FOOTBALL OPENS ROAD PLAY AT NO. 2 GEORGIA

Auburn (3-2, 1-1 SEC) plays its first road game of the 2022 season visiting No. 2 Georgia (5-0, 2-0 SEC) on Saturday, October 8, at Sanford Stadium in Athens, Ga. CBS will televise the 2:30 p.m. CT matchup, the 126th renewal of the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry.

SERIES HISTORY

Auburn trails the all-time series 56-62-8; the Bulldogs have won 16 of the last 21 games. Auburn owns a winning record in Athens (18-16) while Georgia has a winning mark on the Plains (18-12-2).
 Auburn is 17-22-1 against ranked Georgia teams all-time (8-8 in Athens), while the Bulldogs are 15-28-1 vs. the Tigers when they are ranked (13-6 in Athens).

This is only the eighth time the matchup has been played in October; prior to the 2020 season, the last was in 1936 (October 24).

The series is older than the Georgia-Georgia Tech (114 games) and the Auburn-Alabama series (86 games). Auburn and Georgia first met in 1892 at Atlanta's Piedmont Park; each first played its in-state rival in 1893.

The two teams did not play in 1943, because Auburn did not field a team due to World War II, and did not play in 1917 and 1918 because of WWI and the subsequent influenza outbreak. With those exceptions, Auburn and Georgia have played continuously since 1898.

>> Auburn is 82-41-6 all-time in road openers and 382-362-39 all-time in all games played away from Auburn. The Tigers have won 11 of their last 18 road openers.

The Tigers are 46-37-6 all-time in their SEC road openers and have won 20 of their last 26 SEC

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play in the overtime win against Missouri. Hall had three tackles for loss, two sacks, a 39-yard interception and six tackles overall in the 17-14 Auburn SEC opening victory

Hall also earned Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week honors and was a Lott IMPACT Trophy player of the week finalist for his play against Missouri

» Saturday will be the latest date the Tigers have begun road play in a season since 2016, when Auburn's first road game was October 8 at Mississippi State

Auburn leads the SEC in net punting at 44.11 yards, ranking sixth nationally

>> The Auburn-Georgia series is tied for the second-most played current FBS series entering this season [Minnesota-Wisconsin 131, North Carolina-Virginia 126]

Placekicker Anders Carlson is one of only 22 players from all divisions of college football named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for their efforts in community service. He is also a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, awarded to the top student-athlete in college football

Limiting LSU to only 85 yards through the air, Auburn held an SEC opponent to less than 100 yards passing for the first time since the 2019 Ole Miss game (99 yards)

THE GRADUATES

» On the 2022 Auburn roster, 17 players have already received bachelor's degrees: Marcus Bragg (Western Kentucky), Nick Brahms; Marquis Burks; Zach Calzada (Texas A&M); Anders Carlson; Brandon Council (Akron); Luke Deal; Alec Jackson; Shedrick Jackson; Morris Joseph Jr. (Memphis); Eku Leota (Northwestern); Barton Lester; Jacob Quattlebaum; John Samuel Shenker; Kameron Stutts; Austin Troxell; and Kilian Zierer.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms earned 2021 CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors, only the second time that Auburn has had two firstteam honorees in the prestigious program, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes. LB Gregg Carr and K/P Matt Hawkins were both first-team honorees in 1984. Carlson, a 2020 first team Academic All-American, is just the second two-time honoree in Auburn history, along with Hawkins (1984-85). Carlson graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and has since completed his MBA. Brahms graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.89 GPA in professional flight management and also completed his MBA.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 43 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2021 season, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Tank Bigsby, Jackson Billings, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Sammy Cohen, Luke Deal, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Alec Jackson, Tate Johnson, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Jake Levant, Trey Lindsey, Trent Mason, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith, Sawyer Pate, Jacob Quattlebaum, John Samuel Shenker, Wesley Steiner, Zykeivous Walker, Jeremiah Wright and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had six representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Cort Bradley, Jarquez Hunter, Donovan Kaufman, Kyle Vaccarella and Garrison Walker.

Auburn is 8-5-3 in games played on October 8 all-time, 3-3-2 against SEC teams and 5-3-2 away from Auburn on that date.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn has scored in 122 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 31.3 ppg (3,824 total points) during that stretch. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

The longest streak of not being shut out in program history is 149 games, beginning with a 55-16 victory over Richmond on Oct. 4, 1980, in Doug Barfield's final season as the Tigers' head coach and lasting until the final game of Pat Dye's 12-year tenure as Auburn head coach when the Tigers lost 17-0 to No. 2 Alabama in the 1992 Iron Bowl.

» Junior tailback Tank Bigsby got his 2022 campaign off to a productive start with 147 rushing yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns in the season opener against Mercer. His 39-yard score was the longest rushing TD of his career.

The 19th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 2,000 career yards, he ranks 15th with 2,259 career yards and 19 career scores. Bigsby's 10 career 100-yard rushing games are tied for 12th in program history.

With 1,099 yards last season, Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games of 2021.

He ranks third among Auburn rushers in yards gained through their sophomore season: Michael Dyer (2,355/2010-11); Bo Jackson (2,042/1982-83); Tank Bigsby (1,933/2020-21).

In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen); his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. Bigsby was the first Tiger to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993.

» Jarquez Hunter opened his sophomore campaign by rushing for three touchdowns on only eight carries against Mercer. It was Hunter's first career game with multiple rushing touchdowns. Hunter's three rushing scores against the Bears matched his total in 13 games as a freshman.

He was the first Auburn player to rush for three touchdowns since JaTarvious Whitlow did so against Mississippi State in 2019.

Hunter (3 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) and Bigsby (2 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) are the first Auburn teammates to rush for multiple touchdowns in the same game since Whitlow and Joey Gatewood each rushed for a pair of scores against Kent State in 2019.

» An important upgrade in the recent Jordan-Hare Stadium renovation provides a new expanded home locker room for Auburn football student-athletes, more than doubling the previous space, accented with state of the art lighting, speakers and sound system in a customized orange and blue decor in the south end zone.

Hunter added another rushing score against San Jose' State to give him four TD runs for the season and scored his first receiving touchdown of the season on a 22-yard throw from Robby Ashford against Penn State, giving him five total scores for the season.

Hunter is 16th in the SEC in scoring at 6.0 points per game.

>> Hunter ranked ninth among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 597 yards as a true freshman during 2021.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run tied for seventh longest in the nation that season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

Against Akron last season, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

» Tight end John Samuel Shenker is second in career catches by an Auburn tight end with 60, and he is also fourth in career tight end receiving yardage at 718.

Shenker's 33 catches during the 2021 campaign set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season. His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn TE season record.

» Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU last season was the first 100yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times last season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had four receptions for 50 yards at Texas A&M.

» Junior Ja'Varrius Johnson led Auburn with 117 yards on four receptions in the Tigers' season-opening win over Mercer. It was Johnson's second career 100-yard receiving game (107 yards vs. Mississippi State in 2021).

Johnson's 117 receiving yards were the most by an Auburn player since Anthony Schwartz finished with 123 yards and a TD on four catches against LSU in 2020. The last Auburn 100-yard receiver was Shedrick Jackson (111) last season at South Carolina.

Johnson ranks 11th in the SEC in receiving yards per game (61.0) and fourth in the conference in yards per reception (19.06).

>> Ja'Varrius Johnson now has 35 career receptions for 579 yards. Shedrick Jackson now has 60 career receptions for 798 yards.

FOR THE DEFENSE

» Prior to allowing a 1-yard rushing TD against San Jose' State, Auburn had held its opponents without a rushing touchdown in six straight games dating back through the 2021 season, the longest such streak for the Tigers since not allowing a rushing score in eight straight games during the middle of the 2016 campaign.

>> Auburn's defense has allowed only 25 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 71 games.

» Captain Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play in the overtime win against Missouri. Hall had three tackles for loss, two sacks, a 39-yard interception and six tackles overall in the 17-14 Auburn victory.

» Linebacker Cam Riley's 16 tackles against Mercer were a career high for the junior; he led the team in tackles for the first time in his career. Riley had the most tackles by an Auburn player since Zakoby McClain had 17 tackles against Texas A&M in 2020.

Riley and Owen Pappoe were Auburn's leading tacklers against Penn State with six stops each. Pappoe led the Tigers with eight tackles against Missouri.

Riley led the Tigers this season with 31 tackles through the first four contests; he did not play against LSU. He had 23 career tackles entering the season.

» Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 71 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 186 total TD during that 83-game span (2.24 per game).

>> Senior Derick Hall has 16.5 career sacks, all in his last 24 games dating back to the middle of the 2020 season.

Hall recorded six tackles, 3.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks and registered his first career interception against Missouri, becoming the

first Auburn player with a sack and INT in the same game since Smoke Monday in the 2019 Iron Bowl.

Hall is tied for fourth in the SEC with 4.0 sacks and 7.0 TFL this season. Hall has 24.5 career tackles for loss and 111 career tackles.

Eku Leota, who recorded at least 1.0 tackle for a loss in five straight games dating back to the final game of 2021 (6.0 TFL during streak), now has 15.0 TFL and 9.0 sacks during his Auburn career. Adding two seasons played at Northwestern. he has 25.0 TFL and 15.5 sacks.

Colby Wooden now has 126 career tackles, 11.0 career sacks and 23.0 career TFL at Auburn.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas last season.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» All-America kicker Anders Carlson returns for a fifth season of action after suffering a season-ending knee injury at the end of the 2021 Mississippi State game.

Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award
 semifinalist, has moved into second place in
 Auburn career scoring with 380 points, passing
 Wes Byrum (363 points from 2007-10).

He ranked ninth in the SEC in scoring at 7.7 points per game last season and was fifth in the league with 1.40 field goals made per game.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is third in career PAT made (164) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (72). He needs 12 made PATs to crack the SEC's career top 10.

He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT in 2021, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

Carlson ranks seventh in SEC career scoring (380), just five points behind Alabama's Leigh Tiffin (385 from 2006-09).

He is also tied with Kentucky's Austin MacGinnis (2014-17) for eighth in SEC career field goals made.

» With 854 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the alltime leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

» Punter Oscar Chapman earned preseason all-SEC recognition from a number of sources and ranks third in the SEC in average (44.1) this season.

Chapman averaged 45.9 yards on eight punts against Missouri, including a 61-yard boot that was his longest kick of the season. He was recognized as one of Ray's 8 by the Ray Guy Award for that performance, and received the same Ray's 8 recognition vs. LSU, with a 46.2-yard average on four punts.

Auburn leads the SEC in net punting at 44.11 yards, ranking sixth nationally.

>> Keionte Scott ranks sixth in the SEC with a 9.5-yard punt return average, ranking 28th nationally.

» Auburn's 99-yard drive in the second quarter was its first since the 2020 LSU game; it was Auburn's eighth 99-yard drive since 1996. Last year's long drive was 98 yards against Georgia State.

>> Camden Brown scored his first touchdown on an 18-yard pass from Ashford; it was Ashford's third TD pass of the season.

>> Jarquez Hunter's 61-yard reception from Ashford in the second quarter was a career-long completion for both.

More career-long receptions: Omari Kelly's 25-yard reception from Ashford was a career long for Kelly; Tyler Fromm's 35-yard reception was a career long.

>> Defensive firsts: Marcus Bragg recorded his first sack at Auburn. Jayson Jones had his first fumble recovery.

Among those is Auburn kicker Anders Carlson, who is active in his worship center Church of the Highlands and many Christian youth service initiatives.

The final roster features 11 players from NCAA FBS and 11 players from all other divisions of NCAA and NAIA football. Allstate will reward these athletes with an NIL opportunity as well as a charity match from The Allstate Foundation

» Carlson, a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American, is also a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy. Celebrating its 33rd year, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

» Auburn is 8-12 on fourth down this season. The Tigers' 66.7 success rate on fourth downs is tied for 25th nationally. Auburn's eight fourthdown conversions are tied for 15th among all FBS teams and its 12 fourth-down attempts are tied for 26th nationally.

Against Missouri, Auburn converted 3-4 fourth-down opportunities, just the second time in the last four seasons the Tigers converted three fourth-down chances in a game (3-5 vs. Georgia in 2021).

Auburn has converted at least one fourthdown opportunity in six straight games for the first time since doing so in six consecutive games at the end of the 2015 and start of the 2016 seasons.

» Team captains for the 2022 season are defensive lineman Derick Hall, linebacker Owen Pappoe and tight end John Samuel Shenker.

Pappoe, who was also a 2021 captain, is just the fourth two-time captain in Auburn annals, along with two-time captains Reese Dismukes (2013-14), Gusty Yearout (1966-67) and Curtis Kuykendall (1944-45).

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 334-263-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 143-65-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-197-12 overall.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 259-71-6 (.781). Before the Penn State game, Auburn had won 17 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

>> On the current Auburn roster, 45 players have at least one college start to their credit, 25 on offense and 20 on defense.

There are 10 Tigers who have started 20 or more collegiate games: Brandon Council 43 (24 at Akron), Owen Pappoe 34, John Samuel Shenker 32, Colby Wooden 29, Derick Hall 24, Nehemiah Pritchett 24, Tank Bigsby 22, Shedrick Jackson 22, Marcus Harris 22 (5 at Kansas) and Keiondre Jones 21 games.

THE LAST TIME VS GEORGIA #2 GEORGIA 34, #18 AUBURN 10

>> No. 18 Auburn grabbed an early lead with a 17-play opening drive and Tank Bigsby scored a second-half touchdown but No. 2 Georgia won the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry 34-10.

Bigbsy scored on a 6-yard-run, bouncing outside to his left when the middle was clogged on third-and-1 to make it 24-10 with 4:01 left in the third quarter, ending a string of 24 unanswered UGA points.

Caylin Newton's 31-yard catch was the key on Auburn's 78-yard, six-play touchdown drive.

Georgia kicked a field goal in the opening seconds of the fourth quarter and added a 10-yard touchdown run by Zamir White with 7:11 remaining for the game's final score.

Auburn got off to a promising start on its first possession, converting two fourth downs while driving to the Bulldogs' 9-yard-line before Anders Carlson kicked a 24-yard field goal for a 3-0 Auburn lead.

Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out on UGA's first possession but the Bulldoas intercepted a deflected pass at Auburn's 26 on the Tigers' second possession to set up a game-tying field goal late in the first quarter.

Georgia scored back-to-back touchdowns early in the second on White's 1-yard run and Stetson Bennett's 3-yard pass to Adonai Mitchell to give the Bulldogs a 17-3 lead.

Auburn drove to UGA's 3-yard line in the final minute of the first but a fourth down pass fell incomplete, denying the Tigers an opportunity to pull within one score.

After the Bulldogs missed a field goal on their first drive of the third, Auburn

drove 34 yards to Georgia's 40-yard line before an incomplete pass on fourth down handed possession back.

Georgia scored on the next play with a 60-yard pass to lead 24-3 with 6:01 remaining in the third.

Bigsby's touchdown pulled the Tigers within two scores but UGA outscored Auburn 10-0 in the final quarter.

Nix completed 21 of 38 passes for 217 yards. Playing against his former team, Demetris Robertson led Auburn with 59 receiving yards on four catches.

Zion Puckett led Auburn's defensive effort with 10 tackles. Bydarrius Knighten added a career-high nine stops and Chandler Wooten made eight. Eku Leota registered Auburn's sack

>> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.

>> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 85-33 overall as a head coach – including one season at Arkansas State – and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.

>> His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.

>> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

>> The first alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

>> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.

>> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

>> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and longtime chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains. What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 431 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 341, losing 90 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .786 against some of the best teams in college football.

After lightning delayed Auburn's season opener for 90 minutes in the third guarter. Tank Bigsby provided his own lightning strike, racing 39 yards for a touchdown on the first play after the game resumed Generating explosive plays on the ground and in the air, Auburn kicked off the 2022 season by defeating Mercer 42-16 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The big-play Tigers produced seven plays of 20 yards or more

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its first five drives with Jarquez Hunter scoring the season's first points on a 19-yard run on the Tigers' first drive.

Auburn gained 88 yards in two plays on its second possession on a 49-yard run by quarterback Robby Ashford and a 39-yard pass from T.J. Finley to Ja'Varrius Johnson. Auburn made it 14-0 on Finley's 2-yard touchdown pass to John Samuel Shenker

Hunter's 2-yard touchdown put the Tigers on top 21-0 early in the second quarter with 84,562 in attendance. Bigsby, who led Auburn with 147 rushing yards on 16 carries, scored on a 2-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 28-0 lead with 5:04 remaining in the first half.

Mercer capitalized on an Auburn interception to score on a 5-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left in the half. Derick Hall recorded a third-down sack to force a punt in the third quarter. Ashford threw a 56-yard pass to Johnson to set up Hunter's third touchdown, a 1-yarder that gave Auburn a 35-7 lead before lightning within eight miles of Pat Dye Field delayed the game late in the third quarter.

The Bears added nine fourth-quarter points on a field goal and a touchdown with 25 seconds remaining Linebacker Cam Riley led Auburn with a career-high 15 tackles, exceeding his 2021 season total of 14.

Johnson made four receptions for 117 yards, averaging 29.3 yards per catch. Ashford, a redshirt freshman, produced 168 yards of total offense, completing 4-of-7 passes for 100 yards while rushing for 68 yards on six carries.

Robby Ashford raced 30 yards on the first play of Auburn's next possession, crossing midfield. Finley fired to Ja'Varrius Johnson for 24 yards to the 4, then scored on a quarterback keeper to give Auburn a double-diglt lead at 24-13 with 12:45 left in the game.

The Spartans made it a one-possession game with their third field goal with 2:11 left but their on-side kick went out of bounds and Auburn rushed for a first down and ran out the clock.

Finley completed 13 of 20 passes for 167 yards. Ashford led Auburn's rushing attack with 61 yards on seven carries. Bigsby added 51 yards on 13 carries while pacing the Tigers with four receptions for 29 yards. Derick Hall led Auburn with eight tackles while Owen Pappoe added seven.

Auburn's defense provided a spark while the offense struggled in the first quarter. On the opening possession, Colby Wooden recorded the first of six first-half Tiger tackles for loss. Marcus Harris made three of them, including a sack. Eku Leota and Scott also had sacks in the first half.

After Auburn's second interception at the end of the first quarter on the Tigers' 28-yard-line, the Spartans had first-and-goal at the 1, but Auburn's defense kept San Jose State out of the end zone, forcing a 33-yard field goal.

Trailing 3–0, Auburn answered with a 75-yard drive on nine plays. Freshman running back Damari Alston rushed for 35 yards on the second play, Auburn's biggest gain of the game. On fourth-and-4, Finley improvised, avoiding a rusher while finding John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards to move the chains. One play later, Finley and Shenker teamed up again for 20 yards to the Spartans' 7.

From there, Jarquez Hunter started running to his left, then cut up the middle for his fourth touchdown of the season to give Auburn a 7-3 lead with 6:31 remaining in the second quarter.

San Jose' State regained the lead, driving 75 yards on 12 plays and scoring on a 1-yard touchdown run to go ahead 10-7 with 58 seconds left in the half. Auburn held the Spartans to 54 rushing yards on 29 carries, an average of 1.9 yards per rush.

No. 22 Penn State decisively won the red zone and turnover battles Saturday to defeat Auburn 41-12 in the first SEC-Big Ten matchup in Jordan-Hare Stadium history. Jarquez Hunter leaped a defender on the way to his fifth touchdown of the season on a 22-yard pass from Robby Ashford

in the fourth quarter to account for Auburn's only TD.

Three Auburn first-and-goals netted only a pair of Anders Carlson field goals while Penn State was 5-for-5 in the red zone, forced four turnovers and recorded six sacks without allowing either.

Auburn's defense made its presence felt on the opening series when Owen Pappoe delivered a big hit on Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford, causing a fumble that rolled out of bounds. On the next play, the Tigers stopped Clifford's quarterback sneak for no gain on fourth-and-1 giving Auburn possession at Penn State's 47.

T.J. Finley's 24-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson set up Carlson's 31-yard field goal to give Auburn a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter. Clifford's 34-yard pass to Mitchell Tinsley gave the Nittany Lions first-and-goal at Auburn's 7-yard-line. One play later, he

scored on a quarterback draw to put Penn State ahead 7-3 with 4:21 remaining in the first quarter.

Auburn answered in the second quarter, converting twice on third-and-long with a 24-yard pass from Finley to Landen King and Finley's 18-yard scramble on third-and-16. Auburn had first-and-goal at the 10 but had to settle for Carlson's 22-

yard field goal to trim Penn State's lead to 7-6 with 6:59 left in the half. The visitors responded with a touchdown drive, gaining 25 yards on a double-pass back to Clifford for a first down at the Tigers' 10. Kaytron Allen rushed for a touchdown on third-and-3 for a 14-6 Penn State advantage at the 1:46 mark of the first half

Auburn got the ball to start the second half but the Tigers went three-and-out and Nicholas Singleton ran 53 yards on Penn State's first play of the third quarter to set up his 1-yard TD rush one play later for a 21-6 Nittany Lions lead. Penn State outscored Auburn 17-0 in the third quarter, regaining possession after forcing a fumble while sacking Finley on

third-and-13. After the Nittany Lions kicked a 48-yard field goal to extend their lead to 24-6, Ashford completed to Ja'Varrius Johnson

a 6-yard gain on fourth-and-2. Auburn had first-and-goal at PSU's 8-yard-line, but after two plays netted a loss of 15 yards, Ashford's pass on third-and-goal from the 23 was intercepted, one of four Tiger turnovers. Penn State capitalized on the takeaway on Allen's second touchdown run to go ahead 31-6.

Áfter Hunter's 22-vard touchdown on Áshford's first career TD pass, Auburn's 2-point rush attempt was unsuccessful. Singleton scored on a 54-yard touchdown run and Penn State (3-0) added another field goal in the fourth quarter.

In a most improbable ending, Cayden Bridges recovered a fumble in the end zone after Anders Carlson kicked a field goal to give Auburn a 17-14 overtime victory Saturday on Homecoming at Jordan-Hare Stadium

After Carlson connected from 39 yards on the opening possession of OT, Missouri's Nathanial Peat raced 20 yards but fumbled while reaching for the goal line, with Bridges recovering in the back of the end zone to secure Auburn's victory. With a minute and half remaining in the fourth quarter, Missouri stopped Auburn on fourth-and-1 at the visiting Tigers' 29-yard-line, then hit a 39-yard pass play to Auburn's 3-yard line, but Mizzou missed a 26-yard field goal as time expired,

sending the game to overtime tied 14-14. After Colby Wooden's sack forced a three-and-out on the game's opening possession, the Tigers turned back the clock with a 14-play, all rush, touchdown drive that consumed nearly half of the first quarter with 85,750 enjoying a sunny fall afternoon at Pat Dye Field.

Tank Bigsby twice moved the chains on fourth-and-short, and first-time starter Robby Ashford scored on an 11-yard quarterback draw, his first career rushing TD for a 7-0 Auburn lead.

Derick Hall produced Auburn's first takeaway of the season, intercepting a deflected pass and returning it 19 yards to Mis-souri's 24-yard-line.

Ashford connected with Omari Kelly for 12 yards on third-and-6, then completed to Camden Brown to set up Bigsby's 3-yard touchdown run to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead late in the first quarter. Koy Moore led Auburn with 74 receiving yards on four catches.

Missouri evened the score in the second quarter, scoring on a 9-yard rush to cap 54-yard drive and a Brady Cook quarterback sneak on fourth-and-goal from inside the 1-yard line with 30 seconds left in the half after a 79-yard drive. Auburn forced five three-and-outs in the second half while shutting out Missouri after the second quarter.

Auburn was plus-two on turnovers thanks to Hall's interception and Bridges' game-ending fumble recovery.

Robby Ashford's career passing night helped Auburn build a 17-point lead but LSU forced three fourth-quarter turnovers to beat the Tigers 21-17 Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium. Trailing by four points with five minutes left in the fourth quarter, Donovan Kaufman forced a fumble that Jayson Jones

recovered on Auburn's 32-yard line. Needing a touchdown to take the lead, Tank Bigsby rushed for 23 yards across midfield for a promising start to a potential game-winning drive. Jarquez Hunter then picked up a first down at LSÚ's 35, but the Tigers would get no closer. LSU's Greg Brooks Jr. made the Bengal Tigers' fourth takeaway, intercepting Ashford's pass and returning it 30 yards to Auburn's 45. ĽSU (4-1, 2-0) picked up a first down and ran out the clock.

Leading 17-14 at the half, Auburn forced a three-and-out to start the second half, but LSU stopped the Tigers on fourth down and drove 63 yards on seven plays to take a 21-17 lead on John Emery Jr.'s 20-yard run with 3:32 left in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, Auburn drove 65 yards to LSU's 5-yard line, but on second-and-goal from the 10, LSU intercepted Koy Moore's reverse pass, Auburn's second turnover. A muffed punt with 5:31 left in the game accounted for Auburn's third turnover.

Auburn built a 17-0 first-half lead with Ashford throwing for 247 yards and two touchdowns.

The Tigers scored on the opening drive by twice converting on third down, first with Ashford finding Moore for 10 yards on third-and-6, then scrambling and hitting Ja Varrius Johnson for a 53-yard touchdown to put Auburn up 7-0 in the first two minutes.

Late in the opening quarter, LSU's punt pinned Auburn at its 1-yard line but the Tigers drove 99 yards on six plays to take a 14-0 lead. Ashford escaped LSU's pass rush and threw to Jarquez Hunter, who raced 40 yards after the catch for a 61-yard gain. On the next play, freshman Camden Brown leaped in the end zone to snag Ashford's pass for his first career touchdown. Ashford finished with 337 yards and two TDs, completing 19-of-38 passes. Auburn extended its lead to 17-0 on Anders Carlson's 29-yard field goal with 9:38 remaining in the first half.

LSU scored a defensive touchdown midway through the second quarter when Jay Ward recovered a fumble and returned it 23 yards to trim Auburn's lead to 17-7.

The Bengal Tigers made it 17-14 with 15 seconds left in the half when quarterback Jayden Daniels scored on a 1-yard run to

cap an 11-play, 77-yard drive. Wesley Steiner led Auburn's defense with a career-high 11 tackles. The Tigers held LSU to 270 yards of total offense, in-cluding 10-for-26 passing for 85 yards. Colby Wooden, Marcus Bragg and Derick Hall each recorded sacks. Hall and Wooden each made two of Auburn's eight tackles for loss.
