# THE GAME

Auburn (1-7, 0-6 SEC) hosts the New Mexico State Aggies (1-7, 0-4 WAC) in a non-conference matchup Saturday, November 3, 2012, at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in Auburn. Kickoff is set for 11:30 a.m. CT; the game will be televised by CSS. This is Homecoming Weekend at Auburn, and the second of four consecutive home games for the Tigers.

# FIRST AND 10

- This will be just the third-ever meeting between Auburn and New Mexico State in football; the Tigers have won the previous two matchups
- Auburn faces a team nicknamed the Aggies for the second straight week. Last season, Auburn faced the Georgia and Samford Bulldogs in back-to-back contests
- This is the 99th time Auburn has held Homecoming and the 86th Homecoming game at AU.
- The Tigers are 72-8-5 all-time in Homecoming games.
- Emory Blake is just the ninth receiver in Auburn history to record 100 career catches. Blake now ranks ninth in career yardage (1,764); his career best was 118 yards vs. Arkansas
- With his 106-yard performance against Texas A&M, Blake has recorded seven career 100-yard receiving games
- Linebacker Daren Bates is third in the SEC (10.0 tackles/game); teammates Demetruce McNeal (9.25) and Jermaine Whitehead (8.38) rank fifth and seventh among conference tacklers
- Onterio McCalebb is just the second player in SEC history to tally more than 2,000 yards rushing (2.356), 1,000 kick return yards (1,186) and 500 receiving yards (528)
- Auburn has won 75 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points
- The Auburn field goal defense unit has blocked three kicks this season, two of those by Angelo Blackson and one by Corey Lemonier

#### Series Records

The all-time series between Auburn and New Mexico State shows the Tigers with a 2-0 advantage. The two teams first met in Auburn in 1993, a 55-14 Auburn victory.

The most recent meeting between the teams was in 2007, also at Jordan-Hare Stadium, when Auburn posted a 55-20 victory over the Aggies.

Auburn holds a 15-0-1 all-time record against teams that are currently members of the Western Athletic Conference. Broken down by opponent, Auburn is 11-0-1 against Louisiana Tech, 2-0 versus New Mexico State, 1-0 against Utah State and 1-0 against Idaho; Auburn has never faced WAC members San Jose State, Texas State and UTSA in football.

## **Homecoming On The Plains**

Saturday's game will mark the 99th observance of Homecoming at Auburn and the 86th homecoming game for the Tigers. Homecoming at Auburn began in June, 1913, when Dr. Charles Thach, president of what was then Alabama Polytechnic Institute, issued a proclamation calling for "the observance of a Homecoming for all those loyal sons who, as former Auburn students, have passed through her portals and received her honors."

Homecoming festivities were held in connection with the spring commencement exercises until 1924, when Auburn beat Clemson, 13-0, in Auburn's first Homecoming game. The game was played on old Drake Field, which is now the parking lot for the student union.

Until the first section of Jordan-Hare Stadium was completed in 1939, Auburn sometimes observed Homecoming in Montgomery or Columbus, Ga., since adequate campus facilities were not available. Auburn did not have Homecoming games in 1930 and 1938. There was no football team in 1943 because of World War II.

Auburn is 72-8-5 in Homecoming games. Mississippi State (16 times) has been the most common Homecoming opponent. More Homecoming notes:

Auburn has won 20 straight Homecoming contests, to set a school record for consecutive Homecoming victories; the previous record of 18 straight Homecoming wins was set from 1953-69.

Auburn has scored 25 or more points in 25 of the last 29 Homecoming games, including 30 or more points in 23 of those contests.

Auburn is 34-2-1 in its last 37 Homecoming games. Auburn's last Homecoming loss came on Oct. 26, 1991, in a 24-17 setback against Mississippi State.

#### The Homecoming Court

At halftime of Saturday's game, the Homecoming Queen will be crowned on the east side of the field. A pool of more than 50 applicants went through two rounds of interviews and cuts before the five finalists were announced. The queen will be elected by a vote of the Auburn student body and the winner's name is kept secret until the announcement.

The five finalists are Blanche Alverson (Biomedical Science major; Andalusia, Ala.; and a four-year starter on Auburn's women's basketball team); Kathryn Crowley (Building Science; Shaker Heights, Ohio); Anna Davidson (Radio, Television, and Film; Hoover, Ala.); Mallory Gilliland (Hotel and Restaurant Management; Concordia, Kansas); and Becca Goad (Pre-Optometry/Biomedical Science; Clarksville, Tenn.).

All applicants must be an undergraduate with senior status and maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or better. Each applicant was also nominated by a member of one of the 300 campus organizations.

## **SEC Numbers**

In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 291-229-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 118-51-6 all-time, and are 9-6 in SEC home contests under Gene Chizik since 2009.

In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 173-178-12 overall. Under Chizik, Auburn is 7-9 in SEC road play.

## Wake-Up Call

The Tigers are 6-5 in games with a morning kickoff (pre-noon local time) under head coach Gene Chizik, dating back through 2009.

## **For Starters**

When the Auburn-Texas A&M game kicks off, the Tigers will have a total of 44 players with at least one game of starting experience during their college careers.

## SEC Champions: 1957, 1983, 1987, 1988, 1989, 2004, 2010 SEC West Champions: 1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2010

Tops among those are: Daren Bates (43); Nosa Eguae (27); Philip Lutzenkirchen (23); Emory Blake (23); Corey Lemonier (22) and Onterio McCalebb (20).

Making their first career starts for Auburn during the 2012 season have been 14 different players: Angelo Blackson, Trent Fisher, Joshua Holsey, Jonathan Jones and Cassanova McKinzy on defense; Kiehl Frazier, Jay Prosch, Tunde Fariyike, Greg Robinson, Avery Young, Tre Mason, Patrick Miller, Jaylon Denson and C.J. Uzomah on offense.

Under Gene Chizik, the Tigers are now 16-2 against non-conference opponents, their only losses coming versus Clemson, 38-24 in 2011 and 26-19 in this year's season opener. In non-conference matchups, Auburn is 12-0 at home, 0-1 in road games and 4-1 at neutral sites during the Chizik era.

## In November

Auburn is 219-174-21 (.554) all-time in November. The Tigers are 15-9 in the last 24 November games since the 2004 season.

Auburn's all-time home record in November is 88-32-5 (.724). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 131-142-16 (.481) during the month of November. Auburn's November record under Gene Chizik is 5-4.

## **30+ Points Equals Victory**

Auburn has won 75 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 292-4 all-time when scoring at least 30 points.

#### **First College Action**

A total of 21 different players have seen their first career action for Auburn during the 2012 season. Seven of those are true freshmen and eight are redshirt freshmen. Freshmen have made 21 starts for Auburn this season (14 by true freshmen; 7 by redshirt freshmen).

## **Dazzling Debut**

Linebacker Cassanova McKinzy, a true freshman who recorded 12 tackles in his first career start at Vanderbilt, tallied the secondhighest tackle total in an Auburn first start since press box defensive stats became official in 2004. The top 10:

Auburn started three true freshmen on defense -- McKinzy, Joshua Holsey and Jonathan Jones -- against the Commodores, and the trio accounted for 17 tackles, a PBU, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

#### The O-Zone

Auburn's versatile Onterio McCalebb is just the second SEC player all-time to record more than 2,000 career rushing yards, 1,000 career kick return yards, and 500 career receiving yards. The first was Kentucky's Derrick Locke (2,618 yards rushing, 1,464 yards on kick returns, and 883 receiving yards from 2007-10.)

McCalebb now has 2,356 yards rushing to rank 10th among Auburn's career leaders. His 6.23 yards per carry average places him third all-time at Auburn, behind Brent Fullwood (7.15) and Bo Jackson (6.62). That 6.23 average ranks McCalebb second among the NCAA's leading active players in that statistic.

His 128-yard performance on the ground in the win over ULM, was McCalebb's fourth career 100-yard rushing game and his first since last year's Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Virginia (109). Those 128 yards rushing were the second-highest single game total of his career. With his 4-yard TD run for Auburn's first score of the LSU game, McCalebb now has 20 career rushing touchdowns, and 25 touchdowns overall. McCalebb has moved to fifth among Auburn's career all-purpose yardage leaders with 4,070 yards, passing Thomas Bailey (3,928 yards from 1991-94).

He is third on the receptions by a running back list with 57 and fifth for RB receiving yardage with 528; next is Carl Stewart (612/2004-07). McCalebb had a streak of 23 straight games where he caught at least one pass stopped against Texas A&M; he had 49 receptions for 430 yards during that span.

McCalebb's kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half at Mississippi State was the second such score of his career; the senior from Fort Meade, Fla., scored on an 83-yd return vs. Alabama in 2011. It was Auburn's first 100-yard return since Tim Carter vs. LSU in 2000. The last player to return a kickoff for a touchdown vs. Mississippi State was Arkansas' Darren McFadden in 2006. During the Chizik Era, five kickoff returns have gone for touchdowns. AU had its previous five kickoff returns for TD in a 298-game span from 1984-2008.

## The Line On Lutz

With Philip Lutzenkirchen sidelined by season-ending surgery, one of the most productive tight end careers in Auburn annals has concluded. Lutz finishes his career third all-time in Auburn career receiving yards by a tight end, with 628, passing Fred Baxter (1991-92) who had 584 career receiving yards. Lutz is second in career catches by a tight end with 59, behind only Cooper Wallace (63 rec/2002-05). Lutzenkirchen already holds the Auburn record for career touchdowns by a tight end with 14.

# The 1-2-3 Punch

The third member of Auburn's skilled senior 1-2-3 Punch has been receiver Emory Blake, also making a mark on the record book. Blake had 106 yards on five catches versus Texas A&M, his seventh career 100-yard game. Starting the season with a then career-best 109 receiving yards versus Clemson, Blake topped that total with 118 yards receiving on 10 catches against Arkansas, both career highs. This was the most catches by an Auburn receiver in a game since the 2009 season, when Darvin Adams had 10 receptions against Northwestern in the Outback Bowl.

With 113 receptions to date, Blake is just the ninth receiver in Auburn history to record 100 career catches; his current per-catch average of 15.61 yards is fifth among that group.

Blake is fifth on the Auburn career touchdown receptions list with 16 scores, including a 27-yard TD against Texas A&M. Blake is eighth on Auburn's all-time receptions list (113) and ninth in career receiving yardage with 1,764 yards.

# **Tackling Daren Bates**

Senior linebacker Daren Bates, now with 302 career tackles to date, recorded a careerbest 16 tackles at Ole Miss, his seventh double-digit tackle performance in his last 10 games and fourth double-digit tackle game of the 2012 season.

Bates led Auburn with 104 tackles last year, and has already recorded 80 tackles this season, an average of 10.0 per contest. Bates is third in the SEC in tackles per game average and ranks 19th among NCAA leaders in tackles per game. He is now tied for 14th among Auburn's career tackle leaders with Jason Miska (1992-95).

No AU player since the NCAA began using press box tackle totals instead of coaches' film (2004) has had back-to-back 100+ seasons; the last to do so was Takeo Spikes in 1996-97.

# **Top Ten Tacklers**

Three Auburn defenders rank among the top 10 tacklers in the SEC thus far this season. Linebacker Daren Bates is third in the conference averaging 10.0 tackles per game. Safety Demetruce McNeal, whose best effort was an 18-tackle performance at Mississippi State, ranks fifth in the SEC at 9.25 tackles per game. Safety Jermaine Whitehead, at 8.38 tackles per game, is seventh among the SEC leaders.

# Items Of Note/Vs. Texas A&M

Tre Mason's second-quarter touchdown run was his fourth touchdown run in the last three games. It was Mason's fifth score of the season.

Auburn opponents have missed eight of their last 13 field goal attempts and are 9-of-18 for the season on field goal tries. Texas A&M was 0-1 on field goal attempts.

C.J. Uzomah's third-quarter 27-yard touchdown reception was Uzomah's first career touchdown catch. He threw for a TD to Philip Lutzenkirchen last season.

## The D-Line

Auburn's veteran defensive line can account for 97 career starts among seven Tigers: Nosa Eguae, Corey Lemonier, Jeffrey Whitaker, Kenneth Carter, Gabe Wright, Dee Ford and Angelo Blackson. They are averaging more than 16.4 tackles and four quarterback hurries per game.

That group accounted for 22 tackles in the opener with Clemson. Preseason All-American Corey Lemonier was credited with nine tackles and a pair of sacks (-7); that marks the third time in eight games that Lemonier recorded a multiple-sack game. Junior Dee Ford had two sacks of Clemson's Tajh Boyd for -14 vards; those two sacks and his seven tackles overall were both career bests for Ford.

Against Mississippi State, the defensive line came up with 17 tackles, 3.5 TFL and a sevenyard sack by Lemonier. Angelo Blackson also blocked a Mississippi State field goal attempt, the first blocked field goal by Auburn since Jake Ricks had a field goal block versus Kentucky in 2009.

In the win over ULM, the defensive line accounted for 19 tackles, including an 8-yard sack by Ford, and 9 quarterback hurries; Lemonier led the group with 5 tackles and 4 hurries, and he blocked a third-quarter ULM field-goal attempt, the second blocked kick of his career (he previously blocked a South Carolina PAT attempt in 2011). And in overtime, Blackson tipped a ULM field goal attempt for his second block in as many weeks.

Lemonier came through with two sacks (-15) against LSU to give him 16.5 sacks for his career, placing him among Auburn's career top 10 in that statistic. The junior from Hialeah, Fla., has recorded four multiple-sack games during his career, twice this season.

Against LSU, both Whitaker and Blackson forced opponent fumbles and Lemonier was credited with a fumble recovery.

Blackson also forced fumbles against Arkansas and Vanderbilt. Lemonier recovered a VU fumble. Eguae recorded his first sack of the season against Texas A&M.

#### **Average Per Down**

Here's a breakdown of how the 2012 Auburn offense is operating on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Tigers have run a total of 211 plays, gaining 1,243 yards for an average of 5.9 yards per play. On second down, AU has tried 150 plays for 769 yards, an average of 5.1 per play.

On third down, the Tigers have run 97 plays, gaining 279 yards for a 2.9 average. Auburn has tried only five fourth-down attempts this season, gaining two yards.

Auburn's touchdowns this season have come four times on first down (2 rush, 2 pass), six times on second (3 pass, 3 rush), and three times on third down (2 rush, 1 pass).

## When Scoring 20+ Points

Since 2001, Auburn is 99-14 (.890) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 142-21-1 (.876) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

#### **Scoring By Quarters**

This season in the first quarter, the Tigers have been outscored by the opposition 68-21. In the second quarter, Auburn holds a 57-54 advantage in scoring. In the third quarter, Auburn narrowly trails its opponents 48-44. Opponents have outscored Auburn 69-6 in the fourth quarter thus far this season. Auburn has held its opponents scoreless in six quarters this vear.

## 2013 SEC Schedule

In 2013, Auburn will play home football games against Southeastern Conference opponents Mississippi State, Ole Miss, Georgia and Alabama.

The 2013 schedule is considered a "bridge" schedule and not based on any other previous or future scheduling formats. The SEC Athletics Directors will convene in Spring 2013 to begin formulating schedules for the 2014 season and beyond.

The Tigers' 2013 SEC opener will be at Jordan-Hare Stadium September 14 against Mississippi State. Auburn will host Ole Miss on October 5 and Georgia on November 16, before closing the regular season against Alabama on November 30.

Auburn will go on the road to face conference opponents LSU (September 21), Texas A&M (October 19), Arkansas (November 2) and Tennessee (November 9).

The non-conference portion of Auburn's 2013 schedule will be announced in the near future. Auburn will not face the following league opponents in 2013: Florida, Kentucky, Missouri, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.

## **Kickoff Kings**

Auburn is seventh in the NCAA in kickoff return coverage (17.00 yards per return); only nine of the nation's 120 FBS teams hold opponents to 17 yards/return or less in that category.

The Tigers are third in the SEC in kickoff return average (24.85 yards/return), ranking 22nd among NCAA leaders in that statistic. The Auburn season record for team kick return average is 27.3, set in 2005.

Onterio McCalebb ranks fourth in the SEC in kickoff return average, gaining 24.93 yards per run on his 14 returns this season. He is 37th among NCAA leaders. The senior from Fort Meade, Fla., has five returns of 20 yards or better this season: 100 (Miss St); 43 (LSU); 24 (ULM); 22 (Texas A&M); 20 (Miss St).

McCalebb's kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half at Mississippi State was the second of his career; he scored on an 83-yard return vs. Alabama in 2011. It was AU's first 100-yard return since Tim Carter vs. LSU (2000). The last player to return a KOR for TD vs. Miss. State was Darren McFadden (Arkansas, 2006).

It was the fifth kickoff return touchdown of the Chizik era. Prior to that, Auburn had just five kickoff returns for a TD in a 298-game span from 1984-2008.

## **Three Blocked Kicks**

Auburn blocked two ULM field goal attempts and has three blocks on the season. Corey Lemonier blocked one with 3:52 left in the third quarter; Auburn was ahead 28-14 at the time. Lemonier has two career blocks, the other on an extra point against South Carolina in 2011.

Angelo Blackson had the second blocked field goal vs. ULM, tipping the Warhawks' try in overtime. With a block of a field goal attempt at Mississippi State as well, Blackson hadblocks in back-to-back games. Auburn has blocked five opponent kicks (3 FG, 2 punt) in the last five games. The Tigers have 12 total blocked kicks during the Chizik era.

#### **Parkey For Three**

Cody Parkey, who kicked the game-winning 35-yard field goal in overtime against ULM, converted on nine straight three-pointers dating back through last season, before missing on a 49-yarder vs. Arkansas. That tied the third best string of consecutive field goals since 1981.

With two successful field goals at both Ole Miss and Vanderbilt, Parkey is now 11-13 on field goals this year, and 14-14 this season on PAT kicks. His 46-yard field goal at Ole Miss tied his career long.

He made four field goals versus Clemson (37-46-27-36 yards), tying a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic record. Parkey's 46-yard field goal in the third quarter vs. Clemson was a career long, earning him Lou Groza Award star of the week honors.

He ranks among the NCAA's top 30 kickers and is third in the SEC in field goals per game (1.38). Parkey's game-winner against ULM earned him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

Parkey ranks third in Auburn career field goal percentage at .774 (24-31), just behind Scott Etheridge (.791/1992-93) and Matt Hawkins (.788/1994-95).

## **No Return Policy**

Punter Steven Clark, a 2011 Ray Guy Award finalist, continues to excel. Only three of his 48 punts this season have been returned.

Clark is averaging 41.0 yards per punt, placing 12 kicks inside the 20. His long kick of the season was 54 yards against LSU; he has six punts this year of 50 yards or more.

For his career, Clark has a 40.5 average with 47 punts landing inside the 20 and 19 kicks of 50 yards or longer.

# LAST MEETING WITH NEW MEXICO STATE

Auburn created six turnovers and Brandon Cox led the Tigers to 41 consecutive points to finish off New Mexico State 55-20 in front of a rowdy 83,012 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Coming off the bench after 24 starts at quarterback, Cox passed for 135 yards (13-of-19) and a touchdown and rushed for another to help even Auburn's record at 2-2 on the season.

Defense put Auburn on the board in the first quarter when Zac Etheridge caused a fumble by the Aggies' A.J. Harris and Pat Sims recovered and returned it 21 yards for a score at the 7:33 mark.

The Aggies retaliated when Chase Holbrook drove 80 yards on 10 plays, including a 44-yard completion over the middle to Nick Cleaver. Holbrook turned in the Aggies' first score on a 1-yard sneak with 3:51 remaining in the opening quarter.

The Tigers didn't waste any time as Kodi Burns, who became the first freshman quarterback to start for Auburn since 1998, connected with Rodgeriqus Smith on a 58-yard touchdown pass. New Mexico State knotted the score at 14 on a 5-yard pass from Holbrook to Brandon Allen in the second quarter

Two plays later, the Aggies took the lead for the first and final time of the night when Holbrook hit Chris Williams with a 25-yard pass. Holbrook finished the first half connecting on 20-of-23 pass attempts for 207 yards and two touchdowns.

On the next possession, Cox led a 9-play, 62-yard drive that was capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run by Mario Fannin, giving Auburn a lead that it would not relinquish.

Auburn took over in the second half. Jonathan Wilhite intercepted his first of two passes on New Mexico State's first series, which led to an 18-yard touchdown pass from Cox to Smith. A minute later, Sen'Derrick Marks intercepted a Holbrook pass with the help of Josh Thompson and returned it to the 2. Cox came in and finished the deal from a yard out to put the Tigers up

The Tigers put the finishing touches on the Aggies minutes later when Fannin added a 5-yard run to put Auburn up 48-20. Auburn closed the game with an exclamation point when Fannin ran 67 yards for the final score with 22 seconds left on the game clock.

Tate finished the game with 111 yards on 21 rushes, while Fannin ran 15 times for 103 yards and three touchdowns. It marked the first time since 2005 an Auburn player rushed for three TD's in a game. Auburn finished with 422 total yards.

The Tigers' aerial attack finished with 193 yards, led by Smith's career-best 86 receiving yards and two TD's.

Holbrook ended the game completing 29-of-40 pass attempts for 254 yards, but was intercepted three times.

The six turnovers was the most since 2004.

# GAME 1

Cody Parkey made a career-high four field goals and Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards for Auburn but No. 14 Clemson edged past the Tigers for a hard-fought 26-19 victory in the Chick-fil-A Game in the season opener for both teams at the Georgia Dome on Saturday.

Emory Blake caught four passes for a career-high 109 yards and a touchdown while sophomore Kiehl Frazier threw for 194 yards and one touchdown on 11-of-27 passing and one interception in his first career start for Auburn. Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards while Onterio McCalebb add 82 yards.

The game was tied at 16 entering the final quarter after Parkey tied with a field goal with 55 seconds left in the third. Daren Bates intercepted Tajh Boyd and returned it 12 yards to the Clemson 35 on the first play of the fourth quarter. It set up Parkey making his career-high fourth field goal of the game, a 36-yarder to give Auburn a 19-16 lead with 12:50 remaining.

Clemson then scored the final 10 points of the game to outlast Auburn.

In the back-and-forth game, Clemson came right back on a 10-play, 75-yard drive as Boyd threw a 4-yard fade route to DeAndre Hopkins, who had a Clemson single-game record 13 receptions for 119 yards, in the back right corner of the end zone as Clemson took the lead for good, 23-19, with 9:17 left.

Clemson stopped Auburn on the next possession and drove 79 yards on the strength of Andre Ellington's 45-yard run to the Auburn 8. Auburn's defense stopped Clemson at the 1-yard line for the second time to give itself another shot. Chandler Catanazaro made his fourth field goal of the game for a 26-19 Clemson lead with 1:24 left.

Ellington rushed for 231 yards on 26 carries while Boyd threw for 208 yards and a touchdown on 24-of-34 passing.

Clemson opened the game's scoring as Catanazaro made a 39-yard field goal with 5:22 left in the first quarter. Auburn's defense held after Clemson drove 83 yards down to the Auburn 1-yard

line.

Parkey's 37-yard field goal closed Auburn to within 13-10 with 1:24 before the half. On the drive, Frazier's 38-yard completion to Philip Lutzenkirchen to the Clemson 13 was the big play.

# GAME 2

Tyler Russell threw for three touchdowns and 222 yards to lead Mississippi State to 28-10 victory over Auburn in the SEC opener for both teams at Scott Field on Saturday. Demetruce McNeal led the Tigers with a career-high 18 tackles.

With the Auburn offense struggling in the first half, Onterio McCalebb returned the second half kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown to give the Tigers a 10-7 lead. It was the second of his career, the other an 83-yarder vs. Alabama last year, and Auburn's first 100-yarder since Tim Carter vs. LSU in 2000.

However, it was all Mississippi State after that.

Mississippi State (2-0, 1-0) answered quickly as the Bulldogs drove 75 yards in eight plays to regain the lead, 14-10, on Russell's 13-yard touchdown pass to Chad Bumphis touchdown with 11:35 left in the third.

After holding Auburn (0-2, 0-1) to another three and out, State drove 58 yards and took a 21-10 lead on Russell's third touchdown pass, a 3-yard play action to a wide-open Marcus Green, who scored his second of the day, in the back corner of the end zone with 4:38 to go in the third.

The Bulldogs iced the game as LaDarius Perkins scampered 21 yards breaking four tackles to give State a 28-10 lead with 12:33 left in the game.

Mississippi State outgained Auburn 388 to 216 as the Tigers didn't score an offensive touchdown. The Tigers had 91 yards rushing, led by freshman Mike Blakely's 42 yards on 11 carries. Kiehl Frazier completed on 13-of-22 passes for 125 yards to go along with five turnovers, three interceptions and two fumbles. Quan Bray had six receptions for 50 yards while Emory Blake caught two passes for 31 yards.

Jonathon Mincy forced a State fumble on Russell's 8-yard completion to Chris Smith, and it was recovered by the Tigers' Jermaine Whitehead, a Greenville, Miss., native, at the State 39 with a minute left in the first.

# GAME 3

Cody Parkey's overtime field goal clinched Auburn's first win of the season as it defeated Louisiana-Monroe, 31-28, on Saturday afternoon at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Angelo Blackson made Parkey's game-winning kick possible as he blocked a ULM field goal attempt just minutes earlier during ULM's first overtime possession.

Auburn (1-2) saw a 14-point lead disappear late in the fourth quarter as ULM (1-1) rallied from a 28-14 deficit to tie the game with 1:18 left in regulation before the overtime heroics from Blackson and Parkey.

Auburn finished the game with a season-high 418 yards of total offense, including 255 on the ground. Onterio McCalebb finished with a 128 yards, his fourth career 100-yard rushing game, while Tre Mason had 90 yards rushing on a game-high 22 carries.

Kiehl Frazier was 10-of-18 for 130 yards with a touchdown and an interception while his counterpart from ULM, Kolton Browning, was 28-of-46 for 237 yards with three touchdowns.

ULM went 89 yards on its first drive of the game, a 12-play march, and converted on a fourth-and-goal from the one to take the early touchdown lead, 7-0. The drive was capped by a Browning to Harley Scioneaux pass into the corner of the end zone, the first of two touchdown catches for the ULM tight end.

Auburn answered with a five-play, 76-yard scoring drive of its own on its first possession. Mc-Calebb had three carries on the drive, including the 27-yard touchdown run, while Mason had a 34-yard reception on the previous play to get Auburn into ULM territory as Auburn tied it at 7-7.

Browning put ULM back up a touchdown, 14-7, with his 39-yard touchdown run up the middle with 3:52 left in the first half. The run capped a six-play, 80-yard drive that ate up just 2:54 of clock time. Auburn immediately answered with a quick strike of its own, using a Quan Bray pass back to Frazier for the score. The pass covered 33 yards as Auburn went 75 yards in four plays to tie it at 14-14 with 2:18 left in the half.

Auburn struck one more time before the half as Frazier's 33-yard pass to Sammie Coates as time expired put Auburn ahead. 21-14. Auburn took advantage of a 33-vard punt by the

# GAME 4

Auburn's defense held LSU to a season-low 351 total yards and only three points in the final three quarters but fell to the visitors from Baton Rouge, 12-10, on Saturday night before 86,721 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn (1-3, 0-2 SEC) got an outstanding performance from its defense, forcing a pair of LSU turnovers, but could not get a crucial stop late in the fourth quarter with enough time left to have a final scoring chance as LSU's final drive ate up most of the final four minutes.

LSU (4-0, 1-0 SEC) had a chance to extend its lead with less than a minute to play, but Drew Alleman's 34-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right. Auburn had one final possession with 37 seconds left, starting from their own 20, but could only manage 17 yards with no timeouts remaining, and Kiehl Frazier's final desperation heave with no time left was intercepted to end the game.

LSU appeared to be driving for the end zoneon their first possession, but Mettenberger fumbled the snap at the Auburn 2-yard-line, where it was recovered by Jeffery Whitaker to end the LSU threat. It was just the second fumble lost by LSU so far this season.

But LSU would find its way onto the scoreboard on Auburn's next play from scrimmage, taking a 2-0 lead on a safety when Tre Mason was tackled in the end zone by Sam Montgomery. It was the first safety scored against Auburn since the Tigers' 3-2 victory over Mississippi State in 2008.

LSU would then take advantage of the good field position after the safety, driving 59 yards in nine plays and taking a 9-0 lead on a one-yard touchdown run by Michael Ford with 4:18 to play in the first quarter.

After taking over deep in LSU territory when Corey Lemonier sacked Mettenberger and forced a fumble that was recovered by Angelo Blackson, Tre Mason went around left end for 26 yards to the LSU 4-yard-line. On the next play, McCalebb walked into the end zone for Auburn's first touchdown of the night, cutting the deficit to 9-7 as time expired in the opening period.

# GAME 5

The Arkansas Razorbacks forced five Auburn turnovers and sacked Tiger quarterbacks eight times in a 24-7 Razorback win Saturday afternoon before 85,819 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Razorbacks outgained the Tigers, 372-321, including a 130-40 advantage in rushing yards, yet Auburn had 22 first downs to Arkansas' 19. Auburn also matched a season-high with five turnovers and was unable to take advantage of Arkansas' two giveaways.

Emory Blake paced the Auburn offense with 10 catches for 118 yards and Auburn's only score. During the game, he hauled in his 100th career reception, becoming the eighth Auburn player to reach that mark, and now has 1,573 receiving yards for his career to move into a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn.

The Tigers used three quarterbacks for the first time this season. Kiehl Frazier earned the start and finished 9-of-14 for 118 yards and one interception, but was sacked four times in the game. Clint Moseley saw his first game action of the season, starting the second half an dfinishing 13-of-21 for 163 yards and a touchdown, but he also threw two picks and was sacked four times. Jonathan Wallace did not attempt a pass but rushed twice for 11 yards.

The Razorbacks struck first, taking their second possession of the game 80 yards in 10 plays, capped by a two-yard touchdown run from Dennis Johnson to take a 7-0 lead with just more than a minute left in the first quarter.

Arkansas took advantage of an Auburn turnover deep in Tiger territory midway through the second quarter and increased its lead to 10-0 on a 27-yard field goal from Zach Hocker with 6:33 to play in the half; the score would remain 10-0 at the half.

After neither team could generate much offense throughout the third quarter, Auburn mounted a 5-play, 68-yard scoring drive late in the period, cutting the deficit to 10-7 on a 21-yard touchdown pass from Moseley to Blake with 0:33 left. All five plays on the AU scoring drive went for positive yardage, including a 22-yard completion to Tre Mason and a 13-yard rush by

# **GAME 6**

After Auburn scored 17 straight second quarter points, Ole Miss outscored Auburn 27-3 to run away with a 41-20 victory at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday. Tre Mason rushed for two touchdowns and 82 yards on 18 carries for the Tigers while Clint Moseley threw for 118 yards on 11-of-18 passing.

Ole Miss (4-3, 1-2) opened the game's scoring on a toss sweep to running back Randall Mackey, who threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to quarterback Bo Wallace down the left sideline with 7:14 left in the first quarter.

On Auburn's next possession from its own 28, backup center Tunde Fariyike, who was filling in for injured starter Reese Dismukes, snapped the ball over Moseley's head and C.J. Johnson recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown and a 14-0 Ole Miss lead less than two minutes later.

Auburn (1-5. 0-4) bounced right back and drove 74 yards in 13 plays and 6:43 as it cut the lead in half on a Mason 1- yard touchdown run just over a minute into the second quarter. That marked the Tigers' longest scoring drive of the season in plays and time of possession.

Auburn's defense continued to hold Ole Miss after the Rebels' opening drive as the Tigers took over on the Ole Miss 48. Two plays later, Auburn tied it 14-14. On first down, it was a Leroy High to Leroy High connection as Moseley completed a 42-yard pass to Sammie Coates to the Ole Miss 6. Mason then ran in up the middle on the next play for a touchdown with 5:56 left in the half.

Cody Parkey then recovered his own onside kick at the Auburn 47 as Auburn continued to roll. That led to a career long-tying 46-yard field goal by Parkey as the Tigers took a 17-14 lead, their first of the day, with a minute remaining in the half.

However, the Rebels outscored the Tigers 27-3 the rest of the way.

# GAME 7

Senior Zac Stacy became Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher as he gained 169 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries to lead Vanderbilt to a 17-13 victory over Auburn in Vanderbilt Stadium.

Vanderbilt (3-4, 2-3) took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards in 16 plays to take a 7-0 lead on a 7-yard Wesley Tate touchdown run with 6:35 left. On the drive, the Commodores had two successful fourth down conversions.

Auburn (1-6, 0-5) recovered its second of three fumbles as Vanderbilt failed on a fake punt that was recovered by Ashton Richardson at the Commodore 36 yard line. On 3rd and goal from the 10, Clint Moseley threw behind a wide open Emory Blake in the end zone. Cody Parkey brought Auburn to within 7-3 on a 27-yard field goal with 8:10 left in the half.

The Tigers stopped the Commodores again on fourth down, this time with an inch to go from the Auburn 48 as McKinzy made a huge hit and tackle with just under four minutes to go in the half. The key play of Auburn's scoring drive came as Moseley threw a 24-yard strike to Blake on play action to the Vandy 6. The Tigers took over on their own 38 with seven minutes left as they stopped Vanderbilt for the third time on fourth down.

Auburn had it 2nd and 2 from its own 45, but Mason had a rush for no gain and McCalebb lost two yards.

The Commodores took over on their own 19 with 4:41 remaining. On the first play, Stacy, a native of Centreville, Ala., and Bibb County High School alum, rushed it for 27 yards from the wildcat position to the Vanderbilt 41 to become Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher with 2,647 yards.

Stacy fumbled at the Auburn 32 with 2:24 remaining. On 3rd and 2, Moseley completed an 18yard pass to tight end C.J. Uzomah to the Vanderbilt 41 with 1:44 to go. Moseley was sacked on second down and Auburn's comeback threat was ended.

# GAME 8

True freshman quarterback Jonathan Wallace connected on touchdown passes to C.J. Uzomah and Emory Blake and threw for 122 yards but it wasn't enough to overcome No. 21/22 Texas A&M's 672 yards of total offense as the Auburn football team fell to 1-7, 0-6 SEC with a 63-21 loss on Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn.

Both of Wallace's touchdown tosses covered 27 yards and both came in the third quarter after Auburn went down 49-7 at the half. Auburn's lone score in the first half was a Tre Mason oneyard run on Auburn's first possession of the second quarter, Mason's fifth scoring run in the last four contests.

Wallace finished the night 6-for-9 from the pocket and also ran for 71 yards on 13 attempts while Mason rushed 12 times for 80 yards and his fifth touchdown of the season.

Texas A&M (6-2, 3-2 SEC) quarterback Johnny Manziel threw for 260 yards on 16-for-23 passing with two touchdowns and also ran for 90 yards and three touchdowns on nine carries.

Emory Blake finished the night with five catches for 106 yards and moved into fifth in the Auburn record books with his 16th receiving touchdown catch. Uzomah, making his first start at tight end, had three catches for 90 yards.

Leading tacklers for Auburn were safety Demetruce McNeal (10 tackles), safety Jermaine Whitehead (8 tackles) and linebacker Jake Holland (7 tackles).

# **JORDAN-HARE STADIUM**



Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The most recent addition to the stadium was the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame

coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 19 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 28 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.1 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its inception in 1939 and hold an overall record of 286-73-7 there.

## **COACHING LEDGER**

The 2012 season is Gene Chizik's 25th season as a coach in the collegiate ranks. Chizik began his career as a graduate assistant at both Middle Tennessee (1990-91) and Clemson (1988-89) before heading to Stephen F. Austin (1992-97). He then moved to Central Florida from 1998-2001 before making his first stop on The Plains (2002-04). Texas was his final post as an assistant coach. Chizik served as defensive coordinator with the Longhorns from 2005-06. Two seasons as the head coach at Iowa State (2007-08) preceded Chizik's tenure as head coach at Auburn (2009-current). He also spent two seasons coaching at the high school level in Florida.

#### NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

In 2010, in just his second season as head coach at Auburn, Gene Chizik led the Tigers to their first national championship in more than 50 years, defeating Oregon, 22-19, in the BCS Championship Game on Jan. 10, 2011, in Glendale, Ariz.

#### **SEC CHAMPS**

Chizik led Auburn to the Southeastern Conference Championship in 2010, the seventh in program history. The Tigers routed South Carolina, 56-17, at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta on Dec. 4, en route to the national title. It was also Auburn's seventh SEC West Title.

#### .674 WINNING PERCENTAGE

Auburn has a 31-17 record the last threeplus seasons under Gene Chizik for a .646 winning percentage. The Tigers have posted no fewer than eight wins in each of his seasons as head coach. When playing at home, Auburn is 21-6 under Chizik.

#### ALL-SEC

Under Coach Chizik, eight Auburn players have been named All-SEC First Team, including current Tigers Steven Clark and Corey Lemonier.

#### **GOING BOWLING**

Auburn has been to three straight bowl games under Chizik, including the 2010 BCS Championship Game. In his first season as

head coach, the Tigers brought home a 38-35 overtime win over Northwestern at the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1, in Tampa, Fla. The following season, Auburn defeated Oregon, 22-19, for the national title, and in 2011, the Tigers earned a decisive, 43-24, victory against Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in Atlanta on Dec. 31.

#### RECRUITING

Auburn has signed three straight Top 10 national recruiting classes under Chizik.

## **TROPHIES**

Since Chizik arrived on the Plains, four different Auburn players have been first-team All-America while also winning the Heisman Trophy, Lombardi Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Walter Camp Award and Maxwell Award. Chizik himself was named National Coach of the Year for 2010.

## GRADUATION

Since Chizik was hired, 63 Tig er football players have earned their academic degrees from Auburn.

#### NFL DRAFT

Chizik has coached seven former Tigers who went on to become NFL draft picks, including Cam Newton, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers.
