

THE GAME

No. 7 Auburn (9-1, 5-1 SEC) hosts No. 25 Georgia (6-3, 4-2 SEC) Saturday, November 16, at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in the 117th renewal of the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry and the 70th consecutive meeting between the teams. Kickoff is 2:30 p.m. CT and the game will be televised by CBS. This is the first season Auburn will play both Georgia and Alabama in Auburn.

FIRST AND 10

- Auburn has posted the biggest turnaround in the nation through 10 games (last year 2-8)
- Gus Malzahn is 9-1 in his first season as Auburn head coach, the second-best start ever for an Auburn coach; he served as Auburn's offensive coordinator from 2009-11
- SEC special teams player of the week Chris Davis leads the nation in punt return average, gaining 24.1 yards on 10 returns including his 85-yard touchdown at Tennessee
- Wide receiver Sammie Coates is second in the nation in yards per reception (24.92); the sophomore has 26 catches for 648 yards and five scores this season
- The Tigers lead the SEC in rushing at 320.0 yards per game (84 yards better than second-place Missouri), and rank third nationally; Auburn is one of seven teams nationally to have had four different 100-yard rushers this season and the only team nationally with four 500+ yard rushers
- SEC offensive player of the week Nick Marshall's 214 rushing yards at Tennessee were the most
 by any SEC player this season, and the third-best rushing performance ever by an Auburn QB
- Auburn has scored at least 30 points in six consecutive games for the first time since 2004
- Defensive end Dee Ford ranks second in the SEC and 13th nationally in sacks per game with 0.9 sacks per contest; he is now seventh on the Auburn career sacks list
- Auburn set an NCAA record averaging 44.85 yards on seven punt and kick returns at Tennessee
- Tre Mason, the SEC offensive player of the week for his four-TD performance at Arkansas, has scored a rushing touchdown in the last seven games and 14 of the last 17 contests

About Gus Malzahn

Gus Malzahn, who served as Auburn's offensive coordinator from 2009-11, is in his first year as Auburn's head coach. He is 9-1 at Auburn and 18-4 overall. That start is the second-best ever for a new Auburn coach; Terry Bowden started his tenure 20-0.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the BCS National Championship, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title. He was named Auburn's 27th head football coach on December 4, 2012.

Last season at Arkansas State, Malzahn led the Red Wolves to a 9-3 record and 7-1 conference mark. While at Auburn, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 under Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton. The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, including points in a season (577), points per game (41.2), total yards (6,989), total offense (499.2), rushing yards (3,987), rushing touchdowns (41) and passing touchdowns (31), led the Southeastern Conference and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

Prior to Auburn, Malzahn was the offensive coordinator at Tulsa (2007-08) and Arkansas (2006). Two of Malzahn's first three collegiate offenses ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing, including the 2008 Tulsa team and 2006 Arkansas squad. His offenses at Tulsa ranked first nationally in total offense in 2007 and 2008. He coached Heisman Trophy finalist Darren McFadden at Arkansas, while helping the Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing at 228.5 yards per game.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas; in 14 seasons as a high school head coach there, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

The Series

Auburn and Georgia are tied in the all-time series 54-54-8. Georgia has won eight of the last 11 in the series, which is the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry. This will be the 117th meeting between the schools and the 70th consecutive season the teams have met on the gridiron.

World war has been the only thing to prevent Auburn and Georgia from playing football. The two teams did not play in 1943, only because Auburn did not field a team due to World War II. The two teams did not play in 1917 and 1918 because of WWI and the subsequent influenza outbreak. With those two exceptions, Auburn and Georgia have played continuously since 1898.

The Auburn-Georgia series (now 117 games) is older than the Georgia-Georgia Tech (105 games) and the Auburn-Alabama series (77 games). Auburn and Georgia first met in 1892; each first played its in-state rival in 1893.

Additional Auburn-Georgia series notes:

Through 116 meetings, Georgia has outscored Auburn by just 114 points (1,892-1,778), only 0.9 points per game.

In the last 22 meetings (1991-2012), the team that has won the turnover battle has gone 15-2-1, the only exceptions coming in 2010 and 1991.

In games decided by three points or less, Auburn leads, 8-5-8.

In games decided by seven points or less, Georgia leads, 23-19-8.

Deep South's Oldest Rivalry

The Auburn-Georgia series is tied with Oregon-Oregon State as the fourth-most played current series in the nation (Football Bowl Subdivision). The FBS series with the most games played are listed below:

Ralph "Shug" Jordan, who was an assistant at Georgia before becoming Auburn's winningest head coach, often used the Auburn-Georgia series, his favorite rivalry, as an example of the growth of college football.



One of his favorite stories was how gate receipts from early Auburn-Georgia games were divided. It involved Auburn's Cliff Hare and Georgia's Charles Herty, their friendship and the relationship between the two schools that brought college football to the Deep South.

"They would come to Dean Hare's house on Gay Street in Auburn after the game in Columbus to divide the money," Jordan said. "They would take the gate receipts out of an old cigar box, spread it on the kitchen table and say, 'a dollar for you and a dollar for us' until the game proceeds were divided equally between the two schools."

Today, it takes a team of accountants in Auburn, Athens and the SEC office in Birmingham weeks to do what two gentlemen, Hare and Herty, used to do in a matter of minutes.

Road-Field Advantage

The Auburn-Georgia series has taken hospitality to a new level. Auburn owns a winning record in Athens (18-12) while Georgia has a winning mark on the Plains (15-10-2). The Tigers have won 10 of their last 15 games at Sanford Stadium and Georgia has won on six of its last nine trips to Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Former Auburn coach Terry Bowden never beat Georgia in Auburn (0-1-1), but never lost to the Bulldogs in Athens (3-0). Tommy Tuberville had a better road record (3-2) than home record (2-3) against Georgia and Pat Dye had a better record in Athens (4-2) than he did against Georgia in Auburn (3-3). Legendary Georgia coach Vince Dooley (1964-88), an Auburn graduate, had better success against the Tigers in Auburn (7-5-1) than he did in Athens (4-8).

Georgia 56, Auburn 49: An SEC First

The 1996 Auburn-Georgia game, the 100th in the series, was the first SEC game ever to go into overtime. Georgia won 56-49 in four OTs. It was the longest game in SEC history, until the 2001 Arkansas-Ole Miss game that lasted seven overtime periods.

Auburn and Georgia have split two overtime games between the two schools. Georgia claimed the 1996, four-overtime contest, with Auburn claiming a 29-26 overtime victory at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2000.

Williams Sets Record In 2001

In 2001's 24-17 win in Athens, then-freshman Carnell Williams set an Auburn record when he carried the ball 41 times against

Georgia. Williams' 41 carries broke the old record of 38 set by both Stacy Danley (1988) and Bo Jackson (1985). For the game, Williams rushed for 167 yards and two touchdowns and was named the SEC Player of the Week following his performance.

100-Yard Rushers Versus Georgia

Since 1970, Auburn has had 25 100-yard rushing performances against Georgia, including two 100-yard rushers in three games (1974, '78, '79). The Tigers have had a 100-yard rusher in six of the last 12 matchups.

Rudi Johnson gained 152 yards in 2000, Carnell Williams followed with 167 yards in 2001, Ronnie Brown ran for 124 yards in 2002, Williams went for 101 in 2004 and Kenny Irons rushed for 179 yards in 2005. Cam Newton rushed for 151 yards in 2010.

From 1982-85, Auburn had four straight 100-yard rushers vs. the Bulldogs: Lionel James (1982, 8/111, TD); Bo Jackson (1983, 18/118); Tommie Agee (1984, 9/115) and Jackson (19/121, 2 TD).

In November Games

Auburn is 223-176-21 (.555) all-time in November games. The Tigers are 19-11 in 30 November games since the 2004 season. Auburn's all-time home record in November is 90-33-5 (.723). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 133-143-16 (.481) during the month of November.

SEC Numbers

In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 296-231-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 120-51-6 all-time. In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 176-180-12 overall.

Against Ranked Teams

Auburn is now 97-141-6 all-time when facing ranked opponents. Auburn is 42-36-2 at home against ranked teams, 25-60-2 on the road and 30-45-2 against ranked teams on a neutral field.

The Tigers are 76-117-5 all-time when facing SEC opponents that are ranked (33-29-2 at home, 25-54-2 away, 18-34-1 neutral field).

The win at No. 7 Texas A&M was Auburn's first win over a ranked opponent on the road since October 1, 2011, at No. 10 South Carolina. It was the Tigers' second win over a ranked opponent this season after the victory over then-No. 24 Ole Miss.

TIGERS PERFECT TWICE SINCE 2004

Auburn is the only Southeastern Conference team to record two perfect seasons since 2004, going 13-0 in '04 and 14-0 in 2010. Since the 2004 season, Auburn has won 45 of its 75 SEC games and 47 of its 77 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 (vs. Tennessee) and 2010 (vs. South Carolina) SEC Championship games. SEC record since 2004:

30+ Points Equals Victory

Auburn has won 85 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49 four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 302-4 when scoring at least 30 points.

Notes About The Coaching Staff...

Malzahn has now produced 10 1,000-yard rushers in eight seasons as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, at least one in each season, with Tre Mason (1,038) being the most recent.

Overall, Malzahn has had 10 1,000-yard rushers, five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. Malzahn had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season twice, 2006 (Arkansas) and 2010 (Auburn). His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Rodney Garner and Dameyune Craig are the first pair of Auburn football lettermen to be on Auburn's staff at the same time since Kurt Crain and Garner were on the Tiger staff from 1993-95. The last time Garner and Craig were in Auburn uniforms together at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to this season was the 1995 Iron Bowl, a 31-27 Auburn victory. Craig's last home game as an Auburn quarterback was an Auburn 18-17 Iron Bowl victory in 1997.

Fine Line

Auburn is getting excellent production in 2013 from both its offensive and defensive line. The offensive line ranks third in the SEC and 14th nationally in fewest sacks allowed (1.0/game) and fourth in the SEC and 11th in the NCAA in fewest TFL allowed (4.10/gm).

That has allowed Auburn to get 11 100-yard rushing performances from a combination of four different players, one of only seven schools to do so. Auburn averages 320.0 rushing yards per game, first in the SEC and third nationally.

On the defensive line, 13 players are getting time in the rotation, and 11 of those have contributed to at least one sack this season. Auburn is third in the the SEC and ranks 19th nationally with 7.3 TFL per game.

As a group, the D-line has 52.0 TFL and 21.0 sacks through 10 games; last year, the defensive line accounted for 33.5 TFL and 16.0 sacks in 12 games.

Senior Dee Ford, with 7.0 sacks this season in eight games played, is second in the SEC and 13th nationally in sacks per game. With 17.0 career sacks, Ford is tied for seventh on Auburn's career list with Willie Whitehead (1991-94), Leonardo Carson (1996-99) and Corey Lemonier (2010-12).

The Ellis Effect

Including his current stint at Auburn, Ellis Johnson's last three stops as defensive coordinator have seen the veteran coach bring major improvement to his team's scoring defense in his first season.

This season with the Tigers, Johnson has guided the defense to an improvement of 44 spots in the NCAA scoring defense rankings through 2013's first 10 games (66th to 22nd).

Auburn's defense has allowed 204 points (20.4 ppg), the fewest total points through 10 games of the season since 2008, when Auburn allowed just 158 points (15.8 ppg).

In The Red Zone/Defense

Auburn is second in the SEC in red zone defense, allowing opponents to score 23 of 32 times, for a 71.9 percentage. Opponents have converted 14 touchdowns and nine field goals in the red zone.

That percentage is a significant improvement from the Tigers' national ranking over the last five seasons. Auburn currently ranks 15th in NCAA red zone defense; the Tigers' best ranking in the past five seasons has been 72nd in 2010 (0.84).

In The Red Zone/Offense

Auburn is 37-42 scoring in the red zone on the season for the second best percentage in the SEC (.881). Auburn has scored 31 touchdowns and six field goals on drives in the red zone this season.

More About The Tigers ...

- This is the 15th time Auburn has started 9-1 or better through 10 games.
- Auburn has equaled its largest one-year turnaround in school history with a 6-game swing. Auburn's other 6-game swings all-time: 1918 (2-5) to 1919 (8-1); 1934 (2-8) to 1935 (8-2); 1992 (5-5-1) to 1993 (11-0); 2009 (8-5) to 2010 (14-0).
- Auburn has scored 30 points in six consecutive games for the first time since 2004, when the Tigers also scored 30 points or more in six straight games.
- Auburn ranks seventh nationally in yards per play on offense at 7.08 yards.
- The Tigers have already surpassed their season totals from last year in total offense, points scored, rushing, rushing TD, passing TD and first downs. The Tigers are just 146 yards shy of last year's season passing total.
- Auburn threw for 200+ yards just once in 2011 (286 yards vs. Utah State) and twice in 2012 (281 vs. Arkansas and 211 vs. Texas A&M). Auburn has already thrown for 200+ yards in a game five times in 2013 (339 vs. Mississippi State, 224 at LSU, 201 vs. Western Carolina, 236 at Texas A&M, 206 vs. Florida Atlantic).
- Although only +1 in season turnover margin (16 to 15), Auburn has outscored its opponents 66-24 in points off turnovers (6.6 to 2.4 points per game).
- Auburn is third nationally with 153 rushing first downs, behind only Army (175) and Navy (161).

- Auburn has had a 100-yard rusher in eight of its 10 games this season, including at least one in six of the last seven contests. The Tigers have had a pair of 100-yard rushers in three games this season.
- Auburn's total offense of 628 against Florida Atlantic gave the Tigers a school record for most yards of total offense in a three-game span (1,955). Auburn had 712 vs. Western Carolina and 615 at Texas A&M. The previous record was 1,726 yards in 2010 vs. LSU (526), at Ole Miss (572) and vs. Chattanooga (628).
- The Tigers are 3-0 in games decided by seven points or less and 4-0 in games decided by eight points or less, with four come-frombehind wins
- The Tigers currently have 3,200 yards rushing on the season. The last time Auburn had at least that many yards in a season was 2010 when it finished with 3,987 in 14 games. Auburn has 33 rushing touchdowns this season. The last time Auburn had at least that many in a season was 2010 (41).
- Auburn has scored on its opening drive in six of its 10 games this season (five touchdowns and a field goal). The Tigers have scored a touchdown on their opening drive in four of the last six games.
- Auburn is one of only four teams nationally to allow four or fewer punt returns this season; along with Baylor, Utah State and Ohio State. The Tigers have allowed just 16 punt return yards, seventh best in college football, and their 4.0 yard per punt return allowed average is tied for 16th nationally.
- This is the first time Auburn has won road games in consecutive weeks since winning at Kentucky 49-27 on November 5 and winning at Georgia 31-30 on November 12 in 2005.

More From The Tennessee Game...

- Auburn's 44.85-yard average on seven kick/ punt returns vs. Tennessee set a new NCAA record; the previous NCAA record was 41.8 yds/ ret by Florida State vs. Virginia Tech in 1974.
- Chris Davis' 85-yard punt return was the first Auburn punt return touchdown since Robert Dunn vs. Louisiana-Monroe in 2008. Davis' TD was the third longest punt return in Auburn history and the longest since 1970.

- Davis' 127 punt return yards in the game were the second highest single-game total ever by an Auburn player. Mike Fuller set the record with 173 yards in 1974 vs. Chattanooga.
- Corey Grant's 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown was the first of his career and Auburn's second KOR TD of the season.
- This was the first time in Auburn history that the Tigers have returned both a punt return and a kick return for a touchdown in the same game.
- Auburn's 312 combined return yards were a single-game school record; the previous was 208 vs. Chattanooga in 1974.
- Nick Marshall's 62-yard run in the second quarter was a career long for Marshall, and the longest run by an Auburn QB since a 71-yard run by Cam Newton vs. Arkansas State in 2010. The 62-yard run was the longest ever by an Auburn player vs. Tennessee.
- Marshall's 164 yards rushing in the first half at Tennessee were the fourth most rushing all-time by an Auburn player in a first half, and tied for the fifth-best half ever.
- Marshall's 214 rushing yards mark just the 25th time an Auburn player has rushed for 200 or more yards, and the first time since Cam Newton rushed for 217 yards vs. LSU in 2010.
- This was the first time Auburn had a 200yard rusher and a 100-yard rusher in the same game since Cam Newton rushed for 217 yards and Michael Dyer rushed for 100 yards vs. LSU in 2010.

There have only been seven such combinations in Auburn history. The others: Joe Cribbs (250), William Andrews (109) vs. Georgia 1978; Cribbs (219), James Brooks (134) vs. Vanderbilt 1979; Brooks (200), Cribbs (166) vs. Georgia 1979; Tommie Agee (219), Lionel James (115) vs. Maryland 1983; and Bo Jackson (290), Brent Fullwood (173) vs. SW Louisiana 1985.

• The Tennessee block of Cody Parkey's firstquarter PAT kick broke a streak of 90 consecutive PAT kicks by Parkey dating back through the 2011 South Carolina game. The last time Auburn had a PAT blocked was vs. LSU in 1996 (kicker was Jaret Holmes).

- Tennessee's second-quarter 17-yard TD run was only the second touchdown scored by an Auburn opponent off a turnover this season.
- It was the first time Auburn had five rushing touchdowns in an SEC game since rushing for five TDs vs. Georgia in 2010.
- Auburn's first-quarter touchdown was the Tigers' first-ever score in November at Knox-ville; the only previous Auburn game at Tennessee in November was a 27-0 loss in 1929.
- 28 points is the most ever scored by Auburn in the second quarter against an SEC opponent; the previous high was 24 against Mississippi State in 2003, and the most on the road was 21 against LSU in 1993.
- Auburn completed just three passes in the win, the fewest completions in a win since 1985 (4 vs. Miss. State). The last time Auburn had fewer than 17 combined pass attempts in back-to-back games was 14 attempts vs. Mississippi State and Georgia in 1978. Auburn has won seven straight games when throwing nine or fewer passes back through the 1981 Georgia Tech game.
- Auburn's 55 points are the most scored by either team in the series and ranks third all-time in program history for points scored on the road in an SEC game. The Tigers have now won six straight games in the Tennessee series.

Air Marshall Well Grounded

Junior Nick Marshall continues to excel at the helm of the Auburn offense.

Named SEC player of the week, Marshall rushed for 214 yards on 14 carries at Tennessee, scoring twice, to tie the third-highest rushing total every by an Auburn quarterback. It was the best rushing performance by any player in the SEC this season and the 24th best rushing performance in Division I this season.

His 62-yard run in the second quarter was a career long for Marshall, and the longest run by an Auburn QB since a 71-yard run by Cam Newton vs. Arkansas State in 2010. The 62-yard run is the longest ever by an Auburn player vs. Tennessee.

After nine games played, Marshall has passed for 1,301 yards and rushed for 734 more, averaging 226.1 yards total offense per game. He did not see action against Western Carolina and left the Florida Atlantic game early in the second quarter.



Marshall passed for 236 yards on a pair of touchdowns and rushed for 100 yards, scoring twice on TD runs of 16 and 13 yards in the win at Texas A&M, earning his first SEC offensive player of the week award. In the win at Arkansas, he rushed for 59 yards and his 88-yard touchdown completion to Sammie Coates was the third longest pass play in Auburn history.

Against Ole Miss, Marshall posted his first 100-yard rushing game, with 140 yards on 14 carries, scoring twice. Only seven Auburn QBs have rushed for 100 yards in a game; AU quarterbacks have only rushed for 100 yards in a game 18 times in 121 seasons.

Only three quarterbacks nationally have rushed for more yards in a game this season: Jordan Lynch (Northern Ill) 316 vs. C Mich Taysom Hill (BYU) 259 vs. Texas Keenan Reynolds (Navy) 226 vs. Hawaii Nick Marshall (Auburn) at Tennessee

His two touchdown runs against Ole Miss were the first pair of rushing scores by an Auburn QB since Kiehl Frazier scored two rushing TDs in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl against Virginia. The last Auburn QB to rush for 100 yards in a game was Cam Newton vs. Georgia in 2010. Marshall became the 61st player in Auburn history to have a 100-yard rushing game.

In just his third start as Auburn's quarterback, Marshall finished the Mississippi State game 23-34 passing for 339 yards, making him the first Auburn quarterback to pass for 300 yards since Cam Newton threw for 335 against South Carolina in the 2010 SEC title game.

Marshall's 339 passing yards were 16th alltime at Auburn for single-game passing yardage and the ninth-highest passing total against a conference opponent. Marshall's 339 yards passing were also the most ever by an Auburn quarterback in an SEC debut.

On the game-winning drive, Marshall accounted for 84 of the 88 total yards, completing six of his eight passes for 65 yards while rushing three times for 19 yards. With his 151 yards passing (9-11) in the first quarter, Marshall had already established a new season high.

Marshall was the first Auburn quarterback to pass for more than 200 yards since Barrett Trotter versus Utah State in 2011, and the first to throw for 200+ yards versus an SEC opponent since Newton did it against South Carolina in the 2010 SEC Championship game. Adding 22 yards rushing, Marshall finished with 361 yards total offense. He also had a 37-yard pass reception off a tipped ball he threw and then caught.

His 339 yards were the most passing yards by an Auburn quarterback since Brandon Cox threw for 343 versus Georgia Tech in 2005. It was just the fifth time since the start of the 2000 season that an Auburn QB has thrown for 339 or more yards:

- Ben Leard, 394 v Michigan, 2000
- Daniel Cobb, 381 v La. Tech [OT], 2001
- Jason Campbell, 374 v Tennessee, 2004 [SEC Championship Game]
- Brandon Cox, 343 v Georgia Tech, 2005

Tre Mason On The Carry

Junior Tre Mason is having a memorable season for Auburn. Mason is averaging 103.8 rushing yards per game, fourth best among the SEC rushing leaders.

He has rushed for touchdowns in seven consecutive games (the first since Carnell Williams in 2004) and in 14 of the last 17 games. National leaders in consecutive games with a rushing touchdown scored: 11: Bishop Sankey (Washington); 9: Tevin Coleman (Indiana); 7: Tre Mason (Auburn), Bryce Petty (Baylor); 6: Jaquez Johnson (Florida Atlantic).

Mason crossed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second consecutive season with a 10-yard carry in the third quarter of the win at Tennessee; he reached the 1,000-yard mark on his 175th carry of the season. Mason is the first Auburn player to rush for 1,000 yards in back to back seasons since Mike Dyer in 2010-11; the others all-time were Carnell Williams in 2003-04, Stephen Davis in 1994-95, James Brooks in 1979-80 and Joe Cribbs in 1978-79.

Mason now has 2,201 rushing yards in his career, putting him in 13th place all-time ahead of Kenny Irons (2,186; 2005-06). Mason's career total is the seventh best in Auburn history by a player through the end of his junior season:

Stephen Davis 2,811 Carnell Williams 2,666 Bo Jackson 2,517 Michael Dyer 2,335 Joe Cribbs 2,248 James Brooks 2,209 **Tre Mason 2,201**

His three touchdown runs at Tennessee give Mason 24 career rushing and 26 total career touchdowns; he has 16 rushing touchdowns this year. His total of 117 yards rushing at Tennessee was the eighth 100-yard game of his career and fifth this season, and the sixth time in his career he has scored multiple rushing TD in a game. He is now ninth on Auburn's all-time touchdowns scored list.

Mason is the first Auburn player to rush for seven touchdowns in a two-game span since Cam Newton rushed for four TD at Kentucky and three vs. Arkansas in 2010.

Mason rushed for 168 yards and four touch-downs in the win at Arkansas on a career-high 32 carries, the first Auburn player to score four rushing TD in a game since Cam Newton vs. Kentucky in 2010. He earned SEC offensive player of the week honors for that effort.

In his last 17 games dating back to the Ole Miss game in 2012, Mason has rushed for 1,734 yards and 23 touchdowns on 287 carries for an average of 102.0 yards per game and 6.04 yards per carry.

In three games against ranked teams this season (LSU, Ole Miss, Texas A&M), Mason has totaled 387 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns on 74 carries for an average of 5.2 yards per carry and 129.0 rushing yards per game on an average of 24.7 carries per game. He has also caught five passes for 75 yards and returned three kickoffs for 67 yards.

Mason has three career 100-yard rushing games against ranked opponents, including two in 2013 (LSU and Texas A&M). In 14 games against ranked opponents in his career, Mason is averaging 5.3 yards per carry.

He has two of the seven best rushing performances in the SEC this season:
214 Nick Marshall (Aub) at Tennessee
184 Jeremy Hill (LSU) vs. Auburn
178 Tre Mason (Aub) at Texas A&M

Mason's 16 rushing touchdowns this season tie him for fourth in Auburn history with Joe Cribbs (1978). He, Kent State's Dri Archer and New Mexico's Carlos Wiggins are the only players in the nation with a 100-yard rushing game, a rushing touchdown and 100-yard kick return TD this season.

Mason rushed for 178 yards and the gamewinning touchdown at Texas A&M; he had 108 of those in the fourth quarter. Mason had 100 rushing yards, all in the first half, against Western Carolina and 132 yards at LSU.

Mason had two rushing touchdowns of 53 and 20 yards against Western Carolina. He scored on a 1-yard run vs. Ole Miss, twice against LSU and scored an 11-yard rushing TD against Arkansas State and rushing and return scores against Washington State.

His kickoff return touchdown of 100 yards against Washington State was the second KOR score of his career; his first was a 97-yard return against Utah State in the 2011 season opener. The Tigers have returned 20 kickoffs for touchdowns in program history. Mason's three returns that day for 141 yards set an Auburn record for best kick return average (47.0).

Now ninth among Auburn career leaders in kickoff return yards, Mason has 1,015 total, and 3,218 all-purpose yards in his career, just 77 all-purpose yards shy of the Auburn top 10.

On the final carry of 2012, Mason passed the 1,000-yard rushing mark, finishing with 1,002 yards on 171 carries (the fewest number of carries to 1,000 yards by any SEC rusher last season). He was the first non-quarterback to lead Auburn in total offense for a season since Bo Jackson in 1985.

Mason had 100-yard efforts last year against Alabama A&M (181), New Mexico State (152) and Clemson (106). Mason's 86-yard first-quarter TD run against Alabama A&M was the fourth longest rushing play in AU history and the seventh longest from scrimmage ever.

Mason led Auburn in rushing for the 2012 season season with 1,002 yards on 171 carries, a 5.9-yard per-carry average. Scoring twice against AAMU, his eight touchdowns were also most on the squad; he scored seven of those in the last seven games.

The Ground Game

Auburn leads the SEC in rushing at 320.0 yards per game due to a trio of outstanding tailbacks -- Tre Mason, Corey Grant and Cameron Artis-Payne -- and quarterback Nick Marshall.

With 146 yards rushing on nine carries against Washington State, Corey Grant posted his first 100-yard game, the 59th Auburn rusher ever to do so. Grant's 75-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was his first Auburn score and the 24th-longest touchdown run in Auburn program history.

Grant made his first career start against Arkansas State, and responded with a 17-yard first quarter touchdown. He scored on a 43-yard run against Florida Atlantic. Grant is averaging 50.4 rushing yards per game.

Cameron Artis-Payne scored his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter of the win over Arkansas State, a 12-yard run that also put him beyond 100 yards on the night, the 60th

player in Auburn history to record a 100-yard rushing game. He rushed for 133 yards and a touchdown against Western Carolina.

Artis-Payne scored a touchdown in the fourth quarter at Texas A&M and in the third quarter of the win over Florida Atlantic. The junior college transfer is averaging 56.8 yards per game on the ground.

This is the first time in Auburn history that Auburn has had four different 100-yard rushers in the same season: Corey Grant (Washington State); Cameron Artis-Payne (Arkansas State and Western Carolina); Nick Marshall (Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Tennessee) and Tre Mason (LSU, Western Carolina, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Tennessee).

Auburn, Air Force, Minnesota, Arkansas State, Southern Cal, Ole Miss and Ohio State are the only teams nationally to have at least four different 100-yard rushers this season

Last season, Auburn scored only eight offensive touchdowns total in eight SEC games. This season, the Tigers have scored 25 offensive touchdowns in just six SEC games.

Auburn rushed for three touchdowns against both LSU and Ole Miss; four at Texas A&M, at Arkansas and against Florida Atlantic; and five against Western Carolina and at Tennessee.

This is the first time Auburn has rushed for at least three TDs in six consecutive games through records kept since the 1967 season. It is the first time Auburn has had at least three rushing TDs in five consecutive SEC games since the 1985-86 seasons.

50+ Carries

Auburn is averaging 49.3 rushing attempts per game this season, and the Tigers have carried the ball more than 50 times in five contests (50 vs. Arkansas State; 52 at LSU; 60 at Texas A&M; 59 vs. Florida Atlantic; 53 at Tennessee).

Since 1967, Auburn is 141-35-3 (.796) when rushing 50+ times in a game, 44-6-1 (.873) when rushing 60+ times in a game, 5-0 when rushing 70+ times in a game, and 1-0 when rushing 80+ times in a game (82 carries in a 41-0 win over Ole Miss in 1985).

Interceptors

Auburn has recorded 11 interceptions this season, after grabbing only two all last season. Seven different players have accounted for those.



Robenson Therezie and Joshua Holsey each recorded their first career interception against Washington State. It marked the first time two players recorded their first career picks in the same game since Jake Holland and Jermaine Whitehead did so vs. Florida Atlantic in 2011.

Therezie was the first Auburn player to record two interceptions in a game since Josh Bynes against Arkansas in 2010. Auburn as a team had only two interceptions in the 2012 season. Therezie was selected as SEC Defensive Player of the Week and the Jim Thorpe Award national defensive back of the week.

Therezie scored on a 78-yard interception against Ole Miss, the eighth longest such play in Auburn history. It was the longest interception return for a touchdown by an Auburn player since Walter McFadden in the 2010 Outback Bowl vs. Northwestern. Auburn's last interception for a touchdown was by Trent Fisher vs. Alabama A&M last season, a 60-yard return. It was Therezie's third interception of the season, and the first interception thrown by Ole Miss' Bo Wallace this year.

Therezie's fourth pick of the season game at Tennessee. The last Auburn player to have four interceptions in a season was Walter McFadden with six in 2009.

Ryan Smith recorded his first career interception against Ole Miss in the fourth quarter of that win, and had a first-quarter interception at Texas A&M.

Jermaine Whitehead recorded a thirdquarter interception at LSU, breaking Zach Mettenberger's string of 77 pass attempts without an interception. It was Auburn's first interception in an SEC game since 2011 vs. Ole Miss (T'Sharvan Bell). It was the second career pick for Whitehead; his first was versus Florida Atlantic in 2011.

Jonathon Mincy recorded his first career interception, and the first by an AU corner since 2011, with a 10-yard pick against Western Carolina. Ryan White posted his first career interception versus Texas A&M and Cassanova McKinzy nabbed his first pick at Arkansas.

Catching On

Sophomores Sammie Coates (26) and Ricardo Louis (19) and true freshman Marcus Davis (19) are three of Auburn's top four receivers for the season. The young trio has combined for 64

receptions for 970 yards and seven touchdowns. Those totals account for 52% of Auburn's receptions and 56% of its receiving yards this year.

Junior Quan Bray, with 16 catches for 172 yards and three touchdowns, rounds out the Auburn reception leading quartet.

Coates set a career high at LSU with 139 yards receiving on four receptions, his first career 100-yard receiving game and the first for an AU receiver since Emory Blake vs. Georgia in 2012. He is the first Tiger other than Blake to record 100 yards receiving since 2010.

Coates had 104 yards receiving on five catches in the win at Texas A&M, including a 43-yard TD catch. He had 113 yards receiving on just three catches against Florida Atlantic, with touchdowns of 67 and 36 yards from Jeremy Johnson. He had 102 yards on three catches at Arkansas, including a career-long 88 yard touchdown from Nick Marshall.

The last Auburn receiver to record three straight 100-yard games was Tyrone Goodson vs. Ole Miss, LSU and UCF in 1997. The last to catch a touchdown pass in three consecutive games was Philip Lutzenkirchen in 2011.

Coates is second in the nation in yards per catch (24.92). His 11 catches this year of 30+ yards are tied for fifth most of any player nationally. His six catches of 40+ yards this season tie for ninth nationally and he is tied for fifth in the country with four catches of 50+ yards. With three catches of 60+ yards, Coates is tied for sixth nationally.

Introducing Jeremy Johnson

True freshman quarterback Jeremy Johnson saw his first collegiate action making his first start against Western Carolina. In that 62-3 Auburn victory, Johnson was 17-21 passing for 201 yards and four touchdowns against just one interception. He also rushed for 26 yards, earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors.

Johnson's four TD passes vs. WCU were the most by an Auburn quarterback since Clint Moseley threw four against Ole Miss in 2011, and tied him with Stan White (vs. Cal State Fullerton, 1990) for second-most career passes by an Auburn QB in his first career start but the most by a true freshman. Daniel Cobb threw for five touchdowns against Louisiana Tech in his debut in 2001 as a senior.

Johnson entered the action against Florida Atlantic early in the second quarter and threw a 36-yard touchdown pass to Sammie Coates on his very first play. Johnson was 10-16 passing for 192 yards and two scores (both to Coates) and also rushed for 21 yards against FAU, earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors for the second time this season.

First-Time Tigers

In the season opener against Washington State, 14 Auburn players saw their first action in a Tiger uniform: Montravius Adams, Will Adams, Mackenro Alexander, Cameron Artis-Payne, Ben Bradley, Elijah Daniel, Marcus Davis, Johnathan Ford, Brandon King, Alex Kozan, Carl Lawson, Robert Leff, Nick Marshall and JaViere Mitchell.

There were eight more Tigers who saw their first Auburn action against Arkansas State: Gage Batten, Shon Coleman, T.J. Davis, Jordan Diamond, Kenny Flowers, Kamryn Melton, Gimel President and Tony Stevens. Patrick Lymon saw his first action at LSU.

Twelve players saw their first collegiate action against Western Carolina: Eric Averett, Shane Callahan, Wirth Campbell, Michael Clifton, Devonte Danzey, Adam Dyas, Khari Harding, Jeremy Johnson, Tyler Nero, Dimitri Reese, Chandler Shakespeare and Mack VanGorder.

Kyle Bolstad, Reid Brooks and Jackson Thomas were first-time players against Florida Atlantic.

Of Auburn's 38 first-time players this season, 10 are true freshmen, 16 are redshirt freshmen and six are junior college transfers.

No Return Policy

Senior punter Steven Clark, a 2011 Ray Guy Award finalist and 2012 and 2013 semifinalist, continues to excel. His season average is 42.7 with seven of 50+ yards and 15 inside the 20. Clark has had only four punts returned during the 2013 campaign on 38 kicks. He did not punt against Western Carolina.

Only five of his 70 punts last season were returned. Clark averaged 39.8 yards per punt in 2012, placing 15 kicks inside the 20. His season long was 54 yards against LSU; he had six punts last year of 50 yards or more.

For his career, Clark has a 40.4 average on 186 career punts, with 63 punts landing inside the 20 and 26 kicks of 50 yards or longer. Only 11 percent of his career punts (21-186) have

been returned, for an average of just 4.7 yards per return.

A nominee for the National Football Foundation post-graduate scholarship and a semifinalist for the Senior CLASS Award, Clark is fourth in Auburn career punts with 186 and fifth in Auburn career punting yards with 7,515.

Penalties

Auburn has been flagged with only 44 total penalties this season. The Tigers committed nine penalties against Arkansas State, seven at Arkansas, six against Florida Atlantic and only 22 in the other seven contests combined.

Auburn had only one penalty against both Mississippi State (a five-yard penalty for illegal formation) and one at Tennessee (five yards for defensive offsides). The last time Auburn had only one penalty in a game was in 2008, when Auburn had one five-yard penalty in a 37-20 win over UT Martin.

Auburn is 15th nationally and first in the SEC in fewest penalties per game (4.40). In fewest penalty yards per game, the Tigers are 21st nationally and second in the SEC (38.2 ypg). Both averages are Auburn's best for a season since 1989 (3.42 and 30.0 ypg that year).

Parkey For Three

Cody Parkey hit three field goals in the 24-20 Mississippi State win, including a 47-yarder that tied his career long, earning Lou Groza Award Star of the Week honors. Parkey also kicked a 47-yarder against Washington State, one of three FG he made in that 31-24 win.

Parkey had his SEC-leading string of 90 consecutive PAT kicks made snapped with a blocked PAT at Tennessee. He now has 116 career PAT (116-118), making him the fifth player in Auburn history to kick more than 100.

His string of 19 straight field goals made from 45 yards and in, dating back through the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl, was broken on a 40-yarder vs. Florida Atlantic. He is 10-13 on field goals this season.

Parkey now ranks fourth in Auburn career field goal percentage at .755 (34-45), just behind Scott Etheridge (.791/1992-93), Matt Hawkins (.788/1994-95) and Win Lyle (.763/1987-89).

Parkey is tied for first in the nation in touchbacks with 48 this season. During his career, 121 of Parkey's 219 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks (.553), including 120 of 184 since the beginning of his sophomore season (.652).

In 2012, Parkey converted on nine straight three-pointers dating back through the 2011 season, before missing on a 49-yarder vs. Arkansas. That tied the third best string of consecutive field goals at Auburn since 1981.

Parkey was 11-14 on field goals last year, and 27-27 last season on PAT kicks. He made four field goals versus Clemson (37-46-27-36 yards), tying a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic record and earning him Lou Groza Award star of the week honors. Parkey's game-winner against ULM earned him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

Drive Time

Auburn has had 21 drives of 75 yards or longer through 10 games of the 2013 season, all of them accounting for touchdowns. Last season, Auburn had only 13 drives of that length in 12 games, and only 11 such drives in 2011.

Over the past 18 seasons, the current total ranks third: 2010 (29); 2004 (24); **2013 (21)**; 2005 (20); 2000 (17); 1994, 2003 (14); 2012 (13); 2001, 2009, 2011 (11); 1999, 2006, 2007 (10).

Auburn has had 10 scoring drives of less than a minute this season. The quickest scoring drive for the Tigers was a 10-second drive on a 43-yard run by Corey Grant against Florida Atlantic. The quickest SEC drive was 0:25 covering 29 yards on two plays at Arkansas.

Pass Efficiency Defense

Auburn's pass defense is sixth nationally, only allowing a touchdown pass every 38.2 attempts. The Tigers have allowed just nine passing touchdowns this year on 344 pass attempts by their opponents. Of teams with more than 325 pass attempts against them, only Oregon has a better ratio.

The Return Game

Auburn is one of four teams nationally to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game this season:

Auburn at Tennessee North Texas at Georgia Alabama vs. Virginia Tech Baylor vs. Iowa State

Auburn is one of 12 teams to return both a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown this season, and one of seven teams nationally with at least three kickoff/punt returns for touchdowns this season:

- 4 North Texas: 3 PR, 1 KR
- 3 Auburn: 1 PR, 2 KR
- 3 Southern Cal: 3 PR, 0 KR
- 3 Oklahoma State: 2 PR, 1 KR
- 3 Duke: 2 PR, 1 KR

- 3 Rutgers: 1 PR, 2 KR

Auburn ranks third in the nation among teams with the longest active streak of kickoff returns for a touchdown in consecutive seasons. The Tigers have had at least one kickoff return for a score in each of the past six seasons, including Tre Mason's 100-yard return against Washington State and Corey Grant's 90-yard return at Tennessee.

Auburn's KOR touchdowns during that string have come from: Onterio McCalebb (100 vs. Mississippi State, 2012 and 83 vs. Alabama, 2011); Tre Mason (97 vs. Utah State in 2011 and 100 vs. Washington State, 2013); Demond Washington (95 vs. Ole Miss, 2010 and 99 vs. Georgia, 2009); and Tristan Davis (97 vs. Arkansas and 95 vs. UT-Martin, 2008).

Only seven teams have returned two kickoffs for touchdowns this season: Auburn, Iowa State, Rutgers, Stanford, TCU, Texas State and UTEP.

Academic All-District

Auburn punter Steven Clark and defensive back Trent Fisher have been named to the 2013 District 4 Capital One Academic All-District * Football Teams, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America. These teams recognize the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom.

Clark, who graduated in May with his bachelor's degree in exercise science, had a 3.70 grade-point average as an undergraduate. He is now enrolled in graduate studies in biomechanics. Fisher, a junior safety from Brentwood, Tenn., holds a 3.73 grade-point average in communication.

District 4 is comprised of all colleges and universities in Alabama, Florida, Georgia,



South Carolina and Puerto Rico. First-team Academic All-District * honorees advance to the Capital One Academic All-America* Team national ballot, where first-, second- and third-team All-America honorees will be selected later this month. Capital One has been the entitlement rights holder to CoSIDA's Academic All-America programs since 2011.

Average Per Down

Here's a breakdown for the season of how the 2013 Auburn offense operates on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Tigers have run a total of 316 plays, gaining 2,305 yards for an average of 7.29 yards per play. On second down, AU has tried 269 plays for 1,616 yards, an average of 6.0 per play. On third down, the Tigers have run 123 plays, gaining 945 yards for a 7.7 average. Auburn has tried 11 fourth-down attempts, gaining 23 yards (2.1-yard average).

Auburn's touchdowns have come 16 times on first down (11 rush, five pass), 20 times on second down (16 rush, four pass), and 11 times on third down (six rush, five pass).

For Starters

Auburn has a total of 45 players with at least one career start for the Tigers. Tops on that list is Nosa Eguae with 39 career starts, eighth best among current SEC players.

Thirteen players have made their first career start for Auburn this season. Five made their first Auburn start against Washington State: QB Nick Marshall, OG Alex Kozan, DE Craig Sanders, DE LaDarius Owens and Star Robenson Therezie. Against Arkansas State, defensive tackle Ben Bradley and tailback Corey Grant were first-time starters.

Marcus Davis made his first start at WR against Ole Miss. QB Jeremy Johnson, WR Ricardo Louis and RB Cameron Artis-Payne were first-time starters against Western Carolina. LB Kris Frost and WR Melvin Ray made their first start at Texas A&M.

Among 2013 SEC programs, Auburn had the most returning career starts (365) on its roster, seventh most nationally entering the season.

Conversion Rate

The Auburn defense turns up the pressure on third down, ranking second in the SEC allowing opponents to convert just 19.4 percent (7-36) of third down attempts in the fourth quarter, and only 24.2 percent (16-66) in the

second half.

The Tiger defense kept Mississippi State from converting a third down in the second half; MSU was 0-7. The last time Auburn held an SEC opponent to 0 first downs for a half was last year at Vanderbilt, where the Commodores were 0-4 on second-half third downs

Scoring By Quarters

This season in the first quarter, the Tigers have outscored the opposition 111-56. In the second quarter, Auburn is ahead of its opponents 114-65. In the third quarter, Auburn has outscored its opponents 90-53, and the Tigers hold a 71-30 lead in the fourth quarter.

Auburn has had two streaks of scoring in at least 10 consecutive quarters this season. The Tigers started the season by scoring in all

12 quarters the first three games. After being shut out in the first half at LSU, Auburn scored in 17 quarters until the fourth quarter of the Florida Atlantic game.

For the season, Auburn has scored in 37 of 40 quarters. Additionally, Auburn has scored a touchdown in 32 of 40 quarters this season.

Fantastic Finish

In its 24-20 win over Mississippi State, Auburn scored the game-winning touchdown with just 10 seconds left in the game. The winning play was an 11-yard TD pass to C.J. Uzomah from Nick Marshall, capping off Auburn's 12-play, 88-yard drive that began with just 1:56 remaining. The last time Auburn scored a game-winning touchdown in the final 30 seconds of regulation in a game was against Utah State in 2011 (Michael Dyer 1-yard TD run).

Auburn's 24-20 victory over Mississippi State was the Tigers' first fourth-quarter comeback win in an SEC game since the Tigers won at No. 10 South Carolina 16-13 with 1:38 left on a Barrett Trotter 9-yard touchdown pass to Philip Lutzenkirchen in 2011.

Auburn's last victory over an SEC opponent in the final seconds of the game was a 37-34 win at Kentucky in 2010 on a 24-yard Wes Byrum field goal as time expired. Auburn's last victory over any opponent in the final seconds was the 22-19 victory over Oregon in the 2010 BCS National Championship Game with Wes Byrum's 19-yard field goal as time expired.

Auburn's 511 rushing yards versus Western Carolina were more than 10 FBS teams had for their season rushing total through October 13.

300-Yard SEC Half

Auburn's 333 second-half yards gained at LSU marked the first 300+ half an Auburn offense posted versus an SEC opponent since gaining 348 yards in the first half of the 2010 SEC Championship against South Carolina. The last time Auburn had a 300-yard half in the SEC regular season was a 344-yard first half against Kentucky in 2010. Auburn also gained 333 yards in the second half of the Tigers' 45-41 win at No. 7 Texas A&M.

Game Captains

Auburn will select game captains for the 2013 season. Cornerback Chris Davis and center Reese Dismukes served as captains against Washington State, Arkansas State, Mississippi State, Ole Miss, Western Carolina, Texas A&M, Florida Atlantic, Arkansas and Tennessee. Dismukes and defensive end Dee Ford were captains at LSU.

100-Yard Rusher, 100-Yard Receiver

Tre Mason gained 132 yards rushing against LSU, his first 100-yard outing against an SEC opponent. Sammie Coates, with 139 yards receiving against LSU, posted his first career 100-yard game.

That's the first time an Auburn duo has combined for 100 yards rushing and receiving since last year's season opener with Clemson, when Mason (106 rushing) and Emory Blake (109 receiving) posted those marks. It's the first such duo for Auburn in an SEC game since the 2011 Mississippi State game, when Blake had 108 yards receiving and Michael Dyer totalled 150 yards rushing.

Mason (178 yards rushing) and Coates (104 yards receiving) combined again to repeat the feat at Texas A&M, and again in the win at Arkansas (Mason 168, Coates 102).

Only once before has Auburn has three such combination games in one season, in 1994, when Stephen Davis had 100+ yards rushing against Mississippi State, Florida and Arkansas, and Frank Sanders (twice), Andy Fuller and Thomas Bailey were the 100-yard receivers.

The Graduates

Five members of the 2013 Auburn squad have already earned bachelor's degrees. Graduating in May were Nosa Eguae (communication), Steven Clark (exercise science) and Chandler Shakespeare (business management). Craig Sanders (human development and family studies) and Ryan Smith (public administration) were August graduates.

Winningest Programs

Entering the 2013 campaign, Auburn ranked among the 15 winningest BCS college football programs in all-time wins; the Tigers now have 723 total victories. Teams that have 700+ alltime wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn, West Virginia, Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Texas A&M.

- · The last time Auburn played three consecutive SEC games on the road was 1986 (at Vanderbilt, Mississippi State and Florida).
- Auburn and Nebraska are the only two BCS teams to have three undefeated seasons since 1993.
- Auburn finished 4-0 in its non-conference schedule for 2013, the 26th time since joining the SEC in 1933 that the Tigers have not lost a game in non-conference action.
- Auburn is currently tied for the longest bowl winning streak with five consecutive bowl victories.

Clark Ray Guy Award Semifinalist

Punter Steven Clark has been named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award for the third consecutive season. He was one of three finalists for the award in 2011.

Ten semifinalists were selected for the 2013 Ray Guy Award from a field of 85 candidates for the award, which recognizes the most outstanding punter in college football.

The candidates were evaluated on their overall statistics and contribution to the team. Particular emphasis was placed on the punter's net average, percentage of total punts inside the 20-yard line and percentage of punts not returned.

The presentation of the Ray Guy Award will be featured on The Home Depot College Football Awards live on Thursday, December 12 at 7:30 pm ET on ESPN.

The Augusta Sports Council created the Ray Guy Award in 2000 to honor Thomson, Georgia native and College Football Hall of Fame inductee, Ray Guy. Among the statistics used to identify the winner is net punting average, number of times a punt is downed or kicked out of bounds inside the opponent 20-yard line, total yardage punted, average returned yardage, and percentage of punts not returned. The winner must display team leadership, self-discipline, and have a positive impact on the team's success. Learn more about the Ray Guy Award at www.RayGuyAward.com.

Dee Ford On Hendricks Award List

Senior Dee Ford is one of 18 players on the Ted Hendricks Award watch list, honoring the premoier defensive end in college football.

The Ted Hendricks Award is named in honor of college football's first three-time firstteam All-American. As a defensive end at the University of Miami, Hendricks used his agility, height and reach to block passes and kicks, force interceptions and pressure quarterbacks and running backs. He roamed the front line, read plays and blitzed on impulse, completely transforming the way the defensive end position was played. His professional career spanned 15 years and 215 consecutive games, four Super Bowl victories, eight Pro Bowl selections and inductions into the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame.

Frank Sanders 2013 SEC Legend

Auburn's Frank Sanders has been chosen as one of 14 former Southeastern Conference players to be named to the 2013 SEC Football Legends Class.

A four-year letterwinner (1991-94) at wide receiver for Auburn, Sanders was named first-team All-America by the Associated Press, FWAA and Scripps his senior season after leading the SEC in receiving yards per game (910) and breaking Auburn's single-season record for receptions (58).

A consensus all-SEC selection as a senior, the Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native finished his Auburn career second in total receptions with 121, receiving yardage with 1,998 and receiving touchdowns with 15. Sanders had a nine-year NFL career from 1995-2003, including eight with the Arizona Cardinals from1995-2002 and one with the Baltimore Ravens (2003). He had 507 receptions for 6,749 yards and 24 touchdowns during his professional career. His most prolific season came in 1998 when he led the NFC in receptions with 89 for 1,145 yards and three TD.

Sanders and the rest of the class will be honored at the 2013 SEC Football "Weekend of Champions" December 6-7 in Atlanta.

2014 Auburn Schedule

The 2014 Auburn football schedule will feature seven home games and five road games, featuring SEC home contests against Arkansas, LSU, South Carolina and Texas A&M. Auburn's non-conference home games are against San Jose State. Louisiana Tech and Samford.

LAST MEETING WITH GEORGIA

Emory Blake had his eighth career 100-yard receiving game, but Georgia earned a 38-0 win over Auburn on Saturday night before 86,146 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Tigers fell to 2-8 overall, 0-7 in SEC play. With the win, Georgia (9-1, 7-1 SEC) clinched the SEC Eastern Division title and a spot in next month's SEC Championship Game.

Blake had a team-best 108 receiving yards on six catches, his fourth time over 100 yards this season. Auburn quarterback Jonathan Wallace, making his second career start, finished with 15 completions on 22 attempts for 181 yards and an interception. His 15 completions were the most by an Auburn quarterback in a game this season.

quarterback in a game this season.

The Tigers struggled in the rushing game, gaining just 57 yards on 27 attempts. Tre Mason led the way with 33 yards, and Onterio McCalebb had 16 on the ground to go along with 43 receiving yards on three catches.

Georgia's Aaron Murray completed 18-of-24 pass attempts on the night for 208 yards and three touchdowns, connecting with six different receivers as the Bulldogs employed a balanced attack throughout the game. Running backs Todd Gurley and Keith Marshall each topped the 100-yard mark with Gurley getting 11 carries for 116 yards and Marshall rushing eight times for 105.

Malcolm Mitchell was Georgia's leading receiver with 47 yards on five catches. Georgia outgained the Tigers 497-238 with 24 first downs to Auburn's 11.

The Bulldogs also converted 8-of-14 third downs.

The Bulldogs marched straight down the field on their first possession, taking a 7-0 lead on a six-yard completion from Murray to Chris Conley with 10:51 to play in the first quarter. The scoring opportunity was set up by a 49-yard rush down the left sideline by Gurley on his first carry of the game.

Georgia doubled its lead to 14-0 late in the opening quarter, driving 80 yards in nine plays and scoring on Murray's second touchdown pass of the night, this time to Mitchell for five yards. It was 21-0 after the Bulldogs' first drive of the second quarter that spanned 64 yards in nine plays, capped by another Murray TD pass to Marlon Brown.

The Bulldogs kept mixing the run and the pass on their fourth possession, taking a 28-0 lead on a 6-yard run by Todd Gurley after a five-play, 90-yard drive. The key play of the drive was a Murray-to-King connection for 55 yards

GAME 1

Auburn opened the Gus Malzahn era with a 31-24 win over Washington State at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The two teams played a see-saw first half, which saw five lead changes and 46 total points before Auburn pulled out the victory.

Auburn rushed for 295 yards on 46 carries, led by Corey Grant's 146, which included a 75-yard touchdown run in the second quarter which helped give Auburn a lead it would hold onto for the rest of the game.

Nick Marshall finished 10-for-19 for 99 yards. Sammie Coates (44 yards) and Quan Bray (28 yards) each had three catches.

Auburn's defense collected three interceptions on the night, two by Robenson Therezie, including one in the end zone as Washington State was driving late in the fourth quarter for a tying score.

Washington State struck first, taking a 7-0 lead on a Jeremiah Laufasa 4-yard run, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

Auburn took its first lead of the game when Ryan White's two-point conversion run made it 8-7 following a Tre Mason 8-yard scoring run. The touchdown the 10th of Mason's career while the successful twopoint conversion was Auburn's first since Lee Guess caught a Carl Stewart pass at Alabama in 2006.

Washington State took a 14-8 lead with 8:02 left in the first half on a Connor Halliday 7-yard touchdown pass to Bobby Ratliff, capping off a nine-play, 67-yard drive. The lead was short-lived, however, as Mason returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for the game-tying score. A successful Cody Parkey extra-point put Auburn ahead, 15-14.

Mason's 100-yard kick return tied for the second-longest in school history and marks the sixth consecutive season in which Auburn has returned at least one kickoff for a touchdown, tied for the third-longest active streak in the nation.

Washington State wasted little time answering Mason's return, going 75 yards in just 1:28 to reclaim the lead, 21-15, with 6:18 left in the half. Halliday hit Ratliff for a 53-yard pass down to the 1-yard line before Laufasa carried it in for his second score of the day.

Grant's 75-yard touchdown run on the first play following the WSU

score tied it and a Parkey

extra point gave Auburn the lead for good, 22-21.

A career-long 47-yard field goal by Parkey with 1:11 left in the first half put Auburn ahead, 25-21.

The two teams traded field goals during the third quarter as Parkey's 26-yarder extended Auburn's lead to 28-21 while an Andrew Furney 43-yard kick made it 28-24 with 4:18 left in the quarter. That was the only scoring in the quarter.

Parkey's third field goal of the day, a 42-yard kick with 9:07 left in the game, extended the lead to the final seven-point margin, 31-24.

GAME 2

Nick Marshall threw for 147 yards and two touchdowns and tailbacks Tre Mason, Corey Grant and Cameron Artis-Payne each scored a rushing touchdown as Auburn (2-0) cruised to a 38-9 win over Arkansas State (1-1) at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Artis-Payne, finishing the night with 102 yards on 19 carries, led an Auburn rushing attack that finished with 301 yards on the ground.

Marshall finished the night 10-for-17, connecting with seven different receivers, as Auburn led from start to finish.

Mason finished the game with 99 yards on 14 carries, including an 11-yard touchdown in the third quarter that put Auburn up 28-9, while Artis-Payne's 12-yard touchdown run came in the fourth quarter and was the final score of the game.

Marshall's first career touchdown pass landed in the hands of Marcus Davis for an 18-yard score to put Auburn up a touchdown just 3:23 into the game. The catch was the first of the season for Davis.

After a Brian Davis field goal cut the lead to 7-3, Grant rushed 17 yards around right end to cap an 8-play, 85-yard drive to put Auburn ahead, 14-3. The touchdown marked the second straight week that Grant carried a touchdown in, marking the first Auburn player since Onterio McCalebb in 2009 to score in each of the first two Auburn games of a season. Mason would later join Grant in the accomplishment.

Marshall found Sammie Coates just 2:20 before halftime for a 68-yard touchdown strike that extended Auburn's lead to 21-3. The catch was the longest of Coates' career.

Davis hit a 21- and a 42-yard field goal in the third quarter for Arkansas State, cutting the margin to 12 at 21-9 before Mason's third touchdown of the season gave Auburn a 28-9 lead with just 1:14 left in the third quarter.

Cody Parkey's 35-yard field goal with 8:46 left in the game extended the lead to 31-9. It capped off an 11-play, 62-yard drive that lasted 5:12, its longest of the game by both time and number of plays.

Chris Davis finished with a career-high 10 tackles for Auburn, including seven solo, 1.5 sacks, two pass break ups and one forced fumble.

GAME 3

Nick Marshall hit C.J. Uzomah for a 11-yard touchdown pass with just 10 seconds left in the game as Auburn rallied to defeat Mississippi State, 24-20, at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Marshall finished the night with 339 yards passing and two touchdowns as Auburn moved to 3-0 (1-0 SEC) on the season.

Facing a 3rd-down and 10 on the Mississippi State 25-yard line, Marshall rushed over left end for 11 yards and a key first down to keep Auburn's final drive alive. Two plays later, Marshall connected with Uzomah, who finished with three catches for 48 yards, for the gamewinner. Auburn's drive had started on its own 12-yard line with just 1:56 on the clock.

Marshall, who finished 23-34 with two touchdown and two interceptions, had the first 300-yard passing game by an Auburn quarterback since Cam Newton threw for 335-yards in the 2010 SEC Championships Game against South Carolina.

Marshall connected with nine different receivers in the game, with Quan Bray leading the team in yards with 80, while Marcus Davis led the team in receptions with six, totaling 43 yards.

Mississippi State (1-2, 0-1 SEC) had taken its first lead of the game, 20-14, when Dak Prescott scored his second rushing touchdown of the game, a 2-yard scamper just 2:22 into the third quarter.

Cody Parkey's 47-yard field goal, which tied a career long, cut the lead to 20-17 with 9:53 left in the third quarter.

A Parkey 40-yard field goal and a Bray 76 yard touchdown reception helped Auburn jump out to an early 11-0 lead. Instead of kicking the extra point following Bray's catch from Marshall, Auburn successfully went for the 2-point conversion for the second time this season. Bray's reception was the first touchdown catch of his career while the 76-yard connection tied for the 19th-longest in Auburn history and was the longest since Newton hit Terrell Zachery for an 80-yard touchdown against Chattanooga in 2010.

Mississippi State cut the lead to 11-6 as Jameon Lewis rushed for

GAME 4

In the first loss of the Gus Malzahn era, LSU's Jeremy Hill rushed for a career-high 184 yards and three touchdowns as No. 6 LSU defeated Auburn 35-21 on a rainy Saturday night in Tiger Stadium.

Playing in inclement conditions throughout the night, both teams were forced into a ground game with Auburn (3-1, 1-1 SEC) totaling 213 rushing yards to LSU's 228. Auburn out-rushed LSU 140-74 after halftime.

Tre Mason led the way on the ground for Auburn with 132 yards on 26 carries and two touchdowns. He was the third different 100-yard rusher for Auburn in 2013 joining teammates Corey Grant and Cameron Artis-Payne.

The performance was his first 100-yard game since Alabama A&M in 2011 and the fourth of his career. It was his first 100-yard rushing game against an SEC opponent in his career.

Auburn opened the second half with an interception by safety Jermaine Whitehead of LSU quarterback Zach Mettenberger. The pick was the first of the season by Whitehead and his first since 2011.

The Tigers followed up the interception with a two-yard touchdown run by Mason. Mason later added another two-yard touchdown late in the fourth quarter to post his fourth career game with two rushing touchdowns.

The score capped a 10-play, 94-yard drive that included a 52-yard throw from Nick Marshall to Sammie Coates - the longest play surrendered by the LSU defense in 2013. Marshall completed 17-of-33 passes for 224 yards with two interceptions. He also rushed for 46 yards on 14

Artis-Payne added a 12-yard touchdown late in the fourth quarter. He finished with 41 yards on seven carries.

Coates finished with a career-best 139 yards on four receptions to become Auburn's first 100-yard receiver of the season. Ricardo Louis had a career-high five catches.

Mettenberger finished the game 14-of-22 for 229 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Jarvis Landry had seven receptions

for 118 yards to lead LSU.

Cassanova McKinzy led Auburn with eight tackles, 1.5 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. Robenson Therezie also totaled eight tackles.

Auburn raced out to a 17-point first half lead and then held off an Ole Miss second-half rally as Auburn defeated the No. 24 Rebels, 30-22, on Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Quarterback Nick Marshall finished with 140 yards rushing as Auburn moved to 4-1, 2-1 SEC on the season.

Auburn's defense played a key role in the win, sacking the Ole Miss (3-2, 1-2 SEC) quarterbacks six times and also intercepting two passes. Robenson Therezie had one of the two picks for the Auburn defense, returning a Bo Wallace second-quarter pass 78 yards for a touchdown and a 13-3 Auburn lead late in the first quarter.

The six sacks by the Auburn defense were the most for an Auburn defensive unit since it registered 11 quarterback sacks against Alabama in 2005.

Auburn jumped out to a 20-3 lead on the back of touchdown runs from Tre Mason and Marshall and Therezie's pick-six. Mason's 1-yard rush capped off a six-play, 80-yard drive early on Auburn's first drive to put it up 6-0 while Marshall pushed the lead to 20-3 with a 5-yard touchdown run with 5:17 left in the first half to cap an 8-play, 80-yard drive.

Ole Miss scored on a pair of first half field goals. Andrew Ritter hit on a 42-yard field goal in the first quarter and then a 44-yarder with 41 seconds left in the half to make it 20-6 in Auburn's favor at the half.

Ritter connected on a 22-yard field goal early in the third quarter to cut it 20-9 only to have Marshall answer with his second rushing touchdown of the game, a 5-yard run as Auburn went up 27-9 with 6:35 left in the third

Ole Miss wouldn't go away quietly as Wallace hit Donte Moncrief for a 49-yard touchdown pass with 5:55 to go in the third and a 13-yard touchdown pass with 8:29 to go in the fourth to make it 27-22.

The two teams traded turnovers in the fourth quarter following the second Wallace to Moncrief connection. Auburn's Cameron Artis-Payne had the ball stripped for a fumble following an 18-yard run to give Ole Miss the ball at its own 40-yard line but Ole Miss gave it back just three plays later when Ryan Smith intercepted a Wallace pass in the flat.

After a 3-and-out by the Auburn offense, Auburn punter Steven Clark pinned Ole Miss at its own 1-yard line with a 39-

Corey Grant (Washington State), Artis-Payne (Arkansas State) and Mason (LSU) have also had 100-vard rushing nights, marking the first time Auburn has had four different 100-yard single-game rushers in a season.

Jeremy Johnson threw for four touchdowns and completed 17-of-21 passes in his first career start as Auburn (5-1) cruised to a 62-3 win over Western Carolina (1-6). Auburn accounted for a school-record 712 yards of total offense on the day, which included 511 yards rushing, the third-most rushing total in school history.

Johnson and Auburn jumped out to a 42-3 halftime lead while holding the ball for 12:29 seconds, scoring on six of its seven first-half possessions. The true freshman finished with 201 yards passing, 183 of it in the first half, hitting eight different receivers while also carrying it for 26 yards on three carries.

Tre Mason finished with 100 yards rushing, his second 100-yard rushing game of the season and the fifth of his career. He scored on a 20-yard on Auburn's first possession of the game and later scored on a 53-yard run that put Auburn up 35-3 with 7:46 left in the first half to give him seven rushing touchdowns this season.

Cameron Artis-Payne also topped 100 yards on the ground, carrying it seven times for 133 yards. His 25-yard touchdown run up the middle midway through the third quarter extended Auburn's lead to 56-3.

Corey Grant carried it five times for 83 yards, scoring on a 51-yard run that put Auburn up 28-3 with 13:54 left in the second quarter. Johnathan Ford (2 carries, 45 yards) also had a rushing touchdown, scoring on a 38-yard run up the middle just 10 seconds into the final quarter, while Chandler Shakespeare finished with 61 yards on 10 carries, all of it coming in the fourth quarter.

Auburn's rushing total was its most since it ran for 526 yards against Furman in 1946 while the school record is 565 yards rushing against Southwest Louisiana in 1985.

Johnson hit Jay Prosch for an 8-yard score on Auburn's second possession of the game, the first career passing and receiving touchdown for the duo. On Auburn's next possession Johnson hit Ricardo Louis for a 46-yard touchdown strike to extend the Auburn lead to 21-3.

Quan Bray led the Auburn receivers with four catches while Louis' 53 yards were tops on the team. Bray caught a 3-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter for his first receiving touchdown of the season while

Tony Stevens, who caught three passes for 47 yards, scored on a 22-yard pass with just 1:38 left before the half.

Auburn tallied nine touchdowns on the afternoon (five rushing, four receiving), with eight different players scoring.

Kris Frost and Anthony Swain tied for the teamhigh in tackles with three each while Dee Ford, Justin DeLaine, Jabrian Niles and Elijah Daniel each recorded a sack for Auburn's defense, which allowed just 173 yards of total offense to Western Carolina.

Jonathon Mincy had an interception for the Auburn defense, its seventh of the season and the first of his career.

Senior defensive end Dee Ford sacked Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Manziel twice in the final three plays to force seventh-ranked Texas A&M into a turnover on downs with 11 seconds remaining as No. 24 Auburn knocked off the Aggies 45-41 on Saturday at Kyle Field.

The win was the first for Auburn over a ranked opponent on the road since October 10, 2011 at No. 10 South Carolina.

Tre Mason put the Tigers (6-1, 3-1) ahead with just over a minute remaining with a five-yard touchdown run. The junior running back finished with 178 yards rushing on a career-high 28 attempts for his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and third of the season.

Auburn fell behind 34-24 in the first minute of the fourth quarter, but stormed back scoring 21 points in the final stanza on three-straight possessions.

Quarterback Nick Marshall scored his second rushing touchdown of the day from 13 yards out before Cameron Artis-Payne found pay dirt on a 2-yard run to take a 38-34 lead.

Manziel then put the Aggies on top 41-38 with five minutes remaining with his 1-yard touchdown plunge setting the stage for Auburn's final drive.

Auburn converted three third downs on the final drive included an impressive 27-yard connection from Marshall to freshman wide receiver Marcus Davis on a 3rd-and-9 down to the Texas A&M 12-yard line.

The Tigers finished the day 7-of-14 on third down. After converting its first third down attempt, Auburn held the Aggies to just one of its next five leading to a 5-of-13 afternoon.

Marshall finished the day 11-of-23 for 236 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing 20 times for 100 yards and two scores. It was his second career 100-yard rushing performance.

Sammie Coates was the leading receiver with 104 yards on five catches and a 43-yard score. Quan Bray also had a 13-yard touchdown to go

Auburn kept the ball on the ground for each of its first 14 plays, gaining 165 yards and scoring three touchdowns en route to a 45-10 win over Florida Atlantic on Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn finished the game with 422 yards rushing and 628 yards of total offense, marking the third time this season Auburn has gone over 600 yards of total offense in a game.

Tre Mason, Corey Grant and Nick Marshall all scored for Auburn (7-1) in the first quarter. Mason scored on an 8-yard run, Grant on a 43-yard run and Marshall on a 10-yard run as Auburn raced out to the 21-point lead. Auburn finished the first quarter with 186 yards rushing on 18 carries for a 10.3 yards per rush mark.

When Auburn did throw a pass, Jeremy Johnson, who had come in for an injured Nick Marshall, hit Sammie Coates for a 36 yard touchdown pass as Auburn extended its lead to 28-0 with 13:55 left in the first half. Auburn ended the first half with 440 total yards and a 38-7 lead.

Johnson finished the game 10-for-16 for 192 yards with two touchdowns and an interception. Both of his touchdown passes went to Coates, who also hauled in a 67-yard touchdown catch with 3:10 to go

Cameron Artis-Payne scored Auburn's final rushing touchdown of the game, his fifth of the season, midway through the third quarter.

Ten different players contributed to Auburn's 422 yards rushing with Artis-Payne leading the way with 93 yards, Grant with 75, Marshall with 73 and Mason with 60.

The 422 yards rushing gave Auburn 2,523 rushing yards on the season, which is the most it has gained in an entire season since it finished the 2010 season with 3,987 yards on the ground.

Florida Atlantic (2-6) was held to 247 yards of total offense, marking the second time this season Auburn has held an opponent under 250 yards of total offense in a game.

Tre Mason rushed for 168 yards and a career-best four touchdowns to lead No. 8 Auburn to a 35-17 win over Arkansas on Saturday at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Mason finished the night with a career-best 32 carries as the Tigers improved to 8-1 (4-1 SEC) on the year. His 168 yards rushing were the third-best performance of his career.

After Arkansas (3-6, 0-5 SEC) had scored back-to-back touchdowns to pull within 11 points in the fourth quarter, Mason led the Tigers to a response with a 12-yard touchdown run, his fourth of the night, with 10:17 left in the game.

The touchdown stretched Auburn's lead to 35-17 and marked the first time an Auburn player rushed for four or more touchdowns since Cam Newton against Kentucky in 2010.

The Tigers got on the board first with a 9-yard touchdown run by Mason with 2:35 left in the first quarter. Auburn took over with a short field after Kris Frost recovered an Arkansas fumble at the Razorbacks' 29-yard line.

Following a field goal by Arkansas, Auburn covered up an attempted onside kick and again converted the short field with six points. The drive was punctuated by a 4-yard touchdown run from Mason, who carried 13 times for 93 yards in the first half.

The Tigers came up with a huge goal line stand late in the second quarter with JaViere Mitchell making stops at the 1-yard line on third and fourth downs as Auburn forced the Hogs to turn it over on downs.

Mason kept running hard as the second half began and the junior scored his third touchdown of the day from 5 yards out to cap an 11-play, 65-yard drive. The drive included Auburn quarterbacks Nick Marshall and Jeremy Johnson completing 4-of-4 passes.

The Tigers stretched their lead to 28-3 on an 88-yard touchdown throw and catch from Marshall to Sammie Coates. The season for Auburn and third-longest pass in scho

Seventh-ranked Auburn used a pair of special teams touchdowns and a career day rushing by quarterback Nick Marshall to defeat Tennessee 55-23 on Saturday at Neyland Stadium.

Auburn's 55 points were the most scored by either team in the series, a total that ranks third all-time in program history for points on the road in

Marshall rushed for a career-best 214 yards and two touchdowns, tying Bobby Hunt (1959) for the third-best rushing performance by a quarterback in program history.

Additionally, Running back Tre Mason eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing on a 10-yard run in the third quarter for his second-straight season over the plateau. He finished with 117 yards and three touchdowns.

The Tigers rushed for 444 yards on 53 attempts as a team, the most ever by the program in an SEC game. It was Auburn's fifth game with more than 300 yards rushing this season.

Tennessee sandwiched an Auburn touchdown with a pair of field goals to tie the game at six with three minutes left in the first quarter. Marshall found C.J. Uzomah for the 25-yard Auburn score, but Cody Parkey's extra point was blocked.

The two teams combined for 42 points in the second quarter as Auburn took a 34-20 lead into the break.

Mason rumbled 13-yards for a score to knot the game at 13-all after Tennessee's Raijon Neal had given the Vols the lead in the opening seconds of the second quarter. Mason's touchdown began a streak of 21 unanswered points for the Tigers that also included an 85-yard punt return touchdown by Chris Davis and a 7-yard touchdown scamper by Marshall.

The punt return for Davis was the longest for Auburn since 1970 and the third-longest in school history. It was the first punt return for a touchdown since Robert Dunn scored against ULM in 2008.

After a pick-six for the Vols, Marshall redeemed himself with a 38-yard scoring run with 51 seconds remaining in the half to give Auburn the 34-20 lead. The junior had a career-best 164 rushing yards in the first half, the fourth most in the first half by a player in Auburn history and tied for fifth most in either half by an individual.

The Tigers opened the second half with a 90-yard kickoff return touchdown by Corey Grant, the first of his career. The score widened Auburn's advantage to 41-20 and marked the first time in program history the Tigers had returned a kickoff and punt for a touchdown in the same game.

Auburn finished with an average of 44.85 yards on seven kick and punt returns to set a new NCAA record. The Tigers' average eclipsed the mark of 41.8 yards set by Florida State against Virginia Tech in 1974.

Mason scored his second touchdown of the game with 7:52 left in the third quarter on a run from four yards out. The touchdown pushed Auburn's lead to 48-23.

He later added his third touchdown of the day from one-yard out with 13 minutes to go in the game for his second game with three or more touchdowns this season

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The most recent addition to the stadium was the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug"

Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 20 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 28

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.4 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its inception in 1939 and

hold an overall record of 294-74-7 there.


