THE GAME

Defending SEC champion No. 9 Auburn (7-3, 4-3 SEC) hosts the Samford Bulldogs (7-3, 5-2 Southern Conference), coached by Auburn's first Heisman Trophy winner Pat Sullivan, at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in Auburn, Ala. Kickoff is 6 p.m. CT; the game will be televised by ESPNU.

- Cameron Artis-Payne's 221 yards vs. Texas A&M were the most by an SEC rusher this year; he leads the SEC in rushing at 127.6 yards per game
- Auburn has outscored its opponents by 52 points in the fourth quarter (93-41)
- Quarterback Nick Marshall has a school QB record eight career 100-yard rushing games; Marshall is now second in Auburn career QB rushing at 1,807 yards, and needs 78 yards to pass Phil Gargis as Auburn's all-time leading rushing signalcaller
- Quan Bray is third in the nation in punt return average (18.6) and has two punt return TDs this year; the Tigers as a team rank first nationally at 18.20 yards per return
- Auburn claimed its 300th all-time win in Southeastern Conference play with the 41-7 victory over LSU; the Tigers are 302-234-18 in SEC action during the past 81 seasons
- Nick Marshall has accounted for 17 touchdowns (8 pass, 9 rush) in his last six games and is tied for fourth with Stan White with 51 touchdowns accounted for during his career

The 2014 senior class has a record of 30-18; they were redshirts during the 2010 national championship season and a key component in Auburn's 2013 SEC championship campaign.

The Series

The Auburn Tigers and Samford Bulldogs will meet for the 28th time Saturday, their first meeting since 2011. Auburn leads the all-time series 26-0-1. The teams played 24 times between 1903 and 1945, but did not meet again until 1992 and have played only three times since. A few more series notes:

- In 18 of the 26 games, Auburn has recorded a shut out, including the first seven meetings.
Auburn has outscored Samford 125-23 in the three meetings post-WWII.
Auburn has an all-time record of 91-47-2 against teams from the state of Alabama, including Alabama, Alabama A&M, UAB, Birmingham Southern, Camp Sheridan, Marion Institute, Maxwell Field, Montgomery, North Alabama A.C., Samford and Spring Hill.

The 1992-93 games featured a coaching oddity. Terry Bowden was Samford's head coach in 1992 and then Auburn's head coach in 1993.

This will be the 36th time in the modern era (since 1946) that Auburn played consecutive games against teams with the same nickname; the pairings included the Texas A&M and New Mexico State Aggies; Georgia, Mississippi State, Louisiana Tech, Samford and Alabama A&M Bulldogs; and the Eagles of Boston College and Southern Miss.

In Non-Conference Games

The Tigers now have a 25-game home non-conference winning streak. Auburn's last home non-conference loss was a 26-23 OT defeat to South Florida in 2007.

Overall, Auburn has won 10 consecutive regular season games against non-conference competition since a 26-19 loss to No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 season opener.

Auburn's all-time regular season record in non-conference play since SEC action began in 1933 is 237-67-6.

Auburn finished 4-0 in its regular season non-conference schedule for 2013, the 26th time since joining the SEC in 1933 that the Tigers did not lose a game in non-conference regular season action.

In Home Finales

Auburn has an all-time record of 81-27-6 in the final game played in Auburn each season.

SEC Numbers

Auburn gained its 300th all-time win in SEC play with the 41-7 win over LSU. In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 302-234-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 125-52-6 all-time. In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 177-182-12 overall.

In November Games

Auburn is 229-176-20 (.563) all-time in November games. The Tigers are 22-13 in 35 November games since the 2004 season. Auburn's all-time home record in November is 92-35-5 (.721). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 137-141-15 (.492) during November.

2014 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES**At Jordan-Hare**

The win over Louisiana Tech was Auburn's 300th victory at Jordan-Hare Stadium, celebrating its 75th anniversary this season. Auburn had a 14-game winning streak at Jordan-Hare Stadium from the home finale of 2012 snapped against Texas A&M.

Since the stadium expanded to its current capacity in 2004, the current streak of eight sell-outs through the Texas A&M game sets the Auburn record.

Gus Malzahn is 18-2 at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2014 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

Versus Ranked Teams

Auburn is 103-144-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. Auburn is 45-36-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-62-2 on the road and 31-46-2 against ranked teams on a neutral field.

Auburn's 20-week streak ranked in the AP Top 10, second longest in school history, was stopped with the loss at Georgia.

Auburn has won six straight matchups between ranked teams in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The last home loss by Auburn in a matchup of ranked teams was a 21-16 decision to No. 6 LSU by No. 10 Auburn in 2008.

Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 297-101-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 164-29-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 133-72-4 all-time.

The Tigers are 81-119-5 all-time when facing SEC opponents that are ranked (36-29-2 at home, 26-56-2 away, 19-34-1 neutral field).

When Scoring 20+ Points

The Tigers' streak of 23 games scoring at least 20 points was snapped with the loss at Georgia; that string extended back through the start of the 2013 season. Since 2001, Auburn is 107-17 (.869) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 163-25-1 (.868) when scoring 20 or more points.

30+ Points

Prior to the 20-14 win at Kansas State, Auburn had scored 30 points or more in 12 consecutive games, a school record. The previous best was in 1994, when the Tigers scored 30+ points in eight straight games.

Auburn had its string of 88 consecutive games won when scoring 30 or more points snapped in the BCS title game, a 34-31 loss to Florida State. The streak began after a 56-49 four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

In its history, Auburn is now 311-6 (.981) when scoring at least 30 points.

1,000-Yard Rushers

Cameron Artis-Payne has extended Auburn's streak to six seasons with at least one 1,000-yard rusher. Artis-Payne has 1,276 yards through 10 games.

Among the eight schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher in from 2009-13 -- Wisconsin (9), Oregon (7), Stanford (6), Auburn (5), Boise State (5), Nebraska (5), Northern Illinois (5) and Washington (5) -- Auburn, Wisconsin, Boise State and Nebraska have extended their streak already this season.

Some Tiger Stripes ...

Auburn is second in the country in third-down conversion percentage this season (74-134, .552), trailing only Georgia Tech (77-132, .583). Since the start of the 2013 season, Auburn has converted 50.2% of its third downs, which is fourth-best among FBS teams.

Auburn has 18 scoring drives of 72 yards or longer in the last six games, including drives of 99, 96, 93 and 92 yards. All 18 drives accounted for touchdowns.

- Auburn averages 37.8 points per game, 305.2 rushing yards per game and 494.7 yards of total offense in 24 games under head coach Gus Malzahn.
• Auburn has averaged 41.5 points and 573.5 yards of total offense (339.5 rushing) in four home SEC games this season. In seven SEC games this season, Auburn has averaged 33.0 points and 504.1 yards of total offense (284.0 rushing).

Auburn is ninth in the country in red zone defense, allowing scores on 30-42 opponent red zone trips this season (71.4% scoring percentage), including touchdowns on 22 red zone opportunities (52.4% TD percentage).

The Tigers have forced six turnovers in the red zone, including three interceptions by Jonathan Jones and one by Cassanova McKinzy. Against Ole Miss, Derrick Moncrief forced a Bo Wallace fumble recovered by Kris Frost at the Auburn 6-yard line and Frost forced a Laquon Treadwell fumble recovered by Cassanova McKinzy in Auburn's endzone.

After being held scoreless in the first half at LSU in 2013, the Tigers have scored an offensive touchdown in 50 of the last 58 quarters against SEC opponents.

Gus Malzahn is 12-2 in one-score games as a college head coach (9-2 at Auburn).

2014 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

• Auburn has had 20 or more first downs in 17 of the last 19 games. In 24 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 20 times. In 13 of the last 19 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2014, the Tigers have averaged 24.3 first downs per game and under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 24.0 first downs.

Auburn's 31 first downs vs. Texas A&M were the most by the Tigers since gaining 31 first downs against Tennessee in the 2004 SEC Championship game.

• Three times this season Auburn has had 250 yards rushing and 250 yards passing in a game, all against SEC Western division opponents: Arkansas (302 rush, 293 pass); LSU (298 rush, 268 pass); Ole Miss (253 rush, 254 pass).

• In the fourth quarter, Auburn is converting a quarter-best 20-30 (.667) third-down conversions while holding opponents to 11-38 (.289).

In the second half alone, Auburn is converting 37-62 (.597) on third downs while its opponents are 26-76 (.342). For the entire game, Auburn is 55.2 percent (74-134) on third down while opponents are 35.5 percent (50-141).

• Auburn is fifth nationally and third among Power Five teams, averaging 305.2 rushing yards per game since the beginning of 2013, trailing Navy (338.2), New Mexico (313.1), Wisconsin (313.1) and Georgia Tech (312.4).

• Auburn has returned three punts for a touchdown in its last 15 games. Prior to that, the Tigers had returned three punts for scores in 277 games dating back to 1991.

Artis-Payne & The 100-Yard Rushers

The SEC rushing leader at 127.6 yards per game, Cameron Artis-Payne has rushed for 1,276 yards so far this season, the most by an Auburn player in the first 10 games of a season since Rudi Johnson rushed for 1,390 yards in the first 10 games of the 2000 season.

The senior crossed the 1,000-yard mark in the first half of the Texas A&M game; he finished with a career-best 221 yards on 30 carries against the Aggies, scoring twice, the best SEC rushing performance this season. It was his third straight 100-yard rushing game, seventh of the season and ninth of his career.

Artis-Payne rushed for 143 yards at Ole Miss, his first 100-yard effort in a road game; he scored on a six-yard run against the Rebels.

Prior to the Kansas State game, at least one Auburn player rushed for 100 yards or more in eight consecutive games, a school record streak besting the seven games set in 1978 (Joe Cribbs and William Andrews) and again in 1986 (Brent Fullwood and James Joseph). During the eight-game streak, the Tigers got 100-yard games from Tre Mason (6), Nick Marshall (3) and Artis-Payne (2).

Starting a new string, Artis-Payne (116 yards, 1 TD) and Marshall (105 yards) topped the century mark against Louisiana Tech, and duplicated that effort against LSU. Artis-Payne gained 126 yards against LSU, while Marshall had 119 yards and two rushing scores.

Artis-Payne (167 yards, 1 TD) and receiver Ricardo Louis (102 yards, 1 TD) were both 100-yard rushers against South Carolina. That marks the 12th time in 60 games under Malzahn (HC/OC) that Auburn had two 100-yard rushers in a game. It was the eighth time Auburn had two 100-yard rushers in 21 games since Malzahn took over as head coach. Artis-Payne (112 yards) and Marshall (103 yards) did it earlier this season against San José State.

Artis-Payne now has nine career 100-yard rushing games and 16 rushing touchdowns. He is 19th among Auburn career rushers with 1,886 yards. Artis-Payne's 100-yard games:

50+ Carries

Auburn has reached the 50-carry mark this season, against San José State (50) and Texas A&M (59), averaging 360.5 yards rushing in those contests (6.6 yards per carry). The Tigers had 49 carries against LSU, 48 versus both Arkansas and Louisiana Tech, 47 vs. South Carolina, 46 at Ole Miss, 45 at Kansas State and 43 at Mississippi State. Auburn is averaging 47.0 carries per game.

The Tigers averaged 52.1 rushing attempts per game in 2013. The Tigers carried the ball 50 or more times in nine contests (74 Missouri; 60 Texas A&M; 59 Florida Atlantic; 57 Georgia; 53 Florida State; 53 Tennessee; 52 LSU; 52 Alabama; 50 Arkansas State).

Since 1967, Auburn is 145-37-3 (.796) when rushing 50+ times in a game, 45-6-1 (.873) when rushing 60+ times in a game, 6-0 when rushing 70+ times in a game, and 1-0 when rushing 80+ times in a game (82 carries in a 41-0 win over Ole Miss in 1985).

Duke's Debut

Junior college product D'haquille "Duke" Williams is enjoying an auspicious Auburn debut. He leads the Tigers with 38 receptions for 609 yards (16.0 yds/catch) and has five touchdowns.

At Mississippi State, his six catches gained 108 yards, with touchdown catches of 9 and 15 yards. It was Williams' first multiple-score game at Auburn and his third 100-yard receiving game this season.

Williams gained 110 yards on eight catches at Kansas State for his second 100-yard receiving game, scoring on a 9-yard pass from Nick Marshall against the Wildcats. He snagged a deflected pass through the arms of two defenders for an 18-yard TD against Louisiana Tech.

With 154 yards receiving against Arkansas, Williams produced the 12th-best receiving day ever in an Auburn uniform and the best receiving total by a Tiger since Darvin Adams (217 yards) in the 2010 SEC championship game vs. South Carolina. That's the most receiving yards ever by an Auburn player in his first game.

Coates Racking Up Records

Sammie Coates snagged five catches for 122 yards and a score at Ole Miss, for his sixth career 100-yard receiving game and his second 100-yard game this season. His 57-yard touchdown catch from Nick Marshall was Coates' second touchdown catch of the season and 11th of his career. It was Marshall's longest completion of the season and Coates' longest reception this year; it was the third longest offensive play of the season for the Tigers. It was the longest pass by Auburn vs. Ole Miss since 2003 (Jason Campbell to Ben Obomanu).

Coates had 123 yards on three receptions in the first half and finished with 144 yards on four catches against LSU; those 144 yards surpassed his previous high of 139 yards vs. LSU in 2013. Coates' 56-yard reception in the first quarter was his first TD catch of the season.

A junior, Coates has 1,405 career receiving yards, 13th best all-time at Auburn, and he has a 16-game reception streak. Coates' 902 receiving yards in 2013 were the seventh-best season in Auburn annals.

Coates' 11 career receiving touchdowns put him just one away from joining Auburn's career top 10. Since the start of the 2013 season, Sammie Coates has caught nine touchdown passes, all of which have covered at least 36 yards, with the average distance being 54.7 yards. Ten of Coates' 11 career touchdown receptions have gone for more than 30 yards, with an average distance of 48.5 yards.

Coates (42), Ricardo Louis (28) and Marcus Davis (23) were three of Auburn's top four receivers last season. That underclassman trio combined for 93 receptions for 1,444 yards and 10 touchdowns, accounting for 54% of Auburn's receptions and 60% of its receiving yards. Quan Bray, with 23 catches for 195 yards and three touchdowns, rounded out the Auburn reception leading quartet.

Auburn ranks fourth nationally this season in the percentage of receptions returning. Auburn returnees caught 156 of 173 receptions (90.2%) last season. Only two players with a reception in 2013 -- Tre Mason and Jay Prosch -- did not return for 2014.

Interceptors

With 14 interceptions through 10 games, Auburn has already surpassed its interception total from 2013 (13). The last time the Tigers had more than 14 interceptions in a season was 2009 when Auburn intercepted 17 passes.

The Auburn defense has 27 interceptions in 24 games since the beginning of the 2013 season. Prior to that, the Tigers had 24 interceptions in 37 games since early in the 2010 season. Six different players have intercepted at least one pass this season.

Auburn's defense intercepted three passes in its last two games at Mississippi State and at home vs. South Carolina. It is the first time since 2002 that Auburn has intercepted at least three passes in consecutive games. That season, the Tigers intercepted four passes vs. LSU and then three more passes vs. Ole Miss. Auburn also had three interceptions against San José State, making this the first season in which Auburn's defense has had three 3-interception games since 2002; that year AU also intercepted three passes vs. Syracuse.

Jonathan Jones picked off two South Carolina passes, both in the endzone, his second consecutive game with multiple interceptions, giving him five picks for the season. Jones also grabbed two interceptions at Mississippi State.

Jones is the first Auburn player to record two interceptions in a game since Robenson Therezie vs. Washington State in the 2013 season opener. Auburn had only one player record two interceptions in a game from 2010-12 (Josh Bynes vs. Arkansas in 2010), a span of 39 games.

Johnathan Ford also had an interception against Mississippi State and Cassanova McKinzy recorded one against South Carolina.

Montravius Adams had a 36-yard interception in the win over Louisiana Tech, the first of his career, and the first interception by an Auburn defensive lineman since Nick Fairley vs. Mississippi State in 2010.

Two interceptions at Kansas State were key in that road victory. Jonathan Jones' first-quarter interception in the endzone was the first interception of his career. He is the fourth Auburn player to record a pick this season. Trovon Reed's fourth-quarter interception at K-State was his second of the season; he has interceptions in back to back games.

Jermaine Whitehead had his second interception in as many games with a 19-yard pick against San José State, giving him five for his career. Jerraud Powers in 2007 vs. Georgia and Alabama was the last Auburn player to have interceptions in back-to-back games.

Johnathan Ford (3 yards) and Reed (6 yards) recorded their first career interceptions vs. San José State, Auburn's first three-interception game since last year vs. Washington State.

Whitehead's 32-yard interception return for a TD against Arkansas was the second interception score of his career (also vs. Florida Atlantic 2011). Auburn's streak of consecutive seasons with an interception return TD is now eight.

Whitehead had a second-quarter interception vs. Texas A&M, his third of the season.

Seven different players had picks last season, led by Robenson Therezie with four interceptions. Other returnees with interceptions last season were Whitehead (2), Holsey (1), Jonathon Mincy (1) and Cassanova McKinzy (1).

Top Tacklers

Cassanova McKinzy recorded his second double-figure tackle performance of the year with 12 stops against Texas A&M. Johnathan Ford had six tackles and Kris Frost five against the Aggies. Double-digit tacklers this season:

- 14 Kris Frost (South Carolina)
- 12 Johnathan Ford (Ole Miss)
- 12 Cassanova McKinzy (Texas A&M)
- 11 Joshua Holsey (Kansas State)
- 10 Cassanova McKinzy (San José State)

McKinzy and Jermaine Whitehead led Auburn with nine tackles each at Georgia. Linebacker Frost had a team season high 14 tackles in the win over South Carolina, a career best for Frost, along with a fumble recovery and a later forced fumble, earning SEC defensive player of the week honors. Jonathon Mincy and Ford each added seven tackles vs. the Gamecocks.

Frost now has 121 career stops, the fifth active Auburn player to reach the century mark in career tackles, along with Whitehead (205), Jonathon Mincy (193), McKinzy (171) and Robenson Therezie (111).

Ford had a career-high 12 tackles at Ole Miss, while Frost added 9 stops, a sack and a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Ford led Auburn tacklers at Mississippi State with nine tackles, adding an interception and a forced fumble against the Bulldogs. Kris Frost and DaVonte Lambert each had seven tackles vs. Mississippi State.

Three defenders -- Robenson Therezie, Ford and Cassanova McKinzy -- led the squad with six tackles each in the win over LSU. Ford added his first career sack in that game.

McKinzy led Auburn with nine tackles and a TFL against Louisiana Tech; Jonathon Mincy and freshman Tré Williams both had seven stops vs. the Bulldogs.

Joshua Holsey was Auburn's leading tackler at Kansas State; his 11 tackles (10 of them solo stops) earned him SEC defensive player of the week honors. Johnathan Ford had eight tackles and Kris Frost and Mincy added six each against the Wildcats.

McKinzy was Auburn's leading tackler with 10 stops vs. San José State, followed by Ford with eight tackles. Jermaine Whitehead and Mincy, each with seven tackles, and McKinzy with six stops, a sack and two TFL, were Auburn's top tacklers in the season opener against Arkansas.

McKinzy, who led Auburn in tackles (75) as a sophomore last season, was the first underclassman to lead the Tigers in that category since sophomore Zac Etheridge in 2008.

Tackles For Loss

Led by Angelo Blackson with 2.5 tackles for loss and Jonathon Mincy with two, Auburn's 10 TFL at Ole Miss marked the 15th time since the beginning of the 2004 season Auburn posted 10 TFL in a game. Auburn also had 10 TFL against San José State this season. The Tigers went 14-1 in those contests:

Other Tigers with a TFL at Ole Miss were Adams, Elijah Daniel, Johnathan Ford, Kris Frost, Cassanova McKinzy, LaDarius Owens, Gimel President and Wright. Auburn is averaging 6.3 TFL per game this season.

For Starters

Auburn now has 41 players with at least one career start on its 2014 roster. Tops are offensive linemen Reese Dismukes (47 career starts) and Chad Slade (45). Those numbers are the best in the SEC for returning offensive linemen.

Making first starts for Auburn in the season opening win over Arkansas were: DE Montravius Adams, S Johnathan Ford, OT Shon Coleman and WR D'haquille Williams. DE DaVonte Lambert made his first Auburn start at Kansas State, and LB Tré Williams, LB Anthony Swain, OG Devonte Danzey and DE Gimel President were first-time starters vs. LSU. DB Derrick Moncrief made his first start at Ole Miss, and RB Roc Thomas was a first-timer at Georgia.

More From The Georgia Game...

- Seven points was Auburn's lowest first-half scoring total this season; the previous low was 10 points at Kansas State. It's the fewest first-half points since Auburn was shut out in the first half at LSU in 2013 (9/21/13)
- This was Auburn's lowest scoring total for a game since a 49-0 loss at Alabama to end the 2012 season
- This is the first time an Auburn opponent has had a pair of 100-yard rushers since the 2012 Georgia game (Todd Gurley, Keith Marshall)
- The kickoff temperature of 38 degrees was the coldest temperature for an Auburn game since the 2000 Iron Bowl in Tuscaloosa (41 degrees)

100/100

Cameron Artis-Payne's 143 yards on the ground and Sammie Coates' 122 receiving yards at Ole Miss mark the seventh time under head coach Gus Malzahn that the Tigers have had both a 100-yard rusher and receiver in the same game.

Artis-Payne's 177 yards rushing and D'haquille Williams' 154 yards receiving vs. Arkansas mark the first time Auburn has had a 150-yard rusher and a 150-yard receiver in a game since Carnell Williams [177 rush] and Tim Carter [156 receiving] did it against Arkansas in 2001, a stretch of 159 games.

Ten-Game Scoring

Auburn needs just eight more points to crack Auburn's top 10 for scoring in a season. Auburn's 355 points this year rank sixth all-time at Auburn in the first 10 games of a season. The record is 422 points scored in 2010. Ten-game scoring leaders:

The Return Game

Quan Bray scored his second punt return touchdown of the season with a 76-yard score against Louisiana Tech, the seventh-longest in school history and fifth-longest in AU history that went for a score, earning him SEC special teams player of the week honors. Bray ranks third nationally in punt return average (18.6). Bray is eighth in Auburn history in career punt return yardage (535).

Bray is the second player in Auburn history to score two punt return TDs in the same season (Mike Fuller, 1974). Bray's 55-yard punt return for a touchdown against San José State was the first return TD of the senior's career, and continued an Auburn tradition of productivity in the return game.

Auburn ranks second in the nation among teams with the longest active streak of kickoff returns for a touchdown in consecutive seasons. The Tigers have had at least one kickoff return for a score in each of the past six seasons, including Tre Mason's 100-yard return against Washington State and Corey Grant's 90-yard return at Tennessee last year.

Schools with the most consecutive seasons with a kickoff return for a score: 10: *Kansas State*; 6: *Auburn*; 5: *Northern Illinois*; 4: *Florida*.

Auburn's KOR touchdowns during that string were by: Corey Grant (90 vs. Tennessee, 2013); Onterio McCalebb (100 vs. Mississippi State, 2012 and 83 vs. Alabama, 2011); Tre Mason (97 vs. Utah State in 2011 and 100 vs. Washington State, 2013); Demond Washington (95 vs. Ole Miss, 2010 and 99 vs. Georgia, 2009); and Tristan Davis (97 vs. Arkansas and 95 vs. UT-Martin, 2008).

Auburn was one of five teams nationally to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game last season, one of 18 teams to return both a kickoff and a punt for a TD in 2013, and one of 12 teams nationally with at least three kickoff/punt returns for touchdowns. Only 12 teams returned multiple kickoffs for scores last year.

Total Offense Quarters Under Malzahn

In the first quarter against LSU, Auburn gained 247 yards of total offense, marking the ninth time in 19 games under Gus Malzahn and the third time this year the Tigers have gained at least 200 yards of total offense in a quarter. Six of those quarters were against SEC teams.

Triple-Threat Toe

Redshirt freshman Daniel Carlson has handled the majority of punting, placekicking and kickoff duties for Auburn this season, the first Tiger to do all three since Damon Duval (1999-2002).

In his debut vs. Arkansas, Carlson averaged 53.3 yards on three punts, downing two inside the 20, and had seven touchbacks on kickoffs, earning SEC Freshman of the Week accolades.

His 53.3 yds-per-punt average was the best for an Auburn punter since Kody Bliss averaged 54.7 yards against ULM in 2003. Carlson's 62-yard punt against Arkansas was the longest at Auburn since 2007. His field goals of 46 and 42 yards earned him SEC special teams player of the week honors vs. LSU.

For the year, Carlson is averaging 41.2 yards on 30 punts, with nine landing inside the 20. He is 46-46 on PAT attempts and 11-15 on field goals (one blocked). On kickoffs, 39-60 (64.0%) have been touchbacks.

Average Per Down

Here's a breakdown of how the 2014 Auburn offense operates on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Tigers have run 334 plays, gaining 2,196 yards for an average of 6.6 yards per play. On second down, AU has tried 238 plays for 1,660 yards, an average of 6.9 per play.

On third down, the Tigers have attempted 131 plays, gaining 1,032 yards for a 7.8 average. Auburn has tried only four fourth-down conversions (1-4) this season, scoring a 5-yard rushing touchdown vs. San José State.

Auburn's TDs have come 14 times on first down (12 rush, 2 pass), 12 times on second (7 rush, 5 pass), 10 times on third down (9 pass, 1 rush) and once on fourth down (1 rush).

First-Time Tigers

In 2014, 25 Tigers have made their Auburn debut. Twelve saw their first career action in the season opener vs. Arkansas: Peyton Barber, Daniel Carlson, Xavier Dampeir, Gray King, DaVonte Lambert, Derrick Moncrief, Nick Ruffin, Braden Smith, Tyler Stovall, D'haquille Williams, Tré Williams, Hunter Wood.

Eight more made their debuts against San José State: Aaron Garrison, Raashed Kennion, Alex Kviklys, Devaroe Lawrence, Deon Mix, Stephen Roberts, Roc Thomas, Cameron Toney. First-time players at Kansas State were Matthew Shiel and Raashed Kennion.

Stanton Truitt saw his first snaps against Louisiana Tech and Jimmy Hutchinson did the same vs. LSU. Ike Powell saw his first action at Ole Miss.

Scoring By Quarters

In 2014, Auburn has outscored its opponents in the first quarter 90-77 (+13), and has outscored its opponents 106-89 (+17) in the second quarter. In the third quarter, Auburn leads the scoring 66-44 (+22), and the Tigers hold a 93-41 (+52) advantage in the fourth quarter. Auburn has held its opponent scoreless in 11 of 40 quarters.

Winningest Programs

Entering 2014, Auburn ranked 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs; the Tigers currently have 733 total victories.

The 18 FBS teams that have 700+ all-time wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn, West Virginia, Syracuse, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Georgia Tech.

Game Captains

Auburn selects game captains for the 2014 season. Center Reese Dismukes and defensive lineman Gabe Wright have served as the captains vs. Arkansas, San José State, Kansas State, Louisiana Tech, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Ole Miss, Texas A&M and Georgia.

The Graduates

Auburn already has six college graduates on its 2014 roster. Chad Slade (sociology) and Jermaine Whitehead (accounting) were August, 2014, graduates. Jonathon Mincy (public administration) received his bachelor's degree in December, 2013, while Shon Coleman (public administration), Forrest Hill (public administration) and LaDarius Owens (communication) received their diplomas in May, 2014.

Coleman Courage Award Nominee

Offensive tackle Shon Coleman, a leukemia survivor, is the fifth weekly nominee for the 2014 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.

The Courage Award, first presented by the FWAA in 2002, is selected by a group of writers. The requirements for nomination include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship. The winner will be included in festivities during Orange Bowl week.

Chasing The Grey Cup

Two former Auburn Tigers are on rosters of Canadian Football League teams involved in the CFL playoffs. Courtney Taylor is a member of the B.C. Lions, and Antonio Coleman is on the roster of the Eastern Division-champion Hamilton Tiger-Cats. Former Auburn assistant coach Phillip Lolley is the linebacker coach for the Edmonton Eskimos.

Cadillac Williams SEC Legend

Carnell "Cadillac" Williams is Auburn's 2014 SEC Legend. Williams was named an All-American as a senior in 2004 after rushing for 1,165 yards and 12 touchdowns while leading the Tigers to an undefeated season and the SEC Championship.

He was a first-team all-SEC selection and SEC Special Teams Player of the Year in 2004. A two-time first-team all-SEC pick, Williams finished as the school's all-time leader in rushing attempts, rushing touchdowns and scoring. He finished second on Auburn's all-time list in career rushing yards with 3,831.

A 2001 freshman All-American, Williams was selected fifth overall by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2005 NFL Draft and enjoyed a seven-year NFL career.

The Legends will be honored at the 2014 SEC Football "Weekend of Champions" Dec. 5-6 in Atlanta, Ga., with the SEC Legends Dinner presented by AT&T Dec. 5 and the SEC Football Championship Game.

Where They Go Next

Auburn visits Alabama for the Iron Bowl on Saturday, November 29. The Auburn game is Samford's final regular season contest.

LAST MEETING WITH SAMFORD

Auburn survived a scare from Samford, but reeled off 14 straight points in the fourth quarter to close out a 35-16 win on Nov. 19.

Clint Moseley, not usually known for his rushing capabilities, took a quarterback keeper 22 yards for the score with 11:28 remaining to give Auburn the breathing room it would need in the win. The Tigers added a 10-yard touchdown run from Onterio McCalebb with 2:17 to go for the final margin.

Moseley went 13-of-20 passing for 167 yards and a score, and Mike Dyer rushed 30 times for 157 yards and a score for the Tigers.

Dyer passed James Joseph --currently Samford's running backs coach --for 10th on Auburn's all-time career rushing list. He has 2,287 yards in 25 games at Auburn.

Dustin Taliaferro went 17-of-32 for 161 yards, with a touchdown and an interception for Samford. Kelsey Pope caught 13 passes for 90 yards and a score, while Jeremiaha Gates posted his first career 100-yard game, rushing 28 times for 119 yards.

Samford coach Pat Sullivan was honored with a ceremony before kickoff to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the 1971 Heisman Trophy he won at Auburn, becoming the school's first Heisman winner.

Samford closed within 21-16 on a 37-yard field goal by Cameron Yaw with 13:22 left to play, set up by a reverse pass from Pope to Gates for 28 yards into Auburn territory. The Bulldogs had a fourth-and-1 from the Auburn 19-yard line, but opted to go for the Yaw field goal.

The Tigers scored the eventual winning touchdown on a 6-yard Dyer run with 3:25 to go in the third, capping off a 14-play, 70-yard drive in which Auburn handed off to Dyer on the last seven plays and he ran for 51 yards to put the Tigers up 21-13.

The Tigers put a renewed emphasis on the power run game in the second half --rushing 26 times for 160 yards after the break.

Samford had cut the lead to 14-13 with 7:22 left in the third quarter, driving 70 yards in 14 plays -- including 42 on the ground from Gates -- to set up a 28-yard field goal by Yaw, but the Bulldogs could never get the upper hand.

Auburn started off the scoring with a 32-yard strike from Moseley to Philip Lutzenkirchen down the seam, finishing off a nine-play, 55-yard drive and

The team that led the nation in rushing last season just sent a frightening message to defensive coordinators everywhere.

Auburn can pass, too.

Jeremy Johnson passed for 243 yards in the first half, Duke Williams had nine catches for 154 yards in his Auburn debut and Nick Marshall directed an offense that still produced a 177-yard rusher in Cameron Artis-Payne as the Tigers overcame Arkansas and an 88-minute lighting delay in a 45-21 victory in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

When the season-opener was done, Auburn had 595 yards, averaging 8.5 yards per snap. The Tigers ran for 302 yards and passed for 293 more.

Auburn had to break away from a 21-21 halftime score to begin its defense of its Southeastern Conference championship in fine form. But when Auburn had taken control, had taken a 38-21 lead, the game was delayed by the lighting delay with almost 10 minutes remaining.

It didn't affect Auburn one bit.

Johnson was the starter, subbing in that role while Marshall was being punished for an off-season traffic stop and citation, and was sharp throwing down field, especially to Williams, the junior college transfer. Marshall didn't appear until the start of second half, and quickly led Auburn down the field and scored on an 18-yard run for a 28-21 lead.

It was a change-of-pace game, for sure. Auburn, the nation's top rushing team last year, relied on the pass in the first half with Johnson at quarterback. Then the Tigers found balance in the second half with tried-and-true Marshall and Artis-Payne gobbling up yards.

And his principal receiver, the one Duke Williams?

Williams went there, making seven of his catches for 138 yards in the first half from Johnson. He finished with the 12th best receiving day in Auburn history.

Malzahn said he wasn't sure how long he'd play Johnson, but, after Auburn scored on its first three possessions, he stuck with his sophomore.

Auburn's defense helped build the cushion when Jermaine Whitehead intercepted a duck of a pass and went 32 yards for the score and a 35-21 lead with 2:39 left in the third quarter.

Auburn made it 17-0 in the second half, and 38-21 overall, when Daniel Carlson hit his first college field goal, a 45-yarder with 9:55 left.

Corey Grant made it 24-0 in the second half on a 3-yard run with 3:15 remaining.

Johnson, playing the whole way in the first half, hit 12-of-16 passes for 243 and those two touchdown passes in the first two quarters. That was a change of strategy from last year's game in Fayetteville, where Auburn threw it nine times, total, the whole game.

The Tigers scored first, on a 49-yard pass from Johnson to Melvin Ray. Then Arkansas' Brandon Allen threw a 14-yard TD pass to Hunter Henry, and the race was on.

Artis-Payne scored on a 1-yard run for Auburn and Johnson threw an 18-yard TD pass to Williams for a 21-7 lead.

But Allen threw a 17-yard TD pass to AJ Allen and Jonathan Williams scored on a 6-yard run to tie the game at 21 with 4:28 left in the first half.

There were the points, sure. But offensive-minded coach Gus Malzahn liked most everything else, too.

Defense? Check. Special teams? Check. Quarterback and running back play? Check and check.

Auburn ran past San Jose State 59-13 before a sellout crowd of 87,451 in Jordan-Hare Stadium behind a mix of big plays and consistency.

Cameron Artis-Payne rushed for more than 100 yards for the second straight game while running for three touchdowns.

Auburn scored seven touchdowns, including a 55-yard punt return by veteran Quan Bray, and a 3-yard touchdown run by freshman Roc Thomas on his first-ever Auburn carry.

Auburn's defense was solid again, thanks in part to interceptions by Jermaine Whitehead, Rudy Ford and Trovon Reed; and Auburn's offense used three quarterbacks again and mixed in some running backs again.

Nick Marshall started at quarterback and played the first three quarters. When he left, Auburn was up 45-13.

Marshall scored on a 27-yard touchdown run. He threw a 4-yard touchdown pass. There were the feel-good stories of two long-time Tigers.

Bray masterfully returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown. Reed, the receiver-turned-defensive back, intercepted a pass in the end zone to turn back a late San Jose State opportunity.

Defensive end Montravius Adams didn't intercept a pass. But he had a sack and, overall, three tackles for a loss, and the fans cheered every one.

Artis-Payne rushed for 177 yards and a touchdown in the win over Arkansas, then went for 112 yards and three touchdowns against San Jose State. He did most of that work in the first half, when it mattered, when he rushed for 106 yards.

Marshall was second in rushing, like he was last year, by running for 103 yards. Corey Grant rushed for 89 yards. Marshall averaged 9.4 yards a run, Grant averaged 8.9 yards a run. Artis-Payne averaged 7.

Everybody seemed to get into the act in the first half on the way to Auburn's 38-10 lead. Artis-Payne scored three touchdowns in the first two quarters. Bray made his spectacular 55-yard punt return for a touchdown, sidestepping tacklers and outracing everyone to the end zone. Duke Williams, who caught nine passes in the opener, caught four more, all in the first half.

GAME 3

In a game in which yards and points were a premium, Auburn's defense gave the Tigers room to breathe.

The Tigers beat Kansas State 20-14 Thursday night in a Top 25 battle then didn't go to script, unless you played on defense. Auburn played a lot of defense.

No. 5 Auburn led 20-7 until No. 20 Kansas State scored late. Too late.

Auburn's offense played keep-away the final 3:49, thanks, in part to a gutsy third-and-9 pass with 2:06 remaining. Thirty-nine yards later, Auburn happily was able to run out the clock.

Auburn led 10-7 at the half, and at the end of the third quarter, too.

The Tigers didn't find any of that breathing room until early in the fourth quarter when quarterback Nick Marshall threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Duke Williams for a 17-7 lead. The Tigers made it 20-7 until K-State's late TD.

Malzahn's call to throw it to Williams on that third-and-9 play prevented it.

Kansas State could only watch the clock tick away after that. Marshall had pulled out another game, overcoming a few dropped passes and a running game that had trouble in the first half.

All the while, Auburn's defense was turning in a solid performance. K-State had only 40 yards rushing and turned away the Wildcats in three of five trips in the red zone.

Auburn's offense converted on 8-of-11 third-down plays in the second half.

The game that promised offense was all about defense most of the way. A scoreless third quarter said so.

Marshall's touchdown pass to Williams made it 17-7 lead with 14:10 remaining. Daniel Carlson kicked a 25-yard field goal with 6:28 left to make it 20-7. But K-State's cut the lead to 20-14 on Charles Jones' 1-yard TD run with 3:49 left.

The Wildcats never saw the ball again.

The Marshall-to-Williams' touchdown pass was pretty. Before then, both offenses struggled to score because of the defenses, dropped passes and three missed field goals by Kansas State.

Much of the pregame hype was about Auburn's Marshall and Kansas State's Jake Waters. But the two dual-threat quarterbacks were upstaged by the two defenses for much of the game.

Malzahn wanted his hurry-up offense to hurry up in the first half, but, even trying to make it happen by wind-milling his arms encouraging a better pace. But, for the most part, the Tigers couldn't snap it quickly.

Kansas State's defense had Marshall seemingly changing plays as the play clock ticked under 10, then 8, then 5 seconds time after time.

Auburn's first three drives produced only 38 yards and an un-Auburn-like two first downs. Marshall was intercepted, and a couple of receivers missed the ball. But he came through when it mattered.

After a Carlson 34-yard field goal made it 3-0 Auburn, Marcus Robinson's 3-yard TD run gave K-State a lead. But Marshall found Ricardo Louis, who made a nice catch, then made nicer moves dodging defenders on a 40-yard touchdown pass to give Auburn its 10-7 with 1:34 left in the first half.

GAME 4

Bring on all those SEC Top 25 teams, Auburn said Saturday, but the Tigers couldn't say it before being tested by a non-conference homecoming opponent in Jordan-Hare Stadium that, finally, couldn't stop Quan Bray.

The Tigers beat Louisiana Tech 45-17 to send everybody home happy, though the Bulldogs put up a fight until Auburn quarterback Nick Marshall turned in a highlight-reel scramble that ended with a 44-yard touchdown pass to Bray for a 31-10 advantage with 14:24 left in the game, and then by Bray putting the game away with a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown a minute later.

Bray finished with three catches for 91 yards, and, with his two punt returns, accounted for 189 all-purpose yards.

Next up for Auburn is nationally-ranked LSU at 6 p.m. next Saturday in Jordan-Hare.

Auburn improved to 4-0 and will take a 1-0 SEC record into the LSU game. Louisiana Tech fell to 2-3.

Bray scored on that 44-yard touchdown catch and a 37-yard TD catch before returning the punt for the score, his second return for a touchdown this season for a 38-10 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Jeremy Johnson sealed the win six minutes later when he threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Uzomah.

The Tigers did most of their good work in a condensed time: Scoring two touchdowns in a minute and two seconds late in the first half for a 24-3 lead. The Marshall-to-Bray touchdown pass early in the fourth followed by Bray's punt return put the game on an easier street.

Auburn's defense ruled the first quarter, and the second quarter.

The Tigers' offense caught up with their defensive brothers just before half-time with two scores that turned a sluggish 10-0 advantage into a 24-0 lead.

Marshall did that, closing fast and finishing the first half rushing for 94 yards on 11 carries and hitting 6-of-9 pass for 98 yards and two touchdowns. He finished with 105 rushing yards and hit 10-of-17 passes for 166 yards and three touchdowns.

Louisiana Tech finally scored on the last play of the half to make it 24-3, then once in the third quarter and again in the fourth.

That didn't much, not after defensive end Montravius Adams set up two of Auburn's first-half touchdowns. The first came when he caught a pass that was deflected from Kris Frost. Adams rumbled to the Louisiana Tech 5. Cameron Artis-Payne scored on the next play. Adams recovered a fumble to set up another score.

Auburn finally broke loose late in the second half with a nice Marshall-led drive, and a little good fortune, when a pass was deflected at the line of scrimmage, but landed in Duke Williams' hands 18 yards away for a 17-0 lead.

Adams recovered a Louisiana Tech fumble in short order, and Marshall threw a picture-perfect 37-yard touchdown pass to Bray down the left sideline for a 24-0 lead with 34 seconds left in the first half. Jonathan Barnes kicked a 25-yard field goal on the last play of the half to make it 24-3. LA Tech cut it to 24-10 midway through the third quarter when Kenneth Dixon scored on a 1-yard run. Auburn didn't score in the third quarter, but closed with 21 points in the fourth when Bray scored on a catch and punt return and Uzomah scored on the pass from Johnson.

GAME 5

In a world of upsets and missteps, fifth-ranked Auburn stood like a giant in the Top 5 Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn turned in a thoroughly dominating performance, watched quarterback Nick Marshall put on a clinic in passing and running and dropped No. 15 LSU 41-7 before a capacity crowd of 87,451 in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The outcome will surely move up Auburn in the polls, especially in a week in which No. 1 Alabama, No. 3 Oklahoma and No. 4 Oregon all lost.

Marshall accounted for three touchdowns in the first half and led the Tigers on seven scoring drives. Cameron Artis-Payne rushed for 126 yards and a touchdown. And Auburn's defense was impressive. LSU was 0-for-13 on third-down conversions, 1-for-4 on fourth-down conversions.

Auburn, which played for the national title last year, is trying to do it again as it tries to navigate through the tough SEC West. The Tigers have beaten Arkansas and LSU to start that run. Auburn improved to 5-0 overall and 2-0 in the SEC. LSU fell to 4-2 overall and 0-2 in the league.

Auburn wasted exactly zero time setting the tone against LSU by scoring on its first four possessions and thoroughly confusing LSU freshman quarterback Brandon Harris.

Auburn led 31-7 at the half, and that was a halftime deficit LSU coach Les Miles had not seen in his 10 years in Baton Rouge. Auburn had four touchdowns and a field goal in the first half.

Harris, making his first start, was just 1-of-8 passing as Auburn built that lead. LSU changed quarterbacks in the second half, but it didn't matter, not when LSU was 0-for-12 in third-down conversions.

How did Auburn, the team that led the nation in rushing last season, jump out to such a big lead? By passing. Auburn had 379 yards in the first half, with 220 of those coming from the arm of Marshall and Jeremy Johnson, who lined up at receiver, took a handoff from Marshall, and threw a 38-yard pass to Sammie Coates.

That was flashy. But Marshall brought his game throughout. He zipped through the first half hitting 12-of-16 passes for 182 yards and two touchdowns, and ran it 10 times for 81 yards and two more touchdowns. He finished hitting 14-of-22 passes for 207 yards and two touchdowns, and rushed 16 times for

119 yards and two more touchdowns.

Marshall led Auburn to its first score, coming on a career-best 46-yard field goal by Daniel Carlson, then threw a 54-yard touchdown pass to Coates for a 10-0 lead. Then, on the drive Johnson completed his pass, Marshall scored on a 7-yard run. Then he threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Uzomah. Then he ran it in from 29 yards out for a 31-7 halftime advantage.

The closest LSU was able to get in the first half was 17-7 on a Kenny Hilliard 1-yard run late in the first quarter. Auburn shrugged it off with two second-quarter scores.

Auburn played out in the second half, scoring on a 42-yard Carlson field goal midway through the third quarter to make it 34-7. A 12-yard touchdown run by Corey Grant made it 41-7 with 8:44 remaining in the game.

The cowbells clanged and another top team fell in the SEC West on Saturday. No. 3 Mississippi State beat No. 2 Auburn 38-23 in a game filled with turnovers and rain and mistakes too great to overcome, at least for the Tigers in Scott Field.

Chalk it up as another crazy game in the rough-and-tumble SEC West, which saw two of its power teams, then-No. 1 Alabama and No. 2 Auburn on Saturday, lose in back-to-back weekends.

Mississippi State survived, beating a Top 10 team for the third consecutive game, and perhaps laying claim for the top spot in the polls Sunday.

It was just the second regular-season loss for coach Gus Malzahn in his second year as Auburn's head coach. The West is likely far from decided.

The largest crowd in Mississippi State history, officially 62,945, soaked in Mississippi State's quick lead and a second-quarter rainstorm. At least the Bulldogs' fans soaked it up. State led 21-0 early.

Auburn tried to come back. A 16-yard pass from Nick Marshall to Duke Williams completed a 99-yard drive to cut the Bulldogs' advantage to 28-20 left in the third quarter.

It was that way until the fourth quarter until Evan Sobiesk's short field goal put Mississippi State up by two scores, at 31-20 with 11:33 left, then Auburn fumbled the kickoff and Josh Robinson's 1-yard TD run made it 38-20 just 26 seconds later.

The Bulldogs improved to 6-0 overall and 3-0 in the Southeastern Conference. Auburn fell to 5-1 overall and 2-1 in the league, thanks primarily to a troublesome start.

Auburn ran itself into a world of trouble, not only on its first two possessions, but its first two plays. Auburn turned the ball over each time, and each time Mississippi State converted them into touchdowns.

Turnovers and points by everybody, and a fake punt by State that went astray, made for an uneven first half. Offensive penalties in the second half erased some of Auburn's biggest plays. State had four turnovers in the first half. Auburn committed two turnovers and missed a chance to close the gap when it had to settle for field goal tries.

State scored 14 points off turnovers. Auburn scored 13.

Auburn found itself in a hole quickly, and it was deep. The Bulldogs led 14-0 just 3 1/2 minutes into the game. It was 21-0 five minutes later. Auburn made a game from there, scoring three times and missing a short field goal try on

another chance, to make it 21-13 with 5:26 left in the second quarter.

But State answered, scoring late in the half on a 15-yard Prescott run. Prescott accounted for three touchdowns in the first half, running it in from 15 and 2 yards, and throwing a 34-yard touchdown pass to De'Runnya Wilson. State's other touchdown came on a 1-yard run by Robinson.

Auburn tried to catch up. Daniel Carlson kicked field goals of 21 and 22 yards, and Marshall threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Duke Williams. That play made it a one-possession game, but that's when the Bulldogs turned in their best drive, going 75 yards in eight plays for the score to go up 28-13.

Prescott accounted for three touchdowns and had 265 yards of total offense in the first half. Marshall had the touchdown toss to Williams and 145 total yards.

It was a wild, wild game, and Auburn's Nick Marshall, Cameron Artis-Payne and Ricardo Louis needed every yard, every foot, of their monster offensive performance Saturday night to beat South Carolina 42-35 in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Artis-Payne and Louis each rushed for more than 100 yards and Marshall accounted for four touchdowns and more than 200 total yards as the Tigers smashed their way to 551 yards of offense in a see-saw game that ended with Auburn on top.

Auburn didn't take the lead until the third quarter, then didn't take the lead for good until the fourth. South Carolina threw in the end zone on the game's final play. The pass was intercepted.

When the yards were tallied, a whopping total of 1,086 of them with 55 first downs, Auburn improved to 6-1 overall and 3-1 in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina fell to 4-4 overall and 2-4 in the league.

The No. 5 Tigers will likely move up in the national rankings as well after LSU beat No. 3 Ole Miss 10-7. Auburn will play the Rebels in Oxford next Saturday.

This Saturday, there were tricks played and determined efforts. The Gamecocks converted their first five fourth-down tries, but missed on one critical one on a throw in the end zone in the fourth quarter. Carolina had the ball as the game ended, or until Jonathan Jones intercepted the final last throw.

Auburn took its first lead at 28-21 in the third, on a 5-yard Marshall touchdown run. South Carolina tied it right back up less than two minutes later when Dylan Thompson hit a streaking Pharoah Cooper on a 51-yard scoring play.

Louis raced 75 yards for a touchdown a few seconds later. By then, Auburn had 440 yards, of which a whopping 340 came on the ground, with 7:29 left in the third quarter.

Auburn led 35-28. Until South Carolina tied it again on a Dylan Thompson-to-Nick Jones touchdown pass with 2:20 left in the third quarter.

Artis-Payne rushed for 167 yards on 25 carries and Louis had 102 yards on three carries. Marshall was 12-of-14 passing for 139 yards, and rushed for 89 yards and three touchdowns.

South Carolina was on the doorstep of another score until Jonathan Jones intercepted Thompson in the end zone with 13:17 remaining. Two minutes later, Marshall was scoring on a 9-yard run for a 42-35 Auburn lead.

It was a wild first half, with South Carolina going for it, and making it, on fourth down on a touchdown drive; with a blocking tight end catching his first pass in a year for an Auburn touchdown; and with third-string quarterback Jonathan Wallace catching a toss from Marshall then throwing back to Marshall with his first pass since last season for a 17-yard gain.

South Carolina led 7-0, 14-7 and 21-14. Each time, Auburn had an answer, mixing in the pass with a strong running game to match the Gamecocks every step of the way.

South Carolina was first up, scoring on its first drive when Dylan Thompson threw a 32-yard touchdown pass to Shaq Rolland. Auburn tied it when Marshall hit Brandon Fulse with a 3-yard TD pass, his first catch since last year late in the first quarter.

Carolina went back up when Thompson hit Cooper with a 16-yard TD pass. Auburn countered with a 2-yard touchdown run by Cameron Artis-Payne. The Tigers then held Carolina, but Quan Bray fumbled after a nice punt return to set up the Gamecocks for a 27-yard touchdown pass from Thompson to Mike Davis.

That made it USC 21-14 with 5:05 left in the second quarter. Auburn came back with the Marshall-to-Wallace-to-Marshall trickery, then Marshall raced 37 yards up the middle for a touchdown to tie the game 21-21 with 2:35 left in the half.

Auburn showed again it is worthy of national acclaim, building on its No. 3 ranking in the first College Football Playoff standings with a 35-31 victory over Ole Miss. It was a Top 4 battle in the first week of the new playoff standings, and it was a wild one. Ole Miss led by 10 in the third quarter, but the Auburn kept fighting, taking the lead and then withstanding two, make it three, late Ole Miss comeback attempts.

In a game of big plays, these were among the biggest: Cameron Artis-Payne scored on a 6-yard run to put Auburn up 35-31 with 10:23 remaining, Ole Miss quarterback Bo Wallace fumbled on the Tigers' 1 with 6:31 remaining and the Rebels fumbled again just as Laquon Treadwell was ready to cross the goal line with 1:30 left.

Kris Frost caused the fumble, Cassanova McKinzy recovered the fumble and Auburn survived, even one last possession by the Rebels.

No. 3 Auburn improved to 7-1 overall and 4-1 in the SEC. No. 4 Ole Miss fell to 7-2 overall and 4-2 in the league.

The Tigers had to overcome their own mistakes, namely 10 penalties in the first half; and even a late one that gave Ole Miss a first down at its own 48 on a punt return to set up a potential go-ahead score.

Artis-Payne added to his rushing total, going for another 143 yards with a touchdown. Nick Marshall hit 15-of-22 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns. Sammie Coates had five catches for 122 yards and a TD. Auburn defense came up with four sacks, something everybody had been looking for.

The offense had a 90-yard-plus drive for the third straight game, and four of the last five games.

Ole Miss showed it could score quickly, doing it on a 1-play drive and a 2-play drive. But Auburn showed it could drive, going 96 yards for a go-ahead touchdown late in the third quarter, coming on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Marshall to Marcus Davis for a 28-24 lead.

Then, Ole Miss drove it a long way, taking its time until Wallace scored on 3-yard run for a 31-28 lead with 14:26 left in the fourth quarter.

Auburn had the answer, with Artis-Payne scoring what would be the winning touchdown, and the defense with a lot of big saves.

Ole Miss had built a 10-point lead early in the third quarter when Wallace threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to Evan Ingram. But the Tigers bounced right back.

Spurred by a 41-yard Marshall-to-Duke Williams pass, and some nifty running by Artis-Payne, Auburn marched down for a 2-yard Marshall TD run to make it Ole Miss 24, Tigers 21 with 8:30 left in the second quarter.

The flags started flying in the first half. By halftime, Auburn led the dubious penalty stats by a disturbing margin. The Tigers were penalized 10 times for 105 yards in the first two quarters on the way to 13 penalties for 145 yards. Ole Miss was penalized six times for 48 yards.

Auburn finished with 507 yards, and had a bunch at the half, too. But Ole Miss led 17-14 at the break, gaining the lead on the final play of the first half on Gary Wunderlich's 47-yard field goal.

Auburn looked especially sporty when the game began, mixing the run with the pass on the first drive and marching smartly down the field for a quick TD. Marshall put Auburn on top with a 3-yard run, but Ole Miss answered eight minutes later on Mathers' 4-yard TD run.

The Rebels took the lead in the second quarter on a two-play drive included a 59-yard run by Wallace, and a 10-yard TD pass from him to Laquon Treadwell.

Auburn topped that bit of flash with a one-play drive, when Marshall hit Coates with a pretty, mostly-in-the-air 57-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at 14-14 with 1:24 left in the first half.

Ole Miss quickly came back for the 47-yard field goal for the halftime lead.

Kyle Allen threw four first-half touchdowns and the Aggies beat back Auburn's repeated comeback tries to stun the No. 3 Tigers 41-38 in front of a sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn's Cameron Artis-Payne tried to answer, cruising to a 1,000 yards rushing for the season in the first half, and running past 200 yards for the game in the third quarter.

But it wasn't enough for the Tigers, whose comeback was sidetracked at the end of the first half when A&M blocked a field goal and returned it for a touchdown. Auburn fumbled at the A&M 3 with 2:37 remaining down by three and again at the Aggies' 29 with 54 seconds left.

A&M led 35-17 at the half and 38-24 after three quarters. A Nick Marshall 31-yard scoring pass to Quan Bray cut it to 35-31 with 14:54 remaining.

A&M's Josh Lambo kicked a 27-yard field goal to make it a two-score game with 7:54 remaining. But Marshall completed a 52-yard pass to Sammie Coates, and then scored on a 6-yard run to cut A&M's lead to 41-38 with 6:42 left.

Marshall then hit Ricardo Louis with a long pass and Auburn got to the A&M 3. But Auburn fumbled on a missed handoff and the Aggies recovered with 2:37 left.

Auburn fell to 7-2 overall and 4-2 in the Southeastern Conference. Texas A&M, which started the year in the Top 25 and fell out of the rankings, improved to 7-3 overall and 3-3 in the league.

Artis-Payne did his thing, going over 1,000 yards rushing for the year in his first season as a starter. He became the 18th Auburn player to reach that milestone. It's the 25th time a Tiger has done it.

But the defense allowed 35 first-half points, though A&M ran only 28 plays. The Aggies' ability to score quickly also showed in time of possession. Auburn the ball 20 minutes in the first half. A&M had it 10. It all happened quickly.

Texas A&M had more touchdowns (2) than Auburn had plays (1) barely two minutes in the game. Allen was sharp from the beginning, first throwing a 60-yard TD pass to Malcome Kennedy and then a 36-yard scoring pass to Josh Reynolds. That was 14-0 in lightning fashion.

The Tigers tried to come back behind Artis-Payne and Marshall. Artis-Payne had two TDs in the first half and Marshall scored on 1-yard run late in the third quarter to cut A&M's advantage to 38-24.

Auburn was more methodical than A&M most of the game, especially early when it tied the game before the first quarter was done, with Cameron Artis-Payne scoring on a 2-yard run and then again on a 34-yard run to complete drives of 13 and seven plays.

A&M was back at it early in the second quarter when Allen threw a 23-yard TD pass to Ricky Seals-Jones and, three minutes later, a 7-yard touchdown pass to Reynolds for a 28-14 lead with 10:29 left in the second quarter.

Auburn answered with a 30-yard field goal, but a 41-yard try on the last play of the first half was a disaster. Myles Garrett blocked Carlson's try and Deshazor Everett returned it 65 yards for a touchdown to make it 35-17.

Auburn started fast, but Georgia was ready for the long haul Saturday night in Sanford Stadium. The Bulldogs used a combination of tailbacks Nick Chubb and Todd Gurley to run down the Tigers 34-7 on a cold night for the fans and Auburn.

Auburn's Cameron Artis-Payne came in, and left, as the SEC's leading rusher. But the Georgia combination of Chubb and Gurley was too much.

Artis-Payne pushed the 100-yard mark, but Chubb and Gurley combined for more than 250.

Much of the pregame focus was on Gurley, who was returning from a four-game suspension. But it was Chubb who did most of the significant running early for the Bulldogs.

No. 9 Auburn fell to 7-3 overall and 4-3 in the SEC. No. 15 Georgia improved to 8-2 overall and 6-2 in the league.

Auburn scored first, but the Bulldogs bounced back, taking a 24-7 lead midway through the third quarter, then making it 27-7 late in the period.

There was nothing wrong with Auburn when the game started, surprising the Bulldogs with three straight passes to open the game and smartly marching 70 yards in 10 plays for a quick lead when Artis-Payne scored on a 26-yard run.

Georgia didn't score on its first series, but surely signaled it had come to play. The Bulldogs faked a punt from the Auburn 44, one that would have produced a first down near the goal line if a penalty had not sent the Bulldogs back, forcing a real punt.

Georgia held Auburn, and Auburn held Georgia, but the Bulldogs' next punt was fumbled by Quan Bray, setting up a Hutson Mason 6-yard touchdown pass to Malcolm Mitchell that tied the game at 7-7 with 2:15 left in the first quarter.

Georgia was back at it late in the second quarter. Nick Chubb reeled off runs of 11, 12 and 19 yards before scoring on a 9-yard carry for a 14-7 lead with 8:48 left in the second quarter.

The Bulldogs put together another long drive before settling for a 32-yard Marshall Morgan field goal for a 17-7 lead with 29 seconds left in the first half.

The Bulldogs had flipped the game by then.

Georgia, held to 50 yards in the first quarter, had 154 yards in the second quarter. Auburn, which had 121 yards in the first quarter, had 37 in the second quarter, 19 of which came on the next-to-the last play of the half.

Georgia scored on its first series of the second half on a 3-yard run by Gurley, making it 24-7.

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. With the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially

named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 36 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.6 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication hold an overall record of 302-75-7 there.

The 2014 season marks the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare.




