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2017 Men's NCAA S&D Championships Auburn Team Notes

Day Four (Finals) - Saturday, March 25

- 10 different athletes earned a total of 32 All-America honors, led by Zach Apple's 7 ... The 10 athletes are the most for Auburn since 2014 (11 athletes) while the 32 honors are one shy of the 2016 total
- Joe Patching's 1:41.11 in the 200 backstroke consolation finals gives him 15 of the top 25 200 back times in school history
- Joe Patching finishes his career with 16 All-America honors, five of them coming this season
- Zach Apple becomes the 13th Auburn swimmer to earn 7 All-America honors in a single season and the first since Kyle Darmody in 2015 ... It is the 17th time a swimmer has earned 7 All-America honors in a single season
- Michael Duderstadt won the consolation finals of the 200 breast in a personal-best 1:53.13 out of lane eight ... That time was the second-fastest in school history and gives him 10 of the top 20 times in program history in the event ... It also marked the first All-America honors in the event for the senior
- Michael Duderstadt finishes his career with 15 All-America honors
- Scott Lazeroff earned All-America honorable mention with his 16th-place finish, making it two straight years he has scored on the board
- Kyle Darmody finished the meet with four All-America honors for the year all on relays and 21 for his career, which ties him with Ryan Wochomurka for the fifth-most in an individual career in Auburn history

Day Four (Prelims) - Saturday, March 25

- Joe Patching's 1:40.43 in the 200 back was the third-fastest time of his career and the ninth-fastest performance in school history
- Michael Duderstadt (1:54.13) and Tommy Brewer (1:54.85) put up the 11th and 12th-fastest 200 breaststroke performances, respectively, in school history

Day Three (Finals) - Friday, March 24

- Joe Patching set the school record in the 400 IM at 3:41.19, shaving .60 seconds off of his own mark set at last year's NCAA meet ... Patching score the highest finish since previous school record holder Eric Shanteau took third in 2006 ... Patching now holds 7 of the top 11 400 IM performances in school history
- Zach Apple set the school record in finishing 12th in the 200 freestyle at 1:33.36 ... Coming into the meet he was the sixth-fastest performer in school history with a 1:34.63 ... On Friday he went 1:33.44 in the morning and 1:33.36 in finals to hold two of the top 3 fastest swims in school history
- Michael Duderstadt missed his school record in the 100 breaststroke by .05 seconds in finishing fifth in 51.55 ... He now owns 2 of the top 3, 9 of the top 12 and 16 of the top 25 performances in school history ... Duderstadt scored in the 100 breast in all four years, earning honorable mention All-America honors the previous three years ... The last Auburn swimmer to score in the 100 breast in four straight years was Mark Gangloff ('01, '02, '03, '04)

Day Three (Prelims) - Friday, March 24

- Joe Patching's 3:43.34 in the 400 IM prelims was the 8th-fastest 400 IM time in school history ... Patching now owns 6 of the 10 fastest 400 IMs at Auburn
- Luis Martinez 45.92 personal best in prelims of the 100 fly tied for the 15th-fastest 100 fly time in school history and made him the 8th-fastest performer in school history
- Zach Apple missed the school record of the 200 free by .05 seconds, clocking a 1:33.44 to easily win the first heat of the event ... His swim was the second-fastest in school history ... He had previously split a 1:32.39 as the anchor on the school record-setting 800 FR on Wednesday night
- Michael Duderstadt's 51.75 in the 100 breaststroke prelims trails only his school record 51.50 from the 2017 SEC Championships for fastest performances in school history

Day Two (Finals) - Thursday, March 23

- Joe Patching's 45.47 leadoff split on the 400 MR was a personal-best and makes him the third-fastest performer with the seventh-fastest performance in school history in the 100 back
- Joe Patching's 1:42.54 in the 200 IM finals was the second-fastest 200 IM in school history, behind only his school record of 1:42.21

- Zach Apple finished tied for 4th in the 50 free with an 18.97, his second sub-19 swim of the day ... Before Thursday his best 50 time had been a 19.23 ... His 18.97 is tied for the 25th-fastest performance in school history and is the 26th-time an Auburn swimmer has posted a sub-19 50 ... His fourth-place finish was the highest for Auburn in the event since Marcelo Chirighini took second in 2013
- With a sixth-place finish in the 200 free relay, Auburn has now had a top-6 finish in the event every year since 2002

Day Two (Prelims) - Thursday, March 23

- Zach Apple led off the 200 FR with a 19.01 split, a career-best which made him the 8th-fastest performer in school history ... He then bettered that with an 18.93 in prelims of the 50 free, becoming the eighth person to swim a sub-19 50 in school history ... His 18.93 is tied with Adam Brown for the 21st-fastest performance in school history
- Joe Patching's 1:42.99 prelims swim in the 200 IM was the fourth-fastest in his career and the fifth-fastest in school history
- Joe Patching's 45.75 leadoff backstroke split during the 400 medley relay prelims was a personal-best and the 15th-fastest performance in school history
- Tommy Brewer's 1:44.57 200 IM swim makes him the 10th-fastest performer in the event in school history
- Auburn has finished in the top 6 in the 200 free relay every year since 2002

Day One – Wednesday, March 22

- Joe Patching's 1:34.06 leadoff split made him the third-fastest performer in the 200 free in school history ... It was also the sixth-fastest performance in school history
- Auburn set the school record in the 800 free relay (6:14.99), breaking the old school record of 6:15.14 set by Hugo Morris, Arthur Mendes, Kyle Darmody and Joe Patching at the 2017 SEC Championships
