SEC TOURNAMENT SEEDS

>> Auburn is the No. 11 seed while Missouri is the No. 14 seed. The Tigers vs. Tigers winner will play No. 6 seed Ole Miss in the second round at 8:30 pm Central on Thursday.

Auburn has been the SEC Tournament runner-up twice (1984, 2000).



AUBURN IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

>> The Tigers are 26-36 (.419) in the SEC Tournament since its renewal in 1979. Overall, Auburn has a 30-53 (.361) mark in the tournament.

Auburn won the 1985 SEC Tournament when the eighth-seeded Tigers won four games in four days, the first team to accomplish that feat (Arkansas also did it in 2000 by defeating the Tigers in the championship game and Georgia in 2008 and Mississippi State in 2009).

The Tigers won three games in three days in the 2015 SEC Tournament in Nashville's Bridgestone Arena for the first time in 30 years. In fact before 2015, Auburn had won only three SEC Tournament games combined in the previous 15 years.

Two years ago, No. 13 seeded Auburn defeated No. 12 seeded Mississippi State 74-68 in the first round, No. 5 seeded Texas A&M 66-59 in the second round and No. 4 seeded LSU

In fact, Pearl is only the third Auburn coach to win at least three games in a conference tournament in the 111-year history of the program.

Hall of Fame coach and current Auburn radio analyst Sonny Smith became the first to win four games in four days en route to winning the 1985 SEC Tournament championship.

Coach Mike Papke with Fob James Sr. as his captain

won three games in the 1928 Southern Conference Tournament before losing to Ole Miss 32-31 in the championship. The 1928 Tigers won the Southern Conference regular season championship that season.

Auburn lost in the 1984 SEC Tournament championship game 51-49 to Kentucky in which Charles Barkley was named tournament MVP. The Tigers defeated Vanderbilt and Tennessee that year to

reach the final.

Auburn split two games in 1991, defeating No. 16 LSU and Shaquille O'Neal 92-77 before losing to Alabama in the semifinals.

In 2015, No. 13 seed Auburn defeated No. 12 seed Mississippi State 74-68 in the first round, No. 5 seed Texas A&M 66-59 in the second round and No. 4 seed LSU 73-70 in overtime in the quarterfinals. No. 1 ranked and then-undefeated Kentucky defeated Auburn 91-67 in the semifinals.

MARQUIS DANIELS • AUBURN'S SEC LEGEND 6-6, 200, G, Orlando, Fla. (1999-2003)



Former Auburn All-SEC guard Marquis Daniels will be honored as part of the Men's Basketball Legends during the 2017 SEC Tournament in Nashville's Bridgestone Arena March 8-12. The Orlando, Fla. native graduated from Auburn in 3.5 years.

Daniels was a two-time All-SEC selection at Auburn

from 1999-2003. He was a key figure in leading the Tigers to two NCAA tournament appearances, most notably during his senior year in 2003, where he led 10th-seeded Auburn to a Sweet 16 appearance before losing to the eventual national champion Syracuse, 79-78. In that game, Daniels had game highs of 27 points and nine rebounds to bring Auburn back from a double-digit deficit to give the Tigers a chance to win.

In three NCAA Tournament games over St. Joseph's, No. 2 seed and ACC Champion Wake Forest and Syracuse, Daniels averaged 23 points, seven rebounds, three assists and 2.3 steals per game. For the season, he ranked second in the SEC in scoring with 18.4 points, fifth in field goal percentage with a .514 average, 10th in assists with 3.3 and led the league with 2.3 steals per game.

"It's a great honor to be named a legend in such a great conference," Daniels said. "I'm at a loss for words to be honored in such a manner."

He was also a part of Auburn's 2000 NCAA

Tournament team that reached the second round.

Daniels garnered several accolades during his senior campaign, as he was the SEC Player of the Year by the Birmingham News, the SEC's Most Valuable Player by CollegeInsider.com and All-SEC second team by the Associated Press and SEC Coaches.

He is ranked 10th all-time on Auburn's scoring list with 1,530 points and scored in double digits in all 35 games as a senior. He also is the programs all-time steals leader with 208.

After his career at Auburn, he went undrafted but signed with the Dallas Mavericks in 2003. Starting 15 games as a rookie, he averaged 8.5 points per game. The Mavericks then signed him to a multi-year deal, and over the course of the next two seasons, Daniels increased his production from 15 starts to 17 to 29 and boosted his scoring from 8.5 points per game to 9.1 to 10.2.

He played for the Indiana Pacers from 2006-09. In his last season with the team, he started 43 games, shot 72 percent from the free throw line, and had career-high averages with 13.6 points and 4.6 rebounds.

Daniels then played for the Boston Celtics from 2009-12 before finishing his career for the Milwaukee Bucks 2012, starting 33 games and contributing 5.5 points per game.

Reflecting back on his time at Auburn, Daniels could not pick only one memory that stood out.

"Auburn is a special place," he said. "The tradition of the school, going to the Sweet 16, becoming a graduate, spending time on planes with my teammates, the atmosphere of the games, Auburn helped me become the man I am today."

Daniels is one of 14 SEC Legends along with George Linn from Alabama, Oliver Miller from Arkansas, Tasmin Mitchell from LSU, Jason Harrison from Ole Miss, Dontae' Jones from Mississippi State, Acie Law IV from Texas A&M, Matt Bonner from Florida, Jimmy Pitts from Georgia, Keith Bogans from Kentucky, Jon Sundvold from Missouri, Bobby Cremins from South Carolina, Ron Slay from Tennessee and Barry Booker from Vanderbilt.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

» Missouri has lost six straight games since winning two of three, including an 89-78 loss to Auburn last Saturday. Auburn swept Missouri for the first time in history, also defeating the Tigers in a hard-fought 77-72 victory in Columbia on Jan. 10 as Mustapha Heron scored seven of Auburn's last 11 points to finish with 16 points and nine rebounds. Auburn scored 43 bench points.

Mizzou had two 3-point attempts in the final seconds to tie Ole Miss in an 80-77 loss in Oxford.

Missouri fell late to Kentucky 72-62 the game before as well as losing after leading for most of the game in a 57-54 loss to Alabama on Feb. 15.

Jordan Barnett, who had 20 points and six rebounds vs. Auburn on Jan. 10, averages a teamhigh 12.1 points and 5.8 rebounds while Kevin Puryear, who had 19 points and eight rebounds vs. Auburn on Saturday, adds 11.0 points and 6.0 rebounds.

Terrence Phillips chips in 10.5 points, ranks fourth in the SEC with 4.4 assists, 3.8 rebounds and shoots a team-best 34.8 percent from 3-point range.

In two games this year vs. Auburn, Barnett averages 16.0 points and 5.0 rebounds, Phillips averages 13.5 points and 5.5 assists while Jordan Geist averaged 11.5 points.

AUBURN-MISSOURI SERIES

>> This is the eighth meeting between both Tigers with Missouri holding a 4-3 series lead with all games Mizzou joined the SEC in 2012-13.

Auburn defeated Missouri 77-72 in Columbia on Jan. 10 and 89-78 in Auburn on March 4.

Auburn is 2-1 vs. Mizzou in Auburn Arena while Missouri is 3-1 vs. Auburn in Mizzou Arena.

BRUCE PEARL vs. MISSOURI

» Bruce Pearl is 3-3 against Missouri, winning in Columbia on Jan. 10 and in Auburn on March 4. Auburn lost in Columbia last year and split the 2014-15 season series.

Pearl lost to the Norm Stewart-coached Tigers

on Dec. 10, 1992, in his first season as a head coach when his Div. II Southern Indiana team lost 77-62 in the Hearnes Center.

Pearl is 3-2 coaching against Missouri head coach Kim Anderson.

.» Auburn has swept three teams this season in Alabama, LSU and Missouri for the first time since 2008-09 when the Tigers swept Alabama, Arkansas and LSU.

» Auburn has guaranteed its first winning season since going 24-12 in 2008-09. In fact, the Tigers have had only two winning seasons in the previous 13 seasons, both under coach Jeff Lebo. Auburn went 17-15 in 2006-07.

The Mableton, Ga., native averaged 17.5 points while shooting 52.6 percent from the floor and 70 percent on 7-of-10 3-pointers in Auburn's 82-77 win in Tuscaloosa and against Tennessee.

He totaled 14 points, including 11 in the second half, in the win over Alabama while making 2-of-3 treys and 4-of-6 free throws. He took a charge and on the next possession, connected on a four-point play to give Auburn a 64-52 lead with 8:33 left in the game.

Against Tennessee, Harper scored a gamehigh 21 points on 5-of-7 3-pointers.

Harper also won the award on Dec. 26 after leading the Tigers to a pair of huge wins in three days in Connecticut vs. Oklahoma and at UConn.

He had back-to-back career-highs while averaging 21.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals.

HOW DO YOU DO MR. WILEY?

» Austin Wiley, who has played all of 22 college games, is averaging 8.8 points, 4.9 rebounds and 1.4 blocks in 18.1 minutes.

The freshman from Hoover, Ala., scored a career-high 25 points, including 21 in the second half, at TCU on Jan. 28. He was 11-of-13 from the floor with five dunks and pulled down seven rebounds.

He recorded his first double-double in only his 11th game as he had 10 points and a career-best 11 rebounds at No. 23 South Carolina on Jan. 24.

He had 14 points, five rebounds and a block vs. Mississippi State on Feb. 7.

Wiley was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Jan. 23 after averaging 14.5 ppg and 7.5 rpg vs. Alabama and LSU.

Wiley notched 10 points, eight rebounds and four blocks at Georgia March 1.

>> Mustapha Heron scored a game-high 20 points only seven shots, T.J. Dunans totaled 16 points, five rebounds, a career-high four steals and three assists while Danjel Purifoy added 13 points to lead Auburn to a season sweep over Missouri 89-78 on Senior Day in Auburn Arena. The same two teams meet in the SEC Tournament first round on Wednesday at 8:30 pm CT in Nashville's Bridgestone Arena, the third time in history Auburn will play the same team back-to-back. Auburn played Alabama in the regular season finale and SEC Tournament first round in both 1983 and 1952. Auburn used an early 12-0 run to take a 16-8 lead and led 38-23 with 8:20 left in the first half with the Tigers making 17 of its first 22 shots from the floor. The lead grew to its largest at 50-30 on a Purifoy 3-pointer with 2:26 left in the half. Auburn led 54-40 at the half after shooting 68.9 percent from the floor and 5-of-12 from 3-point range. Missouri used a 10-1 run to close to within 67-60 with 13:11 remaining, but that is as close as the visiting Tigers would get. Auburn answered with eight straight points to lead 78-63 on a Jared Harper trey with 9:31 left and coasted from there. Auburn improved to 18-13 overall, 7-11 in the SEC, to win its second most games in 14 years and most since 2008-09. Auburn won its most league wins since that same season, marking the last time the Tigers swept as least three teams in a season. Auburn swept Alabama, LSU and Missouri this year. Auburn outshot Mizzou 56.1 percent to 34.4 percent from the floor and outrebounded the visitors 41-32. Mizzou went 13-of-38 (.342) from

3-point range while Auburn went 9-of-26 (.571). Auburn had nine blocks as Anfernee McLemore had eight points, six rebounds and four blocks while Austin Wiley added eight points, five rebounds and three blocks. Heron was economical as he went 6-of-7 from the floor, including making all three 3-point attempts and 5-of-6 free throws. Bryce Brown added eight points and three assists. Kevin Puryear led Mizzou with 19 points and eight rebounds while Terrence Phillips had 15 points, Jordan Geist 13 points and Jordan Barnett 12.

STARTING 4 FROSH IN A GAME • 15 TIMES

... Auburn has started four freshmen in a game 15 times this season, going 7-8.

The first time the Tigers started four freshmen - Danjel Purifoy, Mustapha Heron, Jared Harper and Austin Wiley - came in the win vs. Oklahoma on Dec. 21 and at UConn on Dec. 23.

It's the first time the Tigers have started four freshmen since nine times in the 2005-06 season.

Those four started five games through the Ole Miss game on Jan. 7 before Purifoy was hurt.

Prior to this season, the previous time came on Feb. 18, 2006, in a 65-61 loss to No. 25 LSU. Josh Dollard, Korvotney Barber, Rasheem Barrett and Quantez Robertson started that game in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum.

Another quartet of freshmen started Auburn's win at Missouri on Jan. 10 as Danjel Purifoy missed the game with a sprained ankle. Heron, Harper, Wiley and Anfernee McLemore, making his first collegiate start, were the four freshmen.

Purifoy, Wiley, Harper and Heron started in the win at Alabama to sweep the Tide and in the win vs. Mississippi State and each game since until Senior Day on March 4 vs. Missouri.

1st TIME FOR BP

>> This marked the first time in Coach Bruce Pearl's 22 years as a head coach that he started three freshmen, much less four freshmen.

In fact, it is the youngest team Pearl has coached in his 22 years as a head coach.

T.J. Dunans sank a buzzer-beating 3-pointer on an inbounds pass with 1.4 seconds to play in a 76-74 win over Mercer on Dec. 18.

Auburn defeated Oklahoma 74-70 in the Hall of Fame's Birthday of Basketball in Uncasville, Conn., on Dec. 21 and two days later, won at UConn 70-67 in overtime.

Auburn defeated LSU 78-74 on Jan. 18 in Auburn to surpass last season's win total with 12 wins.

Freshman Mustapha Heron is ranked ninth in the SEC in scoring at 15.2 ppg and is 18th in rebounding with 5.8 rpg while shooting 44.0 percent from the floor and 42.2 percent from 3-point range.

The Waterbury, Conn., native set the Auburn freshman record by scoring in double figures in his first 25 college games, and has now done it in 30 of 31 games (9 pts vs. #13 Florida).

» Austin Wiley was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Jan. 23 after averaging 14.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 1.0 block in 22.5 minutes to lead Auburn to a pair of wins over Alabama and LSU.

Wiley, who joined the Tigers on Dec. 16, totaled career-highs with 19 points, nine rebounds and 25 minutes in the win vs. Alabama on Jan. 20 in only his 10th collegiate game.

He scored 15 of his 19 points and had seven of his nine rebounds in the second half as the Tigers broke away from a 30-30 tie at halftime.

Wiley totaled 10 points, six rebounds and two blocks in Auburn's 78-74 win over LSU.

He then notched his first double-double in his 11th college game with 10 points and 11 rebounds at No. 23 South Carolina.

He is the son of former Auburn All-American Vickie Orr and Aubrey Wiley, the SEC's leading rebounder in 1993-94.

MAKING A POINT

Auburn graduate transfer point guard Ronnie Johnson has averaged 10.1 points and 3.1 assists off the bench in Auburn's last 17 games.

The Indianapolis, Ind., native averaged 2.4 points in the five games prior.

In fact, he had eight assists in back-to-back games vs. Mississippi State and at Ole Miss.

He had season-highs of 18 points on 4-of-6 3-pointers and eight assists at Ole Miss.

Scoring a team-high 17 points on 2-of-5 treys to go along with three rebounds, two assists and a steal in 20 minutes, Johnson led Auburn to a season sweep over LSU with a 98-75 win at Baton Rouge, Auburn's largest margin of victory at LSU in history.

The Mableton, Ga., native had back-to-back career-highs while averaging 21.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals. He totaled 21 points, including 16 in the second half, in Auburn's 74-70 win over Oklahoma, which made the Final Four last season, in the Basketball Hall of Fame's Birthday of Basketball in Uncasville, Conn.

Entering the game shooting 60.0 percent from the foul line, Harper made 11-of-12 free throws, including 7-of-8 in the final 2:02 to keep the Sooners at bay. He also had three rebounds, two steals and an assist.

In the 70-67 overtime win at four-time national champion UConn in Hartford on Dec. 23, Harper upped his career-high with 22 points as he stuffed the stat sheet with all career-highs of five rebounds, five assists and four steals.

His driving layup with 27 seconds remaining in overtime proved to be the game-winner while assisting on the game-tying 3-pointer by Danjel Purifoy with 1:04 left, after the Tigers erased the Huskies' 7-0 run in overtime.

Harper made 5-of-6 free throws vs. UConn and shot 16-of-18 (.889) from the foul line for the week.

BUZZER-BEATING & MVP DUNANS

» Senior T.J. Dunans sank a buzzer-beating 3-pointer from the left corner to give Auburn a 76-74 victory over Mercer on Dec. 18. Mercer had just taken a 74-73 lead with a conventional 3-point play with 3.8 seconds left.

The Tigers threw the ball to midcourt and called time out with 1.4 seconds to play to set up the heroics.

Consensus five-star Austin Wiley, who is ranked 13th nationally by Scout, 16th by Rivals and 17th by 247Sports, played on Team USA's gold medal winner at the U17 world championships in Spain this summer. He averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds as a junior last season for Spain Park, which reached the state Class 7A finals. He is the son of former Auburn players, All-American Vickie Orr, and Aubrey Wiley, who led the SEC in rebounding in 1993-94.

"This class is historic," said Bruce Pearl. "It started with Austin Wiley - about a year and a half ago - committing to us prior to his junior year. You might say that was a no brainer. His mom, Vickie, was an All-American. His dad, Aubrey, led the SEC in rebounding his senior year. Both of them are part of the Auburn Family, but Austin could've gone anywhere in the country. He had offers from everywhere, but he wanted to be an Auburn Man.

"More importantly, he wanted to start to lead even before he got here. He knew that his verbal commitment might attract others. All he's done between then and now is work so hard to build his body to represent our country in international basketball and wear that USA jersey. Now, he's going to come here and add to the history and legacy of his family."

It marks the second consecutive season a five-star has signed with Auburn as freshman Mustapha Heron was the first in Auburn history.

» Davion Mitchell, 6-1, 185, G Hinesville, Ga. (Liberty County) pronunciation: Day - ve -on

Davion Mitchell, who is ranked 33rd nationally by 247Sports, 41st by Scout and 55th by Rivals, led Liberty County to its first Georgia Class 4A state championship last season, defeating defending state champion Jonesboro, 58-52. He averaged 24.2 points, 7.1 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 2.9 steals per game as a junior, earning Savannah Morning News Boys Basketball Player of the Year honors. Mitchell shot 41 percent (103-of-250) from 3-point range.

Mitchell scored 23 points, 21 of them coming on seven 3-pointers, against Newton in the Holiday Hoopsgiving Tournament in Atlanta Nov. 25, 2016.

"Davion Mitchell is one of the most physical defenders anywhere in high school basketball," said Pearl. "There is not a better on-the-ball defender than Davion Mitchell. If I put you on him, you're not going to score that night, but he can also score. He can also make plays. He's a winner. He brought a state championship to his hometown. He's a terrific young man. We're going to have great point guard play because of Jared Harper and Davion Mitchell running that position."

Chuma Okeke, who is ranked 41st nationally by Scout, 55th by Rivals and 56th by 247Sports, totaled 35 points and 17 rebounds at the Cancer Research Classic on Jan. 11, 2017.

Okeke totaled 35 points and 24 rebounds in a 89-83 triple overtime loss to Newton in the state playoffs on Feb. 24.

He led Westlake to the Georgia Class 6A state championship for the first time since 2002 with a 68-58 overtime win over Pebblebrook in 2016. Westlake trailed by 10 points at the half. He averaged 22.7 points and 7.5 rebounds as a sophomore in 2014-15.

"Chuma had offers from Kansas and everybody in the SEC," said Pearl. "Chuma Okeke is a rare talent. He wins without necessarily always having to have the basketball in his hands. He loves the game. He loves to train. He loves to play. He's a nightmare matchup for people because he can shoot the ball from the perimeter. He can put it on the floor. He can score for himself. He reminds you of Danjel Purifoy, but he has little bit more size. He's creative like Danjel as well. He has a great future in professional basketball. We got to know his family so well."

Pearl is very excited about the future of Auburn Basketball.

"You want success for these young men be-

cause of getting to know all three of these phenomenal families," said Pearl. "I'm just grateful to those guys that they saw what we saw. They believed in what we believed. Together, we have a chance to make history at Auburn. We can make Auburn basketball relevant once again. We can make our lettermen and our former players proud to be able to see what we're doing right now. This is a very exciting day for Auburn basketball."

- Auburn tied an SEC record with 21 made 3-pointers in a 117-72 win over Coastal Carolina on Dec. 15, 2016. The 117 points tied for the fifth-most in school history. The 21 made treys tied Kentucky (1990) and Arkansas (1997).
- Auburn's 119 points scored vs. Northwestern State on Nov. 27, 2015, were the fourth most in school history, and Auburn's 72 points in the

second half were the third most in school history. Auburn's 17 made 3-pointers were one shy of the school record.

- In 21 full years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 15 times. In six years at Tennessee, he won the SEC East outright or tied for it three times and finished second once. In four years at Milwaukee, he was in the top two all four years (two first-place finishes). In nine years at Southern Indiana, he finished first four times and second three times.
- Led Tennessee to an average of 25.2 wins per season, an average year-end RPI of 8 and 6 straight NCAA Tournament appearances
- Reached the NCAA Tournament Elite 8 in 2010 and played in four Sweet 16s in 2005, 2007, 2008 and 2010
- Reached the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 or better in four of last nine years as a head coach
- In the 2015 SEC Tournament, Auburn won three games in three days for the first time in 30 years and reached the semifinals for the first time since 2009. The Tigers defeated Mississippi State and two postseason teams Texas A&M (NIT) and LSU (NCAA) before falling to undefeated Kentucky.
- Auburn defeated five NCAA Tournament teams last season: LSU (twice), Xavier, Georgia and Texas Southern
- It took Auburn just three games under Bruce Pearl to score 100 points in a 105-point output against Louisiana, a feat that hadn't been accomplished since 2003 vs. Grambling State, a span of 340 games.
- Pearl led Tennessee to its first-ever No. 1 national ranking after the Vols upset top-ranked Memphis at the FedExForum in February 2008
- On Nov. 17, 2009, Pearl was able to record victory number 100 at Tennessee, the second-fastest UT coach to reach the century mark, as his team defeated UNC-Asheville 124-49. The 124-point total was the most ever scored by Tennessee in a regular season game. Tennessee's 34 assists also set a school record and its 16 3-pointers tied another.
- On Jan. 10, 2010, Tennessee defeated the #1 ranked Kansas in Knoxville, 74–68. This was the first time that Tennessee defeated a #1 ranked team at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- On March 26, 2010, Tennessee advanced to its first Elite 8 in school history with a 76–73 defeat of Ohio State. On March 28, the Volunteers narrowly missed a trip to the Final Four, losing 70–69 to Michigan State in the Midwest Regional Final in St. Louis.
- Tennessee's 65 regular season SEC wins from 2006-07 to 2010-11 were the most in the SEC over that period.
- Tennessee under Coach Pearl won the 2008 SEC Championship with a 14-2 record and finished with the second-best record in the SEC in his first two years at Tennessee. It was Ten-

nessee's first outright SEC Championship in 41 years.

- At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 16 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg.
- Has coached a league's leading scorer 3 times: KT Harrell, Auburn, 18.5 ppg - 2015 Dylan Page, UWM, 20.9 ppg - 2004 Chris Lofton, UT, 20.8 ppg - 2007
- Tennessee won 37 straight home games under Coach Pearl, eclipsing the previous record of 33 from 1966-68.
- Tennessee was ranked in the top five nationally in attendance in each of Coach Pearl's six seasons in Knoxville.
- In 2005-06, Tennessee had the largest increase in attendance in the nation (5,504 per game) to rank fifth nationally with an average of 17.954
- Bruce Pearl has raised \$1 million in only four golf tournaments at Auburn.

Pearl and his wife, Brandy, have remarkably raised \$770,000 in the last three years benefitting Children's Harbor in Birmingham through the Bruce Pearl Fore the Children Golf Classic. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families.

Over \$200,000 was raised in the Bruce, Barkley & Basketball Golf Classic Oct. 23-24, 2016, benefitting the Auburn Basketball program.

 Pearl started AUTLIVE at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. AUTLIVE raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients.

He initiated the OUTLIVE program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease.

- Pearl donated \$250,000 to the Auburn University comprehensive campaign in September 2016, helping push it over the ambitious \$1 billion goal ahead of schedule.
- The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015. Pearl accepted a \$10,000 donation to an endowed scholarship in his name to Camp Koinonia, an outdoor education program for children with disabilities.
- The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain.

- Every Tennessee player who played under Coach Pearl for four years graduated
- Tennessee had 31 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections in Coach Pearl's six seasons. Nine members of the basketball team (more than half the squad) earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition in 2006-07.
- Pearl took over as head coach of UW-Milwaukee in 2001. In just four seasons, he compiled 86 wins (including a school-record 26 in 2005, and a new Horizon League record for winning percentage) and led Milwaukee to its first NCAA Tournament appearances in 2003 and 2005. Pearl led them to the Horizon League tournament title in both of those years. He also led the school to its first ever NIT bid, as well as its first-ever NCAA D-I postseason victory, in 2004. Milwaukee's 2005 NCAA Tournament run capped the best season in school history, as the Panthers won both the regular season and conference tournament titles, defeating the Detroit Titans in the championship game. Using an intense full-court press, the Panthers scored two upsets in three days over Alabama and Boston College en route to the Sweet Sixteen. The Panthers finished their season 26-6 and were ranked in the coaches' poll at the end of the season for the first time ever (# 23). Pearl left UWM after the 2005 season, his fourth, as the Horizon League's leader in all-time winning percentage (51–13, 79.7%).
- In 1992, Pearl got his first head-coaching job, at the University of Southern Indiana. He inherited a Screaming Eagles team that had won just 10 games in the previous season. Pearl posted a 22–7 record in his first season, and led the Eagles to nine straight NCAA D-II tournaments in addition to winning four Great Lakes Valley Conference titles.
- In 1994, USI finished with a 28–4 record en route to a loss in the D-II championship game; in 1995, the Eagles won 29 games and claimed the D-II championship. A team from the GLVC played for the National Championship every year after his first season at USI. Pearl was named the NABC Division II coach of the year after his national championship. He left USI with a 231–46 record over nine years.
- Coach Pearl was the 2009 recipient of the prestigious Knoxville Award, which recognizes individual contribution to the community through encouragement of volunteerism, philanthropy and community involvement.
- Coach Pearl was actively involved in Camp Koinonia, an outdoor education program for children ages 7-22 who have multiple disabilities. Pearl created the Bruce Pearl "Fore the Kids" Golf Tournament to benefit the camp.
- Named the 2008 "Knoxvillian of the Year" by the Knoxville Metro Pulse

Bryce Brown scored a game-high 19 points on 5-of-10 3-pointers to lead Auburn to an 83-66 win over back-to-back Atlantic Sun Conference Champion North Florida in the season opener for both teams in Auburn Arena. The Tigers made 10 first half treys, the third most in school history in a half, en route to going 13-of-32 from behind the arc for the game. A trio of freshmen in Danjel Purifoy added 14 points, Jared Harper 10 points and four steals and Mustapha Heron 10 points. TJ Lang came off the bench to score nine points, making his first three 3s, all in the first half. Auburn, which led 49-30 at the half, pushed its lead to as much as 61-31 with 15:46 remaining. North Florida trimmed the 30-point deficit to 75-61 with 4:08 left but couldn't get any closer. The Tigers led early until the Ospreys' 6-foot-11, 252-pound center Romelo Banks, who finished with 16 points and 10 rebounds, tied it at 19 with 10:35 left in the half. Auburn answered with a 14-2 run extending to a 30-11 run to end the half. Auburn's defense held reigning A-Sun Conference Player of the Year Dallas Moore to five points on 1-of-13 shooting and first-team All-ASun Chris Davenport to five points and six turnovers. The Tigers forced 28 turnovers. Auburn outshot North Florida 41.7 percent to 38.6 percent from the floor, but was outrebounded 42-36. The Tigers, who won their sixth-straight season opener, started three freshmen in Purifoy, Harper and Heron for the first time in 12 seasons along with a pair of sophomores. Pearl is now 21-1 in seasons openers and started a trio of freshmen for the first time in his 22-year career.

Neither foul trouble nor Georgia State could stop Danjel Purifoy from his appointed rounds of winning one for a teammate. Purifoy played 3 first half minutes because of 2 fouls, caught fire down the stretch and scored 19 points, 17 in the second half, to help Auburn beat Georgia State 83-65. He and Jared Harper each finished with 19 points to lead a balanced Auburn offense. Ten Tigers scored. It's the first time Auburn has been 2-0 since the 2011-12 season. All the fancy 3-point shooting Auburn used to win its season-opener took a backseat to good, old-fashioned balanced scoring in the second game of the season. Auburn made seven 3s and went inside for five dunks. Horace Spencer added 12 points and Mustapha Heron scored 10 and had a team-best eight rebounds. Auburn started slowly, trailing Georgia State until Bryce Brown hit a 3-pointer with 11:13 left in the first half for an 18-15 lead. The Tigers used balanced scoring -- nine Tigers scored in the first 16 minutes -- but Georgia State didn't go away. It was Auburn 35, Georgia State 30 at halftime. The Tigers stretched it to 47-37 with 14:29 left in the second half as Auburn got hot and Georgia State ran head first into foul trouble. It was a different kind of game than the opener, when Auburn led North Florida by 30 after 25 minutes on the way to 13 3-pointers. The Tigers didn't rely as heavily on the 3, but still separated themselves from Georgia State in the second half.

Mustapha Heron was perfect from the floor, and was pretty darn good most everywhere else. The Auburn freshman guard hit all eight of his shots from the floor and had a game-high 24 points and 10 rebounds to help the Tigers stop pesky Eastern Kentucky 85-64 in Auburn Arena. It wasn't all easy. Eastern Kentucky led most of the first half before Auburn took a 37-34 halftime lead. Auburn led 52-50, then the Tigers got hot. Heron didn't do it alone. Fellow freshman Danjel Purifoy scored 16 points and had eight rebounds, and graduate transfer Ronnie Johnson added 13 points while scoring the 1,000th point of his career. The Tigers improved to 3-0 for the second time in the last 10 years before heading off to Mexico for the Cancun Classic next week. Eastern Kentucky shot 32.8 percent, and only 28.9 percent in the second half. Auburn outrebounded the Colonels 51-31. Auburn hit five of seven shots during a second-half run to finally get some breathing room, at 55-48 with 11:09 remaining. The first half was anything but that. Auburn started slowing, hitting only two of its first 14 shots. Eastern Kentucky led 17-12 with 11:21 left in the first half. The Tigers were shooting a cool 26 percent overall, and 13 percent from 3-point line, when Eastern Kentucky led 22-19. But Auburn went on a 9-0 run to take a 37-32 lead. Eastern hit a shot at the halftime buzzer to make it 37-34. Purifoy was already hot by then with 13 points and six rebounds in the first half. The Colonels countered 16 3-point attempts, and 13 2-point attempts, in the first half.

Mustapha Heron scored 15 points, Danjel Purifoy had 11 points, 6 rebounds and 5 assists and Jared Harper 10 points as Auburn remained undefeated with a 67-65 win over Texas Tech in the Cancun Challenge semifinals in the Hard Rock Hotel Riviera Maya. LaRon Smith's block of Aaron Ross' drive in the lane saved it for Auburn as the ball was batted out and Zach Smith's desperation half court 3 missed wide right of the backboard. The Tigers are 4-0 for the first time since 2011-12 and for the second time in 10 years while Heron and Purifoy are the first Auburn freshmen to score in double digits in their first four college games since Scott Pohlman did it in 1997-98. Auburn used a 19-4 run to lead by as much as 42-23 with 15:53 remaining as it held Texas Tech without a field goal for 12:42. The Red Raiders then began to chip away at the Tiger lead. Ronnie Johnson hit a big 3-pointer to put an end to a 12-1 Texas Tech run that cut Auburn's lead to 53-45 with 7:52 to go. The Red Raiders cut it to four with 1:51 to play, but T.J. Dunans' steal and layup put Auburn ahead 65-59 with 1:18 left, but Tech quickly answered with a bucket. The Red Raiders trimmed it to two with 32 seconds left and after Harper split a pair of foul shots, Devon Thomas' layup closed the Auburn lead to 66-65 with :17 on the clock. Harper split another pair of foul shots to set up Smith's game-saving block. Auburn jumped out to 10-3 lead and then the Tigers had a stretch where its next five buckets were 3s en route to taking a 29-19 lead. Auburn pushed it to lead 34-19 with 4:52 to go in the half on the strength of an 11-0 run.

#17 Purdue 96, Auburn 71 November 23, 2016 Cancun Challenge Championship

No. 17 Purdue made 17-of-26 3s and shot 64 percent from the floor en route to a 96-71 victory over Auburn in the Cancun Challenge championship game. It was Auburn's first tournament final since winning the 2002 San Juan Shootout. Danjel Purifoy led the Tigers with 22 points and Mustapha Heron added 15 as both freshmen were named to the Cancun Challenge all-tournament team. Purifoy averaged 16.5 points and Heron 15.0 ppg. Purdue shot a torrid 76 percent from the floor and 75 percent (9-of-12) from 3 in the second half as the Boilermakers pulled away. Purifoy's 3 gave the Tigers a 44-43 lead less than a minute into the second half, but it was all Purdue after that. The Boilermakers went on a 35-10 run over the next 12 plus minutes to take a 78-54 lead with 6:45 to go. The Tigers forced 21 Boilermaker turnovers. After falling behind 40-29, Auburn closed the half on a 12-0 spurt before the Boilermakers' Carsen Edwards sank a 3 at the buzzer to give Purdue a 43-41 lead at intermission, the 12th lead change of the game. T.J. Dunans added 10 points for the Tigers while the Boilermakers placed six players in double figures, led by Carsen Edwards' 21 points on 4-of-5 treys off the bench. Vincent Edwards and P.J. Thompson added 15 points on 3 treys apiece. Caleb Swanigan had a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds to go along with Isaac Haas' 10 points and 10 rebounds. Heron and Purifoy are the first Auburn freshmen to score in double digits in their first five college games since All-American Wesley Person did it in his first 14 games in 1990-91.

Ria'n Holland led Mercer with 24 as the Bears fell to 5-6. Wiley made his debut with 12:55 left in the first half. He promptly got in the box score when he was fouled and hit a free throw.

Auburn's trip to Connecticut was full of holiday cheer. Yante Maten and J.J. Frazier combined for 58 points to lead Georgia to a come-from-behind 96-84 win over Auburn in the SEC opener for both teams in sold out Auburn Arena. The Tigers led by as much as 13 points in the first half and led 66-54 just over five minutes into the second half. The Bulldogs scored 10 straight points to get back into the game and tied it for the first of three times at 70 with 10:11 to go. Georgia had a game-deciding 12-0 spurt to take control at 86-76 with 3:49 left to complete a 32-10 run. The Bulldogs, who shot 59 percent in the second half, outscored the Tigers 53-33 in the period. Both teams came out sizzling in the first half. Auburn jumped out to a 20-9 lead just over five minutes in and pushed it to as much as 33-20 on an Austin Wiley tip-in with 9:29 left in the half. Auburn beat LSU 78-74 giving coach Bruce Pearl career win No. 500. While Auburn's players put on orange "500 wins" t-shirts at midcourt, Pearl walked into the stands to hug his family. Auburn had seven dunks, including one from Horace Spencer in the final minute to seal the win. Auburn got balanced scoring - five players in double figures. Mustapha Heron and TJ Dunans led Auburn with 12 points each. Austin Wiley and Spencer added 10 apiece. Anfernee McLemore scored a career-high 11 points, making all four of his field goals. Aaron Epps led LSU with 15 points and 13 rebounds. Pearl's decision to go big - starting the 6-8 Spencer alongside 6-11 Austin Wiley - to counteract LSU's pair of 6-10 starters paid off with 44 points in the paint to LSU's 42. Ronnie Johnson's layup and free throw gave Auburn an 8-point cushion, 73-65 with 2:08 remaining before LSU threatened yet again. Auburn made 19 of 22 free throws, a significant improvement over recent outings. Pearl spread the minutes evenly among his nine-player rotation, with no one playing more than Dunans' 28 minutes. Wiley's dunk gave Auburn a 10-point lead early in the second half at 44-34. TJ Dunans' steal and slam made it a 12-point lead moments later. Back-to-back 3's by Bryce Brown gave Auburn a 15-point cushion, 57-42. LSU used a 9-0 run to pull within 2, but Dunans scored to preserve Auburn's lead. Auburn used a 15-0 run late in the first half to take a 35-32 halftime lead. Mustapha Heron hit Auburn's first 3-pointer but the Tigers made only one more 3 in the half, shooting 2-for-13. Heron scored 11 in the first half. His layup gave Auburn a 29-28 lead. Heron has reached double figures in each of Auburn's 18 games, a freshman record. Auburn outscored Alabama 33-12 over the final nine minutes as the Tigers trounced the Crimson Tide 84-64 behind freshman Austin Wiley's career-highs of 19 points and nine rebounds in raucous and sold out Auburn Arena. The Tigers and freshmen Mustapha Heron then caught fire. Auburn made 5-of-6 3-pointers, and Heron, who had one point through the game's first 29 minutes, scored 13 of the Tigers' next 21 points to stretch the lead to 72-59 on his third trey with 3:20 left. Heron finished with 15 points to continue his freshman record of 19 consecutive double figure games to start a career. Ronnie Johnson, who had a season-high 17 points off the bench, scored seven of Auburn's next 10 points to give the Tigers a 76-62 lead with 1:37 left. Alabama, which ranked second in the SEC allowing 62.2 points per game and had a +10.3 rebound margin in SEC play, was outscored by Auburn 54-34 in the second half alone. Each team had 34 rebounds. The Crimson Tide did not trail the entire first half and jumped out to a 10-3 lead. The Tigers tied it at 18 and tied it for the fourth time at 30-30 at halftime. Horace Spencer gave Auburn its first lead of the game with the first basket of the second half as the Tigers increased it to 42-36 with a pair of Wiley free throws with 14:16 remaining. Auburn won for the third time in the last four games to improve to 13-6 overall, 3-4 in the SEC as it was the largest margin of victory over Alabama since an 81-57 victory on Jan. 23, 2007.

Freshman Austin Wiley scored 21 of his career-high 25 points in the second half to lead Auburn to an 88-80 win at TCU in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge in Schollmaier Arena. The Tigers used a commanding 25-2 run midway through the second half to take an 80-59 lead with 5:19 remaining as the offense and defense were clicking. Wiley scored nine straight points for the Tigers and 11 of their first 15 to open the second period. Freshman Mustapha Heron scored 15 of his 17 points in the first half while Jared Harper added 13 points and four assists in only 19 minutes with early foul trouble. Auburn made 15 three-pointers and placed five players in double figures as the Tigers defeated Alabama 82-77 and sweep the Tide for the first time since 2009 in Coleman Coliseum. It was the fifth road win of the season, tying for most in the SEC. Ronnie Johnson scored 15 points, including 12 in the first half, while Danjel Purifoy and Jared Harper scored 14 apiece. Eleven of Harper's points came in the second half. Mustapha Heron scored 13 points, making all six free throw attempts, including four in the final 48 seconds. Bryce Brown scored 12 points on 4-of-5 3-pointers while dishing out three assists. Auburn, which went 15-of-27 (.556) from behind the arc, set a SEC season-high for made treys while being the second most made this season. The Tigers used a 26-12 run with seven 3-pointers, including three by Purifoy and one each from Brown, Johnson, Lang and Harper, for its largest lead at 69-54 lead with 7:41 left. Auburn led 78-66 with 1:52 left before turnovers and missed free throws allowed Alabama to score 10 straight points in 1:12 to close to within 78-74 with a minute left. Johnson scored eight straight Auburn points followed by a T.J. Dunans steal and layup to give the Tigers a 23-16 lead. Brown's third 3-pointer of the half gave Auburn its biggest lead at 36-25 with 6:06 left in the half. The Tide answered with an 8-0 run, but the Tigers held a 41-39 lead at the half after shooting 55 percent from the floor while making 7-of-13 3-pointers. Johnson led Auburn with 12 points at the half while Brown made 3-of-4 treys for nine points, the most in seven games. Purifoy, who scored his most points in six games, hit two-straight 3s followed by another Johnson trey for a 54-48 Auburn lead with 11:32 remaining. Bryce hit another 3 for 57-49 lead 10:36 left. The Tigers outshot the Tide 51 percent to 43 percent while holding Alabama to only 38 percent shooting in the second half. Alabama outrebounded Auburn 47-28 and had a 19-5 advantage in second chance points. Braxton Key and Corbin Collins led Alabama with 17 points each while Dazon Ingram had 16 points.

Auburn 98, Mississippi State 92 February 7, 2017 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.

Auburn scored its most points in an SEC game since 1999 in a 98-92 victory over Mississippi State in Auburn Arena. Bryce Brown scored 18 points on 4-of-5 3-pointers and Mustapha Heron scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half to lead the Tigers. Auburn made 8-of-15 first half 3s, going on a 12-0 run to break open a tight game for a 38-21 lead with 4:15 left. The Tigers pushed it to 48-20 at the half before taking its largest lead at 61-40 with 15:40 remaining. Mississippi State scored 64 second half points with 8-of-13 shooting from 3-point range. Auburn scored 50 of its own to keep the Bulldogs at bay. The game didn't dip below double digits until a pair of Lamar Peters free throws made it 85-76 with 2:25 remaining. Nineteen total fouls were called from that point on. The closest State could get was 91-86 with 51 seconds remaining on another two Peters foul shots. Austin Wiley added 14 points, five rebounds and a block in 19 minutes while T.J. Dunans had 11 points, six rebounds, three assists and a block. Heron also had six rebounds, four assists and two steals. Brown has averaged 15.0 points while making 8-of-10 treys in Auburn's last two games after averaging 3.0 points going 1-of-11 from behind the arc in the two games prior. Auburn had a SEC season-high 22 assists while outshooting Mississippi State 51.6 percent to 45.8 percent. The Bulldogs went 11-of-23 (.478) from behind the arc to the Tigers' 9-of-22 (.409). Both teams combined for 51 fouls and 71 foul shots as Auburn went 25-of-38 (.658) from the foul line and State 27-of-34 (.794). It was the most points Auburn scored in an SEC game since a 102-61 victory over Alabama on Feb. 13, 1999, en route to the SEC Championship. Quinndary Weatherspoon led State with a game-high 25 points and nine rebounds while Peters had 23 points and seven assists.

Ronnie Johnson scored 17 points while Danjel Purifoy and Bryce Brown had 15 points each to lead Auburn to a 98-75 win at LSU in the Maravich Assembly Center to ensure Auburn's first winning season since 2009. It is Auburn's largest margin of victory in Baton Rouge in history, eclipsing the previous mark of 18 in 1958, and it is the second most points the Tigers have ever scored in Louisiana's state capital, just shy of the 102 scored in 1976. It was the Tigers' sixth road win of the year, tied for second most in the SEC with No. 19 South Carolina, two behind No. 13 Florida. Back-to-back Bryce Brown 3s, the second after an Anfernee McLemore block, capped a 10-0 run as Auburn pushed ahead 57-47 with 15:34 remaining. Brown was 5-of-8 from 3-point range. LSU cut the lead to six, but Auburn used a 16-7 run to break the game open at 73-58 with 8:32 to play. Auburn led by as much as 95-69 with 1:26 left. T.J. Dunans added 11 points, a career-high tying seven rebounds, three assists and two steals while Mustapha Heron added 10 points and nine rebounds. Austin Wiley and Anfernee McLemore scored nine points each. Auburn finished with a 43-19 edge in bench points and never trailed after taking an 8-7 lead. Auburn shot 51.6 percent from the floor and 45.2 percent from 3-point range for the game, including 60 percent in the second half and 61.5 percent (8of-13) from behind the arc. The Tigers held LSU to 34.5 shooting in the second half and forced 10 turnovers. LSU finished shooting 40.7 percent for the game and Auburn had a 39-30 rebound advantage. Auburn used a 13-2 run, including 10 straight points, to take a 23-11 lead on back-to-back Johnson baskets with 11:13 left. Eight Tigers scored the first 25 points of the game for Auburn. LSU answered with eight straight points with an 11-2 run to trail 25-22. Antonio Blakeney scored a game-high 29 points to lead LSU.
