn turnover on the opening play of the second half, driving 20 yards in four plays and taking a 21-10 lead on Tyler Warren's 2-yard rush. Trailing by 11, Auburn responded to the adversity with a run-oriented, 15-play drive, rushing 12 times for 59 yards, including

Bigsby's 6-yard touchdown run on a toss sweep to trim PSU's lead to 21-17 with 5:52 left in the third quarter. Auburn then stopped Penn State short of a first down on a fake punt, leading to Carlson's 43-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter that pulled the Tigers within one point at 21-20.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead to 28-20 on Noah Cain's 3-yard run to cap a 75-yard drive with 10:48 to play, but Chandler Wooten's tackle for loss on third down forced a punt that led to the first of Auurn's two late scoring chances. Wooten led Auburn with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Nix was 21 of 37 for 185 yards, adding 29 rushing yards. Clifford completed 28 of 32 attempts for 280 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

T.J. Finley's 10-yard touchdown pass on fourth down with 45 seconds left capped a 98-yard drive to give No. 23 Auburn a 34-24 comeback victory Saturday over Georgia State on Homecoming.

Backed up at its 2-yard-line and trailing 24-19 with 3:23 to play, Jarquez Hunter gave Auburn breathing room with an 18-yard run. Finley, who relieved Bo Nix in the second half, hit Kobe Hudson for 15 yards on third-and-11, then Finley rushed for 16 yards to cross midfield. Finley connected with Elijah Canion for 12 yards to GŚU's 30, then hit John Samuel Shenker for 19 yards to the 11 with 1:19 remaining. Three plays netted 1 yard, setting up the stage for Finley and Jackson's fourth-down heroics. Facing a GSU blitz, Finley

avoided multiple rushers, stepping up in the pocket and firing off-balance to a leaping Jackson in the end zone to give Auburn a one-point lead in the final minute. Finley hit Hudson for a 2-point conversion that gave Auburn a 27-24, then after an incomplete pass, Smoke Monday re-

turned an interception 36 yards to secure victory for the Tigers. Trailing 24-12 in the second half, Caylin Newton blocked a punt that Barton Lester recovered in the end zone for a touch-down that cut GSU's lead to 24-19 with 4:44 left in the third quarter.

Auburn's defense forced four consecutive three-and-outs and shut out the Panthers in the second half. Chandler Wooten made a career-high 12 tackles. T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high nine tackles, including two of Auburn's 10 tackles for loss.

Anders Carlson kicked four first-half field goals to account for Auburn's scoring before intermission. After Georgia State took a 3-0 lead, Nehemiah Pritchett returned the kickoff 72 yards to set up Carlson's game-tying 41-

yard field goal. Auburn's defense delivered a three-and-out, leading to Carlson's 23-yard field goal that put the Tigers on top 6-3 after the first quarter.

The visiting Panthers produced three touchdown drives in the second quarter, the first on a 12-yard pass from Darren Grainger to Jamari Thrash to retake a 10-6 lead.

Garlson's third field goal, a 28-yarder, trimmed GSU's lead to 10-9 with 9 minutes left in the half. Grainger threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Roger Carter to give Georgia State a 17-9 lead.

Carlson's fourth field goal with 2:54 left in the second quarter made it 17-12, but Tucker Gregg's 50-yard touchdown run gave Georgia State a 24-12 halftime lead.

Bo Nix avoided four LSU rushers before finding Tyler Fromm for a 24-yard pass on fourth-and-2 for Auburn's first points, Jarquez Hunter scored a late touchdown, and Bydarrius Knighten's interception sealed Auburn's 24-19 comeback victory over LSU Saturday before 97,717 at Tiger Stadium.

Hunter capped a 92-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to give Auburn its first lead with 3:11 to play. Hunter's 44-yard run was the drive's key play. The freshman rushed for 65 yards on six carries. Knighten intercepted LSU on fourth-and-6 with 1:09 to play to secure Auburn's first victory at Tiger Stadium since 1999.

Trailing 13-0 late in the second quarter, Nix rolled right, scrambled left and found Fromm running free in the end zone near the Auburn fan section, a highlight-reel play that energized the visitors' sideline.

Auburn trimmed LSU's lead to 13-10 before halftime on Anders Carlson's 49-yard field goal. Nix completed 23 of 44 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown and added 74 rushing yards and a TD on 12 carries. Cade York kicked a pair of field goals in the third quarter to give LSU a 19-10 lead heading to the final quarter.

Nix scored on a 5-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter to cap a nine-play, 75-yard drive and pull Auburn within two points at 19-17 Tight ends figured prominently in Auburn's offense, with John Samuel Shenker making five catches for 102 yards and

Fromm adding three for 40.

Zakoby McCain led the Tigers' defense with 12 tackles. Derick Hall added eight tackles and 1.5 sacks. After allowing a touchdown on LSU's first possession, Auburn kept LSU out of the end zone the rest of the game. LSU built a 13-0 lead on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Max Johnson to Kayshonn Boutte and a pair of York second-quar-

ter field goals before Nix's razzle dazzle.

Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns and Auburn took the lead on a defensive score in the third quarter to help the Tigers beat No. 17 Arkansas 38-23 Saturday at Reynolds Razorback Stadium. Leading 31-23, the Tigers put away the game with a 12-play, 75-yard drive that chewed up 6 minutes and 11 seconds, culmi-

nating on Nix's 23-yard touchdown run with 2:30 to play. Nix completed 21 of 26 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns, adding 42 rushing yards on five carries and a TD. After Oscar Chapman's 57-yard punt pinned the Razorbacks at their 11-yard-line, Colby Wooden's second sack set up third-and-15 at the Arkansas 6. Derick Hall sacked Jefferson in the end zone, forcing a fumble that Marcus Harris recovered for a touchdown to give Auburn a 21-17 lead. Harris made another huge play on the next drive, stopping Jefferson short of a first down on fourth-and-3 at Auburn's 29-yard-line.

After Anders Carlson kicked a 29-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 31-23 lead with 10:35 to play, Auburn forced a threeand-out, giving Auburn possession at its 25-yard-line with 8:41 to play, setting the stage for Nix's touchdown run

Auburn marched 75 yards on six plays on the game's opening drive with Nix completing all five of his pass attempts for 72 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Varrius Johnson for a 7-0 Tigers lead. After Arkansas kicked a field goal to trim Auburn's lead to 7-3 after the first quarter, the Tigers made it 14-3 with 9:59 left in

the half on Tank Bigsby's 1-yard touchdown run. Nix was 3-for-3 on the drive for 36 yards, including a 19-yard completion to Landen King on third-and-4.

Bigsby rushed for 17 yards to the Razorbacks' 1-yard line before scoring two plays later. Bigsby led the Tigers with 68 rush-

Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns, Tank Bigsby rushed for 140 yards and No. 18 Auburn kept No. 10 Ole Miss out of the end zone in the second half in the No. 18 Tigers' 31-20 win Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium. Jaylin Simpson's end zone interception in the fourth quarter preserved Auburn's two-score lead and the Tigers stopped the Rebels three times on fourth down inside Auburn's 20-yard line in the second half.

The Tigers' defense held Ole Miss (6-2, 3-2) to a 49-yard field goal in the third quarter, forcing two three-and-outs. Zakoby McClain led the way with 14 tackles and two sacks.

In SEC West wins over LSU, Arkansas and Ole Miss, the Tigers have outscored opponents 27-0 in the fourth quarter. Anders Carlson's 28-yard field goal gave Auburn a 31-20 lead with 10:52 remaining in the fourth quarter to culminate an 11-play, 76-yard drive that included a 24-yard Bigsby run and a 24-yard pass from Nix to Kobe Hudson. Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its five first-half drives to take a 28-17 halftime lead. The Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays on their opening possession with Nix rushing for an 11-yard touchdown. Nix was 3-for-3

on the drive for 33 yards while rushing for 18 yards, including another of his patented, sack-avoiding scrambles Picking up where he left off in Auburn's win at Arkansas, Marcus Harris set the tone defensively with a tackle for loss on the Rebels' first play, one of seven TFLs for the Tigers' defense.

After Ole Miss kicked a 29-yard field goal on its first drive, Auburn answered with a 10-play, 72-yard touchdown drive F

Bigsby began the drive with a 26-yard run, then went airborne on third-and-goal from the 1 to put Auburn ahead 14-3 late in the first quarter. In the second quarter, Ole Miss drove 88 yards in 15 plays, cutting Auburn's lead to 14-10 on Snoop Conner's 13-yard touch-

down run. Auburn answered quickly, gaining 35 yards on Nix's pass to Demetris Robertson and scoring on Nix's 7-yard touchdown run to lead 21-10 with 6:20 left in the half. Ole Miss quarterback Matt Corral led the Rebels on a 75-yard drive, scoring on an 11-yard touchdown run to trim Auburn's

advantage to 21-17 with 2:42 remaining in the second quarter.

The Tigers executed their two-minute offense to perfection, driving 69 yards in 11 plays and scoring on Nix's 9-yard pass to Jarquez Hunter with 11 seconds left in the half.

Nix completed 22 of 30 passes for 276 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 30 yards and a pair of TDs.

In a game that featured no offensive touchdowns, No. 13 Texas A&M beat No. 12 Auburn 20-3 Saturday in front of 109,835, the second largest crowd in Kyle Field history. Texas A&M's Michael Clemons recovered a fumble and returned it 24 yards early in the fourth quarter for the game's only

touchdown. The Aggies added a two-point conversion pass to lead 17-3.

After a long Texas A&M run, Donovan Kauffman forced a fumble that Roger McCreary recovered at Auburn's 5-yard line. Auburn (6-3, 3-2) drove 41 yards but came up 1 yard short on fourth down to give the Aggies possession at the Tigers' 46 with 6:50 to play.

Ladarius Tennison's 4-yard tackle for loss on the first play of the second half led to a three-and-out. Tennison registered a career high eight tackles. Smoke Monday led Auburn with nine tackles. The Tigers then drove 56 yards on 10 plays but missed a chance to take a lead when a 33-yard field goal attempt was wide

right. Texas A&M (7-2, 4-2) used a 49-yard completion to set up a 29-yard field goal to take a 6-3 lead with 3:39 remaining in the

third quarter. Seth Small's third field goal gave the Aggies a 9-3 lead with 13:40 left in the game. Small's fourth field goal made it 20-3 with 3:16 remaining.

After Texas A&M kicked a field goal on its first drive of the game, Auburn answered with a 14-play drive of its own, with Shaun Shivers twice moving the chains on third down, first with a 10-yard catch-and-run on third-and-9, then a 7-yard run on third-and-5.

Tank Bigsby rushed for 164 yards and a touchdown, and Shedrick Jackson set career highs with 111 receiving yards on seven catches, but South Carolina defeated Auburn 21-17 Saturday at Williams-Brice Stadium.

With 2:11 to play in the fourth quarter, Auburn forced a punt that South Carolina downed at the Tigers' 20-yard line, but replay overturned the call on the field, ruling that the ball first contacted an Auburn player, giving the Gamecock's possession and allowing South Carolina to run out the clock.

In his first start, T.J. Finley completed 17 of 32 passes for 188 yards and a touchdown.

Derick Hall recorded Auburn's fourth sack to force a punt early in the fourth quarter, but the Tigers' drive stalled at midfield. After forcing a three-and-out on the opening possession of the second half, Auburn drove 63 yards in nine plays to take a 17-14 lead on Ben Patton's first career field goal, a 37-yarder.

Bigsby's 29-yard run, Auburn's longest gain of the night, set up Patton's field goal. Bigsby averaged 7.5 yards per rush on 22 carries, logging his fifth 100-yard game of the season and ninth of his career. South Carolina answered with a 67-yard touchdown drive, taking a 21-17 lead on Jason Brown's third touchdown pass, a

7-yarder to Josh Vann on third-and-goal at the 4:57 mark of the third quarter. Auburn drove 67 yards in 15 plays, including a 19-yard pass to Jackson on fourth-and-16, but the Tigers missed a 25-yard field goal attempt with 14:10 remaining in the game.

Auburn built a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, forcing a three-and-out on South Carolina's first possession thanks to Eku Leota's third-down sack that gave the Tigers possession at midfield after a Gamecocks punt.

With a ferocious pass rush and precision coverage, Auburn kept No. 3 Alabama out of the end zone until the final minute before falling 24-22 in quadruple overtime Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Iron Bowl.

Bryce Young's two-point pass to John Metchie accounted for the winning points after Auburn went first and threw an incompletion in the fourth overtime

The first overtime in Iron Bowl history began with Alabama's 6-yard touchdown pass from Young to Slade Bolden to give the Crimson Tide its first lead of the night at 17-10. Auburn answered when Landen King scored his first career touchdown with a spectacular one-handed catch of T.J. Finley's 5-yard pass to tie at 17-17 after Ben Patton's extra point.

Patton delivered again in the second OT, giving Auburn a 20-17 lead with a 49-yard field goal. Will Reichard's 38-yard field goal sent the game to a third extra period with a 20-20 tie.

In the third overtime, a one-play shootout from the 3-vard line under new NCAA rules. Young hit Metchie for a 22-20 lead but Auburn anrered when Finley rolled right and tossed back to his left to John Samuel Shenker to tie it at 22-22, sending the game to the decisive fourth OT.

Auburn took advantage of a short field by driving 39 yards in four plays for the only touchdown of the first half. On third-and-14, Finley threw a back-shoulder pass to Demetris Robertson for 29 yards, Auburn's longest gain of the game. On the next play, Finley found Kobe Hudson in the slot 2 yards behind the line of scrimmage. Hudson faked out one defender and outraced another to the end zone for a 15-yard touchdown that put the Tigers ahead 7-0 with 6:50 left in the first half.

Patton's 33-yard field goal gave Auburn a 10-0 lead with 11:43 remaining in the third quarter. Alabama's next drive ended when Bydarrius Knighten intercepted Young at Alabama's 45-yard line.

On their next possession, the visitors drove to Auburn's 19, but a mishandled hold denied Alabama a chance to attempt a 36-vard field goal, preserving the Tigers' 10-0 lead after three quarters.

John Samuel Shenker broke Auburn's single-season records for tight end receptions and yards but Houston scored on a late fourth-quarter touchdown pass to win the Ticketsmarter Birmingham Bowl 17-13 Tuesday at sold-out Protective Stadium. After allowing a touchdown on Houston's opening drive, the Tigers kept the Cougars out of the end zone until Most Valu-

able Player Clayton Tune threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to Jake Herslow with 3:27 remaining in the game. Needing to drive 75 yards for a game-winning TD, Tank Bigsby gained 8 yards on Auburn's first play but three straight incompletions ended the possession.

Trailing 10-6 in the third quarter, Auburn drove 78 yards on 11 plays to take a 13-10 lead on T.J. Finley's 12-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Hudson on third-and goal, helping the Tigers overcome the Cougars' 10-0 first-half lead. Finley completed 19 of 37 passes for 227 yards and a touchdown. Bigsby led Auburn with 96 rushing yards on 19 carries and

68 receiving yards on five catches, including a career-long 51-yarder that led to Auburn with Yo rusning yards on Five catches, including a career-long 51-yarder that led to Auburn's first points on Ben Patton's 35-yard field goal late in the first half.

The Tigers made two interceptions and a fourth-down stop in the second half, helping turn a 10-3 halftime deficit into a 13-10 lead.
