» South Carolina is ranked No. 23 by the Associated Press and No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches poll. In the NCAA RPI rankings as of Jan. 23, Auburn is ranked No. 70 and South Carolina No. 20.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

» The Gamecocks had their five-game winning streak snapped in an 85-69 loss at No. 5 Kentucky despite Sindarius Thornwell's 34 points. Sophomore guard PJ Dozier, who ranks 12th in the SEC averaging 14.6 points, did not play against the Wildcats. South Carolina leads the nation in 3-point field goal pct. defense (.272), is fourth in field goal pct. defense (.374) and eighth in scoring defense (60.7 ppg) while leading the SEC in all three categories plus steals (8.3). The Gamecocks are 11-1 at home this season with the only loss coming to Clemson 62-60 on Dec. 21. Thornwell averages a team-high 19.4 points while shooting 40 percent from 3-point range. 6-foot-9 sophomore Chris Silva adds 9.4 points and a team-high





>> Austin Wiley was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Monday after averaging 14.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 1.0 block in 22.5 minutes to lead Auburn to a pair of wins over Alabama and LSU.

Wiley, who joined the Tigers on Dec. 16, totaled career-highs with 19 points, nine rebounds and 25 minutes in the win vs. Alabama on Jan. 20 in only his 10th collegiate game.

He scored 15 of his 19 points and had seven of his nine rebounds in the second half as the Tigers broke away from a 30-30 tie at halftime.

Wiley totaled 10 points, six rebounds and two blocks in Auburn's 78-74 win over LSU.

For the season, he is averaging 8.6 points, 4.7 rebounds and 1.1 blocks in

only 16.7 minutes per game while shooting 55.8 percent from the field.

He is the son of former Auburn All-American Vickie Orr and Aubrey Wiley, the SEC's leading rebounder in 1993-94.

His scoring average jumped 1.2 points after the Alabama game to reach 8.6 points and 4.7 rebounds.

» Freshman Mustapha Heron has scored in double figures in his first 19 collegiate games, breaking the record for the most for a freshman to begin a season previously held by All-American Wesley Person, who did it in his first 14 games in 1990-91.

With only one point, Heron scored 14 points, including 3-of-3 treys, in the final nine minutes as Auburn increased a 53-52 lead to 84-64 vs. Alabama on Jan. 20.

All-American and NBA All-Star Mike Mitchell scored in double figures 24 times as a freshman in

25 games in 1974-75. He did not play the season opener vs. South Florida and then totaled six points in his college debut at Butler in Auburn's second game. Mitchell then scored in double figures the next 24 games.

All-SEC Eddie Johnson scored in double figures in 24 of 26 games as a freshman in 1973-74. He was held to single digits vs. Jacksonville in Clemson's IPTAY Tournament in his second game and at UTEP in the Sun Bowl Tournament in his sixth contest.

BIG TIME OFF THE BENCH

» Graduate transfer Ronnie Johnson has come off the bench to average 10.4 points on 17-of-33 (.515) field goals in the last five games for the Tigers. He had averaged 2.4 points in the five games prior.

The Indianapolis, Ind., native scored a season-high 17 points on 5-of-7 field goals and 6-of-8 free throws in the win over Alabama on Jan. 20.

He also had two assists without a turnover in 20 minutes vs. the Tide.

BRYCE IS BACK

» Sophomore Bryce Brown is averaging 8.8 points while shooting 43.5 percent (10-of-23) from 3-point range in his last four games.

He had six total points in the three games prior.

After scoring 19 points on 5-of-10 treys vs. North Florida in the season opener, Brown went 8-of-41 (.195) from behind the arc in his next 10 games prior to his current hot streak.

The Stone Mountain, Ga., set the Auburn freshmen record with 78 made 3-pointers last season.

» Since Danjel Purifoy's left ankle injury with 27 minutes to play in Auburn's 88-85 loss to Ole Miss on Jan. 7, Auburn had different starting lineups in each of its next three games.

In Auburn's 77-72 win at Missouri, Austin Wiley, Jared Harper, Mustapha Heron, T.J. Lang and Anfernee McLemore, who made his first collegiate start, started.

In Auburn's 92-72 loss at No. 6 Kentucky, T.J.

Dunans made his first start this season, replacing McLemore.

In the 78-74 win over LSU, Horace Spencer made his first start since Dec. 18 to join Wiley, Harper, Dunans and Heron.

Coach Bruce Pearl had employed the same starting lineup with Purifoy and the other four in the five games prior.

Purifoy returned and came off the bench to play 29 minutes vs. Alabama on Jan. 20, totaling five points, three rebounds and three steals.

FAB FRESHMEN 5

» Auburn's fab freshmen five are having a huge impact this season and each have started.

Mustapha Heron, Danjel Purifoy and Jared Harper rank in the top five among SEC freshmen in scoring. Heron is third at 15.6 ppg, Purifoy in fourth at 13.1 ppg and Harper in sixth at 12.4 ppg.

» Auburn outscored Alabama 33-12 over the final nine minutes as the Tigers trounced the Crimson Tide 84-64 behind freshman Austin Wiley's career-highs of 19 points and nine rebounds in raucous and sold out Auburn Arena. The Tigers and freshmen Mustapha Heron then caught fire. Auburn made 5-of-6 3-pointers, and Heron, who had one point through the game's first 29 minutes, scored 13 of the Tigers' next 21 points to stretch the lead to 72-59 on his third trey with 3:20 left. Heron finished with 15 points to continue his freshman record of 19 consecutive double figure games to start a career. Ronnie Johnson, who had a season-high 17 points off the bench, scored seven of Auburn's next 10 points to give the Tigers a 76-62 lead with 1:37 left. Alabama, which ranked second in the SEC allowing 62.2 points per game and had a +10.3 rebound margin in SEC play, was outscored by Auburn 54-34 in the second half alone. Each team had 34 rebounds. The Crimson Tide did not trail the entire first half and jumped out to a 10-3 lead. The Tigers tied it at 18 and tied it for the fourth time at 30-30 at halftime. Horace Spencer gave Auburn its first lead of the game with the first basket of the second half as the Tigers increased it to 42-36 with a pair of Wiley free throws with 14:16 remaining. Auburn won for the third time in the last four games to improve to 13-6 overall, 3-4 in the SEC as it was the largest margin of victory over Alabama since an 81-57 victory on Jan. 23, 2007. Alabama, which was trying to start SEC play with three straight road wins for the first time since 1986-87, fell to 11-7, 4-2 in the SEC. Braxton Key led the Crimson Tide with 18 points while Riley Norris added 10 points. Auburn shot 50 percent from the floor, including 61.5 percent (6-of-13) from 3-point range and was 28-of-42 (.667) from the foul line. The Tigers held Alabama to 41.4 percent shooting, including 6-of-21 (.286) from 3-point range. Alabama went 10-of-19 (.526) from the free throw line.

» Tyler Harris scored 22 points on 10-of-13 shooting as Auburn fell to No. 22 South Carolina 81-69 as the Gamecocks remained unbeaten in Auburn Arena. The Tigers allowed 28 points off 21 turnovers, including 15 in the first half. Auburn was able to cut the lead to five at 59-54 with 10:58 remaining with a 9-0 run before the Gamecocks took control of the game. Kareem Canty scored 21 points, going 5-of-12 from 3-point range, and added a team-high five assists. Bryce Brown added 11 points and Jordon Granger scored eight and collected a team-high three steals. One of two unbeaten teams remaining

in the NCAA, South Carolina used depth to its advantage, scoring 24 points off the bench to Auburn's three. Auburn shot 44.4 percent from the floor (24-54) while South Carolina shot 50.0 percent (25-50). The Tigers were 12-of-30 (40.0 percent) from 3-point range and the Gamecocks were 9-of-23 (39.1 percent). Sindarius Thornwell, who came in averaging 11.4 points, led the Gamecocks with 22 points, seven assists and three steals. Auburn shot 69.2 percent from the free throw line (9-13) while South Carolina shot 78.6 percent (22-28).

He totaled 21 points, including 16 in the second half, in Auburn's 74-70 win over Oklahoma, which made the Final Four last season, in the Basketball Hall of Fame's Birthday of Basketball in Uncasville, Conn.

Entering the game shooting 60.0 percent from the foul line, Harper made 11-of-12 free throws, including 7-of-8 in the final 2:02 to keep the Sooners at bay. He also had three rebounds, two steals and an assist.

In the 70-67 overtime win at four-time national champion UConn in Hartford on Dec. 23, Harper upped his career-high with 22 points as he stuffed the stat sheet with all career-highs of five rebounds, five assists and four steals.

» Auburn won 10 games prior to Christmas for the first time since the 1999-2000 season when the Tigers reached the NCAA Tournament second round.

LAST TIME 10-2

» Auburn was 10-2 for the first time since the 2002-03 season when the Tigers began the season 15-2.

That marked the last season Auburn appeared in the NCAA Tournament as the Tigers lost to eventual national champion Syracuse 79-78 in the Sweet 16 in Albany, N.Y.

THE WILEYS DEBUTS

» Freshman Austin Wiley totaled nine points, three rebounds and two blocks in 15 minutes in his collegiate debut vs. Mercer on Dec. 18. He only practiced two days with the Tigers prior to playing.

The Hoover, Ala., native followed that up with six points, three rebounds, an assist and steal in 18 minutes vs. Oklahoma on Dec. 21 and seven points and three rebounds at UConn on Dec. 23. He started both games vs. Oklahoma and at UConn, both Auburn wins. He had both a career-high 11 points and four rebounds vs. Georgia in 19 minutes in his SEC debut.

He averaged 24.2 points, 7.1 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 2.9 steals per game as a junior, earning Savannah Morning News Boys Basketball Player of the Year honors. He led Westlake to the Georgia Class 6A state championship for the first time since 2002 with a 68-58 overtime win over Pebblebrook in 2016. Westlake trailed by 10 points at the half. He averaged 22.7 points and 7.5 rebounds as a sophomore in 2014-15.

Auburn's increase of 2,002 was its largest in 15 years. The top four ranked teams in NCAA Div. I average home attendance increase for 2014-15 include North Carolina State at 2795, Auburn 2002, Virginia 1972 and Utah 1790. The other three teams were NCAA Tournament participants.

• Auburn averaged 7,825 in 17 home games in 2014-15 at Auburn Arena, the most since the 2001-02 season. Auburn ranked third in the SEC in attendance capacity at 87.5 percent in 2014-15.

• In the last three years, Auburn's non-conference strength of schedule has an average rank of 61, ranked 101st this year and was ranked 29 in 2015-16 and 54 in 2014-15 compared to 262 and 303 in the two seasons prior to Pearl.

• Auburn tied an SEC record with 21 made 3-pointers in a 117-72 win over Coastal Carolina on Dec. 15, 2016. The 117 points tied for the fifth-most in school history. The 21 made treys tied Kentucky (1990) and Arkansas (1997).

• Auburn's 119 points scored vs. Northwestern State on Nov. 27, 2015, were the fourth most in school history, and Auburn's 72 points in the

second half were the third most in school history. Auburn's 17 made 3-pointers were one shy of the school record.

- In 21 full years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 15 times. In six years at Tennessee, he won the SEC East outright or tied for it three times and finished second once. In four years at Milwaukee, he was in the top two all four years (two first-place finishes). In nine years at Southern Indiana, he finished first four times and second three times.

- Led Tennessee to an average of 25.2 wins per season, an average year-end RPI of 8 and 6 straight NCAA Tournament appearances

- Reached the NCAA Tournament Elite 8 in 2010 and played in four Sweet 16s in 2005, 2007, 2008 and 2010

- Reached the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 or better in four of last nine years as a head coach

- In the 2015 SEC Tournament, Auburn won three games in three days for the first time in 30 years and reached the semifinals for the first time since 2009. The Tigers defeated Mississippi State and two postseason teams Texas A&M (NIT) and LSU (NCAA) before falling to undefeated Kentucky.

- Auburn defeated five NCAA Tournament teams last season: LSU (twice), Xavier, Georgia and Texas Southern

- It took Auburn just three games under Bruce Pearl to score 100 points in a 105-point output against Louisiana, a feat that hadn't been accomplished since 2003 vs. Grambling State, a span of 340 games.

- Pearl led Tennessee to its first-ever No. 1 national ranking after the Vols upset top-ranked Memphis at the FedExForum in February 2008

- On Nov. 17, 2009, Pearl was able to record victory number 100 at Tennessee, the second-fastest UT coach to reach the century mark, as his team defeated UNC-Asheville 124-49. The 124-point total was the most ever scored by Tennessee in a regular season game. Tennessee's 34 assists also set a school record and its 16 3-pointers tied another.

- On Jan. 10, 2010, Tennessee defeated the #1 ranked Kansas in Knoxville, 74-68. This was the first time that Tennessee defeated a #1 ranked team at Thompson-Boling Arena.

- On March 26, 2010, Tennessee advanced to its first Elite 8 in school history with a 76-73 defeat of Ohio State. On March 28, the Volunteers narrowly missed a trip to the Final Four, losing 70-69 to Michigan State in the Midwest Regional Final in St. Louis.

- Tennessee's 65 regular season SEC wins from 2006-07 to 2010-11 were the most in the SEC over that period.

- Tennessee under Coach Pearl won the 2008 SEC Championship with a 14-2 record and finished with the second-best record in the SEC in his first two years at Tennessee. It was Ten-

nessee's first outright SEC Championship in 41 years.

- At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 16 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg.

- Has coached a league's leading scorer 3 times: KT Harrell, Auburn, 18.5 ppg - 2015
Dylan Page, UWM, 20.9 ppg - 2004
Chris Lofton, UT, 20.8 ppg - 2007

- Tennessee won 37 straight home games under Coach Pearl, eclipsing the previous record of 33 from 1966-68.

- Tennessee was ranked in the top five nationally in attendance in each of Coach Pearl's six seasons in Knoxville.

- In 2005-06, Tennessee had the largest increase in attendance in the nation (5,504 per game) to rank fifth nationally with an average of 17,954

- Bruce Pearl has raised \$1 million in only four golf tournaments at Auburn.

Pearl and his wife, Brandy, have remarkably raised \$770,000 in the last three years benefitting Children's Harbor in Birmingham through the Bruce Pearl Fore the Children Golf Classic. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families.

Over \$200,000 was raised in the Bruce, Barkley & Basketball Golf Classic Oct. 23-24, 2016, benefitting the Auburn Basketball program.

- Pearl started **AUTLIVE** at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. **AUTLIVE** raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients.

He initiated the **OUTLIVE** program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease.

- Pearl donated \$250,000 to the Auburn University comprehensive campaign in September 2016, helping push it over the ambitious \$1 billion goal ahead of schedule.

- The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015. Pearl accepted a \$10,000 donation to an endowed scholarship in his name to Camp Koinonia, an outdoor education program for children with disabilities.

- The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain.

- Every Tennessee player who played under Coach Pearl for four years graduated
- Tennessee had 31 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections in Coach Pearl's six seasons. Nine members of the basketball team (more than half the squad) earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition in 2006-07.

- Pearl took over as head coach of UW-Milwaukee in 2001. In just four seasons, he compiled 86 wins (including a school-record 26 in 2005, and a new Horizon League record for winning percentage) and led Milwaukee to its first NCAA Tournament appearances in 2003 and 2005. Pearl led them to the Horizon League tournament title in both of those years. He also led the school to its first ever NIT bid, as well as its first-ever NCAA D-I postseason victory, in 2004. Milwaukee's 2005 NCAA Tournament run capped the best season in school history, as the Panthers won both the regular season and conference tournament titles, defeating the Detroit Titans in the championship game. Using an intense full-court press, the Panthers scored two upsets in three days over Alabama and Boston College en route to the Sweet Sixteen. The Panthers finished their season 26-6 and were ranked in the coaches' poll at the end of the season for the first time ever (# 23). Pearl left UWM after the 2005 season, his fourth, as the Horizon League's leader in all-time winning percentage (51-13, 79.7%).

- In 1992, Pearl got his first head-coaching job, at the University of Southern Indiana. He inherited a Screaming Eagles team that had won just 10 games in the previous season. Pearl posted a 22-7 record in his first season, and led the Eagles to nine straight NCAA D-II tournaments in addition to winning four Great Lakes Valley Conference titles.

- In 1994, USI finished with a 28-4 record en route to a loss in the D-II championship game; in 1995, the Eagles won 29 games and claimed the D-II championship. A team from the GLVC played for the National Championship every year after his first season at USI. Pearl was named the NABC Division II coach of the year after his national championship. He left USI with a 231-46 record over nine years.

- Coach Pearl was the 2009 recipient of the prestigious Knoxville Award, which recognizes individual contribution to the community through encouragement of volunteerism, philanthropy and community involvement.

- Coach Pearl was actively involved in Camp Koinonia, an outdoor education program for children ages 7-22 who have multiple disabilities. Pearl created the Bruce Pearl "Fore the Kids" Golf Tournament to benefit the camp.

- Named the 2008 "Knoxvillian of the Year" by the Knoxville Metro Pulse

Bryce Brown scored a game-high 19 points on 5-of-10 3-pointers to lead Auburn to an 83-66 win over back-to-back Atlantic Sun Conference Champion North Florida in the season opener for both teams in Auburn Arena. The Tigers made 10 first half treys, the third most in school history in a half, en route to going 13-of-32 from behind the arc for the game. A trio of freshmen in Danjel Purifoy added 14 points, Jared Harper 10 points and four steals and Mustapha Heron 10 points. TJ Lang came off the bench to score nine points, making his first three 3s, all in the first half. Auburn, which led 49-30 at the half, pushed its lead to as much as 61-31 with 15:46 remaining. North Florida trimmed the 30-point deficit to 75-61 with 4:08 left but couldn't get any closer. The Tigers led early until the Ospreys' 6-foot-11, 252-pound center Romelo Banks, who finished with 16 points and 10 rebounds, tied it at 19 with 10:35 left in the half. Auburn answered with a 14-2 run extending to a 30-11 run to end the half. Auburn's defense held reigning A-Sun Conference Player of the Year Dallas Moore to five points on 1-of-13 shooting and first-team All-ASun Chris Davenport to five points and six turnovers. The Tigers forced 28 turnovers. Auburn outshot North Florida 41.7 percent to 38.6 percent from the floor, but was outrebounded 42-36. The Tigers, who won their sixth-straight season opener, started three freshmen in Purifoy, Harper and Heron for the first time in 12 seasons along with a pair of sophomores. Pearl is now 21-1 in seasons openers and started a trio of freshmen for the first time in his 22-year career.

Neither foul trouble nor Georgia State could stop Danjel Purifoy from his appointed rounds of winning one for a teammate. Purifoy played 3 first half minutes because of 2 fouls, caught fire down the stretch and scored 19 points, 17 in the second half, to help Auburn beat Georgia State 83-65. He and Jared Harper each finished with 19 points to lead a balanced Auburn offense. Ten Tigers scored. It's the first time Auburn has been 2-0 since the 2011-12 season. All the fancy 3-point shooting Auburn used to win its season-opener took a backseat to good, old-fashioned balanced scoring in the second game of the season. Auburn made seven 3s and went inside for five dunks. Horace Spencer added 12 points and Mustapha Heron scored 10 and had a team-best eight rebounds. Auburn started slowly, trailing Georgia State until Bryce Brown hit a 3-pointer with 11:13 left in the first half for an 18-15 lead. The Tigers used balanced scoring -- nine Tigers scored in the first 16 minutes -- but Georgia State didn't go away. It was Auburn 35, Georgia State 30 at halftime. The Tigers stretched it to 47-37 with 14:29 left in the second half as Auburn got hot and Georgia State ran head first into foul trouble. It was a different kind of game than the opener, when Auburn led North Florida by 30 after 25 minutes on the way to 13 3-pointers. The Tigers didn't rely as heavily on the 3, but still separated themselves from Georgia State in the second half.

Mustapha Heron was perfect from the floor, and was pretty darn good most everywhere else. The Auburn freshman guard hit all eight of his shots from the floor and had a game-high 24 points and 10 rebounds to help the Tigers stop pesky Eastern Kentucky 85-64 in Auburn Arena. It wasn't all easy. Eastern Kentucky led most of the first half before Auburn took a 37-34 halftime lead. Auburn led 52-50, then the Tigers got hot. Heron didn't do it alone. Fellow freshman Danjel Purifoy scored 16 points and had eight rebounds, and graduate transfer Ronnie Johnson added 13 points while scoring the 1,000th point of his career. The Tigers improved to 3-0 for the second time in the last 10 years before heading off to Mexico for the Cancun Classic next week. Eastern Kentucky shot 32.8 percent, and only 28.9 percent in the second half. Auburn outrebounded the Colonels 51-31. Auburn hit five of seven shots during a second-half run to finally get some breathing room, at 55-48 with 11:09 remaining. The first half was anything but that. Auburn started slowing, hitting only two of its first 14 shots. Eastern Kentucky led 17-12 with 11:21 left in the first half. The Tigers were shooting a cool 26 percent overall, and 13 percent from 3-point line, when Eastern Kentucky led 22-19. But Auburn went on a 9-0 run to take a 37-32 lead. Eastern hit a shot at the halftime buzzer to make it 37-34. Purifoy was already hot by then with 13 points and six rebounds in the first half. The Colonels countered 16 3-point attempts, and 13 2-point attempts, in the first half.

Mustapha Heron scored 15 points, Danjel Purifoy had 11 points, 6 rebounds and 5 assists and Jared Harper 10 points as Auburn remained undefeated with a 67-65 win over Texas Tech in the Cancun Challenge semifinals in the Hard Rock Hotel Riviera Maya. LaRon Smith's block of Aaron Ross' drive in the lane saved it for Auburn as the ball was batted out and Zach Smith's desperation half court 3 missed wide right of the backboard. The Tigers are 4-0 for the first time since 2011-12 and for the second time in 10 years while Heron and Purifoy are the first Auburn freshmen to score in double digits in their first four college games since Scott Pohlman did it in 1997-98. Auburn used a 19-4 run to lead by as much as 42-23 with 15:53 remaining as it held Texas Tech without a field goal for 12:42. The Red Raiders then began to chip away at the Tiger lead. Ronnie Johnson hit a big 3-pointer to put an end to a 12-1 Texas Tech run that cut Auburn's lead to 53-45 with 7:52 to go. The Red Raiders cut it to four with 1:51 to play, but T.J. Dunans' steal and layup put Auburn ahead 65-59 with 1:18 left, but Tech quickly answered with a bucket. The Red Raiders trimmed it to two with 32 seconds left and after Harper split a pair of foul shots, Devon Thomas' layup closed the Auburn lead to 66-65 with :17 on the clock. Harper split another pair of foul shots to set up Smith's game-saving block. Auburn jumped out to 10-3 lead and then the Tigers had a stretch where its next five buckets were 3s en route to taking a 29-19 lead. Auburn pushed it to lead 34-19 with 4:52 to go in the half on the strength of an 11-0 run.

No. 17 Purdue made 17-of-26 3s and shot 64 percent from the floor en route to a 96-71 victory over Auburn in the Cancun Challenge championship game. It was Auburn's first tournament final since winning the 2002 San Juan Shootout. Danjel Purifoy led the Tigers with 22 points and Mustapha Heron added 15 as both freshmen were named to the Cancun Challenge all-tournament team. Purifoy averaged 16.5 points and Heron 15.0 ppg. Purdue shot a torrid 76 percent from the floor and 75 percent (9-of-12) from 3 in the second half as the Boilermakers pulled away. Purifoy's 3 gave the Tigers a 44-43 lead less than a minute into the second half, but it was all Purdue after that. The Boilermakers went on a 35-10 run over the next 12 plus minutes to take a 78-54 lead with 6:45 to go. The Tigers forced 21 Boilermaker turnovers. After falling behind 40-29, Auburn closed the half on a 12-0 spurt before the Boilermakers' Carsen Edwards sank a 3 at the buzzer to give Purdue a 43-41 lead at intermission, the 12th lead change of the game. T.J. Dunans added 10 points for the Tigers while the Boilermakers placed six players in double figures, led by Carsen Edwards' 21 points on 4-of-5 treys off the bench. Vincent Edwards and P.J. Thompson added 15 points on 3 treys apiece. Caleb Swanigan had a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds to go along with Isaac Haas' 10 points and 10 rebounds. Heron and Purifoy are the first Auburn freshmen to score in double digits in their first five college games since All-American Wesley Person did it in his first 14 games in 1990-91.

Not even teammate Mustapha Heron could calculate just how hot Jared Harper was. Make it five 3s in the first half. And it helped Auburn beat UAB 74-70 in front of 8,728 fans in Bartow Arena. The Tigers hit 11 of their 27 3-point attempts, including those five from Harper in the first half, and three from Danjel Purifoy in the second half. Harper led Auburn with a career-high 21 points. Purifoy added 16 and Heron scored 11. Auburn improved to 6-1, winning its first true road game of the season. Harper kept Auburn close in the first half, then Purifoy got the hot hand with consecutive 3s as Auburn went on a 7-0 run to take a 53-47 lead with 11:57 remaining. The Tigers were shooting 59 percent in the second half when it led 66-55. It was a tight game in the first half, and again late. Auburn hit 3s, sure enough, but UAB countered with dunks for a 37-33 halftime lead. Auburn led by 11 with 6:30 remaining. UAB closed the gap in the final minute. A good portion of the Bartow Arena fans cheered for Auburn, and they roared as the 3-pointers found their mark. Pearl said he was thankful for the Auburn turnout. It was the 19th meeting between the state schools, though just the second since 1999. It was Pearl who agreed to renew the series last season. He's 2-0 against the Blazers since.

The teams only hit three of their first 21 shots when Oklahoma led 5-4. Auburn picked it up. The Sooners tried. Oklahoma had hit just four of their first 23 shots when Auburn led 19-10. Auburn shot 39 percent in the first half. The Sooners, a Final Four team a year ago, shot 24 percent. Auburn led 34-22 at the break. Jared Harper scored 22 and the Tigers beat UConn 70-67 in overtime in Hartford on Friday, two days after knocking off Oklahoma in Connecticut, too. The holiday trip had Auburn coach Bruce Pearl in a festive mood. Harper hit the go-ahead basket with 27 seconds remaining after Danjel Purifoy hit a 3, his only field goal of the game, to tie it. Auburn, winning in both Uncasville and Hartford days apart, improved to 10-2, the best start since the 2002-03 season. Pearl acknowledged neither Oklahoma nor UConn is playing to its past standards. But the Tigers still won the games over nationally-recognized teams. The Tigers are heading to an early start to Southeastern Conference play against Georgia at home on Dec. 29. Their short Christmas break will include this week of winning. It was also a successful trip for Mustapha Heron, a high school star in his home-state Connecticut, who scored 15 points and had eight rebounds for Auburn after recording a double-double against Oklahoma. It wasn't easy for Auburn. The Tigers shot poorly in the first half. But Auburn hung around, traded the lead with UConn multiple times in the second half and led 66-60 with 1:20 remaining. The Huskies scored the last six points of regulation to force overtime. The Tigers scored the final six points in overtime to win it. Auburn, playing its fourth game in nine days, had trouble getting going through the first half and into the second. The Tigers hit just 2 of its first 14 shots, and though Auburn picked it up, they ended the first half shooting only 29 percent. But UConn missed an opportunity to pull away and led only 31-30 at halftime. The game was close the rest of the way as Auburn closed out its pre-conference schedule in a most successful way.

Yante Maten and J.J. Frazier combined for 58 points to lead Georgia to a come-from-behind 96-84 win over Auburn in the SEC opener for both teams in sold out Auburn Arena. The Tigers led by as much as 13 points in the first half and led 66-54 just over five minutes into the second half. The Bulldogs scored 10 straight points to get back into the game and tied it for the first of three times at 70 with 10:11 to go. Georgia had a game-deciding 12-0 spurt to take control at 86-76 with 3:49 left to complete a 32-10 run. The Bulldogs, who shot 59 percent in the second half, outscored the Tigers 53-33 in the period. Both teams came out sizzling in the first half. Auburn jumped out to a 20-9 lead just over five minutes in and pushed it to as much as 33-20 on an Austin Wiley tip-in with 9:29 left in the half. The Tigers made six of their first nine 3-pointers. Georgia closed to within 39-36, but Auburn stretched it out to a 51-43 halftime lead behind 56.3 percent shooting. T.J. Dunans scored a career-high 23 points for Auburn in a hard-fought 92-72 loss at No. 6 Kentucky in sold out Rupp Arena. Auburn used a 12-2 run that included part of 12 straight Auburn points by Dunans followed by a Horace Spencer layup to cut a 14-point Kentucky lead to 60-56 with 12:26 to go. The Tigers, who committed 31 fouls to 18, missed six of their first seven foul shots in the second half and finished 5-of-15 for the game. The Wildcats went 17-of-32 from the free throw line. Mustapha Heron, who scored double figures in his 17th straight game to open the season with 11 points, drained a 3 from the left wing as the Tigers closed to within 70-64 and then drew a fifth foul on De'Aaron Fox, who came in averaging 16.7 points, seventh in the SEC with 7:23 left. There were nine lead changes in the first five minutes as Auburn jumped out to an early 13-10 lead on an Anfernee McLemore layup. It was a shootout for most of the opening period as both teams were shooting over 60 percent from the floor while Kentucky made seven of its first nine 3-pointers and Auburn four of its first seven. A 6-0 Auburn run cut the Wildcat lead to 37-30 with 5:31 left, but Kentucky pushed it back out to a 51-39 lead at the half. The Tigers finished shooting 47 percent from the floor, 56.3 percent (9-of-17) from 3-point range while the Wildcats were 56 percent from the field and 58 percent (11-of-19) behind the arc. Kentucky was led by the SEC's scoring leader, Malik Monk's 24 points on 4-of-8 treys and six assists and Bam Adebayo's 15 points, eight rebounds and three blocks.

Auburn beat LSU 78-74 giving coach Bruce Pearl career win No. 500. While Auburn's players put on orange "500 wins" t-shirts at midcourt, Pearl walked into the stands to hug his family. Auburn had seven dunks, including one from Horace Spencer in the final minute to seal the win. Auburn got balanced scoring - five players in double figures. Mustapha Heron and TJ Dunans led Auburn with 12 points each. Austin Wiley and Spencer added 10 apiece. Anfernee McLemore scored a career-high 11 points, making all four of his field goals. Aaron Epps led LSU with 15 points and 13 rebounds. Pearl's decision to go big - starting the 6-8 Spencer alongside 6-11 Austin Wiley - to counteract LSU's pair of 6-10 starters paid off with 44 points in the paint to LSU's 42. Ronnie Johnson's layup and free throw gave Auburn an 8-point cushion, 73-65 with 2:08 remaining before LSU threatened yet again. Auburn made 19 of 22 free throws, a significant improvement over recent outings. Pearl spread the minutes evenly among his nine-player rotation, with no one playing more than Dunans' 28 minutes. Wiley's dunk gave Auburn a 10-point lead early in the second half at 44-34. TJ Dunans' steal and slam made it a 12-point lead moments later. Back-to-back 3's by Bryce Brown gave Auburn a 15-point cushion, 57-42. LSU used a 9-0 run to pull within 2, but Dunans scored to preserve Auburn's lead. Auburn used a 15-0 run late in the first half to take a 35-32 halftime lead. Mustapha Heron hit Auburn's first 3-pointer but the Tigers made only one more 3 in the half, shooting 2-for-13. Heron scored 11 in the first half. His layup gave Auburn a 29-28 lead. Heron has reached double figures in each of Auburn's 18 games, a freshman record. The Tigers overcame an 11-point first-half deficit by scoring 20 points in the paint and committing only three turnovers in the half, 11 in the game.

Auburn outscored Alabama 33-12 over the final nine minutes as the Tigers trounced the Crimson Tide 84-64 behind freshman Austin Wiley's career-highs of 19 points and nine rebounds in raucous and sold out Auburn Arena. The Tigers and freshmen Mustapha Heron then caught fire. Auburn made 5-of-6 3-pointers, and Heron, who had one point through the game's first 29 minutes, scored 13 of the Tigers' next 21 points to stretch the lead to 72-59 on his third trey with 3:20 left. Heron finished with 15 points to continue his freshman record of 19 consecutive double figure games to start a career. Ronnie Johnson, who had a season-high 17 points off the bench, scored seven of Auburn's next 10 points to give the Tigers a 76-62 lead with 1:37 left. Alabama, which ranked second in the SEC allowing 62.2 points per game and had a +10.3 rebound margin in SEC play, was outscored by Auburn 54-34 in the second half alone. Each team had 34 rebounds. The Crimson Tide did not trail the entire first half and jumped out to a 10-3 lead. The Tigers tied it at 18 and tied it for the fourth time at 30-30 at halftime. Horace Spencer gave Auburn its first lead of the game with the first basket of the second half as the Tigers increased it to 42-36 with a pair of Wiley free throws with 14:16 remaining. Auburn won for the third time in the last four games to improve to 13-6 overall, 3-4 in the SEC as it was the largest margin of victory over Alabama since an 81-57 victory on Jan. 23, 2007.
