- SEC women's soccer is beginning its 23rd season deeply rooted in the national scene of collegiate soccer. Since the SEC initiated women's soccer as a varsity sport in 1993, the sport's popularity has grown through the country and especially in the Southeast.
- Florida was predicted to win to the 2015 Southeastern Conference women's soccer title in voting by the league's 14 head coaches. This marks the 17th time that the Gators have been tabbed by the coaches to win the title. The Gators received 167 points that included 11 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 149 points (two first-place votes). Kentucky received one first place vote.
- Fifty-two players were named to the Preseason SEC Watch List. Check page two of this release for a complete listing of the Preseason Watch List.
- · Seven SEC teams were mentioned in the NSCAA preseason poll, including three in the top 11. Texas A&M enters the season ranked fifth nationally while Florida was tabbed eighth, South Carolina 11th and Kentucky 16th. Auburn, Missouri and Tennessee were listed among those receiving votes.
- Four SEC students were among the 28 women named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch Lists. Mikaela Harvey (Texas A&M), Savannah Jordan (Florida), Christen Westphal (Florida) and Hannah Wilkinson (Tennessee) were listed on the preseason watch list for the most prestigious individual award in college soccer presented annually.
- Fourteen players that earned All-SEC honors last year return for the 2015 campaign. Included in that group are first team selections Simone Charley (Vanderbilt), Savannah Jordan (Florida) and Christen Westphal (Florida).

• Twenty-one regular season matches will be televised to a national television audience this year. SEC Network will broadcast 17 matches while ES-PNU will show four. Additionally, more than 100 matches will be shown digitally on SEC Network +.

- · The SEC Network will broadcast each of the first three rounds of the SEC Tournament while ESPNU will show the championship game.
- The SEC led all conferences with three teams (Florida, South Carolina and Texas A&M) in the 2014 NCAA Quarterfinals. The ACC and Pac-12 each had two and the Big Ten has one team.
- A record-tying eight Southeastern Conference soccer teams were among the 64 competing for the 2014 NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship. It ties the league record set in 2011 and marks the seventh time in the last eight seasons that at least six SEC teams have received postseason bids.
- Four SEC teams received national seeds with Texas A&M earning a No. 1 seed, Florida a No. 2 seed and Kentucky and South Carolina earning No. 3 seeds. Joining them in the field were Arkansas, Auburn, Georgia and Missouri.
- · Seven of the eight teams participating in postseason play advanced to at least the second round.
- Texas A&M's 9-1-1 league record earned the Aggies the 2014 SEC Championship. It was the second straight regular season title for Texas A&M, who shared the 2013 crown with Florida.
- In 2014, SEC teams posted a 70-31-8 (.678) record in non-conference action. They out scored their non-conference opponents 232-109.
- Twelve SEC soccer players earned Capital One Academic All-District honors in 2014
- 12 SEC teams received the NSCAA Women's Team Academic Award in 2014.

Preseason Poll

Florida was predicted to win to the 2015 Southeastern Conference women's soccer title in voting by the league's 14 head coaches. This marks the 17th time that the Gators have been tabbed by the coaches to win the title.

The Gators received 167 points that included 11 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 149 points (two first-place votes). Kentucky received one first place vote.

Florida returns six starters, including 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy candidates – junior forward Savannah Jordan and senior defender Christen Westphal, from the 2014 team that advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinal Round.

Points were compiled on a 13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis, though each coach was not allowed to vote for their own team.



Format

There shall be a single-elimination tournament of the top ten teams played at the conclusion of the SEC regular-season schedule. The tournament champion shall be the SEC representative to the NCAA championship.

The top ten teams with the highest point total, regardless of divisions, will participate in the tournament. The following point system is utilized to determine regular season standings and seeding for the tournament: a win counts as three points, a tie as one, and a loss as zero points. If a game(s) is cancelled, neither team will receive a point and the standings will be determined by average points per game. The tournament shall be played in a Monday-Wednesday-Friday-Sunday format with Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday designated as off/practice days.

Seeding

The tournament will be seeded 1-10 regardless of division based on the point system implemented to determine regular season standings. If teams are tied, the following procedures, in order as follows, will be used to break the tie:

Two-Team Tie – The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the tied teams.
- B. Points earned versus common opponents.
- C. Goal differential versus common opponents.
- D. Goals scored versus common opponents.

- E. Won-Lost record of the two teams versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- F. Goal differential versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- G. Goals scored versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
 - H. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

Three-Team Tie (or more) – The following procedure will be used until the tie is broken. If at any time this tie breaker results in only two remaining tied teams, then the two-team tiebreaker will be used beginning with Subsection A in that procedure and continuing from that point:

- A. If all teams have played one another, then most points earned in those matches only.
- B. If all teams have not played, but one team has defeated all teams in the tie break, then that team breaks the tie and shall be placed highest. Remaining teams will continue with the tie break procedure.
- C. If all teams have not played one another and a team does not have all wins over the tied teams, then use Subsection B in the two-team tie break procedures and continue through the two team tie-break procedures until ties between all teams are broken (except Subsection H will read "if three or more teams are still tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw").

ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE

On April 9, 2014, The University of Alabama announced the hiring of Wes Hart as the fourth head coach in the history of the women's soccer program. Hart joins the Crimson Tide from Florida State where he spent two seasons as an assistant coach, including the Seminoles' first national championship season in 2014. In just two seasons at Florida State, Hart helped develop a balanced offensive attack that resulted in 407 points on 129 goals and 149 assists. The Seminoles won two back-to-back ACC championships, made two College Cup appearances, and posted a national runner-up finish and a national title. The new-look Crimson Tide welcomes nine new players in 2015, including seven freshman and two transfers. The young roster features 15 freshman/ sophomore, while just eight upperclassmen round out the squad. The Tide returns all four of its regular starters on the defensive backline, along with starting goalkeeper Emily Rusk, a group that turned in nine shutouts a season ago. Senior goalkeeper Emily Rusk came into her own in 2014, earning numerous national accolades for her success on and off the field. The Charlotte, N.C., native earned four in-season honors, including a pair of SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors, along with two separate honors from national online soccer websites. Named to the All-SEC second team following the season, Rusk tied the Alabama all-time record with seven shutouts during her junior campaign.

ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS

Overall: 0-0-0 SEC: 0-0-0

Following a program-record 15-8-1 (46 points) finish in 2013 and a 9-7-6 (33 points) mark in 2014, the Razorbacks are coming off back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2009. The Razorbacks' 2015 schedule includes three matches against teams that finished in the top 10 of the final RPI last year and six teams that are ranked in the NSCAA preseason top 25 poll. With a 33-25-8 record in his first three seasons, Colby Hale is 13 wins away from surpassing Janet Rayfield (45 in six seasons, 1993-98) as the winningest head coach in program history. Hale is the first coach in school history to amass 33 wins over his first three seasons. The Razorbacks and Illinois St. are the only two teams in the country to win two true NCAA Tournament road games over the last two years (Oklahoma St. in 2013 and Oklahoma in 2014). Arkansas' three road-plus-neutral site NCAA Tournament wins over the last two years are tied for the most in the country. UCLA (2013 Champs) and Florida St. (2014 Champs) also have three each. The Razorbacks return 74-percent of their point production from 2014, including top goal scorers Alexandra Fischer (6), Claire Kelley (6) and Ashleigh Ellenwood (5). Ellenwood and Cameron Carter were among the national statistical leaders in 201, as Ellenwood ranked 8th with 14 assists, while Carter ranked 5th with 2140:28 total minutes played. After averaging 981 fans per game in 2013, the Razorbacks attracted 1,359 supporters per contest in 2014 for a 38.5-percent increase in average attendance.

Auburn comes into 2015 off a 12-win season a year ago. It's eighth 10 or more wins in a season in the last nine years, which was capped by a trip to the NCAA Tournament's Second Round. The second round appearance was the program's sixth in its history and first since 2012. The Tigers continued their streak of consecutive SEC Tournament appearances in 2014, making the field for the 14th-straight year, the second-longest active streak in the conference behind Florida (20). Six of Auburn's eight top goal scorers from a year ago return to the roster, led by juniors Brooke and Casie Ramsier, along with sophomore Courtney Schell, who each had four scores during the campaign. Sophomore Kristen Dodson returns to the roster as well after an All-SEC year which included three goals and 10 assists, good for 16 points. Her assist total was the second-most ever in a season by an Auburn freshman, behind only Kellie Evans, who had 13 in 2000. Senior defender Kala Faulkner is back on The Plains for her final season as a Tiger as she heads up a stout Auburn defense that put up 10 shutouts in 2014, the second-most in the SEC. Faulkner raked in the honors a year ago for her play on and off the field, being named to her third-straight All-SEC team, her second NSCAA All-Region team and her first NSCAA Scholar All-American team.

Kentucky returns nine of 11 starters from its 2014 season, which was the best in program history. Last season, UK advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time in school history, while also finishing third in the Southeastern Conference, and making the championship match of the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach. The Gamecocks return six starters and 25 letter winners from last year's squad, including 2014 SEC Freshman of the Year Savannah McCaskill. South Carolina posted a 14-6-5 overall record last season on its way to the program's first appearance in the NCAA Quarterfinals. South Carolina heads into its 2015 campaign with each of its top five scorers from a year ago. Junior forward Sophie Groff and McCaskill both totaled a team-best 15 points, while junior midfielder Chelsea Drennan tallied a teamhigh seven assists in 2014. Texas A&M has finished with a winning record in all of its previous 22 seasons. The closest the Aggies have finished to the .500 mark is the 14-8 (.636) record they posted in 1998. G Guerrieri ranks among the leaders in winning percentage and victories among active Division I coaches. With a career record of 394-121-29 (.751), he ranks fifth in victories and winning percentage. The Aggies have 11 consecutive 15-win seasons dating back to 2004. In their first 22 seasons, the only two years the Aggies have not reached the 15-win plateau are 1998 (14-8) and 2003 (13-6-33). Last season, the Maroon and White became the first team to win the SEC double in consecutive years since 2000 and 2001. The Aggies were the first team to win back-to-back SEC Tournament titles since Tennessee in 2002 and 2003. The Aggies played in their 20th consecutive NCAA Championship, one of five teams to play in each of the last 20 tournaments. The other schools to make it to every tournament since 1995 are North Carolina (1982-2014), Notre Dame (1993-2014), Virginia (1994-2014) and Penn State (1995-2014). The Aggies return 11 letterwinners, including three starters from last season's College Cup squad. The list of returnees is highlighted by 2014 All-SEC Second Team midfielder Janae Cousineau and 2014 SEC All-Freshman defender McKayla Paulson.
