THE GAME

Auburn (0-1, 0-0 SEC) visits Mississippi State (1-0, 0-0 SEC) in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams Saturday, September 8, 2012, at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field (55,082) in Starkville. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. CT and the game will be televised by ESPN and ESPN 3D. This will be the fifth time Auburn football has appeared on a 3D telecast.

FIRST AND 10

- Auburn begins its 79th season of Southeastern Conference play with Saturday's game at Mississippi State
- The Tigers are 45-28-5 in SEC openers, including an 18-1 mark in their last 19 league openers
- This is the 86th meeting between the schools in football; Auburn leads the series 60-23-2
- Coach Gene Chizik is 30-11 in his fourth season at Auburn; 35-30 in his sixth season overall as a head coach
- Auburn starts the season with two non-home games for the first time since 1984
- Auburn has new coordinators on both sides of the football for 2012, in defensive coordinator Brian Van Gorder and offensive coordinator Scot Loeffler
- Junior punter Steven Clark, one of three finalists for last year's Ray Guy Award, is one of two returning first team all-SEC honorees for Auburn, along with junior defensive end Corey Lemonier. Returnees Philip Lutzenkirchen (senior tight end) and Onterio McCalebb (senior all-purpose back) were second team all-SEC selections in 2011.
- Auburn's last two matchups with Mississippi State have been decided by the final drives
- Auburn's 2012 schedule features eight games against bowl participants from a year ago, including five that played in traditional New Year's games
- 15 players saw their first collegiate action for Auburn last Saturday

Series Records

The Tigers hold a 60-23-2 (.714) record all-time against Mississippi State and have won four straight against the Bulldogs. Auburn has faced Mississippi State in its last eight SEC openers.

Auburn has a 27-6 advantage in all games played at Auburn, a 12-4-1 lead in all games played at Starkville, and a 21-13-1 advantage in games played at neutral sites. Those include Birmingham, Ala. (AU leads 14-11-1); Columbus, Miss. (AU leads 1-0); Jackson, Miss. (AU leads 5-2); and Montgomery, Ala. (AU leads 1-0).

Auburn's last two games versus Mississippi State have come down to the final drives of the game. In 2010 at MSU, after a blocking a FG attempt by Auburn, MSU took over on its own 20 with 90 seconds remaining and moved the ball to the AU 41 with 45 seconds remaining. Auburn held MSU on an incomplete 4th and 10 pass with 22 seconds remaining to preserve the win.

In 2011 at Auburn, Ryan Smith made his first tackle of the season and fourth of his career when he stopped MSU QB Chris Relf at the goal line with a leg tackle on the final play of the game to preserve a 41-34 victory over the No. 16 Bulldogs.

SEC Openers

Auburn is 44-28-5 all-time in SEC openers, including a 17-1 mark in its last 18 league openers. In its last 14 SEC openers, Auburn has outscored its opponents 444-184. In SEC road openers, Auburn is 40-32-6 all-time since 1933.

After A Loss

The Tigers are 7-3 in games following a loss during the Gene Chizik era. Auburn followed up its last loss (to Alabama) with a win over Virginia in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl.

30+ Points Equals Victory

Auburn has won 74 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 291-4 all-time when scoring at least 30 points.

Road Starts

Auburn is now 78-36-6 all-time in road openers and 359-329-39 all-time in all games played away from Auburn. The Tigers have won seven of their last nine road openers.

This season is the 32nd time ever (first since 1984) and eighth since 1950 that Auburn has played its first two games outside of Auburn. It is also just the sixth time that Auburn has played its first two games outside of the state of Alabama.

Winningest Programs

Entering the 2012 campaign, Auburn ranks among the 15 winningest BCS college football programs in terms of all-time wins, now with 711 total victories. Teams that have 700+ all-time wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn and West Virginia.

Dominant D-Line

Auburn's veteran defensive line can account for 69 career starts among seven Tigers: Nosa Eguae, Corey Lemonier, Jeffrey Whitaker, Kenneth Carter, Gabe Wright, Dee Ford and Angelo Blackson.

That stellar group accounted for 22 tackles in the win over Clemson. Preseason All-American Corey Lemonier was credited with nine tackles and a pair of sacks (-7); that marks the third time in the past eight games that Lemonier recorded a multiple-sack game.

Junior Dee Ford had two sacks of Clemson's Tajh Boyd for -14 yards; those two sacks and his seven tackles overall were both career bests for Ford.

When Scoring 20+ Points

Since 2001, Auburn is 98-12 (.890) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 141-19-1 (.878) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

Auburn is 155-49-5 (.757) all-time in the month of September, and has won 31 of its last 37 September contests.

The Tigers have posted a winning record during the month of September each of the previous 13 seasons and 28 of the past 31, with the last losing September record coming in 1998 (1-2).

Rise And Shine

The Tigers are 5-1 in games with a morning kickoff (pre-noon local time) under head coach Gene Chizik, dating back through 2009.

Moving Up The Charts: The 1-2-3 Punch

Auburn's skilled senior 1-2-3 Punch on offense of receiver Emory Blake, tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen and tailback Onterio McCalebb continues to make its mark on the Tiger record book.

With a career-best 109 receiving yards versus Clemson, Emory Blake has moved to seventh on the Auburn career touchdown receptions list with 14 scores (tying Lawyer Tillman/1985-88 and Philip Lutzenkirchen/2009-12). Blake also moved up the all-time receiving yardage list; he now stands at 13th with 1,342 yards, jumping four spots over Devin Aromashodu/2002-05 (1,333), Alexander Wright/1986-89 (1,320), Ben Obomanu/2002-05 (1,313) and Thomas Bailey/1991-94 (1,243).

Ontario McCalebb rushed for 82 yards

against Clemson to improve to 13th on the Auburn all-time rushing list with 2,098 yards, passing Lionel James/1980-83 (2,086 yds) and James Bostic/1991-93 (2,084). McCalebb also had two receptions for six yards in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game, which moves him to fourth on the receptions by a running back list with 47 (tied with Stacy Danley) and fifth for receiving yardage by a running back with 494, passing Carnell Williams/2001-04.

Philip Lutzenkirchen is now fourth all-time in Auburn career receiving yards by a tight end, with 560. He passes Andy Fuller/1993-95, 494 yds; Lorenzo Diamond/1999-2002, 521 yds; Victor Hall/1989-91, 521 yds.

Parkey For Three

Against Clemson, Cody Parkey converted on four field goals in a game (37-46-27-36 yards) for the first time in his career, tying a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic record; he had three field goals last season vs. Florida Atlantic. The last Auburn kicker with four field goals in a game was Wes Byrum at Tennessee in 2009.

Parkey's 46-yard field goal in the third quarter was a career long for the junior kicker. Three of his four kicks on the night either ties the game or gave Auburn a lead. He has made 10 of his last 12 field goal attempts dating back through last year's Florida game. He is now 6-of-7 all-time in the Georgia Dome.

More Career Bests Vs. Clemson

Tre Mason recorded his first 100-yard career rushing game with 106 yards on 14 carries (7.6 ypc). Mason's 30-yard gain in the second quarter was his longest career rushing play.

Kiehl Frazier's 54-yard touchdown completion to Emory Blake in the first quarter was the longest pass play and scoring play of the

first-time starter's career. That play, and a 38-yard completion to Philip Lutzenkirchen, each exceed his passing total of 34 yards for the 2011 season. Frazier finished the game with 194 yards on 10-of-27 passing and a touchdown.

Ryan White led the team in tackles with 12, marking a new career best. His previous high was five vs. Florida Atlantic in 2011. Jermaine Whitehead also surpassed his previous best in tackles with 11.

First College Action

For Starters

When the Auburn-Mississippi State game kicks off, the Tigers will have a total of 36 players with at least one game of starting experience during their college careers. Tops among those are: Daren Bates (36); Nosa Eguae (24); Philip Lutzenkirchen (18); Emory Blake (16); and Corey Lemonier and Onterio McCalebb (15).

Making first career start vs. Clemson: Angelo Blackson on defense; Kiehl Frazier, Jay Prosch, Tunde Fariyike, Greg Robinson and Avery Young on offense.

In Non-Conference Games

Under Gene Chizik, the Tigers are 15-2 against non-conference opponents, their only losses coming versus Clemson, 38-24 in 2011 and 26-19 in this year's season opener. In non-conference matchups, Auburn is 11-0 at home, 0-1 in road games and 4-1 at neutral sites during the Chizik era.

The Captains

Auburn will select game captains during the 2012 football season.

Captains for the season opener versus Clemson were seniors T'Sharvan Bell, Onterio McCalebb, Daren Bates and Philip Lutzenkirchen.

The Coaching Staff

Auburn welcomes new coordinators on both sides of the football, in defensive coordinator Brian Van Gorder and offensive coordinator Scot Loeffler. With those additions, the Tigers

have a restructured coaching staff that also includes the addition of secondary coach Willie Martinez and the move of Tommy Thigpen, who coached safeties his first three years at Auburn (2009-11), to linebacker coach (the position he played at North Carolina and coached at UNC and Illinois prior to his arrival at AU).

Here's a breakdown of the Auburn coaching staff for the 2012 season.

On the field:

Senior Bowl Watch List

Five Auburn seniors are among the players listed on the 2013 Senior Bowl watch list: defensive back T'Sharvan Bell, wide receiver Emory Blake, tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen, tailback Onterio McCalebb and offensive lineman John Sullen.

The nation's premier all-star game unveiled its first ever "Watch List," highlighting 312 seniors and top NFL draft prospects from 114 different schools to keep an eye on during the 2012 college football season. The top 100

seniors in the country will be invited to participate in the 2013 Senior Bowl, set for Saturday, January 26, in Mobile's Ladd-Peebles Stadium. The SEC led all conferences with 71 players on the watch list.

James Owens Courage Award

The Auburn Athletics Department will present the first James Owens Courage Award to the man who broke the color barrier on the football field at Auburn.

Owens, who became the first African-American scholarship football player at Auburn in 1969, will receive the inaugural award named in his honor. It will be presented to Owens on the field at the Louisiana-Monroe game at Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 15.

"James Owens is an Auburn icon and one of the most important figures in the storied history of Auburn football," Director of Athletics Jay Jacobs said. "It is only fitting that he is the first recipient of this new award named in his honor. James displayed incredible courage in the face of tremendous adversity and became one of the heroes of the 1972 Amazin's. He forever changed Auburn football for the better, and the establishment of the James Owens Courage Award will ensure that we never forget what he means to Auburn University."

The James Owens Courage Award will be presented annually to a current or former Auburn football player who has displayed courage in the face of adversity, distinguishing himself while contributing to the betterment of Auburn University.

A Fairfield native, Owens lettered at Auburn as a fullback from 1969-72. During three seasons on the varsity, he helped Auburn to a 28-5 record and played a key role on the 1972 Amazin's team, which defied the odds and finished the season with a 10-1 record and a top five national finish.

The New Orleans Saints drafted Owens in the 11th round of the NFL Draft after his senior season at Auburn.

Where They Go Next

Playing their first home game of the 2012 campaign, Auburn hosts Louisiana-Monroe in an 11:21 a.m. CT contest Saturday, September 15, at Jordan-Hare Stadium that will be televised by the SEC Network. Mississippi State is at Troy that evening.

LAST MEETING WITH MISSISSIPPI STATE

Ryan Smith made a game-saving tackle on Mississippi State QB Chris Relf at the goal line as time expired to preserve Auburn's 41-34 victory over No. 16 Mississippi State. The two teams combined for 28 first quarter points and 55 first half points before both defenses tightened up and Auburn won its 17th consecutive game, currently the longest in FBS.

Barrett Trotter, who finished the game 16-for-23 for 146 yards with two touchdowns and an interception, hit tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen for a 10-yard touchdown pass just under a minute into the fourth quarter to give Auburn a 14-point cushion, 41-27. Auburn, which trailed just once in the game, won its seventh straight game against a team ranked in the AP poll.

Trotter's favorite target on the afternoon was Emory Blake, who caught seven passes for 108 yards with a touchdown. Blake's touchdown catch, a 46-yard catch-and-run, tied the game at 21-21 in the second quarter as Auburn scored 17 points in the second quarter to take a 31-24 lead into the half.

Michael Dyer rushed for 150 yards on 18 carries, averaging 8.3 yards per carry, scoring twice. His first touchdown came on Auburn's first possession of the game when he went 35 yards for the score to put Auburn up, 7-0. His second touchdown gave Auburn the lead for good at 28-21 with 4:51 left in the first half as he went in from two yards out to cap a six-play, 59-yard drive.

Auburn took a 14-0 lead less than four minutes into the game as Demetruce McNeal returned a Relf interception 43 yards for the score.

Mississippi State wasted little time answering as LaDarius Perkins (11 rushes, 78 yards), scored on a 40-yard run less than a minute after McNeal's score and then Relf found Brandon Heavens for a 15-yard touchdown pass four minutes later to tie it at 14-14.

Relf finished the game 20-for-33 for 195 yards with a touchdown and an interception and also rushed 27 times for 106 yards.

Vick Ballard was the top rusher for Mississippi State, tallying 135 yards on 21 carries. Relf was right behind him with 106 yards on 27 carries, giving the Bulldogs a pair of 100-yard rushers.

Cody Parkey hit a pair of field goals for Auburn, connecting from 43 yards out right before the half to put Auburn up, 31-24, and then again right after the half to put Auburn ahead, 34-24.

The field goals were the first of Parkey's collegiate career. The first, the 43-yarder, came after Auburn took over possession with 40 seconds left in the half.

Defensively for the Tigers, Daren Bates led the team with 12 tackles, followed by Neiko Thorpe with 11. Nosa Eguae tallied nine while T'Sharvan Bell and McNeal notched eight apiece. Corey Lemonier had a team-high two tackles for loss, including Auburn's lone sack of the day.

GAME 1

Cody Parkey made a career-high four field goals and Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards for Auburn but No. 14 Clemson edged past the Tigers for a hard-fought 26-19 victory in the Chick-fil-A Game in the season opener for both teams at the Georgia Dome on Saturday.

Emory Blake caught four passes for a career-high 109 yards and a touchdown while sophomore Kiehl Frazier threw for 194 yards and one touchdown on 11-of-27 passing and one interception in his first career start for Auburn. Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards while Onterio McCalebb add 82 yards.

The game was tied at 16 entering the final quarter after Parkey tied with a field goal with 55 seconds left in the third. Daren Bates intercepted Tajh Boyd and returned it 12 yards to the Clemson 35 on the first play of the fourth quarter. It set up Parkey making his career-high fourth field goal of the game, a 36-yarder to give Auburn a 19-16 lead with 12:50 remaining.

Clemson then scored the final 10 points of the game to outlast Auburn.

In the back-and-forth game, Clemson came right back on a 10-play, 75-yard drive as Boyd threw a 4-yard fade route to DeAndre Hopkins, who had a Clemson single-game record 13 receptions for 119 yards, in the back right corner of the end zone as Clemson took the lead for good, 23-19, with 9:17 left.

Clemson stopped Auburn on the next possession and drove 79 yards on the strength of Andre Ellington's 45-yard run to the Auburn 8. Auburn's defense stopped Clemson at the 1-yard line for the second time to give itself another shot. Chandler Catanzaro made his fourth field goal of the game for a 26-19 Clemson lead with 1:24 left.

Ellington rushed for 228 yards on 25 carries while Boyd threw for 208 yards and a touchdown on 24-of-34 passing.

Clemson opened the game's scoring as Catanzaro made a 39-yard field goal with 5:22 left in the first quarter. Auburn's defense held after Clemson drove 83 yards down to the Auburn 1-yard line.

Catanzaro made a 40-yard field goal to bring Clemson to within 7-6 after the Tigers recovered a Tre Mason fumble just past midfield. Auburn had driven from its own 1-yard line to the Clemson 48 before Auburn's impressive drive ended with the turnover on the first possession of the second quarter.

Ellington's 68-yard run to the Auburn 15 followed by a Ryan White personal foul penalty set up Clemson's first touchdown on a 7-yard run by Roderick McDowell for a 13-7 Clemson lead with 7:26 left in the half. Clemson's drive covered 85 yards in only three plays.

Parkey's 37-yard field goal closed Auburn to within 13-10 with 1:24 before the half. On the drive, Frazier's 38-yard completion to Philip Lutzenkirchen to the Clemson 13 was the big play.

The Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record crowd of 75,211 saw Auburn gain 374 yards on 64 plays while Clemson had 528 yards total offense on 87 plays. Auburn rushed for 180 yards to Clemson's 320, 228 of it from Ellington.

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The most recent addition to the stadium was the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame

coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 19 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 28 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won .797 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its inception in 1939 and hold an overall record of 285-70-7 there.

COACHING LEDGER

The 2012 season is Gene Chizik's 25th season as a coach in the collegiate ranks. Chizik began his career as a graduate assistant at both Middle Tennessee (1990-91) and Clemson (1988-89) before heading to Stephen F. Austin (1992-97). He then moved to Central Florida from 1998-2001 before making his first stop on The Plains (2002-04). Texas was his final post as an assistant coach. Chizik served as defensive coordinator with the Longhorns from 2005-06. Two seasons as the head coach at Iowa State (2007-08) preceded Chizik's tenure as head coach at Auburn (2009-current). He also spent two seasons coaching at the high school level in Florida.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

In 2010, in just his second season as head coach at Auburn, Gene Chizik led the Tigers to their first national championship in more than 50 years, defeating Oregon, 22-19, in the BCS Championship Game on Jan. 10, 2011, in Glendale, Ariz.

SEC CHAMPS

Chizik led Auburn to the Southeastern Conference Championship in 2010, the seventh in program history. The Tigers routed South Carolina, 56-17, at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta on Dec. 4, en route to the national title. It was also Auburn's seventh SEC West Title.

.750 WINNING PERCENTAGE

Auburn has a 30-11 record the last three seasons under Gene Chizik for a .732 winning percentage. The Tigers have posted no fewer than eight wins in each of his seasons as head coach. When playing at home, Auburn is 20-3 under Chizik.

ALL-SEC

Under Coach Chizik, eight Auburn players have been named All-SEC First Team, including current Tigers Steven Clark and Corey Lemonier.

GOING BOWLING

Auburn has been to three straight bowl games under Chizik, including the 2010 BCS Championship Game. In his first season as

head coach, the Tigers brought home a 38-35 overtime win over Northwestern at the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1, in Tampa, Fla. The following season, Auburn defeated Oregon, 22-19, for the national title, and in 2011, the Tigers earned a decisive, 43-24, victory against Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in Atlanta on Dec. 31.

RECRUITING

Auburn has signed three straight Top 10 national recruiting classes under Chizik.

TROPHIES

Since Chizik arrived on the Plains, four different Auburn players have been first-team All-America while also winning the Heisman Trophy, Lombardi Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Walter Camp Award and Maxwell Award. Chizik himself was named National Coach of the Year for 2010.

GRADUATION

Since Chizik was hired, 63 Tiger football players have earned their academic degrees from Auburn.

NFL DRAFT

Chizik has coached seven former Tigers who went on to become NFL draft picks, including Cam Newton, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers.

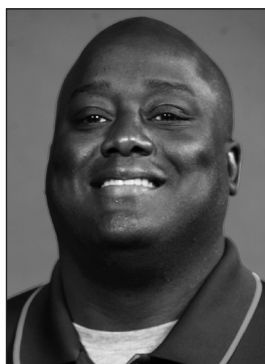
