## NM State Takes on Auburn, Saturday

The New Mexico State (1-7, 0-4) football team travel to Auburn (1-7, 0-6) to face what could be their toughest games of the 2012 season. The Aggies will not only face the Tigers on the weekend but will also play in front of a crowd of over 87,000 fans. Kick-off is set for 10:30 a.m. (MT)

The Tigers have dropped four in a row and are 1-2 at home this season. This will be the second game of a four game home stand for Auburn.

The Tigers and Aggies squared off for the first time in 1993, as NM State lost 55-14.

The game will also be televised on Comcast Sports Southeast.

## Aggies/Tigers History

NM State and Auburn will lock up for the third time in program history on Saturday. This will be the third trip to Auburn, Ala., for the Aggies. In the previous two meeting the Aggies fell 50-14 in 1993 and 55-20 in 2007.

## Scouting the Tigers

Auburn comes into the game with the Aggies at 1-7 overall and 0-6 in SEC play. This season the Tigers are 1-4 at home with their only win coming in overtime against Sun Belt opponent Louisiana-Monroe. Auburn has four straight games at home before wrapping up

## Aggie Media Guidelines

### INTERVIEWS

Interviews with head coach DeWayne Walker or any New Mexico State assistant football coach must be coordinated through Media Relations Director Tyler Dunkel, (575) 646-2927.

### PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All interviews must be arranged by the Media Relations Office. Players have been instructed not to grant any interview, in person or by telephone, not arranged by the Media Relations staff. Player telephone numbers are private and will not be released.

Interviews with players must be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations Office at least one day in advance to minimize demands on the student-athlete's time. All other requests for after practice must be made by 1 p.m. on the day of the interview. No player interviews will be conducted after Wednesday of each week. Player interviews will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday only. Interviews will be conducted after practice or by phone if arranged prior to the day.

Head coach DeWayne Walker will review ALL media requests for players both before or after practice or requests by phone. Approval by Walker is needed before interviews can be scheduled. Walker or Media Relations Director Tyler Dunkel reserves the right to deny interview requests.

Phone interviews must also be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations Office with the requested player returning the call at an agreed upon time from the Athletic Media Relations Office.

Keep in mind, team locker rooms are off limits to media representatives at ALL TIMES. Interviews during practice are strictly prohibited. New Mexico State football practices are open to the public and media is welcome to attend. Following each practice, Walker and selected players will be available for brief interviews if requested. Please coordinate with the Athletic Media Relations staff in attendance.

### POSTGAME

New Mexico State provides equal access to all members of the working media.

At home games, Walker will hold a postgame press conference in the meeting room at the north end of Aggie Memorial Stadium. Access to this room can be found on the ramp leading to the field.

Requests for player interviews should be made to Media Relations Director Tyler Dunkel or the opposing SID no later than the eight-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

New Mexico State players will be brought to the meeting rooms for interviews. The opponent's coach will be available either on the field or outside the visitor's locker room at the discretion of the visiting SID.

Head coach DeWayne Walker will review ALL media requests for players after each game and reserves the right to select players from the submitted list.

### CREDENTIALS

Credentials for New Mexico State home games are issued for working media ONLY and should be requested as early as possible due to space limitations.

All members of the media must request credentials in writing through Jeremy Strachan, Assistant Media Relations Director, (575) 646-3269.

Requests are honored from sports editors of daily newspapers and sports directors of television and radio stations. Requests from individuals not employed by a media outlet WILL NOT be considered.

the season at rival Alabama.

Auburn has struggled offensively this season, scoring just 16.4 points per game, while allowing 29.9 points a contest. The Tigers are averaging 284.0 yards per game, giving up over 444 yards in total offense per contest.

Individually, quarterback Kiehl Frazier leads the Tigers in passing with 753 yards and two touchdowns, but has thrown eight interceptions. Tre Mason has 554 rushing yards for an average of 69.2 yards per game and five touchdowns. Emory Blake has caught 35 passes for 531 yards and three scores to lead the receiving corps.

Defensively, Daren Bates leads the Tigers with 80 tackles, 5.5 tackles for a loss, two sack and the team's lone interception, followed by Demetruce McNeal with 74 tackles. Corey Lemonier leads Auburn with five sacks on the season.

### Aggies Against the SEC

Since 1977 the Aggies have faced a team from the current SEC (Southeastern Conference) 12 times. NM State is 0-14 all-time against SEC schools. The first game against an SEC team came in 1977 versus Arkansas when the Aggies fell to the Hogs 53-10. The last SEC team NM State has faced was Georgia in 2011. The Aggies lost 63-16.

The Aggies closest game against an SEC team came in 2002, when the Aggies played South Carolina to a 34-24 decision. NM State has faced Auburn twice back in 1993 and 2007.

### NM State vs Auburn, 2007

A week after being booed and

benched, Brandon Cox passed for 135 yards and a touchdown as Auburn broke open what had been a close game in the second half to defeat New Mexico State 55-20 Saturday night.

Cox's passing complemented the running of Ben Tate and Mario Fannin. Tate rushed 21 times for 112 yards and a touchdown, while Fannin ran the ball 15 times for 103 yards and three touchdowns, including a 67-yarder in the fourth quarter.

The game was redemption for both Cox and Fannin. Cox, a fifth year senior who started the last two years, was benched early in last week's upset loss to Mississippi State and was mostly ineffective in Auburn's 1-2 start. After booing Cox lustily last week, fans were hollering "Brandon! Brandon!" after he threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to Rod Smith early in the third quarter.

Fannin had fumbled three times in the first three games, but held onto the ball against the Aggies after spending the week carrying a football every where he went on campus. His three touchdowns were the most by an Auburn player since 2005.

Auburn (2-2) held a slim 21-20 lead at halftime. Cox, who came in dur-

ing the second quarter, gave the Tigers a spark as they outscored the Aggies 34-0 in the second half.

New Mexico State (2-2) was led by Chase Holbrook, who completed 29-of-40 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns, but had three interceptions. Auburn's Johnathan Wilhite had two of those interceptions.

Freshman quarterback Kodi Burns, who saw his first action last week, started instead of Cox. The Tigers started slow, failing to get a first down in their first two possessions.

The defense got Auburn on the board at 7:33 in the first quarter when Pat Sims recovered a fumble by the Aggies' A.J. Harris and returned it 21 yards for a score. It was the first time Auburn had scored first this season.

The Aggies came back as Holbrook got the passing game going, driving 80-yards in 10 plays, including a 44-yard completion over the middle to Nick Cleaver. Holbrook scored on one-yard sneak as the Aggies tied the score 7-7 at 3:51 in the first.

Auburn took the lead on the next play from scrimmage when Burns hit Rod Smith with a 58 yard scoring pass.

New Mexico State tied it again on a 5-yard pass from Holbrook to Brandon Allen. The Aggies took a 20-14 lead two plays later.

On his first play, Cox fumbled the snap on Auburn's next play and Holbrook followed with a 25-yard TD pass to Chris Williams.

Cox had better luck on Auburn's next possession, leading the Tigers on a 9-play, 62-yard drive capped by a one-yard touchdown run by Fannin, giving the Tigers a 21-20 lead.

### Morrison Continues to Run Strong

Running back Germi Morrison has stepped into the lead running back position over the last few games for the Aggies. Against Utah State, Morrison had a career-high 96 yards on 19 carries. He also caught a career-high four passes for 28 yards. Versus Louisiana Tech, Morrison recorded his second straight game with over 90 yards rushing, while catching a career-high four passes for 51 yards.

On the season, Morrison has 451 yards on the ground to lead NM State on 91 carries with one touchdown. He is fifth on the WAC in rushing yards per game with 63.3. Morrison also has 11 catches for 91 yards on the year.

### Harris a Tough Cornerback

Cornerback Jeremy Harris recorded a career-high three pass break ups against No. 24 Louisiana Tech. He also had six tackles for the second straight week. Over the course of the last three games, Harris has 16 tackles and five pass break ups. On the season he leads the team in pass break ups with eight, ranking him fifth in the WAC. He also ranks tied for seventh in the conference in forced fumbles with two, which also leads the Aggies.

On the season, Harris has 39 tackles, an interception, eight pass break ups and two forced fumbles.

### Cazares Leads Team in Tackles

Safety Davis Cazares currently leads the team in tackles with 83 thru eight games. He also leads the WAC in tackles per game and is 18th in the nation. Cazares had a career day against New Mexico with 19 tackles and a forced fumble. He had eight solo tackles and 11 assisted. On the season, Cazares has recorded five games with double-digit tackles.

Cazares' previous high was 10 tackles against Sacramento State to start the season. He then followed that performance with a 10 tackles against UTSA. This past weekend, Cazares had 15 tackles about No. 24 Louisiana Tech.

In 2011, Cazares played in 13 games for the Aggies on special teams and at safety. He tallied 12 tackles on the season. Cazares recorded a season-high three tackles against Fresno State (Nov. 12) and two tackles versus Ohio (Sept. 3), New Mexico (Oct. 1) and Nevada (Oct. 29).

For his career, Cazares has 103 tackles and a forced fumble.

### Walls' Continues to be Major Factor

Tight end Trevor Walls continues to be a productive play maker for the Aggies this season. Against Louisiana Tech, Walls had two catches for 26 yards with along of 20 yards. Each catch on third and long. Versus Utah State, Walls caught a single game career-

high three passes for 37 yards and a long of 29 yards, also a career-high. Walls is averaging 11.5 yards a catch with one touchdown.

For his career, Walls has 19 receptions for 236 yards and a touchdown, averaging 12.4 yards a catch.

### Sacking the QB

The Aggie defense had three sacks against Utah State this past weekend. It was the most for the Aggies as a team this season. NM State has recorded three or more sacks in a game only four other times since the 2009 season. Donte Savage had two against Utah State, while Trashaun Nixon recorded the other sack.

On the season, NM State has 10 sacks.

### Savage Close to Breaking into Top-5

Defensive end Donte Savage had his best game of the 2012 season against Utah State. Savage tied a season-high six tackles, two sacks, two and half tackles for a loss and four quarterback hurries. He was named an honorable mention Defensive Lineman of the Week by College Football Performance.

On the season, Savage has three sacks and 32 tackles. His six tackles for a loss ranks him ninth in the WAC, while his three sacks' leads the team.

For his career, Savage has 132 tackles, 27.0 for a loss, four forced fumbles, three recovered fumbles, a blocked PAT and a blocked punt. Savage looks to make his mark on the sack record book. He currently has 14 for his career and needs two to break into the top five all-time at NM State.

### Franklin Continues to Be the Aggies' Top Receiver

Wide receiver Austin Franklin recorded his sixth 100-yard receiving game of the season against Louisiana Tech with a team-leading seven catches for 139 yards. He has seven 100-yard receiving games in his career, including six this season (Sac State – 236; UTEP – 107; New Mexico – 107; UTSA – 105; Idaho – 115; Louisiana Tech - 139)

Franklin also leads the team in scoring with 56 points on nine touchdown receptions and a two-point conversion catch. He is tied for sixth in the conference in scoring with 7.0 points per game.

Nationally, Franklin ranks third in receiving yards per game, is 14th in receptions per game and 35th in all-purpose yards. He ranks first in the WAC in receiving yards per game and second in receptions per game.

Franklin saw action in all 13 games for NM State in 2011 at wide receiver and as a returner of kickoffs and punts. He grabbed 34 receptions for 524 yards and three touchdowns on the season, including 22 yards rushing on four carries. Franklin also returned three kicks for 103 yards including a long of 54. He registered a career-high eight receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown at BYU.

For his career, Franklin has caught 91 passes for 1,489 yards and 12 touchdowns, averaging 16.4 yards per catch.

## Manley by the Numbers

This season, Manley has thrown for 2,090 yards and 12 touchdowns, completing 54.4 percent of his passes.

Against UTEP, Manley surpassed the 2,000-yard passing mark with 290 yards on 20-of-47 passing. Manley has thrown for over 200 yards in a game nine times in his career and has now thrown a touchdown pass in nine straight games. Against Idaho, Manley recorded his third 300-yard passing game, with 309 yards on 28-of-45 passing and a touchdown. He broke the 3,000-yard passing mark for his career in that game as well.

Manley is currently fourth in the WAC in passing yards per game (261.2) and fourth in total offense per game (249.2).

For his career, Manley has thrown for 3,586 yards and 21 touchdowns, while completing 54.4 percent of his pass attempts.

## Additions to the Staff in 2012

The Aggies welcome four new coaches to the staff in 2012. Jerry McManus takes over as offensive coordinator for the departed Doug Martin, while David Elson will handle the defensive coordinator duties after the retirement of Dale Lindsey. Both McManus and Elson have several years at the college level as top assistants, while Elson holds head coaching experience.

Brad Bedell comes to NM State as the new offensive line coach, while Romeo Bandison will oversee the defensive line. Bedell and Bandison each have professional football playing experience, while Bandison has coached at top programs like Boise State and Colorado.

## Honors in 2011

The New Mexico State football team received several honors after the 2011 football season both for on-the-field accomplishments and in the classroom. Taveon Rogers was selected as a third team Yahoo Sports and honorable mention Pro Football Weekly All-American teams. Five players including Rogers, Donyae Coleman, Davonte Wallace, Jonte Green and Kenny Turner all garnered All-WAC honors the most all-conference picks since joining the WAC. Valerian Ume-Ezeoke was also named to the Rivals.com Freshman All-WAC team. Defensive lineman David Niumatalolo was selected as CoSIDA Academic All-American, the team's first Academic All-American since 1999. The Aggies also landed 16 players on the Academic All-WAC list.

## House, Green and Rogers Playing in the NFL

The Aggies currently have three players in the NFL. Defensive back Davon House who was drafted by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round of the 2011 NFL Draft, becoming the first Aggies to be drafted since 2003. In 2012, defensive back Jonte Green was selected in the sixth round by the Detroit Lions, while wide receiver/kick returner Taveon Rogers was signed as a free agent by the Cincinnati Bengals. Rogers has since moved to defensive back.

# Head Coach DeWayne Walker



When DeWayne Walker took over the football program at New Mexico State, Dec. 31, 2008, he preached a change in culture, hard work, a new commitment and discipline, all of which came true in his first year on the job. Now entering his fourth year with the Aggies, Walker looks to continue to build on those values.

A season full of milestones best describes the 2011 season for Walker and the Aggies. NM State finished the year at 4-9 overall with a win over Big Ten opponent Minnesota, the first in school history, a third straight victory against in-state rival New Mexico, a home win over Idaho and a program-first victory against Fresno State. The Aggies won two road games on the season, accomplishing this feat for just the second time since 2002. The NM State offense also ranked 26th in the nation in passing offense, 47th in total

offense and 28th in kickoff returns.

Walker guided the Aggies to five All-WAC honors, the most since joining the WAC and since the 2002 season. Kick returner/wide receiver Taveon Rogers was named to five All-America teams, becoming the 12th All-American in school history and the first since 2008. Rogers was the team's leading kick returner with 1,318 yards and three touchdowns in 2011. He left NM State as the all-time leader in kick returns for a career (103), kick return yardage (2,728) and most kick returns for a touchdown (3). He ranked second in the nation in all-purpose yards per game with 196.3, which led the league. Rogers led the Aggies in receiving in 2011 with 59 catches for 1,048 yards and nine touchdowns, averaging 17.8 yards a catch and 87.3 yards a game. Against Fresno State, Rogers recorded a school record 412 all-purpose yards.

Running back Kenny Turner, rushed for 1,074 yards and 10 touchdowns and was named a second team All-WAC selection. Turner became just the second 1,000-yard rusher for the Aggies since the 2000 season.

Donyae Coleman also thrived under Walker's system, leading the Aggies in tackles with 133 and interceptions with six. He led the WAC in interceptions and ranked seventh in the country.

The 2010 season was a turning point for the Aggie football team regardless of the 2-10 overall record. Walker helped the Aggies to their second win over in-state rival New Mexico in as many years, making it the first time since the 1998 and 1999 seasons that NM State put together two straight wins against the Lobos. He also guided the Aggies to a homecoming win over San Jose State, the first homecoming win for the Aggies since 2007.

Walker led defensive back Davon House to a first team All-WAC honor and kicker returner Taveon Rogers to a second team All-WAC selection. House finished his career with 11 interceptions, leading the team with three picks in 2010. Rogers broke the school record for kick returns and kick return yardage in a single season. House was drafted by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round of the 2011 NFL Draft.

Despite a 3-10 overall record and a 1-7 mark in WAC play in 2009, Walker and the Aggies' football team made significant strides to become a team that the players, coaches, the university and the Las Cruces community can be proud to support.

Walker led the Aggies as they finished the year in the top six in the conference in pass defense, total defense and scoring defense. NM State ranked 36th in the nation in pass defense and 54th in pass defense efficiency. The Aggies also beat in-state rival New Mexico in Albuquerque for the first time since the 1999 season.

Defensive back Davon House was named a first team All-WAC selection, after leading the league in passes defended and interceptions. House also broke the school record for most interception return yards for a career. On the season, House returned an interception and a fumble for a touchdown.

Coming into the 2009 season, one of Walker's top priorities on offense was the running game. NM State averaged 141.5 yards a game on the ground, the most by an Aggie team since the 2003 season (211.2 ypg). Running back Seth Smith was the highlight of the Aggies' offense in 2009. Smith became just the third individual since 1969 (Dennis Manns and Chris Barnes) to rush for 1,000 yards in a season and recorded the first 1,000-yard season since 2000.

Prior to NM State, Walker spent three seasons as UCLA's defensive coordinator. In addition, he served as UCLA's interim head coach for the 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl game.

Walker, who excelled at coaching defenses for three different organizations in the National Football League prior to UCLA, has established himself as one of the top defensive minds in the collegiate game.

In 2008, Walker guided the Bruin defense to a 48th ranking in the nation in total defense, allowing 337 yards a game. UCLA's passing defense was atop the nation's leaders ranking 11th overall and second in the Pac-10, holding its opponents to just 167.6 yards per game through the air.

In 2007, the Bruin defense once again found itself listed among the national leaders in several categories. UCLA ranked 14th in rushing defense (109.2 yards per game), 29th in total defense (343.23 yards), 29th in scoring defense (22.3 points) and 32nd in pass efficiency defense (115.26). The Bruins also ranked second nationally in tackles for loss per game (8.77), third in third-down conversion defense (29.1), tied for 15th in sacks per game average (3.0) and tied for 17th in fumbles caused (14). Defensive backs Trey Brown (tied for first, 1.77/pg) and Alterraun Verner (tied for 11th, 1.46/pg) ranked among the nation's

best in the passes defended category, while defensive end Bruce Davis ranked tied for ninth in the nation in sacks per game (.92).

In 2006, the Bruins were among the national leaders in rushing defense (tied for ninth in the NCAA and tied for first in the Pac-10 with 91.08 yards per game) and total defense (33rd nationally at 304.83) and allowed almost half as many touchdowns (27) as the previous year (48). UCLA allowed 91.1 yards per game, 2.83 yards per rush and just nine touchdowns on the ground, the first time since 1985 that the Bruins had allowed fewer yards per game on the ground. The Bruin defense also ranked fifth nationally in third-down conversion defense (28.4, 50 of 176).

Walker joined the Bruins from the Washington Redskins, where he had coached the secondary, specifically the cornerbacks, the previous two seasons (2004-05) under head coach Joe Gibbs. In 2005, the Washington Redskins won 10 of 16 regular-season games, including their final five straight, to earn a wild-card berth in the playoffs. Washington defeated Tampa Bay in Florida, before dropping a 20-10 decision to the NFC champion Seattle Seahawks on the road.

The Washington Redskins ranked No. 1 among the NFL's 32 teams in lowest opponent passing percentage (54.4). In addition, they also ranked second (tied) in fewest touchdown passes allowed (15), 10th in pass defense (192.6 yards) and 14th (tied) in interceptions (16). Walker played a key role in the development of rookie cornerback Carlos Rogers and the continued fine play of Shawn Springs. In 2004, his first year in Washington, Springs became the first cornerback in NFL history to lead his team in sacks (five) and interceptions (six) in the same season and finished the year with 69 tackles. He also tutored veterans Walt Harris and Fred Smoot in that first year.

Walker spent the previous two seasons (2002-03) as secondary coach of the New York Giants under coordinator Johnnie Lynn, a former Bruin. Prior to joining the Giants, Walker spent the 2001 season as associate head coach/secondary coach at USC under Pete Carroll and was the first staff member hired by Carroll. That season, the Trojans ranked seventh nationally with 19 interceptions and also ranked 16th nationally in pass defense (179.2 yards) and 16th (tied) in fewest touchdown passes allowed (11).

He also served as secondary coach of the New England Patriots for three seasons, the first two (1998 and 1999) under Carroll and the third (2000) under Bill Belichick. During his tenure with the Patriots, defensive backs Ty Law and Lawyer Milloy each earned trips to the Pro Bowl.

Walker began his coaching career at Mt. San Antonio College (1988-92), serving as secondary coach for four seasons before becoming defensive coordinator in 1992. He then gained valuable experience by coaching at Utah State (1993), BYU (1994), Oklahoma State (1995) and California (1996-1997) before moving to the Patriots. At Cal, he tutored future NFL performers Kato Serwanga and Marquis Smith.

He also participated in the NFL's minority coaching internship program, working with the San Francisco 49ers in 1996 and the Patriots in 1997. A former cornerback himself, Walker played three seasons professionally - one in the CFL (Edmonton Eskimos in 1982) and two in the USFL (Oakland Invaders in 1984 and Arizona Outlaws in 1985). In college, he was a two-year starter at Minnesota (1980-81) after playing at Pasadena City College in Albany, N.Y., in 1992.

Walker and his wife, Zan, have two daughters (Kesha and Kendra) and one son (Kevin).

LAS CRUCES, N.M. (Aug. 30)-The New Mexico State football team opened its season with a 49-19 victory over Sacramento State inside Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Quarterback Andrew Manley and wide receiver Austin Franklin led the Aggie offense with career-high performances. Manley finished with a career-high 367 passing yards and three touchdowns on a 14-of-22 passing. Franklin posted a career-high 236 receiving yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Defensively, linebacker Trashaun Nixon debuted with 15 tackles. Linebacker Bryan Bonilla and safety Davis Cazares finished with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

After NM State went three-and-out, Sacramento State settled for a 38-yard field goal attempt, but missed wide right.

The Aggies took advantage of the Hornet miscue capping a five-play, 79-yard drive with a 52-yard Manley pass to Franklin for a touchdown on the next drive.

In the second Manley once again found Franklin for a big 50-yard pass that put the ball on the Hornets' 19 yard line. Tailback Tiger Powell scored his first touchdown, giving the Aggies a 14-0 lead.

Manley threw his second long touchdown of the game to Jerrel Brown on a career-long 50-yard reception. Sacramento State got on the board with a 32-yard field goal to make it 21-3. Manley later found Franklin again, for an 84-yard touchdown that gave NM State a 28-3 lead.

The Hornets scored on an 8-yard touchdown pass with 17 seconds left in the half; the Aggies led 28-10. Sacramento State scored on the first two drives of the second half. The Hornets scored a 25-yard field goal and after an Aggie punt, the Hornets went on a six-play, 88-yard drive capped off by a 25-yard touchdown pass. The ensuing PAT was blocked by NM State's Donte Savage, keeping the Aggie lead at 28-19.

The Aggie defense finally came up with the game's first turnover in the waning moments of the third quarter. Defensive lineman Desmond Anaya dislodged the ball and nose tackle Walton Taumoepeau quickly fell on the ball at Sacramento State's 38-yard line. The fumble was the first of three turnovers in the second half and NM State capitalized on each one, scoring the game's final 21 points.

The Aggies quickly turned the turnover into points as running back Germi Morrison finished off the six-play, 38-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown run up the left side, extending NM State's lead to 35-19.

On the first play of the next Hornet drive, NM State recovered another fumble as Savage quickly fell on the ball for NM State at the Sacramento State 34-yard line. It was Savage's third career fumble recovery.

It took the Aggies only four plays and 1:37 to once again convert the turnover into a touchdown. Powell finished off the drive with a 2-yard run up the middle for his second touchdown of the game. NM State led 42-19 with 6:45 left in the game.

The Aggie defense once again came up big on the Hornets' next play from scrimmage. Cornerback Jeremy Harris intercepted a pass from Safron at the Sacramento State 28-yard line. NM State then finished off the game and the Hornets with a five-yard touchdown run up the middle by running back Robert Clay making the final score 49-19.

ATHENS, Ohio (Sept. 8) - The New Mexico State football team fell 51-24 to Ohio at the Bobcats' Peden Stadium Saturday evening.

Andrew Manley finished the night at 12-of-24 passing with 132 yards and a touchdown. Austin Franklin led the receiving corps with five receptions for 72 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown grab. Franklin also blocked an OU field goal attempt. Kemonte Bateman made four catches for 45 yards.

Tiger Powell gained a career-high 41 yards on the ground in the game on 14 carries including a 2-yard rushing touchdown. Germi Morrison rushed for a career-high 39 yards on seven carries. Akeelie Mustafa racked up 19 yards on two carries and also returned a kickoff 91 yards for a touchdown, part of 180 yards on six returns for the evening.

Defensively, Dele Junaid led the Aggies with a career-high 11 tackles while Bryan Bonilla added 10 stops.

Down 21-14, NM State drove 23 yards on seven-plays to set up a 38-yard field goal make by Tyler Stampler to cut the Bobcat lead to 21-17 with 11:55 left in the third quarter.

On the next possession, OU connected on a 37-yard field goal with 10:45 left in the third to move ahead 24-17.

Ohio later scored on a 5-yard run to complete a five-play, 32-yard drive to move ahead 31-17. The Bobcat defense came up with an interception return for a touchdown to put Ohio out front 38-17 with 6:30 in the third. OU extended the lead to 45-17 after a 40-yard touchdown pass at the 0:51 mark of the third.

NM State responded on the ensuing kickoff Mustafa scored his first touchdown as an Aggie on a 91-yard kickoff return to the end zone with 37 ticks left in the third to cut the OU lead to 45-24.

Ohio added a 25-yard field goal with 10:15 left in the game to lead 48-24 and later split the uprights again with a 26-yard kick to increase the Bobcat lead to 51-24 with 4:48 remaining for the final result.

Ohio scored on its opening drive of the game with a seven-play, 68-yard scoring drive ending on a 6-yard keeper for a touchdown to put the Bobcats up 7-0 at the 11:09 mark of the first quarter.

The Aggies answered with an 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive. Powell capped the drive with his third rushing touchdown of the season from two yards out to tie the score at 7-7 with 5:51 left in the first quarter.

With the score tied after one quarter, Ohio pushed ahead on its first drive of the second stanza. An OU 28-yard touchdown pass put the Bobcats up by a 14-7 margin with 13:42 left in the first half.

New Mexico State tied the score at 14-14 on the next possession. Manley connected with Franklin on a 42-yard touchdown reception at the 10:40 mark of the second quarter.

The Aggies earned another scoring chance after a fumble recovery by senior defensive end Desmond Anaya to give NM State the ball in Bobcat territory at the 35-yard line. NM State's offense stalled near the red zone and a 42-yard field goal attempt missed wide left with 6:54 left in the half.

OU moved back into the lead after a 33-yard scoring run to lead 21-14 with 4:54 left in the half. Later Ohio's 28-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Franklin and advanced by Justin Smith to the NM State 33 as the half expired. Ohio led NM State 21-14 at the break.

**LAS CRUCES** - The New Mexico State football team lost to 1-25 rival New Mexico, 27-14, in front of 25,211 fans inside Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Aggies fell to 1-3 on the season, while the Lobos improve to 2-2.

Sophomore quarterback Andrew Manley completed 22-of-34 passes and finished with 256 total passing yards and one touchdown. Senior running back Robert Clay led the Aggie ground attack rushing 11 times for 47 yards and one touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Austin Franklin had his third 100-plus yards receiving game of the season, finishing with a team-high 107 yards on six catches.

Defensively, junior strong safety Davis Cazares led NM State with 19 total tackles. Sophomore linebacker Anthony Joiner added 12 tackles, while junior linebackers Bryan Bonilla and Trashaun Nixon each finished with 10 tackles.

The Lobos took the opening kickoff and proceeded to go on a 13-play, 71-yard drive that culminated with a 24-yard field goal by junior kicker Justus Adams. The field goal would be the only score of the first quarter.

UNM added to its lead early in the second quarter after driving 84 yards on nine plays. Freshman Lobo running back Jhurrell Pressley capped off the drive with a 7-yard touchdown run up the middle giving the Lobos a 10-0 lead.

It took NM State just over two minutes, however, to answer the Lobo touchdown. Manley completed a couple of first-down passes to junior tight end Perris Scoggins before hitting Franklin on a deep post. The 35-yard pass play placed the ball at the UNM 11 yard line. Clay finished off the drive on the next play with an 11-yard touchdown run to the left side cutting the Lobo lead to 10-7.

With just over five minutes left in the half, UNM began a drive that would end with a 29-yard field goal on the last play of the half. The Lobos led at halftime, 13-7.

Manley finished the half with 81 passing yards, going 7-of-11. Clay rushed for 24 yards to lead the Aggies at the half, while Franklin led the receivers with 42 yards receiving on two receptions.

After a turnover-free first half, the second half started with each team turning the ball over on its first possession.

NM State received the second half kickoff and drove into Lobo territory, but sophomore wide receiver Joseph Mathews fumbled the ball at the Lobo 30 yard line. Freshman free safety Brandon Branch recovered the fumble for UNM and returned it to Aggie 40 yard line.

NM State got the ball right back on the next play, however, when junior defensive end Kalvin Cruz recovered a fumble by Lobo senior quarterback B.R. Holbrook.

Three plays after the fumble recovery Manley hit Franklin on a 29-yard pass play that put the ball at the Lobo 27 yard line. The drive stalled, however, and UNM took over after the Aggies could not convert on a fourth and nine.

The Lobos proceeded to score on a 29-yard touchdown run up the middle by junior running back Kasey Carrier to take a 20-7 lead after three quarters.

UNM added another touchdown early in the fourth quarter after a fumble by Aggie sophomore running back Akeelie Mustafa gave the Lobos the ball at the NM State 40-yard line. UNM took advantage of the short field and increased its lead to 27-7 after Pressley's second rushing touchdown.

NM State added a late 23-yard touchdown pass from Manley to Franklin to make the final score 27-14.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. (Sept. 29) - The New Mexico State football team lost its opening conference game to undefeated UT-San Antonio, 35-14, Saturday night inside Aggie Memorial Stadium in from 14,341 fans. The Aggies fall to 1-4 on the season (0-1 in WAC play) while UTSA improves to 5-0 (1-0 in WAC play).

The Aggies were led by sophomore quarterback Andrew Manley who finished 21-of-40 passing with 276 passing yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Junior running back Germi Morrison led NM State on the ground with 30 yards rushing on eight carries while sophomore wide receiver Austin Franklin once again led the Aggies in receiving with seven catches for 105 yards and one touchdown. Franklin has at least one touchdown catch in each of the Aggies' first five games and Saturday was the fourth time in five games he has had over 100 yards receiving.

Defensively, junior strong safety Davis Cazares led the NM State with 10 total tackles while senior linebacker B.J. Adolph finished with seven tackles.

NM State's first possession was highlighted by a fake punt that moved the ball into UTSA territory. The Aggies, however, failed to take advantage of the opportunity as they were stopped on fourth-and-two from the Roadrunner's 27-yard line.

After forcing a quick three-and-out, NM State got the ball back and proceeded to go on a seven-play, 55-yard drive that resulted in the game's first touchdown. The drive was aided by a couple of 16-yard passes from Manley, first to senior wide receiver Kemonte' Bateman and then to sophomore wide receiver Austin Franklin. Manley finished off the drive with an eight-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Trevor Walls. It was Wall's first-career touchdown catch as an Aggie.

NM State's defense forced a punt on the Roadrunner's next possession. Franklin, however, fumbled the ball on the ensuing punt return. UTSA recovered the ball on the Aggie 48-yard line. The very next play junior quarterback Eric Soza hit junior running back Evans Okotcha on 48-yard touchdown pass. The one-play drive tied the game at seven.

UTSA would go on to score the only two touchdowns of the second quarter to go up 21-7 at halftime. Manley had 149 passing yards at the half on 13-of-24 passing. Sophomore running back Joseph Mathews had 20 yards on the ground at the half while senior wide receiver had 55 yards on four catches.

UTSA took the ball back after an interception by Manley at the Aggie 18-yard line. That was followed by Soza hitting junior wide receiver Cole Hicks in the right corner of the end zone to give the Roadrunners a 28-7 lead. It would be the only scoring of the third quarter.

NM State drove the ball right back on their next possession and had a third-and-goal at the 4-yard line before Manley threw an interception in the end zone.

NM State cut the lead to 28-14 early in the fourth quarter on a 41-yard touchdown pass from Manley to Franklin. It would be as close as the Aggies would get to UTSA, however, as the Roadrunners closed out the scoring with a touchdown late in the fourth to make the final score 35-14.

MOSCOW, Idaho (Oct. 6)-The New Mexico State football team was unable to pull off a late fourth quarter comeback against Idaho on the road, falling short 26-18.

The Aggie offense recorded 407 total yards with 98 rushing yards and 309 passing yards. Quarterback Andrew Manley went 28-of-45 for 309 yards and one touchdown and ran for an additional four yards. Wide receiver Austin Franklin led all NM State receivers by notching nine catches for 115 yards, his fifth game of at least 100 yards receiving this season. Wide receiver Kemonte' Bateman caught five balls for 76 yards and also returned two kicks for 25 yards. Running back Germi Morrison led all Aggie running backs with 66 total yards on the ground, averaging 4.1 yards per carry. Quarterback Travaughn Colwell took some snaps in a wildcat scheme, adding 22 yards of rushing on four carries for the Aggies.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Aggies recorded one interception and one forced fumble. Linebacker Trashawn Nixon and safety Davis Cazares led all Aggies in tackles, each recording eight tackles. Nixon recorded two tackles for loss and was responsible for forcing both Aggie turnovers.

NM State intercepted the first attempted play by Idaho on its opening drive when linebacker Trashawn Nixon picked off a throw down the sideline by Idaho quarterback Dominique Blackman. The interception by Nixon was the first of his career.

The Aggies struck first midway through the first quarter when kicker Tyler Stampler nailed a 42-yard kick to put the Aggies up 3-0. Morrison broke through the line for a 20-yard run early in the first quarter on the second drive by the Aggies. Morrison's 20-yard run ties the longest single carry by an Aggie running back so far this season. The drive was capped off by a 42-yard kick by Stampler.

Idaho answered with its own field goal on the following drive, and also completed a 35-yard touchdown pass on a later drive. The first quarter ended with NM State down 10-3.

After a 17-yard touchdown pass by Idaho put the Vandals up, 17-3, the Aggies answered with a 30-yard touchdown pass from Manley to Bateman at just over five minutes remaining in the second half to bring the score to 17-10.

Nixon added to his forced turnover total when he forced and recovered a fumble from Idaho wide receiver Jahrie Level near the 50 yard line, bringing his game total and career total of turnovers to two.

The second quarter ended on a 55-yard kick by Idaho, setting the score at 20-10 as the Aggies headed into halftime down by 10.

The Aggies finished the first half with 205 yards of total offense, including 92 rushing yards and 113 passing yards. Manley went 8-of-14 with one touchdown and accounted for all 113 passing yards by the Aggies in the first half. Bateman and Franklin each caught for at least 30 yards in the first half. Bateman's only catch of the first half was the 30-yard touchdown pass from Manley. Franklin ended the first half with 57 yards on three receptions.

LOGAN-UTAH -- Multiple athletes on both offense and defense recorded career games in the 41-7 loss to Utah State University on Saturday, Oct. 20.

Four different NM State Aggies had career games on both sides of the ball.

Running back Germi Morrison had a career performance against Utah State, putting up 96 rushing yards. Morrison's previous record was 76 rushing yards set against UTEP earlier in the season. Morrison also had 28 receiving yards off four catches, also a career-high.

Tight end Trevor Walls had also had a career game with both catches and receiving yards. Walls caught three passes for 37 total yards, a new career high. Walls' previous career-high receiving game came against Utah State in 2011.

Quarterback Travaughn Colwell entered the game late in the first quarter, taking various snaps in the wildcat formation throughout the game. Colwell finished with 12 passing yards and 31 rushing yards from five carries.

Defensive tackle Donte Savage had a productive day at the line by producing two sacks, bringing his career sack total to 14. Savage's last game with at least two sacks came against UNM in 2010.

NM State finished with 189 passing yards and 132 rushing yards for 321 total yards of offense. Quarterback Andrew Manley finished the game going 19-37 for 177 yards and one touchdown. Wide receiver Austin Franklin caught eight catches for 84 yards and one touchdown, bringing his season total to 8 touchdowns. Franklin also ran the ball three times for 16 yards.

Safety Davis Cazares led the NM State Aggie defense with 12 total tackles, nine being unassisted tackles. NM State combined for three sacks on defense, two from defensive lineman Donte Savage and one from linebacker Trashaun Nixon.

Utah State scored early with a screen pass on their first offensive possession, resulting in a touchdown. NM State responded with a progressive first drive on offense, which included a couple shuffle passes and runs by Morrison. The drive stalled and resulted in a punt.

Morrison gained a total of 37 yards for NM State in the first quarter. Manley completed seven passes from 12 attempts for a total of 69 yards in the first quarter. Three different NM State defenders finished the first quarter with two tackles apiece.

NM State concluded the first half with 183 yards of total offense. NM State produced 97 passing yards and 86 passing yards. Morrison led NM State in rushing in the first half with 70 total yards off 12 carries. Morrison also caught three passes for 31 yards, bringing his all-purpose yard total for the first half to 101. Two different Aggies accumulated at least 30 receiving yards for NM State in the first half. Morrison contributed with his 31 yards off three catches and Walls caught two passes for 30 yards. Wide receiver Kemote Bateman also contributed with three catches for 21 yards.

Cazares led the NM State defense with eight tackles, five of which were unassisted tackles.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. -- The New Mexico State football team held the top-ranked scoring offense in the nation, Louisiana Tech, to its lowest point total of the season in a 28-14 loss to the Bulldogs on Saturday inside Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Aggie defense was led by junior safeties Davis Cazares and George Callender. Cazares finished with a team-high 15 tackles, eight of which were unassisted, while Callender was right behind with a total of 14 tackles on the night. Junior linebacker Bryan Bonilla almost joined the safety duo with double-digit tackles, finishing with nine total tackles.

Offensively, sophomore quarterback Andrew Manley threw two touchdown passes in the fourth quarter and finished the game with 283 passing yards on 18-of-34. Junior running back Germi Morrison nearly missed a 100-yard rushing game, gaining 92 yards on 16 carries. Sophomore wide receiver Austin Franklin tallied his sixth 100-yard receiving game of the season, finishing with seven catches for 139 yards, including a 67-yard touchdown catch late in the fourth quarter.

The Aggie defense was stout all night, especially in critical situations. NM State held the Bulldogs to 7-of-19 on third down conversions. The Aggies also allowed only two scores in seven Louisiana Tech red zone scoring chances.

The Bulldogs had three of those red zone chances in the first half, but could only convert one of them. NM State was aided by three missed field goals by Louisiana Tech senior kicker Matt Nelson. The Aggies held the nation's top-scoring offense to only one touchdown on six possessions during the first half and trailed 7-0 at the half.

Cazares and Callender led NM State at the half with seven total tackles each. Bonilla added another six tackles.

On the offensive side, Manley finished the half with 107 yards passing on 10-of-19 passing. Morrison led the Aggies both on the ground and in the air. He finished the half with six carries for 31 yards and three receptions for another 40 yards.

Louisiana Tech increased its lead to 21-0 off a couple of NM State turnovers in the second half and added a fourth-quarter touchdown off an 83-yard touchdown run by senior running back Ray Holley.

The Aggies didn't concede, however, coming back with two fourth-quarter touchdowns of their own. With 6:35 left in the game, Manley hit senior wide receiver Kemote Bateman down the middle with a 19-yard touchdown pass for NM State's first touchdown. After a Bulldog punt, Manley and Franklin connected for the final score of the night with just over two minutes left in the game. An Aggie on-side kick attempt failed ending the game at 28-14.
