### COASTAL CAROLINA VS. AUBURN

- The Chanticleers are 0-1 all-time against the Auburn Tigers.
- The teams met on Dec. 17, 1995, in Auburn with the Tigers winning 82-66.
- Current Chanticleer head coach Cliff Ellis was in his second as Auburn's head coach at the time.

### LAST TIME OUT

- Coastal Carolina defeated in-state foe South Carolina State 66-52 on Tuesday evening.
- Coastal tallied 42 total rebounds for a plus-13 advantage on the boards and connected on nine 3-pointers.
- Coastal's dominate performance on the glass was directed by Badou Diagne's 11-rebound effort, while Josh Cameron led the way in threes with four. Diagne also scored 14 points, marking his second double-double of the season. Cameron matched Diagne's scoring output with 14 of his own on 5-of-9 from the floor, including 4-of-6 from deep.

## COACH ELLIS VS. AUBURN

- Head coach Cliff Ellis is 2-0 all-time against Auburn. He led South Alabama to a 95-73 victory during the 1983 Colonial Classic in Mobile, Ala. Ellis' second win against Auburn came by way of a 84-72 decision on March 18, 1993 as the head coach of Clemson.

## COASTAL CAROLINA VS. THE SEC

- Coastal Carolina is 3-12 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference.
- Coastal picked up its first win over an SEC member on Dec. 11, 1993, defeating South Carolina 88-74 in Columbia.
- Coastal's next victory against the SEC came on Dec. 13, 2010 at LSU with a 78-69 overtime decision. The Chants defeated the Tigers again the following year in Conway by a 71-63 score.
- The Chanticleers have lost their last two contests against SEC foes, falling at Ole Miss by a 72-90 score in 2012 and again to the Rebels at home last season (70-72). [Coastal travels to Ole Miss to complete the three-game series on Thurs., Dec. 18]

## ELLIS' RETURN TO AUBURN

- Friday's contest marks head coach Cliff Ellis' first return to Auburn since departing the university following the 2004 season. Ellis led the Auburn from 1994-2004, guiding the Tigers to a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament in 1999. Ellis was also named the 1999 AP National Coach of the Year. In all, Ellis compiled 177-128 overall record, won the 1999 SEC regular season title and took the Tigers to three NCAA Tournaments (1999, 2000, 2003).

## WE'VE BEEN DOWN THIS ROAD BEFORE

- Friday will not be coach Ellis' first time leading Coastal against one of his former programs. Ellis has led the Chanticleers against Clemson, which he coached from 1984-94, three times.
- Coastal and Clemson first met with Ellis on the sideline on Nov. 22, 2011, in the Tigers' Littlejohn Coliseum. Coastal would win the game 60-59 on a Chris Gradnigo tip-in as time expired.
- The Chants then hosted Clemson on Dec. 19, 2012 and handily defeated the Tigers 69-46 in front of a capacity crowd at The HTC Center.
- Clemson took the final game of the three-game series with a 69-40 home win last season.

## SETTING UP FOR SUCCESS

- Coastal Carolina has set itself up for success with strong defense in the first half for much of the season. Through seven games, only UCLA and Chattanooga have scored more than 30 points in the first half. UCLA held a slim 32-28 lead at the break, while Chattanooga trailed the Chants 40-35 at the half. The Chants are 5-1 this season when holding a lead at the half.

## THE SCORING STREAK COMES TO AN END

- Warren Gillis put together one of the more impressive scoring streaks in recent Chanticleer basketball memory. He ended last season scoring in double-figures in 21 straight games and scored 10-plus in CCU's first six games this season to total a double-digit scoring streak to 27 straight games.
- Gillis failed to reach double-figures on Tuesday, Dec. 2, 2014, against SC State as he finished with eight on a 3-of-10 shooting night.
- Coincidentally, the previous time Gillis failed to reach double-digits in the points column was Dec. 30, 2013, against SC State as he closed that contest with nine points.

## SCORING POINTS AND PLAYING STRONG DEFENSE

- Through seven games this season the Chanticleers are averaging 71.7 points and allowing just 54.6 points per game for a +17.1 scoring margin. CCU's 71.7 points per game ranks third in the Big South, while the 54.6 points against and 17.1 point scoring margin are both tops among conference schools.
- Offensively the Chanticleers rank second in the Big South with a .440 field goal percentage and third with a .347 3-point field goal percentage. Individually, Josh Cameron (14.6 ppg), Warren Gillis (12.0 ppg) and Shivaughn Wiggins (10.4 ppg) rank in the top 30 of the league's individual scoring list.
- Defensively, Coastal also ranks atop the league in field goal percentage defense (.352), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.269) and defensive rebounds (30.3 per game).

### COACHING & CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- 2014 Gene Bartow Award recipient from Colleg Insider.com.
- Led Chanticleers to NCAA Tournament in 2013-14 — the school's first since 1993 — to become one of 12 coaches in NCAA history to lead four different Division I programs to NCAA Tournament.
- Directed Chanticleers to three consecutive postseason appearances (2010-12).
- One of two coaches in NCAA Division I history to win 100 games with four different programs, joining Lefty Driesell.
- Guided Coastal to a combined 56-13 record in 2009-10 and 2010-11, setting the Big South record for most wins in back-to-back seasons (school-record 28 wins both years).
- Directed Chanticleers to a Big South-record 16 conference wins in 2010-11.
- Coastal Carolina was the first team in Big South history to improve from eighth-place the previous year to regular-season conference champions in 2009-10.
- Is the 10th winningest active Division I coach by victories (668) and is 27th all-time in Division I wins.
- Has made 23 postseason appearances in his career (13 NIT, 9 NCAA, 1 CIT).
- A six-time conference Coach of the Year during his career (Sun Belt, ACC, SEC and Big South).
- Led Auburn to a school-record 29-4 mark in 1998-99, as well as SEC title, No. 1 seed in NCAA Tournament and "Sweet Sixteen" appearance.
- Was named the 1999 SEC and National Coach of the Year by six different organizations, including the John and Nellie Wooden and Associated Press awards.
- Led Clemson to the 1990 ACC title, the only one in school history.
- Named ACC, NABC and USBWA District III Coach of the Year in 1990, as well as ACC and District Coach of the Year in 1987.
- .671 winning percentage at South Alabama is the highest in school history.
- Led South Alabama to three Sun Belt Conference Championships, two NCAA Tournament appearances and a Top 10 national ranking during his tenure.
- Also served as Athletic Director at South Alabama and was inducted into the Mobile Sports Hall of Fame in 2003 for his work with the Jaguars' basketball program.
- Is an accomplished recording artist with several albums.



## GILLIS 19 AWAY FROM 1,000

- Warren Gillis is just 19 points shy of becoming just the 19th member of Coastal Carolina's 1,000 point club.
- Gillis has scored 981 points in his 98 career games for a 10.01 points per game average.
- At his current pace (12.0 ppg), Gillis will eclipse the 1,000 career points plateau on Dec. 11 at home against Warren Wilson.
- Gillis has played with two of Coastal's 18 all-time 1,000-point scorers. The senior shared the court with both Anthony Raffa (1,470 points) and Kierre Greenwood (1,119 points) during both the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons.
- Gillis will need to score 341 more points this season to reach the CCU all-time top-10 career scoring list.

## LEADING (SIXTH) MAN

- Senior guard Josh Cameron has fully adapted to the sixth man role this season and currently leads the Chanticleers with 14.7 points per game. Cameron, a natural shooting guard, started the final 26 of last season at point guard; however, with the arrival of true point guard Shivaughn Wiggins, Cameron relinquished his point guard duties.
- This season Cameron has been the first Chant off the bench in six of the seven games and has led Coastal in scoring four times.
- Cameron has spent time this season playing both the point and shooting guard positions and averages 20.0 minutes per game.

## PLAYING AGAINST THE BIG BOYS

- Since the 2010-11 season Coastal Carolina 11 contests against Power 5 Conference schools. Coastal is 4-7 in those contests with a pair of wins over both LSU and Clemson.
- Coastal has already played UCLA this season (lost 71-84 on Nov. 16) and has games scheduled at Auburn and Ole Miss in December.

- The Chants recorded 50-plus rebounds in back-to-back games against Columbia International and Piedmont International.
- Individually, Badou Diagne leads the Chants on the boards, averaging 7.3 per game to rank fourth-best in the Big South.

## BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS MAINLAND BRACKET RECAP

- Coastal Carolina spent the Thanksgiving holiday competing in the Mainland Bracket of the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament, hosted by Chattanooga. The Chanticleers defeated Louisiana-Monroe in their opening game by a 61-48 score. The Chants ultimately fell 67-78 to the host Mocs in the title game on Thanksgiving Day.
- Shivaughn Wiggins lead Coastal's offensive efforts at the event, averaging 15.5 points. Josh Cameron was close behind Wiggins, tallying 15.0 points per game. Badou Diagne was CCU's leading rebounder, averaging 6.0 per contest.

## 5 DAYS ... 3 GAMES ... 2 COASTS

- The 2014-15 Chanticleers have one of the more peculiar and ambitious season-opening stretches in the country. Coastal opens the season at home Friday, Nov. 14 against Trinity Baptist before heading west to play UCLA on Sunday, Nov. 16, followed by a home contest on Tuesday, Nov. 18 against Columbia International.
- For those counting at home, the Chanticleers traveled 5,074 miles (round trip) in a 36-hour span with a game against one of college basketball's perennial powers highlighting the trip.
- Coastal went 2-1 during the stretch with a 79-36 win over Trinity Baptist, a 71-84 defeat at UCLA and a 82-51 victory over Columbia International.

## WARREN G ... THE REGULATOR

• Senior Warren Gillis was the man that made Coastal tick during the 2013-14 season. Not only did the Philadelphia native average a career-high 14.7 points per game a year ago, but he also led the Chanticleers with 106 assists. The versatile guard earned second team All-Big South honors for his efforts during the regular season. He then went on to be named the Big South Tournament MVP as he averaged a blistering 17.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per game en route to leading the Chanticleers to their first conference tournament title since 1993. This season Gillis was named to the conference's preseason first team as the veteran prepares to lace up for his final season in a Chanticleer uniform.

## WILSON ONE OF THE BEST FRESHMAN IN THE NATION IN 2013-14

• Elijah Wilson turned in a phenomenal rookie campaign during the 2013-14 season. He led the Chants in scoring with 537 points while breaking Coastal Carolina Hall of Fame member Jack Leasure's freshman scoring record by 117 points. He also broke the school's freshman field goals made record which stood for 29 years with 200 made baskets. The previous record was held by William Calvin who made 156 shots during the 1984-85 season.

• Wilson finished the season as the 12th ranked freshman scorer in the country at 15.8 points per game. In addition, he ranked 10th-best in the Big South.

## GILLIS AND WILSON NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

• Warren Gillis was named to the Big South Conference's preseason first team, while Elijah Wilson was named to the second team.

• Gillis, one of two Chanticleer seniors on the 2014-15 roster, was named second team All-Big South and the Big South Tournament MVP a year ago. He is coming off a career-best season that featured 14.7 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. Moreover, the Philadelphia native closed the season on a 21-game double-digit scoring streak.

• Wilson, who was named to the All-Freshman team and honorable mention All-Big South last year, is coming off the finest freshman campaign in Coastal history. The Wilmington, N.C., product scored a CCU freshman record 537 points on 200 made field goals for a team-leading 15.8 points per outing. His point production also ranked him as the 12th-highest freshman scorer in the NCAA.

## JUST THE TWO OF US

• Head coach Cliff Ellis became just the second coach in NCAA Division I history to win 100 or more games at four different institutions during the 2012-13 season. Coach Ellis has won 100 or more games at South Alabama (171), Clemson (177), Auburn (186) and Coastal Carolina (134). He joined Lefty Driesell who won 100 or more games at Davidson (176), Maryland (348), James Madison (159) and Georgia State (103).

## CHANTICLEERS TABBED AS PRESEASON FAVORITE

• After winning the 2014 VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Basketball Championship and turning in a 21-win season, Coastal Carolina men's basketball has been selected as the preseason favorite to repeat as conference champions by the league's head coaches and media members.

• The Chanticleers garnered 297 total points and 14 of 29 first-place votes to edge out 2013-14 regular season champion High Point (293 total points and 12 first-place votes) as the league favorite by four points. Radford received one first-place vote and 233 total points to finish third in the poll followed by Winthrop (221 total points) and Charleston Southern (199 total points and on first-place vote). UNC Asheville also picked up a first-place vote and 191 total points to finish sixth. Gardner-Webb (168), Campbell (113), Liberty (85), Presbyterian College (67) and Longwood (47) rounded out the poll.

• In addition, Sports Illustrated projected the Chanticleers to be a No. 16 seed in the 2015 NCAA Tournament in the publication's annual NCAA basketball preview issue. Also, CBS Sports College Basketball "Bracket Guru" Jerry Palm has the Chants as a No. 14 seed in his preseason bracket.

### REBOUNDING AND THREES LEAD CHANTS PAST SC STATE

**CONWAY** - Fueled by 42 total rebounds for a plus-13 advantage on the boards and nine 3-pointers the Coastal Carolina men's basketball team dispatched in-state foe South Carolina State 66-52 Tuesday evening inside The HTC Center.

Coastal's dominate performance on the glass was directed by Badou Diagne's 11-rebound effort, while Josh Cameron led the way in threes with four. Diagne also scored 14 points, marking his second double-double of the season. Cameron matched Diagne's scoring output with 14 of his own on 5-of-9 from the floor, including 4-of-6 from deep.

Coastal improved to 5-1 overall with the victory, while SC State dropped to 1-5. The teams will meet again on Dec. 14 in Orangeburg.

With Coastal leading 11-7, SC State's Gerdarius Troutman connected on a three to pull the Bulldogs with a point. However, Coastal's Cameron responded with a three of his own and after a defensive stop Diagne followed with his second thunderous dunk of the half to ignite a 16-8 Chanticleer run. Shivaughn Wiggins capped the scoring outburst with a triple from the left wing, giving Coastal a 12-point lead at 30-18 with 3:27 to play before the half.

Warren Gillis scored a floater in the lane and Tristian Curtis counted a free throw to conclude Coastal's scoring for the half. SC State's Greg Mortimer made a pair at the line and Tashombe Riley scored on a tip-in to cut Coastal lead to 33-26 at the intermission.

SC State's 26 points at the half marked the sixth time in the season's opening seven games that the Chants had held its opponents to less than 30 first-half points.

The opening 10 minutes of the second half turned into a 3-point shooting contest with SC State connecting on five from deep and the Chants three. Each time the Bulldogs cut Coastal's lead to a single possession, the white-clad Chanticleers answered with a trey to keep SC State at bay.

Coastal led 45-40 when Cameron hits his first 3-pointer of the second half with 10:54 to play. Cameron then connected on two more threes and converted a fast-break layup during a three minute stretch to outscore the Bulldogs 11-6 and push the Chants back out to a 10-point lead at 56-46 with 7:39 to play.

SC State cut Coastal lead to eight at 58-50 with an alley-oop by Ty Soloman to Darryl Palmer, but the Chants clamped down defensively and took advantage of four Bulldog turnovers during the next minute to stretch the lead back to double-figures.

The Bulldogs would get no closer through the late stages of the game as Coastal closed the contest on a 6-0 run to provide the 66-52 final.

Coastal finished the contest connecting on 24-of-49 attempts for a 49.0 field goal percentage, while SC State was 17-of-55 (30.9 percent) from the floor. The Chanticleers also outscored the Bulldogs 24-10 in the paint.
