11 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING AUBURN

- ✓ Mississippi State has won six out of the last 10 overall in this series and five out of the last 10 at Auburn. However, the Tigers have won two-straight against MSU in Auburn, including last year's 89-80 win that marked the final game ever at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum.
- ✓ MSU is looking to win three-straight SEC games for the first time this season.
- ✓ Junior guard Dee Bost has been the productive player against Auburn. In five games, he's totaled 91 points for an 18.2 average. His career-high of 32 points came last year in an 85-75 overtime win in Starkville.
- ✓ In his 13 years at the helm, Rick Stansbury is 80-54 against Western Division schools.
- → Against Arkansas Wednesday, Dee Bost scored 18 points to become the 33rd player in school history to score 1,000 for a career. He reached the milestone with 3:34 left in the first half on a 3-pointer.
- ✓ Dee Bost is tops on the team with 49 assists despite playing in just nine games. In SEC play, that's first in the league. He's also sixth in the assist/turnover ratio department.
- ✓ Ravern Johnson is now just one 3-point attempt shy of becoming only the third player in school history to attempt 600 for a career (Barry Stewart, 779; Darryl Wilson, 645).
- → MSU's 15.2 fouls a game rank as the 10th fewest in the country.
- ✓ After losing their first two games played on Wednesday, the Bulldogs finally broke into the win column thanks to the win against Arkansas.
- → The Arkansas game Wednesday featured the eighth different lineup for Mississippi State this season.
- ✓ Senior guard Riley Benock has played in 123 games. In third place is Derrick Zimmerman at 127. Jarvis Varnado and Barry Stewart hold the record of 141.

KNOM Although Mississippi State ranks last in the SEC in points allowed, the Bulldogs have yielded just 57 and 56 points in their last two games against LSU and Arkansas. In SEC only games, MSU is 7th defensively.

MEET AUBURN

◆Mississippi State faces an Auburn team that's lost two-straight games.

The Tigers' lone SEC win came at South Carolina. However, their last outing at Georgia resulted in an overtime loss. Auburn is still looking for its first win in its new arena.

Earnest Ross leads Auburn with his 13.2 scoring clip. He's the only player scoring in double-digits.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 8-6 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 142-49 (.744) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 132-39 (.772) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 210-35 (8-4 this year) when leading at halftime; 151-34 (6-1) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 226-70 (12-3) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 209-76 (9-3) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 163-30 (9-2) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

FEBRUARY RECORD UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 5-3 record, coupled with this year's 2-1 mark, the Bulldogs are 52-41 (.559) in the month of February since **Rick Stansbury** was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 88-83 (.515) in February.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In 22 games this year, the Bulldogs are nearly on the same pace, having drained 170 of their 503 attempts for an 7.4 average.

Last year, **Ravern Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

Johnson is nearly on the same pace from a year ago. Through 20 games, he is 53 of 151 beyond the arc.

1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBER

On Wednesday against Arkansas, junior guard **Dee Bost** became the 33rd MSU player to score 1,000 points for a career. He reached the milestone with 3:34 left in the first half on a 3-pointer that tied the game at 25-apiece.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, senior guard **Ravern Johnson** became the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In that outing, scored 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. He now has 1,321 for his career to rank 14th all-time, while Bost has 1,015 to rank 33rd.

MEET THE HEAD COACH



onsistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 268-150 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons an another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 157-41 (.793) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 73-27 (.730) SEC mark and a 84-14 (.857) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 363-139 (.723) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.


Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting

The Bulldogs trailed just 27-26 at the half, but a 22-7 run early in the second by the Alabama put the game out of reach.

For the first time this season, the Bulldogs were playing with the services of point guard Dee Bost, who played 33 minutes and scored 14 points while dishing out five assists. The contest also marked a return to the lineup for Renardo Sidney, who drew his second start. He scored two points in 26 minutes of action.

Both teams struggled shooting in the first half. A Riley Benock 3-point basket opened the MSU scoring and actually gave the squad its largest lead of the afternoon. The Crimson Tide answered with the game's next six points.

MSU grabbed last lead on a Bost 3-point basket, making it 31-29 with 18:57 left. The Crimson Tide scored the game's next six points and did not trail again.

Back-to-back baskets by JaMychal Green capped the 22-7 run and placed the Tide on top, 53-38 with 9:08 left.

The Bulldogs drew no closer than 10 points the rest of the way, as the Crimson Tide shot 60 percent from the floor in the game's final half.

MSU head coach Rick Stansbury continued his mastery of the in-state rivals, as the Bulldogs recorded a fourth straight win in the series. He is now 19-7 against Ole Miss, including an amazing 7-6 ledger in Oxford, where the Bulldogs won on this floor for a third straight time.

Sidney had far-and-away his best outing in the Maroon and White. The heralded sophomore scored his 24 points on 9-of-12 shooting, including a pair of makes from 3-point range. Sidney had five defensive rebounds and tallied a season-best 36 minutes.

The Rebels led 34-32 at the break led 54-47 on a Chris Warren layup with 9:52 remaining. But back came MSU.

LSU actually did not get a shot in the final 2:09 of regulation. The Tigers turned the ball over on their final three possessions, including one trip where the Bulldogs committed three straight fouls.

The lead changed hands three times during a competitive first half and LSU led 33-30 at the break.

After Sidney tied the contest on a baseline move, Stringer made back-to-back 3's for a 57-54 lead for the hosts. With 2:26 left, Augustus scored a putback, cutting the deficit to 57-56. MSU forced a defensive stop. Offensively, Bost sank two free throws for a 58-57 MSU lead with 1:59 remaining.
