FOOTBALL HOSTS TULANE IN 2019 HOME OPENER

» No. 10 Auburn (1-0) hosts the Tulane Green Wave (1-0) on Saturday, September 7, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala., for the Tigers' 2019 home opener. ESPN2 will televise the 6:30 p.m. CT non-conference matchup.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 251-69-6. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 24-6.

SERIES HISTORY

Auburn and Tulane are meeting for the 38th time, but it's just the second matchup in the series since 1955. The Green Wave lead the series 17-14-6 all-time. The two teams met every year from 1921-55 with the exception of 1943, when Auburn did not field a team.

This will be only the third matchup in Auburn; Tulane won 28-0 in 1950 and Auburn posted a 38-13 victory on The Plains in 2006 in the series' last contest.

From 1932-49, all 17 games in the series were played in New Orleans, where the Green Wave hold a 12-9-5 series advantage. The series is tied 4-4-1 all-time at neutral sites, with games in Gulfport, Miss., Mobile and Montgomery.

Twenty-one previous meetings included a shutout by at least one team including four scoreless ties (three straight from 1936-38). The Tigers have won three of the last four games in the series.

Auburn is 28-25-6 all-time against current members of the American Athletic Conference. The Tigers' last two games against AAC members came in bowl games; Auburn defeated Memphis 31-10 in the 2015 Birmingham Bowl and the No. 7 Tigers lost 34-27 to 10th-ranked UCF in the 2018 Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl. The last regular season game Auburn played against a current AAC members was in 2007, a 26-23 overtime loss to South Florida in Auburn.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Auburn's comeback from a 15-point deficit against Oregon was its largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game (24-point deficit overcome for a 28-27 win)
- Auburn taking the lead over Oregon with just nine seconds remaining in the game was the latest the Tigers gained the lead to win since Chris Davis broke a tie against Alabama in 2013 with one second on the clock by returning a missed field goal attempt
- The Tigers face six of the top 12 teams in the Associated Press preseason rankings, with four of those contests away from home
- Only Auburn, Alabama, Clemson and Washington have finished in the top 15 in scoring defense each of the past three seasons
- With 13 seniors listed, Auburn ranks second to only Michigan (15) for most players on the 2020 Reese's Senior Bowl watch list

- Auburn is the only FBS team that opened the last two seasons with a win over an APranked opponent (#6 Washington, #11 Oregon)
- SEC freshman of the week Bo Nix was the first true freshman to start an Auburn season opener at quarterback since Travis Tidwell in 1946 and the first SEC true freshman QB to start an opener since 2004 (Brent Schaeffer, Tennessee)
- With 40 consecutive starts, Marlon Davidson ranks second nationally among FBS players in consecutive starts behind Louisiana Tech's Ethan Reed (41)
- Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league coaches and media: DL Derrick Brown, OL Prince Tega Wanogho (first team), DL Marlon Davidson, DL Nick Coe (second team), K Anders Carlson, DB Javaris Davis, OL Marquel Harrell, OL Mike Horton, P Arryn Siposs and WR Seth Williams (third team)

2019 AUBURN FOOTBALL

IN HOME OPENERS

» Auburn is 100-16-3 (.853) all-time in home openers; there were no games played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938. Although Jordan-Hare Stadium opened in 1939, Auburn did not open a season there until 1951. Since then, Auburn has gone 65-12-2 (.833) alltime in home openers.

The Tigers have won 12 of their last 13 home openers, the only loss a 19-13 setback to eventual national champion Clemson in 2016.

IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn is 173-58-5 all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 108-22-1 (.832) all-time at home in September, and 65-36-4 (.632) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 42 of 49 seasons. Auburn is 17-7 in September games under Gus Malzahn. The Tigers are 4-0 all-time in games played on September 7, outscoring opponents 205-16 in those contests.

FRESHMAN DEBUT

» Bo Nix was the first true freshman to start an Auburn season opener at quarterback since Travis Tidwell in 1946, a 13-12 Auburn win vs. Southern Miss in Montgomery.

Record of true freshmen in their first starts at Auburn since 1969: 6-2

Nix was the first SEC true freshman QB to start a season opener since Tennessee's Brent Schaeffer in 2004.

- Nix was 13-31 for 177 yards passing with two TD against Oregon, going 4-6 passing on the gamewinning drive, capped by a 26-yard TD to Seth Williams, and converting a 4th-and-3 rushing, earning SEC freshman of the week.
- » Bo Nix' father Patrick made his starting debut as a junior in the 1994 season opener at Ole Miss, a 22-17 Auburn win. Patrick Nix was 17-5-1 as a starter in his Auburn career.

TOTAL OFFENSE

There have been nine 600-yard total offense games and 25 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn, the latest being the 586-yard output against Purdue in the Music City Bowl, the third 500-yard game last season.

Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 17 times under Malzahn, the latest being 255 yards in the first quarter against Purdue, and nine times against SEC teams, including a 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss last year.

Auburn has scored in all 81 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

- The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 29 times in 80 games, 50 points or more 13 times and 60 points or more three times.
- Auburn has scored first in 25 of its last 32 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including nine times this season. The Tigers are 41-13 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.
- Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 56-81 games, with 33 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn averages 21.97 first downs per game under Malzahn.
- Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 52 of 81 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Twelve different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (64 100-yd performances).

- Despite having its nine-year run of 1,000-yard rushers end in 2018, Auburn is still tied with Nevada and Wisconsin for the most 1,000-yard rushers among FBS teams since 2009 with 11.
- Auburn's four quarterbacks entered the season having combined for only two career passing attempts and only one completion.

The two attempts by the Tigers' returning signal callers are the fewest attempts for any FBS team entering 2019; next are Penn State (5-7) and North Carolina State (7-8). Cord Sandberg completed his only attempt in 2018, a 22-yarder against Alabama State, and Joey Gatewood attempted one pass against Purdue in the Music Bowl.

>> Sophomore Seth Williams, who scored the game-winning touchdown against Oregon on a 26-yard reception from Bo Nix with just 0:09 remaining, caught three passes for 44 yards on the game-winning drive.

As a true freshman, Williams led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in yards per reception (20.54) and finished the season ranked third in Auburn freshman receiving yards (534) and fifth in freshman receptions (26).

Williams scored on a pair of 11-yard catches vs. Texas A&M, the second the gamewinner with 1:41 remaining. He added a 45-yard TD catch against Liberty and finished that contest with 109 yards on five catches, his first career 100-yard game.

In his career, all but three of his 30 catches have earned a first down or TD, including scoring on all three of his red-zone receptions and on three of his six fourth-quarter catches.

- » Redshirt junior Eli Stove has surpassed 1,000 career yards from scrimmage (58 receptions for 524 yards and a score and 42 rushing attempts for 482 yards and 3 TDs). Stove's first score of the 2019 campaign was an 11-yard touchdown catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon.
- Entering the 2019 season, Auburn's 99 combined career starts from its starting offensive linemen ranked 10th among FBS schools; Oregon was the leader with 153 combined starts.
- As a true freshman, Anthony Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's longest offensive play of the season and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

Schwartz scored his first TD against Alabama State, a 57-yard reception, then added a 23-yard rush in the second quarter for his first career TD run. Schwartz added rushing touchdowns against Alabama and Southern Miss and scored on a fumble recovery in the endzone at Ole Miss. He added a 6-yard rushing score in the Music City Bowl to give him seven touchdowns for the season.

Schwartz finished ranked sixth in Auburn freshman receiving yards (357) and ninth in freshman receptions (22).

DOMINATING DEFENSE

Auburn joins Alabama, Clemson and Washington as the only teams that have finished the season ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense in each of the three seasons since Kevin Steele became the Tigers' defensive coordinator in 2016.

Auburn has allowed only 18.32 points per game in Steele's three seasons as coordinator, seventh among FBS teams.

Prior to 2016, Auburn had not held its opponents to under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0 ppg), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents to under 20 ppg. In the season prior to Steele's arrival on The Plains, Auburn allowed 26.0 ppg, 54th nationally.

- Senior safety Jeremiah Dinson earned SEC defensive player of the week honors with his 13-tackle performance against Oregon; he had two TFL and a 6-yard sack.
- Auburn has held 13 of its 41 opponents (12-1 record) under 300 yards of total offense in Steele's three seasons. That equals the number of times the Tigers held an opponent to under 300 yards in the previous six seasons combined (79 games).
- » Auburn's defense has allowed only eight first-quarter touchdowns in the last 32 games, and only seven in the opening period since the start of 2017 (four last season).
- >> Last season, the Auburn defense allowed a TD on just 34.3 percent (12-35) of its opponents' trips into the red zone, second best in the nation.
- " Auburn has allowed a touchdown on just 53 of its opponents' 119 red zone chances in Steele's four years as the Tigers' defensive coordinator. The 44.5 red zone touchdown percentage is second in the country, trailing only Wisconsin (43.2%) since the start of the 2016 season.
- » In 18 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 22.8 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times (44.4 percent).

Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked opponents to 17 or fewer points (18.4 percent).

- » Auburn is third nationally allowing just 30 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers are tied for seventh nationally allowing only 83 total TD during that span.
- Onder Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 32 times, including 15 of the last 17 games (not including season openers), the latest being Purdue. In 25 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.
- » Auburn ranked 20th nationally in TFL per game (7.4) last season, with 96 TFL and 38 sacks for the year. The Tigers had 17 sacks in the last four games after recording 15 in the first six games. For the season, Auburn's 38 sacks (2.92/gm) ranked 16th nationally.
- Auburn is one of 17 teams nationally allowing less than five yards per play since the start of 2016, allowing 4.954 yards per play during that period.
- In 41 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 103 sacks (2.5 per game) and has been held without a sack only five times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 27 of those games. The Tigers averaged 7.4 TFL per game last season, 20th nationally.

The Tigers have forced 57 turnovers (30 INT, 27 FR) and allowed only 29 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

Auburn was one of just 13 teams nationally with at least three interceptions returned for touchdowns last season.

Career interceptions by current players: Javaris Davis (6), Daniel Thomas (5); Jeremiah Dinson (2); Big Kat Bryant, Noah Igbinoghene, Smoke Monday, Jamien Sherwood, Christian Tutt (1).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- » Big Kat Bryant's 83-yard fumble recovery against Oregon was the first of his career and the longest fumble return by Auburn through records back through the 1996 season; the previous long during that period was an 82-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Justin Garrett vs. Louisville in 2015.
- » Auburn is 28-8 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 13-4 when turnovers are even, compared to 12-15 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle. In wins, Auburn has a +32 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -15 in turnovers during Malzahn's head coaching tenure. The Tigers are 19-5 when they play turnover-free football and 38-14 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn.
- Auburn is 46-17 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 29-8 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 8-10 when it fails to force a turnover.
- >> The Tigers are 15-3 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Auburn kickers have converted 277 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013 Tennessee game, the longest active streak in the FBS and the SEC record.

Cody Parkey (2013) Daniel Carlson (2014-17) and Ian Shannon (2015-18) were Auburn's

- .> Auburn has 31 former lettermen still with NFL teams after the final preseason cuts August 31, representing 20 different NFL teams
- » Former Auburn lettermen on NFL rosters who finished their college careers elsewhere: Byron Cowart (New England), John Franklin III (NY Jets)
- » On NFL practice squads: Deshaun Davis (Jacksonville), Darrell Williams (Washington), D'haquille Williams (Buffalo)
- » Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) and Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)
- » At least one former Tiger has been selected to 17 of the last 19 Pro Bowls, including Dee Ford in 2019. Auburn has had at least one former player in 11 of the last 14 Super Bowls

previous kickers during the streak; Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating. The NCAA record is 302, set by Florida State from 2012-16.

Marlon Davidson blocked three field goal attempts last season, second-best nationally. Jordyn Peters, also ranked second nationally, blocked three punts, making Auburn the only team nationally with two players with multiple blocked kicks/punts.

Auburn's seven blocked kicks/punts tied for best in the nation with Toledo and Baylor among FBS teams. Seven blocked kicks were the most for a season in Auburn records back through 1996.

- Auburn is tied with Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (131) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- In his debut last season, Anders Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yards), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PAT attempts and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.
- With 572 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (679 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.
- Auburn ranked fifth nationally last year in net punting (41.91), the highest net average at Auburn back through 1996. Punter Arryn Siposs averaged 44.2 yards per kick (18th ranked nationally), with 10 punts of 50+ yards. His career best was a 60-yarder vs. Arkansas.
- Auburn and North Carolina were the only Power 5 schools in the Top 50 in kickoff return average, kickoff return defense, net punt and punt return average last season.
- » Auburn was one of 18 teams nationally to return both a kickoff and a punt for a TD last season, along with Alabama, Appalachian State, Boise State, Louisville, Maryland, Memphis, Michigan, New Mexico State, North Texas, Ohio, Pitt, TCU, Temple, Toledo, Troy, Utah State and Washington State.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn has won 20 straight games (18-0 mark under Malzahn) when the Tigers score a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers have scored 22 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, nine interceptions and one missed field goal.

The last time the Tigers lost a game in which it scored a non-offensive touchdown was at Mississippi State in 2012, when Auburn lost 28-10 despite a 100-yard Onterio McCalebb kickoff return to start the second half.

RANKINGS

- >> This is the 39th time the Tigers have been ranked in the preseason AP poll since 1950, the 13th time in the last 17 seasons and the fifth time in seven seasons under head coach Gus Malzahn. It's the 36th time the Tigers have been ranked in the preseason Top 20.
- Auburn has played 35 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 80 games as the Tigers' head coach (43.8 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 20 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 17-19 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including a 7-13 mark against Top 10 teams.
- Auburn is 111-159-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 51-41-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-68-2 on the road and 33-50-2 on a neutral field.
- Auburn is 16-19 all-time against ranked non-conference opponents in regular-season action, including 10-7 at home, 3-7 on the road and 3-5 at neutral-site locations.
- >> The Oregon game was the fifth time in Gus Malzahn's seven seasons as Auburn's head coach that the Tigers have played a regular-season non-conference game against a ranked opponent (3-2 record). Prior to Malzahn's tenure, Auburn had only played four such games in the previous 22 seasons combined.
- >> The Tigers are 87-128-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (41-32-2 at home, 27-61-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 56-48-3 overall (27-9-1 at home, 18-29-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).
- Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 319-115-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 179-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 140-83-4 all-time.
- >> When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 78-71-4 (34-12-1 at home, 21-37-1 away and 23-22-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

- >> The Tigers will travel 2,520 miles this regular season, second-most in the SEC, trailing only Texas A&M (2,534 miles).
- >> Since 2001, Auburn is 141-26 (.844) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 197-34-1 (.852) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 536-54-9 (.902) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 336-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 168-3 (.982) when scoring 40 points, 77-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

2019 AUBURN FOOTBALL

>> Five of Auburn's first eight games are away from Jordan-Hare Stadium, including all three games in the month of October. It is the first time since September, 1978, that the Tigers will play all of its games in a calendar month away from home (min. 3 games).

That year, Auburn opened the season by winning 45-32 at Kansas State on September 16, followed by an 18-7 victory at Virginia Tech on September 23 and a 29-10 triumph over Tennessee in Birmingham September 30 prior to playing its first home game of the season against Miami (Fla.) on October 7.

- >> In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 319-249-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 134-59-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 185-190-12 overall. The Tigers are 28-20 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.
- Auburn's freshmen accounted for 239 of the Tigers' 402 points last season (59.5 percent), including 25 of 49 TDs (51.0 percent).

Freshman scoring: Anders Carlson 89; JaTarvious Whitlow 48; Anthony Schwartz 42; Seth Williams 30; Shaun Shivers 18; Harold Joiner 6; John Samuel Shenker 6.

» On the 2019 squad, 28 players started the season with at least one college start to their credit. 16 on offense and 12 on defense.

Auburn had six first-time starters against Oregon: Bo Nix, Marquis McClain, Spencer Nigh, Shaun Shivers, K.J. Britt and Owen Pappoe.

Eight Tigers now have at least 20 college starts: Marlon Davidson 40, Jack Driscoll 33 (20@UMass), Derrick Brown 27, Javaris Davis 25, Jeremiah Dinson 25, Mike Horton 21, Prince Tega Wanogho 21 and Marquel Harrell 20.

- Five players saw their first collegiate action against Oregon -- true freshmen Derick Hall, Bo Nix, Owen Pappoe, D.J. Williams and sophomore Tanner Dean.
- The Tigers have 768 total victories, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs.

THE LAST TIME VS. TULANE AUBURN 38, TULANE 13

>> Freshman Ben Tate ran for 156 yards to carry a hobbled running game and Brandon Cox passed for 212 yards and three touchdowns in the Tigers' 38-13 win over Tulane on Saturday. Tate shouldered most of the rushing load with starter Kenny Irons sitting out to rest a gimpy ankle and backup Brad Lester aggravating a nagging groin injury early.

The Tigers (7-1) were hoping to avoid a letdown following a victory over then-No. 2 Florida last week, and succeeded mostly due to forcing three turnovers in a game featuring short-handed offenses that put up plenty of yards.

Lester started but played only sparingly, catching a 36-yard pass and rushing for a 2-yard touchdown on the opening drive but only getting two carries after that.

Tulane (2-5), playing without two injured starters at receiver, has now lost its last 31 games against ranked opponents dating back to 1982. Cox was 16-of-19 passing and was almost flawless in the first half, when he went 12-of-13 for 161 yards and two touchdowns. The only incompletion was a dropped pass by a wideopen Tre Smith, who would have been in a foot race for a 73-yard TD on the play.

Tate ran 26 times and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. He might have gone from a potential redshirt to No. 1 if the other backs can't go against Mississippi.

Auburn held out guard Tim Duckworth (knee) and fullback Carl Stewart (strained calf) and center Jason Bosley also went down with a knee injury.

The Green Wave had a chance to pull within a touchdown in the third quarter but receiver Preston Brown fumbled at the Auburn 5, ending a 92-yard drive. The Tigers then drove 87 yards and scored on Cox's 23-yard pass to Courtney Taylor for the receiver's first touchdown of the season, making it 31-10.

Auburn had another touchdown set up by a fumbled shotgun snap by Lester Ricard at the 10 in the first half and an interception by Zach Gilbert stopped another late threat.

Tulane's offense caused some havoc in gaining 389 yards, the most allowed by the nation's fifth-ranked scoring defense this season.

Ricard completed 20 of 39 passes for 283 yards and a touchdown. Preston Brown caught nine passes for 139 yards and Davis gained 126 yards on eight catches. Matt Forte rushed for 117 yards for his third consecutive 100-yard game.

Even short-handed, Auburn's offense was more effective. The Tigers' 432 yards was the most since their season opener against Washington State, when they had 484.

Auburn led 24-10 at halftime, thanks partly to a pair of improbable field-goal opportunities in the last 15 seconds. First, Tuberville opted to go for it on fourth-and-1 at his own 32, but Cox was stopped for no gain on a sneak. Auburn's defense held Tulane to a 21-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot with 15 seconds left. Then, Thevenot's squib kick went right to tight end Tommy Trott -- who earlier caught a 27-yard touchdown pass -- and he returned it to midfield with 10 seconds to play.

Cox hit Lee Guess for a 22-yard pass to set up John Vaughn's 45-yard kick as time expired.

FAST FACTS

- » Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.
- » Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.
- » His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.
- » Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last eight seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012
- » Now beginning his seventh season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): 176, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); 99, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); 85, Tommy Tuberville (10); 54 Gus Malzahn (6); 48, Jack Meagher (9); 47, Terry Bowden (6); 33, Gene Chizik (4); 29, Doug Barfield (5); 22, Chet Wynne (4).

- » Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).
- » Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 22 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season three times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018).
- » Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).
- » Malzahn is 40-10 (.800) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017 and 5-2 in 2018 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.
- » In eight seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.
- » Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 66 of 81 games.
- » Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.

- » In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 414 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 324, losing 83 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .791 against some of the best teams in college football.

Nine years ago, Auburn beat Oregon on a last-second field goal. On Saturday night, quarterback Bo Nix didn't want to put it on the kicker again. Instead, the true freshman tossed a 26-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams with nine seconds left to lead the Tigers past Oregon, 27-21, in the season opener.

On the play before, Nix completed a 13-yard pass to Williams to put the Tigers in field-goal range with a chance to win. But rather than play it safe, he took a shot on the next play, throwing a jump ball to Williams who wrestled it away from the defender at the goal line.

The touchdown gave Auburn its first lead of the game and capped a 15-point second-half comeback. It was the largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game when the Tigers overcame a 24-point deficit to win 28-27.

What changed? For starters, the defense clamped down in the second half and made a huge stop on fourth down midway through the fourth quarter to thwart an Oregon drive and keep it a one-point game. The offense also found its rhythm with Nix under center.

Nix, the first rue freshman to start at quarterback for Auburn since 1946, threw for 177 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 42 yards in his first college game. His first career touchdown pass came late in the third quarter when he threw a quick pass to Eli Stove who took it in from 11 yards out to cut the Oregon lead to 21-13.

On the opening drive of the fourth quarter, Auburn used a heavy dose of running back JaTarvious Whitlow to get down to the goal line where it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who took his first snap and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 21-20.

Whitlow recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards on 24 carries. The sophomore also surpassed 1,000 career all-purpose yards (897 rushing, 173 receiving). As a team, the Tigers ran for 206 yards and threw for 177 yards in Saturday's win.

Defensively, senior safety Jeremiah Dinson led Auburn with 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack – the third of his career. K.J. Britt, making his first at middle linebacker, finished second on the team with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

It was also a career night for defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell, another first-time starter, who made two clutch stops late and recorded six tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

At the half, Auburn trailed, 14-6, and it could have been worse if not for an 83-yard fumble recovery from Big Kat Bryant that led to an Anders Carlson field goal and swung the momentum. It was the longest fumble return by an Auburn player through records dating back to 1996.

With the win, the Tigers open the season 1-0 for the third straight year. They will return home next week to face Tulane in the first game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.
