FOOTBALL BACK HOME AFTER OPEN DATE

» No. 18 Auburn (5-2, 2-1) returns after an open week to host No. 10 Ole Miss (6-1, 3-1) for an SEC West contest Saturday, October 30, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn. ESPN will televise the 6 p.m. CT matchup.

It's an All Auburn, All Orange Day and recognitions include the winners of the Jack Meagher (Rowdy Gaines), Walter Gilbert (Tucker Fredericksen) and the Pamela Wells Sheffield (Dr. June Henton) awards and the 2021 NCAA men's tennis doubles finalists Tad Maclean and Finn Murgett.

THE HARSIN DEBUT

» Head coach Bryan Harsin began his tenure on the Plains with a 60-10 victory over Akron. Harsin now holds an 81-26 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State).

Auburn's 60 points were the most by an Auburn coach in his first game; the previous best was 37 points in Gene Chizik's opener vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009. Auburn's 142 points in the first three contests set a new program record for the most points in a head coach's first three games.

SERIES HISTORY

» Auburn leads 34-11 all-time against Ole Miss. The Tigers have won five straight in the series, outscoring the Rebels 135-82 (34.0-22.0 ppg). Auburn leads 16-3 in Auburn and 13-3 in Oxford, while the series is tied 5-5 at neutral sites.

The Tigers were 35-28 winners in Oxford last year and 20-14 winners at Jordan-Hare Stadium during the 2019 season.

Eleven of the last 17 games in the series have been decided by double digits; Auburn has a 9-2 record in those games. Prior to the last 15 games, the previous five games were decided by eight points or fewer.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- John Samuel Shenker's 102-yard receving total at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn TE since 1994 (Andy Fuller vs. Florida)
- All-America kicker Anders Carlson ranks fourth in the SEC in scoring at 9.0 points per game. He is now third in Auburn career scoring with 338 points
- Auburn is 32nd nationally in rushing defense at 122.9 yards allowed per game; four of the first seven opponents have been held to fewer than 100 yards rushing
- >> Auburn is second in the SEC and is 10th nationally in team TFL at 8.0 per game (56 total for the season)
- Auburn is the only SEC team with three players with at least 4.0 sacks this season: Eku Leota, Derick Hall and Colby Wooden

- >> Jarquez Hunter's school-record 94-yard TD run vs. Alabama State is the third-longest run nationally this season. He has 12 carries of 10 or more yards and seven of 20 yards or more
- Auburn's 248 points are the 11th-most scored through the first seven games of a season in program history; the highest total was 290 points in 1995
- Nehemiah Pritchett ranks eighth in the SEC in combined kick return yards. His 165 KOR yards vs. Georgia State were the seventh-most in a game in Auburn history
- Auburn is ninth nationally having allowed only seven sacks this season, including four games not allowing a sack
- Colby Wooden was SEC co-defensive lineman of the week with 4 tackles and 2 sacks at Arkansas

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson earned CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors for 2020, the 15th player so honored in Auburn history. Carlson graduated in December with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and is currently pursuing an MBA at Auburn. Carlson was a second-team All-American and a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2020.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» Auburn football had 17 representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. 2021 AUBURN FOOTBALL

IN OCTOBER

Auburn is 319-167-18 (.653) all-time in October. Auburn's October home record is 174-36-3 (.829). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 145-131-15 (.519) in October.

Auburn is 8-6-1 in games on October 30 alltime, 6-3 against SEC teams, 1-2 against ranked teams, 2-0 in home games and 2-0 against Ole Miss on that date.

TOTAL OFFENSE

- » Auburn's 248 points are the 11th-most scored through the first seven games of a season in AU history; the most was 290 points in 1995. This is the third season Auburn scored at least 60 points in each of its first two games, along with 1932 and 1922.
- » Auburn overcame double-digit deficits to win consecutive games for the first time since 2010. The Tigers trailed Georgia State 24-12 before scoring the game's last 22 points in a 34-24 victory, highlighted by a 13-play, 98-yard drive in the fourth quarter.

At LSU, Auburn was down 13-0 in the second quarter before rallying for a 24-19 victory, the Tigers' first win in Baton Rouge since 1999.

That was the Tigers' largest come-frombehind win on the road since the 2010 Iron Bowl. The game-winning drive totaled 92 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 1-yard Jarquez Hunter TD run with 3:11 remaining.

- Auburn's 1,151 yards of total offense through the first two games to start the season were the most in recorded history, surpassing the 2009 season (1,145).
- Since 2001, Auburn is 160-31 (.839) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 216-39-1 (.847) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 556-59-9 (.898) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 349-9 (.977) when scoring 30 points, 176-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

Auburn has scored in 111 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

- » Auburn piled up 613 total yards against Akron, 20th most in program history and the most since the Tigers gained 633 yards vs. Kent State in 2019. Those were the second most yards in an opener in program history. The most came against SW Louisiana in 1985 (695 yards).
- The duo of Jarquez Hunter and Tank Bigsby is averaging 145.4 rushing yards per game this season (1,018 total yards) and has totaled eight TD on the ground.

Bigsby has three 100-yard games this season, while Hunter has two. Hunter is averaging 8.63 yards per carry in his freshman season, the fourth-best of any FBS player this season.

Sophomore Tank Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games this season; that gave him four consecutive 100-yard rushing games back through last season, the first Auburn RB to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

The 48th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 1,000 career yards, he currently ranks 38th with 1,360 career yards and 11 career scores.

Against Alabama State, he rushed for 122 yards on 11 carries; his 51-yard run in the third quarter was a career long.

Against Akron, Bigsby led Auburn with 119 rushing yards and two scores in its season-opening win. He added 102 yards and two scores at Penn State.

In 12 career games where the sophomore has gotten double-digit carries, he has averaged 98.9 yards on the ground and scored all 11 of his career rushing TDs.

>> In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose aver-

age (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen.

Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993. He ranks 10th in the SEC this season at 5.16 yards per carry.

>> True freshman Jarquez Hunter already ranks 10th among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 484 yards through seven games.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. His run is third longest in the nation this season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

Against Akron, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was also the last freshman to open the season with back-to-back 100-yard games at Auburn (148, La Tech and 114, Miss St) in 2009.

- Shaun Shivers became Auburn's 49th career 1,000-yard rusher against Georgia; he now has 1,002 career rushing yards. Shivers' five receptions for 38 yards at LSU were both career highs for the senior.
- » T.J. Finley engineered a 13-play, 98-yard go-ahead scoring drive against Georgia State, culminating in a 10-yard fourth-down touchdown pass to Shedrick Jackson with just 0:45 remaining. Only six Auburn scoring drives since 1970 have been longer than 98 yards.
- >> In Auburn's win at LSU, Bo Nix made things happen both on the ground and through the air, rushing for 74 yards and a TD, and showing off his fancy footwork on a pair of fourth-down conversions where he scrambled from multiple would-be tacklers, finding Tyler Fromm for a touchdown and Demetris Robertson to keep alive a late second-quarter drive. Nix earned SEC offensive player of the week honors.

All three times Nix has faced LSU in his

All three times Nix has faced LSU in his career, he has scored at least one rushing and one passing touchdown.

Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards.

The junior passed his father, Patrick, who threw for 4,957 yards from 1992-95, after entering the night tied with him on the school's all-time career passing yardage list.

Going 20-22 with three TD passes against the Zips, Nix' pass efficiency rating of 240.91 was the second-best rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

» Nix is now 559-945 (59.2%) in his career for 6,445 yards and 36 passing scores.

He ranks third in career pass completions (559), second in career pass attempts (945), fourth in career passing yardage (6,445) and sixth in career TD passes (36).

Nix now has eight career games with a passing and rushing TD, passing Cam Newton (7) for the most such games among Auburn quarterbacks since 2000.

Nix recorded his fourth career game with three passing TDs against Akron. In the opener, Nix tied a career-best mark by completing 11 straight passes to begin the game. He previously completed 11 straight passes in Auburn's victory at Ole Miss in 2020.

- Nix threw a school record 256 consecutive passes without an interception dating back to last year's Iron Bowl before his interception against Georgia. The junior has now had three streaks of at least 100 passes without an interception in his career, including the previous school record 250 consecutive passes without an INT from 2019-20 and a streak of 118 in 2019.
- Nix has made 31 consecutive starts at quarterback back through the 2019 season opener. That's the fifth most consecutive starts by an Auburn signalcaller since 1969.

The top four in consecutive QB starts: 45, Stan White (1990-93); 34, Phil Gargis (1974-76); 33, Pat Sullivan (1969-71); 32, Jason Campbell (2002-04).

in the Georgia State game, one of four receptions against the Panthers.

Jackson led Auburn with five catches and 79 receiving yards against Akron. The senior totaled just 10 catches and 130 yards in his first three seasons at Auburn.

Sophomore Ja'Varrius Johnson caught the first three passes of his career for 51 yards, including a 34-yard TD, against the Zips. Sophomore Kobe Hudson caught a 28-yard TD for his first career score, and was Auburn's leading receiver against Penn State (66 yds) and Georgia State (76 yds).

Against Alabama State, Malcolm Johnson Jr. had his first career score on a 49-yard catch from transfer T.J. Finley, his first Auburn TD pass, and Sean Jackson scored his first career TD on a 4-yard rush.

» Graduate transfer Demetris Robertson scored his first Auburn touchdown in the second quarter against Alabama State, a 6-yard reception from Bo Nix. His second TD reception was 28 yards in the third quarter and he added a 36-yard rush for a third score, the first Auburn player with three TD in a game since JaTarvious Whitlow vs. Mississippi State in 2019. The last Tiger with two TD catches in a game was Seth Williams vs. Kentucky last season.

Robertson had a team-best six receptions for 60 yards in the win at LSU and a 71-yard TD catch at Arkansas. He leads the squad with 23 receptions for the season for 312 yards.

Tight end John Samuel Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker has had five catches in a game three times this season (vs. Akron for 38 yards and at Penn State for 62 yards).

His 20 catches this season rank him tied for seventh among the season leaders for receptions by a tight end at Auburn. His 268 yards this season are already fifth-most ever by an Auburn tight end.

Shenker is ninth in career catches by an

Auburn tight end with 35, and he is tenth in career tight end receiving yardage with 426.

FOR THE DEFENSE

- >> The Tigers are 32nd in rush defense (122.9 ypg), 29th in scoring defense (19.7 ppg) and 40th in total defense (340.6 ypg).
- >> The 10 points allowed by Auburn in the first two games of the season marked the fewest points the Tigers have allowed in any two-game span since giving up three points each vs. Ole Miss and Tennessee Tech in 2007.

That was the fewest points Auburn allowed in the first two games of a season since the Tigers opened the 1996 season with shutouts of UAB and Fresno State.

The shutout of Alabama State was the 244th all-time shutout for Auburn.

- The Auburn defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards. That marks the fewest rushing yards allowed since the 2001 Florida game (-36 yards). LSU rushed for 33 yards, Alabama State gained only 46 yards on the ground and Penn State was held to 94 yards rushing.
- >> Linebacker Zakoby McClain led the nation with 113 tackles in 2020, averaging 10.3 per game. That average ranked third in the SEC and 19th nationally. He was the first Auburn player to average 10 tackles per game since Dontarrious Thomas in 2001 (10.2 avg.).
- » McClain, a Lott IMPACT Trophy quarterfinalist, has 11 career double-figure tackle games (five last season) and he has led the Tigers in tackles 12 times in his career, including seven tackles in the opener vs. Akron, 10 against Alabama State, 12 at LSU and 15 at Arkansas.

The junior now has 225 tackles for his career, making him the 16th Auburn player since 2000 to record more than 200 career tackles.

McClain is looking to become Auburn's first player with 100+ tackles in back-to-back seasons since Takeo Spikes in 1996 (119) and 1997 (136).

- Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 59 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 163 total TD during that 72-game span (2.26 per game).
- » Bydarrius Knighten's interception of a fourth-down LSU pass with 1:09 remaining sealed Auburn's win at Tiger Stadium, giving Auburn four interceptions for the season.

Smoke Monday's 36-yard interception for a touchdown with 0:31 remaining sealed the win over Georgia State; it was the senior's third career pick six (also Tennessee, 2020, and Alabama, 2019).

Roger McCreary, who had a pick six against Alabama State, is the first Tiger to record interceptions in consecutive games since Jeremiah Dinson vs. Southern Miss and Mississippi State in 2018.

McCreary scored his first career touchdown with a 35-yard interception return against Alabama State; his interception at Penn State gives him six picks for his career.

Last season, McCreary was the first Auburn player to record three interceptions in a season since Joshua Holsey in 2016.

Auburn is 62-23 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 38-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 11-14 when it fails to force a turnover.

Preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks third in Auburn career scoring with 338 points.

He ranks fourth in the SEC in scoring at 9.0 points per game this season and leads the league with 1.71 field goals made per game.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is fourth in career PAT made (143) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (65).

He is 12-15 on field goal attempts and 27-28 on PAT this season.

Carlson made 20 of 22 field goal attempts last year, and has made 36 of his last 39 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

His 50-yard field goal vs. Northwestern was his fifth career FG of at least 50 yards:

- 53 Washington (2018)
- 53 Liberty (2018)
- 52 Alabama (2019)
- 50 Tennessee (2020)
- 50 Northwestern (2020)

In 2019, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

- >> With 812 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the alltime leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).
- Nehemiah Pritchett's 165 kickoff return yards against Georgia State was the seventhbest game total in Auburn history. Pritchett's 72-yard return was the longest by Auburn since Noah Igbinoghene (96 yards) in the 2020 Outback Bowl.

2021 AUBURN FOOTBALL

- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (160) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- » Barton Lester blocked a punt against Alabama State, Auburn's first of three blocked kicks this season.

Colby Wooden blocked an Alabama State field goal attempt; it was recovered by Nehemiah Pritchett for a 80-yard return and his first career score. It was Auburn's first blocked field goal for a touchdown since Neiko Thorpe vs. Kentucky in 2009 (69 yards).

Auburn blocked a punt and a field goal in the same game for the first time since the 2013 Alabama game.

Caylin Newton blocked a Georgia State punt returned by Barton Lester for a touchdown. The Tigers have recorded seven field goal blocks and eight punt blocks since the start of 2016.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

MORE FROM THE ARKANSAS GAME

- Oscar Chapman had two 57-yard punts at Arkansas, career longs.
- >> The Tigers have scored 30 or more points against the Razorbacks in nine straight games.
- >> This was the first SEC game when Auburn scored a touchdown on its opening drive since 2019 vs. Arkansas.
- Auburn's 38-23 win at Arkansas was its largest margin of victory over a ranked opponent on the road since knocking off No. 25 Texas A&M 26-10 in 2015. It was just the seventh time Auburn has defeated a ranked opponent by 15+ points on the road and just the third time an unranked Auburn team has done so.

- >> Auburn is outscoring opponents 53-10 in the fourth quarter in its five wins this season, including 24-0 in the Tigers' two SEC victories. In those two SEC wins, Auburn has outgained its opponents 249-89 in the final period.

Overall, the Tigers have outgained their opponents 539-209 in the fourth quarter in their five victories this season and have scored six offensive TDs while allowing just one score in the final quarter of those games.

In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 332-258-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 141-62-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-195-12 overall.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 257-70-6 (.781). Auburn has won 15 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

THE LAST TIME VS. OLE MISS **AUBURN 35, OLE MISS 28**

>> Bo Nix hit Seth Williams for a 58-vard touchdown pass with 1:11 to play to give Auburn a 35-28 comefrom-behind win at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Trailing by one point, Auburn drove 80 yards on six plays. Nix and Williams connected again for a two-point conversion pass that gave Auburn a seven-point lead.

Ole Miss drove to Auburn's 29 with 3 seconds remaining, but Jordyn Peters made an interception on the game's final play on which Ole Miss was penalized for passing beyond the line of scrimmage.

Early in the third Roger McCreary tackled Ole Miss kicker Luke Logan for a 4-yard-loss on a fake field goal after a special teams miscue had given the Rebels a short field.

After an Auburn punt, Ole Miss drove 89 yards on three plays, scoring on Matt Corral's 10-yard run to lead 21-14 at the 7:09 mark of the third quarter.

Auburn answered with a 10-play, 88-yard game-tying drive. Tank Bigsby ran for 19 yards on third-and-2, then Nix rolled right and threw high down the middle to Williams, who hauled in the pass at the Ole Miss 1-yard line. Shaun Shivers scored on the next play for a 21-21 tie with 2:57 to play in the third quarter.

The Tigers' defense delivered a key stop when Smoke Monday sacked Corral on third-and-5 to force an Ole Miss punt.

The Tigers then drove 80 yards on 11 plays to take the lead. Nix twice completed passes on third downs, first to Williams, then to John Samuel Shenker. Bigby stiff-armed a defender on an 18-yard TD run.

On the PAT attempt, Auburn was unable to cleanly convert the snap and hold, resulting in a 27-21 lead.

Bigsby rushed for 129 yards on 24 carries with two touchdowns.

Ole Miss drove for a touchdown to take a 28-27 lead with 5:43 to play, then forced a three-and-out from Auburn's offense. The Tigers defense responded with its own three-and-out to give the offense one more opportunity, setting the stage for the most recent Bo-to-Seth game-winner.

Nix completed 23 of 30 passes for 238 yards and a touchdown, adding 52 rushing yards on 10 carries and a TD. Williams led Auburn's receiving corps with eight catches for 150 yards and the game-winning touchdown, his fifth career 100-yard game.

Owen Pappoe led Auburn's defensive with 14 tackles. Smoke Monday made a career-high 12, including a sack, while Jamien Sherwood added



- >> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.
- >> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 81-26 overall as a head coach including one season at Arkansas State and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.
- >> His impressive resume at Boise saw him led the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.
- >> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.
- >> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.
- >> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.
- >> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.
- >> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 429 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 337, losing 86 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .793 against some of the best teams in college football.

Auburn kicked off the Bryan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the 2021 season opener.

Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on firstand-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0.

Nix found Ja'Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead. Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion.

The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his

second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half. Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up

Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

Bigsby eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in his career on his second carry of the second half, a 32-yard pickup. Shivers gave Auburn a 44-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown run, his second score of the night.

After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first Auburn touchdown on a 1-yard sneak to give the Tigers a 53-Ó lead. True freshman running back Jarquez Hunter began the drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

Making his first start in his 50th Auburn game, T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss. Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles. Marquis Burks made two of Auburn's six sacks. Moultry, Derick Hall, Colby Wooden and Marcus Harris also registered sacks.

The Tigers scored on their first eight possessions and did not punt until the 5:11 mark of the third quarter. Auburn welcomed the return of full stadium capacity, with 83,821 on hand to witness Harsin's debut.

Playing in front of the largest crowd ever to witness an Auburn football game, the No. 22 Tigers had two potential game-tying possessions in the final seconds before falling to No. 10 Penn State 28-20 Saturday at Beaver Stadium.

Trailing by eight with 7:02 to play, Auburn drove 73 yards in four minutes before an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal at PSU's 2-yard line with 3:08 left. Auburn's defense forced a punt, giving the Tigers another opportunity, starting at AU's 38yard line with 38 seconds left and no timeouts.

Bo Nix completed three passes to advance to PSU's 26, but his final throw fell incomplete against Penn State's prevent defense as time expired.

Tank Bigsby recorded his third 100-yard game of the season, rushing for 102 yards on 23 carries with two touchdowns. Freshman Jarquez Hunter added 63 yards on nine carries.

Auburn's defense stopped Penn State on fourth-and-1 on the opening drive to give the Tigers possession on Auburn's 44.

Bigsby rushed for 18 yards on the Tigers' first play and Anders Carlson gave Auburn a 3-0 lead with a 45-yard field goal. The Nittany Lions scored on Sean Clifford's 4-yard touchdown pass to Jahan Dotson to cap an 88-yard drive to lead 7-3

with 2:24 left in the first quarter.

Auburn answered with an 11-play, 75-yard drive, converting three third downs. Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards on third-and-2, then on third-and-12, Nix hit Kobe Hudson for 36 yards to PSU's 13.

Bigsby took over from there with three consecutive runs, completing the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run on third-and-1

to regain the lead for Auburn, 10-7 at the 12:28 mark of the second quarter.

Penn State responded with a 91-yard touchdown drive, reclaiming a 14-10 lead on Clifford's 2-yard pass to Brenton Strange with 1:23 remaining in the half.

Penn State took advantage of an Auburn turnover on the opening play of the second half, driving 20 yards in four plays and taking a 21-10 lead on Tyler Warren's 2-yard rush.

Trailing by 11, Auburn responded to the adversity with a run-oriented, 15-play drive, rushing 12 times for 59 yards, including

Bigsby's 6-yard touchdown run on a toss sweep to trim PSU's lead to 21-17 with 5:52 left in the third quarter.

Auburn then stopped Penn State short of a first down on a fake punt, leading to Carlson's 43-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter that pulled the Tigers within one point at 21-20.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead to 28-20 on Noah Cain's 3-yard run to cap a 75-yard drive with 10:48 to play, but Chandler Wooten's tackle for loss on third down forced a punt that led to the first of Auurn's two late scoring chances. Wooten led Auburn with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Backed up at its 2-yard-line and trailing 24-19 with 3:23 to play, Jarquez Hunter gave Auburn breathing room with an 18-yard run. Finley, who relieved Bo Nix in the second half, hit Kobe Hudson for 15 yards on third-and-11, then Finley rushed for 16 yards to cross midfield. Finley connected with Elijah Canion for 12 yards to GŚU's 30, then hit John Samuel Shenker for 19 yards to the 11 with 1:19 remaining.

Three plays netted 1 yard, setting up the stage for Finley and Jackson's fourth-down heroics. Facing a GSU blitz, Finley

avoided multiple rushers, stepping up in the pocket and firing off-balance to a leaping Jackson in the end zone to give Auburn a one-point lead in the final minute.

Finley hit Hudson for a 2-point conversion that gave Auburn a 27-24, then after an incomplete pass, Smoke Monday re-

Trailing 24-12 in the second half, Caylin Newton blocked a punt that Barton Lester recovered in the end zone for a touchdown that cut GSU's lead to 24-19 with 4:44 left in the third quarter. Auburn's defense forced four consecutive three-and-out's and shut out the Panthers in the second half.

Chandler Wooten made a career-high 12 tackles. T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high nine tackles, including two of Auburn's 10 tackles for loss.

Anders Carlson kicked four first-half field goals to account for Auburn's scoring before intermission.

After Georgia State took a 3-0 lead, Nehemiah Pritchett returned the kickoff 72 yards to set up Carlson's game-tying 41yard field goal. Auburn's defense delivered a three-and-out, leading to Carlson's 23-yard field goal that put the Tigers on top 6-3 after the

first quarter. The visiting Panthers produced three touchdown drives in the second quarter, the first on a 12-yard pass from Darren

Grainger to Jamari Thrash to retake a 10-6 lead.

Carlson's third field goal, a 28-yarder, trimmed GSU's lead to 10-9 with 9 minutes left in the half. Grainger threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Roger Carter to give Georgia State a 17-9 lead.

Bo Nix avoided four LSU rushers before finding Tyler Fromm for a 24-yard pass on fourth-and-2 for Auburn's first points, Jarquez Hunter scored a late touchdown, and Bydarrius Knighten's interception sealed Auburn's 24-19 comeback victory over LSU Saturday before 97,717 at Tiger Stadium.

Hunter capped a 92-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to give Auburn its first lead with 3:11 to play. Hunter's 44-yard run was the drive's key play. The freshman rushed for 65 yards on six carries.

Knighten intercepted LSU on fourth-and-6 with 1:09 to play to secure Auburn's first victory at Tiger Stadium since 1999.

Trailing 13-0 late in the second quarter, Nix rolled right, scrambled left and found Fromm running free in the end zone near the Auburn fan section, a highlight-reel play that energized the visitors' sideline.

Auburn trimmed LSU's lead to 13-10 before halftime on Anders Carlson's 49-yard field goal.

Nix completed 23 of 44 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown and added 74 rushing yards and a TD on 12 carries.

Cade York kicked a pair of field goals in the third quarter to give LSU a 19-10 lead heading to the final quarter.

Nix scored on a 5-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter to cap a nine-play, 75-yard drive and pull Auburn within two points at 19-17.

Tight ends figured prominently in Auburn's offense, with John Samuel Shenker making five catches for 102 yards and Fromm adding three for 40.

Zakoby McCain led the Tigers' defense with 12 tackles. Derick Hall added eight tackles and 1.5 sacks. After allowing a touchdown on LSU's first possession, Auburn kept LSU out of the end zone the rest of the game

LSU built a 13-0 lead on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Max Johnson to Kayshonn Boutte and a pair of York second-quarter field goals before Nix's razzle dazzle.

Auburn defeated Georgia State the previous week on a fourth-down touchdown pass from T.J. Finley to Shedrick Jackson.

burn's 26 on the Tigers' second possession to set up a game-tying field goal late in the first quarter.

Georgia scored back-to-back drives touchdowns early in the second quarter on Zamir White's 1-yard run and Stetson Ben-

nett's 3-yard pass to Adonai Mitchell to give the Bulldogs a 17-3 halftime lead. After the Bulldogs missed a field goal on their first drive of the third quarter, Auburn drove 34 yards to Georgia's 40-yard line before an incomplete pass on fourth down handed possession back to the Bulldogs.

Beigsby's touchdown pulled the Tigers within two scores but UGA outscored Auburn 10-0 in the final quarter.

Leading 31-23, the Tigers put away the game with a 12-play, 75-yard drive that chewed up 6 minutes and 11 seconds, culminating on Nix's 23-yard touchdown run with 2:30 to play.

Nix completed 21 of 26 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns, adding 42 rushing yards on five carries and a TD.
