ARKANSAS HITS ROAD FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK

- ▶ The Razorbacks head back out on the road, traveling to Auburn, Ala., this week to take on the Auburn Tigers. Last week, Arkansas played its first road conference game and fell at Texas A&M while Auburn had a bye. In their last game, Auburn was defeated at home by LSU.
- ▶ The Razorbacks have won four of the last six games in the series with Auburn, and the teams have split the last two meetings at Auburn.
- ▶ Arkansas ran 98 plays on offense at Texas A&M, the most by an SEC team since 2007 and tied for the 9th-highest single-game total in SEC history. The 98 plays also are tied for the 7th-highest single-game total in the NCAA this year.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton broke the SEC and Arkansas single-game records with 303 receiving yards vs. Rutgers. Hamilton's total broke the SEC record of 291 set by LSU's Josh Reed in 2001 and the UA record of 281 set by Jarius Wright vs. Texas A&M in 2011. Hamilton's 303 receiving yards ranks as the 15th-highest single-game total in NCAA history.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton broke the SEC record for yards-per-catch average in a game (min. 10 receptions) with 303 receiving yards on 10 receptions vs. Rutgers. His average of 30.3 yards per catch broke the previous conference record of 23.3 set by Tennessee's Kelley Washington in 2001.

THE TEAM

- Arkansas ranks 3rd in the SEC and 21st in the NCAA with an average of 310.4 passing yards per game.
- ▶ Arkansas is the only SEC team and one of six in the NCAA to pass for 400 yards in multiple games this season. UA accounted for 419 yards through the air vs. Rutgers and for 400 vs. Jacksonville State.
- ▶ The Razorbacks are 3rd in the SEC and 15th in the country in net punting, earning an average of 41.16 yards per punt.
- ▶ The Razorbacks are tied for 3rd in the SEC with an average of 1.40 sacks per game allowed.

OUARTERBACKS

- ▶ Tyler Wilson holds 12 school records, including career completion percentage (61.1). He has accounted for the top-two single-game passing yards and total offense yards totals and produced three of the top-four single-game pass completions totals. He also ranks in the top 10 in school history in career passing touchdowns (40), career pass completions (423), career passing yards (5,733), career pass attempts (692), career total offense yards (5,679) and career touchdown responsibility (44).
- ▶ Tyler Wilson is averaging 7.38 yards of total offense per play in his career, which is the highest for an active SEC player and the 4th-highest average among active players in the NCAA.
- ▶ Tyler Wilson leads the NCAA with his average of 17.15 yards per completion. He also is tied for the SEC lead and for 4th in the NCAA with 17 passes of 25 or more yards. He ranks second in the SEC and 6th in the NCAA with an average of 8.84 yards of total offense per play. Wilson also ranks 2nd in the SEC and 10th in the NCAA with his average of 9.34 yards per pass attempt.

- ▶ Tyler Wilson leads the SEC and ranks 7th in the NCAA with his average of 338.8 passing yards per game. He also ranks 2nd in the SEC and 12th in the NCAA with an average of 338.0 yards of total offense per game.
- ▶ Tyler Wilson broke the Arkansas single-game records for pass attempts and total offense plays at Texas A&M. Wilson's 59 pass attempts broke the previous record of 52 set by Clint Stoerner at Alabama in 1999, and Wilson's 62 total plays broke the previous record of 57 he set vs. Texas A&M last season.
- ▶ Tyler Wilson accounted for 426 yards of total offense vs. Rutgers, the 2nd-highest single-game total in school history and 2nd-most in the SEC this season. Wilson set the school record with 481 yards of total offense vs. Texas A&M in 2011.
- ▶ Tyler Wilson passed for 419 yards vs. Rutgers, the 2nd-highest single-game total in school history and 2nd-most in the SEC this season. Wilson owns the top-two single-game passing marks in school history after setting the school record with 510 yards last season vs. Texas A&M.
- ▶ Tyler Wilson is in his second season as Arkansas' starting quarterback and in contention for many major awards. He boasts a career record of 12-5 as a starter having defeated Missouri State, New Mexico, Troy, Texas A&M, Auburn, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Tennessee, Mississippi State, Kansas State and Jacksonville State.
- ▶ Tyler Wilson opened the season 19-of-27 passing for 367 yards and three touchdowns in a 49-24 win vs. Jacksonville State. His passing yards total was the most in school history for a season-opening game, the 11th-highest single-game performance in school history, and his three touchdowns tied the school record for a season opener.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman Brandon Allen made the first start of his collegiate career vs. No. 1 Alabama and completed 10-of-18 passes for 60 yards, connecting with six different receivers throughout the game. Allen has appeared in three games this season and is 20-of-45 for 178 yards and one touchdown. He recorded his first collegiate passing touchdown on a 13-yard strike to Mekale McKay on the first offensive drive of the second half vs. ULM.

RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- ▶ Biletnikoff Award contender Cobi Hamilton leads all active NCAA players with his career average of 18.2 yards per reception. Hamilton also is tied for second among active SEC players and for 10th among active players in the NCAA with 17 receiving touchdowns.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton leads the SEC and ranks 9th in the NCAA with his average of 118.2 receiving yards per game. He also ranks 3rd in the SEC with his average of 6.2 receptions per game.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton is tied for 4th on UA's all-time career touchdown receptions list with 17 and is tied for 5th in school history with six career 100-yard receiving games. He also ranks 7th on UA's all-time career list with 2,110 receiving yards and ranks 13th in school history with 116 receptions.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton broke the Arkansas record for receiving yards in consecutive games with a total of 465 yards vs. Rutgers and at Texas A&M. Hamilton broke the SEC single-game record with 303 yards against the Scarlet Knights before putting up 162 yards the next week at Texas A&M to break the previous UA record of 367 set by Derek Holloway with 171 in the 1981 Gator Bowl vs. North Carolina and 192 in the 1982 season opener vs. Tulsa.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton was named SEC co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance vs. Rutgers. Hamilton broke the SEC and Arkansas single-game records with 303 receiving yards, tied for the 15th-highest single-game total in NCAA FBS history, on 10 receptions with three touchdowns. His 30.3 yards-per-catch average broke the SEC record (min. 10 receptions) and his three receiving touchdowns tied the Arkansas record as he became just the third Razorback in school history with three touchdown catches in a game.

ARKANSAS CAREER ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

▶ Cobi Hamilton tied the Arkansas record and became just the third Razorback in school history to hav
three touchdown receptions in one game with three scores vs. Rutgers. His three touchdowns marked th
first time since 1999 a Razorback recorded three touchdown receptions in one game.

- ▶ Cobi Hamilton accounted for 303 all-purpose yards, the highest single-game total in the SEC this season, tied for the 3rd-highest single-game total in the NCAA this season and the 3rd-highest single-game total in school history, on 10 receptions vs. Rutgers.
- ▶ Arkansas and Georgia are tied for the SEC lead with four 100-yard receiving games and are the only two schools in the conference with three different receivers to have at least one 100-yard receiving game. Brandon Mitchell and Chris Gragg each topped 100 receiving yards vs. Jacksonville State, marking the first time since 2009 Arkansas had two 100-yard receivers in one game. Mitchell finished the game, his first at wide receiver, with 122 yards on four receptions and Gragg had 110 yards and two touchdowns on a team-high seven catches for the second 100-yard receiving game of his career. Cobi Hamilton became the third Razorback with a 100-yard receiving game this season when he caught 10 passes for an SEC-record 303 yards and three touchdowns vs. Rutgers and added another 100-yard receiving game the next week with 162 yards at Texas A&M.
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton has caught at least one pass in 27 straight games, the longest active streak in the SEC and tied for the 10th-longest active streak in the NCAA.
- ▶ Mackey Award candidate Chris Gragg is tied for 4th in the NCAA among tight ends with his average of 4.8 receptions per game. Overall, Gragg is tied for 7th in the SEC in receptions per game and ranks 12th in the conference in receiving yards per game with his average of 58.5.
- ▶ Chris Gragg's two touchdown catches vs. Jacksonville State were the most in the SEC in week one, and his seven receptions were the most by a tight end in the SEC and tied for the 6th-most overall in the conference in the first week of the season.
- ▶ Chris Gragg, who graduated with a bachelor's degree in sports management in May, leads a talented group of tight ends. Gragg has started 19 games in his career and caught 69 passes for 948 yards and six touchdowns.
- ▶ Javontee Herndon made the first touchdown reception of his career in the season opener vs. Jacksonville State. The junior finished the game with a career-high-tying four receptions for a career-high 96 yards, including a career-long 63 yarder, and one touchdown.
- ▶ The Razorbacks' tight end group brings a mix of experience and newcomers behind Chris Gragg. Junior Austin Tate has seen action in 29 games and made 11 receptions for 83 yards, while redshirt freshman Alex Voelzke and true freshman Demetrius Dean also factor in the rotation.

RUNNING BACKS

- ▶ Knile Davis has rushed 82 times for 263 yards and two touchdowns in the first five games of 2012. Davis, who missed the 2011 season due to injury, was named to watch lists for the Doak Walker, Maxwell and Walter Camp awards prior to the 2012 season.
- ▶ Knile Davis is tied for 15th on UA's all-time career touchdowns scored list. Davis scored the 21st touchdown of his career on a career-long 64-yard reception at Texas A&M and has three total touchdowns this season.
- ▶ Knile Davis led the Razorbacks with 59 rushing yards vs. No. 1 Alabama. His rushing yards total is the most the Crimson Tide defense has allowed to an opposing individual in their last seven games, dating back to last season vs. Georgia Southern.
- ▶ Dennis Johnson leads all active SEC players and ranks 3rd among active players in the NCAA with 4,566 career all-purpose yards, the 3rd-highest total in school history.
- ▶ Dennis Johnson is averaging 6.30 yards per carry in 2012 with 170 yards on 27 carries and has not had a rush for negative yardage. Last season, Johnson's average of 6.32 yards per carry led all SEC rushers with at least 100 carries.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- ▶ Arkansas opened the Texas A&M game with the following starters on the offensive line: David Hurd (OT), Tyler Deacon (OG), Travis Swanson (C), Alvin Bailey (OG) and Jason Peacock (OT). Swanson and Bailey each have started all 31 games of their collegiate careers.
- ▶ The Razorbacks did not allow a sack against Texas A&M, which entered the game leading the NCAA with an average of 5.33 sacks per game.
- ▶ Alvin Bailey was named to the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award watch lists prior to the 2012 season. He also was selected as a preseason first-team All-American and All-SEC performer by *Athlon* and was a preseason second-team All-SEC pick by the conference's coaches and media.
- ▶ Travis Swanson, voted as one of six team captains for the 2012 season, was named to the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists and was selected as a preseason third-team All-SEC performer by the conference's coaches.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- ▶ The defensive line is one of Arkansas' deepest position groups as seven different defensive linemen have starts on their resume, led by DeQuinta Jones' 25 and Byran Jones' 22.
- ▶ Chris Smith leads the team with five quarterback hurries and 2.0 sacks, and Robert Thomas is tied with Trey Flowers for the team lead with 3.5 tackles for loss.
- ▶ Byran Jones leads the defensive linemen in tackles with 23.
- ▶ Robert Thomas led the Razorbacks with 2.0 tackles for loss vs. ULM as the defensive linemen accounted for 4.0 of UA's 5.0 TFLs in the game.
- ▶ Chris Smith was named SEC co-Defensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 3 after he led the defensive linemen with a career-high-tying six tackles, 1.0 for loss with 1.0 sack, and one quarterback hurry vs. Jacksonville State.
- ▶ Defensive tackle Alfred Davis was voted one of six team captains for the 2012 season. He has played in 38 consecutive games and graduated in May with a bachelor's degree in sports management.
- ▶ Collectively, the Razorbacks' defensive linemen have appeared in 268 games with 91 starts and recorded 477 career tackles, 53.5 for loss, 20.0 sacks and 27 quarterback hurries.

LINEBACKERS

- ▶ Alonzo Highsmith had a career-high 15 tackles, including a career-high-tying 2.0 for loss, vs. Rutgers. His tackles total is the 3rd-highest single-game performance in the SEC and tied for the 19th-most tackles in a game in the NCAA this season.
- ▶ Alonzo Highsmith is tied for the SEC lead and for 11th in the NCAA with 51 tackles this season. His average of 10.2 tackles per game is tied for 2nd in the SEC and for 19th in the NCAA. He also is tied for 3rd among Razorbacks with 3.0 tackles for loss.
- ▶ Terrell Williams made a career-high 12 tackles, including 1.0 for loss, vs. Rutgers.
- ▶ Tenarius Wright led Arkansas in tackles vs. ULM with a single-game career-high total of 11. He also added one guarterback hurry against the Warhawks.
- ▶ Alonzo Highsmith has started all 18 games of his UA career at linebacker and recorded 131 tackles, 15.5 for loss with 5.5 sacks, two fumble recoveries, three quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and one interception.

ON THIS DATE

- UA is 9-4 on Oct. 6, including 3-1 on the road, and has won two straight Oct. 6 games.
- 2007 Arkansas defeated Chattanooga 34-15 in Little Rock as part of a stretch of seven wins in the final nine games of the regular season to earn a berth in the Cotton Bowl.
- 1979 No. 13 Arkansas won 16-13 at TCU under head coach Lou Holtz. The win was part of a season that ended with Arkansas sharing the SWC title and playing in the Sugar Bowl.
- 1962 The No. 15 Razorbacks earned a 42-14 win at TCU on their way to a 9-2 record and a second straight Sugar Bowl appearance.

SCHEDULE

- ▶ Including Jacksonville State and ULM, who kicked off their seasons with Arkansas, the Razorbacks face seven opponents with more than one week to prepare for the game in 2012. Beginning with the Ole Miss game, UA plays three straight weeks against an opponent coming off a bye week prior to the game.
- ▶ Arkansas is hosting six games in Fayetteville for the fourth time in school history. The only other times the Razorbacks played six games on campus were 1910, 2006 and 2007.
- ▶ Arkansas is hosting LSU in Fayetteville for the first time since 1992 in a game that has wrapped up the regular season for each team every year since Arkansas joined the SEC.
- ▶ The Arkansas and Texas A&M series became a conference matchup and returned to campus sites in September, marking UA's first trip to College Station since 1991. The teams renewed their Southwest Conference rivalry by playing a nonconference game inside Cowboys Stadium from 2009-11. The Razorbacks won all three of those contests and lead the all-time series 41-25-3.
- ▶ UA is set to host Ole Miss in Little Rock for the 16th time, including the first meeting between the schools in 1913, and the first time since 1992. Arkansas has hosted nine different SEC teams in War Memorial Stadium since joining the conference.
- ▶ The Razorbacks' 2012 schedule features three teams that were ranked in the top 10 of the preseason AP poll and eight teams that played in a bowl game last season.

- ▶ Arkansas started the Texas A&M game with the following defensive backfield: Will Hines (CB), Ross Rasner (S), Rohan Gaines (S), Alan Turner (S) and Kaelon Kelleybrew (CB). Turner made the first start of his career against the Aggies.
- ▶ Safeties Ross Rasner and Rohan Gaines are tied for 2nd on the team and for 9th in the SEC with 37 tackles.
- ▶ Safety Rohan Gaines leads all SEC freshmen with 37 tackles.
- ▶ Cornerback Kaelon Kelleybrew leads the team and is tied for 6th in the SEC with four pass breakups.
- ▶ Ross Rasner made a career-high 11 tackles, tied for the 3rd-highest total in the SEC in week one, with 1.5 for loss, one forced fumble and one pass breakup against Jacksonville State.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- ▶ Dennis Johnson is the SEC's record holder for career total return average at 24.0 yards per return, career kickoff return yards with 2,755 and career kickoff returns with 115. He also is the conference's active career leader in total return yards with 2,755.
- ▶ Dennis Johnson is the SEC's active career leader in all-purpose yards with 4,566, a total that ranks 3rd in school history and 3rd among active players in the NCAA. He is tied for 4th on the SEC's all-time career list and for 2nd among active players in the NCAA with three kickoff returns for touchdowns.
- ▶ Zach Hocker's career average of 8.0 points per game leads all active SEC kickers, is the 4th-highest among active kickers in the NCAA and 7th-highest among all active players.
- ▶ Zach Hocker ranks 2nd among active SEC players and 9th among active NCAA players with 125 PATs made in his career.
- ▶ Zach Hocker is UA's record holder for career field goal percentage with his success rate of 78.8, which ranks as the 14th-best percentage among active kickers in the NCAA. He also ranks in the top 10 on the school's all-time career list for PAT kicks made (125), points by a kicker (248), points (248), field goals made (41), PAT attempts (127) and field goal attempts (52).
- ▶ Zach Hocker leads the SEC and ranks 2nd in the NCAA with an average kickoff of 65.52 yards. He leads the SEC and is tied for 3rd in the nation with a touchback percentage of 78.3, and his 18 touchbacks are 3rd in the conference and tied for 9th in the country.
- ▶ Zach Hocker set a new single-game career high with six touchbacks and tied his single-game career high with seven PATs in the season opener vs. Jacksonville State.
- ▶ Senior Dylan Breeding is in his fourth season as the UA punter. He ranks 2nd in the SEC and 9th in the NCAA with his average of 45.5 yards per punt. His career average of 43.4 yards per punt stands 4th on Arkansas' all-time career list.

STAFF

- ▶ John L. Smith returned to Arkansas as head coach in April. In addition to Smith, the Razorback coaching staff welcomed new faces and adjusted duties of some coaches at the conclusion of the 2011 season. Offensive coordinator Paul Petrino, defensive coordinator Paul Haynes, assistant head coach/linebackers Taver Johnson and defensive tackles coach Kevin Peoples were all added to the on-field coaching staff, while Steve Caldwell added special teams coordinator duties and Bobby Allen moved to cornerbacks.
- ▶ Combined, the Arkansas staff has 234 years of coaching experience. The staff also features eight coaches who have been either an offensive or defensive coordinator in their career.

John L. Smith was born and raised in southeast Idaho. He grew up on a farm outside the city of Idaho Falls in Iona. His father (Bob) was a banker who also owned a 40-acre cattle farm. Bob also directed a ski school. Coach Smith's grandfather and uncle were also farmers.

Coach Smith grew up with a calf roping arena in his back yard. He spent time going to rodeos as a child and competed in rodeos. He belonged to the junior posse in Iona.

Coach Smith tried out for all sports growing up because his parents did not make their children do chores on the farm at night if they were involved in sports. The sports he tried out for were baseball, basketball, track and skiing. He lettered three years in football, basketball and track while attending Bonneville High School in Idaho Falls, Idaho.

His favorite subject in school was math and he earned his undergraduate degree in physical education with a minor in math in 1971 from Weber State. Smith earned a master's of science in physical education from the University of Montana in 1974.

As a child, John L. Smith would sneak over to high school practices and watch how the football coach worked with the players. It was then that John L. knew he wanted to get into coaching.

John L. Smith's high school coach (Ralph Hunter) is like a second father to him. Coach Hunter left to go to Weber State prior to the senior year of high school for John L. and Coach Smith followed him to Weber State.

Coach Smith played quarterback in high school where he ran the ball in a T/Option offense. He played quarterback and linebacker at Weber State.

In 2000 Sports Illustrated recognized Smith as one of Idaho's top 100 athletes of the 20th century. He was later inducted into the Idaho Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001.

THE NAME

John Smith became John L. Smith when he worked at Idaho for Dennis Erickson. There were three John Smith's on the football staff at the time so the secretary came up with a way to keep things straight. John Gregory Smith was the offensive line coach. John G. Smith was the former baseball coach who was the equipment manager and John L. Smith has used the name ever since.

THE ADVENTURES

Coach Smith uses trips and adventures in the offseason to try to get away from coaching and forget the job for a while. It is also a way to show players to not be afraid to take opportunities and to jump through open doors.

If he could do anything in his life other than coaching, Coach Smith would spend his time skiing.

Coach Smith is an avid reader of Ernest Hemingway and has read all of his books. Coach Smith thinks of himself as an adventurer and believes we all have that in us to some degree.

A brief recap of some of John L. Smith's adventures include:

- In 2000, he went through basic training for officers with the U.S. Marines in Quantico, Va.
- In 2001, Smith ran with the bulls in Pamplona, Spain, During his time at Idaho, Coach Smith would watch film at night with assistant coach Art Valero. To break up the monotony of watching film late at night occasionally Art would put on film of the running of the bulls. Watching the film made an impact and years later, Coach Smith and his oldest son joined Coach Valero to run with the bulls.
- In 2002, he skydived from a Cessna at 14,000 feet over Greensburg, Ind. Coach Smith says he would never do it again and only did it to get over his fear of heights.
- In December 2003, Smith participated in an orientation flight on a T-38 Talon at Randolph Air Force Base, Texas.
- In July 2004, he took his entire family on a wildlife photo safari in Kenya. Smith and his sons left the safari early and traveled to Tanzania to climb a 19,340-foot peak on Mount Kilimanjaro. Coach Smith says the last ascent of the climb is major. He left at midnight to get to the top when the sun came up and says it was an unbelievable experience watching the sun come up through the clouds.
- In July 2005, Smith went paragliding with his children off the Matterhorn in Zermatt, Switzerland.

Coach Smith has some thoughts on future challenges he'd like to accomplish including: climbing the Grand Tetons and skiing the glaciers at the top, running a marathon, rafting in the Grand Canyon.

THE MENTORS

John L. Smith believes you are a product of how you were raised and the coaches you had or worked for. However, you are your own individual coach though. The NFL was never a goal of John L. Smith's and he believes he is at the pinnacle as far as coaching positions.

John L. Smith's coaching mentors include: Ralph Hunter – High School Coach Jack Swarthout – Montana Chris Ault – Nevada Dennis Erickson – Idaho

THE MEDIA

Coach Smith feels he has a good reputation with the media because he is comfortable around people. His philosophy with the media is to be forthright and honest. He says there may be times where he can't tell them something at that moment, but feels media can relate to that as people. After he was the head coach at Michigan State, John L. Smith hosted a morning radio show in Louisville where he felt he was an advocate for coaches. He never thought he was out of coaching, but was looking for the right opportunity.

THE FAMILY

Coach Smith is the son of Robert (Bob) and Luana Smith. Coach Smith has three brothers and one sister and all of them live in Idaho except for one brother in San Diego. John L. is the second of the five children.

Married to the former Diana Flora, Coach Smith and his wife are the parents of three children, Nicholas, Kayse, Sam. Coach Smith and Diana have two granddaughters who are age 3 and 1. Coach Smith is the uncle of San Francisco 49ers quarterback Alex Smith.

John L. and his wife (Diana) were born one day apart in the same hospital. She was born first.

Coach Smith met his wife (Diana) in seventh grade when country and city schools mixed together to attend the same junior high. They dated for nine years before they were married. Coach Smith proposed to Diana over the phone saying they needed to get married in one month before the start of fall football practices.

John L. and Diana Smith were married on August 15, 1970, and have been together for 42 years.

MOVING BACK TO ARKANSAS

John L. Smith was coaching at Weber State (his alma mater) before coming back to be the head coach at the University of Arkansas. His wife (Diana) got a call from Coach Smith about getting the job as movers were loading their belongings from their home in Louisville to go to Weber State. Diana asked Coach Smith if she could tell the movers and he said "you better because they are going to a different place now." The Smiths told the movers the truck needed to go to Fayetteville, but they didn't have an address yet and would get that to them when the truck got to Arkansas. Diana found a house to rent on line by doing virtual tours.

When Coach Smith returned to Arkansas as head coach in April of 2012 the Razorback football players, coaching staff and support staff gave him a standing ovation in the first team meeting.

When making the final decision to come to Arkansas, Coach Smith relied heavily on his wife (Diana) who told him this was his chance to win a championship. At the time he took all of the other head coaching jobs they were rebuilding projects at other schools.

GAME DAY TRADITIONS AND ROUTINES

Coach Smith wears his left sock inside out on game day. This tradition started as a player after he had a big game in which he performed well and noticed his sock was on inside out following the game.

Coach Smith's pregame speeches are not long and some are planned and others aren't. He does let assistant coaches pick one game to speak before. Pregame speeches are done the night before a game.

Coach Smith believes in regimentation for the schedule for the program. He believes sleep is highly overrated and gets by on four hours a night. He wakes up at 5 a.m. and is in the office by 6 a.m. Staff meetings are at 7:30 a.m. and he runs steps in the stadium at Noon. He wants the players to understand nothing changes, but there will be an adjustment if there is a surprise. Away game travel is extremely structured and is a business trip.

The 10th-ranked University of Arkansas football team defeated Jacksonville State on Saturday inside Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium 49-24 in front of a crowd of 71,062, the third-largest attendance in school history for a season opener.

Senior quarterback Tyler Wilson broke the Arkansas record for passing yards in a season opener with 367 yards through the air, breaking the previous record of 318 by Casey Dick vs. Western Illinois in 2008. Wilson's passing yards also ranked as the ninth-highest single-game total in school history. Wilson was 19-of-27 with three touchdown passes, which tied the UA record in a season opener.

record in a season opener.

Leading the UA receiving corps was junior wide receiver Brandon Mitchell, who totaled 122 yards on four receptions in his first collegiate game at receiver. Also tallying more than 100 receiving yards was senior tight end Chris Gragg with 110 yards on seven receptions and two touchdowns for the second 100-yard receiving game of his career. It is the first time since 2009 vs. Georgia that Arkansas had two 100-yard receivers in one game with Greg Childs collecting 140 yards and Jarius Wright accumulating 108.

Junior running back Knile Davis led the Razorbacks on the ground with 70 total yards and one touchdown. Defensively, senior safety Ross Rasner led all Razorback defenders with a career-high 11 total tackles, topping his previous high of seven tackles, including 1.5 for loss and one forced fumble. Senior linebacker Tenarius Wright recorded eight tackles.

On special teams, Dennis Johnson moved into 3rd on the SEC's all time serves it of the force that the server was to the force of the server was the server when the server was the server was

On special teams, Dennis Johnson moved into 3rd on the SEC's all-time career kickoff return yards list with 96 yards on four returns. Johnson now has 2,571 kickoff return yards in his career passing South Carolina's Chris Culliver (2,476, 2007-10) and Mississippi State's Derek Pegues (2,498, 2005-08).

The Arkansas defense started off with a bang after a blocked field goal by defensive tackle Byran Jones to prevent the Gamecocks from putting the first points on the board.

The Arkansas offense put together an 11-play, 80-yard drive in the first quarter that was capped off when redshirt freshman running back Kody Walker pounded it in the end zone for a one-yard touchdown with 7:43 on the clock. The touchdown put UA up 7-0 over the Gamecocks after the extra point by Zach Hocker.

Hocker.

On the ensuing drive, the Gamecocks answered the Razorbacks touchdown with one of their own to tie the game at 7-7. The Gamecocks then drove the ball 35 yards down the

field after recovering a fumble to set up a four-yard touchdown run. The touchdown would give the Gamecocks their only lead over the Razorbacks at 14-7. Following the Gamecock touchdown, Johnson electrified

Following the Gamecock touchdown, Johnson electrified the crowd when he notched a 42-yard kickoff return to set up a quick five-play, 58-yard drive that ended in a 30-yard touchdown pass from Wilson to Gragg to tie the game 14-14, allowing the Gamecocks to lead the game for just 1:47.

After the tying score, the UA defense took the field and

After the tying score, the UA defense took the field and forced JSU to their first three-and-out and punt of the game to put the UA offense back on the turf. Once again, Wilson connected with Gragg for a four-yard touchdown pass to put the Razorbacks in the lead for good. With the touchdown, Gragg secured his first two-touchdown game as a Razorback.

Wilson connected on a 34-yard pass to Mitchell, a careerlong reception, to set up a three-yard rushing touchdown by senior running back Ronnie Wingo Jr. to extend Arkansas' lead to 28-14 with 5:12 remaining in the second quarter.

On the next offensive possession, the Razorbacks marched down the field to put together a four-play, 54-yard drive that resulted in a five-yard touchdown by Davis to lengthen the Razorbacks' lead, 35-14. JSU would answer the UA touchdown with one of their own with eight seconds remaining in the half. The Razorbacks entered the locker room up 35-21 over the Gamecocks.

After the half, Jacksonville State was forced to kick a 49-yard field goal after a strong defensive showing. The field goal shortened the UA lead to 35-24 but marked the Gamecocks' final points of the night.

Arkansas was quick to respond, with Wilson launching a dayard touchdown to junior wide receiver Javontee Hermdon to give the Razorbacks a 42-24 lead. The 63-yard catch was Herndon's first touchdown and a career-long reception, besting his previous high of 41 yards in the season opener last season against Missouri State.

against Missouri State.

In the third quarter, the Razorback defense was the next to make a play, when redshirt freshman safety Rohan Gaines forced a JSU fumble that was recovered by senior linebacker Alonzo Highsmith. The fumble recovery set up the seventh offensive touchdown of the game as Johnson found the end zone, putting UA up for good 49-24.

The win was Arkansas' 12th straight at home, tied for the

The win was Arkansas' 12th straight at home, tied for the fourth-longest streak in school history, and 20th home victory since 2009, tied for the most in the SEC over that span.

The No. 8 University of Arkansas Razorbacks fell 34-31 to the ULM Warhawks in overtime in front of a crowd of 53,089 fans at War Memorial Stadium. Junior kicker Zach Hocker gave the Razorbacks the lead in overtime after connecting on a 37-yard field goal. ULM took its shot at the end zone, going for it on a 4th and 1 and was successful with a 16-yard touchdown run to finalize the score.

Arkansas was 3-of-3 in the Red Zone with three touchdowns to remain perfect from inside the 20-yard line this season. The Razorbacks are now 8-of-8 with eight touchdowns in the Red Zone this season.

Senior quarterback Tyler Wilson recorded the 14th multiple-touchdown game of his career with two passing touchdowns in the first half. Wilson would finish the day with 196 yards in the first half. With his first half yardage he moved into sixth on Arkansas' all-time career passing yards list. He now has 4,941 in his career, passing Brad Taylor (4,802, 1981-84). Freshman quarterback Brandon Allen took over for Wilson in the second half and recorded 85 total yards off six completions.

Senior wide receiver Cobi Hamilton tallied 99 receiving yards and one touchdown. Also recording impressive receiving stats was freshman wide receiver Mekale McKay, who pulled in two catches for 74 total yards. McKay notched career highs in both receptions (2) and yardage (74). Senior tight end Chris Gragg hauled in seven catches for 83 yards.

The Warhawks were the first to get points on the board, after the ULM defense pulled in an interception and drove the ball 67 yards down the field scoring off a four-yard rushing touchdown.

The Razorbacks were quick to answer, with Wilson connecting with junior receiver Julian Horton on a 20-yard pass for a touchdown. The tying score came off a nine-play, 75-yard drive that took 2:34 off the clock

In the second quarter, the Razorbacks struck first off a 39-yard pass from Wilson to Hamilton to give UA the 14-7 lead.

Wilson launched a 61-yard rocket to McKay to set up a three-yard touchdown run by Davis. The 61-yard reception was a career-high for McKay. The three-play, 87-yard drive extended the UA lead to 21-7 to close out the half.

The Razorback defense came up big in the third quarter when senior safety Ross Rasner intercepted the Warhawks on the 1-yard line and put together a 32-yard return. The interception was the first of his career. Allen capitalized when he connected with McKay in the corner of the end zone for a 13-yard touchdown play that marked the first career touchdown for both Allen and McKay. The touchdown capped off a 67-yard drive and extended the Razorbacks' lead to 28-7.

ULM would score on a three-yard touchdown run with 5:41 remaining in the third quarter. It was the Warhawks' first score since their first possession of the game and shortened the UA lead to 28-14.

On their next possession, ULM scored off a oneyard pass with 14:08 on the clock in the fourth quarter. The touchdown shortened the Razorback lead to 28-21 and allowed ULM to pull within seven of UA after scoring on a critical fourth and one on the oneyard line.

On the final drive of regulation, the Warhawks would put together the longest drive of the game (90 yards). With 55 seconds on the clock the Warhawks scored on a 23-yard touchdown pass. The touchdown tied the game 28-28 and would send the two teams into overtime.

Arkansas fell in overtime after ULM scored a touchdown to Arkansas' field goal.

The University of Arkansas Razorbacks fell to the No. 1 Alabama Crimson Tide by a score of 52-0 in a matchup that drew 74,617 fans to Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium, the sixth-largest crowd in stadium history.

Freshman quarterback Brandon Allen, making his first career start with senior Tyler Wilson out due to an injury, was 10-for-18 with 60 yards on the day. Allen connected with six different Razorbacks on the day. Leading the Razorbacks on the ground was junior running back Knile Davis with 59 yards.

After the Arkansas defense forced Alabama to a three-and-out on their first possession, the Crimson Tide came back and put points on the board with a six-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter to go up 7-0.

In the second quarter, Alabama drove 46 yards down the field to score on a 51-yard field goal to put the Crimson Tide up 10-0. Alabama would later capitalize on an interception and drive 67 yards down the field to score on a 20-yard touchdown pass for a 17-0 lead.

With 3:01 on the clock in the second quarter, Alabama would score with a one-yard rushing touchdown to head into the half up 24-0.

#1 ALABAMA 52

To start the third quarter, the Crimson Tide drove 75 yards down the field and scored on a 10-yard rushing touchdown to put Alabama up 31-0. With 11:27 in the third quarter, a fumbled kick return gave the Crimson Tide the ball on the 27-yard line, which resulted in a one-yard touchdown giving Alabama a 38-0 lead. Alabama picked up a 12-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to put the Tide up 45-0. Alabama would snag another touchdown off a 27-yard rush to put Crimson Tide up 52-0, which was the final score.

Senior wide receiver Cobi Hamilton put up the performance of his career breaking the SEC and University of Arkansas records for single-game receiving yards as the Razorbacks fell to Rutgers 35-26 in front of a crowd totaling 72,543 inside Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium on Saturday night. Hamilton finished the night with 303 yards and three touchdowns, which tied the UA single-game record.

The Texarkana, Texas, native had a career day as he set career highs in receptions (10) and receiving yards (303). Hamilton's 303-yard receiving game broke the SEC record of 293 set by Josh Reed of LSU in 2001 and the school record of 281 set by Jarius Wright against Texas A&M in 2011.

Senior quarterback Tyler Wilson went 20-for-39 with 419 yards and three touchdowns. With his 419 yard performance, he became the sixth Razorback in school history to reach 5,000 career passing yards (5,191 yards).

Senior punter Dylan Breeding set a new career high with a 72 yard punt, besting his previous high of 70 yards against LSU in 2011. Breeding ended the evening with six punts for 295 total yards with three inside the 20-yard line, including a fourth-quarter punt that was downed at the 1.

Senior running back Dennis Johnson broke the SEC career kickoff returns record. With three tonight, Johnson now has 113 in his career, breaking the previous record of 112 held by Brandon James from Florida (2006-09).

On the first drive of the game, Wilson ignited the crowd when he launched a 54-yard pass to Hamilton that set up a 37-yard field goal by kicker Zach Hocker, 3-0 Arkansas.

The second score of the game was nearly déjà vu as Wilson again connected with Hamilton on a 57-yard pass to put the Razorbacks up 10-0 to close the first quarter.

Rutgers shortened the Razorback lead in the second quarter with a 10-yard touchdown pass to bring the Scarlet Knights within three, 10-7. With 1:30 left in the first half, Rutgers took the lead on a 19-yard touchdown pass, 14-10.

To open the second half, Rutgers put together a 10 play, 75-yard drive, scoring on a 38-yard touchdown pass and making the tally 21-10.

The Razorbacks put together a six-play, 52-yard drive that was reminiscent of the offensive story the whole game, as Wilson connected with Hamilton twice for a total of 46 yards. The drive resulted in a 27-yard field goal by Hocker as UA cut the lead to 21-13.

Rutgers drove 75 yards down the field and scored on a two-yard touchdown pass to put the Scarlet Knights up 28-13 over the Razorbacks.

The Razorbacks marched 74 yards down the field in five plays in the fourth quarter. Wilson threw a bullet to Hamilton for a 10-yard touchdown as the Wilson-Hamilton connection continued and Arkansas pulled within 28-20.

Wilson launched a rocket to Hamilton once again on an 80-yard pass play that resulted in a touchdown to bring the Razorbacks within two of the Scarlet Knights, 28-26.

Rutgers answered the Razorbacks just two plays later, as the Scarlet Knights scored on a 60-yard touchdown pass for the final margin of 35-26.

The University of Arkansas Razorbacks fell to the Texas A&M Aggies by a score of 58-10 at Kyle Field in front of a crowd of 86,442. During the game, senior wide receiver Cobi Hamilton became the eighth Razorback in school history with 2,000 career receiving yards.

Leading the Razorbacks through the air was senior quarterback Tyler Wilson, who went 29-for-59 with 373 yards and one touchdown. Wilson's 59 pass attempts set a new school record, besting the previous record of 52 by Clint Stoerner, which was set in 1999 against Alabama.

Hamilton became the eighth Razorback in school history with 2,000 career receiving yards. With 11 receptions and 162 yards against Texas A&M, Hamilton now has 2,110 receiving yards in his career. As a result, Hamilton broke the UA record for receiving yards in consecutive games. With 162 today, he added to his SEC-record 303 last week vs. Rutgers, Hamilton had 465 in the last two games. The previous record was 337 by Derek Holloway (141 vs. North Carolina, Dec. 28, 1981 and 196 vs. Tulsa, Sept. 11, 1982).

Leading the Razorbacks on the ground was junior running back Knile Davis, who compiled 65 rushing yards. Davis also tallied 64 receiving yards with one touchdown.

The Aggies struck first in the first quarter with a four-yard passing touchdown to put them up 7-0.

The Razorbacks were quick to respond when the Arkansas offense put together a five-play, 79-yard drive that ended when Wilson connected with Davis on a 64-yard touchdown pass that silenced the Aggie crowd. With 37 seconds on the clock in the first quarter kicker Zach Hocker slid one between the uprights for a 26-yard field goal and three points, giving the Razorbacks a 10-7 lead.

TEXAS A&M 58

Texas A&M took the lead with 20 points in the second quarter. With 12:44 on the clock the Aggies tied with game with a 46-yard field goal. The Aggies would connect again on a 26-yard field goal to give them the lead, 13-10. Texas A&M put together a three play, 50-yard drive that resulted in an 11-yard passing touchdown. To close out the half the Aggies would throw an 80-yard touchdown pass to make the halftime score, 27-10.

In the third quarter, the Aggies tacked on three more scores, the first a 21-yard field goal to put them up 37-10. Next, with 7:18 on the clock, Texas A&M scored on a 10-yard touchdown run. Last, the Aggies capitalized on a Razorback fumble and ran 28 yards into the end zone to close out the third quarter with the Razorbacks trailing 44-10.

With 10:23 remaining in the fourth quarter, A&M tacked on a seven more with a six-yard rushing touchdown to put them up, 51-10. A&M put together a three play, 80-yard drive to score on a 13-yard rushing touchdown to make the final score 58-10.
