TALKING POINTS

AT A GLANCE

For the first time since the 2011 BCS National Championship game and just the second ever, Oregon will take on Auburn in the AdvoCare Classic at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, The Ducks closed head coach MARIO CRISTOBAL'S first season on a three-game win streak, highlighted by a Redbox Bowl victory over Michigan State. Oregon is one of eight Power 5 teams (Clemson, Florida, Iowa, Kentucky, Ohio State, Stanford, TCU) that will start 2019 on a three-game win streak or better.

SEASON OPENERS

Oregon has won seven consecutive season openers, but will open away from Autzen Stadium for the first time since 2011 when it took on LSU at AT&T Stadium. The Ducks are 88-31-4 all-time in season openers and their last loss in an opener came against LSU in 2011. Oregon has opened its season against a current Power 5 team 44 times (20-23-1) in program history and has won 12 of its last 15 of those contests.

BACK IN THE TOP 25

For the 11th time in the last 12 years, Oregon opens the season ranked in the Associated Press Top 25. The Ducks came in at No. 11 in the AP preseason poll and are 12-2 all-time in season openers as a ranked team.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

One of just nine FBS teams with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver a year ago, Oregon welcomes back two-thirds of that trio. QB JUSTIN HERBERT became the fifth player in program history to throw for 3,000 yards (3,151), while RB CJ VERDELL was just the third freshman in program history to hit the 1,000-yard plateau (1,018) on the ground. The Ducks are one of four FBS teams (Clemson, Liberty, Memphis) that return a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher. It is the second time in program history Oregon has returned a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000yard rusher (2014 - Marcus Mariota & Byron Marshall).

DID YOU KNOW?



In 2018, CJ VERDELL was the only Power 5 player in the nation with 1,000 yards rushing and 300 yards receiving.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Senior LB Troy Dye leads all active Power 5 players with 313 career tackles and has 17 games with 10+ tackles.

Oregon has a combined 153 career starts along the offensive line, which is the most in the nation.

Oregon is averaging 38.3 points per game over QB Justin Herbert's 28 career starts.



Calvin Throckmorton has allowed just one sack over his last 2,289 offensive snaps, including 1,105 in pass protection. Over that span, Throckmorton has started at four different positions.

Oregon has a combined **153 starts** from seven different players on the offensive line heading into the season opener. The trio of Hanson, Lemieux and Throckmorton make up 113 of those starts.

Juniors Shane Lemieux and Calvin Throckmorton have made 38 consecutive starts on the offensive line, which is tied for the fifthlongest streak among current FBS players.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

INSTANT IMPACT

A year ago, **PENEI SEWELL** became the first Oregon true freshman to start on the offensive line in a season opener since **LEE GUNDY** did so in 1997 against Arizona. Sewell was also the first Oregon freshman offensive lineman to start since TYRELL CROSBY made his first start against Wyoming in 2014. Sewell was also the first true freshman offensive lineman in Oregon history to earn all-conference honors (Coaches - Honorable Mention).

MR. VERSATILITY

Over his career, CALVIN THROCKMORTON has started 29 games at right tackle, five contests at left tackle, three at right guard, and one at center. He was the only FBS player to start at four (LT, C, RG, RT) of the five positions along the offensive line in 2018. Throckmorton played three different positions in two games last season - vs. UCLA (LT, C, RG) and at Utah (LT, C, RG).

BATTLE TESTED

Led by a group of five seniors, the Oregon offensive line has an FBS-best 153 combined starts entering the 2019 season. Seven different players make up the total, while SHANE LEMIEUX and CALVIN THROCKMORTON are two of 10 FBS offensive linemen that have started 30 or more consecutive games.

In 2018, CJ VERDELL joined LaMichael James (2009) and Royce Freeman (2014) as the only freshmen in Oregon history with 1,000 yards <u>rushing</u> in a season.

RUNNING BACK NOTES

ONE AND ONLY

As a freshman in 2018, RB CJ VERDELL was the only Power 5 player in the country and one of just two FBS players (Darwin Thompson - Utah State) with over 1,000 yards rushing and 300 yards receiving on the season. Verdell was just the third Duck in program history with 1,000 yards rushing and 300 yards receiving in a single season, joining TERRENCE WHITEHEAD (2004) and ROYCE FREEMAN (2015). Since 2000, just 20 players in the Pac-12 have gone for 1,000 yards rushing and 300 yards receiving in a season.

RUNNIN' WILD IN THE CIVIL WAR

During Oregon's dominating 55-15 win over Oregon State to close the regular season in 2018, running backs TRAVIS DYE and CJ VERDELL put together the top two rushing performances by a freshman in program history. Dye's 199 yards on 33 carries are the most by a freshman in school history, while Verdell was close behind with 187 yards on 23 carries. Both bested LAMICHAEL JAMES' freshman record of 183 yards on 24 carries against USC on Oct. 31, 2009.

» Verdell also added five TDs in the Civil War, becoming the first FBS player since 2016 with four rushing TDs and one receiving TD in a game. He was the first Pac-12 player to accomplish the feat in a league game since 2011.

DYNAMIC DUO

One of just 10 Power 5 running back duos with over 700 rushing yards each last season, sophomores TRAVIS DYE and CJ VERDELL combined for over 2,000 yards from scrimmage in 2018. The two backs combined for nine 100-yard games last season with Oregon going 5-1 in the contests that one of the two accomplished the feat.

TEAM & OFFENSIVE NOTES

BACK ON COLLEGE GAMEDAY

For the third time in its last 10 games dating back to last season, Oregon will be one of the featured teams on ESPN's College GameDay. It marks the 25th time (14-10) in program history that the Ducks have been featured on College GameDay.

TAKING IT TO ANOTHER LEVEL

Head coach MARIO CRISTOBAL has taken Oregon's recruiting efforts to a different level since being named the head coach in December of 2017.

OVERALL

- » Only Pac-12 program to have a top 2 class in the league each of the last two years, according to 247Sports composite.
- » First time ever that Oregon has finished in the top 2 in the Pac-12 recruiting rankings (247Sports) two consecutive years.
- » Over the last two classes, the Ducks signed the No. 1 ranked player in six different states (seven total).
- » The total of 21 ESPN300 signees over the last two years is the same total that Oregon signed over the previous five years (2013-17) combined.

2019 CLASS

- » The 2019 class finished No. 6 in the country by ESPN and No. 7 by both 247Sports and Rivals, all the best in program history.
- » The class rated as the top class in the Pac-12 Conference, the first time ever that Oregon claimed the top spot in the Pac-12.
- » In addition to signing Kayvon Thibodeaux, the top-ranked player in the 2019 class by ESPN, Oregon signed Malaesala Aumavae-Laulu, the top-ranked JC player by JCGridiron.com the same year.
- » Signed 12 players from the state of California.
- » Signed the top DE (Kayvon Thibodeaux), CB (Mykael Wright), ILB (Mase Funa), OL (Jonah Tauanu'u) and All-Purpose Back (Sean Dollars) in California.
- » Signed six of the top 21 players in California, according to 247Sports.

2018 CLASS

- » His 2018 class ranked 13th by both 247Sports and Rivals despite Cristobal becoming the head coach just weeks before the initial signing period.
- » The 11 ESPN300 signees by coach Cristobal were the most amongst new head coaches.
- » One of five teams (Georgia, Ohio State, Penn State & Texas) with three offensive linemen in the ESPN300.
- » Added the top player in four different states.
- » Signed 11 players from the state of California.

POINT OF EMPHASIS

A point of emphasis prior to his first season by head coach **MARIO CRISTOBAL**, Oregon had the fewest number of penalties in the Pac-12 in 2018 after ranking dead last in all four penalty categories in 2017.

BALL HAWKS

One of two FBS teams (lowa) that had four players with three or more interceptions in 2018, Oregon's returns three players from that quartet in THOMAS GRAHAM JR., JEVON HOLLAND and **DEOMMODORE LENOIR**. The Ducks are joined by fellow Pac-12 member Cal as the only two teams in the country that return three players that had three or more INTs last season.

2018 Notables

- » Only FBS team to have four different players come away with two interceptions in a game. » First Power 5 team since Michigan State in 2013 to have four different players come away with two interceptions in a game during the same season.

Oregon will open with four members of its highest-ranked recruiting class in school history in the two-deep on the defensive side of the ball.

- » KAYVON THIBODEAUX, the top-ranked recruit in school history, enters the season second on the depth chart as co-starter at defensive end.
- » MASE FUNA, the top-ranked linebacker recruit in school history, holds the backup role at STUD. » A pair of true freshmen are on the two-deep at cornerback. MYKAEL WRIGHT, the highest-rated defensive back recruit in school history, is the backup behind junior THOMAS GRAHAM JR.
- » DJ JAMES, a three-star recruit from Alabama, is the backup behind junior DEOMMODORE LENOIR.

DEFENSE DOES IT AGAIN

Since the start of the 2017 season, only Utah State (11) has more defensive touchdowns than Oregon. The Ducks' eight defensive TDs the last two seasons are tied with California for the most by a Power 5 team. Oregon's defense has also fueled its offense, as the Ducks rank 10th nationally with an average of 7.35 points off turnovers per game since the start of the 2017 season.





Mario Cristobal was named the University of Oregon's 34th head football coach on Dec. 8, 2017.

Cristobal, who possesses over 20 years of coaching experience along with an extensive track record of success as one of the nation's best offensive line coaches and an elite recruiter, was named the Ducks' head coach after spending the 2017 season as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator and offensive line coach.

Since taking over as head coach, Cristobal has captivated the passionate Duck fan base with the culture he is creating and the standards he has set for the program. His vision to restore Oregon as one of the nation's elite programs is backed by two consecutive top 15 recruiting classes and a relentless commitment to excellence in every phase of the program.

In Cristobal's first season as head coach, Oregon's focus on culture and development helped play a big part in the first three-game win streak to close a season since 2011, highlighted by the Redbox Bowl victory over Michigan State. The Ducks' 5-1 start featured back-to-back ranked wins at California and against Washington, as the 9-4 campaign marked the third-most victories by a first-year head coach at Oregon.

One of four FBS first-year head coaches to win a bowl game in 2018. Cristobal's vision of an offense that prides itself on a balance of power and speed helped Oregon finish the season as one of nine FBS teams with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver. Oregon ranked 17th nationally in scoring offense (37.2 ppg) during the regular season and displayed the grit Cristobal is instilling with its 7-6 win over Michigan State to close the season. It marked the fewest points given up by Oregon in a bowl game since the 1917 Rose Bowl.

Cristobal's emphasis on player development yielded 11 Pac-12 All-Conference selections and three All-Americans along the offensive line in Shane Lemieux, Calvin Throckmorton and Penei Sewell. Senior defensive back Ugochukwu Amadi became the first player in program history to win the Lombardi Award, which is given to the top FBS player regardless of position. Amadi was one of four Ducks selected in the 2019 NFL Draft.

A renowned recruiter, Cristobal led Oregon's relentless effort to sign the nation's No. 13 class in 2018 according to 247Sports, just under two months after being named the head coach. A year later, Cristobal and his staff landed the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 6 by ESPN, marking the first time Oregon has ever had the top class in the Pac-12. Oregon is the only Pac-12 program to finish with a top two class in the league each year and has added the top player from seven different states over that span.

In his first year at Oregon as co-offensive coordinator, the run-game was a major factor in the up-tempo Duck offense that tied for the Pac-12 lead with seven 40-point performances. The Ducks scored 40 rushing touchdowns during Cristobal's first season, the most since 2014. Royce Freeman ranked 11th nationally with 1,475 yards and tied for 12th with 16 rushing touchdowns. The Ducks finished the regular season with more than 3,000 yards on the ground, averaging 268 yards rushing per game. The Ducks' rushing offense ranked eighth in the FBS at the end of the regular season.

Cristobal's streak with an offensive lineman selected in the NFL Draft extended to five consecutive years when senior left tackle Tyrell Crosby was taken by the Detroit Lions in the 2018 NFL Draft, while Freeman was taken in the third round by the Denver Broncos. Under Cristobal, Crosby allowed only three quarterback hurries and no sacks on his way to being named an Outland Trophy candidate and the recipient of the Morris Trophy as the top offensive lineman in the Pac-12.

Cristobal came to Oregon with a reputation as one of the nation's top recruiters. He was named the National Recruiter of the Year by 247Sports in the 2015 cycle, and was ranked as the nation's No. 2 recruiter in the country by 247Sports at the time of his hiring based on the final haul he brought to Alabama. His 2015 class included 2018 NFL first-round picks Minkah Fitzpatrick (Miami Dolphins), Daron Payne (Washington Redskins) and Calvin Ridley (Atlanta Falcons).

Prior to arriving in Eugene, Cristobal spent four seasons (2013-16) at Alabama as the assistant head coach, offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator, helping the Crimson Tide to the CFP National Championship following the 2015 season, as well as a runner-up finish after the 2016 season.

Cristobal's offensive lines at Alabama produced a plethora of standout players and NFL draft picks. Over Cristobal's four seasons, five Alabama offensive lineman were selected in the NFL Draft, good for a tie for the second-most from one program over that span. Included were three in the top two rounds, including 2016 first-round selection Ryan Kelly (Indianapolis Colts).

In each of his four seasons, a different offensive lineman earned first-team All-America honors, while Kelly won the Rimington Trophy as the nation's top center and was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2015. The following year, Cam Robinson claimed the Outland Trophy. Both Kelly and Robinson won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the SEC's top offensive lineman.

In 2015, Cristobal's offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award as the Most Outstanding Offensive Line Unit in college football. The physically-dominating group helped Derrick Henry break Herschel Walker's SEC single-season rushing record en route to winning the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Award and the Doak Walker Award.

Alabama's offense ranked in the top 25 nationally in time of possession three times and in rushing offense twice from 2013-16. The Crimson Tide also had the SEC Player of the Year three times over that span in Amari Cooper (2014), Henry (2015) and Jalen Hurts (2016).

Prior to joining Nick Saban's staff at Alabama, Cristobal spent six seasons (2007-12) as the head coach at Florida International (FIU), solidifying his standing as one of the country's top young college football coaches and recruiters after taking over a program under heavy NCAA sanctions and coming off a winless season. Cristobal led the Panthers to the most successful year in school history in 2011, capturing a program-record eight wins, including a road win at eventual co-Big East Champion Louisville.

Cristobal was named the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year in 2010 after leading FIU to its first Sun Belt Conference championship and a bowl victory over MAC champion Toledo, and he finished his FIU career having produced NFL talents such as T.Y. Hilton and Jonathan Cyprien.

Cristobal coached at Miami (Fla.), his alma mater, under Larry Coker for three years before accepting the head job at FIU. As the tight ends coach for the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he helped develop multiple players into NFL draft picks, including firstround pick and All-Pro Greg Olsen. In 2006, Cristobal took over a Miami offensive line that featured four new starters and saw a 39 percent decrease in sacks allowed from the previous season (36 to 22).

Cristobal spent three years (2001-03) at Rutgers under head coach Greg Schiano, working with the offensive tackles and tight ends for the first two seasons before shifting his focus solely to the offensive line in 2003. Cristobal was a critical factor in Rutgers' resurgence to competitiveness and helped lay the foundation in recruiting and coaching for a program that went from obscurity to college football's upper echelon in a matter of five years. Cristobal helped Rutgers to a 5-7 mark in 2003, the school's best record since 1998. One of Cristobal's most accomplished pupils was tight end L.J. Smith, the Philadelphia Eagles' second-round pick in the 2003 NFL Draft.

Cristobal began his coaching career in 1998 as a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the Hurricanes for three seasons under Butch Davis. He joined the Hurricanes' staff six years after finishing a four-year playing career at Miami as a standout offensive lineman under hall of fame coach Jimmy Johnson. Cristobal was a first-team All-Big East selection in 1992 and helped the Hurricanes to a pair of national championships (1989, 1991).

A native of Miami and a prep standout at Christopher Columbus High School, Cristobal graduated from Miami in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and later earned a master's degree from Miami in 2001. Following his college career, Cristobal signed a free-agent contract with the Denver Broncos in 1994 and then played for the Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe in 1995 and 1996.

Cristobal and his wife, Jessica, were married in June 2006 and have two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
