## THE GAME

Defending SEC champion Auburn (0-0, 0-0 SEC) opens the second season of the Gus Malzahn era and the 2014 campaign hosting the Arkansas Razorbacks (0-0, 0-0 SEC) on Saturday, August 30 at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in Auburn. Kickoff is 3:00 p.m. CT; this will be the lead telecast on the SEC Network's first Saturday of football.

## FIRST AND 10

- Auburn begins its 122nd season of football and its 75th campaign in Jordan-Hare Stadium
- The Tigers are the defending SEC champions. Other seasons when Auburn has defended an SEC title were 1958, 1984, 1988, 1989, 1990, 2005 and 2011
- Auburn has sold out its season ticket allotment for 2014 -- 77,400 tickets
- The first-ever SEC team to lead the NCAA in rushing, Auburn ranked first among FBS teams in rushing yds/ game (328.3), yds before contact (2,983) and yds outside the tackles (3,108) in 2013
- Auburn had 10 players named to the coaches' preseason all-SEC teams, including first-teamers Reese Dismukes, Sammie Coates and Nick Marshall
- The Tigers had the ball while trailing with less than two minutes remaining five times last season, and scored a touchdown all five times
- Auburn is 93-26-2 in season opening games all-time
- The Tigers are 96-15-3 all-time in home openers; they did not play any games in Auburn until the 1896 season
- Auburn is among 17 teams with its coaching staff intact from a year ago; others: Arizona, Baylor, Boston College, BYU, Clemson, Colorado, Colorado State, Kansas State, UL-Lafayette, Michigan State, Ole Miss, San Diego State, South Carolina, Tennessee, UTEP and Washington State
- The 2014 Auburn schedule includes eight bowl teams from a year ago, and nine teams receiving votes in the preseason Amway Coaches' USAToday poll

The Series

Auburn and Arkansas will play Saturday in the 24th meeting between the teams. Auburn holds a 12-10-1 advantage in the series history. Auburn was a 35-17 winner last season.

Auburn and Arkansas are tied 5-5-1 in all games played at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Tigers lead 6-4 in games played at Fayetteville. Auburn won the only matchup played in Memphis (1984), while Arkansas won the only contest played at Little Rock (1995).

Through the first 23 games in the series, Arkansas has outscored Auburn by a total of just 554-542, an average differential of just 0.5 points per contest.

Some more Auburn-Arkansas series notes: The first 10 games (1984-2000) of the series featured six games decided by six points or fewer, including one tie. Only three games were decided by 17 or more points.

In contrast, the last 13 games (2001-2013) of the series have featured 10 games decided by 17 points or more. The average margin of victory in the series during that time is 16.31 points per game.

Coach Gus Malzahn played wide receiver for Arkansas in 1984-85, before finishing his college career at Henderson State. Auburn offensive coordinator Rhett Lashlee was a Razorback quarterback from 2002-04, and running backs coach Tim Horton was a three-year starter and four-year letterwinner at split end and punt returner from 1986-89.

Malzahn served as Arkansas offensive coordinator in 2006; Rhett Lashlee served as an offensive graduate assistant at Arkansas that same season. Tim Horton was the Razorbacks' running backs coach and recruiting coordinator from 2007-12. J.B. Grimes served as a graduate assistant at Arkansas from 1981-82 and was the offensive line coach there from 1989-92.

Auburn In Season Openers

Auburn is 93-26-2 (.777) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won seven of their past eight openers dating back to the 2006 season opener.

Auburn's total of 93 season-opening victories is just two behind Alabama (95) and one behind Arkansas (94) for the most among current SEC schools. Next is Georgia with 90.

Auburn has compiled a record of 50-7-1 (.871) in season openers played in Auburn. Although Jordan-Hare Stadium opened in 1939, Auburn did not open a season there until 1951. Since then, Auburn has gone 35-6 (.854) in season openers played at the stadium.

Season Openers With SEC Opponents

Auburn has opened the season against a conference foe 15 times previously, posting a 10-5 record in those games.

Auburn's most common SEC opponent in season openers has been Tennessee; the teams met seven times in openers from 1956-62. The only other SEC team Auburn has opened the season against more than once is Ole Miss; those teams met five times (in 1949 and 1992-95). Auburn has also opened the season against SEC opponents Vanderbilt (1951), Mississippi State (1972) and Kentucky (1988).

SEC Numbers

In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 298-232-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 122-51-6 all-time. In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 176-180-12 overall.

In August Games

Auburn is 5-2 (.714) all-time in games played during the month of August, including a 1-1 record on the date of August 30.

Auburn is 5-1 (.833) at home all-time in August and 0-1 at a neutral site (the 1984 Kickoff Classic). All seven August games were the opener that season.

**30+ Points**

Auburn scored 30 points in 10 consecutive games for the first time in school history to conclude the 2013 season. The previous best was in 1994, when the Tigers scored 30+ points in eight straight games.

Auburn had its string of 88 consecutive games won when scoring 30 or more points snapped in the BCS title game, a 34-31 loss to Florida State. The streak began after a 56-49 four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 305-5 when scoring at least 30 points.

**Opening Day Superlatives**

Season openers have produced several impressive performances by the Tigers, including two SEC records. Bo Jackson's 290 rushing yards versus Louisiana-Lafayette in 1985 and Alexander Wright's 263 receiving yards in 1989 against Pacific are the best season-opening performances by an SEC player.

Chris Todd's 93-yard TD pass to Terrell Zachery in 2009 vs. Louisiana Tech is the longest pass play in school history.

**Strength Of Schedule**

Auburn's 2014 opponents combined to go 93-60 (60.8%) last season, which makes Auburn's schedule the 16th toughest schedule in the country according to their opponents' 2013 winning percentage.

Auburn plays three teams that won at least 10 games in 2013 (Alabama 11; South Carolina 11; LSU 10) and nine of the Tigers' opponents received votes in the preseason polls.

Auburn's 2014 schedule includes seven homes and five road games. In 2014, Auburn will play both Alabama and Georgia on the road in the same season for the first time in program history.

Auburn will play eight bowl teams from a year ago that combined to go 6-2 in those bowl games: **Kansas State:** Buffalo Wild Wings (W, 31-14 vs. Michigan); **LSU:** Outback (W, 21-14 vs. Iowa); **Mississippi State:** Liberty (W, 44-7 vs. Rice); **South Carolina:** Capital One (W, 34-24 vs. Wisconsin); **Ole Miss:** Music City (W, 25-17 vs. Georgia Tech); **Texas A&M:** Chick-Fil-A (W, 52-48 vs. Duke); **Georgia:** Gator (L, 19-24 vs. Nebraska); **Alabama:** Sugar (L, 31-45 vs. Oklahoma)

**Most Improved**

Improving from a record of 3-9 in 2012 to their 12-2 mark for 2013, the Tigers improved by 8.0 games for the biggest turnaround in college football last season. In fact, Auburn's achievement was just short of the all-time NCAA improvement record of 8.5, set by Hawaii from 1999-2000 (0-12 to 9-4).

**SEC Improvement**

With a seven-win improvement from 0-8 in SEC play during 2012 to 7-1 last season, Auburn made the biggest turnaround in SEC history. The previous top turnarounds:

*Georgia: 2-4 (1958) to 7-0 (1959)*

**When Scoring 20+ Points**

Since 2001, Auburn is 100-15 (.870) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 156-23-1 (.869) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

1,000-Yard Rushers

Auburn is one of just eight schools nationally to boast at least one 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last five seasons.

Wisconsin leads that string with nine consecutive seasons, followed by Oregon (7) and Stanford (6). Auburn, Boise State, Nebraska, Northern Illinois and Washington have five consecutive seasons.

The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013) and Nick Marshall (2013).

Coach Gus Malzahn has produced 11 1,000-yard rushers in eight years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, including at least one in each season. Additionally, Malzahn has had five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in a season three times, Arkansas in 2006 and Auburn in 2010 and 2013. His 2007 Tulsa offense had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Nick Marshall

Quarterback Nick Marshall, the consensus preseason all-SEC signalcaller, scored a rushing touchdown and threw a touchdown in the same game six times in 2013, including the final five games, the longest current consecutive streak in college football.

Marshall scored a total of 14 touchdowns in those five games (7 rush, 7 pass), and had a total of 26 touchdowns in his first season as the Tigers' starting quarterback (12 rush, 14 pass).

Marshall enters his senior season with 1,068 rushing yards, fourth in school history among quarterbacks. He needs 333 yards to pass Jimmy Sidle for third, 406 yards to pass Cam Newton for second and 817 yards to pass Phil Gargis to become Auburn's all-time leading rusher among quarterbacks.

Marshall enters the season ranked 39th in career rushing yards among all players. He is one of only four SEC quarterbacks to post a 1,000-yard rushing season, along with Newton, Sidle and Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel.

The Tigers last lost a game in which its quarterback had a 100-yard rushing performance on Nov. 15, 1975, at Georgia. Auburn lost 28-13 that day despite Phil Gargis rushing for 119 yards. Auburn averaged 52.1 rushing attempts per game in 2013. The Tigers carried the ball 50 or more times in nine contests (74 Missouri; 60 Texas A&M; 59 Florida Atlantic; 57 Georgia; 53 Florida State; 53 Tennessee; 52 LSU; 52 Alabama; 50 Arkansas State).

Since 1967, Auburn is 144-36-3 (.795) when rushing 50+ times in a game, 45-6-1 (.873) when rushing 60+ times in a game, 6-0 when rushing 70+ times in a game, and 1-0 when rushing 80+ times in a game (82 carries in a 41-0 win over Ole Miss in 1985).

**2014 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES****Coates Racking Up Records**

Sammie Coates' 902 receiving yards in 2013 were the seventh-best season in Auburn annals. That total is the fourth-most in Auburn history by a player who returned the next season, trailing only Ronney Daniels (1,068 yards in 1999), Terry Beasley (1,051 yards in 1970) and Darvin Adams (997 yards in 2009).

Coates enters his junior season with 1,016 career receiving yards, 24th best all-time at Auburn. Just ahead of him are Marcel Willis (1,022), Willie Gosha (1,048) and Terrell Zachary (1,106).

Coates' nine career receiving touchdowns put him just three away from joining Auburn's career top 10. Coates, who finished third nationally in yards per catch (21.5), had seven touchdown catches last season, and averaged 54.1 yards per TD reception; the TD distances: 88, 68, 67, 43, 39, 38, 36.

Coates (42), Ricardo Louis (28) and Marcus Davis (23) were three of Auburn's top four receivers last season. That underclassman trio combined for 93 receptions for 1,444 yards and 10 touchdowns, accounting for 54% of Auburn's receptions and 60% of its receiving yards. Junior Quan Bray, with 23 catches for 195 yards and three touchdowns, rounded out the Auburn reception leading quartet.

Auburn ranks fourth nationally this season in the percentage of receptions returning. Auburn returnees caught 156 of 173 receptions (90.2%) last season. Only two players with a reception in 2013 -- Tre Mason and Jay Prosch -- do not return for 2014.

**For Starters**

Auburn has 30 players with at least one career start on its 2014 roster. Tops are offensive linemen Reese Dismukes (37 career starts) and Chad Slade (36). Those numbers are the best in the SEC for returning offensive linemen.

**Interceptors**

Auburn recorded 13 interceptions last season, after grabbing only two during the 2012 campaign. Seven different players accounted for those picks, led by Robenson Therezie with four interceptions.

Other returnees who recorded interceptions last season were Jermaine Whitehead (2), Joshua Holsey (1), Jonathon Mincy (1) and Cassanova McKinzy (1).

**Top Tacklers**

Linebacker Cassanova McKinzy, who led Auburn in tackles (75) as a sophomore last season, was the first underclassman to lead the Tigers in that category since sophomore Zac Etheridge in 2008.

Other returning players who ranked among Auburn's top dozen tacklers last season include Jermaine Whitehead (65), Kris Frost (59), Robenson Therezie (57), Jonathon Mincy (56), Gabe Wright (31) and LaDarius Owens (30).

**Triple-Threat Toe**

Redshirt freshman Daniel Carlson will handle the punting, placekicking and kickoff duties for Auburn this season, the first Tiger specialist to do all three since Damon Duval (1999-2002).

Carlson is one of just five kickers handling triple duty nationally this season, along with Justin Manton (ULM), Austin Rehkow (Idaho), Tyler Wedel (Northern Illinois), and Matt Wogan (Oregon).

**The Return Game**

Auburn ranks second in the nation among teams with the longest active streak of kickoff returns for a touchdown in consecutive seasons.

The Tigers have had at least one kickoff return for a score in each of the past six seasons, including Tre Mason's 100-yard return against Washington State and Corey Grant's 90-yard return at Tennessee last season.

Schools with the most consecutive seasons with a kickoff return for a score: 9: *Kansas State*; 6: *Auburn*; 5: *Northern Illinois*; 4: *Florida*.

Only 12 teams returned multiple kickoffs for touchdowns last season: Auburn, Duke, Florida State, Iowa State, New Mexico, North Carolina, Purdue, Rutgers, Stanford, TCU, Texas State and UTEP.

The Graduates

Auburn already has seven college graduates on its 2014 roster.

Jonathon Mincy (public administration) received his bachelor's degree in December, 2013, while Shon Coleman (public administration), Forrest Hill (public administration) and LaDarius Owens (communication) received their diplomas in May, 2014.

Chad Slade (sociology) and Jermaine Whitehead (accounting) were August, 2014, graduates.

At Jordan-Hare

Auburn carries a nine-game winning streak at Jordan-Hare Stadium into the 2014 season after going undefeated at home (8-0) last season and beating Alabama A&M in the 2012 home finale.

A win over Arkansas would give Auburn a 10-game home winning streak, which would tie the 10th longest home winning streak in Auburn history. The Tigers previously accomplished the feat from October 27, 1928, to November 21, 1936.

Auburn has only had seven home winning streaks longer than its current nine-game string during Jordan-Hare Stadium's history. Last season marked the 36th time that Auburn has gone undefeated during its first 74 seasons in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn's 2014 NFL Draft

Auburn had four former players drafted in the 2014 NFL Draft, including two first-round picks for the second time in four years.

Greg Robinson was taken second overall by the St. Louis Rams and Dee Ford was drafted 23rd overall by the Kansas City Chiefs in the first round. Cam Newton and Nick Fairley were first-round picks in 2011.

The St. Louis Rams took 2013 Heisman finalist Tre Mason with pick No. 75 in the third round. Jay Prosch was selected in the sixth round, No. 211 overall, by the Houston Texans.

The Rams are the first team to take two Auburn players in the top three rounds of the NFL Draft since the Washington Redskins selected Carlos Rogers and Jason Campbell in the first round of the 2005 draft.

This year's draft marked the first time that Auburn had three offensive players drafted since 2007: Ben Grubbs (1-29), Kenny Irons (2-49) and Courtney Taylor (6-197).

Greg Robinson became the third player who played in Gus Malzahn's offensive system to be drafted in the top four overall picks of the draft since 2008, joining Darren McFadden, who was drafted No. 4 overall by the Oakland Raiders out of Arkansas in 2008 and Cam Newton, who was the top overall selection by the Carolina Panthers in 2011.

Jay Prosch was the first Auburn fullback to be drafted since Heath Evans was a third-round selection, No. 82 overall, by the Seattle Seahawks in 2001.

Honoring Past Champions

Auburn will honor two of its SEC championship teams during the 2014 season.

The 2004 13-0 squad coached by Tommy Tuberville, which won the SEC with an undefeated mark and downed Tennessee 38-28 in the SEC championship game, will be recognized at the San Jose State game September 6.

LAST MEETING WITH ARKANSAS

The Mason rushed for 168 yards and a career-best four touchdowns to lead No. 8 Auburn to a 35-17 win over Arkansas on Saturday at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Mason finished the night with a career-best 32 carries as the Tigers improved to 8-1 (4-1 SEC) on the year. His 168 yards rushing were the third-best performance of his career.

After Arkansas (3-6, 0-5 SEC) had scored back-to-back touchdowns to pull within 11 points in the fourth quarter, Mason led the Tigers to a response with a 12-yard touchdown run, his fourth of the night, with 10:17 left in the game.

The touchdown stretched Auburn's lead to 35-17 and marked the first time an Auburn player rushed for four or more touchdowns since Cam Newton against Kentucky in 2010.

The Tigers got on the board first with a 9-yard touchdown run by Mason with 2:35 left in the first quarter. Auburn took over with a short field after Kris Frost recovered an Arkansas fumble at the Razorbacks' 29-yard line.

Following a field goal by Arkansas, Auburn covered up an attempted outside kick and again converted the short field with six points. The drive was punctuated by a 4-yard touchdown run from Mason, who carried 13 times for 93 yards in the first half.

The Tigers came up with a huge goal line stand late in the second quarter with JaViere Mitchell making stops at the 1-yard line on third and fourth downs as Auburn forced the Hogs to turn it over on downs.

Mason kept running hard as the second half began and the junior scored his third touchdown of the day from 5 yards out to cap an 11-play, 65-yard drive. The drive included Auburn quarterbacks Nick Marshall and Jeremy Johnson completing 4-of-4 passes.

The Tigers stretched their lead to 28-3 on an 88-yard touchdown throw and catch from Marshall to Sammie Coates. The play was the longest of the season for Auburn and third-longest pass in school history.

Coates finished the day with three receptions for 102 yards and a touchdown for his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season. In a night heavy on the run game, Marshall completed 7-of-8 passes for 118 yards and the score while also rushing for 59 yards on nine carries.

Arkansas used a long kickoff return followed by a 13-yard touchdown

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. With the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially

named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 30 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 79.5 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication hold an overall record of 297-74-7 there.


