REGULAR SEASON FINALE

» Auburn visits Mississippi State on Saturday, December 12, for the Tigers' 2020 regular season finale at Davis Wade Stadium in Starkville, Miss.; the 6:30 p.m. CT SEC West contest will be televised by the SEC Network.

The Auburn seniors preparing for their last regular season game: Chris Bobo, K.J. Britt, Big Kat Bryant, Tanner Dean, Devin Guice, Trent Kelley, James Owens Moss, T.D. Moultry, Daquan Newkirk, Jordyn Peters, Prince Micheal Sammons, Clarke Smith, Eli Stove, Bill Taylor, Barrett Tindall and Jacob vonEschenbach.

» Auburn has an all-time record of 52-68-7 in regular-season finales since 1892. The Tigers are 51-69-7 all-time in the final game of the regular season played away from Auburn.

SERIES HISTORY

» The Tigers hold a 64-27-2 (.699) record all-time against Mississippi State and have won seven of the last 11 matchups against the Bulldogs. Auburn was a 56-23 winner in Auburn last season, while the Bulldogs won 23-9 in Starkville in 2018; the home team has won seven of the last nine games.

Auburn has a 30-7 advantage in all games played at Auburn, a 13-7-1 lead in all games played at Starkville, and a 21-13-1 advantage in games played at neutral sites. Those include Birmingham, Ala. (AU leads 14-11-1); Columbus, Miss. (AU leads 1-0); Jackson, Miss. (AU leads 5-2); and Montgomery, Ala. (AU leads 1-0).

IN DECEMBER

» Auburn is 22-25-2 (.500) all-time in December. Prior to this year, Auburn's only previous home game in December was a 30-20 win over Alabama in 1989. Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 21-24-2 (.468). Auburn is 3-2 in December under Gus Malzahn. This is Auburn's first-ever December 12 game.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn is one of only 14 teams nationally with both a fumble return and an interception return for scores this season

» Redshirt freshman Colby Wooden is third in the SEC with 8.5 TFL this season; Wooden has recorded at least 0.5 TFL in seven of nine games. As a team, the Tigers are seventh in the SEC with 48.0 TFL

» Zakoby McClain is third in the SEC averaging 10.4 tackles per game (94 total) and Owen Pappoe is 10th in the conference with an 8.1 average (73 total)

» Bo Nix's 91-yard TD pass to Anthony Schwartz vs. LSU is tied for the longest pass play in the SEC and the third-longest in the FBS this season

» True freshman Tank Bigsby is eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (114.7/gm) and has accounted for a quarter (12-48) of Auburn's plays of 20+ yards this season (8 KOR, 4 rush). Seth Williams has 12 receptions of 20+ yards as well this season

» Bigsby, whose 642 rushing yards rank second among all FBS freshmen, was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games; previously only Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010) rushed for three 100-yard games against SEC opposition as Auburn freshmen

» Anders Carlson is one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award; the junior placekicker is 15-17 on field goals and 22-23 on PAT this season

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had 13 representatives on the 2019-20 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included O.C. Brothers, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Trey Lindsey, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, Jacoby Puckett, Zion Puckett and Mark-Antony Richards.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn has scored in all 102 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

» Against Arkansas, South Carolina, Ole Miss and LSU, Auburn rushed for at least 200 yards in four straight games for the first time since 2017, the only SEC team to do so this season.

» There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 30 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn, the latest being 503 yards against LSU this season.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained 200+ yards total offense in a quarter 18 times (the latest: 200 yards in the third quarter vs. Kent State in 2019); and nine times vs. SEC teams (latest: 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss 2018).

» Auburn has scored first in 36 of its last 53 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign. The Tigers are 49-16 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

» Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 70-102 (.686) games, with 39 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State in 2019, the sixth time the Tigers gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 21.75 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» Auburn recorded three straight 30-point games (35 points at Ole Miss, 48 points vs. LSU and 30 points vs. Tennessee) for the first time since 2017.

The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by

Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 35 times in 100 games, 50+ points 17 times and 60+ points three times.

In 2019, Auburn scored 50+ points in four games in a season for just the third season in program history; others were in 2010 (6) and in 2016 (4).

» Auburn passed and rushed for more than 200 yards in three consecutive games against South Carolina, Ole Miss and LSU, averaging 213.0 rushing yards and 270.0 passing yards in those games for an average of 483.0 yards of total offense. It was the first time the Tigers passed and rushed for at least 200 yards in three straight games since doing so in four straight games in 2017.

Against LSU, Auburn threw for 300 yards and rushed for 206 yards, the third time the Tigers have totaled 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards in a game under head coach Gus Malzahn.

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 58 of 102 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Fifteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (72 100-yd performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher under Malzahn is 45-13; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

Three TD passes against Kentucky tied his career best (also 2019 at Arkansas) and Nix posted his sixth career 200-yard passing game with 238 yards passing and a 58-yard gamewinning TD pass to Williams at Ole Miss.

Against LSU, Nix was 18-24 passing for 300 yards and three more touchdowns, and he was Auburn's leading rusher with 81 yards on 11 carries, including a 5-yard score. Nix' pass efficiency rating of 221.3 vs. LSU was the second-best game rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

Nix is now 391-660 in his career for 4,540 yards and 26 passing scores.

Nix' Auburn record of 251 pass attempts without an interception, dating back through the 2019 LSU game, was snapped at Georgia.

› In 2019, Nix set the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16).

› Against LSU, Nix threw three touchdown passes and rushed for one score, his ninth career game with a passing touchdown and rushing touchdown, two more than any other SEC quarterback since the start of 2019.

It was the second time Nix threw three TDs and rushed for a TD in the same game in his career (at Arkansas in 2019). He is the first Auburn quarterback to do that since Jarrett Stidham did so against Georgia in 2017 and the first to do so multiple times since Cam Newton did it four times in 2010.

The sophomore now has 26 career TD passes, putting him two behind Ben Leard (1997-2000) for 10th in Auburn history. He's four TD passes behind Cam Newton for ninth and five behind his father, Patrick Nix (1992-95), for eighth.

Nix also has 13 career rushing TD; his two rushing scores vs. Texas A&M were his first career game with multiple rushing TDs. Nix leads all SEC QBs with six rushing TDs this season, is second among all signal callers in the league with 332 rushing yards on the year and third with an average of 3.53 yards per carry.

› The 91-yard touchdown pass from Bo Nix to Anthony Schwartz against LSU was the longest career score for both and the third-longest pass play in Auburn history (the longest: 94, Cam Newton to Emory Blake vs. ULM in 2010).

It's tied for the longest pass play in the SEC and third-longest in the FBS this season, only trailing a 93-yard pass from UCF's Dillon Gabriel to Ryan O'Keefe and a 92-yarder from Brady White of Memphis to Tahj Washington.

› Junior receiver Seth Williams caught the gamewinning TD from Bo Nix with 1:14 remaining at Ole Miss, a 58-yard completion; Williams finished with 150 yards on eight catches, his fifth career 100-yard game, earning him SEC offensive player of the week honors.

Williams ranks seventh among Auburn career leaders in receiving, with 1,995 yards. His 124 career receptions rank eighth among Auburn career leaders, and his 16 receiving touchdowns are tied for fifth best at Auburn. He has caught a pass in his last 22 games dating back to the 2018 Music City Bowl against Purdue.

Against Kentucky, Williams posted the fourth multiple-score game of his career with touchdown catches of 11 and 4 yards from Bo Nix. Williams gained 112 yards on six receptions against the Wildcats.

In his career, 94 of Williams' 124 catches have resulted in either a first down or a touchdown, including TD on eight of his red zone receptions and 15 of his 22 catches in the fourth quarter. All but eight of his receptions this season have gone for a first down or TD.

Williams led Auburn in 2019 with 59 catches for 830 yards and eight scores. He was the first Auburn player with TD catches in five straight games since Emory Blake (seven in 2010-11).

› The 58-yard game-winning TD pass to Seth Williams from Bo Nix at Ole Miss was Williams' third career game-winning catch (Texas A&M 2018, Oregon 2019, Ole Miss 2020). It was the fourth time Nix has led Auburn on a fourth-quarter drive to put the Tigers ahead for good.

› Anthony Schwartz had a career-high 123 yards receiving on just four catches in the win over LSU, highlighted by a 91-yard touchodwn reception from Bo Nix, Auburn's longest pass play in 10 years.

Schwartz posted his first 100-yard game with a 10-reception, 100-yard performance in the win over Arkansas, scoring on a 17-yard pass from Bo Nix. The junior was also Auburn's top receiver at Georgia, with eight catches gaining 57 yards.

With his 59 yards on six receptions at South Carolina, Schwartz went over 1,000 career receiving yards; he now has 1,401 yards on 112 receptions. Schwartz is 17th on Auburn's career receiving yardage chart and 12th on Auburn's career receptions list.

Schwartz entered the 2020 campaign with seven career rushing scores and 10 overall TD. Schwartz' 57-yard TD run at Texas A&M in 2019 was a career long for the speedster and Auburn's longest rushing play of the season.

» Schwartz, who caught a 91-yard TD pass against LSU and a 54-yard TD against Tennessee, both from Bo Nix, is the first Auburn player to have 50-yard catches in consecutive games since Darius Slayton caught a 52-yard TD pass from Jarrett Stidham in the 2018 Iron Bowl followed by touchdown catches of 74 and 52 from Stidham vs. Purdue in the Music Bowl that season.

» True freshman Tank Bigsby ranks eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average at 114.7 yards per game (1,026 yards total), ranking third among FBS freshmen.

Bigsby rushed for more than 100 yards in three consecutive games (Arkansas 146, South Carolina 111, Ole Miss 129). He's the first Auburn player to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby is the first Auburn freshman with three 100-yard rushing games since Ja'Tarvious Whitlow in 2018, and only the third Auburn freshman ever with three 100-yard rushing games against SEC competition; others were Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010).

Bigsby's 129 yards rushing on 24 carries with touchdowns of 4 and 18 yards, and three kick returns for 75 yards, at Ole Miss earned him SEC freshman of the week accolades.

Bigsby rushed for 146 yards on 20 carries against Arkansas, the 12th-best rushing day ever by an Auburn freshman. He's one of just 10 Auburn players, and the only freshman, to record more than 250 all-purpose yards in a game; Bigsby totaled 268 all-purpose yards against Arkansas (146 rush, 16 rec, 106 KOR).

Bigsby, who next rushed for 111 yards and his first career TD at South Carolina, was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in

back-to-back games since redshirt freshman Ja'Tarvious Whitlow in 2018 (122 vs. Alabama State; 104 vs. LSU). Bigsby was the first true freshman to do so and the first freshman, true or redshirt, to do it in consecutive SEC games since Michael Dyer in 2010 (100 vs. LSU; 180 at Ole Miss). He was named to the FWAA Freshman All-America watch list.

Bigsby led Auburn with 31 yards rushing and 68 yards receiving on seven catches against Georgia in his first career start; he was the first player to lead the Tigers in rushing and receiving yards since Kerryon Johnson totaled 167 rushing yards and 66 receiving yards against Georgia in 2017.

» Bigsby ranks sixth among Auburn freshman rushers with 642 yards and is tied for fifth among AU freshman rushers with five rushing touchdowns scored.

» Senior Eli Stove has more than 1,600 career yards from scrimmage (127 catches for 1,134 yards and six scores and 55 rushing attempts for 554 yards and four TD). He is seventh in Auburn career receptions and ranks 25th in career receiving yardage.

Stove caught a 21-yard touchdown from Bo Nix in the opener against Kentucky, one of four receptions on the day. He led Auburn with seven catches at South Carolina, including an 11-yard TD catch, and had five receptions for 64 yards with a 9-yard touchdown.

Last season, he had an 11-yard TD catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon, added a 4-yard rushing TD against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State, the first Tiger to score in three straight games since Kerryon Johnson (2017).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

» Auburn won the turnover battle against Kentucky, using a Roger McCreary interception and fumble recoveries from Jamien Sherwood and Owen Pappoe to post a 3-0 advantage in

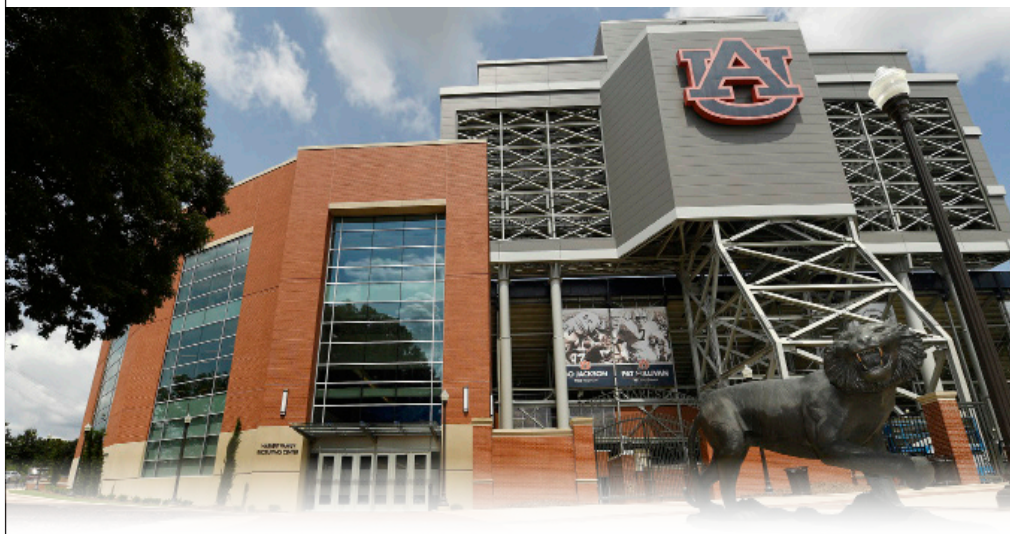

the turnover margin against the Wildcats. The Tigers were 2-0 in turnovers at Ole Miss on interceptions from Roger McCreary and Jordyn Peters.

Christian Tutt's fumble return for a touchdown and interceptions by Nehemiah Pritchett and Big Kat Bryant accounted for Auburn's three turnovers forced in the win against LSU.

Smoke Monday's 100-yard interception return for a touchdown in the third quarter against Tennessee was the Tigers' key turnover of that victory.

» Auburn is 35-9 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 17-7 when turnovers are even, compared to 14-19 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +43 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -19 in turnovers during Malzahn's tenure.

The Tigers are 23-6 when they play turnover-free football and 47-19 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn. The Tigers are 21-5 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

» Auburn is 57-22 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 36-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 10-13 when it fails to force a turnover.

FOR THE DEFENSE

» Against Texas A&M, linebacker Zakoby McClain posted a career-high 17 tackles, the most by an Auburn player since Demetruce McNeal (18) at Mississippi State in 2012. It was McClain's sixth career double-figure tackle game (fourth this season) and the fifth time this year he has led the Tigers in tackles. The junior now has 153 tackles for his career.

» With his 13 tackles at South Carolina, Zakoby McClain became the first Auburn player since Deshaun Davis in 2018 with double-figure tackles in three straight games (Georgia 11, Arkansas 14, South Carolina 13).

Owen Pappoe also put together three consecutive double-figure games against Arkansas (10), South Carolina (10) and Ole Miss (14), and added 12 tackles against Tennessee. He has 122 career tackles.

Jamien Sherwood crossed the 100-career tackle mark with his 11-tackle performance at Ole Miss and now has 128 for his career. Smoke Monday had a career-best 12 stops at Ole Miss.

Auburn had four players post double-figure tackles at Georgia: Jamien Sherwood (14), Jordyn Peters (13), K.J. Britt (12) and McClain (11); all four of those players set or tied career bests. It was the first time Auburn had four players with double-figure tackles since the 2019 LSU game, when Auburn had five.

McClain (14) and Pappoe (10) were the top tacklers against Arkansas.

» Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 52 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 143 total TD during that span (2.31 per game).

» Auburn, which has allowed a TD on 49.5 percent (92-186) of its opponents' red zone trips since 2016, is one of four FBS to allow a TD on fewer than 50 percent of its opponents' red zone trips during that time (along with Wisconsin, Clemson and Cincinnati).

» Senior linebacker K.J. Britt earned first team all-SEC honors from AP and second team from the SEC coaches in 2019, totaling 69 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble. He was a 2020 preseason all-SEC first-teamer and on watch lists for the Lott IMPACT, Bednarik, Butkus and Nagurski awards.

Britt posted a then-career-best 11 tackles and a TFL in the season opening win against Kentucky, and topped that with a 12-tackle performance at Georgia. That gives Britt 119 tackles and 13.0 TFL for his career.

Britt had hand surgery after the Georgia game and has not yet returned to action.

» Under Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 42 times, including 26 of the last 37 games (not including season openers). In 34 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.

Auburn held LSU to 32 rushing yards, the third fewest in the long-time series (also 1999/26 yds, 1988/28 yds) and the 19th time against an SEC opponent that the Auburn defense allowed 32 rushing yards or fewer; the last was vs. Arkansas (25 yds) in 2016.

» Auburn has allowed only 19.52 points per game in Steele's tenure as coordinator, 10th among FBS teams. Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg.

» Auburn has held 19 of 62 opponents (16-3 record) below 300 yards total offense in Kevin Steele's five seasons as defensive coordinator. That exceeds the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 in the previous six years combined (14 in 79 games).

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 18 first-quarter touchdowns in the last 51 games.

» In 28 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 24.5 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points nine times. Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked foes to 17 or fewer points (18.4%).

» In 62 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 146 sacks (2.35 per game) and has been held without a sack only seven times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 37 of those games, including 8.0 TFL against Kentucky and 7.0 TFL against Arkansas, Ole Miss and LSU this season.

The Tigers have forced 87 turnovers (44 INT, 43 FR) and allowed only 48 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

» Redshirt freshman cornerback Jaylin Simpson earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors in his first career start vs. Kentucky, accounting for four tackles, a TFL and a PBU.

» Sophomore Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play against LSU, with four tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble.

» Junior Smoke Monday was the SEC defensive player of the week for his 100-yard interception TD against Tennessee, to go along with four tackles.

» Junior Jamien Sherwood is one of only five players in the SEC with two or more fumble recoveries this season.

» Auburn held South Carolina to 297 yards of total offense, the first time this season the Tigers held an opponent to less than 300 yards total offense and the 19th time in 61 games under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele, compared to just 15 such games in the previous 89 games (back to 2009).

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Gus Malzahn is now 22-1 in games where Auburn scores a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being Smoke Monday's 100-yard interception return against Tennessee, Barton

Lester's TD recovery of a Jordyn Peters blocked punt against Arkansas. and Christian Tutt's fumble recovery TD against LSU.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

Against Minnesota in that Outback Bowl, Auburn scored on a 96-yard kickoff return by Noah Igbinoghene, the last time the Tigers lost a game in which they scored a non-offensive touchdown since 2012 at Mississippi State.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Jordyn Peters' blocked punt against Arkansas was the fourth of his career; he had three during the 2018 season. That most recent block resulted in a Tiger touchdown when recovered by Barton Lester.

It was the first blocked punt for a TD by Auburn since the 2018 Alabama State game (blocked by Jordyn Peters, recovered by Devan Barrett) and the first by Auburn in an SEC game since the 2017 Texas A&M contest.

» Junior kicker Anders Carlson booted the gamewinning 39-yard field goal with 0:07 remaining in the Arkansas win.

With 8 points against Texas A&M, Carlson ranks seventh in Auburn career scoring with 258.

Carlson is sixth in career PAT made (114) at Auburn and he is fourth in career field goals made (48).

Carlson has made 15 of 17 field goal attempts this season, and has made 21 of his last 23 field goal attempts dating back to late in the 2019 season. His 50-yard field goal against Tennessee was his fourth career field goal of at least 50 yards and first of the season.

The Tennessee game was his seventh career game with at least three field goals, including four in his last nine games played dating back to last season's Iron Bowl.

Last season, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, is now with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

» With 732 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are now third all-time in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

In second place are Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (734 points from 2013-19); the leaders are Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

» Auburn is one game ahead of Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (152) without having a punt blocked. The Tigers last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

RANKINGS

» Auburn is playing consecutive games against AP Top5 opponents for the fifth time in program history and the second time under head coach Gus Malzahn. In 2013, the Tigers played three straight games against top-5 opponents for the only time in school history.

» Auburn is 22-60-2 all-time against AP Top-5 opponents, including a 5-14 mark under head coach Gus Malzahn.

» Ranked Auburn teams are 29-5 against Mississippi State all-time, including 25-3 against unranked Bulldog teams. In Starkville, ranked Auburn teams are 9-3 all-time, including 8-1 when Mississippi State enters the game unranked.

» The Tigers opened the season with a win over an AP-ranked opponent for the third straight year. The Tigers are the only team in the country to defeat a ranked opponent to open 2018, 2019 and 2020.

This was the sixth time all-time that a ranked Auburn team has played four straight games against teams in the AP Top 25. Others: 1968, 1983-84, 1987, 2002-03 and 2013.

» Auburn is 114-166-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 53-43-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-72-2 on the road and 33-51-2 on a neutral field.

» Auburn has played 46 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 102 games as the Tigers' head coach (45.1 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 27 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 20-26 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including 8-19 against Top 10 teams.

» The Tigers are 90-134-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (43-34-2 at home, 28-65-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 59-53-3 overall (29-10-1 at home, 19-33-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 330-122-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 188-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-89-4 all-time.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 81-77-4 (36-13-1 at home, 22-41-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

» The Tennessee game was Gus Malzahn's 100th game as Auburn head coach. His first game was a 31-24 win over Washington State at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2013.

Malzahn is the fifth all-time to coach 100 games at Auburn; also Ralph "Shug" Jordan (265 games, 1951-75); Pat Dye (142 games, 1981-92); Mike Donahue (139 games, 1904-06, 1908-22); Tommy Tuberville (125 games, 1999-2008).

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 329-257-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 141-61-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 188-195-12 overall. The Tigers are 38-26 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 27-6.

The season-opening win over Kentucky was Auburn's 325th victory all-time in SEC regular season competition.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 154-30 (.837) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 210-38-1 (.841) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 550-58-9 (.899) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 345-9 (.975) when scoring 30 points, 174-3 (.9758) when scoring 40 points, 81-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» On the current Auburn roster, 41 players have at least one college start to their credit, 23 on offense and 18 on defense.

THE LAST TIME VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE #7 AUBURN 56, MISS. STATE 23

>> A touchdown on the Tigers' first offensive play set the tone Saturday in No. 7 Auburn's 56-23 dismantling of Mississippi State at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Bo Nix completed 16 of 21 passes for 335 yards and two touchdowns, adding 56 rushing yards and a TD.

Auburn (5-0) scored six TDs in the first half and led 42-9 at intermission.

JaTarvious Whitlow scored three touchdowns in the first half, including a 30-yarder on Auburn's first play.

The Tigers forced three-and-outs on State's first two possessions, after which the Bulldogs' rushing yardage was minus-19.

Nix scored on a 9-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-0 lead with 9:46 left in the first quarter.

After Jordyn Peters recovered a fumble on the ensuing kickoff return at State's 18-yard line, Malik Miller's block paved the way for Anthony Schwartz on a 13-yard TD sweep to make it 21-0 just six minutes into the game.

After a Mississippi State touchdown, Whitlow scored his second TD from 3 yards out to put Auburn ahead 28-6 with 13:18 left in the second quarter.

Nix's 39-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams gave Auburn a 35-9 lead at the 5:33 mark.

Jeremiah Dinson recovered a fumble late in the half. Nix connected with Schwartz for a 48-yard pass, the game's longest play. With 12 seconds left in the half, Whitlow scored his third touchdown.

Auburn kept the pressure on in the second half, scoring on the opening drive on Nix's 32-yard pass to Williams. Nix and Williams teamed up eight times for 161 yards and two touchdowns.

Nix went over the 300-yard mark for the first time in his Auburn career on a 31-yard pass to Sal Cannella.

Kam Martin scored Auburn's final touchdown on a 7-yard run with 14:16 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers gained 578 yards.

Auburn forced two turnovers and limited State's Kylin Hill, the SEC's leading rusher, to 45 yards on 17 carries, a 2.6 per carry average, less than half of his 6.1 average.

Daniel Thomas led Auburn with six tackles. K.J. Britt added five, including two of the Tigers' five tackles for loss.

FAST FACTS

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

» His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last nine seasons - with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.

» Now in his eighth season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): **176**, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); **99**, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); **85**, Tommy Tuberville (10); **67, Gus Malzahn (8)**; **48**, Jack Meagher (9); **47**, Terry Bowden (6); **33**, Gene Chizik (4); **29**, Doug Barfield (5); **22**, Chet Wynne (4).

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).

» Since 2000, in the eight seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 25 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season four times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

» Malzahn is 50-12 (.806) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 4-1 in 2020 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In nine seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 83 of 102 games (81%).

» Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.

» 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

» Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 59 of 102 games under Malzahn.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 426 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 334, losing 85 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Bo Nix threw three second-half touchdown passes and No. 8 Auburn's defense forced three turnovers to lead the Tigers to a 29-13 season-opening win over No. 23 Kentucky Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Nix connected twice with Seth Williams and once with Eli Stove, completing 16 of 27 passes for 233 yards with no turnovers. Nix and Williams teamed up six times for 112 yards and two touchdowns.

Trailing 7-0 after Kentucky scored on its opening drive, Auburn answered with a 7-yard, seven-play drive to take the lead. After D. J. Williams' 1-yard touchdown run, Grant Loy's two-point conversion pass to John Samuel Shenker gave Auburn an 8-7 lead.

Late in the half, Kentucky threatened to take the lead, but Roger McCreary intercepted Terry Wilson's pass in Auburn's end zone, returning 100 yards for a touchdown that was negated by a penalty on the return.

On third-and-goal from the 11, Nix rolled right and threw to Williams, who elevated in the end zone for a touchdown that extended Auburn's lead to 15-7 with 5:42 left in the third quarter.

Wilson threw a touchdown pass to trim Auburn's lead to 15-13, but the Tigers' defense forced an incomplete pass on Kentucky's two-point attempt to preserve the lead late in the third quarter.

Jamien Sherwood recovered a fumble early in the fourth quarter to give Auburn possession at Kentucky's 23-yard line.

Four plays later on third-and-goal from the 4, Nix targeted Williams, who outmuscled his defender to record his second touchdown, putting Auburn in front 22-13 with 10:21 left in the game.

Kentucky tried a fake punt, but Jordyn Peters ran down the Wildcats' punter for a 3-yard loss, giving Auburn the ball on UK's 27.

Auburn quickly capitalized two plays later when Nix connected with Eli Stove for a 27-yard touchdown that increased Auburn's lead to 29-13.

McCreary forced a fumble that Owen Pappoe recovered for Auburn's third turnover. Pappoe and DaQuan Newkirk each made sacks among the Tigers' eight tackles for loss. K.J. Britt led Auburn with 11 tackles while Smoke Monday made 10, both career highs.

Auburn University students comprised the majority of the 17,490 in attendance, 20 percent of Jordan-Hare Stadium's pre-pandemic capacity.

Auburn honored former coach Pat Dye, who died on June 1, by wearing helmet decals with Dye's initials and the words "Sixty Minutes," referencing Dye's famous answer when asked at his introductory press conference how long it would take Auburn to beat its in-state rival.

Malzahn paid homage to Dye by wearing the College Football Hall of Fame coach's traditional gameday attire: a white short-sleeve shirt, tie and Auburn hat.

The Tigers make their first road trip next Saturday when they play at Georgia in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry at 6:30 p.m. CT on ESPN and the Auburn Sports Network.

In a top-10 matchup, No. 4 Georgia beat No. 7 Auburn 27-6 Saturday at Sanford Stadium in the 125th edition of the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry.

Bo Nix completed 21 of 41 passes for 177 yards and true freshman Tank Bigsby accounted for 99 yards of total offense to pace the Tigers.

After Georgia scored a touchdown and kicked a field goal on its first two drives to lead 10-0 after the first quarter, the Bulldogs added a 21-yard touchdown pass and Zamir White's second TD run to lead 24-0 with 6:26 remaining in the first half.

Auburn got on the scoreboard with a 20-yard Anders Carlson field goal to cap a 12-play, 65-yard drive for a 24-3 halftime score.

On the drive, Nix's 19-yard pass to Bigsby was Auburn's longest gain of the half. Making his first start, Bigsby made seven receptions for 68 yards while adding 31 rushing yards on eight carries.

Auburn began the second half with a 15-play drive that led to Carlson's 45-yard field goal, trimming UGA's lead to 24-6. The Tigers converted three third downs on the drive, with Nix hitting Seth Williams for 10 and 20 yards to move the chains twice while Nix rushed for 10 yards on third-and-5.

After Georgia kicked a field goal to lead 27-6, Auburn again drove into UGA territory, with 6-2, 300-pound true freshman tight end J.J. Pegues twice picking up first downs with 2-yard runs out of the Wildcat formation. The drive ended with a fourth-down interception.

Anthony Schwartz had eight receptions for 57 yards.

Jamien Sherwood highlighted Auburn's defensive effort, making a career-high 14 tackles. Sherwood tallied 13 stops in the first half, including a tackle for loss, while breaking up two passes. Jordyn Peters also had a career effort with 13 tackles. K.J. Britt added 12 tackles and Zakoby McClain made 11, both career highs. McClain also recorded a sack.

The Tigers and Bulldogs played in front of 20,524 in Auburn's first road game of the coronavirus pandemic.

Auburn returns to Jordan-Hare Stadium next Saturday vs. Arkansas at 3 p.m. CT on SEC Network.

All Anders Carlson needed was a second chance Saturday. The junior kicker missed a 34-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter, but when his teammates picked him up and gave him another opportunity with less than 20 seconds left to win it, he delivered.

Carlson drilled a 39-yard field goal, his third made field goal of the game, to propel No. 13 Auburn to a 30-28 victory over Arkansas on a wet, rainy day in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

It took all three phases for Auburn in the final sequence. Following the missed kick, the defense responded with a three-and-out to give the Tigers the ball back. On offense, it was Tank Bigsby who took over on the final drive. The freshman running back caught a pass for nine yards and then had back-to-back runs for 17 yards to set up the go-ahead kick from Carlson.

Bigsby finished with 146 yards rushing, 16 yards receiving and added 106 yards on kick returns. He ran for 106 yards in the first half, becoming the first Auburn running back to reach 100 yards in the first half of an SEC game since Kerryon Johnson did it against Ole Miss in 2017.

In what was a sloppy start for both sides due to the weather, Auburn scored first with a blocked punt for a touchdown. Senior defensive back Jordyn Peters broke through the right side and blocked the punt while junior linebacker Barton Lester was right there to fall on it in the end zone.

For Peters, it was the fourth punt block in his career. It was Auburn's first blocked punt for a touchdown since 2018 against Alabama State when Peters blocked it and Devan Barrett returned it for six.

The Tigers kept the foot on the gas, adding a field goal late in the first quarter to make it 10-0. On their opening drive of the second quarter, it was vintage Auburn football as the offense ran the ball 10 straight times and marched 80 yards down the field for a touchdown. Bigsby started the drive with runs of 13 and 17 yards. Fellow running back D.J. Williams picked up 11 yards and then converted a third-and-2 with a 5-yard run. Quarterback Bo Nix capped the drive with a 15-yard touchdown run to extend the lead to 17-0.

As a team, Auburn rushed for 215 yards in the first half. Arkansas battled back in the second half to cut the lead to two, but the Tigers responded and mounted another impressive touchdown drive. This time it was Nix and wide receiver Anthony Schwartz who took over. The two connected five times for 56 yards on the drive, including a 17-yard touchdown catch from Schwartz on 3rd-and-10 where he weaved through a handful of Razorbacks on his way to the end zone.

Schwartz finished with a team-high 10 receptions and 100 yards receiving, both career highs. On defense, linebackers Owen Pappoe and Zakoby McClain stepped up for Auburn in the absence of senior leader K.J. Britt. McClain led the team with 13 tackles, a new career high, and Pappoe also set a career high in tackles with 10 while adding a sack as well.

Pappoe's sack was one of seven tackles for loss by the defense. Sophomore Colby Wooden, starting in place of the injured Big Kat Bryant, recorded two tackles for loss, a sack and six total stops. It was the fifth straight win in the series for Auburn who now leads 18-11 all-time.

The Tigers (2-1) will go back on the road next week to face a South Carolina team who earned their first victory of the season Saturday. The game is scheduled to kick off at 11 a.m. CT and will be televised on ESPN.

Tank Bigsby raced past the 100-yard mark for the second straight game and scored his first collegiate touchdown Saturday but No. 15 Auburn lost 30-22 at South Carolina.

Bigsby passed the century mark in the fourth quarter on runs of 30 and 19 yards, setting up Anders Carlson's third field goal to make it a one-score game with 6:36 to play. Bigsby gained 111 yards on 16 carries.

Auburn's defense held the Gamecocks to one first down before the Tigers got the ball back with 2:15 to play, needing to go 80 yards with no timeouts.

Auburn drove to the Gamecocks' 12-yard line with 9 seconds remaining, but on fourth-and-5, Bo Nix was tackled at the 9-yard-line, two yards short of the first down.

Auburn scored on the opening drive of the second half to lead 19-14 after marching 54 yards on 11 plays and converting two third downs to set up Carlson's second field goal, a 35-yarder.

The Gamecocks answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive, taking a 20-19 lead on a 10-yard touchdown pass. South Carolina's attempted two-point pass was incomplete with 6:31 left in the third quarter.

Owen Pappoe's first career interception ended South Carolina's red zone threat late in the third quarter, but the Gamecocks soon regained possession with their third interception and scored on an 8-yard run on their next play to lead 27-19 with 54 seconds left in the quarter.

Bo Nix hit Seth Williams for a 58-yard touchdown pass with 1:11 to play to give Auburn a 35-28 come-from-behind win Saturday at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Trailing by one point, Auburn (3-2) drove 80 yards on six plays, the Tigers' fifth long scoring drive of the game. Nix and Williams connected again for a two-point conversion pass that gave Auburn a seven-point lead.

Ole Miss (1-4) drove to Auburn's 29 with 3 seconds remaining, but Jordyn Peters made an interception on the game's final play on which Ole Miss was penalized for passing beyond the line of scrimmage.

Early in the third quarter Roger McCreary tackled Ole Miss kicker Luke Logan for a 4-yard-loss on a fake field goal after a special teams miscue had given the Rebels a short field.

After an Auburn punt, Ole Miss drove 89 yards on three plays, scoring on Matt Corral's 10-yard run to lead 21-14 at the 7:09 mark of the third quarter.

Auburn answered with a 10-play, 88-yard game-tying drive. Tank Bigsby ran for 19 yards on third-and-2, then Nix rolled right and threw high down the middle to Seth Williams, who hauled in the pass at the Ole Miss 1-yard line. Shaun Shivers scored on the next play for a 21-21 tie with 2:57 to play in the third quarter.

The Tigers' defense delivered a key stop when Smoke Monday sacked Corral on third-and-5 to force an Ole Miss punt.

The Tigers then drove 80 yards on 11 plays to take the lead. Nix twice completed passes on third downs, first to Williams, then to John Samuel Shenker. Bigby stiff-armed a defender on an 18-yard touchdown run.

On the PAT attempt, Auburn was unable to cleanly convert the snap and hold, resulting in a 27-21 lead.

Bigsby recorded his third consecutive 100-yard game, rushing for 129 yards on 24 carries with two touchdowns.

Ole Miss drove for a touchdown to take a 28-27 lead with 5:43 to play, then forced a three-and-out from Auburn's offense.

The Tigers defense responded with its own three-and-out to give the offense one more opportunity, setting the stage for the most recent Bo-to-Seth game-winner.

Nix completed 23 of 30 passes for 238 yards and a touchdown, adding 52 rushing yards on 10 carries and a TD. Williams led Auburn's receiving corps with eight catches for 150 yards and the game-winning touchdown, his fifth career 100-yard game. Anthony Schwartz added seven receptions.

Owen Pappoe led Auburn's defensive with 14 tackles. Smoke Monday made a career-high 12, including a sack, while Jamien Sherwood added 11.

Two touchdown drives by each team led to a 14-14 halftime tie. After both teams went three-and-out on their opening possessions, the Rebels drove to Auburn's 4-yard line before McCreary ended the threat with his second end zone interception of the season.

The Tigers then drove 95 yards on 14 plays with Bigsby capping the drive with a 4-yard touchdown to give Auburn a 7-0 lead.

The Rebels answered with 75-yard drive to tie it at 7-7 on Corral's 6-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Moore with 13:46 remaining in the half.

Auburn responded with a 10-play, 79-yard scoring drive. Shaun Shivers crossed midfield with runs of 14 and 12 yards. On third-and-4, Nix hit Williams on a slant, with Williams hurdling an Ole Miss defender to gain 21 yards.

Nix scored on a 4-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-7 at the 9:11 mark of the second quarter.

The Rebels then drove 78 yards on 16 plays, converting on fourth-and-5 before scoring on Corral's quarterback run for a 14-14 tie with 3:35 left in the half.

Auburn didn't need any tricks on Halloween this year. It was all treats for the Tigers on Saturday as they dominated LSU, winning 48-11 inside Jordan-Hare Stadium.

It was Auburn's largest margin of victory over LSU, surpassing the previous total of 35 (1999, 2014), and it was also the most points either team has scored in series history.

After a scoreless first quarter, Auburn struck first in the opening minutes of the second quarter with a 9-yard touchdown pass from Bo Nix to Eli Stove. The score was set up by the Auburn defense and cornerback Nehemiah Pritchett who pulled down his first career interception and returned it 48 yards. Stove scored on the next play.

The Auburn defense made its presence felt again later in the quarter when Christian Tutt recovered a fumble and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown to put the Tigers up 14-0. The fumble was caused by Derick Hall who sacked LSU quarterback T.J. Finley on the play.

From that point on it was all Auburn, dismantling the defending national champions in all three phases.

The offense found its rhythm, scoring touchdowns on each their next five drives, including a 99-yard drive to close out the first half and a 75-yard drive to open the second half. The defense kept LSU out of the end zone until a touchdown midway through the fourth quarter with Auburn ahead 48-3.

Nix was responsible for four of Auburn's seven touchdowns. The sophomore quarterback finished 18 of 24 through the air for 300 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran for a career-high 81 yards on 11 carries, adding a fourth score on the ground. It was the third career 300-yard passing performance from Nix, who finished with a pass efficiency rating of 221.3.

On his final play before exiting the game, Nix connected with junior wide receiver Anthony Schwartz on a 91-yard touchdown pass - the third-longest touchdown pass in school history. With the catch, Schwartz finished as Auburn's leading receiver. He had four receptions for 123 yards.

Stove and fellow wide receiver Ze'Vian Capers also caught touchdowns Saturday. The early score from Stove was his third of the season and fifth of his career. The junior recorded a team-high five receptions for 64 yards and added 21 yards rushing. Capers, a true freshman, was wide open in the end zone when he caught a 9-yard pass from Nix. It was his first career touchdown at Auburn.

For the first time since week two, Tank Bigsby failed to go over 100 yards rushing. But the freshman running back still ran for 71 yards on 15 carries and scored two touchdowns in the third quarter to bring his total to five on the season. Bigsby is now ninth among Auburn freshman rushers all-time with 503 yards on the season.

As a team, Auburn rushed for 206 yards in Saturday's win. The Tigers have now surpassed 200 yards on the ground in four straight games.

On the visiting side, LSU finished with only 32 yards rushing thanks to an inspired performance from the Auburn defense. The group forced three turnovers, held LSU to 5 of 17 on third down and recorded four sacks - two from Hall, one from T.D. Moultry and one from Marquis Burks. It was the first two sacks of Hall's career.

Auburn was so dominant on defense that LSU never made it inside the Auburn 30-yard until midway through the fourth quarter. LSU crossed midfield just three times on its first 12 drives.

Coaching in his 100th game at Auburn on Saturday, head coach Gus Malzahn notched another victory as the Tigers beat Tennessee, 30-17, inside Jordan-Hare Stadium.

It was Auburn's first game in 21 days, and there might have been a little rust early as the home team fell behind 10-0 in the first quarter. But the Tigers responded with 27 unanswered points and made plays in all three phases to pull away in the second half for their third straight win.

The biggest play of the night came late in the third quarter from the Auburn defense. With the Tigers leading 13-10 and Tennessee threatening to score, junior safety Smoke Monday intercepted a pass from Jarrett Guarantano in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown.

It was the second career pick-six for Monday, and it was the longest interception return for a touchdown by an Auburn player since Zakoby McClain took one back 100 yards last year against Alabama.

After the defense held again on the next drive, it was the offense's turn to put the game away. The Tigers went 80 yards on 12 plays, and D.J. Williams capped the drive with a 9-yard touchdown run to make it 27-10. Williams had 38 yards on the drive and led Auburn's ground attack with 66 yards on 11 carries.

Williams and backfield counterpart Shaun Shivers, who finished with 65 rushing yards, picked up the slack with freshman Tank Bigsby forced to leave the game in the first quarter.

Quarterback Bo Nix also had to shake off some rust Saturday, but after struggling in the first quarter, he connected with Anthony Schwartz on a 54-yard touchdown pass midway through the second quarter to put the Tigers on the board. It was the second straight game the two have hooked up on a touchdown of 50 yards or more, and it was the third receiving score of the season for Schwartz.

For Nix, it was the spark he needed. The sophomore signal caller was 15 of 19 for 189 yards after the first quarter, and in addition to the touchdown, he completed multiple passes to convert on third down and keep drives going. Auburn was 9 of 15 on third down for the game and 6 of 8 in the second half.

While Schwartz led the team with 84 yards receiving, fellow wide receiver Seth Williams finished with 52 yards and had a team-high five receptions, including four on third down that resulted in first downs.

On special teams, Anders Carlson made all three of his field-goal attempts. He tied the game with a 25-yard kick late in the first half and then gave Auburn a 13-10 lead when he connected on a 27-yarder midway through the third quarter. The junior kicker also drilled a 50-yard field goal in the final minutes. It was his longest kick of the season and the fourth kick of 50 yards or more in his career.

With the win, Auburn improves to 5-2 on the season. The Tigers will play the first of three remaining games next week at Alabama. Kickoff is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. CT, and the game will be televised on CBS.

A 96-yard fourth-quarter touchdown drive provided the highlight Saturday for No. 22 Auburn in a 42-13 loss to top-ranked Alabama in the 2020 Iron Bowl at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

The drive began at Auburn's 4-yard line after Smoke Monday caused a fumble that Jamien Sherwood recovered. Auburn quarterback Bo Nix spent time in both end zones on the drive, escaping a safety and rushing 8 yards for a first down on third-and-3 from the Tigers' 11-yard line.

Three Mark-Antony Richards' runs netted 25 yards to Auburn's 44. Nix connected with tight end John Samuel Shenker for 26 yards to Alabama's 8-yard line.

After two Richards' runs advanced the ball to the 1, Nix scored on third-and-goal to cap a 12-play drive, the Tigers' longest in the series since the 1987 Iron Bowl.

Nix completed 23 of 38 passes for 227 yards. Anthony Schwartz led Auburn's receiving corps with five catches for 60 yards. After Auburn's defense forced a punt on Alabama's first possession of the second half, Nix's 37-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson on third-and-2 was Auburn's longest gain of the game.

Auburn scored first in the second half on Anders Carlson's 45-yard goal, trimming Alabama's lead to 21-6 with 10:36 left in the third quarter.

Alabama answered quickly when Mac Jones hit DeVonta Smith for a 58-yard touchdown pass to make it 28-6.

Nix and Schwartz teamed up for three consecutive completions for 39 yards, but Auburn missed a 56-yard field goal attempt.

After a Najee Harris 39-yard touchdown run, Jones' fifth TD pass, a 24-yarder to John Metchie, gave Alabama a 42-6 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Auburn held Alabama to 2 yards rushing on five carries in the first quarter. Alabama's first drive began at Auburn's 34-yard line, but the Tigers' defense forced a punt after a three-and-out.

Auburn picked up a pair of first downs on its second drive before punting to Alabama's 22-yard line. The home team scored first on a 66-yard touchdown pass to Smith.

Auburn put Alabama behind the chains late in the first quarter on Big Kat Bryant's ninth career sack but Jones' second touchdown pass, a 7-yarder to Metchie, gave Alabama a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter.

The Tigers responded with a 12-play drive, converting a pair of third downs on Nix completions to Schwartz and J.J. Pegues, to set up Carlson's 47-yard field goal to make it 14-3.

Alabama (8-0) scored on a third consecutive drive on Jones' 24-yard touchdown pass to Jahleel Billingsley for a 21-3 half-time lead.

Zakoby McClain led Auburn with nine tackles. Jaren Handy recorded his first career sack. Richards led Auburn with 57 rushing yards on 14 carries.

Two rushing touchdowns from Bo Nix weren't enough for Auburn on Saturday as the Tigers fell, 31-20, to No. 5 Texas A&M in the home finale.

Auburn battled back from an early 7-0 deficit, and Nix's first score put the Tigers ahead 10-7 late in the first half. The sophomore quarterback did his best Houdini impression, escaping two defenders in the backfield and avoiding a sack. He then rolled left, ran toward the end zone and lowered his head at the goal line, willing himself in for six.

Texas A&M responded with a touchdown to take a 14-10 lead into halftime, but the Tigers marched down the field on the opening drive of the second half and scored on a 3-yard touchdown run from Nix, his second of the game.

For Nix, it was the first time in his career with two rushing touchdowns. He finished with 49 yards on the ground and 144 yards through the air on 15 of 23 passing.

Following Nix's second touchdown run, Auburn continued to have success on the ground with freshman Tank Bigsby ripping off a 42-yard run on the next drive. It was the longest run of Bigsby's young career, and it led to a 24-yard field goal from Anders Carlson to make it 20-14.

Bigsby, Nix and junior Shaun Shivers spearheaded an Auburn rushing attack that finished with 196 yards on 30 carries, averaging 6.5 yards per carry. Bigsby paced the Tigers with 76 yards on nine carries while Shivers also carried it nine times for 68 yards.

The offense hit a snag in the fourth quarter, though, and Texas A&M scored 17 unanswered points in the final 15 minutes to pull away for the victory.

Defensively for Auburn, linebacker Zakoby McClain finished with a career-high 17 tackles, including two tackles for loss. It was the sixth double-digit tackle game of the season for McClain who also recorded his third sack and first forced fumble of the season. McClain now has a team-high 94 tackles through the first nine games.

Auburn (5-4) will wrap up the regular season next Saturday at Mississippi State.

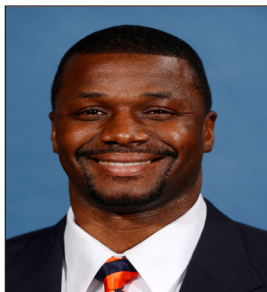
