THE GAME

No. 25 Auburn faces No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game Saturday, September 1, 2012, at the Georgia Dome (73,000) in Atlanta. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CT (7 p.m. ET) and the game will be televised by ESPN.

It is the 49th meeting between the two schools and the third consecutive season in which they have played. Clemson defeated Auburn 38-24 last season in Clemson.

FIRST AND 10

- Auburn begins its 120th season of football with the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game versus Clemson
- The Tigers are ranked No. 25 in the preseason USA Today Coaches' Poll
- This is the 49th meeting between the schools in football; Auburn leads the series 34-12-2
- Coach Gene Chizik is 30-10 beginning his fourth season at Auburn; 35-29 in his sixth season overall
- Auburn starts the season with two non-home games for the first time since 1984
- Auburn welcomes new coordinators on both sides of the football, in defensive coordinator Brian Van Gorder and offensive coordinator Scot Loeffler
- Junior punter Steven Clark, one of three finalists for last year's Ray Guy Award, is one of two returning first team all-SEC honorees for Auburn, along with junior defensive end Corey Lemonier. Returnees Philip Lutzenkirchen (senior tight end) and Onterio McCalebb (senior all-purpose back) were second team all-SEC selections in 2011
- Auburn has averaged crowds of more than 80,000 per game at Jordan-Hare Stadium for the last 19 seasons
- The Clemson game is the first non-home game opener for Auburn since 2002
- Auburn's 2012 schedule features eight games against bowl participants from a year ago, including five that played in traditional New Year's games

Series Records

Auburn leads the all-time series with Clemson, which was first played in 1899, by a 34-12-2 advantage. Auburn leads 20-4 in games played at Auburn, 10-6-1 in games played at Clemson and 4-2-1 in games played in a neutral setting.

Against the ACC

This is the sixth time Auburn will open the season against a team from the Atlantic Coast Conference; AU is 3-2 in the previous five matchups:

Against current members of the ACC, Auburn is 121-76-8 (60.9%) all-time.

At The Dome

Auburn is 5-3 all-time in games at the Georgia Dome, and 8-6-1 all-time in all games in domes. The 2012 season opener will be Auburn's second ever in a domed stadium. The Tigers opened the 2001 campaign at Syracuse's Carrier Dome.

In Night Games

In games starting at 5 p.m. or later local time during the Chizik era, the Tigers are 16-4 overall. At home in night games, Auburn is 10-1; the Tigers are 4-3 at an opponent's stadium and 2-0 in neutral site games.

In Season Openers

Auburn is 92-25-2 in season opening games all-time. The Tigers have won their last six season openers.

This will be just the third time Auburn has opened a season in Atlanta. In 1892, Auburn defeated Georgia there 10-0; the Tigers were 18-6 victors over Georgia Tech in the 1902 season opener.

Since 1977, Auburn is 25-5 in season openers against non-conference opponents. All-time, the Tigers are 55-15 when opening the season versus a non-conference foe.

Road Starts

Auburn is 78-35-6 all-time in road openers and 359-328-39 all-time in all games played away from Auburn. The Tigers have won seven of their last eight road openers.

This season will be the 32nd time ever (first since 1984) and eighth since 1950 that Auburn has played its first two games outside of Auburn. It will also mark just the sixth time that Auburn has played its first two games outside of the state of Alabama.

Tigers Versus Tigers

Auburn's season-opening matchup with Clemson will mark the 109th time that Auburn has faced another set of Tigers across the line of scrimmage. The Auburn Tigers are 59-44-5 all-time against schools that share the Tiger nickname. Here are the individual breakdowns:

Opening Ws Second In SEC

Auburn's total of 92 season-opening victories is just one behind Alabama for the best among the Southeastern Conference schools. The Tigers are tied with Arkansas for second, followed by Georgia with 89 wins in season openers.

Opening Day Superlatives

Season openers have produced several impressive performances by the Tigers, including two SEC records. Bo Jackson's 290 rushing yards versus SW Louisiana in 1985 and Alexander Wright's 263 receiving yards in 1989 against Pacific are the best season-opening performances by an SEC player.

The Tigers' 565 rushing yards and 695 yards of total offense against SW Louisiana in the 1985 opener are school single-game

In September

Auburn is 155-48-5 (.757) all-time in the month of September, and has won 31 of its last 36 September contests. The Tigers have posted a winning record during the month of September each of the previous 13 seasons and 28 of the past 31, with the last losing September record coming in 1998 (1-2).

30+ Points Equals Victory

Auburn has won 74 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 291-4 all-time when scoring at least 30 points.

When Scoring 20+ Points

Since 2001, Auburn is 98-12 (.890) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 141-19-1 (.878) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

The Coaching Staff

Auburn welcomes new coordinators on both sides of the football, in defensive coordinator Brian Van Gorder and offensive coordinator Scot Loeffler; with those additions, the Tigers have a restructured coaching staff that also includes the addition of secondary coach Willie Martinez and the move of Tommy Thigpen, who coached safeties his first three years at Auburn (2009-11), to linebacker coach (the position he played at North Carolina and coached at UNC and Illinois prior to his arrival at AU).

For Starters

When the Auburn-Clemson game kicks off, the Tigers will have a total of 30 players with at least one game of starting experience during their college careers. Tops among those are: Daren Bates (35); Nosa Eguae (24); Philip Lutzenkirchen (17); Emory Blake (15); and Corey Lemonier and Oterio McCalebb (14).

In Non-Conference Games

Under Gene Chizik, the Tigers are 15-1 against non-conference opponents, their only loss coming at Clemson (38-24) in 2011. In non-conference matchups, Auburn is 11-0 at home, 0-1 in road games and 4-0 at neutral sites during the Chizik era.

Halftime Rallies

Five times in the Chizik era the Tigers have rallied to win after trailing at halftime. The 2011 Tigers rallied from a 21-14 halftime deficit against Utah State in the 2011 season opener for a 42-38 victory.

The 2010 Tigers pulled the trifecta, overcoming deficits to Clemson, South Carolina (reg. season) and Alabama. Chizik's first team (2009) had one halftime rally to beat West Virginia.

Auburn has had a pair of "walk-off" wins under Chizik, both coming in 2010. The Tigers defeated Oregon in the BCS National Championship Game and Kentucky on the road on field goals as time expired.

LAST MEETING WITH CLEMSON

Clemson's Tajh Boyd threw for four touchdowns and 386 yards to lead Clemson to a 38-24 victory over No. 21 Auburn at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 17 to end the nation's longest winning streak at 17 games. Michael Dyer led Auburn with 151 yards rushing and two touchdowns.

Auburn got off to a fast start with a pair of touchdowns and two Clemson three-and-outs. Dyer scampered a career-high 52 yards untouched for a touchdown on his first play to give Auburn a 7-0 lead at 4:24 into the game.

On fourth down on Auburn's next possession, Barrett Trotter fired a downfield strike to Emory Blake for a 36-yard touchdown to put Auburn ahead 14-0 with 7:54 left in the opening quarter. Auburn finished the first quarter with 182 yards total offense.

On the first play of the second quarter, Clemson cut the lead in half on a 4-yard Boyd to DeAndre Hopkins touchdown pass. Auburn answered with its longest scoring drive, play-wise, of the season with a 16-play, 90-yard touchdown drive in 5:57 that was capped on a 1-yard Dyer touchdown run for a 21-7 lead with 8:54 left in the half.

Clemson scored 14 straight points to close out the half, totaling 21 second-quarter points. The Atlantic Coast Conference Tigers drew to within 21-14 on a Boyd's 6-yard touchdown pass to tight end Dwayne Allen on third down with 5:06 remaining in the half. Clemson had three third-down conversions on the drive.

After stopping Auburn, Clemson tied the game at 21 on Andre Ellington's 2-yard rushing touchdown with 1:11 remaining as both teams combined for 520 yards total offense in the first half. Auburn outgained Clemson 285-235.

On a third and six on the opening possession of the second half, Boyd completed a 65-yard touchdown pass to Sammy Watkins on a four-play drive to give Clemson its first lead of the game at 28-21, only 1:15 into the half.

With Clemson driving, Demetruce McNeal laid a hit on Clemson's Mike Bellamy to force a fumble that was recovered by Neiko Thorpe at the Auburn 18 with 8:01 left in the third for Auburn's first fumble recovery of the season.

On the first play after the turnover, Dyer had a 45-yard rush up the right sideline. Trotter then completed a 12-yard pass to Travante Stallworth on third down for a first down by a nose at the Clemson 26 to set up Cody Parkey's 38-yard field goal to draw Auburn within 28-24.

Clemson answered with a 19-yard Boyd to Watkins 24 touchdown pass to make it 35-24 with 16 seconds remaining in the third.

Clemson upped its lead to 38-24 on a 38-yard field goal by Chandler Catanzaro with 11:48 remaining. Auburn's drive on the next possession ended with an interception.

Clemson outgained Auburn 624-435 in total offense and ran 92 plays to Auburn's 63. Clemson was 14-of-18 in third down conversions to Auburn's 5-of-13, while possessing the ball for 36:15 to 23:45 for Auburn.

Barrett Trotter was 12-of-25 passing for 198 yards and one touchdown.

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The most recent addition to the stadium was the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame

coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 19 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 28 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won .797 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its inception in 1939 and hold an overall record of 285-70-7 there.

COACHING LEDGER

The 2012 season is Gene Chizik's 25th season as a coach in the collegiate ranks. Chizik began his career as a graduate assistant at both Middle Tennessee (1990-91) and Clemson (1988-89) before heading to Stephen F. Austin (1992-97). He then moved to Central Florida from 1998-2001 before making his first stop on The Plains (2002-04). Texas was his final post as an assistant coach. Chizik served as defensive coordinator with the Longhorns from 2005-06. Two seasons as the head coach at Iowa State (2007-08) preceded Chizik's tenure as head coach at Auburn (2009-current). He also spent two seasons coaching at the high school level in Florida.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

In 2010, in just his second season as head coach at Auburn, Gene Chizik led the Tigers to their first national championship in more than 50 years, defeating Oregon, 22-19, in the BCS Championship Game on Jan. 10, 2011, in Glendale, Ariz.

SEC CHAMPS

Chizik led Auburn to the Southeastern Conference Championship in 2010, the seventh in program history. The Tigers routed South Carolina, 56-17, at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta on Dec. 4, en route to the national title. It was also Auburn's seventh SEC West Title.

.750 WINNING PERCENTAGE

Auburn has a 30-10 record the last three seasons under Gene Chizik for a .750 winning percentage. The Tigers have posted no fewer than eight wins in each of his seasons as head coach. When playing at home, Auburn is 20-3 under Chizik.

ALL-SEC

Under Coach Chizik, eight Auburn players have been named All-SEC First Team, including current Tigers Steven Clark and Corey Lemonier.

GOING BOWLING

Auburn has been to three straight bowl games under Chizik, including the 2010 BCS Championship Game. In his first season as

head coach, the Tigers brought home a 38-35 overtime win over Northwestern at the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1, in Tampa, Fla. The following season, Auburn defeated Oregon, 22-19, for the national title, and in 2011, the Tigers earned a decisive, 43-24, victory against Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in Atlanta on Dec. 31.

RECRUITING

Auburn has signed three straight Top 10 national recruiting classes under Chizik.

TROPHIES

Since Chizik arrived on the Plains, four different Auburn players have been first-team All-America while also winning the Heisman Trophy, Lombardi Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Walter Camp Award and Maxwell Award. Chizik himself was named National Coach of the Year for 2010.

GRADUATION

Since Chizik was hired, 63 Tiger football players have earned their academic degrees from Auburn.

NFL DRAFT

Chizik has coached seven former Tigers who went on to become NFL draft picks, including Cam Newton, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers.

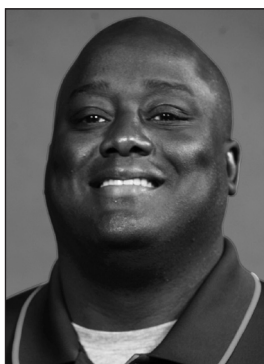
