- It will be Auburn's first-ever trip to Kyle Field. The two teams have faced off twice in the state of Texas with both meetings occuring in Dallas, Texas.
- The Aggies are 3-0 against Auburn, including last year's 63-21 win in Auburn, Ala.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Auburn appeared in the Associated Press Top 25 this week for the first time since 2011 to set up a top 25 battle between the No. 24 Tigers and the No. 7 Aggies. Under head coach Kevin Sumlin, the Aggies have compiled a 4-3 record against top 25 teams. For his career, Sumlin is 7-4 against the top 25.
- Texas A&M is nearing the 700-win level in all-time victories. Last week's win over Ole Miss was the 697th in program history. There are 17 FBS football program with 700 or more victories, including SEC brethren Alabama, Tennessee, Georgia, LSU and Auburn.
- Texas A&M takes a FBS-best nine-game streak of 40-point games into the Auburn game.
- Texas A&M has gained 400 or more total yards in 18 straight games, which is a school record and is the second-longest streak in FBS.

MONEY IN THE RED ZONE

Texas A&M leads the NCAA FBS in red zone chances, red zone scores, red zone touchdowns and red zone rushing touchdowns.

"FAST START"-ERS

One of the opening periods of Sumlin's practices is called "fast start." Occurring just after warmups, "fast start" features several live-action 11-on-11 series just like a game situation. He started implementing the period when his teams at the University of Houston were getting off to slow starts.

- Texas A&M has scored first in 18 of 19 games under Kevin Sumlin. The only game when the Aggies didn't score first was the 2013 season opener against Rice.
- On opening offensive series under Sumlin, the Aggies have scored 16 of 19 times with an impressive 15 touchdowns. A&M has opened the last five games with a TD on its first offensive series.
- In first quarters under Sumlin, the Aggies have outscored their opponents 231-82 or an average of 12.1-4.3.
- While the Aggies have been scoring regularly on its opening possession, Mark Snyder's defense has forced a punt, turnover or turnover on downs on 13 of 19 opening series.
- While time of possession is rarely a statistic applicable to the Aggies' offense, A&M's TOP in the first quarter does. In 2013, A&M holds a 48:26-41:34 advantage in first quarters and have held the ball longer than its opponents in five of six contests. The only outlier game was against SMU (7:42-7:08) when the Aggies won the toss and inadvertently deferred their choice to the second half. Sumlin's teams generally take the ball, while traditional wisdom has most teams deferring its choice to the second half.

SUMLIN SHINES

- Since the end of the 2010 season, Kevin Sumlin has compiled an impressive 28-4 record at Houston (12-1) and Texas A&M (16-3).
- Since dropping his A&M debut game to Florida, Sumlin has compiled a 16-2 record.

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

The Aggies have been solid in the turnover margin category with 11 takeaways against just seven turnovers, which is tied for No. 2 in the SEC and tied for No. 27 nationally.

- Last year, the Aggies had a turnover advantage in four of 13 games. In 2013, the Aggies have won the turnover battle in four of six games.
- Their turnover margin success has led to a significant advantage in points after turnovers. The Aggies have scored 48 points after gaining a turnover, while opponents have scored just 24 points after turnovers.
- With 11 takeaways in the first six games of 2013, the Aggies are nearing the season total of 16 from 2012.

After 19 career games, Aggie sophomore QB Johnny Manziel is nearing a statistical milestone generally known only to upperclassmen. With 1,837 rushing yards and 5,541 passing yards, Manziel could become the 17th player in FBS history to have 2,000 rushing yards and 6,000 passing yards in his career.

ABOUT LAMBO'S BOOT

Junior walkon PK Josh Lambo's walk-off game-winning 33-yard field goal against Ole Miss was the first by an Aggie since Terry Venetoulias beat Texas Tech with a 21-yarder in 1992.

Other recent memorable game-winners (but not walk-offs) include:

- Russell Bynum's 39-yarder against Missouri in 1998 with 1:30 remaining gave A&M the winning 17-14 margin in a game that clinched the Big 12 South for the Aggies.
- Randy Bullock's 19-yarder against Nebraska in 2010 with 3:02 remaining gave A&M the winning 9-6 margin.
- Todd Pegram's FG in the first overtime against Colorado in 2004 provided the winning margin when the A&M defense recovered a fumble on the ensuing possesion.

NOTING MANZIEL

• Sophomore QB Johnny Manziel threw for 400 yards or more in back-to-back games against Sam Houston (426) and Alabama (464) earlier this season, which had never been accomplished in school history.

• He has a career yards/rush average of 6.9.

- Manziel's career completion percentage is 69.5, which is far ahead of the school record of 62.5 set by NFL first-round selection Ryan Tannehill.
- Manziel has surpassed 300 yards in total offense in 16 of 19 career games.
- Manziel has at least one rushing and passing TD in 11 of 19 career games.
- Manziel has rushed for 100 yards and passed for 200 yards eight times in 19 career games.
- According to ESPN Stats and Info. Manziel has nine career games with at least 200 passing yards, one passing TD and one rushing TD, which is the most by any player in NCAA FBS since the beginning of 2012.

400-YARD STREAK

The Aggies gained 587 yards against Ole Miss, which marked the 18th straight game that the offense has surpassed the 400-yard plateau, which is easily the longest streak in school history and is second-longest in the NCAA FBS.

- · Since head coach Kevin Sumlin's arrival in College Station, the Aggies have surpassed 400 in 18-of-19 games, including 500-plus yards 13 times.
- Digging deeper into the Aggies' offensive surge, Texas A&M has posted 45 400-plus yardage outputs in 58 total games since shifting to a no-huddle, up-tempo offense in 2009. During that span, the Aggies have hit the 500-yard level 30 times. As a point of comparison, the Aggies reached 400 total yards in just 18 games in the decade of games prior to 2009 (116 games).

MANZIEL & EVANS

- Of the 114 career receptions by sophomore WR Mike Evans, 110 of the passes have come from Johnny Manziel.
- On the night before games, Manziel and Evans are roommates.
- · Manziel has 13 career interceptions (in 613attempts), and Evans has made the tackle on four of pickoffs.

- Sophomore WR Mike Evans leads the SEC and ranks No. 6 in FBS in receiving yards per game with a 122.8 average.
- His five TDs in six games have already matched 2012's season total.
- Evans has at least one 20-yard catch in 17of-19 career games.
- Evans' mammoth 279-yard effort against the Crimson Tide shattered Ken "Dude" McLean's record of 250 receiving yards (13 catches) against Texas in 1965. One of McLean's catches against the Longhorns was the famed "Texas Special," which resulted in a 91-yard TD.
- In 19 career games, Mike Evans has caught at least one pass on the Aggies' opening offensive sequence 10 times.
- Evans' 279 receiving yards vs. Alabama ranked No. 4 in SEC history for single game receiving yards.
- Evans has had at least two catches in every game of his career (19 games).
- Just 19 games into his A&M career, Evans ranks No. 5 in career receiving yards (1,842 yards) and No. 6 in career catches (114).

STREAKS

- The Aggies have scored a touchdown on their opening drive of the game in four straight games.
- Texas A&M has a streak of 18 straight sellouts at Kyle Field, which began with the 2010 Nebraska game.
- A&M has scored in double digits in 34 straight games dating back to the Aggies' 9-6 win over Nebraska in 2010.
- The Aggies haven't been shut out since 2003 -- a span of 121 games.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Texas A&M matched a school record with its 10th straight road victory last week against Ole Miss. The last loss for the Aggies on the road was a 53-50 overtime loss to Kansas State in Manhattan, Kan., on Nov. 12, 2011. The Aggies' other 10-game road winning streak was in 1939-40.
- Kevin Sumlin's personal "away from home" winning streak stands at 15 games.

- Going into the Auburn game, the Aggies have used 17 true freshmen, four redshirt freshman, two four-year transfers and two junior college transfers for a <u>total of 25 players that have</u> <u>made their maroon and white playing debuts in 2013.</u>
- Since 1972, the Aggies have awarded varsity letters to 10 or more true freshman in a season only a handful of times: 18 in 2009, 16 in 1980, 11 in 1973 and 10 in 1972 and 2008.

MAROON GOONS CLEAR THE WAY

Paving the way for the Aggies' offense is one of the biggest offensive fronts in school history, which features a pair of tackles that have been projected to be NFL first-round draft picks in the future. The projected starting five, self-titled the "Maroon Goons," of senior All-American Jake Matthews (OT), juniors Cedric Ogbuehi (OT) and Jarvis Harrison (OG), sophomore Mike Matthews (C) and redshirt freshman Germain Ifedi (OG) weigh in at 1,526 pounds or 305.2 per goon.

Matthews shifted from right tackle to left tackle to replace Outland Trophy winner Luke Joeckel, while Ogbuehi moved from guard to right tackle.

The Aggies entered the 2013 season with a top 10 preseason ranking in The Associated Press poll for the 13th time in school history. The Aggies were No. 7 in the AP poll, and No. 6 in the USA Today coaches poll.

- It was the highest AP preseason rank since starting No. 7 in 1999, and the No. 6 ranking by the coaches was the highest since bing ranked No. 6 in the 1995 poll.
- With this week's No. 7 AP/No. 7 USA Today ranking, the Aggies have been ranked in 18 straight editions of the polls.
- Texas A&M finished 2012 ranked No. 5 in both the media and coaches polls. It was A&M's highest final rank since 1956.
