## FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES ROAD SWING AT SEC FOE AUBURN

Florida State, which has won a season-high tying four consecutive games, plays its final non-conference game of the regular season as it travels to play at Auburn of the Southeastern Conference on Wednesday, January 2, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. EST (NOTE TIME CHANGE) at the Auburn Arena in Auburn, Ala. The game is the third of five consecutive games away from Tallahassee which sees the Seminoles play in five different states in a span of 18 days. The Seminoles have won the first two games of the road swing -- at Charlotte (79-76, December 22), against Tulsa (82-63, December 29 in Sunrise, Fla.) -- and will travel to play at Auburn, at Clemson to begin ACC play (January 5) and at Maryland (January 9) before returning home to play host to North Carolina at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (January 12). Florida State's four-game winning streak matches a four-game winning streak it enjoyed from November 12 (95-68 win over Buffalo) through November 21 (75-67 win over North Florida).

## FLORIDA STATE VS. AUBURN -- A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State closes out its non-conference schedule and opens up the 2013 calendar year as it travels to play at Auburn on January 2, 2013 at the Auburn Arena in Auburn, Ala. It marks the third consecutive season the Seminoles and the Tigers will meet with both teams winning on their home courts in the last two meetings. The Seminoles and the Tigers have a long playing history beginning in the late 1960s. The Seminoles and the Tigers have met 30 times with Auburn holding a 22-8 series advantage. The Seminoles' game against Auburn will mark the second SEC team (Florida on December 5) that the Seminoles will compete against before starting conference play on Jan. 5 at Clemson.

## FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD

Florida State will play its first true road game of the season as it travels to play at Auburn on Wednesday. The Seminoles have played four of their 12 games away from Tallahassee with two coming at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. (wins over BYU and Saint Joseph's), one coming at the Time Warner Cable Arena in Charlotte, N.C. (win over Charlotte) and one coming at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla., (win over Tulsa). Including Wednesday's game on campus against Auburn, the Seminoles play 10 of their final 19 games of the regular season away from home.

## ALL-AMERICAN SNAER HITS THE TRIFECTA

All-American Michael Snaer was named the Most Valuable Player of the Seminoles' win over Tulsa in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 29. It marked the third MVP award of the calendar year for Snaer who was named the MVP of the 2012 ACC Tournament and the MVP of the 2012 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

## ALL-AMERICAN SNAER CONTINUES HIS TORRID STREAK

All-American Michael Snaer was named the Most Valuable Player of the Seminoles' win over Tulsa on December 22. For Snaer it continued a torrid streak which has seen him score at least 19 points in three consecutive games, score a career-high 30 points in the Seminoles' 79-76 win over Charlotte, and averages 22.7 points per game since Florida State's 91-59 win over Maine on December 12. In those three games, Snaer has made nine 3-point field goals (9-22, .409 percent) and 21 free throws (21-28, .750 percent) while totaling seven steals and seven assists.

## ALL-AMERICAN SNAER IN THE ACC STATISTICS

All-American Michael Snaer is ranked third in 3-point field goals made (24), fourth in 3-point percentage (.407), fifth in scoring (16.1 ppg), seventh in free throw percentage (.814), 10<sup>th</sup> in minutes played per game (32.0) and 22<sup>nd</sup> in rebounding (5.3 rpg) in the ACC statistics.

## LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Auburn and win its season high fifth consecutive game of the season. It would mark the fourth time in the last two seasons that the Seminoles will have earned winning streaks of at least five games.

...Defeat Auburn and gain a win over a team from the SEC for the second consecutive season and for the fifth time in the last six seasons;

...Defeat Auburn and raise its true road record to 14-10 (.583 winning percentage) in the last three seasons. The Seminoles are the third winning road team in the ACC since the start of the 2008-09 season;

...Defeat Auburn and break a three-game losing streak at Auburn -- the Seminoles have not won at Auburn since December 4, 1978.

**FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST EIGHT YEARS**

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last eight years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played with 163 wins. The Seminoles average 22.3 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12) and 8-4 (2012-13).

**SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE**

With seven regulars in the Seminoles' line-up shooting better than 70 percent from the free throw line, the Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Auburn as the ACC leader in free throw shooting percentage. Under head coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have developed into one of the top free throw shooting teams and led the ACC from the free throw line in both 2007 and 2008. This season, with a .731 mark from the free throw line during the first 12 games of the season, the Seminoles have shot better than 70 percent from the free throw line in four of their last five and nine of the 12 games this season.

**SEMINOLES AGGRESSIVE IN GETTING TO THE LINE WINS**

Florida State has made as many or more free throws than its opponents have attempted in six of its eight wins. The Seminoles average 24.4 free throw attempts in their eight wins (shooting .749 percent) while averaging 23.8 free throw attempts during their four losses (shooting .695 percent). The Seminoles have won two games – against Saint Joseph's (seven made free throws to 26 attempts for Saint Joseph's) and against Maine (16 made free throws to 18 attempts for Maine). For the season, Florida State has made 53 more free throws than its opponents while attempting 59 free throws more than its opponents.

**FLORIDA STATE IN ITS LAST FOUR WINS**

Florida State is averaging a +17.3 margin of victory in its last three games – all wins over Maine (91-59, +32), Louisiana Monroe (63-48, +15), Charlotte (79-76, +3) and Tulsa (82-63, +19).

**SEMINOLES GETTING IT DONE IN THE SECOND HALF LATELY**

Florida State has played its best basketball in the second halves of its last four games – all wins. The Seminoles have outscored their last four opponents (Maine, +18; Louisiana Monroe, +10; Charlotte, +6; Tulsa, +16) by an average of +12.5 points in the second half to take four straight wins. The Seminoles rallied from a halftime deficit (40-35, -5 against Charlotte) to gain their seventh win of the season on December 22 in Charlotte.

**FLORIDA STATE GOING TO THE BOARDS**

Florida State enjoyed a +12 rebound margin (44-32) in its victory over Tulsa in the Orange Bowl Classic on Saturday in Sunrise, Fla. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles had earned a rebound margin of 12 rebounds or better - +14 (43-29) in their 75-67 win over North Florida (November 21), +12 in their 63-48 win over Louisiana Monroe (December 17) and +12 in their win over Tulsa (December 22). Florida State is one of only two teams (also Georgia Tech) with three players (Terrance Shannon, 13<sup>th</sup>; Okaro White, 16<sup>th</sup> and Michael Snaer 22<sup>nd</sup>) in the top 25 of the ACC statistics for rebounding. Florida State pulled down a season high 44 rebounds in its win over the Danny Manning-led Golden Hurricane of Tulsa.

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE BONUSPHERE**

Florida State has made at least five 3-point field goals in 11 of its 12 games this season and averages 6.8 made 3-point field goals per game – the Seminoles ranked fifth in the ACC with a 6.2 made 3-point field goal average last season.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. AUBURN – THE LAST TIME**

Paced by Michael Snaer's 22 points, Florida State built a 50-16 lead at halftime and defeated Auburn 85-56 on January 4, 2012 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Ten of Snaer's points came from the free-throw line where he was a perfect 10-for-10. Snaer's perfection after drawing the foul was a team-wide characteristic against Auburn. The Seminoles hit 22 of their 26 free throw attempts against their SEC foe. Ian Miller scored 15 points off the bench and starter Xavier Gibson added 12 points, five rebounds and a game-best four blocks. Luke Loucks added eight points and six assists, Bernard James had four points, eight rebounds and three blocks, Okaro White scored six points while Jon Kreft grabbed eight rebounds to go along with his four points. Florida State shot 53.7 percent from the field against Auburn. Auburn was held to just 32.3 percent shooting and was out-rebounded 45-30.

**FLORIDA STATE TO PLAY IN 2013 PUERTO RICO TIP-OFF TOURNAMENT**

Florida State will play in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off Tournament Nov. 21-24, 2013 in San Juan, Puerto Rico. The Seminoles will be joined by Auburn, Charlotte, Georgetown, Kansas State, Long Beach State, Michigan and Virginia Commonwealth in the eight team tournament. It will mark the first time the Seminoles will play a tournament in Puerto Rico. Oklahoma State defeated NC State, 76-56, to win the championship of the 2012 Puerto Rico Tip-Off Classic.

**FLORIDA STATE SECOND IN THE ACC IN STEALS**

Florida State, which has earned at least eight steals in each of its last four games, is ranked second in the ACC with a 7.8 steals per game average. The Seminoles are 6-1 in games when they have earned eight or more steals in a game. The Seminoles are ranked just behind North Carolina in steals (9.5-7.8) as they look to lead the ACC in steals for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles led the ACC in both steals (7.8 spg) and blocked shots (6.1 bpg) during the 2011-12 season.

**FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING TRENDS**

Florida State is 4-0 when its scores 80 or more points, 6-0 when it scores 75 or more points and 7-1 (with seven consecutive wins) when its scores 70 or more points in a game this season. The Seminoles' topped Louisiana Monroe in scoring 63 points in a 63-48 win over the Warhawks.

The Seminoles, as they have throughout the season, have held onto the basketball much better in the second half as compared to the first half as they average 6.5 turnovers in the second half as compared to 9.3 turnovers in the first halves of its first 12 games of the season.

**FLORIDA STATE AT HALFTIME THIS SEASON**

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Auburn with a 7-0 record when it leads at halftime. The Seminoles recovered from a 40-35 halftime deficit against Charlotte as they outscored the 49ers, 44-46, in the second half to gain their 79-76 win on December 22. It marked the second time since its victory over Saint Bonaventure in the 2012 NCAA Tournament that the Seminoles recovered from a halftime deficit to win a game. Florida State trailed the Bonnies by a 34-28 score before rallying for a 66-63 win. The win advanced the Seminoles to the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

**SNAER TURNING THINGS ON IN THE SECOND HALF**

Florida State freshman guard Aaron Thomas, who averaged 17.0 points and 4.5 rebounds while shooting .500 from the field (11 of 22) and .857 from the free throw line (12 of 14) as he played 68 total minutes (34.0 mpg) in two Seminole wins last week, was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on December 24, an award he shared with Oliver Hanlan of Boston College. Thomas made the first start of his career (in Florida State's win over Louisiana Monroe), made seven consecutive free throws and scored 22 of his 34 points (65 percent) in the second halves of the Florida State's two wins.

**FLORIDA STATE OFF TO STRONG START IN RECRUITING**

Two standout players – Xavier Rathan-Mayes (Scarborough, Ontario/Huntingdon Prep) and Jarquez Smith (Haddock, Ga./Jones County) – have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Florida State and play basketball for head coach Leonard Hamilton. Rathan-Mayes, the No. 24 ranked senior in the ESPN 100, is in second season at Huntington (W.V.) Prep. As a junior, Rathan-Mayes averaged 14.6 points, 4.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game while shooting 44 percent from 3-point range. Smith averaged a double double of 12 points, 10 rebounds and 5 blocked shots per game as a junior at Jones County High School. He earned All-Region First Team honors, was voted as the best defender in the region and selected to play in Georgia's North/South All-Star game. Smith led Jones County to the Georgia State AAAAA High School playoffs in 2012.

**HAMILTON IS THE ONLY COACH IN HISTORY**

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton is the only coach in college basketball history to be named as the Coach of the Year in both the ACC (2009 and 2012) and the Big East (1995 and 1999). Hamilton is the third winningest coach in Florida State basketball history and the second winningest coach in Miami basketball history.

**SNAER A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE**

# Shannon shines in Seminoles' win

SUNRISE — It had been the worst offensive stretch of his career.

Florida State junior forward Terrance Shannon had scored just 17 points in his last four games heading into Saturday afternoon's matchup against Tulsa at the BB&T Center.

He had hit just four of his previous 22 shots from the floor. And in the Seminoles' narrow win over Charlotte last Saturday, Shannon didn't make a single basket from the field and finished with three points, four fouls and four turnovers in 21 minutes.

"Coach (Leonard Hamilton) called me out and challenged me," Shannon said. "So I had to step up to the challenge. He was displeased with the way I had played the last few games so I had to step it up.

"I respect him and I respected everything he said. I knew if he was calling me out he was wanting me to respond."

Which is exactly what he did against the Golden Hurricanes.

Shannon hit his first three shots from the floor — all jumpers — on his way to a breakout 16-point, 10-rebound performance in the Seminoles' 82-63 victory.

"Terrance is consistent with his effort and energy," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "He wasn't very pleased (with his performance against Charlotte), but he affects the game with just his live body and his energy — moving, setting screens, creating havoc.

"Today the ball was falling for him. And he's worked very hard on his jumper and he's very confident in his scoring ability."

With good reason. Earlier in the year Shannon had a three-game stretch, against St. Joseph's, Minnesota and North Florida, where he averaged 14 points and nine rebounds per game.

But he suffered a "stinger" in his neck in the Florida loss and hadn't looked like the same player since.

Until Saturday.

"He's a very talented basketball player," Tulsa head coach Danny Manning said. "He comes in with a motor and he's able to give them second-chance opportunities on the offensive glass. He runs the floor hard. He rebound well. He played exceptionally well."

It was the type of performance senior teammate Michael Snaer expects to see every night from the Georgia native, who is just now rounding into normal shape according to Hamilton.

“If there is one element that we really, really need from our big guys it’s toughness,” Snaer said. “And that’s what he brings. We need him to bring that every single game.”

For Shannon’s part, he said he expects Saturday’s performance to be a springboard into the New Year.

“I feel like the second half of the season we’ve got to step it up,” he said. “So I want to be that driving force.”
